2014-15 SEASON PREVIEW

Returning All-Pac-12 Performers... Three first team All-Pac-12 performers, and two second team selection return in 2014-15. First team honorees include STANFORD guard **Chasson Randle**, COLORADO forward **Josh Scott**, and UTAH guard **Delon Wright**. ARIZONA guard **T.J. McConnell** and OREGON guard **Joseph Young** were second team picks.

Coach Speak... Along with WASHINGTON STATE's **Ernie Kent** returning to the league (Oregon from 1998-2010), the Pac-12 welcomes two additional coaches to the league in CALIFORNIA's **Cuonzo Martin** and OREGON STATE's **Wayne Tinkle**... Ten of the 12 Pac-12 head coaches have each compiled 100 or more career wins, while the average career win total for Pac-12 coaches is at 250 victories... When it comes to league victories, WASHINGTON's **Lorenzo Romar** (127 Pac-12 wins) and Washington State's **Kent** (109) have combined for 236 Pac-12 wins. The other 10 coaches have compiled 279 league wins... ARIZONA coach **Sean Miller** served as an assistant coach with U.S. Men's U18 National Team at the 2014 FIBA Americas Championship, helping lead the United States to a gold medal... Approaching milestone wins this season - ARIZONA STATE's **Herb Sendek** needs five wins to reach No. 400, while UCLA's **Steve Alford** needs nine wins to reach No. 500.

Champs - Regular Season/Tournament... ARIZONA won its 13th Pac-12 title and first since 2011. Meanwhile, the UCLA Bruins captured their fourth Pac-12 tournament crown. It's the sixth consecutive year that the regular season champion did not capture the league's postseason title. Since the Pac-12 reinstated the league's postseason tournament in 2002, only three teams won both the regular season and tournament titles - Stanford (2004), UCLA (2006) and UCLA (2008).

Home Sweet Home...No Pac-12 team had a losing record at home as the league compiled a 96-7 (.932) mark at home in non-conference action.

Home Away From Home... Check the Pac-12 rosters and you'll find 20 student-athletes (five fewer than last season) who hail from 12 different countries outside the United States. Those countries are: Canada (4), Serbia (3), Australia (2), Hungary (2), Senegal (2), Austria, Belgium, Cameroon, Denmark, England, Germany, and Netherlands.

Pac-12 Tours China... Utah head coach Larry Krystkowiak guided a group of Pac-12 players through a three-game tour of China as part of the league's Globalization Initiative. The following players represented the Pac-12: Arizona guard Jacob Hazzard, Arizona State guard Bo Barnes, California forward Roger Moute a Bidas, Colorado forward Xavier Johnson, Oregon State guard Malcolm Duvivier and center Cheikh N'diaye, Stanford center Schuyler Rimmer, USC forward Nikola Jovanovic, Utah guard Jordan Loveridge, forward Jeremy Olsen, and guard Brandon Taylor, Washington guard Andrew Andrews, and Washington State guard DaVonté Lacy... The three-game tour included stops in Shanghai and Beijing. The Pac-12 faced the Chinese University All-Star Team, then took on Chinese Basketball Association's Jiangsu Dragons and Shanghai Sharks. Pac-12 squad returned home with a 3-0 record.

Returning Starters.. Big turnover in the league as only six teams return three or more starters, with Colorado and Utah leading the way with four returning starters each, and an average of 2.3 returning starters per team. Here is the breakdown of the number of returning starters by team:

Rocky Mountain High... Among the Pac-12 teams, Colorado and Utah have the most returning production in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals (see chart on page 3).

Get Your Picture Taken With Adam Silver... With Arizona's Aaron Gordon selected fourth overall in the NBA Draft, the Pac-12 now has now had a player selected in the first round in the NBA Draft for the 26th consecutive year... UCLA had three players selected in the first round - Zach LaVine, Jordan Adams and Kyle Anderson. It's happened once before in the Conference with UCLA's Dave Greenwood, Roy Hamilton and Brad Holland all taken within the first 14 picks of the 1979 NBA Draft... The league has had 29 first-round picks over the last seven years of the NBA Draft. Over the last seven NBA Drafts, a total of 48 Pac-12 players have been selected representing 11 of the Conference's 12 member institutions.

