## 2011-12 SEASON PREVIEW

**Returning All-Pac-10 Performers...** There'll be plenty of opportunities for Pac-10 student-athletes to make a name for themselves as the league returns just two first team All-Pac-10 performers, and three second team selections. First team honorees include California guard **Jorge Gutierrez** and UCLA forward **Reeves Nelson**. Second team picks include Oregon State guard **Jared Cunningham**, California forward **Harper Kamp** and Arizona State guard **Trent Lockett**.

**Opportunities Abound...** Once again the young and talented student-athletes in the Pac-12 will have the opportunity to fill the roles of those who have moved on. . . Missing will be the league's top seven scorers, including the top four who were NBA draft picks. . . Missing will be eight of the league's top nine rebounders.

**Coach Speak...** UCLA coach **Ben Howland** needs three conference wins to reach 100 league victories, while Washington coach **Lorenzo Romar** needs five wins. When they reach that milestone, they'll join current California coach **Mike Montgomery** (247) as a select group of 20 coaches in Pac-12 history to record 100 or more league victories. The last time three or more coaches had 100 league victories at the same time? It was 1964 - Oregon State's Slats Gill (276), UCLA's John Wooden (171) and USC's Forrest Twogood (121).

**Huskies Prevail, Again...** Washington successfully defended its Conference Tournament crown. The Huskies are just the second team to win back-to-back postseason titles since the Arizona Wildcats won four straight from 1988-90 and 2002.

**Home Sweet Home...**For the second straight season, Conference teams finished the year with a winning record at home... League teams posted a 87-16 (.845) record at home in non-conference action.

**Home Away from Home...** Check the Pac-12 rosters and you'll find 21 student-athletes who hail from 10 different countries outside the United States. Those countries are: Australia (6), Canada (6), Denmark, Germany, Mexico, Russia, Senegal (2), Sudan, Sweden, and Ukraine.

**How I Spent My Summer...** Four Pac-12 teams took the opportunity to polish their games on foreign soil. California hit the Scandinavian countries of Sweden, Norway and Denmark. Oregon ventured to Italy, while Stanford toured Spain. USC went south of the equator for a series of games in Brazil.

**Older and Wiser...** Last year, Conference rosters included a total of just 17 seniors (1.7 per team). This year, 39 seniors (3.3 per team) grace the Pac-12 rosters. Here is the breakdown of seniors by team:

**What's New?...** Two teams and one coach. With the expansion from the Pac-10 to the Pac-12, the league welcomes Colorado and Utah. While Colorado head coach **Tad Boyle** has past experience in the Pac-12 as an Oregon assistant (1995-97), Utah welcomes first-year coach **Larry Krystkowiak**.

**Scheduling...** The Pac-12 will continue to play an 18-game schedule. However, with the expansion, the league slate will include a pair of "misses" at home and on the road for each set of travel partners. Here's a look at which pair of games will be absent from the schedule:

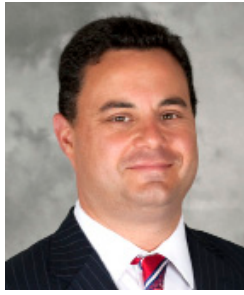

**STRENGTHS** - In just his second season at the helm of the Wildcats, coach **Sean Miller** guided Arizona to the Elite Eight and was within one bucket of reaching the Final Four . . . With one of the nation's top incoming freshman classes (ranked fourth in the country by Rivals.com), the Wildcats will look to rely on freshmen **Josiah Turner** and **Nick Johnson** to make an immediate impact in the Arizona backcourt. However, they'll still need to contend with veteran guards **Kyle Fogg** (8.1 ppg/2.6 apg) and **Jordin Mayes** (4.9 ppg). Mayes shot 45.3 percent from three-point range and was tabbed All-Pac-10 Freshman honorable mention . . . Forwards **Solomon Hill** (8.0 ppg/4.7 rpg) and **Jesse Perry** (6.6 ppg/4.4 rpg) provide a veteran and experienced frontcourt. Hill is the only returning player to start all 38 games last season, while Perry saw action in all 38 games . . . Junior guard/forward **Kevin Parrom** (7.6 ppg/3.4 rpg) adds versatility to the Wildcat lineup... Arizona went 17-0 at home last season and has a current home win streak of 19 games, making McKale Center an intimidating venue.

