2014-15 SEASON REVIEW

PAC-12 REGULAR-SEASON CHAMPIONS » PAC-12 TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS



POINTS OF EMPHASIS

- » Arizona won the second-most games in program history (34) and captured both the Pac-12 regular-season and tournament titles en route to advancing to its second-straight Elite Eight, a feat accomplished only once before in program history.
- » The Wildcats have been ranked in 60-consecutive AP polls, including the last 40 in the top 10, and 63-straight coaches polls; only Arizona, Duke, Kansas and Louisville have been ranked in every AP poll over the last three years.
- » Arizona has 147 victories since the start of the 2010-11 season, the sixth-best total nationally; UA has won 30 games in consecutive seasons for the first time in program history and owns three 30-win seasons under Sean Miller.
- » UA was the nation's best team at getting to the line, leading the nation in both free throw attempts (974) and makes (700); four of UA's starters shot at least 150 free throws as UA set a program record for attempts in a season.
- » With McConnell ranked in the top 15 nationally in assist average, steals average and assist-to-turnover ratio, Arizona was one of two teams nationally in the top 10 in both offensive and defensive efficiency (also Kentucky).
- » Arizona shot 48.8 percent from the floor as a team to rank fifth nationally; UA outscored opponents by an average of 10.2 points per game in the paint, 6.3 per game off of turnovers and 5.5 per game on second chances.
- » Ranked third nationally in defensive efficiency in 2014-15, UA has held 80 of its last 83 opponents under the 80-point mark; the Wildcats held 22 opponents under 60 points this season.
- » Led by T.J. McConnell (2.2) and Stanley Johnson (1.5), Arizona averaged 7.2 steals per game, which ranked second in the Pac-12 and marked UA's highest average in Miller's tenure as head coach.
- » The Wildcats ranked second in the nation with a +8.8 rebound margin and ranked first nationally in defensive rebound percentage at 77.6; Arizona is 126-22 (.851) in Miller's tenure when it wins the battle on the glass.
- » Arizona was 26-1 this season when its bench outscored the opponent's reserves; UA got an average of 20.7 points per game from its bench and outscored the opponent's bench by an average margin of 7.4 points per game.

THIS WEEK IN THE PAC-12

MILLER'S PROCESS PAYING DIVIDENDS IN TUCSON

Arizona head coach Sean Miller stressed the importance of "honoring the process" upon taking the reigns of the UA program in 2009, and over the last six seasons, that process has paid off in a major way.

Since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, Miller has guided the Wildcats to a 147-37 (.799) record, marking both the most wins and the best winning percentage in the Pac-12 over that time. Arizona has won three regular-season conference titles and a Pac-12 Tournament crown, made four Sweet 16s and advanced to three Elite Eights during that timeframe.

Miller's 2010-11, 2013-14 and 2014-15 Arizona squads are the only Pac-12 teams to reach 30 wins or advance to the Elite Eight since the beginning of the 2010-11 season. UA was also the first Pac-12 team to attain the No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press poll since January 2006, holding it for eight-straight weeks during the 2013-14 campaign.

Since 2009, Miller has also signed 19 recruits ranked in the top 100 of ESPN RecruitingNation's individual charts - the second-most in the nation over that span. UA and Kentucky are the only schools in the nation to pull in five-straight top-10 recruiting classes from 2011-15.

WILDCATS CAP SPECIAL TWO-YEAR RUN WITH SECOND-STRAIGHT ELITE EIGHT

With its appearance in the NCAA West Regional in each of the last two seasons, Arizona has played in consecutive Elite Eights for just the second time in program history, and the first since 1997 and 1998.

UA's latest Elite Eight berth came on the heels of sweeping the Pac-12 regular-season and tournament titles for the first time since 1990, and the first time in the conference 2008. Arizona's back-to-back Pac-12 regular-season titles are the program's first since 1993 and 1994.

The Wildcats' 67 wins over the last two seasons were the most in program history over a two-year period, while their .882 winning percentage over the last two campaigns marked the second-best in program history in a two-year span.

UA CAPTURES SECOND-STRAIGHT PAC-12 TITLE, THIRD IN FIVE YEARS

The Wildcats' win over California on March 5 wrapped up the outright 2015 Pac-12 regular-season championship, UA's second in a row and third in five years. The crown was Arizona's 14th Pac-12 regular-season title and the 31st conference championship of any kind in program history.

The league titles in the last two seasons marked the first time UA has won back-to-back Pac-12 championships since capturing two in a row from 1993-94. Since joining the Pac-12, Arizona has won the regular season title an average of every 2.1 years. The Wildcats have won at least three championships per decade since the 1980s, their first full decade in the Pac-12.

UA's win over Stanford on March 7 moved the Wildcats to 16-2 in the Pac-12, Arizona's best Pac-12 record since 2003 and the best final league record by any Pac-12 team since the 2007-08 campaign.

ARIZONA WINS FIFTH PAC-12 TOURNAMENT TITLE

UA ended a 13-year drought of Pac-12 Tournament championships this season with the first of the Sean Miller Era, winning its three games in Las Vegas by an average of 18.7 points per game to claim the 32nd conference title in program history.

While Arizona averaged 74.3 points and 15.0 assists per game, while shooting .473 as a team, the championship was fueled by defensive effort in typical UA fashion. The Wildcats limited their three Pac-12 Tournament opponents to 55.7 points and .390 shooting from the floor, both tournament bests.

After winning three conference tournament titles in a row from 1988-90, UA hadn't won a Pac-10/12 Tournament championship since claiming the first edition of the revived event in 2002.

ASHLEY COLLECTS PAC-12 TOURNAMENT MOP HONORS

The fourth-leading scorer in the tournament with an average of 19.7 points per game, Brandon Ashley was recognized as the Pac-12 Tournament Most Outstanding Player in a vote by the media covering the event.

Ashley's 19.7 points per game came on 73.1 percent shooting from the field, fifth-best at the tournament, and he also knocked down 21-of-24 free throws. He scored a career-high 24 points on 9-of-11 shooting to power UA to a 70-64 win over UCLA in the semifinals, and put up 20 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the floor and 8-of-10 shooting from the line as an encore in the finals win over Oregon.

The San Francisco native was joined on the Pac-12 Tournament All-Tournament team by teammates Rondae Hollis-Jefferson, Stanley Johnson and T.J. McConnell.

JOHNSON CLEANS UP DURING INDIVIDUAL AWARDS SEASON

Following one of the best individual seasons in the country in 2014-15, Stanley Johnson was a popular choice for individual awards befitting the leading scorer and second-leading rebounder on one of the nation's top teams.

The Fullerton, Calif., native was named the winner of the inaugural Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award presented at the first-ever ESPN College Basketball Awards Show. Johnson beat out the likes of Justin Anderson (Virginia), Sam Dekker (Wisconsin), LaDontae Henton (Providence) and Justise Winslow (Duke) for the prestigious honor.

He also became the 28th All-American in Arizona history, and the fourth in the Sean Miller Era, when he was recognized as a third-team selection by the NABC. Prior to that accolade, Johnson garnered inclusion on the five-man Freshman All-America by the USBWA.

Johnson is the first Arizona player named to the USBWA Freshman All-America Team, which is in its third year of existence.

FOUR WILDCATS HONORED BY PAC-12, JOHNSON NAMED FOY

Stanley Johnson became the eighth player in Arizona men's basketball history to earn Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honors on March 9, joining Brandon Ashley, Rondae Hollis-Jefferson and T.J. McConnell as UA players to earn All-Pac-12 honors. Hollis-Jefferson and McConnell were also named to the Pac-12 All-Defensive Team.

With three players on the All-Pac-12 first team, the league champion Wildcats were the only program with multiple first-team honorees, and Arizona's four total All-Pac-12 selections were also a league high. UA was the only program with multiple players on the five-man Pac-12 All-Defensive Team.

The league's freshman leader in scoring, steals, free throws made and free throw attempts, Johnson is the second-straight Pac-12 Freshman of the Year for Arizona after Aaron Gordon claimed the award in 2014. He was also the lone freshman named to the All-Pac-12 first team.

