OFF THE TOP

- The 2015-16 edition of the Arizona Wildcats finished the season with a record of 25-9 and a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. 2015-16 marks the eighth season of 25 wins or more in Sean Miller's twelve seasons as a head coach and his fifth in seven seasons in Tucson. In just seven seasons at the helm of the Wildcat program, Miller has already climbed to third in UA coaching history for wins at 188. He trails only Lute Olson (589) and Fred Enke (509) who both coached at Arizona for 25 and 37 seasons respectively.
- Kaleb Tarczewski finished his senior campaign tied with Matt Muhelebach (1987-91) for the most wins in an Arizona career at 110. The Wildcat duo's 110 victories rank fifth in Pac-12 history. Fellow senior Gabe York also finished tie for fifth in wins with 105.
- Head coach Sean Miller wrapped up his seventh season in the Pac-12 amassing a record of 91-35 in league play. His winning percentage of .722 is fourth in Pac-12 history among all coaches with six or more seasons in the conference of champions. Miller trails only John Wooden (.810), Lute Olson (.764) and Jim Harrick (.743) in this category.
- UA's arrival in the Dunkin' Donuts Center in Providence, R.I. (2,600 miles) marks the farthest site the program has ever played a NCAA game in, surpassing Philadelphia (2,300 miles) in the 2006 NCAA Tournament.
- Ryan Anderson finished the season averaging 15.3 points and 10.1 rebounds per game. His 17 double-doubles helped ensure Anderson became the first Wildcat to average a double-double for the season since Jordan Hill in 2008-09.
- The 2016 class saw four senior Wildcats all earned their undergraduate degrees. Those four kept Miller's impressive academic feat intact. Every one of his 36 seniors who have completed their eligibility under him have earned a college degree, including all 19 eligible seniors at Arizona. Included in this year's quartet of college graduates is Kaleb Tarczewski who graduated from the Eller School of Management, which is one of the most prestigious undergraduate management programs in the nation.

ONE OF THE WINNINGEST PROGRAMS IN THE LAST THREE YEARS

By the end of the 2015-16 season, Arizona has become one of the winningest programs in the nation in the past three seasons. Arizona, Villanova and Kentucky have jockeyed for the title of winningest program in the nation over the last three seasons.

It's just part of the winning culture instilled on the Arizona Basketball program since the arrival of head coach Sean Miller. In Miller's seven seasons in Tucson, UA has averaged 26.8 wins per season. Since the start of the 2010-11 season, the Wildcats have a 172-46 (.789) record, both the most wins and best winning percentage in the Pac-12.

TOUGH TO BEAT

Going back to the 2012-13 season, Arizona has suffered only 22 losses in its last 3+ seasons. Only two of those 22 losses have been by ten or more points. In its last 22 losses, 11 have been one possession games. UA's average margin of defeat in those 22 losses is 4.4 points.

THE ATTENDANCE STREAK CONTINUES

Arizona led the Pac-12 Conference in attendance for a 32nd consecutive season with an average home crowd of 14,527, which included 14 sellouts. UA's streak of 32 straight seasons leading one conference in attendance is the second longest active streak in the nation, following Kentucky's 40 seasons atop the SEC attendance rankings. UA has a two-season lead on the Kansas Jayhawks who have led the Big XII in attendance for 30 consecutive seasons. (Syracuse led the Big East for 33 seasons before joining the Atlantic Coast Conference prior to the 2013-14 season).

A NATIONAL POWER WHEN IT COMES TO RECRUITING

Arizona continued its dominance on the recruiting trail with its most recent group of commitments. The Wildcats' 2016 recruiting class was ranked as one of the top in the nation by ESPN with three five-star prep prospects.

Rawle Alkins (New York City) and Kobi Simmons (Atlanta, Ga.) will join the Wildcats backcourt while Lauri Markkanen (Helsinki, Finland) will bolster the frontline.