**CONCERNS** - Replacing Derrick Williams, the Pac-10 Player of the Year and second overall pick in the NBA Draft. He posted 19.5 ppg, 8.3 rpg and shot 59.5 percent from three-point range . . . With the transfer of Momo Jones, point guard duties may fall to a freshman . . . The Wildcats lose nearly 40 percent of the team's total scoring with the absence of Williams and Jones . . . Lost Jamelle Horne, a 40-percent three-point shooter, to graduation . . . A difficult non-conference schedule includes battles with St. John's, San Diego State, Florida, and Gonzaga. In all, 11 of Arizona's opponents for the 2011 season have played in the NCAA Tournament in the past two seasons . . . The 'Cats will need to cut down on the turnovers as they committed 12.7 per game . . . Mayes is recovering from foot surgery after suffering a stress fracture in last season's NCAA Tournament. Mayes spent much of his summer in a walking boot, but should be back on the court in September.

**STRENGTHS** - Junior G **Trent Lockett**, the team's leading scorer last season at 13.4 points, wasn't afraid to mix it up on the inside where the second team All-Pac-10 selection grabbed 5.3 rebounds per game. He will anchor a young and talented backcourt that includes sophomore **Keala King** (3.7 pg/2.6 rpg) and top freshman point guard **Jahii Carson**. Carson, ranked by ESPNU as the eighth-best point guard in the 2011 class, is the nation's only incoming freshman to earn a spot on USA Basketball's U19 World Championship Team . . . Sophomore forward **Kyle Cain** led the team in rebounds, averaging 5.5 per game last season (fifth-best average by a freshman in ASU history). He'll be counted on to add more frontcourt scoring. He shot a team-best 54.5 percent from the field in posting 5.4 points per game . . . Good size up front with junior center **Ruslan Pateev** (7-0, 249) and sophomore center **Jordan Bachynski** (7-2, 243). Those two combined for 5.8 points, 4.3 rebounds and 44 blocked shots . . . A favorable schedule has the Sun Devils playing only one true road game among the first 12 non-conference games.

**CONCERNS** - The only Pac-12 squad that does not have a senior, the Sun Devils will need the underclassmen to be prepared to log plenty of minutes over a demanding Pac-12 schedule that has them starting on the road for the first three games of league play at rival Arizona, USC and UCLA. The road in league play was a challenge last season as the Sun Devils finished 1-8, dropping their final seven on the opponent's court . . . Will need to find another consistent scoring option to pair up with Lockett, especially from three-point range. With the departure of seniors Ty Abbot, Rihards Kuksiks and Jamelle McMillan go 186 three-pointers. Returning players accounted for just 40 treys, led by sophomore guard/forward **Chanse Creekmur** who connected for 20 three-pointers. . . Need to convert at the charity stripe as the Sun Devils hit only 63 percent of their free throws.

**STRENGTHS** - While most teams in the Pac-12 will rely on youth to bridge the gap created by the early departure of the star talent in the league, the Cal Bears turn to seniors **Jorge Gutierrez** (14.6 ppg/4.5 apg/1.6 spg) and **Harper Kamp** (14.2 ppg/5.6 rpg) for leadership. And it's not the obligatory "senior leadership" to describe this team as these guys have the skills. . . Gutierrez and Kamp earned All-Pac-10 honors and, with sophomore guard **Allen Crabbe**, provide the Bears with their top three scorers from a year ago. One of the bright stars in the league, Crabbe was tabbed Pac-10 Freshman of the Year after he averaged 13.4 points and 5.3 rebounds, to go along with 62 three-pointers he connected on at a 40 percent clip from beyond the arc. . . In addition to Gutierrez running the point, the Bears can turn to junior guard **Brandon Smith** (6.4 ppg) to distribute the ball. Smith dished out 3.9 assists and was among the league leaders with a 1.68 assist/turnover ratio. . . The veterans have experience in tight games as the Bears were 6-6 in games decided by four or fewer points, which bodes well in handling pressure in crunch time. . . Coach **Mike Montgomery** has posted 247 wins in league play. Only four other coaches have won more in Pac-12 play, and three of them are in the Basketball Hall of Fame - Arizona's Lute Olson (327), UCLA's John Wooden (304) and Oregon State's Slat's Gill (276). . . The Bears summer tour took them to Scandinavia where they posted a 4-1 record.

**CONCERNS** - The Golden Bears lost just one senior in Markhuri Sanders-Frison, but he was their top rebounder who finished with an average of 7.4 rpg. However, sophomore forward **Richard Solomon** (5.6 ppg/4.4 rpg) and his team-leading 27 blocks will look to pick up the minutes played by Sanders-Frison. . . California will take on five non-conference opponents that won at least 20 games last season, and 10 teams that received bids to the 2011 NCAA tournament. . . A demanding schedule that includes neutral site games vs. Georgia and either Notre Dame or Missouri, plus road contests at San Diego State and at UNLV.