ARIZONA AMONG NATION'S WINNINGEST PROGRAMS OVER LAST FOUR YEARS

While Sean Miller and Co. arrived in Tucson for the 2009-10 season, the 2010-11 campaign effectively marks the beginning of the Miller Era. Five years ago, the Wildcats claimed their first conference championship under Miller and made a run to the Elite Eight that only ended at the hands of eventual national champion Connecticut.

A winning culture has been restored at Arizona, and over the last five years, few nationally have been better at winning than Miller's Wildcats.

UA HAS LEAGUE'S MOST 25-WIN SEASONS SINCE MILLER'S ARRIVAL

Arizona's win at Colorado on Feb. 26 was its 25th of the 2014-15 season, marking the fourth time in head coach Sean Miller's tenure that the Wildcats have reached the 25-win mark.

In that same timeframe, the rest of the Pac-12 has combined to produce just seven 25-win campaigns. Miller's 2010-11, 2013-14 and 2014-15 Arizona squads are the lone Pac-12 teams to win 30 games since he arrived in Tucson to start the 2009-10 season.

CONTINUING A WINNING TRADITION

UA LOCKS UP ANOTHER OF PROGRAM'S TOP FOUR-YEAR RUNS

ARIZONA ENDS SEASON WITH LENGTHY HOME WINNING STREAK

Arizona was 17-0 at home in 2014-15, marking the program's third unblemished home slate under head coach Sean Miller and the 12th in the history of McKale Center. UA is 91-11 (.892) at McKale Center with Miller at the helm.

The Wildcats' current 38-game home winning streak is the third-longest in program history. UA's 81 and 71-game home winning streaks currently rank fifth and 10th in NCAA history, respectively. UA's 38-game streak is the longest active run of consecutive home wins in the nation.

UA AGAIN AMONG ADJUSTED DEFENSIVE EFFICIENCY LEADERS

Bolstered by a defensive effort that ranked fourth nationally in field goal percentage defensive and sixth in scoring defense, UA ranked first nationally in adjusted defense in 2013-14.

The Wildcats ranked third nationally in that department this season, allowing less points per 100 possessions less than last season's nation-leading average.

Arizona's harassment of opposing ballhandlers was one of the catalysts for its high-level defensive efficiency in 2014-15, as UA ranked second in the Pac-12 with an average of 7.2 steals per game.

EASY POINTS HARD TO COME BY FOR ARIZONA'S OPPONENTS

Arizona has held 80 of its last 83 opponents under the 80-point mark, dating to March 2, 2013. Forty-one opponents during that time have failed to reach 60 points against the Wildcats.

Arizona ranked sixth nationally in scoring defense in 2013-14, yielding just 58.6 points per game to also lead the Pac-12.

UA allowed 59.7 points per game this season to rank third in the Pac-12 and 18th nationally, and held 22-of-38 opponents (57.9 percent) under 60 points.

ARIZONA STINGY WITH SECOND-CHANCE OPPORTUNITIES

In each of the last three seasons, Arizona has ranked among the national leaders in defensive rebound percentage with a mark of better than 72 percent each season.

The Wildcats are secured 77.6 percent of available defensive rebounds this season, the top mark in the country.

The lack of second-shot opportunities led UA to outscore its opponents by an average of +3.8 second-chance points per game in 2013-14. The Wildcats were even better in that department this season with an average margin of +5.5 second-chance points per contest.

REBOUND MARGIN LEADS TO WILDCAT WINS

Arizona was 30-2 (.938) this season and is 126-22 (.851) under head coach Sean Miller when it holds an edge in the rebound column.

UA had a +8.8 rebounding margin this season to lead the Pac-12 and rank second nationally. It was also the best rebound margin by a Miller-coached team.

The Wildcats ranked ninth nationally in 2013-14 with a +7.1 average rebound, at the time the second-best by a Sean Miller-coached team and the top mark of Miller's tenure at Arizona.

WILDCATS RECORD BEST STEALS SEASON OF MILLER ERA

Not known as a team that jumps passing lanes to pile up a high number of steals, Arizona more often picks up steals as a result of tough on-ball pressure and forcing teams into mistakes.

However those steals happened, UA had its best steals season under head coach Sean Miller in 2014-15 with an average of 7.2 per game that ranked second in the Pac-12.

T.J. McConnell led UA and ranked second in the Pac-12 with an average of 2.2 steals per game. His 83 total steals on the year were the best single-season total by an Arizona player under Miller and the third-best single-season total in program history. He had a career-best eight steals against Oregon State on Jan. 30, a Pac-12 single-game high this season.

Stanley Johnson led Pac-12 freshmen and ranked sixth in the league overall with an average of 1.5 steals per game. His 57 total steals were the third-most by a freshman in Arizona history and the most by a UA freshman in Miller's tenure.

ARIZONA A HANDFUL INSIDE THE ARC ON BOTH ENDS

UA was able to impose its will inside the arc on both ends of the floor this season, outscoring its opponents by an average of 12.8 points per game and shooting 10.6 percent better than its opponents from two-point territory.

The quartet of Brandon Ashley, Rondae Hollis-Jefferson, Stanley Johnson and Kaleb Tarczewski is combining to shoot 53.5 percent (541-of-1,011) from inside the arc, pacing UA to a clip of 53.3 percent from two-point range and an average margin of +10.2 points per game in the paint.

Arizona threw down 122 dunks this season for an average of 3.2 per game, and 301 in 76 games since the start of the 2013-14 campaign (4.0/game).

Conversely, UA clamped down on opponents inside the arc, allowing them to shoot just 42.7 percent from two-point range to rank 18th nationally.

UA THE NATION'S BEST AT GETTING TO THE FREE THROW LINE

Arizona is shot 71.9 percent from the free throw line in 2014-15, an increase of 6.0 percent from the 2013-14 campaign. UA averaged 25.6 free throw attempts per game, an increase of 2.7 per game over last season's numbers.

The Wildcats' total of 974 free throw attempts and 700 free throw makes both ranked first nationally, while its free throw rate of 47.1 ranked ninth in the country.

UA's 974 free throw attempts were a program record for a single season, while its 700 makes ranked second on the program's single-season chart.

UA WINGS GETTING TO THE LINE AT A HIGH RATE

Having two explosive talents on the wing in Rondae Hollis-Jefferson and Stanley Johnson paid off for Arizona in numerous ways in 2014-15, perhaps none more glaring than at the free throw line.

Hollis-Jefferson and Johnson draw 5.5 and 5.2 fouls per 40 minutes played, which led to them leading the Wildcats in free throw attempts at 205 and 178, respectively.

Hollis-Jefferson and Johnson ranked second and fourth, respectively, in the Pac-12 in free throw attempts, which was also good for 38th and 99th nationally, respectively.

ARIZONA LOOKING TO GET OUT AND RUN

Turning defense into offense has always been a central part of Sean Miller's coaching philosophy, and his teams consistently look to push the ball off of opponents' misses and turnovers.

The Wildcats averaged 6.6 points per game on the fastbreak and allowed just 3.7 fastbreak points to its opponents, translating to an average margin of +2.9 points per game in that area.

UA tied or outscored its opponents on the break in 73.7 percent of its games this season (28-of-38), while 11 opponents were shut out in the fastbreak-points column this season.

WILDCATS ONCE AGAIN BALANCED ON THE OFFENSIVE END

With a margin of just 4.6 points per game between its leading scorer and its No. 6 scorer, UA once again proved to feature the balanced scoring attack that head coach Sean Miller seeks to employ.

Each of those top six scorers averaged at least 9.2 points and between 5.7-10.3 field goal attempts per game.

Since the start of the 2013-14 season, Arizona has had at least four players reach double figures in 47-of-76 games (61.8 percent), including 21 games with five or more double-digit scorers during that time.

MCCONNELL TOPS PAC-12 ACTIVE ASSIST LEADERS

In his first year on the court in the Pac-12, T.J. McConnell handed out 202 assists, good for sixth on Arizona's single-season chart.

His total of 440 led active Pac-12 players at the end of the 2014-15 season despite the fact that McConnell played only 76 games at a Pac-12 institution (5.8/game). He led the Pac-12 with an average of 6.3 assists per game in 2014-15, and his 238 assists ranked second on UA's single-season chart.

In his tenure at UA, the Wildcats were 49-4 (.925) when McConnell recorded at least five assists in a game.

