

DUCKS DYNASTY?

OREGON swept both the Pac-12 regular-season and tournament titles en route to a school-record 31 victories in 2016. The Ducks will likely be the heavy favorites to repeat in 2017, armed with returning scoring, rebounding and assists production among the top 3 in the Pac-12.

Coming off an NCAA Tournament No. 1 seed and Elite Eight appearance, Oregon will likely also be pegged a national championship contender and with that the top candidate to be the Pac-12's first Final Four team since the last of UCLA's three consecutive appearances in 2008, and the league's first NCAA champion since ARIZONA in 1997.

CHALLENGING NON-CONFERENCE SLATE

Pac-12 teams posted a combined record of 117-33 during the non-conference portion of their 2015-16 schedules, second-best nationally in terms of win percentage (.780) and wins per school (9.8) behind only the Big 12.

On the docket in 2016-17, Pac-12 members currently have a total of 151 non-conference games scheduled. Including potential matchups in early season tournaments, nearly half of those games could come against opponents which reached postseason play in 2015-16:

ENCORE, ENCORE?

The Pac-12 will be seeking to repeat one of its most competitive and successful men's basketball seasons in its history. Several benchmarks headlined the 2015-16 campaign:

// Seven Pac-12 teams earned NCAA Tournament bids, the most in league history.


// The Pac-12 was the toughest conference in the country to win on the road in 2015-16 (31-77, .287). Dating to its expansion to 10 teams in 1978-79, 2015-16 was the toughest road slate in league history.

// Four Pac-12 teams appeared in the final AP Top 25, the most for the league since 2007. At least three teams finished in the USA Today Coaches Top 25 for the third consecutive season.

// After just a combined five conference contests between ranked foes the previous six seasons, there were seven instances of AP Top 25 ranked Pac-12 teams facing off in 2015-16, the most for the conference since 10 in 2007-08.

// Nine Pac-12 teams finished inside the NCAA RPI Top 100, tied for the second-most by any conference in the country behind only the ACC's 11. Seven Pac-12 teams finished in the RPI Top 75, also tied for second-most nationally, and six ranked in the RPI Top 50, tied for the third-most.

// All Pac-12 teams finished with a Strength of Schedule in the Top 100, one of two conferences in the country to have all its teams in the Top 100 (Big 12). Eight Pac-12 teams posted a non-conference SOS in the Top 100, tied with the SEC for the most in the nation.




WELCOME BACK TO THE WEST

The NCAA Tournament's Final Four will be held in the western United States for the first time in more than two decades when ARIZONA STATE serves as host at University of Phoenix Stadium in Glendale, Ariz on April 1 and 3. The Final Four's last venture west came 22 years ago in 1995 when UCLA defeated Arkansas, 89-78, at the Kingdome in Seattle for its NCAA-record 11th national championship.


// The Bay Area will welcome its first NCAA Tournament Regional since 2007 when the Pac-12 handles host duties at the SAP Center in San Jose on March 23 and 25.

// Pac-12 member UTAH will play host to NCAA First and Second Round contests at Vivint Smart Home Arena in Salt Lake City on March 16 and 18.



A NEW VENUE TO CROWN THE WEST'S BEST

After four years at the MGM Grand Garden Arena in Las Vegas, the Pac-12 Conference will begin a new three-year agreement to host its postseason tournament at the new T-Mobile Arena in 2017. Opening in April 2016 and seating more than 18,000, T-Mobile Arena will debut as host to the annual event to determine the Pac-12's automatic entrant into the NCAA Tournament from March 8-11, 2017.



GROWING THE PAC-12 GLOBAL GAME

Following a successful first-of-its-kind event in 2015, Stanford and Harvard will participate in the 2016 Pac-12 China Game at Mercedes-Benz Arena in Shanghai on Nov. 12. The contest will tip at 11 a.m. local Shanghai time and be televised nationally in the U.S. on Friday, Nov. 11 at 7 p.m. PT on ESPN/ESPN2. Last season's Pac-12 China Game between Washington and Texas - the first regular-season contest by a U.S. sports league, professional or collegiate, in China - was an overwhelming success with more than 7,000 fans at Mercedes-Benz Arena and an ESPN audience in the U.S. witnessing a fast-paced game won by the Pac-12's Huskies, 77-71.

