Built on a firm foundation of academic excellence and superior athletic performance, the Conference ushered in a new era on July 1, 2011, officially becoming the Pac-12 Conference with the additions of the University of Colorado and University of Utah.

Just 27 days after the Conference officially changed its name, Commissioner Larry Scott announced the creation of the Pac-12 Networks on July 27, 2011, solidifying a landmark television deal and putting the Conference on the forefront of collegiate athletics. The Networks, including one national network, six regional networks, and a robust digital network marked the first-ever integrated media company owned by a college conference. In addition, the “TV Everywhere” rights allow fans to access Pac-12 Networks outside the home on any digital device, including smartphones and tablet computers.

In 2011, the Pac-12 also launched its Globalization Initiative to proactively promote the Conference and member institutions through student-athlete exchanges and sport. In its first three years, Pac-12 student-athletes have enjoyed unique cultural and athletic experiences in China, fielding full university and Pac-12 all-star teams in women’s volleyball and men’s basketball, with plans to play the first-ever men’s basketball regular season game in China in November 2015, and the Conference and its member schools have gained significant brand exposure for the future and set a foundation for growth.

On the field, the Pac-12 rises above the rest, upholding its tradition as the “Conference of Champions ®,” claiming an incredible 131 NCAA team titles since 1999-2000, including 10 in 2013-14. That is an average of nearly nine championships per academic year. Even more impressive has been the breadth of the Pac-12’s success, with championships coming in 28 different men’s and women’s sports. The Pac-12 has led or tied the nation in NCAA Championships in 48 of the last 54 years, the only exceptions being in 1980-81, 1988-89, 1990-91 and 1995-96 when the Conference finished second, and only twice finished third in 1998-99 and 2004-05.

For the ninth-consecutive year, the Pac-12 had the most NCAA titles or tied for the most of any conference in the country, winning at least six every year since 2000-01. No other conference has won double-digit NCAA crowns in a single year, the Pac-12 doing so seven times, including a record 14 in 1996-97.

Spanning nearly a century of outstanding athletics achievements, the Pac-12 was the first conference to reach 400 championships in 2010-11. With the inclusion of Colorado and Utah, the Conference surpassed another major milestone, with league teams capturing 450 titles, outdistancing the next conference by nearly 200. In all, Conference teams have won 469 NCAA Championships (287 men’s, 154 women’s, 28 combined).

Pac-12 members have won 287 NCAA team championships on the men’s side, 83 more than the next closest conference. Men’s NCAA crowns have come at a phenomenal rate for the Pac-12 - 16 basketball titles by six schools (more than any other conference), 54 tennis titles, 46 outdoor track & field crowns, and 28 baseball titles. Pac-12 members have won 25 of 45 NCAA titles in volleyball, 40 of 45 in water polo, 28 in skiing, and 24 in swimming & diving national championships.

Individually, the Conference has produced an impressive number of NCAA individual champions. Over 2,000 (2,167) individual crowns have been won by Pac-12 student-athletes over the years with 1,485 by male student-athletes.

On the women’s side, the story is much the same. Since the NCAA began conducting women’s championships 33 years ago, Pac-12 members have claimed at least four national titles in a single season on 24 occasions, including 14-consecutive years from 2000-2014. Overall, the Pac-12 has captured 154 NCAA women’s titles, easily outdistancing the SEC, which is second with 93. Pac-12 members have dominated a number of sports, winning 23 softball titles, 21 tennis crowns, 14 volleyball titles, 15 of the last 25 trophies in golf, and 13 in swimming & diving.

Pac-12 women student-athletes shine nationally on an individual basis, as well, having captured an unmatched 682 NCAA individual crowns, an average of nearly 21 championships per season.

The Pac-12’s excellence is further proven in the annual Learfield Sports Directors’ Cup competition, the prestigious award that honors the best overall collegiate athletics programs in the country. STANFORD continued its remarkable run and won its unprecedented 20th-consecutive Directors’ Cup in 2013-14. Seven Pac-12 member institutions ranked among the top-27 Division I programs, the most of any conference and five were in the top 20: No. 1 STANFORD, No. 7 UCLA, No. 8 USC, No. 15 OREGON, No. 20 CALIFORNIA, No. 26 ARIZONA and No. 27 ARIZONA STATE. At least five member institutions have been ranked in the top 20 in all but one year of the Director’s Cup program, with seven appearing in the top 20 on five different occasions (1998, 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2006).

## 2013-14 REVIEW

The Conference’s 10 national titles came in the form of six men’s and four women’s crowns. Six different league schools claimed NCAA titles and, of the seven NCAA institutions to have won multiples titles, three were from the Pac-12. No other conference in the country had more than one team win multiple NCAA titles.