STRENGTHS – The Wildcats posted their fifth-consecutive 20-win season and second straight with 30 wins under coach Sean Miller ... UA returns three of their starting squad with senior guard **T.J. McConnell** (8.4 ppg/5.3 apg/3.6 rpg), junior forward **Brandon Ashley** (11.5 ppg/5.8 rpg) and junior center **Kaleb Tarczewski** (6.3 rpg/9.9 ppg) ... Sophomore forward **Rondae Hollis-Jefferson** (9.1 ppg) has the tools needed to become a top scorer for UA after a great freshman season and will work alongside incoming freshman forward and five-star recruit **Stanley Johnson**, the 2014 FIBA U18 Tournament MVP ... In the back court, junior guard **Gabe York** (6.7 ppg/2.2 rpg) could find a spot on the starting lineup after helping Arizona lead the Pac-12 in scoring defense (58.6 ppg) as a reserve last year. He will be helped by some fresh talent in the likes of junior transfer guard **Kadeem Allen**, as well as fellow returning guard **Elliott Pitts** who saw quality minutes late last season ... The Cats hauled in a solid recruiting class with three four-star freshman recruits in guard **Parker Jackson-Cartwright**, forward **Craig Victor** and center **Dusan Ristic**.

CONCERNS – UA will miss its two top scorers in Nick Johnson and Aaron Gordon and will have to work quickly to find players to fill those starting roles ... The Cats struggled from the charity stripe last year with a .659 average, 11th in the league, and will miss Johnson's team-leading .781 free throw percentage as only Ashley and Tarczewski had percentages above .700 ... How will Ashley respond after suffering season-ending foot injury in February ... Arizona faces tough non-conference opponents including Elite Eight finisher Michigan and NCAA Tournament participant Gonzaga.

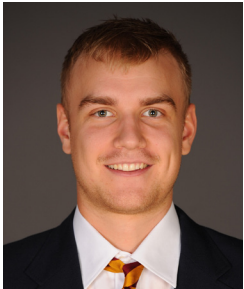

STRENGTHS – Two of Arizona State’s top five scorers return in seniors **Shaquielle McKissic** (9.0 ppg/5.4 rpg) and **Jonathan Gilling** (7.7 ppg/3.8 rpg) ... Also coming back for the Sun Devils are junior **Eric Jacobsen** (10.4 mpg/2.4 ppg) and senior **Bo Barnes** (13.8 mpg/4.5 ppg), who grew into two of ASU’s top contributors from the bench later in the season and may step into a more consistent starting role ... Despite some heavy turnover, the Sun Devils have a bevy of fresh faces to hit the hardwood this season, including junior transfers **Roosevelt Scott**, a versatile player who's shown prowess both offensively and defensively; **Willie Atwood**, a power forward out of Connors State, and California JC Player of the Year **Gerry Blakes**... ASU also built out depth at the point guard position with three-star recruits **Tra Holder** and **Kodi Justice** to go with Blakes... ASU was 16-1 at home last year and 32-5 in the past two seasons, including a 8-1 Pac-12 home mark last year.

CONCERNS – The Sun Devils lose their top three scorers in Jahii Carson, Jermaine Marshall, and Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year Jordan Bachynski, who led the league in blocked shots ... ASU also lost six other players to graduation or transfers, and the turnover could require a lot of necessary rebuilding before the Devils hit their stride ... ASU may have led the Conference in blocked shots as a team but struggled with rebounds on the offensive end as the team had a -2.4 rebounding margin, one of only two negative figures in the Conference last season.

STRENGTHS - The Bears have eight letterwinners returning, including two of their top three scorers in **David Kravish** (11.4 ppg) and **Tyrone Wallace** (11.3 ppg) ... After spending last year in mostly a reserve role, sophomore guard **Jabari Bird** (8.3 ppg, 20.0 mpg) is prepped to breakout on the Cal roster ... Another reserve with starting potential is **Jordan Mathews**, a sophomore guard who garnered 12 starts in 35 appearances last season with an 8.3 ppg average ... Cal's incoming players added some much needed depth at every position, especially center, as **Kameron Rooks** could miss the 2014-15 season with a torn ACL ... freshman **Kingsley Okoroh**, a product of England who was a key shot blocker for Westwind Prep and **Dwight Tarwater**, a graduate transfer from Cornell, will look to step in on the blocks ... At forward, Kravish will be joined by **Christian Behrens**, who worked his way back from a knee injury to appear in 24 games last year and became a physical force under the net for the Bears ... Another key forward is graduate transfer **Dwight Tarwater**, who started all 28 games as a captain for Cornell last season, averaging 7.1 ppg and a team-best 5.5 rpg ... First-year coach **Cuonzo Martin** brings to Cal a 124-82 record in six years as a head coach.

