2013-14 SEASON PREVIEW

Returning All-Pac-12 Performers... Three first team All-Pac-12 performers, and three second team selection return in 2013-14. First team honorees include ARIZONA STATE guard **Jahii Carson**, COLORADO guard **Spencer Dinwiddie**, and STANFORD forward **Dwight Powell**. UCLA guard **Kyle Anderson**, CALIFORNIA guard **Justin Cobbs**, and WASHINGTON guard **C.J. Wilcox** were second team picks.

Coach Speak... Excluding Washington coach **Lorenzo Romar**'s 118 wins in Pac-12 play, California coach **Mike Montgomery** has more Pac-12 wins (272) than the 10 other Pac-12 coaches combined (258).

Champs - Regular Season/Tournament... UCLA won its 31st Pac-12 title and first since 2008. Meanwhile, the OREGON Ducks captured their third Pac-12 tournament crown. Oregon was the fifth different school over the last six years to win the league's postseason trophy. It's the fifth consecutive year that the regular season champion did not capture the league's postseason title. Since the Pac-12 reinstated the league's postseason tournament in 2002, only three teams won both the regular season and tournament titles - Stanford (2004), UCLA (2006) and UCLA (2008).

Home Sweet Home... League teams posted a 79-16 (.831) record at home in non-conference action.

Home Away From Home... Check the Pac-12 rosters and you'll find 25 student-athletes (six more than last season) who hail from 14 different countries outside the United States. Those countries are: Canada (6), Australia (3), Serbia (3), Brazil (2), Germany (2), Cameroon, Denmark, Egypt, Hungary, Iran, Netherlands, Russia, Senegal, Sweden.

Pull Out The World Map... Colorado's **Spencer Dinwiddie** was a member of Team USA at the World University Games in Kazan, Russia where he averaged 7.9 ppg, and a team-leading 5.5 assists per game... STANFORD's **Dwight Powell** and Arizona State's **Jordan Bachynski** led the Canadian Development Men's National Team to victory over Dinwiddie and Team USA at the World University Games... Arizona freshman forward **Aaron Gordon** and Washington freshman guard **Nigel Williams-Goss** were teammates for gold medal-winning Team USA at the FIBA U19 World Championships in Prague, Czech Republic. Gordon was selected MVP of the U19 World Championships after averaging 12.6 ppg and 6.2 rpg... UCLA's **Bryce Alford**, Arizona teammates **Brandon Ashley** and **Rondae Hollis-Jefferson**, Oregon's **Damyean Dotson** were on the training roster at the U19 trials... Colorado junior **Beau Gamble** and freshman **Chris Jenkins** are members of Athletes-in-Action that will tour Lithuania in August... STANFORD's **Roscoe Allen** earned a spot on Hungary's roster for the U20 European Championship in Pitesti, Romania, while Cardinal teammate **Stefan Nastic** represented the Serbian National Team at the XVII Mediterranean Games in Mersin, Turkey... Arizona State will travel to China this summer as part of the Pac-12's Globalization Initiative.

Returning Starters.. Each Pac-12 team has at least two returning starters, with an average of 2.9 returning starters per team. Here is the breakdown of the number of returning starters by team:

Only In L.A.... Two coaching changes this year, and both are in Los Angeles. UCLA welcomes **Steve Alford**, while USC brings in **Andy Enfield** to lead the Trojans. You have to go back to the 1921 when both UCLA and USC hired new basketball coaches in the same year when USC tabbed Bill Hunter and UCLA named Caddy Works to lead their respective programs. Although, Henry Bibby finished up the 1995-96 season as USC's interim head coach, then had the interim dropped before the 1996-97 season. That was the same season Steve Lavin was named UCLA's interim head coach, before taking permanent status of the position in 1997.

Bench Knowledge... Arizona hired former Wildcat point guard **Damon Stoudamire** as an assistant coach during the summer. He's not the only three-time All-Conference guard sitting on a Pac-12 bench. UCLA's Director of Operations **Tyus Edney** also shared three-time All-Pac-10 honors with Stoudamire from 1993-95.