OREGON was one of three teams in the country to win three NCAA titles

this academic season. The Ducks took home the hardware in men’s outdoor track & field, the program’s first team title in the sport since 1984, and swept the men’s and women’s indoor national championships. It is the first time ever UO has won three NCAA titles in one academic year. An additional four teams in the country had two NCAA titles, including USC and UCLA. The Trojans continue to dominate the sports of men’s water polo and men’s tennis, winning a sixth-straight title in the pool and a fifth in six years on the court. The Bruins won the Conference’s third-ever women’s soccer title and the program’s first, while also taking home the women’s tennis crown.

COLORADO kicked off the year for the Conference winning its fourth NCAA men’s cross country title. CALIFORNIA was first in men’s swimming, the program’s third national championship in four years, and STANFORD won its third women’s water polo crown in four years, extending the school’s streak of at least one NCAA team championship to 38-consecutive years.

In addition to the 10 national championships, the Pac-12 also had runners-up in six NCAA Championship events: women’s cross country (ARIZONA), women’s swimming (STANFORD), women’s rowing (CALIFORNIA), men’s volleyball (STANFORD) and women’s water polo (UCLA). Overall, the Conference had 32 teams finish in the top four at 22 NCAA Championship events, including an all-Pac-12 women’s water polo final four.

Participation in the postseason was a common occurrence for the Pac-12 in 2013-14. Of the 22 sports sponsored by the Conference, 19 witnessed at least half its teams participating in NCAA or other postseason action. The men sent 79 of a possible 100 teams into the postseason (79.4 percent), while the women sent 83 of a possible 115 teams (72.2 percent).

For the second-straight year, a record number of league teams participated in college football bowl games. After earning a then-league record eight bowl bids in 2012, Conference teams bested that with nine teams making bowl trips in 2013, producing a 6-3 record. A Pac-12 record five teams posted 10 or more wins during the season, a feat no other league in the country accomplished. STANFORD represented the Pac-12 in the Rose Bowl for the second-consecutive year by virtue of a 38-14 win over ARIZONA STATE at the Pac-12 Championship Game. ASU went on to participate in the National University Holiday Bowl. Also joining the Cardinal and Sun Devils in postseason play were OREGON (Valero Alamo), UCLA (Hyundai Sun Bowl), USC (Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl), WASHINGTON (Fight Hunger Bowl), WASHINGTON STATE (Gildan New Mexico Bowl), ARIZONA (AdvoCare V100 Bowl) and OREGON STATE (Sheraton Hawai’i Bowl). Six Pac-12 teams appeared in the final Associated Press poll marking the sixth time in league history that six teams were in the final ranking. The teams in the top 25 were: Oregon (9th), Stanford (11th), UCLA (16th), USC (19th), Arizona State (21) and Washington (25th). Also receiving votes was Arizona.

It was also a record-breaking season for Pac-12 men’s basketball with a league-record eight teams posting 20 wins during the 2013-14 campaign. ARIZONA captured its 13th regular-season crown, while UCLA won its fourth Pac-12 Tournament title at the MGM Grand Garden Arena in Las Vegas, its first since 2008. The highly-competitive Pac-12 season was rewarded with a record-tying six teams (Arizona, ARIZONA STATE, COLORADO, OREGON, STANFORD, UCLA) earning NCAA Tournament bids. The Wildcats obtained one of the four No. 1 seeds in the postseason tournament, the Conference’s first since 2008. Pac-12 teams went 8-6 in tournament play, with UA, Stanford and UCLA reaching the Sweet Sixteen, while the Wildcats were just one point short of the NCAA Final Four, advancing to the Elite Eight. The eight NCAA Tournament wins were the most by the league since it posted an identical 8-6 mark in 2008. An additional three teams participated in postseason action with CALIFORNIA and UTAH receiving NIT bids and OREGON STATE playing in the CBI.

Pac-12 women’s basketball also saw tremendous success with five teams earning NCAA Tournament bids, the most since 2006. USC captured its first-ever Pac-12 Tournament title, securing its first NCAA Tournament bid since 2006. STANFORD claimed its 14th-consecutive regular-season crown, then advanced to the NCAA Final Four for the sixth time in seven years. Its trip to the national semifinals was also the seventh-straight year a Pac-12 team has advanced that far. OREGON STATE also ended a long NCAA Tournament drought, earning its first invitation to the Big Dance since 1996; CALIFORNIA made a third-straight trip to the NCAA Tournament; and ARIZONA STATE returned to the postseason event after a two-year absence. COLORADO, OREGON, WASHINGTON and WASHINGTON STATE also all participated in the WNIT, making it the most-ever teams to participate in the postseason in the history of the league. Three teams were ranked in the final Associated Press poll: Stanford was No. 6, Cal was No. 24 and USC was No. 25, its first appearance in the final poll in 20 years.