// Following an All-Star tour of Australia in July, the Pac-12 and FOX Sports Australia have reached a multi-year partnership to televise league games in the country - 21 games including a Game of the Week and eight Pac-12 Tournament games will air in Australia in 2016-17.

// 28 international student-athletes from 20 different countries appear on Pac-12 rosters for 2016-17, including multiple players from Canada (6), Democratic Republic of Congo (2), England (2) and Senegal (2).


NEW CARD ON THE BLOCK

The league's lone coaching change comes at STANFORD where Jerod Haase takes over a Cardinal team that returns four starters and the most scoring, rebounds, steals and blocks in the Pac-12 from last season.

The 18th men's basketball coach in Stanford history arrives from UAB, where he went 80-53 in four seasons and led the Blazers to the 2015 NCAA Tournament and a 2016 Conference USA regular-season title.

Haase's addition further highlights the prowess of Pac-12 coaches who were standout collegians:

- All 12 coaches played basketball collegiately, the only Power 5 conference in which that is the case. Ten played at the Division I level, trailing only 12 from the 15-team ACC.
- Five of the Pac-12's coaches were both drafted and played in the NBA (Alford, Hurley, Krystkowiak, Martin, Romar). The other Power 5 conferences have three combined NBA drafttees and players (Danny Manning, Kim Anderson, Bryce Drew).



NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK



Along with 34 returning starters among nearly 90 returning players, more than 70 newcomers - players set to make their league debut in 2016-17 - will dot the rosters of Pac-12 men's basketball programs this season.

- 45 freshmen, including McDonald's All-Americans **Lonzo Ball** and **TJ Leaf** (UCLA), **Markelle Fultz** (WASH), **Kobi Simmons** (ARIZ).
- Of the 45 freshmen there are 18 Scout Top 100 signees, 15 247 Sports Top 100 signees and a dozen ESPN Top 100 signees.
- 24 transfers and seven redshirt newcomers

STRENGTHS – Arizona returns two starting guards in senior **Kadeem Allen** (8.4 ppg/3.6 apg) and sophomore **Allonzo Trier** (14.8 ppg/3.3 rpg), a Pac-12 All-Freshmen Team selection in 2015-16 ... Sean Miller again reloaded his roster with one of the country's best recruiting classes - ranked No. 7 by both ESPN and Scout. Guards **Kobi Simmons** and **Rawle Alkins** highlight the freshman class and give the Wildcats a loaded backcourt, though **Lauri Markkanen**, a 7-0 forward from Finland, could be the most important add as he'll partner with fellow 7-0 international **Dušan Ristić** in the frontcourt. Simmons is the 22nd McDonald's All-American to sign with Arizona all-time ... Forward **Ray Smith**, a top 30 recruit in the class of 2015, will help bolster the frontcourt after missing all of 2015-16 due to injury. He'll be joined in the post by talented JUCO transfer **Keanu Pinder** ... Arizona will enter the 2016-17 season with the nation's second-longest active Top 25 ranking streak. Arizona lost three All-Pac-12 performers and three of its top four scorers from 2015-16 due to graduation - two of the winningest players in program history in Kaleb Tarczewski and Gabe York, as well as graduate transfer Ryan Anderson ... Along with the scoring departure, the trio of Anderson, Tarczewski and York accounted for more than half (685-of-1367) of the Wildcats' rebounds, and York made nearly half (98-of-221) of the team's three pointers in 2015-16 ... Young team's chemistry will be tested very early in year with regular-season opener against Michigan State in the Armed Forces Classic in Honolulu ... Hampered by injuries throughout 2015-16 season, bug has started early in 2016-17 as grad transfer **Talbott Denny** (Lipscomb) will miss season due to injury.