STRENGTHS - The Wildcats have posted three consecutive 20-win seasons under coach **Sean Miller**, including a Sweet 16 appearance last season. . . While the Wildcats have lost their top two scorers in All-Pac-12 guard Mark Lyons and NBA first round draft pick Solomon Hill, they do return three solid starters – junior guard **Nick Johnson** (11.5 ppg/3.6 rpg/3.2 apg/1.9 spg), sophomore center **Kaleb Tarczewski** (6.6 ppg/6.1 rpg/53.8 FG%), and sophomore forward **Brandon Ashley** (7.5 ppg/5.3 rpg). . . With the departure of Lyons, the Wildcats will count on sophomore transfer **T.J. McConnell** to handle point guard duties. Senior guard **Jordin Mayes** (2.8 ppg) and sophomore guard **Gabe York** will give the Wildcats depth in the back court. . . The Wildcats will depend on a stellar recruiting class that includes a pair of McDonalds All-American forwards in freshmen **Aaron Gordon** and **Rondae Hollis-Jefferson**. Gordon was a member of Team USA U19 squad that won the FIBA world championship this summer and was named MVP.

CONCERNS - With forwards Hill and Grant Jerrett headed off to the NBA, the 'Cats will need to rely on the newcomers to help out on the glass. . . That Cats were second in the league, shooting 74.9 percent from the charity stripe. However, returning players only converted 69.7 percent from the free throw line. . . The NIT Season Tip-Off and a road tilt at Michigan will be a good measure for how the top recruits can perform against top non-conference competition before heading into league play.

STRENGTHS - The Sun Devil back court is expected to be one of the best in the league with sophomore **Jahii Carson** and senior transfer **Jermaine Marshall** (10.5 ppg/4.0 rpg). Carson was named Pac-12 Co-Freshman of the Year as he led all freshmen in the nation in scoring at 18.5 points per game and added 5.25 assists per contest in a league-leading 37.2 minutes per game. He is the first freshman to average 18.5 points/5.1 assists since Chris McGuthrie of Mount St. Mary's notched the feat in 1992-93 (19.8/5.1). Marshall led Penn State in scoring last season, and was sixth in the Big Ten, with 15.3 points per game. . . Senior center **Jordan Bachynski** (9.8 ppg/5.9 rpg) shot an efficient 58.3 percent from the field, while his 3.4 blocks per game (Pac-12 record 120 blocked shots) were key in ASU limiting the opposition to 41.0 percent field goal shooting. . . Junior forward **Jonathan Gilling** (9.7 ppg/6.1 rpg) continues to give the Sun Devils a scoring threat from beyond the arc with a league-best 84 three pointers (2.40 per game). Big improvement on the boards for Gilling as he raised his rebound average from 1.8 as a freshman to 6.1 last season.

CONCERNS - Will miss the do-everything talent of Carrick Felix, a second round NBA Draft pick. Felix averaged 14.6 ppg, 8.1 rpg, and a team-best 50 steals . . . The Sun Devils need to convert at the charity stripe. Their 64.9 percent free throw percentage was last in the Pac-12. . . Experience coming off the bench. Aside from the three returning starters, only two returning letterwinners appeared in more than half the team's games - sophomore F/C **Eric Jacobsen** (32 games/7.3 minutes per game) and junior G **Bo Barnes** (28 games/4.1 minutes per game).

CONCERNS - Crabbe's All-American performance, with 18.4 ppg and a .348 three-point field goal percentage, will be tough to replace as, aside from Cobbs, only three returners averaged more than five points per game...California was last in the Conference in three-point field goals and three-point field goal percentage, and they will have to look to extending the floor beyond the arc...The Bears also have tough competition in the Maui Invitational, where Cal will face some of the top talent in the nation including Syracuse who brought an end to the Bears' tourney run last year.