DEFENSIVE PRESSURE PRODUCES RESULTS FOR MCCONNELL

Having played two seasons at Duquesne, senior guard T.J. McConnell doesn't top the list of the Pac-12's active steal leaders despite the fact that his 324-career thefts roughly doubled the league's top active total (167) at the end of the 2014-15 season.

McConnell piled up a team-high 64 steals in 2013-14, good enough to rank fourth in the Pac-12 with an average of 1.7 per game. He ranked second in the Pac-12 with an average of 2.2 per game this season, and his total of 147 steals at UA was fifth among active Pac-12 players.

His 83 steals this season placed him third on Arizona's single-season chart.

MCCONNELL'S ARRIVAL COINCIDES WITH IMPROVED BALL SECURITY

Paced by T.J. McConnell's league-leading 3.0 assist-to-turnover ratio, Arizona ranked 12th nationally in 2013-14 with a 1.48 ATR that also marked the best in the Sean Miller Era. UA's 10.2 turnover average in 2013-14 was the best in program history, eclipsing the mark of 10.5 set in 1985-86.

Two of the five best seasons in program history in terms of turnovers per game have come since McConnell arrived on campus (including his redshirt year in 2012-13 in which he practiced with the team).

The Wildcats averaged 11.0 turnovers per game in 2014-15, giving McConnell a hand in three of the five least turnover-prone seasons in Arizona history.

DISRUPTIVE HOLLIS-JEFFERSON A CATALYST FOR UA WINS

With his length, athleticism and work ethic, Rondae Hollis-Jefferson has established himself as one of the country's elite defenders.

The Chester, Pa., native led Arizona with an average of 0.8 blocks per game this season, swatting a team-best 3.4 percent of opponents' two-point shots while on the floor. In 76-career games, he blocked 72 shots (0.9/game) and led UA in blocks 34 times (44.7 percent).

Hollis-Jefferson also averaged a career-best 1.2 steals per game this season, and ranked ninth in the Pac-12 with an average of 1.3 per game in league play.

Arizona was 10-0 in his career and 7-0 this season when Hollis-Jefferson recorded at least three blocks or at least three steals in a game.

ASHLEY TURNS IN PRODUCTIVE JUNIOR SEASON

Brandon Ashley didn't take long to get back into the swing of things following last season's foot injury, ranking second on the team in scoring (12.2/game) and third in rebounds (5.2/game).

He ranked fourth on the team in minutes played (27.8/game) and has played 30 or more in 14 games this season.

He shot .514 from the floor on the season and took the third-most free throws on the squad with a career-high 172. On the defensive end of the floor, he put up career-high totals in both blocks (25) and steals (23).

Ranked fourth on the team in rebounding at 5.2 per game, Ashley had a career average of 5.4 boards per contest, including a clip of 1.7 per game on the offensive glass. More than 30 percent of his career rebounds (164-of-510) came on the offensive boards.

TARCZEWSKI AN UNSUNG PRESENCE ON OFFENSIVE END

After leading Arizona in rebounding as a freshman and ranking second on the team in that category as a sophomore, Kaleb Tarczewski developed a reputation as a glass cleaner and defensive presence.

The junior has also quietly established himself as a factor on the offensive end of the floor, as evidenced by the fact that UA is 41-7 (.854) during Tarczewski's tenure when he scores in double figures.

Tarczewski has proven to be ultra-efficient in his 48-career double-figure scoring games, shooting 64.8 percent from the floor (208-321) and averaging just 6.7 field goal attempts in those contests. He currently ranks 58th on Arizona's career scoring list with 941 points.

WILDCATS CONTINUE TO BUILD ON RANKINGS STREAK

The Wildcats have been ranked in 60-consecutive AP polls and 63-straight coaches polls. Since the start of the 2012-13 season, Arizona has spent 53 weeks ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll, including each of the last 40 polls.

UA took over the No. 1 ranking in the Dec. 9, 2013, AP poll, marking its first top ranking since 2003 and the first time a Pac-12 team had garnered the top spot since 2006. The Wildcats held the top spot for a program-record eight-straight weeks.

UA was the nation's lone team to be ranked in the top 10 of every AP poll during the 2013-14 season, and one of just five schools to be ranked in the top 10 in every poll during the 2014-15 campaign.

Only four schools - Arizona, Duke, Kansas and Louisville - have been ranked in every AP poll over the last three seasons.

WILDCATS NOT AFRAID TO HEAD AWAY FROM MCKALE

Since Sean Miller took over the reigns of the Arizona program in 2009-10, Arizona has compiled a 40-26 (.606) record in true road games, averaging 6.7 true road wins per season in his tenure.

UA's 40 total road wins are the most in the league over that span, and its 32 Pac-12 road victories are also the most in the league over the last six years.

WILDCATS CONTINUE TO BE LEAGUE'S BIGGEST DRAW, EVEN AWAY FROM HOME

Aside from the fact that Arizona's average home attendance was nearly 2,500 fans higher than the next Pac-12 school in 2014-15, the Wildcats continued to be the league's biggest draw when they played on the road.

Average attendance at Pac-12 schools increased by an average of 30 percent in 2013-14 when Arizona came to town, including an increase of more than 60 percent at one league opponent's venue.

This season, attendance increased at every Pac-12 arena when UA came to town, including four increases of more than 50 percent. Arizona was the biggest draw of the season for seven of the nine Pac-12 teams it played on the road this season.

The Wildcats averaged 14,591 fans per home game in 2014-15, equating to a 99.6 percent capacity of McKale Center for the season. This season's average home attendance was the highest in McKale Center history, eclipsing the previous record of 14,587 set in 2005-06.

The gold medal was Miller's second as a member of the USA Basketball program, as he won one as a player at the 1991 World University Games in England.

MILLER TAPPED FOR ANOTHER USA BASKETBALL COACHING ASSIGNMENT

After helping coach the 2014 USA Basketball Men's U18 National Team to a gold medal at the 2014 FIBA Americas U18 Championship, Arizona head coach Sean Miller will reprise his role as an assistant coach for the team, working alongside Ed Cooley (Providence) to assist head coach Billy Donovan (Florida) at the 2015 FIBA U19 World Championship in Greece.

Defending U19 gold medalists, the USA squad will attempt to replicate that feat at the 2015 FIBA U19 World Championship, which will be held from June 27-July 5.

MILLER AMONG NATION'S ELITE AT ADVANCING IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

Head coach Sean Miller has directed Arizona to its 17th Sweet 16 appearance in 2015, marking the program's third in a row and fourth in five years. He led Xavier to Sweet 16 appearances in 2008 and 2009, giving him six for his career.

Since 2008, Miller is one of four coaches nationally to lead a team to six or more Sweet 16 berths. He also has a 13-1 (.929) career record in the NCAA Tournament against lower-seeded teams, the best record in the history of the event.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - Brandon Ashley scored a career-high 21 points in his return to the lineup, and No. 2 Arizona shook off a shaky start to open the season with a 78-55 win over Mount St. Mary's Friday night.

Arizona was out of sorts early before closing the first half with a big run to build a 15-point lead that was barely challenged.

Ashley played confidently and moved freely, finishing 9 of 10 from the floor in his return from missing the final 16 games last season with a broken foot.

Rondae Hollis-Jefferson lifted the Wildcats out of their funk with harassing defense and an array of soaring dunks, finishing with 15 points.

An NCAA Tournament team a year ago, Mount St. Mary's managed to keep Arizona within reach for most of the first half. Once the bigger, more athletic Wildcats turned up the pressure, the Mountaineers couldn't keep up.

Kristijan Krajina led Mount St. Mary's with 13 points and Byron Ashe added 12.

The Wildcats entered the season with lofty expectations, even for a storied program like theirs.

Arizona returned five key players from a team that fell a few seconds short of the Final Four last season and coach Sean Miller added another stellar recruiting class, headed by Stanley Johnson.

But before the Wildcats could start their expected romp through the schedule, Miller issued a warning: The preseason hype may have been overhyped, at least for now.

Citing a lack of cohesiveness and depth, along with an "identity crisis" on defense, Miller said the Wildcats were nowhere near the airy preseason predictions.

Early on against Mount St. Mary's, it seemed to be onto something as Arizona looked a bit disjointed on offense, struggling with turnovers - five in the first six minutes - and getting good looks at the basket.

