SEASON DATA: Arizona (19-15, 8-10 Pac-10) won 19 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the 24th consecutive season, which is the longest active postseason streak in all NCAA divisions and the second longest in Division I history ... The Cats were a No. 10 seed in the West Region games in Washington, D.C., and marked just the ninth NCAA Tournament game for the program in the Eastern Time Zone in 67 all-time games played ... Freshman guard Jerryd Bayless earned second-team All-America accolades from *Sports Illustrated*, marking the program's first such honor since the 2004-05 campaign ... UA's 19 wins and 8-10 conference record did bring two streaks to an end - Arizona had won 20 or more games in each of the previous 20 seasons and posted an above .500 league record each year since 1984-85.

THE RANKINGS: Arizona finished the season unranked in both polls for the 11th consecutive week. For the season, the Wildcats were ranked in either or both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Top 25 polls in eight of 21 polling periods this season. It continues a streak that has seen the Wildcats earn a national ranking in 21 consecutive seasons, dating back to 1987-88.

ARIZONA INTERIM HEAD COACH KEVIN O'NEILL ... completed his fourth season at Arizona and his first as the Wildcats' interim head coach ... In his 12th season as a college head coach, O'Neill has a career record of 171-180 (.487) and 19-15 (.559) at Arizona ... Prior to his return to Tucson, O'Neill had spent the previous seven seasons in NBA circles in which he was the head coach of the Toronto Raptors for one season (2003-04/33-49/.402) and an assistant coach for the New York Knicks, Detroit Pistons and Indiana Pacers for five seasons ... In those seasons on the bench, O'Neill's squads made five NBA playoff appearances with the Pistons advancing as far as the Eastern Conference Finals in 2003 ... O'Neill was the head coach at Marquette University for five seasons (1989-94), guiding the Golden Eagles to a 86-62 (.581) record and three postseason appearances, including two NCAA Tournament appearances ... His 1994 MU club won the Great Midwest Conference championship ... O'Neill spent three seasons as the head coach at the University of Tennessee (1994-97), where he guided the Volunteers to a 36-47 (.434) record and an appearance in the 1996 National Invitational Tournament ... From there, he moved to Northwestern University (1997-2000), where he posted a 30-56 (.349) record that included a berth in the 1999 N.I.T. ... It was just the third postseason appearance in school history and the third winning season for the program in the previous 29 seasons ... O'Neill was named Great Midwest Conference Coach of the Year in 1993 and 1994. He was assisted by Josh Pastner and Miles Simon.

THE BEAT GOES ON: 2008 marked Arizona's 24th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance, which is the longest active streak and second longest tournament appearance streak in NCAA history. The streak trails only North Carolina, which made 27 straight appearances from 1975-2001. Regarding the active streak, each of the top five teams made it into the 2008 NCAA Tournament (Arizona 24, Kansas 19, Kentucky 17, Duke 13, Michigan State 11).

ARIZONA IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICAL RANKINGS: As a team, Arizona ranked in the top 30 nationally in five statistical categories: assist:turnover ratio (1.27:1/19th), free throw percentage (.749/20th), field goal percentage (.478/21st), three-point field goal percentage (.390/26th) and turnovers per game (12.2 topg/26th). Individually, UA players ranked in the top 100 of nine categories: Jerryd Bayless, points per game (19.7 ppg/37th) and free throw percentage (.839/59th); Chase Budinger, points per game (17.1 ppg/94th); Jordan Hill, field goal percentage (.620/10th), rebounds per game (7.9 rpg/72nd) and blocked shots per game (1.6 bpg/72nd); and Nic Wise, assists per game (4.4 apg/95th), steals per game (2.0 spg/45th) and assist:turnover ratio (2.16:1/44th).

ALL-AMERICA: Jerryd Bayless was a second-team All-American as selected by *Sports Illustrated*. Bayless is the 22nd Wildcat to earn a total of 85 All-America honors since 1950-51. Additionally, he is the first UA freshman to earn All-America kudos since Jason Gardner in 2000 and the first Wildcat of any sort to earn such accolades since Channing Frye and Salim Stoudamire in 2004-05.