STRENGTHS - Coach **Tad Boyle** aims to continue his streak of three-straight 20-win seasons and back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances. The two consecutive tourney visits are the first such occurrence for the Buffs in 50 years...Boyle will have a seasoned squad of four returning starters to work with, including first team All-Pac-12 junior guard **Spencer Dinwiddie** (15.3 ppg), who spent his summer representing Team USA at the World University Games after pacing the Buffs in points per game and assists (99 total, 3.0 apg)...Junior guard **Askia Booker**, who started in all 33 games and finished second to Dinwiddie in points per game last season (12.4 ppg), also returns to a strong backcourt...Colorado's front line includes sophomore forwards **Josh Scott**, an All-Pac-12 freshman team honoree, and **Xavier Johnson**. The two combined for a solid 19.1 ppg and 10.5 rpg...The Buffs were undefeated at home during the non-conference slate, finishing the year with a 12-3 overall and 6-3 conference record on their home court, so the mid-season stretch of five out of seven at home will prove beneficial for CU.

CONCERNS - The Buffs lost Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year Andre Roberson (347 rebounds/11.2 rpg) and look to replace his powerful rebounding style as he totaled nearly 200 more boards than rebounding runner-up Adams (178 reb)...Colorado will also miss senior guard Sabatino Chen (4.4 ppg, 2.2 rbg), a key reserve and team leader...CU's assist game looks to improve as well as no Colorado player had more than 100 assists last season. The Buffs were at the bottom of the league in total assists (328) and assists per game (9.9)...CU concludes the regular season with three straight road games before the Pac-12 Tournament.

Sophomore guard **Damyean Dotson**, who was second on the squad in scoring (420 pts/11.4 ppg), will also return for Oregon after starting 36-of-37 games as a true freshman and earning Pac-12 All-Freshmen Team honors along the way...Sophomore guard **Dominic Artis** looks to build upon a solid freshman-year performance (8.5 ppg/3.2 apg) where he started in 25 of his 28 appearances and was a fairly consistent three-point shooter (34-of-95, .358)...The Ducks landed highly-touted UNLV transfer **Mike Moser**, a fifth-year senior who provides four seasons of experience at forward. Moser posted 14.0 ppg and 10.4 rpg in 2011-12 and is looking to bounce back with Oregon after injuries limited his playing time as a senior.

CONCERNS - Oregon's obstacles primarily include replacing three starters. Four of the five top scorers will not be returning, and UO will need players to step up and account for a combined 32.5 points per game... With the four-member senior class holding two transfers and limited playing time, incoming transfers and freshmen will face pressure to contribute immediately... Oregon will open the season with a tough matchup in the Armed Forces Classic against Georgetown, the co-Big East Champions and No. 2 seed in last year's NCAA Tournament.

STRENGTHS - The Beavers have possibly the lowest turnover risk from last season as they only lose one starter and return their top two starting scorers in guard **Roberto Nelson** (17.8 ppg) and forward **Devon Collier** (12.6 ppg), two members in a well-rounded group of experienced seniors...Collier, who only started 15 games but appeared in all 32 with an average of 25.5 minutes per game, combines with junior forward **Eric Moreland** (9.4 ppg/10.6 rpg) to provide a formidable pair in the low post. Moreland had an impressive sophomore campaign where he led Oregon State in rebounds (307/10.6 rpg), and has been tough around the basket with his 73 blocked shots (2.52 bpg). The two combined to shoot 53.6 percent from the field... Redshirt senior center **Angus Brandt** is expected to provide a very physical presence in the paint after senior F/C Joe Burton's departure. Brandt scored an average of 11.3 ppg in four games last season, including his first career double-double against Alabama on Nov. 15, before a season-ending injury.....The Beavers certainly don't lack in the height department with six players standing 6-10 or taller.

CONCERNS - With the transfer of guard Ahmad Starks (10.4 ppg), and his team-leading 64 three-pointers, Oregon State's will need to look for consistent three-point threat to join Nelson...In addition, the Beavers will need to replace the 183 combined assists by Starks and Burton who contributed a 1.5 assist/turnover ratio. Returning players combined for a 0.9 assist/turnover ratio...Sophomore guard **Challe Barton** (11 starts, 16.9 minutes per game) should get a good opportunity to fill the stat sheet with assists.