**STRENGTHS** - Coach **Tad Boyle** led the Buffaloes to a school-best 24 wins last season and an appearance in the postseason NIT semifinals at Madison Square Garden. . . Sophomore guard **André Roberson** will be counted on to help Boyle rebuild the Buffaloes as they begin their transition to the Pac-12. Roberson averaged 6.7 points, a team-best 7.8 rebounds, and 1.3 steals in just 22.3 minutes of action per game. . . Senior guard **Nate Tomlinson** will pair with Roberson in the Colorado backcourt. He is one of two returning starters, having averaged 3.1 points and 2.5 assists. . . The other returning starter is senior forward **Austin Default**. He averaged 6.6 points and 4.2 rebounds . . . Talented freshmen guards **Askia Booker** and **Spencer Dinwiddie**, a Rivals150 recruit, provide Boyle with back-court depth and the skills to play at a high pace. Dinwiddie is considered the 25th best point guard in the 2011 class.

**CONCERNS** - Replacing five student-athletes to graduation and the production of Alec Burks, an NBA First Round draft pick (12th overall pick by the Utah Jazz). Burks averaged 20.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 2.9 assists. . . The Buffaloes will need to find scoring as they lose their top four scorers that accounted for 2,258 points or 74.6 percent of the team's scoring. . . As key contributors to the success of this year's team, Roberson and Default will need to avoid foul trouble that plagued each of them last season. . . Will need to develop game-time experience as only four returning players averaged better than five minutes per game. . . Will need to adjust to a Pac-12 schedule that calls for three sets of back-to-back road games, and one stretch of three straight road games in unknown venues.

**STRENGTHS** – Six players from last year’s 21-18 squad return to build on the program’s 12th season of 20 or more wins. Capturing the postseason CBI title should build confidence for three returning starters in junior forward **E.J. Singler** (11.7 ppg, 5.6 rpg), senior forward **Tyrone Nared** (5.1 ppg/3.9 rpg) senior guard **Garrett Sim** (8.2 ppg) . . . Diminutive sophomore guard **Johnathan Loyd** gives the Ducks experience in the backcourt as he averaged 4.7 points and 2.3 assists in just under 20 minutes of action per game last season. . . The Ducks went on a 10-day exhibition tour of Italy at the end of August, where they finished 2-3 against five professional Italian teams. Incoming freshman guard **Jabari Brown** averaged 15.4 ppg on the foreign excursion . . . The aforementioned Brown is a five-star recruit and the 19th-best hoopster in the 2011 class, according to Rivals.com . . . Incoming guard **Brett Kingma** of Mill Creek, Wash., is also on the Rivals150 list at No. 135. Kingma hit a team-leading 11 three-pointers in Italy at a 45.8 percent clip. . . Six straight December home games should help the Ducks prepare for the Pac-12 slate.

**CONCERNS** – The departure of Joevan Catron, who was the team’s leading scorer (15.9 ppg) and rebounder (6.7 rpg), will leave a void for the Ducks. He is now a Wollongong Hawk in Australia’s National Basketball League . . . Replacing Catron’s production should come from senior **Jeremy Jacob**, who averaged 6.2 points and 3.5 rebounds. However, he missed half of last season due to injury. He did average 7.5 points/4.5 rebounds in four games during Oregon’s exhibition tour. . . This year will be an educational one for Oregon as nine of the 15 team members are newcomers. The roster has five transfers and four incoming freshmen . . . Oregon will have several challenging non-conference road games. It opens up its non-conference schedule in Nashville, Tenn., against Vanderbilt, who hovered around the top-25 for most of last season. Then the Ducks will have trips to Nebraska and BYU.

