Built on a firm foundation of academic excellence and superior athletic performance, the Conference ushered in a new era on July 1, 2011, officially becoming the Pac-12 Conference with the additions of the University of Colorado and University of Utah.

Just 27 days after the Conference officially changed its name, Commissioner Larry Scott announced the creation of the Pac-12 Networks on July 27, 2011, solidifying a landmark television deal and putting the Conference on the forefront of collegiate athletics. The Networks, including one national network, six regional networks, and a robust digital network marked the first-ever integrated media company owned by a college conference. In addition, the "TV Everywhere" rights allow fans to access Pac-12 Networks outside the home on any digital device, including smartphones and tablet computers.

That same year, the Pac-12 also launched its Globalization Initiative to proactively promote the Conference and member institutions through student-athlete exchanges and sport. In the first four years, Pac-12 student-athletes have enjoyed unique cultural and athletic experiences in China, fielding full university and Pac-12 all-star teams in women's volleyball and men's basketball, with the first-ever men's basketball regular season game schedule to be played in China between WASHINGTON and Texas to tip off the 2015-16 campaign. The Conference and its member schools have gained significant brand exposure for the future and set a foundation for growth.

On the field, the Pac-12 rises above the rest, upholding its tradition as the "Conference of Champions ®," claiming an incredible 140 NCAA team titles since 1999-2000, including nine in 2014-15, an average of nearly nine championships per academic year. Even more impressive has been the breadth of the Pac-12's success, with championships coming in 28 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-12 has led or tied the nation in NCAA Championships in 49 of the last 55 years, the only exceptions being in 1980-81, 1988-89, 1990-91 and 1995-96 when the Conference finished second, and only twice finished third in 1998-99 and 2004-05.

For the 10th-consecutive year, the Pac-12 had the most or tied for the most NCAA titles of any conference in the country, winning at least six every year since 2000-01. No other conference has won double-digit NCAA crowns in a single year, the Pac-12 doing so seven times, including a record 14 in 1996-97.

Spanning nearly a century of outstanding athletics achievements, the Pac-12 was the first conference to reach 400 championships in 2010-11. With the inclusion of Colorado and Utah, the Conference surpassed another major milestone, with league teams capturing 450 titles, outdistancing the next conference by nearly 200. In all, Conference teams have won 478 NCAA Championships (291 men's, 158 women's, 29 combined).

Pac-12 members have won 291 NCAA team championships on the men's side, 77 more than the next closest conference. Men's NCAA crowns have come at a phenomenal rate for the Pac-12 - 16 basketball titles by six schools (more than any other conference), 54 tennis titles, 47 outdoor track & field crowns, and 28 baseball titles. Pac-12 members have won 25 of 46 NCAA titles in volleyball, 41 of 46 in water polo, 29 in skiing, and 24 in swimming & diving national championships.

Individually, the Conference has produced an impressive number of NCAA individual champions. Over 2,000 (2,208) individual crowns have been won by Pac-12 student-athletes over the years with 1,333 by male student-athletes. Student-athletes have also captured 174 individual titles at combined championships (ie., skiing and fencing).

On the women's side, the story is much the same. Since the NCAA began conducting women's championships 34 years ago, Pac-12 members have claimed at least four national titles in a single season on 25 occasions, including 15-consecutive years from 2000-2015. Overall, the Pac-12 has captured 158 NCAA women's titles, easily outdistancing the SEC, which is second with 97. Pac-12 members have dominated a number of sports, winning 23 softball titles, 21 tennis crowns, 14 volleyball titles, 16 of the last 26 trophies in golf, and 14 in swimming & diving.

Pac-12 women student-athletes shine nationally on an individual basis, as well, having captured an unmatched 701 NCAA individual crowns, an average of nearly 21 championships per season.

The Pac-12's excellence is further proven in the annual Division I Learfield Sports Directors' Cup competition, the prestigious award that honors the best overall collegiate athletics programs in the country. STANFORD continued its remarkable run and won a remarkable 21st-consecutive Directors' Cup in 2014-15 leading the Pac-12 to an unprecedented 1-2-3 finish in the final standings. Seven Pac-12 member institutions ranked among the top-30 Division I programs, tying for the most of any conference, and five were in the top 15: No. 1 STANFORD, No. 2 UCLA, No. 3 USC, No. 12 CALIFORNIA and No. 13 OREGON. At least five member institutions have been ranked in the top 20 in all but one year of the Director's Cup program, with seven appearing in the top 20 on five different occasions (1998, 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2006).