STRENGTHS - The Cardinal made its 23rd appearance in the postseason over the last 26 seasons, advancing to the second round of the NIT Tournament last year...Stanford won't suffer from a high turnover rate as they return four starters who had an ability to score and distribute the ball, with three players averaging more than 10 points per game...A strong core of experience along the front line will boost Stanford, including returning senior forwards **Josh Huestis** (10.5 ppg/9.0 rpg) and All-Pac-12 honoree **Dwight Powell** (14.9 ppg/8.4 rpg), who combined to form the league's top rebounding tandem (17.4 rpg)...Powell, the team's leading scorer, was the only player ranked among the league's top-10 in Pac-12 games in both scoring and rebounding...Junior guard **Chasson Randle** (13.6 ppg) will continue to advance the Cardinal's downtown game, as he knocked down 61 of his 170 three-point attempts last season. Randle spent his summer with Huestis in the training camp for Team USA in preparation for the World University Games, will...Adding to Stanford's backcourt is senior guard **Aaron Bright** (9.3 ppg/3.4 apg), who notched a .321 three-point field goal percentage and led the team in assists with 103 (3.4 apg).

CONCERNS - Stanford finished their season ranked last in the Pac-12 in field goal percentage (.416) and ninth in field goal percentage defense (.425)...Of the Cardinal's five top scorers, no one shot over .500, one of just three conference teams to net the same results...The Cardinal will need more physical play on the glass. While Huestis and Powell provided a one-two punch on the boards, no other player added more than 2.9 rebounds per game, and that was 6-1 guard Randle.

Alford is 463-225 over the course of 22 seasons as a collegiate head coach, and most recently coached at New Mexico where he saw six postseason appearances, three of which were NCAA Tournament berths...Versatile guard **Kyle Anderson** will come back as a sophomore after spearheading the Bruins' rebounding effort with 302 total rebounds (8.6 rpg), which ranked sixth overall in the league. He also added 9.7 ppg and 3.5 apg...The Bruins also have returning experience in senior forwards **Travis Wear** (10.9 ppg/5.2 rpg) and **David Wear** (7.1 ppg/5.0 rpg) and junior guard **Norman Powell** (6.1 ppg/2.2 rpg)...Notable sophomore returners include forward **Jordan Adams** and forward **Tony Parker** (2.4 ppg/1.2 rpg). Adams was the second leading scorer for the UCLA squad with 15.3 ppg hit a team-high 46 three-pointers. Adams also led the Conference in steals (73, 2.2 steals per game) and was third overall from the charity stripe (.843)...UCLA won't see a road game until three weeks into the non-conference season when they travel to Las Vegas, Nev. for the Las Vegas Invitational Finals.

CONCERNS - UCLA will have to contend without dynamic freshman standout Shabazz Muhammad (17.9 ppg) and last year's conference assist leader Larry Drew II (256 assists/7.8 apg)...The Bruins face a tough neutral-site matchup against ACC powerhouse Duke on Dec. 19, just before the end of the non-conference season...Even with Anderson's 302 boards, the Bruins ranked last in rebounding defense and margin, posting the league's only negative rebounding margin through the entire season (-1.6).



STRENGTHS - A core of returning starters and a touted recruiting class will help new USC head coach **Andy Enfield** in his first season...Enfield arrives in Los Angeles with a 41-28 career record over two seasons of head coaching experience, and comes from a Florida Gulf Coast team that advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16... Trojan returners include three-point shooting leader **J.T. Terrell** (67-for-185, .362), who was also the second leading scorer for the Trojans last season (11.7 ppg)... Junior guard **Byron Wesley** (10.2 ppg, 4.3 rpg) joins Terrell as the other returning starter for the Trojans... USC roped a signing class of five that ranked second in the conference and No. 21 by HoopScoop, including the 2013 Gatorade High School Player of the Year for California in guard/forward **Roschon Prince**, who averaged 20.3 ppg and 7.2 rpg his senior season at Long Beach Poly and will surely add young talent to the Trojan squad.

CONCERNS - The Trojans' defense won't be the same without center Dewayne Dedmon, who entered in the NBA Draft...Dedmon paced USC in the paint, leading the team in rebounds (146, 7.0 rpg) and blocking 66 shots for a 2.1 average that ranked third in the Pac-12...Senior **Omar Oraby** (6.3 ppg/3.9 rpg), the only center currently listed on the roster, started four games but appeared in all 32...USC's scoring margin last season was -1.9, the only margin in negative digits in the conference, and their 65.7 ppg average was 10th in the Pac-12...The Trojans will miss their scoring leader in All-Pac-12 honorable mention forward Eric Wise (11.9 ppg), as well as their assist leader in Jio Fontan (168 assists/5.25 apg).