**STRENGTHS** – Junior guard **Jared Cunningham** will look to take the Beavers to the next level and will have plenty of experience with him in Corvallis. Cunningham earned Second Team All-Pac-10 and All-Pac-10 Defensive Team honors after averaging 14.2 points, 3.1 rebounds and a conference-leading 2.83 steals per game. . . In addition to Cunningham, the Beavers return three other starters in frontcourt junior forward **Joe Burton** (7.0 ppg/5.6 rpg), junior center **Agnus Brandt** (4.8 ppg/2.5 rpg) and sophomore forward **Devon Collier** (7.0 ppg/4.4 rpg). . . The backcourt is solid with experience. Joining Cunningham are sophomore guards **Ahmad Starks** (7.8 ppg) and **Roberto Nelson** (7.5 ppg). Starks hit a team-best 42 three-pointers, while Nelson scored a team season-high 34 points in the regular season final at Arizona State. . . With 11 returners and just two newcomers, familiarity should help the Beavers improve upon last year's 11-20 effort. . . The Beavers should be well-rested heading into the Pac-12 Tournament as their final three games over the last two weeks of the regular season are at home. . . The 18-game league schedule calls for four misses - two of those games are against perennial league favorites Arizona and UCLA.

**CONCERNS** – The Beavers face Texas in a November tournament in New Jersey, and then play either North Carolina State or Vanderbilt to wrap up the tournament. Regardless of who they meet, it will be a tough slate of non-conference games for Oregon State. Not that any other weekend will be easy when they get into Pac-12 play: OSU travels to Washington for its first Conference match-up, hosts the Bay Area schools the next week, and then heads to Arizona the following weekend. . . . While the Beaver backcourt is in good hands, OSU loses a pair of guards in Calvin Haynes and Lathen Wallace who contributed 16.2 points per game. In addition OSU loses leading rebounder Omari Johnson (6.2 rpg).

**STRENGTHS** – Twelve letterwinners, including four starters, return for coach **Johnny Dawkins'** Cardinal squad, led by senior forward **Josh Owens**. He returns as the team's top scorer and rebounder, averaging 11.6 points and 6.5 rebounds . . . Stanford relied on a solid freshman class last season and should reap dividends for that in 2011-12. Sophomore forward **Dwight Powell** (8.1 ppg/5.2 rpg) and sophomore guard **Anthony Brown** (8.7 ppg/3.2 rpg) earned All-Pac-10 Freshman team honors last season. . . Point guard duties will fall to sophomore **Aaron Bright** (5.1 ppg/2.0 apg) and junior **Jarrett Mann** (4.9 ppg/4.1 apg), but don't be surprised to see freshman **Chasson Randle** battle for playing time. Randle was considered the 20th best guard in the country for the 2011 class by Rivals.com . . . The team took a trip to Spain in early September to build team chemistry and get a jump-start on their on-court execution. They traveled to Madrid, Totana, Alicante and Barcelona, and faced six of Spain's top teams.

**CONCERNS** – The Cardinal will need to convert at the charity stripe. Returning players connected on just 63 percent of their free throws. . . Offensive star Jeremy Green contributed 16.7 points per game and shot 43 percent from the three-point line last season, but left a year early in declaring for the NBA Draft. His 88 three-pointers last season were nearly half the team's total (198) from beyond the arc. . . Stanford will face its biggest non-conference test Dec. 22 when they host back-to-back NCAA title competitor Butler. Then the Cardinal close the season with five road games over the final seven games of the regular season.

**STRENGTHS** – UCLA's frontcourt will be anchored by junior forward **Reeves Nelson** and sophomore center **Joshua Smith**. Nelson averaged 13.9 ppg and 9.1 rpg to earn All-Pac-10 First Team honors, while Smith tallied 10.9 ppg, 6.3 rpg and 34 total blocks to garner Pac-10 All-Freshman Team honors. . . Adding even more height to the team will be 6-10 twin brothers **David** and **Travis Wear**. The Southern California natives transferred from North Carolina last year and are now eligible to play after sitting out for a year. . . The frontcourt goes even deeper with junior forward **Brendon Lane** and sophomore center **Anthony Stover**, who each logged better than eight minutes of action per game. . . A senior backcourt is key to a team's success and the Bruins are blessed with point guard **Lazeric Jones** (9.1 ppg/3.6 apg) and **Jerime Anderson** (5.1 ppg/2.6 rpg). Each appeared in all 34 games, while Jones was the only Bruin to start each game.

**CONCERNS** – Point production from the bench. Last season the starting five accounted for 84 percent of the team's scoring. Anderson is the only returning non-starter to average more than 3.0 points per game. . . The Bruins lost a pair of All-Pac-10 performers in forward Tyler Honeycutt and guard Malcolm Lee, two huge contributors who declared early for the NBA Draft. As a sophomore, Honeycutt started all but one game, racking up 12.8 ppg, 7.2 rpg and a Conference-high 2.1 blocked shots per game, while Lee contributed 13.1 ppg while earning a spot on the 2011 Pac-10 All-Defensive team. . . Senior guard Jerime Anderson was suspended indefinitely from the team in late July and will miss at least the season opener. . . No true home court this season as Pauley Pavilion undergoes a renovation. Home games will be split between the Honda Center in Anaheim and the Los Angeles Sports Arena. . . UCLA's non-conference schedule includes battles against Kansas or Georgetown, depending on how the bracket turns out, in the EA SPORTS Maui Invitational, and then Texas at home in early December.