And, after needing 4 1-2 minutes to get its first field goal, Mount St. Mary's started hitting a few shots and was still within 28-25 late in the first half.

Then Arizona hit the accelerator.

Running off three straight steals and breakaway dunks in 45 seconds - Hollis-Jefferson's tomahawk was particularly nice - the Wildcats closed the first half with a 12-0 run to lead 40-25.

Mount St. Mary's had one more run in it, using a 6-0 spurt to pull within seven.

Arizona erased that hope quickly, using a 12-0 run to push the lead to 63-44 before cruising to the victory.

The Wildcats traded blows in this heavyweight bout in paradise, coming up with the big plays down the stretch to win their 33rd straight regular-season non-conference game.

Rondae Hollis-Jefferson gave Arizona his usual exuberant boost and scored 14 points, while the Wildcats closed in around San Diego State defensively in the second half to add to the Maui title they won in 2000.

Trey Kell had a four-point play with 17 seconds to go and Winston Shepard hit a 3 with less than a second left, but it wasn't enough for the Aztecs.

Kell and Shepard had 14 points each to lead San Diego State, which made 11 of 29 shots in the second half.

An Arizona-San Diego State title game was what college basketball fans hoped for when the Maui Invitational brackets came out.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - Stanley Johnson and Gabe York each scored 18 points, and No. 3 Arizona blitzed Gardner-Webb during a 16-0 second-half run to roll over the Bulldogs 91-65 Tuesday night.

Arizona (7-0) needed to shake out the cobwebs after the holiday break and had to rally from a sluggish start with a big run to end the first half. The Wildcats again were flat to open the second half, but had an even bigger run in them, hitting 11 straight shots during an 18-2 stretch that put the game out of reach.

Arizona shot 56 percent and made 10 of 17 from 3-point range to extend its home-winning streak to 25 games.

Gardner-Webb (3-4) made the game close with a strong start to the second half before wilting under Arizona's athleticism.

Tyler Strange and Tyrell Nelson each had 15 points to lead the Bulldogs.

Arizona's main goal was to avoid a letdown against Gardner-Webb after winning three tough games for a second Maui Invitational title just before Thanksgiving. It figured to be a little tougher with a marquee match-up against No. 9 Gonzaga coming up on Saturday.

Gardner-Webb has played a tough non-conference schedule in its second season under Tim Craft and held up reasonably well before its trip to the desert, picking up a win over Clemson last week in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

The Wildcats looked rusty after a five-day break, throwing up shots that barely nicked the rim, sailed high off the backboard or missed everything, as Johnson did on an open 3-pointer.

Gardner-Webb had the clanking thing going early, too, putting up shots that were woefully short or caromed off the backboard without hitting rim.

Arizona found the range late in the half. Gardner-Webb couldn't against the Wildcats' pressure.

Arizona hit 5 of 9 shots from 3-point range in the first half, closing with a 14-4 run to take a 40-28 lead.

The Bulldogs hit 10 of 31 shots in the half, going 4 for 15 from 3-point range.

But Gardner-Webb still had some fight left.

The Bulldogs hit their first five shots of the second half, including three 3-pointers while opening with a 13-2 run that cut Arizona's lead to 42-41.

Once Arizona turned up the pressure that was it.

Smothering the Bulldogs with their pressure defense, Arizona set up easy shots in transition, scoring 16 straight points to go up 67-48.

Rondae Hollis-Jefferson and Brandon Ashley had the highlights of the run with a pair of backboard-shaking dunks; Hollis-Jefferson two-handed on an alley-oop from York, Ashley one-handed on a drive down the lane.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - T.J. McConnell scored six of his 12 points in overtime and No. 3 Arizona held on for a 66-63 victory over No. 9 Gonzaga after Byron Wesley air-balled the first of three missed free throws with 3.3 seconds left on Saturday.

Arizona (8-0) rallied from a poor-shooting first half and a couple of deficits in the second half to force overtime. McConnell, limited in the first half by foul trouble, was assertive in the extra period, leading the Wildcats to their 26th straight home win.

Brandon Ashley had 14 points for Arizona, which has won 35 straight regular-season non-conference games.

Gonzaga (7-1) shot well inside, but went 4 for 17 from 3-point range and had two key turnovers late in overtime.

Wesley had a chance to tie the game after being fouled on a 3-pointer, but was well short on his first attempt and clanged away the other two.

Kyle Wiltjer led the Bulldogs with 15 points. Kevin Pangos had six assists, but was held to eight points on 3-of-10 shooting.

Arizona rolled Gonzaga in the round of 32 in last season's NCAA tournament, and the rematch was a marquee matchup of deep, talented teams butting heads in one of college basketball's best venues.

Arizona's forte has been defense. Even when the Wildcats have struggled on offense, the defense has come to the rescue, leading to impressive wins over Kansas State and San Diego State on the way to the Maui Invitational title last week.

Gonzaga, which won the NIT Season Tip-Off, has gotten to this point behind one of the nation's most efficient offenses, ranking third nationally with 54 percent shooting while winning by an average of 29.4 points per game.

Wiltjer kicked off the game with an air ball on an open jumper, a prelude for what was a physical, don't-give-an-inch first half.

Arizona struggled against Gonzaga's pack-it-in defense, missing 11 of its first 14 shots - mostly from outside - while going 9 of 27 in the first half.

Gonzaga struggled early on against Arizona's all-over pressure. It found a rhythm for a short stint to go up seven, and then struggled again to finish the first half at 9 of 29 from the field.

The Wildcats went on a short run to end the half behind Ashley, who hit a 3-pointer, scored on a spinning drive and found Elliott Pitts on a kick-out 3-pointer to tie it at 27.

The second half was completely different, with the teams trading athletic plays and big shots instead of clanks.

Gonzaga did most of its damage inside, getting into the lane and crashing for offensive rebounds.

The Zags pushed the lead to 60-54 on a putback by Wiltjer, but Arizona fought back, tying it on a jumper by Ashley with 1:25 left.

Wiltjer had a chance to win it at the end of regulation, but his turning 3-pointer from the corner just missed.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - Stanley Johnson scored 17 points, Gabe York added 15 and No. 3 Arizona crushed struggling Michigan 80-53 on Saturday.

Arizona (10-0) got off to a rare fast start and kept the accelerator down, quickly turning a highly-anticipated nonconference game into a rout.

The Wildcats dominated inside, outscoring Michigan 42-16 in the paint and grabbing 14 more rebounds for their 28th consecutive home win.

Kaleb Tarczewski had 15 points and seven rebounds for Arizona, which shot 58 percent to win its 37th straight regular-season nonconference game.

Michigan (6-4) capped off a disappointing week with a dismal performance.

The Wolverines fell into a quick double-digit hole and struggled against Arizona's defense all day, shooting 35 percent for their first three-game losing streak since 2010-11.

Zak Irvin led Michigan with 14 points.

Arizona has won some tough games to this point, knocking off Kansas State and San Diego State to win the Maui Invitational before outlasting No. 9 Gonzaga in overtime last week.

Michigan had taken a pretty big stumble over the past week, leaving the Wildcats a little wary of the Wolverines.

Michigan was the victim last weekend in one of college basketball's biggest upsets in recent years, losing 72-20 to New Jersey Institute of Technology, a 24-point underdog. The hangover still lingering, the Wolverines lost to Eastern Michigan after scoring 42 points against the neighboring school.

What worried Arizona was a bounce-back game by Michigan.

The Wolverines played in the Elite Eight last season - as did Arizona - and beat Syracuse earlier this year, so they're still a talented team. They also figured to be a little angry after two unexpected home losses.

The Wildcats made their mood a little worse.

Plagued by slow starts this season, Arizona made eight of its first nine shots to go up 20-9. The Wildcats kept dropping shots and filling up the highlight reel, going up 33-17 on a jump-out-of-the-gym, one-handed alley-oop by Johnson on a feed from York in transition.

Arizona made 15 of shots 24 in the first half, building a 36-25 lead.

Michigan kept up for the first few minutes, but faded quickly against Arizona's pressure.

The Wolverines went more than 7 minutes without a field goal and shot 7 of 22 in the opening half.

Little changed to start the second half.

Michigan missed its first six shots while Arizona had the fans leaping out of their seats every few trips down the floor.