The junior guard also led the Sun Devils in minutes, free throws made and attempted, and assists while finishing second in three pointers made and steals ... Forward **Obinna Oleka**, who started 18 games in his debut season from junior college, is back as ASU's leading returning rebounder (6.1 rpg) and second-leading returning scorer (9.6 ppg). Also back in the fold is wing **Kodi Justice**, who paced the Sun Devils with 60 threes a season ago ... Hurley's national champion pedigree from Duke and prior coaching success at Buffalo has paid immediate dividends on the recruiting trail. He landed ESPN's No. 16 recruiting class with the signings of Top 100 freshmen **Sam Cunliffe, Romello White** (will redshirt 2016-17) and **Jethro Tshisumpa**, and transfer **Shannon Evans II** is eligible this season after earning All-MAC honors and guiding Buffalo to the NCAA Tournament in 2015 ... 6-9 forwards **Andre Adams**, who missed 2015-16 with an ACL injury, and **Ramon Vila**, will seek to join frontcourt rotation.

Will once again have to navigate one of the nation's toughest non-conference slates. After participating in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off in mid-November, ASU has a three-week slate featuring consecutive games against Kentucky, UNLV, Purdue, San Diego State and Creighton, with only two of those games at home. The Sun Devils excelled in the non-league portion of their 2015-16 schedule, notching wins over conference champions Texas A&M, Belmont and Stephen F. Austin, as well as N.C. State, Creighton and UNLV ... Incoming freshman forward **Vitaliy Shibel** suffered a torn ACL this summer and will miss the season.



STRENGTHS - Will enter 2016-17 season as a Top 10 team nationally and national title contender ... Oregon, which reached the Elite Eight in 2015-16, is one of just five teams nationally to win a game in each of the last four NCAA Tournaments along with Gonzaga, Kansas, North Carolina and Wichita State ... **Dana Altman**, the repeat John R. Wooden Pac-12 Coach of the Year in 2015-16, has guided the Ducks to 20 or more wins in a school-record six consecutive seasons, highlighted by last season's program-best 31 victories ... The defending Pac-12 regular season and tournament champions are the likely favorites to repeat as the Ducks return five key pieces from last season's seven-man rotation: **Dillon Brooks** (16.7 ppg/5.4 rpg/3.1 apg), **Tyler Dorsey** (13.4 ppg/4.3 rpg), **Chris Boucher** (12.1 ppg/7.4 rpg/2.9 bpg), **Jordan Bell** (7.0 ppg/5.4 rpg/1.8 bpg) and **Casey Benson** (6.0 ppg/3.1 apg) ... **Dylan Ennis**, a Villanova transfer who missed nearly all of 2015-16 due to injury, was granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA and will add depth to considerable backcourt talent ... Along with returning talent, Ducks add a trio of Top 100 freshmen in **M.J. Cage**, **Payton Pritchard** and **Keith Smith**, as well as the JUCO national player of the year (**Kavell Bigby-Williams**) for the second straight season.

The graduation of starter Elgin Cook and key reserve Dwayne Benjamin are Oregon's only major losses from last year's record-setting team ... Brooks underwent offseason foot surgery in late July and did not participate in Ducks' summer foreign tour of Spain. Timing of return will have definite impact on Ducks ... Oregon has the potential to face eight postseason teams as part of its 2016-17 non-conference slate, with two additional non-league games yet to be added to its schedule.

Robert Cartwright, who was expected to start at point guard in 2015-16, is slated to return after missing the entire season with a forearm injury ... Stanford's two newcomers are both Top 100 freshmen forwards in 6-8 **Kodye Pugh** and 6-11 **Trevor Stanback**.

Despite having 10 of its top 11 players back from last year's roster, the lone departed player is First Team All-Pac-12 performer and leading scorer Rosco Allen (15.6 ppg/6.5 rpg), who opted to turn pro with a year of eligibility remaining ... The returning experience will be helpful considering the Cardinal's challenging non-conference slate that features an opening contest against a reloaded Harvard team in the Pac-12 China Game, the Advocare Invitational, and potential Top 25 teams in Saint Mary's, Kansas and SMU.