He collected Pac-10 All-Freshman team honors after posting 9.9 points per game, 3.2 assists per game, and set the USC freshman record for steals with 69. . . Sophomore forward **Garrett Jackson** (3.2 ppg/1.7 rpg) will be counted on to have a breakout year for the Trojans. He appeared in 33 games, and along with Jones are the only two returning players to have seen action in more than six games. . . Transfers **Dewayne Dedmon** and **James Blasczyk** bring major height to the team at 7-0 and 7-1, respectively. Dedmon has unusual agility and quickness for his height, and can score outside of the paint . . . Junior transfer **Aaron Fuller** will provide the Trojans will be a scorer in the paint, as well as mid-range. . . The Trojans traveled to Brazil in August for an exhibition tour, playing games in Sao Paulo and Rio de Janeiro. That gave freshman guard **Alexis Moore** and freshman forward **Byron Wesley** a great opportunity to acclimate themselves to USC basketball and their new teammates.

**CONCERNS** - Rebounding. After counting on Nikola Vucevic and Alex Stepheson to pull down 10.3 and 9.2 rebounds per game, respectively, the Trojans will need newcomers to make an immediate impact on the boards. USC's top returning rebounder is the 5-7 Jones at 2.6 rebounds per game . . . Senior guard **Jio Fontan** tore a knee ligament on USC's summer tour in Brazil and underwent season-ending surgery that will cause him to miss the entire 2011-12 season. He was the team's top returning scorer at 10.5 points, as well as assist leader with 3.9 per game. . . Depth, as only two players return that saw experience in more than six games. In fact, aside from Jones and Jackson, the other returning players combined for a total of 28 minutes of action. . . Never one to duck the competition, O'Neill has the Trojans playing one of the more difficult non-conference schedules.

**STRENGTHS** – Utah not only enters its first season in a new conference, but also with a new coach, **Larry Krystkowiak**. He comes to Salt Lake City from New Jersey, where he was an assistant coach for the Nets in 2010-11. He was also with the Milwaukee Bucks as an assistant in 2006-07 and as head coach in 07-08 . . . The Runnin' Utes are quite familiar with Pac-12 teams as they have an all-time record of 146-114 (.562) against league teams, and are 92-31 (.748) when hosting Pac-12 opponents . . . While the Utes only have four returning letterwinners, those four were major contributors last season. . . Senior point guard **Josh Watkins** is one of two returning starters from last year. He averaged 14.5 ppg and 3.5 apg last season . . . Standing at 7-3, senior center **David Foster** creates quite a distraction for the opposition. He averaged 2.9 points, 5.2 rebounds and ranked sixth nationally with 3.2 blocked shots per game. He'll be joined in the frontcourt by junior center **Jason Washburn** who posted 6.0 points per game on 61.8 percent shooting, and added 4.1 rebounds. . . Junior guard **Chris Hines** returns as the team's leading three-point shooter, hitting 31 treys at 37 percent. . . Incoming freshmen expected to battle for extended playing time are forward **George Matthews** and guard **Kareem Storey**. . . The Runnin' Utes are 526-124 (.809) all-time in their current home, the Jon M. Huntsman Center.

**CONCERNS** – The Utes have 11 new players on their 15-player roster. That means 73 percent of the team is new to the program. This turnover equals the loss of 72 percent of three-point shots, 59 percent of total scoring, 55 percent of rebounds and 48 percent of assists. In spite of the lack of returning production, the program has a history of success in its previous conference—12 regular-season conference titles in 21 years. . . Utah will need to take care of the ball as it posted a 0.70 assist-to-turnover ratio last season. . . Will need to look for a scoring threat from long distance as returners contributed just 51 buckets from beyond the arc.