Pac-12 volleyball also recorded an unprecedented season with a league-record nine teams earning NCAA Tournament bids, also the most in the country, with three receiving a top-16 seed. After winning the Conference regular-season crown for the first time since 2005, WASHINGTON advanced to its first national semifinal since 2006 marking the 14th time in 16 years a Pac-12 team has advanced that far. With 14-straight years of at least six Conference teams earning NCAA bids, the Pac-12 has dominated the sport, winning a record 14 NCAA volleyball titles since 1982, including 12 in the last 23 years.

## 2014-15 PAC-12 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP DATES AND SITES

OREGON STATE won its second-straight Pac-12 baseball crown and was the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament. Five teams altogether earned postseason bids with ARIZONA STATE, OREGON, STANFORD and WASHINGTON joining the Beavers in the tournament. UW made its return to the NCAA Tournament after a 10-year absence, while the Cardinal used a walk-off home run to advance to the Super Regionals before falling to eventual national champion Vanderbilt. The Pac-12 has, by far, won the most baseball national titles of any conference in the country, claiming 28 titles dating back to 1947, including two of the last three when the league had back-to-back champions in 2012 (Arizona) and 2013 (UCLA).

Another sport in which the Pac-12 Conference has dominated is softball where league teams have claimed 23 NCAA titles in the 33-year history of the championship. Pac-12 teams captured an unprecedented nine in a row from 1988-1997, then most recently claimed six-straight from 2006-11. Five teams participated in the tournament in 2014, with OREGON earning the overall No. 1 seed and advancing to the NCAA Women's College World Series. Joining the Ducks in the tournament were third-seeded UCLA, No. 9-seed ARIZONA STATE, No. 11-seed ARIZONA and No. 12-seed WASHINGTON as the Bruins, Wildcats and Huskies went as far as the Super Regionals. The Conference has had at least three teams in the NCAA Tournament every year since the league began sponsoring the sport in 1987. Before earning the No. 1-overall seed, UO claimed its second-straight Pac-12 crown.

### PAC-12 CONFERENCE HISTORY

The roots of the Pac-12 Conference date back 99 years to December 2, 1915, when the Pacific Coast Conference (PCC) was founded at a meeting at the Oregon Hotel in Portland, Ore. The original membership consisted of four schools - the University of California at Berkeley, the University of Washington, the University of Oregon, and Oregon State College (now Oregon State University). All still are charter members of the Conference.

Pacific Coast Conference play began in 1916 and, one year later, Washington State College (now Washington State University) was accepted into the league, with Stanford University following in 1918.

In 1922, the PCC expanded to eight teams with the admission of the University of Southern California (USC) and the University of Idaho. In 1924, the University of Montana joined the league roster, and in 1928, the PCC grew to 10 members with the addition of UCLA.

The Pacific Coast Conference competed as a 10-member league until 1950, with the exception of 1943-45 when World War II curtailed intercollegiate athletic competition to a minimum. During that time, the league's first commissioner was named. Edwin N. Atherton was Commissioner in 1940 and was succeeded by Victor O. Schmidt in 1944. In 1950, Montana resigned from the Conference and the PCC continued as a nine-team Conference through 1958.

In 1959, the PCC was dissolved and the Athletic Association of Western Universities (AAWU) was formed with Thomas J. Hamilton as appointed Commissioner of the new league. The original AAWU membership included California, Stanford, USC, UCLA and Washington. Washington State joined the membership in 1962, while Oregon and Oregon State joined in 1964. Under Hamilton's watch, the name Pacific-8 Conference was adopted in 1968. In 1971, Wiles Hallock took over as Commissioner of the Pac-8.

Ten years later, on July 1, 1978, the University of Arizona and Arizona State University were admitted to the league and the Pacific-10 Conference became a reality. In 1986-87, the league took on a new look, expanding to include 10 women's sports. Since then, the Conference has been considered the premiere league in women's athletics, securing the most NCAA titles in women's sports of any conference nearly every year.

Thomas C. Hansen was named the Commissioner of the Pac-10 in 1983, a role he would hold for 26 years until 2009, and was succeeded by current Commissioner Larry Scott, who took on the new role in July 2009.

During the 2010-11 academic year, the University of Colorado accepted its invitation to join the Pac-12 on June 11, 2010, and on June 17, 2010, the University of Utah agreed to join the Conference. The Buffaloes and Utes officially became the 11th and 12th members of the Conference on July 1, 2011, the first additions to the league since 1978.

It was during that 2010-11 academic year that Scott helped deliver monumental changes that transformed the Conference into a modern 12-team league. In addition to expanding to 12 teams, member institutions agreed to equal revenue sharing for the first time in the Conference's history, created two divisions - the North and the South, for football only and established a Football Championship Game for the first time ever. He also secured a landmark media rights deal that dramatically increased national exposure and revenue for each school, establishing the Pac-12 Networks and Pac-12 Digital Network that guaranteed enhanced exposure across all sports.