CONCERNS - The departure of Cobbs leaves a gap to be filled in not only scoring but also passing, as Cobbs posted 204 assists and was a key director on the floor for the Bears in finding open shots ... STRENGTHS - The Buffs have seen postseason action for four straight seasons now under head coach **Tad Boyle**, and are looking to use that momentum to continue their historic run ... Not only do the Buffs return four players who started a majority of their games, but also get back a whopping 13 letterwinners from last season for one of the most experienced rosters in the league ... Leading CU's charge are **Josh Scott** (14.1 ppg), **Askia Booker** (13.7 ppg) and **Xavier Johnson** (12.0 ppg), three of the top four scorers for the Buffs from last season. Scott also established himself as one of the top all-around players and a leader for CU, averaging 8.4 rebounds per game with 13 double-doubles last season ... CU has a touted recruiting class that includes freshman **Dominique Collier**, a four-star local product who has spent the offseason bulking up in hopes of working his way into the starting lineup ... One of CU's greatest strengths remains its home court advantage as the Buffs are 60-9 at Coors Events Center in Boulder over the past four years under Boyle.

CONCERNS - The Buffs are still a young squad with just one non-walk-on senior on a roster of 16 ... Despite a stellar performance at home, CU has struggled over the past few years with away games, going 5-6 on the road last year, 5-7 in 2012-13 and 4-7 in 2011-12 ... Colorado has a small roster in terms of physical size, with no player standing over the 6-10 mark, which could prove difficult for the Buffs when playing against larger, more physical offenses ... CU has a heavy loss to deal with as team leader Spencer Dinwiddie left for the NBA. While Dinwiddie sat out with an injury the second half of last season, his leadership and basketball knowledge was a huge help behind the scenes for the Buffs.

STRENGTHS - The Ducks will rely on **Joseph Young**, senior guard and lone returning starter, to guide them back to the postseason in 2014-15. Young is the Pac-12's top returning scorer after averaging 18.9 points per game last season, including a NCAA Tournament average of 24.0 points on 17-of-31 (.548) shooting from the field in two games. Young is one of the league's top three-point shooters, hitting 76 treys at 41.5 percent . . . Coach **Dana Altman** has relied on transfers the last couple of seasons to build a 97-47 record in four seasons, including four straight 20-win campaigns. He'll look to do the same in 2014-15 with forward **Dwayne Benjamin** and center **Michael Chandler** . . . Benjamin and Chandler will be a big assist to junior forward Elgin Cook on the frontline. Cook, who averaged 6.7 points and 3.7 rebounds on the year, came up big in the postseason, averaging 14.0 points and 5.5 rebounds, including a career-high 23 points in the second round vs. BYU . . . Senior guard **Jalil Abdul-Bassit** will be called upon to help Young as an outside scoring threat. Abdul Bassit hit 7-of-18 (.389) from beyond the arc last season. Those seven treys represent the second most returning three-pointers behind Young's 76.

CONCERNS - Offseason turmoil left the Ducks with a roster depleted of players with experience. Just four returning players saw game experience last season . . . All players will need to hit the boards as only 20 percent of the rebounding numbers return and the roster includes only two players taller than 6-7 . . . Oregon will open the season in the Legends Classic and will get tested in a hurry by NCAA Tournament participants Michigan and either Villanova or VCU.

STRENGTHS - The Beavers turn to head coach **Wayne Tinkle** to lead the Oregon State program. Tinkle was the head coach at Montana for eight seasons and won 158 games, the second most in school history. He led the Grizzlies to Big Sky regular-season titles in 2010, 2012 and 2013 and Big Sky Tournament championships in 2012 and 2013 . . . The Beavers return just one starter in junior guard **Langston Morris-Walker** (4.0 ppg/2.1 rpg) . . . OSU will have solid perimeter shooters in Morris-Walker, **Malcolm Duvivier** and **Olaf Schaftenaar** as the three combined to shoot 46-of-123 (.374) . . . While thin on numbers, the Beavers do have some height with a pair of 6-10 forwards in juniors **Daniel Gomis** and Schaftenaar, and a 7-0 center in sophomore **Cheikh N'diaye** . . . Gomis made his presence known in the paint with 31 blocked shots. While that averaged out to 1.0 block per game, it was one block per 11 minutes of action . . . While Morris-Walker is the lone returning starter, junior forward Jarmal Reid does have 19 career starts under his belt and can provide leadership to a team void of a senior on the roster.