The Pac-12 Conference is set to celebrate 100 years of excellence. The yearlong celebration of the Conference centennial, including marking the date of the official formation 100 years ago on December 2, will kick off with the start of the football season at Pac-12 Media Day and continue throughout the 2015-16 academic year.

The Conference's storied history dates back 100 years when four schools - the University of California, Oregon Agricultural College (now Oregon State University), the University of Oregon and the University of Washington - gathered at the historic Imperial Hotel in Portland, Ore., to form the Pacific Coast Conference.

2015-16 SEASON PREVIEW

Returning All-Pac-12 Performers... Two first team All-Pac-12 performers, and two second team selection return in 2015-16. First team honorees include OREGON STATE guard **Gary Payton II** and CALIFORNIA guard **Tyrone Wallace**. OREGON forward **Elgin Cook** and UTAH guard **Brandon Taylor** were second team picks.

Coaching Stability... There was only one addition to the coaching ranks in the Pac-12 with Arizona State's **Bobby Hurley**. Hurley, the two-time NCAA champion and NCAA's all-time assist leader with 1,076, becomes the 18th head coach in Sun Devil history... ARIZONA coach **Sean Miller** served as head for the U.S. Men's U19 National Team at the 2015 FIBA World Championship, guiding the United States to a gold medal... With 17 victories, Miller can join the quartet of Pac-12 coaches who have compiled 300 or more career victories - Oregon's **Dana Altman** (533), UCLA's **Steve Alford** (513), Washington's **Lorenzo Romar** (363) and Washington State's **Ernie Kent** (338)... When it comes to league victories, **Romar** (132 Pac-12 wins) and Kent (116) have combined for 248 Pac-12 wins. The other 10 coaches have compiled 296 league wins.

Champs - Regular Season/Tournament... ARIZONA won its second-straight Pac-12 title and 14th overall. Arizona also won the Pac-12 Tournament, becoming the sixth different school in the last seven years to win the Pac-12 Tournament crown. The last time the Conference regular season champion also won the Conference tournament title was 2008 (UCLA).

Backcourt Bonanza... Pac-12 backcourts will lead talented young teams in 2015-16. In terms of scoring, the Cal tandem of guards **Tyrone Wallace** and **Jordan Mathews** combined to average 30.7 points per game. Most among returning backcourts in the Pac-12, just ahead of the UCLA duo of **Bryce Alford** and **Isaac Hamilton** (26.0 ppg) ... Three backcourts

had a pair of players post at least 100 assists each last season - UCLA's Alford (176) and Hamilton (116); USC's **Julian Jacobs** (116) and **Jordan McLaughlin** (100); and Washington State's **Ike Iroegbu** (106) and **Ny Redding** (101) ... Arizona State sophomore **Tra Holder** posted the second-most assists by a Sun Devil freshman with 115 ... Oregon State backcourt swiped and dished at a high rate as senior **Gary Payton II** led the Pac-12 with 95 steals (3.05 spg) and added 98 steals (3.2 apg), while junior **Malcolm Duvivier** led the Beavers with 107 assists (3.5 apg).

Home Away From Home... Check the Pac-12 rosters and you'll find 22 student-athletes (two more than last season) who hail from 12 different countries outside the United States. Those countries are: Canada (3), Serbia (3), Senegal (3), Hungary (2), Australia, Austria, Belgium, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Cameroon, England, Germany, Israel, Montenegro, Netherlands and Nigeria.

Pac-12 China Game... The Washington Huskies and the Texas Longhorns will square off in the Pac-12 China Game which will be played Nov. 14 at the Mercedes-Benz Arena in Shanghai. It is the latest event in the Pac-12's Globalization Initiative, an unprecedented effort to promote goodwill and showcase the Conference and its member institutions in China through student-athlete exchanges and sport. The game and the two-year partnership with Alibaba Group represent a major first for sports in China. With this game, the Pac-12 will become the first U.S. sports league, collegiate or professional, to host a regular season contest in China. The game will be played at 11 a.m. local Shanghai time and broadcast live in the United States on ESPN on Nov. 13 at 7 p.m. PT / 10 p.m. ET. Alibaba Group is the unrivaled leader in mobile in China, and the game will be distributed live via Alibaba's mobile and digital distribution platforms.