ALL-AMERICA: Jerryd Bayless was a second-team All-American as selected by *Sports Illustrated*. Bayless is the 22nd Wildcat to earn a total of 85 All-America honors since 1950-51. Additionally, he is the first UA freshman to earn All-America kudos since Jason Gardner in 2000 and the first Wildcat of any sort to earn such accolades since Channing Frye and Salim Stoudamire in 2004-05.

FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICA: Jerryd Bayless also earned freshman All-America kudos from collegeinsider.com. It marked the third straight season in which UA had at least one freshman All-America pick, as Bayless joined Marcus Williams (2006) and Chase Budinger (2007) in that distinction.

ALL-REGION: Two Arizona players earned all-region honors in voting recently released by the NABC and the USBWA. Jerryd Bayless was a first team all-District 15 pick by the NABC, while Chase Budinger claimed second team honors. Additionally, Bayless was an all-District IX selection by the USBWA.

ALL-CONFERENCE: Four Arizona players earned all-Pac-10 honors in voting released March 10 by the league's head coaches. Jerryd Bayless was a second team all-conference honoree, while Chase Budinger was a second-team pick. Additionally, Jordan Hill was an honorable mention all-league and all-defensive team selection and Jawann McClellan was an honorable mention all-defensive team honoree. Bayless also was named to the all-freshman team.

ALL-ACADEMIC: Bret Brielmaier was named to the Pacific-10 Conference's All-Academic team. A 6-foot-7, 237-pound forward, Brielmaier was one of five players selected to the first team. The senior from Mankato, Minn., carries a 3.09 grade point average and is majoring in Interdisciplinary Studies, while averaging 2.7 points, 2.9 rebounds and 0.5 assists per game in 21 appearances this season. It is the first time that Brielmaier has been honored by the conference. Brielmaier is the 10th Wildcat to earn Pac-10 All-Academic honors since 1985-86. He is the first to be so honored since Jason Ranne and Andre Iguodala in 2003-04.

A COACHING TIMELINE: Here is a quick rundown on the chain of events regarding the Arizona coaching staff. On Nov. 4, it was announced that UA head coach Lute Olson would be taking a leave of absence due to a personal matter. During this period, assistant coach Kevin O'Neill accepted the head coaching responsibilities. On Dec. 7, Olson announced that he would not return this season. On Dec. 18, O'Neill was tabbed as Olson's successor. On March 10, it was announced that Olson would resume the head coaching responsibilities once this season was complete. During Olson's leave of absence all games will be credited to O'Neill's coaching record.

SCHEDULED TO RETURN: With the 2007-08 season now in the annals of history, here is a quick look forward to 2009. Heading into that campaign, Arizona is scheduled to return a total of eight letterwinners (Bagga, Budinger, Hill, Horne, Johnson, Onobun, Tangara and Wise), which could mean that 57.7 percent of the scoring (1,410 of 2,443 points), 59.4 percent of the rebounding (625 of 1,052 rebounds), 49.4 percent of the assists (260 of 526 assists) and 53.4 percent of the minutes played (3,668 of 6,875 minutes) could be back as well.

ELITE COMPANY: Jerryd Bayless' 11 points in the NCAA Tournament capped a season in which he placed himself among some elite company. The 6-foot-3 guard from Phoenix, Ariz., finished the season as the highest-scoring freshman in school history – one of just three players to score more than 500 in his debut season. He finished the season with 592 points scored in 30 appearances (19.7 ppg). Here is the complete list: 1.) Jerryd Bayless (2007-08), 592; 2.) Coniel Norman (1972-73), 576; 3.) Gilbert Arenas (1999-2000), 523; 4.) Sean Elliott (1985-86), 499; 5.) Eric Money (1972-73), 492; 6.) Chase Budinger (2006-07), 484; 7.) Mike Bibby (1996-97), 458; 8.) Salim Stoudamire (2001-02), 434; 9.) Marcus Williams (2005-06), 430; 10.) Bob Elliott (1973-74), 429; and 11.) Michael Wright (1998-99), 404.

LOOK IN THE RECORD BOOK: In addition to his single-season point total listed above, Jerryd Bayless made quite a dent in the Arizona record book. Beyond becoming the first Wildcat to ever score 30 or more points in three consecutive games, the freshman guard also accomplished the following: the UA single-game record for free throws made (18 vs. Houston), the single-game record for free throw attempts (20 vs. Houston), the single-game record for free throw percentage (16-of-16 vs. Stanford), his 39 points vs. Arizona State on Feb. 10 equaled the ninth-highest total in school history, and his .839 free throw percentage (187-of-223) ranks fifth on the UA career list, while his 187 made free throws ranked fourth on the single-season list.