CONCERNS - The Beavers need instant offense as they lose their top five scorers, including the Pac-12's leading scorer Roberto Nelson (20.7 ppg) . . . Even with a tall front court, the Beavers returning rebounding production stands at 24.5 percent of last season's total . . . Who will take the reigns at point guard to distribute the ball. The team's top returning assist leader is the 6-10 Schaftenaar with 19 (0.6 per game).

STRENGTHS - The Cardinal reached the Sweet 16 last year for the fifth time in school history and for its first postseason appearance since 2008 ... This year, Stanford returns three key starters in leading scorer and first team All-Pac-12 honoree **Chasson Randle** (18.8 ppg, 3.6 rpg), center **Stefan Nastic** (7.4 ppg, 2.8 rpg) and last year's Pac-12 Most Improved Player of the Year in **Anthony Brown** (12.3 ppg, 5.0 rpg) ... The Card also returns some of its top rotating talent with nine other letterwinners, including **Marcus Allen** and **Grant Verhoeven** who each saw playing time in the majority of Stanford's 36 games ... The Cardinal brings in a highly-touted recruiting class that ranks as high as No. 13 by ESPN.com, No. 14 by Scout.com and No. 15 by Rivals.com, including McDonald's All-American **Reid Travis**. All four incoming freshmen were top-100 players and four-star recruits ... Stanford's non-conference slate features mostly home games with the exception of three true road games and the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic on neutral territory in Brooklyn, N.Y.

CONCERNS - Stanford has one of the most difficult non-conference schedules in the league, if not the nation, as the Cardinal will take on 11 teams that played in the NCAA Tournament last season, including a contest against UConn, which Stanford upset on the road last season. Last year, Stanford ranked 13th in overall strength of schedule and 95th according to KenPom.com ... The Cardinal will miss leaders Dwight Powell and Josh Huestis, who were two of four Stanford players to average 10 or more points per game and 200 or more total blocks on the season. Both were NBA Draft picks.

STRENGTHS - Head coach Steve Alford made a big statement in his first year at the helm, taking the UCLA men's hoops program to the Pac-12 Tournament title and the Sweet 16, so the Bruins have plenty of momentum heading into Alford's second season ... Despite losing three players who went in the first round of the NBA Draft, the talent is in place for UCLA to make another successful run in 2014-15, including returning starter **Norman Powell** (11.4ppg/2.8rpg), an honorable mention All-Pac-12 Defensive Team selection last year. Powell improved his scoring significantly in his junior campaign, increasing his average from 6.1 points per game from his sophomore season ... Alford brought in a top-notch recruiting class this season, ranked seventh in the nation, that features two McDonald's All-Americans in **Kevon Looney** and Thomas Welsh, one five-star recruit in **Jonah Bolden** and Hungary U18 National Team captain and center **Gyorgy "G.G." Golo-man**. In addition, UCLA will benefit from the addition of sophomore **Isaac Hamilton**, a former McDonald's All-American guard who did not play in 2013-14 ... UCLA brings back key reserves who will look to step into starting roles, such as sophomore guard **Bryce Alford** (8.0 ppg/2.8 apg/47 three-pointers) and junior forward/center **Tony Parker** (6.9 ppg/4.4 rpg).

CONCERNS - The Bruins lose five of its eight rotation players from last season, including four starters (Jordan Adams, Kyle Anderson, David Wear and Travis Wear). With so much turnover, Alford will look to the incoming freshmen to play a significant role despite their inexperience on the collegiate scene ... UCLA will focus on improving its defense this year after ranking sixth in the Pac-12 in field goal percentage defense.