The Wildcats opened with an 11-0 run highlighted by Ashley's two-handed alley-oop on an inbound play and York's 3-pointer from the corner.

But it was all Wildcats after that. Arizona held UTEP without a basket for more than 5 minutes while it pushed its lead up to 48-41 with a 10-1 run.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - Rondae Hollis-Jefferson had 13 points and eight rebounds, and No. 8 Arizona opened the Pac-12 season with a 73-49 rout over Arizona State on Sunday night.

Arizona (12-1) was sharp after an extended break, dominating Arizona State at both ends to quickly turn its rivalry game into a runaway.

The Wildcats took control with a big early run while building a 20-point halftime lead and kept the pressure up to get their conference season off to a rousing start.

Arizona had a rare good night from the free-throw line, making 16 of 19, and shot 51 percent despite a sloppy second half. Brandon Ashley and Stanley Johnson scored 13 points each.

Arizona State (8-6) beat then-No. 2 Arizona in Tempe last season, but had no chance at repeating the upset after finishing with more turnovers (22) than field goals (14).

Gerry Blakes had nine points to lead the Sun Devils, who shot 32 percent.

Arizona won its first 12 games before a surprising loss at UNLV on Dec. 23, ending a 39-game nonconference winning streak.

Coach Sean Miller spent the 11 days between game honing the Wildcats' focus and working on their problems areas, namely offensive rebounding and free-throw shooting.

Arizona State coach Herb Sendek shifted his team's momentum by shuffling his lineup.

Coming off a triple-overtime home loss to Lehigh, Sendek put Savon Goodman and Roosevelt Scott in the starting lineup and shifted Blakes to point guard. The Sun Devils followed with two of their most impressive victories of the season, beating Detroit by 39 and Harvard by 10.

Miller also shifted his lineup open the conference season, starting Hollis-Jefferson and Elliott Pitts over Johnson and Gabe York.

The change seemed to help Arizona's shooting, particularly from the perimeter early.

The Wildcats took their first five shots from the 3-point line and made four, with Hollis-Jefferson adding three free throws after being fouled on another.

Arizona was just as sharp defensively and raced away from Arizona State with a 15-1 run to go up 21-8.

Arizona State had trouble just getting into its offense, some of it from Arizona's pressure, but also because of sloppiness.

The Sun Devils had eight field goals (on 21 shots) and 13 turnovers in the first half.

Arizona hit 17 of 29 shots and led 45-25 behind Johnson's 13 points.

Arizona wasn't nearly as efficient offensively in the second half, but neither was Arizona State.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) - With all the offensive weapons that No. 7 Arizona possesses, point guard T.J. McConnell figured it was only a matter of time before he would be called on to score.

McConnell took advantage of Oregon's defensive tactics Thursday night for a season-high 21 points, and all five Wildcats scored in double figures during an 80-62 victory over the Ducks.

"I kind of knew when Pac-12 play started that they were going to try to force me to score," McConnell said. "When I was driving they kind of stayed on their man, so it freed up the shot for me and I just knocked them down tonight."

The win was the second for Arizona (14-1, 2-0) in its last five meetings with the Ducks (11-4, 1-1), and its first at Matthew Knight Arena, which opened in 2011.

"This is a hard place to play," Wildcats coach Sean Miller said. "Obviously a fantastic arena and a tough crowd, but most important, a very good team."

The Wildcats made it look easy at times. They got 14 points from Stanley Johnson, 13 from Rondae Hollis-Jefferson in his second start of the season and 11 from Kaleb Tarczewski. Brandon Ashley scored 10.

Joseph Young, the Pac-12's leading scorer at 20.1 points per game, led Oregon with 12. Jordan Bell added 11.

"Rondae did an excellent job on Joe Young," Miller said. "His length and his determination were a big reason we won."

Arizona had a 40-27 edge in rebounds, led by Tarczewski with 10 and Hollis-Jefferson with nine. The Wildcats shot 27 of 56 from the field (48.2 percent).

McConnell, who had 12 points in the second half, took advantage of the way Oregon defended him when his teammates set picks for him at the top of the key or on the wings.

"I was setting a lot of high ball screens for him," Tarczewski said, "and I saw that their guy was going under, so I moved my ball screen down a little bit and it got him open. "He did a great job of being aggressive on offense. I think everyone did that."

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - Stanley Johnson scored all 18 of his points in the second half, T.J. McConnell added 16 points in a rare display of offensive aggression and No. 10 Arizona rolled over No. 8 Utah 69-51 on Saturday.

Arizona (16-2, 4-1 Pac-12) came out shaky at both ends in the Pac-12's first game between Top 10 teams in nearly seven years. The Wildcats rallied behind McConnell, the pass-first point guard who creates his own shots while still setting up his teammates.

Johnson took over in the second half and the Wildcats shot 49 percent against one of the nation's toughest defensive teams to win their 32nd straight home game.

The Wildcats also outworked the Pac-12's best rebounding team, grabbing 21 more than the Utes (14-3, 4-1), including 17 on the offensive glass that led to 18 second-chance points.

McConnell had six assists, and Brandon Ashley added 14 points and eight rebounds.

Brandon Taylor had 12 points and Jordan Loveridge scored all of his 11 points in the second half for Utah.

Coming off victory over Colorado, Arizona coach Sean Miller said the Wildcats would be home underdogs against the up-in-your-face Utes. That wasn't completely true; the Utes were six-point underdogs according to the Glantz-Culver line.

Still, Miller had a point.

Utah entered McKale Center with a higher ranking and leading the Pac-12. The Utes also were among the national leaders in defensive scoring and shooting percentage, and have the dynamic duo of Delon Wright and Loveridge.

Utah sure looked like the better team early, starting with Wright's steal and breakaway dunk on the game's opening possession.

The Utes jammed up the Wildcats inside and they had no answer, missing seven of their first eight shots while Utah opened with a 10-2 run, with Wright having a hand in all 10 points.

The Wildcats clawed back behind their feisty bulldog of point guard, McConnell, who dribbled in and out of traffic to set up himself and his teammates.

McConnell had 12 points - two on a jumper over the 7-foot reach of Jakob Poeltl - two assists and set up his teammates for five free throws by halftime, helping Arizona build a 31-26 lead after its early funk.

Johnson took over in the second half, scoring nine quick points, including a breakaway dunk off a steal.

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) - Stanley Johnson had 19 points and seven rebounds and No. 7 Arizona handed Stanford its first home loss of the season with an 89-82 victory Thursday night.

Brandon Ashley added 17 points while playing with foul trouble in the Wildcats' 10th straight win in the rivalry.

Arizona (17-2, 5-1 Pac-12) tied the game at 52 with 14:34 left on Ashley's three-point play and went ahead on his 3-pointer the next time down the floor in a decisive sequence that helped the Wildcats pull away.

Chasson Randle scored 26 points and became just the third Stanford player to reach 2,000 points and 15th in conference history. UCLA's Jason Kapono was the last to reach the milestone in 2003.

Anthony Brown added 18 points and nine rebounds as the Cardinal (13-5, 4-2) dropped to 9-1 at home in Maples Pavilion and had a three-game winning streak snapped with just their second defeat in nine games.

Arizona moved back into a first-place tie in the Pac-12 standings, holding Stanford close to its 73.1 scoring average with a large contingent of Wildcats fans among the near-sellout of 6,943 fans.

Ashley scored Arizona's initial six points, and the Wildcats crashed the offensive boards to create second and third chances early.

Arizona hit 11 of its first 16 shots on the way to a 26-17 lead midway through the first half. But Stanford capitalized when the Wildcats cooled off - during a 1-for-7 stretch - and tied the game at 31 on Randle's two free throws with 4:36 left in the half.

Stanford outshot Arizona 54.5 percent to 53.8 on the way to a 41-39 halftime edge.

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) - Stanley Johnson had 18 points and nine rebounds, Dusan Ristic scored 12 points and No. 7 Arizona avenged last season's loss in Berkeley by crushing California 73-50 on Saturday night.

The Wildcats (18-2, 6-1 Pac-12) overcame early foul trouble to their frontcourt to finish the first half ahead by 10. They came out of the break with another big burst, going ahead by 24 points and cruising to their fourth consecutive win.

It was a small slice of redemption for Arizona after Cal upset the top-ranked and undefeated Wildcats 60-50 on Justin Cobbs' last-second shot a season ago at Haas Pavilion.