**STRENGTHS** – Junior point guard **Abdul Gaddy** has been cleared to play after suffering a season-ending ACL tear last season. He led the Pac-10 in assist-to-turnover ratio at 3.1 (49 assists/16 turnovers) as a starter before his injury, so he is expected to lead the offense once again . . . The two-time defending Conference Tournament champions will rely on the shooting of senior **Scott Suggs** (7.4 ppg), and sophomore guards **C.J. Wilcox** (8.1 ppg) and **Terrence Ross** (8.0 ppg). That trio accounted for 156 three-pointers at a success rate of 40 percent. . . The Husky frontcourt will be anchored by stalwart senior forward **Darnell Gant** (5.2 ppg/3.8 rpg) and junior center **Aziz N'Diaye** (4.6 ppg/5.7 rpg). . . Coach **Lorenzo Romar** secured another talented freshman class, led by point guard **Tony Wroten**, guard **Hikeem Stewart** and forward **Martin Breunig**. All three appeared on the Rivals150 list, while Wroten was considered the fourth-ranked point guard and No. 14 overall player in the country for the 2011 class.

**CONCERNS** – The high-scoring Huskies, with a 83.1 points per game scoring average, lost their top three scorers in guard Isaiah Thomas (16.8 ppg, 6.1 rpg), dominant big man Matthew Bryan-Amaning (15.3 ppg, 8.0 rpg, 54 blocks) and Justin Holiday (10.5 ppg, 5.2 rpg). Thomas went to the Sacramento Kings as the 60th pick in the 2011 NBA Draft, while Bryan-Amaning and Holiday have signed with teams overseas. Their absence adds up to 51 percent of last year's offense. . . Washington heads east to play two marquee non-conference games in December when they take on Marquette in the Jimmy V Classic in Madison Square Garden, and Duke four days later in the same arena. . . The schedule doesn't get any easier when it comes to Pac-12 play as the Huskies finish the regular season with five of seven on the road. And to top it off, they'll have back-to-back trips to Los Angeles - first for a pair of games vs. USC and UCLA, then the Pac-12 Tournament.

**STRENGTHS** – The Cougars return three starters in junior guard **Reggie Moore** (9.1 ppg/3.0 rpg/3.4 apg), versatile senior guard **Marcus Capers** (5.8 ppg/4.4 rpg), and senior forward **Abe Lodwick** (3.5 ppg/4.1 rpg), that led WSU to the NIT semifinals and a 22-13 record. . . Third-year coach **Ken Bone** has sent the program on an upswing the last couple seasons, taking the team from last in Conference standings in 2009-10 to 6th in the Pac-10 and reaching the NIT Semifinals in the 2010-2011 season, posting the school's third 20-win season in five years. . . Freshman guard **DaVonté Lacey** is a top-50 shooting guard joining the Cougars from Tacoma, Wash., who will look to crack into the lineup. . . The Cougar backcourt is solid with Moore, Capers and senior **Faisal Aden**. Aden is the top returning scorer with an average of 12.7 ppg, while picking up 1.4 steals per game. . . Frontcourt experience will come from sophomore forward Brock Motum, who came off the bench last season to post a productive 7.6 points and 3.0 rebounds in just over 19 minutes of action per game. . . Veterans have experience in tight games as four contests went to overtime last year, most among league teams.

**CONCERNS** – A pair of key losses with Klay Thompson and DeAngelo Casto. All Thompson did was lead the league in scoring (21.6 ppg), while adding 5.2 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 1.6 steals. He declared early for the NBA and was the No. 11 pick of the Draft (Golden State). Meanwhile, Casto, who averaged 12.0 points and a team-leading 6.8 rebounds to go with 59 blocked shots, departed school early and is now playing professionally in Turkey. Those two accounted for 45 percent of the offense and 33 percent of the team's rebounds. . . Even though the Cougar roster contains four seniors and four juniors, the schedule is not kind as six of their first eight games are away from home - a tough slate, even for a veteran team.

The ARIZONA Wildcats reached the Elite Eight where they bowed out of the NCAA Tournament to eventual national champion Connecticut just one three-pointer short of reaching the Final Four, the WASHINGTON STATE Cougars reached the semifinals of the NIT, and the OREGON Ducks captured the CBI crown to give the Pac-10 its second title in three seasons of the CBI Tournament. . . . Oregon's **Joevan Catron** earned CBI Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors, while All-America honors rolled in for Arizona's **Derrick Williams**, who was a consensus Second Team All-America selection. He earned second team honors by the USBWA, NABC and the Associated Press, as well as collecting John R. Wooden All-America honors. . . . Five Pac-10 teams won 20 or more games for the fourth time in five seasons. . . . The road was a tough place to play in league action as the home team held a 58-32 (.644) advantage. It was the most wins compiled by the home teams since 1999 (62-28).