Returning Starters... The Conference welcomes back a lot of the its talented student-athletes in 2015-16 as only Arizona, Stanford and Washington return fewer than three starters. Overall the league has an average of 3.0 returning starters per team. Here is the breakdown of the number of returning starters by team:

Arizona and UCLA are two of only four teams in the country to have multiple draft picks in the 2014 and 2015 NBA Draft ... The league has had 33 first-round picks over the last eight years of the NBA Draft. Over the last eight NBA Drafts, a total of 55 Pac-12 players have been selected representing all 12 of the Conference's member institutions.

STRENGTHS – Senior C **Kaleb Tarczewski** (9.3 ppg/5.2 rpg) is the lone returning starter, but has plenty of experience having appeared in 109 career games with 107 starts ... Senior G **Gabe York** (9.2 ppg/2.1 rpg) provides Arizona with a three-point threat having led the team with 66 treys, hitting at 40 percent ... Junior G **Kadeem Allen**, the 2014 National JUCO Player of the Year by both the NABC and NJCAA, redshirted the 2014-15 season and will be eligible to play this year ... Senior F **Ryan Anderson**, who transferred from Boston College, will be eligible to compete as well. He was a Third-team All-ACC honoree in 2013, averaging 14.3 ppg and 7.3 rpg. Added depth in the frontcourt is expected from senior F **Mark Tollefson**, a graduate transfer from San Francisco who earned second-team All-WCC honors last year ... One of the nation's top recruiting classes, hauling in three five-star student-athletes in **Allonzo Trier**, **Ray Smith** and **Justin Simon** along with four-star student-athlete **Chance Comanche** ... **Sean Miller** has already had the opportunity to coach Trier at the U19 FIBA World Championships where Team USA won gold ... The Wildcats have been ranked in 60-consecutive AP polls, including the last 40 in the top 10, and 63-straight coaches polls.

CONCERNS – Arizona lost their top four scorers from the 2014-15 Pac-12 Championship squad. Stanley Johnson (13.8 ppg), Brandon Ashley (12.2 ppg) and Rondae Hollis-Jefferson (11.2 ppg) declared early for the NBA Draft while T.J. McConnell (10.4 ppg/6.3 apg) graduated ... The 'Cats averaged 7.2 steals per game, which was UA's highest average in Miller's tenure, but the defense will take a hit as the four departed starters combined for 207 of the team's 275 steals ... Another challenging schedule that includes a road game at Gonzaga and home games with Missouri and UNLV, which handed Arizona its first loss last season.

The duo combined for 30.7 points per game to edge out UCLA's backcourt combination of Bryce Alford/Isaac Hamilton (26.0 ppg) ... Wallace was the only player in the Pac-12 who was ranked in the top-five in the conference in points, rebounds and assists per game (3.97 apg) in 2014-15 ... Mathews gives the Bears a deep threat as he connected on 70 three-pointers at a league-leading 44.3 percent. Mathews also proved to be the team's most reliable free-throw shooter, hitting at 78.6 percent ... The Cal backcourt is not only talented, but deep as it includes junior **G Jabari Bird** (10.5 ppg/3.3 rpg) and junior **G Sam Singer** (4.4 ppg/2.6 rpg). Singer appeared in all 33 games and posted 2.9 assists per game ... Per Scout.com, Cal is welcoming the third-best recruiting class in the country this season. The young Bears looking to provide a huge boost to **Cuonzo Martin's** squad include front court phenoms **Jaylen Brown** (five-star), **Ivan Rabb** (five-star) and **Roman Davis** (three-star).

CONCERNS - David Kravish exhausted his eligibility and will be missed. He was a big factor in the paint as he averaged 11.3 ppg, 7.0 rpg and 1.48 blocked shots per game. He established a Cal career record with 226 blocked shots, while his 917 career rebounds were third most in school history ... Aside from Mathews, the Bears struggled at the line. Mathews hit 78.6 percent from the charity stripe, while the rest of the team shot 61.3 percent ... Need to turn Haas Pavilion into a homecourt advantage. It was 4-5 at home in league play, while being outscored 70.2-64.0. Two of those wins came on last second shots.