BETTER WITH AGE: Sophomore forward Chase Budinger continues to play under the weight of expectation, and it should be stated that the 6-foot-7 forward continues to produce and improve. In 34 games, Budinger improved on nearly every statistical category, most notably minutes per game (35.3), three-point FG percentage (.380), assists (2.9 apg) and scoring (17.1 ppg). He is just the sixth player in Arizona history to score 1,000 career points as a sophomore, accomplishing the feat in just 61 appearances.

KEYS TO VICTORY: Look no further than the field goal percentage column as an indicator of UA success. This year, the Cats were a spotless 15-0 when shooting better than their opponents and 4-15 when not. On the year, UA shot 47.8 percent from the field (843-of-1,765), a figure that was 37 percentage points higher than the opposition. UA has held foes to less than 40 percent shooting nine times in 2007-08. Additionally, the Cats are 13-0 when shooting 50 percent or better from the floor.

SHOULDERING THE LOAD: Arizona's regular starters accounted for 88.3 percent (2,158 of 2,443) of the scoring. No matter your perspective, the 285 points contributed by the UA bench is the fewest by percentage in school history, going back to 1931-32, the first year on file with complete individual statistics.

GET ON THE GLASS: Rebounding was an Arizona area of concern all year long, as the club posted a -1.6 rebound margin during the season, the program's worst effort since 1982-83. During Pac-10 play it was even worse at -4.5. When Arizona outrebounded the opposition, the club was 8-2. All told, the Wildcats were outrebounded in 14 of 18 Pac-10 games. On the positive side, UA was 3-1 when it managed to win the rebounding battle in league play.

YOUNG AND PRODUCTIVE: Make no mistake about the 2007-08 Wildcats — they were a very young bunch. There were seven freshmen and sophomores on the 15-man roster, including four in the regular starting lineup, and that septet accounts for 81 percent of the scoring, 65 percent of the rebounding, 72 percent of the assists and 66 percent of the minutes played.

A RARITY AROUND HERE: Guard Jerryd Bayless narrowly missed becoming the first freshman and 15th player in school history to score at least 600 points in a season. At the Pac-10 Tournament, Bayless passed Coniel Norman (576 points in 1972-73) as the highest-scoring freshman in Arizona history, finishing the season with 592 points. Salim Stoudamire was the last Wildcat to top the 600-point plateau, when he tallied 662 points in 2004-05. Furthermore, Bayless' 19.7 ppg scoring average was the highest for a UA player since Jason Gardner averaged 20.4 ppg in 2001-02.

CENTER OF ATTENTION: Forward Jordan Hill finished 2007-08 as the Pac-10 field goal percentage leader with a .620 (184-of-297) figure. What's interesting is that the 6-foot-10 sophomore averaged just 8.7 attempts per game, third on the team. He ranked fourth on the team in minutes played (29.4), which may underscore his true value. When Hill plays 30 minutes or more, UA was 11-5 and he took an average of 12.6 shots. When that MP figure is 29 or fewer, the team is 8-10 with just 5.5 attempts. A year ago, Hill averaged 4.7 points, 4.1 rebounds and 14.1 minutes played in 29 games, so he's come a long way in terms of his productivity. He also ranked fourth in the Pac-10 with a 1.7 blocked shots per game average.

NCAA Tournament Facts

Arizona has made 24 consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament, the longest active streak in the nation. Since UA's streak began in 1985, 265 different teams have played in the NCAA Tournament. In that span, Arizona ranks fifth in games played and number of wins, and is one of just 18 schools to post at least 20 tournament victories.

As a measure of consistent excellence, Arizona is one of just 11 schools to have appeared in at least 18 of the last 24 NCAA Tournaments. The Wildcats' .629 winning percentage ranks eighth. No school with 18 or more appearances since 1985 has a cumulative losing record.