STRENGTHS - With 10 returners, including four starters, the Bruins are poised to be much improved over last year's 15-17 mark and 10th-place showing in the Pac-12. Add in a Top 5 recruiting class (ESPN No. 5, Scout No. 4, 247 Sports No. 10), and UCLA is expected to be a preseason Top 25 team ... All four returning starters averaged double-figure scoring last season: **Isaac Hamilton** (16.8 ppg), **Bryce Alford** (16.1 ppg), **Thomas Welsh** (11.2 ppg) and **Aaron Holiday** (10.3 ppg). All totaled among its 10 returners, UCLA has the second-most scoring back (77%) in the Pac-12 just behind Stanford. Perhaps more impressive is the offensive facilitation and firepower back for the Bruins as 84.3 percent of the team's assist production returns, led by Alford (5.2 apg), Holiday (3.9 apg) and Hamilton (3.3 apg), and 94.5 percent of made threes are back led by the same trio (172 combined threes) ... Alford is the league's returning career leader in points (1,364), assists (445) and threes (213) ... McDonald's All-Americans **Lonzo Ball** and **T.J. Leaf** will provide an immediate impact, but fellow Top 100 freshman **Ike Anigbogu**, a 6-10 forward/center, may be the most critical addition for the Bruins' frontcourt needs.

Defense and rebounding will be major keys to Bruins' success in 2016-17. UCLA surrendered 76.7 points and 37.1 rebounds per game in 2015-16, both 10th in the league. With the departure of second- and third-leading rebounders Tony Parker (8.2 rpg) and Jonah Bolden (4.8 rpg), the Bruins will need to establish an interior presence to be a factor on the boards and defensive end.

Add 6-10 forwards **Harrison Henderson** and **Nick Rakocevic** and USC's recruiting class ranks No. 31 nationally according to ESPN ... Received an important late addition in August when 6-9 immediately eligible transfer **Charles Bugs** joined roster from Minnesota, where he averaged 5.9 points and 2.9 rebounds in 2015-16.

Coming off a 2015-16 season that included its first NCAA Tournament appearance in five seasons and first AP Top 25 ranking since 2008, USC would certainly trend high in the preseason Top 25 provided the return of second- and third-leading scorers Nikola Jovanovic (12.1 ppg) and Julian Jacobs (11.6 ppg/5.5 apg), but both opted to forgo final season of eligibility ... The frontcourt will be USC's biggest question mark in 2016-17 with only two key returning contributors over 6-5 - rim-rocking 6-11 forward **Chimezie Metu**, who averaged 6.4 points and 3.6 rebounds as a rookie, and rangy 6-10 wing **Bennie Boatwright**, who tied for the team-lead with 60 threes.

Fultz led Washington in scoring during its August tour of Australia and New Zealand with 21.2 points per game, and provided 6.8 rebounds, 4.6 assists per contest. He also was named Most Valuable Player of the FIBA Americas Under-18 Championship in Chile this July, leading Team USA to a perfect 5-0 record and the gold medal by averaging 13.8 points, 5.2 rebounds and four assists in just 21.8 minutes ... Dickerson (10.6 ppg/11.4 rpg) averaged a double-double during the Huskies' summer foreign tour, and was joined in double-digit scoring by Fultz and returners **David Crisp** (13.2 ppg) and **Dominic Green** (11.2 ppg) ... New Zealand newcomer **Sam Timmins** and Auburn transfer **Matthew Atewe** add depth alongside Dickerson and Dime in frontcourt.

Lost top three scorers (Andrew Andrews, Dejounte Murray, Marquese Chriss) from fast-paced Huskies team that started four freshmen and averaged league-best 83.9 points per game in 2015-16. With departures, UW lost more than two-thirds of its scoring ... While Fultz is expected to shoulder the bulk of the vacated scoring load, Huskies will need other point-producers to emerge ... Though its high-scoring and up-tempo pace was a contributing factor, UW also allowed the most points in the Pac-12 at 80.8 points per game. Huskies will need to find a way to match enough defensive stops with their offensive pace.

Possibly seeking to increase Cougars' offensive pace, coach **Ernie Kent** added a quartet of guards in **Milan Acquaah**, **Jamar Ergas**, **Malachi Flynn** and **KJ Langston** to join Iroegbu and returning starter **Charles Callison** (7.9 ppg/3.0 apg) in the backcourt ... The trio of Hawkinson (18.6 ppg/9.0 rpg), Iroegbu (16.0 ppg/7.2 apg/6.2 rpg) and Flynn (10.8 ppg/6.2 apg) led the Cougars to a 3-2 record on their summer tour of Italy ... Aiding Hawkinson in the frontcourt will be returning center Clifford, who averaged 6.8 points on 64 percent shooting in just 14 minutes per game last season, and a pair of 6-9 rookie forwards in **Jeff Pollard** and **Arinze Chidom** ... WSU is in the top-half of the league in returning scoring, rebounding, assists, steals and made threes.