It will look to do the same in 2015-16 as the Buffaloes return their top three rebounders in senior F **Josh Scott** (14.5 ppg/8.4 rpg), junior F **Wesley Gordon** (6.6 ppg/6.9 rpg) and senior G/F **Xavier Johnson** (10.3 ppg/5.6 rpg). In terms of numbers, no frontline in the Conference has a better returning group of rebounders ... Scott was efficient in averaging 14.5 points per game as he shot 54.4 percent from the field and 75.2 percent from the free throw line ... Scott and Gordon were both in the top-five in the Pac-12 in 2014-15 for their prowess in blocking shots as the duo combined for 93 rejections. Scott blocked 1.77 per game, while Gordon contributed with 1.38 blocks per game ... Eight of their first 11 games are at home in the Coors Events Center where the altitude and the Buffs student section, the C-Unit, can make it extremely difficult on the opposition.

CONCERNS - Colorado will miss the production of Askia Booker. The guard averaged 17.2 points per game, the third-best total in the conference for the season, posted 99 assists (3.19 apg) and 44 steals (1.42 spg) ... Senior G **Xavier Talton** (54 assists) and sophomore G **Dominique Collier** (44 assists) will be tasked to take care of the ball for the Buffaloes as Colorado was near the bottom of the league in assists (11.76 apg) and turnover margin (-1.94) ... Colorado will need to add a deep scoring option. No returning player made more than 29 three-pointers last season ... Johnson could be limited early as he tore his left achilles tendon in June during off-season workouts.

With the entire starting five returning from last year, Beaver Nation can expect the same defensive mindset... Giving up a measly 59.2 points per game on 38.6 percent shooting by the opposition, the Beavers were one of three league teams that allowed fewer than 60 points per game ... Senior G **Gary Payton II** (13.4 ppg/7.5 rpg) led the swarming OSU defense with 95 steals, which are tied for third most in a season in Pac-12 history, and only trails his father's school record 100 thefts set in 1990 ... On paper, the Beavers have the highest-ranked recruiting class in school history as they welcome **Kendal Manuel, Gligorije Rakocevic, Stephen Thompson Jr.** (son of assistant coach Stephen Thompson), **Tres Tinkle** (son of Wayne Tinkle), **Derrick Bruce** and **Drew Eubanks**. Despite OSU returning all five starters, some of these newcomers could find themselves in the starting lineup when the season starts.

CONCERNS - The Beavers will need to turnaround their rebounding margin (-2.3). None of the returning frontcourt players averaged better than 3.9 rebounds per game and account for just 37.6 percent of the returning rebound totals ... The Beavers had balance in their outside shooting as buckets from beyond the arc were distributed among senior F **Olaf Schaftenaar** (47 treys), senior G **Langston Morris-Walker** (38), junior G **Malcolm Duvivier** (30) and Payton II (27), but they'll need to improve on efficiency as the team shot a league-low 32.3 percent from three-point range.

The talented freshmen class, which is ranked No. 22 by Rivals.com, includes C **Josh Sharma**, G/F **Marcus Sheffield** and F **Cameron Walker**.

CONCERNS - Stanford will need to replace a good bulk of its scoring and rebounding as the departing trio of Anthony Brown, Stefan Nastic and Chasson Randle accounted for 66.0 percent of the Cardinal's overall scoring and 45.3 percent of its rebounding in 2014-15 ... Brown and Randle dominated Stanford's three-point production combining for 169 treys last season. Rosco Allen (38 treys) is the only returning player to have more than 13 three-pointers ... 

Sophomore F **Jakob Poeltl** (9.1 ppg/6.8 rpg), a Pac-12 All-Freshman selection, is one of the Pac-12's top big men and anchors the Utah front court. Poeltl and junior F **Chris Reyes** (4.3 ppg/3.7 rpg) were key to the Ute's posting one of the Pac-12's top rebounding teams (+4.7 rebound margin).

CONCERNS - Replacing the all-around production from Delon Wright, All-American and Bob Cousy Award winner. He led the team in scoring (14.5 ppg), assists (5.1 apg) and steals (2.1 spg), and was second in rebounds (4.9 rpg) ... The Utes will need replace Wright as the go-to guy in crunch time. He got to the free throw line for 183 attempts (fourth most among all Pac-12 players). Only Poeltl got to the line more than 65 times for the Utes, and he'll need to improve on his percentage (55-of-124/.444) ... The non-conference schedule is loaded with games against San Diego State, at Wichita State, and against the defending NCAA Champions, Duke Blue Devils.