CLAWING HIS WAY BACK: The Wildcat with the most postseason experience (six games) certainly showed a lot of heart in overcoming a number of setbacks. After playing in all four games of UA's 2005 NCAA Tournament run, Jawann McClellan has beaten injuries (wrist, knee) and academic difficulties following the death of his father in 2005 to become UA's glue guy. He averaged 35.1 minutes, 8.4 points and 3.6 rebounds to go with 92 assists, 22 blocks and 22 steals and a .386 three-point FG percentage.

MIGHT BE MOST VALUABLE: Nic Wise more than proved his worth this year by averaging 9.2 points, 2.3 boards and 4.4 assists per game. He ranks third among Pac-10 players in assists per game and three-point FG percentage (.472), second in steals (2.0 spg) and fourth in assist:turnover ratio (2.16). He missed seven games due to knee surgery and the Cats were 16-7 with both Wise and Jerryd Bayless in the line-up. Those contributions are solid for a guard who averaged just 8.1 minutes per game last year.

GETTING DEFENSIVE: In 34 games, the Wildcats managed to limit the opposition to an average of only 66.9 points per game, which is the lowest scoring defense figure for the program in seven seasons. Only Arizona's 2001 Final Four club was stingier on the defensive end (66.3 ppg). Eight times in 2007-08 Arizona held the opposition to less than 60 points.

SCORING 80: Perhaps no statistic is more telling of UA success, as the squad is 170-19 (.899) since the start of the 1997-98 season when scoring at least 80 points. Arizona was 8-0 this season when topping the 80-point plateau.

IN MARCH: Since the start of the 1996-97 season, Arizona has a 50-25 (.667) record in the month of March. In that span, 35 of those games have been played in the NCAA Tournament and UA is 24-11 (.686) in those affairs.

AN UNUSUAL UNDERDOG: When looking at Arizona's tournament history, it hasn't played as a seeded underdog too often. Since 1985, the Wildcats have played a total of 62 NCAA Tournament games, and only 18 of those had Arizona as the lower seed. UA has a 7-11 (.389) record in those contests.

GEOGRAPHIC SIGNIFICANCE: The road trip that brought Arizona to Washington, D.C., is the second-longest the program has taken for an NCAA Tournament appearance (1,952 miles), topped only by UA's trip to Philadelphia in 2006 (2,057 miles). Additionally, it was just Arizona's 18th NCAA Tournament game east of the Mississippi River (8-10), following stops in New Orleans (0-1), Philadelphia (1-1), Rosemont, Ill. (1-1), Raleigh (0-1), Milwaukee (0-1), Indianapolis (2-0), Birmingham (2-0), Memphis (2-0), Dayton (0-1), Charlotte (0-1), Atlanta (0-1) and Washington, D.C. (0-1).

CAPPED NICELY: Jerryd Bayless capped his freshman campaign rather nicely as the 11th pick of the first round of the 2008 NBA Draft by the Indiana Pacers. He is the eighth Arizona underclassman to enter the draft early and be selected since 1991, joining Brian Williams (1991), Mike Bibby (1998), Gilbert Arenas (2001), Richard Jefferson (2001), Michael Wright (2001), Andre Iguodala (2004) and Marcus Williams (2007), and is the 60th Arizona product to be selected in the NBA Draft since 1948. He is also the 15th first-round draft pick in school history and the ninth Lottery pick since 1989.

MATRICULATION: When it comes to the NBA Draft, no school is called more often than the University of Arizona. Since the NBA Draft was shortened to two rounds in 1989, Arizona leads the nation with 29 players picked in that span. That figure amounts to nearly half of the 60 players in school to be selected by NBA clubs. Of the 29 players selected in the last 20 years, 13 have been first-round selections, including nine Lottery Picks. Here are the top five programs nationally:

EARLY SIGNEES: The Arizona coaching staff signed four student-athletes to National-Letters-of-Intent during the November early signing period. Brandon Jennings (G, 6-0, 170) from Lakewood, Calif., Oak Hill Academy; Brendon Lavender (G, 6-4, 180) from Mesa, Ariz., Mountain View High School; Emmanuel Negedu (F, 6-7, 230) from Bloomington, Ind., Brewster Academy; Jeff Withey (C, 6-11, 240) from San Diego, Calif., Horizon High School, will join the squad next fall. According to rivals.com, this class was ranked as the seventh-best nationally.