The three incoming freshmen were joined by a trio of transfers in Talbot Denny (Lipscomb University), Keanu Pinder (Hutchinson CC) and Dylan Smith (UNC Asheville). Denny, a Tucson native, will return home as a graduate transfer and will be eligible for the 2016-17 season. Pinder can also play right away with two seasons of eligibility remaining. Smith comes to Tucson after one season with UNC Asheville where he led the Bulldogs in scoring (13.5 ppg) while earning a spot on the Big South All-Freshmen team. Smith will redshirt the 2016-17 season in accordance with NCAA transfer rules and then have three seasons of eligibility left.

ARIZONA: A FREQUENT HOME FOR MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Incoming freshman Kobi Simmons will continue Arizona's rich legacy of McDonald's All-Americans joining the Wildcats.

Simmons gives UA 22 McDonald's All-Americans in program history. After landing 15 All-Americans from 1984 to 2007, Arizona has now inked seven since 2012.

MCKALE FINGERPRINTS ON THE NBA FINALS

It was former members of the Arizona Basketball program that made headlines in June. Seven former Wildcat players were part of the 2016 NBA Finals between the Golden State Warriors and the Cleveland Cavaliers, which is the most UA alums in a NBA Finals in program history, topping five one year ago.

SEAN MILLER IN THE BIG DANCE

Arizona head coach Sean Miller has advanced to the Sweet 16 or beyond in six of his nine NCAA Tournament appearances as head coach at both Arizona and Xavier. His six Sweet 16's since 2008 are tied with John Calipari, Bill Self and Mike Krzyzewski for the second most behind Tom Izzo with seven.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION FOR WILDCAT TRIO

Various international competitions will fill the summer schedules of two returners and a newcomer. UA guard Kadeem Allen and sophomore center Chance Comanche will participate in the Pac-12's 2016 All-Star Basketball Tour of Australia. The two Wildcats are part of the conference's team of 12 student-athletes that will play exhibition games against Australia's National Team in July. Allen, Comanche and the rest of the Pac-12 continent will attend training camp in Los Angeles before the six-day tour July 9-14. The Wildcats will open exhibition play against the semi-professional SEABL team on July 10 before facing the Australian Boomers July 12 and 14. All games being played in Hisense Arena, the home of Melbourne United of the NBL.

Incoming freshman Lauri Markkanen will also spend some time away from Tucson before beginning his freshman season. Markkanen will participate in international competition for his home country of Finland, which he represented in the 2015 U18 European Championships.

WILDCATS CONTINUE TO BUILD ON RANKINGS STREAK

The Wildcats have been ranked in 78-consecutive AP polls and 81-straight coaches polls. The 78-consecutive weeks in the AP poll is currently the second-longest streak in the nation behind Kansas. Since the start of the 2012-13 season, Arizona has spent 56 weeks ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll during that span. UA took over the No. 1 ranking in the AP poll on Dec. 9, 2013, marking its first top ranking since 2003 and the first time a Pac-12 team had garnered the top spot since 2006.

The Wildcats held the top spot for a program-record eight straight weeks. Arizona was one of just 11 programs in the nation to appear in all 20 Associated Press polls in 2012-13, and one of just eight programs nationally to do so in 2013-14. UA was the only program in the nation to be ranked in the top 10 in every AP poll in the 2013-14 and the 2014-15 seasons.

GABE YORK'S SEASON FROM DEEP IN PERSPECTIVE

While Gabe York has already cemented his place in the career three-point shooting record books after rising into the top five in program history in made three-point field goals and three-point field goals attempted in a career, his senior season has reached historical proportions from beyond the arc. York has cracked the top five in made three-pointers in a single season in UA history.

A DOMINATION OF THE GLASS FOR THE AGES

The Wildcats' dominance of the glass has been to a national and historic extent as they ended the season ranked sixth in the nation in rebounding margin at +9.2. UA's +9.2 rebounding margin ranked third in Arizona history trailing the 1950-51 Wildcats who posted a ridiculous +19.3 rebounding margin and the 1976-77 Wildcats' +9.7 mark.