STRENGTHS - Despite a rough first year, head coach **Andy Enfield** brings in a top-20 recruiting class and faces a challenging schedule in hopes to up the ante for year two ... The Trojans have one returning starter in sophomore forward **Nikola Jovanovic**, a member of the Pac-12 All-Star Team that traveled to China this summer. Jovanovic is the top returning scorer (8.0 ppg) and rebounder (4.4 rpg) for USC ... Enfield's roster has plenty of playing experience, with five returning letterwinners that saw action in at least 18 of USC's 32 total games ... The Trojans were third in the Conference last year in rebounding offense as five different players pulled down at least 100 boards, including returner **Julian Jacobs** ... Newcomers for USC include transfer **Katin Reinhardt**, who comes from UNLV where he started 34 of 35 games as a freshman ... USC's recruiting class of four highly touted high school players was ranked 16th in the nation by ESPN.com and includes the sixth-ranked point guard recruit in guard **Jordan McLaughlin**.

CONCERNS - The Trojans' roster is exceptionally young, with no seniors on the team and just three juniors. With six newcomers and a roster that has only been playing together for a year, the team will have to spend a few games getting adjusted to a brand new lineup ... USC also faces a heavy turnover as it loses its top four scorers from last season. The quartet accounted for an average of 46.6 points per game and 18.3 rebounds per game for the Trojans ... USC has a tough schedule ahead that includes 11 games against teams that played in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, including a road game against New Mexico, which holds a 105-13 record on its home court.

STRENGTHS - The Utes have improved dramatically since joining the Pac-12, posting a 6-25 record in its first year in the league, and last year was no different as head coach **Larry Krystkowiak** led Utah to its best record since 2009, going 21-12 and reaching the NIT Tournament ... Utah returns almost all of its top talent from last season, including leading scorer **Delon Wright**, who was a first-team All-Pac-12 and All-Defensive Team selection last year. Wright led the Utes in scoring (15.5 ppg), blocks (84), and steals (82) as well as free throws made (153) and field goals made (174) ... Other key returners for the Utes include **Jordan Loveridge** (14.7 ppg/7.0 rpg), who led the team in rebounds last season, and **Brandon Taylor** (10.6 ppg/.398 three-point field goal percentage) along with both centers from last season in **Dallin Bachynski** and **Jeremy Olsen** ... The Utes had a strong offensive game last season, outscoring opponents by 10.8 points per game last season, tied for the second-best scoring margin in the league. Utah was also near the top in field goal percentage, tied for second with a .488 average ... Krystkowiak brings in five freshmen, including **Brekott Chapman** and **Kyle Kuzma**.

CONCERNS - Utah faces a much tougher non-conference schedule this year, including a home game against Wichita State which finished the season ranked No. 2 by the AP and had an undefeated regular season. Utah also plays against perennial power Kansas for just the second time in program history in a matchup to be televised on ESPN ... Despite a solid three-point defense, the Utes will need to lock down their game from downtown after finishing seventh in the Pac-12 in three-point shots made.

STRENGTHS - The Huskies bring back three of their top five scorers from last year in a lineup anchored by guard **Nigel Williams-Goss**, who elected to return to UW for his sophomore campaign and spent part of the offseason at the prestigious CP3 Elite Guard camp. Williams-Goss was a member of the Pac-12 All-Freshman Team last season after averaging 13.4 ppg and 4.38 apg in his first year with the Huskies ... Also returning for UW is junior guard **Andrew Andrews** (12.3 ppg/3.9 apg), who has played in all but three games for the Huskies since joining the roster two years ago and will continue to be a key leader for the team ... Sophomore **Jernard Jarreau** looks to work his way into the starting lineup after redshirting last year due to an injury suffered in the season opener. Jarreau averaged 3.2 ppg and 2.6 rpg in an average of 12.7 minutes per game as a freshman ... Guard **Darin Johnson** (5.9 ppg/16.1 mpg) looks for his first career start with the Huskies after playing in 31 of UW's 32 games last season.

CONCERNS - UW loses two key starters in leading scorer C.J. Wilcox and forward Perris Blackwell. The two combined for 28.5 points per game and were two of just four players along with Williams-Goss and Andrews to average more than 10 points per game on the season ... **Mike Anderson** (5.5 ppg/5.5 rpg) and **Shawn Kemp, Jr.** (4.4 ppg/15.4 mpg) are the lone seniors on the team, meaning most of the UW leadership will be coming from the underclassmen. Outside of Williams-Goss and Andrews, few of the juniors and sophomores saw much action in last year's rotation, and with the departure of Wilcox and Blackwell the duo will have a heavy burden as the team's leaders.