The Golden Bears (11-9, 1-6) are far from that team now. They've lost six straight and eight of nine games, falling into last place in the conference.

Jordan Mathews scored 16 points, and David Kravish had 16 points and 11 rebounds for the Bears, who lacked the bodies to match up against a deep and talented Arizona team.

The Wildcats outshot the Bears 49 to 43 percent and outrebounded them 31 to 25. They also showed off their depth, outscoring Cal's bench 24-0.

Cal was coming off an embarrassing 79-44 home loss to Arizona State - the second-worst home loss in school history - on Thursday in a battle of last-place teams in the conference. Wildcats coach Sean Miller warned his team not to take the Bears lightly, especially with what happened here last year.

Cal could hardly run its offense in the opening minutes as Arizona's smothering defense disrupted plays before they ever took shape. The Wildcats, though, had their share of miscues, including five consecutive turnovers that stalled its momentum.

Center Kaleb Tarczewski and Ashley also sat out much of the half in foul trouble.

The Bears briefly took the lead before Arizona regrouped, putting together a 14-2 run over the final four minutes of the first half sparked by their transition game. The Wildcats led 29-19 at the break and moved ahead 42-25 early in the second half.

Together, it was a 27-8 run between the end of the first half and the start of the second that put Arizona in control. Wildcats fans took over, too, with chants of "U-of-A!" that drowned out the home crowd.

About 19 people representing 15 NBA franchises were credentialed for the game, which was part of Coaches vs. Cancer week with coaches sporting sneakers and suits.

Golden State Warriors coach and former Wildcats standout Steve Kerr also was in attendance along with most of his coaching staff. Kerr's daughter, Maddy, is a sophomore on Cal's volleyball team.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - Brandon Ashley scored 12 points and T.J. McConnell had a career-high eight steals to spark No. 6 Arizona's smothering defense, lifting the Wildcats to a 57-34 victory over Oregon State on Friday night.

Arizona (20-2, 8-1) held Oregon, the Pac-12's top-scoring team, to 56 points on Wednesday and was even better against the methodical Beavers.

The Wildcats limited Oregon State to 28 percent shooting and shut down Beavers leading scorer Gary Payton II to win their 34th straight home game.

McConnell also had seven points and six assists, while Elliott Pitts hit a couple of big shots in the second half for the Wildcats.

Oregon State (14-7, 5-4) handed Arizona its only conference loss earlier this month by attacking Arizona's defense. The Beavers were the ones on their heels in the rematch, unable to get anything to fall inside or out, finishing 3 for 15 from 3-point range.

Olaf Schaftenaar led Oregon State with eight points. Payton finished with six on 3-of-13 shooting.

The Beavers pulled off the upset of the Pac-12 season so far, knocking off Arizona 58-56 on Jan. 11 for their first win over a top-10 team in 15 years.

Oregon State gave the Wildcats fits with its zone in that game, holding Arizona to 37 percent shooting, including 4 for 17 from 3-point range, and a season low in points.

The Beavers also took advantage of individual matchups at the other end, exploiting weak links in Arizona's defense.

But that game was in Corvallis. This one was at McKale Center, one of the toughest road venues in college basketball.

The Wildcats also were coming off one of their best games of the season, a 90-56 rout over Oregon, and Oregon State just had one of its worst, a 73-55 loss at Arizona State.

The patient Beavers managed to keep the game at their pace in the first half, working the shot clock down to keep it close.

The Wildcats shifted the tide late in the half behind their defense, holding Oregon State scoreless over the final 7:45.

The Beavers hit 6 of 20 shots in the first half, including 1 for 8 from 3-point range. The Beavers also had 11 turnovers, five of those on steals by McConnell.

Arizona scored the final 11 points of the half to lead 24-13.

The second half was even more defensively dominated.

Arizona missed its first nine shots, while Oregon State opened 1 of 8.

Pitts gave the Wildcats a quick lift, scoring on a three-point play and 3-pointer in transition, and Arizona stretched the lead to 34-21.

The Beavers struggle against Arizona's pressure, finishing 8 of 29 in the second half to spoil any chance of a comeback.

Holder, who had two points in 12 minutes the first game, was the catalyst, repeatedly beating Arizona defenders off the dribble.

The freshman had a hand in every point during a 9-0 run, finishing the first half with 10 points and five assists. The Sun Devils hit 15 of 29 shots, including 4 of 9 from 3-point range, and led 41-34 at halftime after a steal led to a last-second putback by Willie Atwood.

Arizona was good offensively early, but became a bit discombobulated when McConnell went to the bench with his second foul midway through.

Goodman helped Arizona State keep its cushion early in the second half, bullying his way to the rim for eight points in the opening 4 1-2 minutes.

Arizona chipped away at the lead as the game became more chippy, getting it within a single possession with just under 4 minutes left.

The Sun Devils kept them at arm's length from there.

Gerry Blakes, who had 14 points, hit a 3-pointer to put Arizona State up 68-63 and Barnes helped seal the upset, hitting a fadeaway 3-pointer with just under a minute left.

Brandon Taylor made a 3-pointer with 1:57 remaining to give Utah a 57-55 lead. York then drew Jakob Poeltl's fifth foul and made one free throw and then rebounded his miss on the second attempt and put it in to give the Wildcats a 58-57 lead with 1:39 to play.

Hollis-Jefferson, who had 10 points, made 3 of 4 free throws in the final minute and York hit two more to clinch the Wildcats' 13th straight win over Utah (22-6, 12-4 Pac-12).

Kaleb Tarczewski led Arizona (26-3, 14-2) with 13 points while Stanley Johnson had 12 points and 11 rebounds. The Wildcats now lead the conference standings by two games with two games remaining.

After dominating Utah 69-51 earlier in the season thanks to a big rebounding advantage, the Wildcats again bullied the Utes on the boards, 44-35, to overcome 33-percent shooting.

Delon Wright had 17 points and Jordan Loveridge scored 10 before fouling out as the Utes finished the season 16-1 at home.

Taylor, Utah's second leading scorer, got his first points of the game on a 3-pointer to put the Utes up 47-41, with 8:11 remaining and get the sellout crowd roaring.

But York hit a 3 and Hollis-Jefferson dunked to draw within one point again. It was back-and-forth from there as the game had seven lead changes in the last 7 minutes.

The first half was the physical battle many expected between the conference's two best defensive teams. Arizona jumped out to a 17-8 lead but the Utes fought back and took a short lead before the half ended with Arizona ahead 29-28. The teams were whistled for a combined 25 fouls.

The Wildcats (27-3, 15-2) already had clinched at least a tie for the conference title and the No. 1 seed in next week's Pac-12 tournament.

It was the most one-sided victory for Arizona and most lopsided loss for Cal this season.

Kaleb Tarczewski added 14 points and Stanley Johnson had 12 for the Wildcats, who had six players in double figures in their seventh straight win. McConnell finished without a turnover.

The Wildcats won their 37th straight at home, the longest active streak in NCAA Division I.

Cal kept up very briefly, then Arizona turned it on, outscoring the Bears 29-8 to go up 41-20 on Tarczewski's two free throws with 3:13 left in the half.

The Wildcats finished the half in spectacular fashion. With 4.9 seconds left, McConnell drove the length of the court and passed to Tarczewski for a dunk at the buzzer and a 48-27 lead.

Ashley matched his career best of 21 points with an inside

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - T.J. McConnell had 10 points and 11 assists in his final home game, helping No. 5 Arizona close out the regular season with a 91-69 victory over Stanford on Saturday.

Arizona (28-3, 16-2 Pac-12) led by 16 points at halftime despite McConnell being in foul trouble and fought through a chippy second half to extend the nation's longest home winning streak to 38 games.

Brandon Ashley had 15 points and Rondae Hollis-Jefferson added 14 for the Wildcats, the No. 1 seed in next week's Pac-12 Tournament after ending the season with an eight-game winning streak.

McConnell left to a standing ovation and kissed the McKale Center "A" logo at center court after leaving the game with about 3 minutes left.

Chasson Randle had 16 points and Stefan Nastic added 14 for Stanford (18-12, 9-9), which lost seven of its final 10 games.