Saw one starter (Que Johnson) and two key reserves (Valentine Izundu, Renard Suggs) transfer out of program, and starter Junior Longrus transition into graduate manager role with Cougars after earning two degrees in May 2016 ... Loss of Izundu, who averaged 2.2 rejections in 2015-16, places WSU 10th among the conference's returning blocks production ... Closed conference play with 17 consecutive losses.

LEAGUE RECORD SEVEN TEAMS EARN NCAA BIDS, NO. 1 SEED OREGON REACHES ELITE EIGHT


The Pac-12 celebrated its Centennial with one of its best seasons of men's basketball in conference history in 2015-16. The league was historically deep with a record seven teams earning bids to the 2016 NCAA Tournament and concluding the season ranked third in the nation in Conference RPI, equaling its highest ranking since 2000, with nine teams in the RPI Top 100 and 11 in the Top 110.

The OREGON Ducks became the ninth team in league history to accomplish the double championship, claiming the Pac-12 regular season title outright with a 14-4 record as well as capturing the program's fourth Pac-12 Tournament title with an 88-57 victory over UTAH in the championship game.

OREGON was joined by ARIZONA, CALIFORNIA, COLORADO, OREGON STATE, UTAH and USC in the NCAA Tournament, while WASHINGTON was selected to participate in the NIT. The Pac-12 became the only conference to advance a team to the Elite Eight in each of the last three seasons as OREGON defeated Holy Cross, St. Joseph's and Duke to reach the West Region final.

UTAH sophomore **Jakob Poeltl** was chosen the Pac-12's Player of the Year as well as a consensus Second Team All-American and the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award recipient as the nation's best center. The 7-0 forward/center from Vienna, Austria led the Pac-12 in field goal percentage (.646) and finished second in the league in scoring (17.2 ppg), fourth in rebounding (9.1 rpg) and eighth in blocks (1.6 bpg).

CALIFORNIA forward **Jaylen Brown** averaged 14.6 points and 5.4 rebounds to earn Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honors. OREGON STATE senior guard **Gary Payton II** became the first player in league history to repeat as Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year after pacing the conference in steals (2.5 spg) for the second straight season. COLORADO redshirt sophomore guard **George King** was selected Pac-12 Most Improved Player of the Year after averaging 13.6 points while hitting 68 three pointers at a league-best 45.6 percent clip. UTAH senior guard **Brandon Taylor** was voted the Pac-12 Student-Athlete of the Year. OREGON's **Dana Altman** was named Pac-12

Coach of the Year for the second straight season and third time in the last four years.

Joining Poeltl in earning All-America honors were ARIZONA senior forward **Ryan Anderson**, OREGON sophomore forward **Dillon Brooks** and Payton II.

The Pac-12 had five players selected in the NBA Draft, including three lottery selections - California's Jaylen Brown (No. 3 - Boston), Washington's **Marquese Chriss** (No. 8), Utah's Jakob Poeltl (No. 9) - most among all conferences.

PAC-12 TOURNAMENT RECAP: Oregon claimed its fourth Pac-12 Tournament Championship (2003, 2007, 2013, 2016) ... Oregon's 31-point victory is the largest margin of victory in the Pac-12 Tournament Championship. The previous record was set in 2015 when Arizona beat Oregon by 28 points (80-52) ... Oregon's win marks the first time in conference tournament history that the better seeds held through the entire tournament. There were no upsets (loss by the better seed) in the 2016 Pac-12 Tournament, the first time that has happened in event history. There was only one upset in the 1987, 1989, 2002, 2004, 2006 and 2008 tourneys ... Elgin Cook was named the Pac-12 Tournament Most Outstanding Player. He averaged 17.3 points, 6.3 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game. Cook and fellow All-Tournament picks Tyler Dorsey, Dillon Brooks and Chris Boucher combined to average 67.6 points per game in the 2016 Pac-12 Tournament.