STRENGTHS - The Cougars look to new head coach **Ernie Kent** to bring them back into the fray after a rough season last year where WSU went 3-15 in Conference play. Kent comes to Washington State after 13 years of coaching at Oregon where he took two teams to the Elite Eight and guided the Ducks to the NIT Final Four on two occasions ... Washington State returns senior guard **DaVonté Lacy** (19.4 ppg/4.2 rpg), who missed out on eight games for the Cougars due to injury and looks to bounce back to full health after playing in China with the Pac-12 All-Star Team ... Also returning is sophomore **Que Johnson** (9.5 ppg/2.4 rpg), who led the team in scoring in eight games and saw 14 starts as a freshman ... Kent brought in a strong recruiting class, adding three freshmen guards and two transfers – one guard and one center – to the lineup ... The Cougs were third in the league last year in three-point field goals made, averaging 7.55 per game, and bring back three players that had a three-point field goal percentage of .700 or better.

CONCERNS - The Cougs were near the bottom of the Conference in multiple statistical categories, and have a lot of rebuilding to do under the new head coach and with Lacy entering his final year with the team ... WSU also has a big role to fill with the departure of D.J. Shelton (10.1 ppg/9.6 rpg), a power forward who was one of the more aggressive players on the roster both offensively and defensively as he led the team in rebounds and was second in scoring ... Washington State opens the season on the road for the first time since 2006-07, playing UTEP and TCU in Texas. WSU lost to both opponents last year on the Cougs' home court.

NINE TEAMS IN POSTSEASON ARIZONA REACHES ELITE EIGHT

The Pac-12 placed six teams in the NCAA Tournament, with another three teams playing in the NIT and CBI. The six teams in the NCAA Tournament match the league record six that participated in the 2009 NCAA Tournament. The Pac-12 posted an 8-6 record in NCAA Tournament play, with ARIZONA advancing to the Elite Eight for the second time in four years.

Arizona posted its fifth 30-win season on the way to its 13th conference title. The Wildcats were ranked in the AP top five each week since Nov. 18, including an eight-week stretch at No. 1.

UCLA captured their fourth Pac-12 Tournament crown with one of the most memorable championship game in years, as it defeated Arizona 75-71 before a capacity crowd of 12,916 fans. Arizona trailed by as much as 11 points in the first half, before cutting the deficit to four points at halftime. In a back-and-forth second half, neither team led by more than five points. In fact, both teams did not make a field goal for a four-minute stretch late in the game until Jordan Adams hit a three-pointer with 45 seconds remaining to break a 68-68 tie to give the Bruins the lead for good at 71-68. Both teams played nearly flawless basketball as the two teams combined for just 15 turnovers.

On March 31, CALIFORNIA head coach **Mike Montgomery** announced his retirement. In 32 seasons as a collegiate head coach, he captured 677 career victories and exits the game as the 25th-winningest head men's basketball coach with at least 10 years of experience at the Division I level in NCAA history. He ranks third on the Pac-12's all-time conference victories list behind Arizona's Lute Olson and UCLA's John Wooden with 282 league wins. Montgomery enjoyed 31 winning seasons in his 32 years as a collegiate head coach, posting 22 20-win seasons.

Arizona guard **Nick Johnson** (16.3 ppg/4.1 rpg) earned Pac-12 Player of the Year honors, then went on to collect consensus first team All-America honors (The Sporting News, USBWA, NABC, John Wooden). Freshman teammate **Aaron Gordon** (12.4 ppg/8.0 rpg) picked up Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honors and added The Sporting News second team All-America honors. UCLA's **Kyle Anderson** (14.6 ppg/8.8 rpg/6.5 apg) earned The Sporting News second team All-America honors as well, and picked up AP third team All-America accolades. ARIZONA STATE's **Jordan Bachynski** was tabbed the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year. He set a Pac-12 single-season record for blocked shots with 133 and the Pac-12 career record with 314 blocks.

STANFORD junior G **Anthony Brown** picked up Pac-12 Most Improved Player honors. Brown, who had a career average of 6.6 ppg entering the season, was third on the team averaging 12.3 ppg. He led the team, and was third in the Pac-12, shooting .453 from three-point range. Senior teammate **Dwight Powell**, who earned All-Pac-12 honors, was named the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Arizona coach **Sean Miller** was tabbed as the John R. Wooden Pac-12 Coach of the Year, his second league honor in five seasons.