Arizona had little to gain from this game other than maintaining momentum into next week's Pac-12 Tournament after wrapping up its second straight conference title with Thursday's 39-point win over California.

Stanford needed a big boost to have any shot at making the NCAA Tournament.

The Cardinal dented their chances with a 67-62 loss to Arizona State on Thursday and lost starting forward Michael Humphrey to a sprained left ankle 4 minutes into the game. The 6-foot-9 freshman was out against Arizona and is questionable for the start of the Pac-12 Tournament.

Stanford managed to hang with the Wildcats well into the first half, overcoming a slow start to pull within 27-25.

Arizona took over after that, forcing the Cardinal into one tough shot after another during a 13-0 run that made it 42-27.

The Wildcats made 16 of 29 shots - 5 of 9 from 3-point range - and led 47-31 at halftime after York hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer. And they did it without much help from McConnell, who played 8 minutes after picking up two fouls.

The game got physical to open the second half, with players pushing, shoving and falling to the court as the crowd grew animated.

It did nothing to change the outcome.

Stanford managed to pull within 12, but Arizona stretched the lead again behind a three-point play on a two-handed dunk by Hollis-Jefferson and another two-hander by Kaleb Tarczewski over Nastic.

LAS VEGAS (AP) - Arizona was unable to get much of a flow against California's physical defense in the first half.

Once the Wildcats got rolling, there was no stopping them.

Stanley Johnson had 19 points, Brandon Ashley added 15 and No. 5 Arizona ran away from Cal in the second half for a 73-51 victory in the Pac-12 tournament quarterfinals Thursday.

"The familiarity, the intensity (of conference tournaments) can sometimes catch you off-guard," Arizona coach Sean Miller said. "I don't know if it necessarily caught us off-guard, in the first half, but we really regained who we are in the second half."

Top-seeded Arizona (29-3) had trouble shaking the Bears in a rough first half before taking control with a run sparked by its defense early in the second.

Rondae Hollis-Jefferson had 10 points, six rebounds and was the catalyst for Arizona's defense.

T.J. McConnell added 13 points and six rebounds for the Wildcats, who move on to face the winner between USC and UCLA in Friday's semifinals.

"They played well in the first half and we kind of stagnated," McConnell said. "Credit Cal for that, but we made the plays when we needed to."

No. 8 seed Cal (18-15) played better than it did in two blowout losses to Arizona during the regular season, but faded after the Wildcats made their second-half run.

Tyrone Wallace had 19 points to lead the Bears, who shot 34 percent. David Kravish had 12 rebounds, but was held to six points on 3-of-13 shooting.

"It's tough when you don't establish a post presence," Cal coach Cuonzo Martin said. "We need spacing around the floor and move the ball out of the post to find shooters."

Arizona won its second straight Pac-12 regular-season title and is trying to add something that had been elusive: The conference tournament title.

The Wildcats have reached the title game three times in Miller's six seasons, but have not won the championship since 2002, when Luke Walton was tournament MVP.

The first step was to knock off Cal, a team they beat by a combined 62 points in two games this season.

The Bears rolled over Washington State in the opening round with an impressive offensive show and stood toe to toe with Arizona in a physical first half.

Cal didn't shoot particularly well, but limited Arizona's second chances and was steady defensively to stay within 33-27 at halftime.

"We were battling. When shots went up, we were trying to find bodes," Wallace said. "On the offensive end we were able to get some shots down."

Hollis-Jefferson was the spark for Arizona. The athletic forward is always revved up, but seemed to have it in an extra gear against Cal.

He soared in for a tomahawk dunk over Kingsley Okoroh, blocked Wallace from behind and guarded different players on three straight possessions during one stretch.

Hollis-Jefferson also got tangled with Dwight Tarwater, which led to a shove and some jawing, and had to be escorted away by the officials after colliding with two players diving for a loose ball.

Hollis-Jefferson continued to fight for every inch and loose ball, and had a dunk in transition during a 9-0 run that put Arizona up 46-32.

"Rondae does everything for us," Miller said. "He made some big plays defensively for us and a couple times in transition really ignited us."

Arizona stretched the lead after its early run, smothering the Bears defensively to reach the tournament semifinals for the fifth straight year.

LAS VEGAS (AP) - Brandon Ashley scored 20 points, Stanley Johnson added 14 and No. 5 Arizona crushed Oregon 80-52 Saturday night to win its first Pac-12 tournament title in 13 years.

Top-seeded Arizona (31-3) rolled over Oregon in a dominating first half, building a 15-point lead with a flurry of 3-pointers and baskets in transition.

The Wildcats let up a little defensively in the second half, but were even better on offense to polish off their first Pac-12 championship since Lute Olson was coach and Luke Walton was tournament MVP in 2002.

T.J. McConnell had 12 points and six assists for the Wildcats, who shot 54 percent.

Oregon (25-9) was out of it almost from the start after Arizona went on two big first-half runs. The Ducks played better offensively in the second half, but had no chances of catching the racing Wildcats.

Joseph Young had 19 for Oregon, which still should be in good position to get an NCAA Tournament invite on Selection Sunday.

Arizona has been in this spot before; the Wildcats were playing in their fourth Pac-12 championship game in Sean Miller's six years as coach.

Winning it has been another story. Arizona Pac 12 title drought included a loss to UCLA in the championship game last season.

The Wildcats won the regular-season title and got to this year's championship game by beating California and UCLA.

Oregon had a strong finish to the regular season, then beat Colorado and Utah to strengthen its NCAA Tournament chances.

Arizona rolled over the Ducks twice during the regular season, winning by 18 in Eugene and 24 in Tucson.

The Wildcats did it to the Ducks again, blowing past them with a 14-0 run in the first half and another 10-0 spurt to lead 36-21 at halftime.

Arizona hit 15 of 31 shots, had eight offensive rebounds and held the Ducks to 7-of-25 shooting. The Wildcats also hounded Young, holding him to seven points - two after a quick flurry to start the game - on 2-of-10 shooting.

Oregon played better offensively in the second half and Young got untracked. The Ducks made 11 of 20 shots and Young confidently stroked in jumpers, scoring 13 in the half.

Oregon never put a dent in Arizona's lead, though, because it couldn't stop the Wildcats.

Arizona made 15 of 24 shots in the second half, stretching the lead even more as the clock wound down.

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) - Rondae Hollis-Jefferson had 23 points, 16 in the first half, along with 10 rebounds and the second-seeded Arizona Wildcats overwhelmed No. 15 seed Texas Southern from the start for a 93-72 victory in their NCAA Tournament opener on Thursday.

Pac-12 freshman of the year Stanley Johnson added 22 points for the balanced Wildcats (32-3), who led by as many as 27 points at Portland's Moda Center. Arizona goes on to meet the winner of Thursday's game between seventh-seeded VCU and No. 10 seed Ohio State.

Madarius Gibbs had 15 points for Texas Southern (22-13), which won an automatic bid as the winner of the Southwestern Athletic Conference Tournament. Gibbs, also the Tigers' top scorer during the regular season, was the SWAC Player of the year.

It was the 12th straight win for the Wildcats, who were coming off an 80-52 thrashing of Oregon in the Pac-12 Tournament championship game last weekend.

Brandon Ashley added 14 points for Arizona. The junior forward missed Arizona's run to the Elite Eight in last year's NCAA Tournament because of a foot injury, but was named the conference tournament's most outstanding player after averaging 19.6 points and 6.3 rebounds in three games.

Texas Southern was making its second straight appearance in the tournament after a 62-58 victory over Southern for the SWAC Tournament title. Last season the Tigers fell to Cal Poly in their NCAA Tournament opener.

The Wildcats rolled through last year's tournament with victories over Weber State, Gonzaga and San Diego State before falling to Wisconsin in the round of eight. Gone from that team are Aaron Gordon and Nick Johnson.

The teams had never met, but Arizona was wary going into the game because of Texas Southern's regular-season upsets at Michigan State and Kansas State. The Wildcats, meanwhile, had dropped games to unranked challengers UNLV, Oregon State and Arizona State.

The Wildcats took a 15-2 lead, subduing the smaller Tigers from the start. Ashley's dish to Dusan Ristic under the basket for a layup extended the lead to 17-4.

Deverell Biggs' steal and fast-break layup narrowed the gap slightly to 21-11 for Texas Southern. But Arizona responded to go up 40-20 on Hollis-Jefferson's dunk with 4:15 left in the half.