2012-13 Pac-12 Review

EIGHT TEAMS REACH POSTSEASON ARIZONA, OREGON IN SWEET 16

The Pac-12 placed five teams in the NCAA Tournament, with another three teams playing in the NIT. The five teams in the NCAA Tournament represented the most by the Pac-12 since six participated in the 2009 NCAA Tournament. With ARIZONA and OREGON advancing to the Sweet 16, it marked the first time the league placed two teams in the regional semifinals since 2008.

In one of the closest league races in years, UCLA captured its 31st regular season Conference title, and first since the 2008 season. The Bruins are just the third Conference champion to post a 13-5 league record under the 18-game league schedule in 35 seasons of Pac-10/Pac-12 competition.

After 11 years in Los Angeles, the Pac-12 moved its championship to Las Vegas where the MGM Grand Garden Arena played host to the league's postseason tournament... Similar to the regular season where 57 of 108 league games were decided by single digits, the 11-game Pac-12 Tournament provided eight games decided by single digits, including a tournament record three overtime games... OREGON won its third Pac-12 Tournament title, and first since 2007. The Ducks were the fifth different league school to capture the postseason crown over the last six years.

Earning All-America recognition for their efforts during the 2012-13 season were CALIFORNIA junior G **Allen Crabbe** (NABC Third Team), and UCLA freshman G/F **Shabazz Muhammad** (Sporting News Second Team, USBWA All-Freshman First Team). Crabbe (18.4 ppg/6.1 rpg) was named the Pac-12 Player of the Year, becoming the third California player in the last four years to earn the honor... Muhammad (17.9 ppg) and ARIZONA STATE freshman G **Jahii Carson** (18.5 ppg/5.1 apg) shared Pac-12 Co-Freshman of the Year honors. Carson was the nation's top freshman scorer... COLORADO junior F **André Roberson** was tabbed the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year after leading the league with 11.2 rebounds per game (second in the nation). He also added 2.2 steals per game (2nd in Pac-12) and 1.3 blocked shots per game (8th in Pac-12)... STANFORD junior F **Dwight Powell** was named the Pac-12's Most Improved Player. During the 2012 season, he averaged 5.8 points and 4.6 rebounds. He boosted those numbers during the 2013 season to

14.9 points per game and 8.4 rebounds per game... OREGON coach **Dana Altman** was tabbed as the John R. Wooden Pac-12 Coach of the Year, as well as picking up NABC District 20 Coach of the Year honors, as he guided the Ducks to their third consecutive 20-win season, a Pac-12 Tournament title and an appearance in the NCAA Sweet 16 where they lost to eventual NCAA champion Louisville... ARIZONA STATE senior G/F **Carrick Felix**, who earned All-Pac-12 Second Team honors, was named the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Felix graduated with a B.S. in Communications in the spring of 2012 and was accepted into the Masters of Liberal Studies program where he is studying for his masters degree.

Pac-12 Tournament Recap: After 11 years in Los Angeles at the STAPLES Center, the Pac-12 moved its championship to Las Vegas where the MGM Grand Garden Arena played host to the league's postseason tournament... Similar to the regular season where 57 of 108 league games were decided by single digits, the 11-game Pac-12 Tournament provided eight games decided by single digits, including a tournament record three overtime games... The Oregon Ducks won their third Conference Tournament crown with a 78-69 victory over top-seeded UCLA. Oregon was the fifth different Pac-12 school to claim the crown over the last six years. Oregon's Johnathan Loyd, who hails from Las Vegas, earned Most Outstanding Players honors. Loyd came off the bench to average 11.3 points, including 19 points in the Championship game, and added 3.0 assists and 2.0 steals... Fans made their presence felt in Las Vegas as games were played before 80 percent of capacity at the Grand Garden Arena, with the semifinal session played before a capacity crowd of 13,151 fans.