Washington had the fifth-best defense in the conference in terms of three-point field goal percentage ... Their opponents converted on 33.1 percent of their three-point tries ... Washington blocked 4.94 shots per game on the year, the second-best total in the conference ... The Huskies have the No. 6 ranked recruiting class for the 2015-16 season per Scout.com ... Head coach **Lorenzo Romar** and his staff added seven freshmen to the team, six of which are four-star prospects. Look for the pair of freshmen forwards **Marquese Chriss** and **Matisse Thybulle** contend for starting spots on day one.

CONCERNS - The downside to having nine newcomers means the lack of team experience. Washington only has one upperclassman returning that has played Division I basketball (Andrews). Excluding Andrews, only one player returns that averaged more than seven minutes of action per game – sophomore G **Donaven Dorsey** (3.8 ppg/1.7 rpg) ... Will need to avoid the let-down experienced after the holidays last season. After opening the year 11-0, the Huskies dropped 13 of 18 ... Demanding November schedule will certainly test the young Huskies. Washington will open the season against Texas in Shanghai, China and less than two weeks later will participate in the Battle 4 Atlantis in the Bahamas against a field that includes Gonzaga, Texas A&M, Syracuse, UConn, Michigan, Texas and Charlotte.

The Cougars converted on 72.0 percent of their free throws, the No. 3 ranked mark in the Pac-12 ... The Cougars dished out a league-best 14.61 assists per game. Pacing the offense was junior G **Ike Iroegbu** (8.9 ppg/3.4 apg) and sophomore G **Ny Redding** (4.1 ppg/3.3 apg). Each had at least 100 assists last season. Only two other league teams return two or more players with 100 or more assists (UCLA and USC) ... Junior G **Que Johnson** (6.1 ppg/2.3 rpg) adds depth to the Cougar perimeter game.

CONCERNS - The Cougars will need to replace the scoring production provided by DaVonté Lacy, who led the team at 16.9 ppg, along with 68 three-pointers and his ability to get to the line (141-of-183/.770) ... Rebounding. Despite Hawkinson's league-leading 10.8 rebounds per game, no other returning player averaged more than 2.9 rebounds per game ... WSU gave up 76.5 ppg on 46.8 percent shooting. Both figures ranked at the bottom of the league.

SEVEN TEAMS IN POSTSEASON ARIZONA REACHES ELITE EIGHT STANFORD CAPTURES NIT CROWN

The ARIZONA Wildcats captured their 14th Pac-12 regular season title, and then won their fifth Pac-12 Tournament title as they defeated OREGON in the championship game, 80-52. It was their first Pac-12 Tournament crown since 2002.

Seven teams participated in the postseason. ARIZONA, OREGON, UCLA and UTAH were selected to participate in NCAA Tournament where the Wildcats advanced to the Elite Eight for the second straight year. ARIZONA STATE and STANFORD were selected for the NIT. Stanford swept through the postseason and earned its third NIT title, and second in four seasons. COLORADO was a participant in the CBI.

Pac-12 Player of the Year honors went to Oregon's **Joseph Young**, who averaged 20.7 points, averaged 2.5 three-point field goals per game and shot 92.5 percent from the free throw line. Arizona's **Stanley Johnson** picked up Freshman of the Year honors after he led the Wildcats with 13.8 points per game, while pulling down 6.5 rebounds per game. OREGON STATE junior G **Gary Payton II** earned Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year after recording a league-best 95 steals (3.1 spg). His father earned the same honor for the Beavers in 1987. WASHINGTON STATE sophomore F **Josh Hawkinson** led the Pac-12 in rebounds (10.8 avg) and collected Most Improved Player of the Year honors. STANFORD senior G **Chasson Randle** earned Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year, and went on to earn CoSIDA Academic All-America honors. Oregon coach **Dana Altman** was tabbed Pac-12 Coach of the Year. Altman led Oregon to its fourth consecutive 20-win season and third straight NCAA Tournament appearance.

Utah senior G **Delon Wright** was named the Bob Cousy Award winner honoring the nation's top point guard. Arizona's Stanley Johnson was named the Julius Erving Award winner honoring the nation's top small forward. Wright earned numerous All-America honors including The Sporting News First Team and John Wooden All-America Team selections. Johnson, Oregon's Young and Stanford's Randle also picked up All-America accolades.

Seven Pac-12 players were selected in the 2015 NBA Draft, third among all conferences, including four in the first round. Arizona's Johnson led the way as the No. 8 overall pick going to Detroit. Over the last three drafts, a total of 23 Pac-12 players representing nine of the Conference's 12 member institutions have been selected, including 13 first round picks.