Hollis-Jefferson led all players with 16 points and 7 rebounds at the break, and the Wildcats led 54-33. Tonnie Collier had eight points in 7 first-half minutes off the bench for the Tigers. He finished with 10 points.

Arizona stretched the lead to 66-39 on Elliott Pitts' layup in the second half, but coach Sean Miller was judicious with his starters. The Wildcats outrebounded the Tigers 35-19.

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) - Gabe York made five 3-pointers and finished with 19 points, T.J. McConnell also scored 19 points and second-seeded Arizona advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third straight year with a 73-58 victory over 10th-seeded Ohio State on Saturday.

The Wildcats (33-3) overcame a sluggish start until their outside shooting busted the Buckeyes' zone defense, which they rarely used during the regular season but broke out for the NCAA Tournament. The Pac-12 champions went ahead by 15 points with 6:34 remaining and held off Ohio State (24-11) in the closing minutes.

Arizona will face the winner of Xavier-Georgia State in the West Regional semifinals Thursday in Los Angeles.

The Buckeyes gave the Wildcats all they could handle, even with standout freshman and likely NBA lottery pick D'Angelo Russell struggling with his shot. Russell scored nine points and made just 3 of 19 shots after going for 28 points in Ohio State's overtime win over VCU in its tournament opener.

Russell had seven rebounds and six assists in what was probably his final collegiate game. He wore a bandage to cover the five stitches he received above his left eye after taking an elbow in Thursday's game and spent the final minutes on the bench listening to Arizona's fans chant "U-of-A!" as their team ran away.

Sam Thompson added 18 points and Shannon Scott scored 10 for the Buckeyes, who led by six points in the first half but never could match Arizona's size. The Wildcats won the rebounding battle 43-26.

It was sweet redemption for the Wildcats and coach Sean Miller, who lost on a last-second shot to Ohio State in the regional semifinals two years ago. And it was the first time in three tries Miller beat close friend and Ohio State coach Thad Matta, who also handed Miller's Xavier team a last-second defeat in the 2007 tournament.

The Wildcats remain on track for another revenge game: a rematch against Wisconsin in the regional final. The Big Ten champions, who eliminated Arizona in last year's regional final, are the top seed in the West.

And if they can continue to turn in these types of performances, the Wildcats like their chances.

Miller had pleaded with his team to improve its defense after beating Texas Southern 93-72 in its opening game. Arizona answered its coach's call, though the offense took longer to come around this time.

The Wildcats looked slow and stagnant most of the first half against Ohio State's smothering zone. In the second half, they worked the ball at a blistering pace and started hitting shots from outside.

York hit four 3-pointers during one stretch. He finished 5 of 9 from long range to help Arizona go up 59-44 with 6:34 to play during the clinching stretch.

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Just when Arizona appeared to be in serious trouble against underdog Xavier, T.J. McConnell sparked his Wildcats back to the brink of the Final Four.

McConnell scored 13 of his 17 points in the second half, freshman Stanley Johnson added 12 points, and second-seeded Arizona made a dominant late rally for a 68-60 victory over sixth-seeded Xavier in the West Regional semifinals on Thursday night.

Kaleb Tarczewski had 12 points and 12 rebounds as the Wildcats (34-3) weathered a major scare from the Musketeers (23-14) and clamped down defensively during a game-ending 19-7 run.

With its third Elite Eight berth in five years, Arizona gets another shot its first Final Four under coach Sean Miller, who led Xavier for five years until 2009.

The Wildcats will face top-seeded Wisconsin (34-3) on Saturday at Staples Center in a rematch of last season's West final.

"It's almost as if we had a summer to think about it, and we have to somehow make that to our advantage," Miller said.

Matt Stainbrook had 17 points and 10 rebounds in his final game for Xavier, which fell just short of its first trip to the Elite Eight since 2008. Those Musketeers were coached by Miller and assistant Chris Mack, who replaced his boss.

With its 14th straight victory, Arizona has another chance to reach its first the Final Four since 2001 - but only after getting a late boost from McConnell, the senior who turned 23 on Wednesday. The point guard is Miller's surrogate on the court, and he made all the right moves down the stretch.

Xavier moved ahead early in the second half and led 53-49 with seven minutes remaining - but with their season in danger, the Wildcats finally went to work.

Arizona's sizable crowd awoke as the Wildcats made an 11-2 run that included a 3-pointer from McConnell with 4:18 to play. Even more importantly, Arizona held the Musketeers without a field goal for an 8:35 stretch in the final minutes after getting shredded on the interior earlier in the game.

Johnson, the Orange County product likely headed to the NBA after one season at Arizona, managed just two points after halftime. The Wildcats' upperclassmen took charge late, with McConnell and Tarczewski scoring the biggest points and leading the defensive effort.

Arizona largely shut down Stainbrook, the Musketeers' glasses-wearing, Uber-driving MBA student and leading scorer. He made just one field goal after halftime, part of their 9-for-23 performance from the field.

The game was a bittersweet reunion for Miller, who reluctantly left Xavier for a bigger job at Arizona. At Miller's urging, the Musketeers gave the job to Mack, who has led Xavier to three Sweet 16 berths during six winning seasons while navigating the school's move to the Big East.

After an even first half, the game appeared to be bending toward Xavier, which took a lead early in the second. The Musketeers even managed to get points on a possession featuring two air-balled 3-point shots, when Stainbrook caught the second miss and got fouled.

Neither team made a major move in the first half, which ended in a 28-28 tie. Although Johnson scored 10 points, his four fellow Arizona starters were a combined 5 for 19, and the Wildcats couldn't score in the final 3:47.

Xavier appeared to be thoroughly unimpressed by the enormity of the stage, comfortably keeping pace with 10 points from Stainbrook and solid interior play. Only an 0-for-7 effort on 3-pointers prevented the Musketeers from taking a halftime lead.

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Frank Kaminsky and the Wisconsin Badgers hung on to make the Final Four again.

"Frank the Tank" scored 29 points, Sam Dekker added his second straight career high of 27 and the West Regional's top seed beat No. 2 Arizona 85-78 on Saturday to reach consecutive Final Fours for the first time in school history.

The Badgers (35-3) denied the Wildcats (34-4) a Final Four berth for the second straight year, having beaten them by one point in overtime in Anaheim a year ago when their seeds were reversed.

Wisconsin and 67-year-old coach Bo Ryan head to Indianapolis next week hoping for another shot at undefeated and top-seeded Kentucky, which beat the Badgers by one point in the national semifinals last year.

Rondae Hollis-Jefferson and Brandon Ashley scored 17 points each for the Wildcats. T.J. McConnell added 14 points in his last college game and Kaleb Tarczewski and Gabe York had 11 each.

The Badgers hit 10 of 12 3-point attempts in the second half, outscoring the Wildcats 30-3 from long range.

Arizona pressured full court in the last 4 minutes, making for some perilous possessions by the Badgers as they darted and passed trying to safely get the ball down court. A long inbound pass by Wisconsin was nearly intercepted before Josh Gasser grabbed it, got fouled and made both free throws to keep the Badgers ahead by 10 points.

The Wildcats twice got within five points in the last 2 1/2 minutes, but both times Dekker dashed their hopes with arcing 3-pointers.

Kaminsky led the Badgers' offensive outburst to start the second half. He scored eight of their 14 points, working their inside-outside game to perfection in finding Dekker for a 3-pointer to put Wisconsin ahead 44-36.

Hollis-Jefferson and Tarczewski picked up their third fouls and freshman Stanley Johnson left the game to have his contact lens adjusted, all in quick succession. It didn't faze the Wildcats, who went on a 10-3 run to close to 47-46.

Dekker hit Wisconsin's fifth 3-pointer of the second half, launching a 10-2 spurt that gave the Badgers a 57-48 lead. Nigel Hayes added a 3 and Kaminsky scored on a reverse layup before getting called for his third foul.

Arizona led 33-30 at halftime after missing 7 of 8 field goals to start the game.

The Badgers jumped to a 10-2 lead to start the game, with Ashley going to the bench after two quick fouls. He soon returned, scoring six straight points that tied the game and gave the Wildcats a stronger presence in defending Kaminsky, who had 13 points in the half.