ARIZONA IN THE LAST FIVE SEASONS

WILDCATS IN THE PAC-12 AWARDS

Arizona Basketball was well represented in the postseason honors from the Pac-12 Conference last with four Wildcats earning five accolades. GABE YORK EARNS FINAL PAC-12 WEEKLY AWARD OF THE SEASON

After a poetic Senior Day week that included a pair of victories over California and Stanford, Gabe York was named the Pac-12 Conference Player of the Week. York averaged 25.5 points per game while shooting a scorching-hot 60.7 percent from the field. The senior's week was highlighted by his career-high 32 points in the Wildcats' win over Stanford on Senior Day that saw York match a McKale Center record with nine made three-point field goals.

The California native opened his week by playing the role of catalyst in Arizona's come-from-behind win over No. 25/25 California on Thursday night. York scored all 19 of his points in the second half, including a trio of three-pointers in the final two minutes. Arizona went on to score 11 consecutive points in the final two minutes to defeat the Golden Bears 64-61.

The senior guard did not wait until the second half versus Stanford to start his offensive onslaught. York buried four of his nine record-setting three-pointers in the first half in his team's 94-62 victory over the Cardinal on Senior Day. His performance from beyond the arc matched Salim Stoudamire's nine made three-pointers versus Oregon State in 2005 as the McKale Center record.

ANDERSON NAMED TO ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

One day after garnering First Team All-Conference honors from the Pac-12, Arizona forward Ryan Anderson was named to the USBWA's All-District Team. Anderson was one of ten players selected to the team for District IX, which includes all players from California, Oregon, Washington, Hawai'i, Alaska and Arizona.

Anderson finished the regular season leading the Wildcats in scoring (15.8 ppg) and rebounding (10.2 rpg). The senior was the USBWA National Player of the Week after averaging 26.5 points and 13.5 rebounds per game in a pair of wins at Washington and Washington State. His big week in the Evergreen State also garnered weekly honors from the Pac-12. Anderson tallied 16 double-doubles in 30 appearances this season with his best coming at Washington State with 31 points and 12 rebounds.

ARIZONA DRAWS A CROWD WHEREVER IT GOES

Arizona not only lead the Pac-12 Conference in home attendance for a 32nd consecutive season with an average crowd of 14,527 this season, but UA is boosting road attendance as well.

1,000 POINT SCORERS ON THE SAME TEAM

The Wildcats became the only program in the nation to have four players with 1,000 career points at the NCAA Division I level when Gabe York became the 50th Wildcat to score 1,000 points in a career against versus USC on Feb. 14. Arizona was later joined by a handful over other programs in that distinction as Pittsburgh, Oklahoma, George Washington, Army and North Florida all have at least four players with 1,000 career points or more. The quartet of Ryan Anderson (1,787 points), Mark Tollefsen (1,253 points), Kaleb Tarczewski (1,185 points) and Gabe York (1,128 points) have combined for a total of 5,353 points in their careers.

SHOOTING EFFICIENCY AS A TEAM

Sean Miller led Team USA to a gold medal to the 2015 FIBA U-19 World Championships as head coach with a roster that included Arizona Wildcat Allonzo Trier. This came one summer after he helped guide the U.S. U-18 National Team to a gold medal at the FIBA Americas Championship as an assistant coach.

The pair of gold medals he has earned as a coach are team with a third that he won one as a player at the 1991 World University Games in England.

MILLER AMONG NATION'S ELITE AT ADVANCING IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

Head coach Sean Miller has directed Arizona to its 17th Sweet 16 appearance in 2015, marking the program's third in a row and fourth in five years. He led Xavier to Sweet 16 appearances in 2008 and 2009, giving him six for his career.

Since 2008, Miller is one of four coaches nationally to lead a team to six or more Sweet 16 berths. He also has a 13-1 (.929) career record in the NCAA Tournament against lower-seeded teams, the best record in the history of the event.