Currently, the Pac-12 sponsors 11 men's sports and 11 women's sports. Additionally, the Conference is a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) in four other men's sports and three women's sports.

The Pac-12 Conference offices are located in the heart of San Francisco in the SOMA district.

**PAC-12 TOPS FINAL LEARFIELD DIRECTORS' CUP**

**WALNUT CREEK, Calif.** - Five Pac-12 Conference institutions finished the 2013-14 academic year ranked in the final Learfield Sports Directors' Cup top 20, and seven were positioned in the top 27, the most of any conference, the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) announced.

Despite capturing just one NCAA title during the 2013-14 academic year, STANFORD won its 20th-consecutive Directors' Cup. Nine top five finishes, including seven in the top three, propelled the Cardinal in tallying 1,482.00 points. It's the fourth-highest point total all-time for the Cardinal.

UCLA finished seventh (1,078.50 points) and have now placed among the top 10 three consecutive years and in 19 of 21 Directors' Cup standings all-time. The Bruins captured the women's soccer title in the fall, added a women's tennis title in the spring, and had three top-four NCAA finishes. NCAA championships in men's water polo and men's tennis elevated USC to an eighth-place showing with 1,063.75 points. OREGON placed 15th with 943.00 points after picking up three NCAA titles in men's and women's indoor track and field, and men's outdoor track and field. A men's swimming and diving title led CALIFORNIA to a 20th place finish, while ARIZONA and ARIZONA STATE rounded out the top 27, finishing 26th (795.25) and 27th (793.25), respectively.

WASHINGTON finished 33rd with 646.50 points. COLORADO, aided by a national title in men's cross country, was 39th overall (543.00). UTAH finished 72nd with 298.25 points, followed by OREGON STATE (75th, 280.75) and WASHINGTON STATE (149th, 104.00).

The success of the Pac-12 in the Director's Cup was bolstered by the capturing of 10 NCAA titles, most among all conferences. In addition, Pac-12 league members recorded six runner-up finishes and at least one team finished among the top four in 22 NCAA championships.

The Directors' Cup was developed as a joint effort between the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and USA Today. Points are awarded based on each institution's finish in up to 20 sports - 10 women's and 10 men's.

OREGON STATE won its second-consecutive Pac-12 Championship after going 23-7 in league play. Ranked in the top-five throughout the entire season, the Beavers earned the No. 1 overall national seed in the 2014 NCAA Division I Baseball Championship. OSU made a school-record sixth-straight NCAA postseason appearance and hosted a regional in Corvallis for the second-straight year. Four other teams earned NCAA postseason at-large bids in ARIZONA STATE, OREGON, STANFORD and WASHINGTON. The Pac-12 runner up Huskies finished just two games back from the Beavers after being picked to finish 10th out of 11 teams in the preseason poll. UW returned to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2004 and reached 40 or more wins for just the fifth time in program history.

In one of the most unpredictable regional rounds in NCAA Baseball Championship history that saw only three of eight national seeds advance to Super Regionals, only one Pac-12 team managed to advance to Super Regionals. The Cardinal—who finished tied for fifth in the league—upset Indiana to win the Bloomington Regional thanks to a two-run walkoff homerun in the regional final. The Beavers fell to UC Irvine in the regional final, while the Sun Devils, Ducks and Huskies all fell in regionals on the road. Stanford traveled to Nashville to take on Vanderbilt, but the Cardinal's hot bats couldn't overcome the Commodores' stingy pitching staff. With no teams advancing to the College World Series, streaks of two-consecutive Pac-12 NCAA Champions and 17-straight years with a Pac-12 representative in Omaha were snapped.

OSU sophomore outfielder **Michael Conforto** was named the Pac-12 Player of the Year for the second-consecutive year, while Beaver LHP **Jace Fry** earned Pitcher of the Year honors. WASHINGTON junior shortstop **Erik Forgiore** was tabbed the Defensive Player of the Year, STANFORD freshman right-hander **Cal Quantrill** was named Freshman of the Year and Washington's **Lindsay Meggs** garnered Coach of the Year laurels.

The ARIZONA Wildcats captured their 13th Pac-12 regular season title, and first since the 2011 season, while the UCLA Bruins won their fourth Pac-12 Tournament title as they defeated Arizona in the championship game, 75-71.

A league-record eight teams posted 20-wins during the 2013-14 campaign. The highly-competitive Pac-12 season rewarded the league with a record-tying six teams (ARIZONA, ARIZONA STATE, COLORADO, OREGON, STANFORD, UCLA) selected to participate in NCAA Tournament. Arizona obtained a coveted No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. It was the first time a Pac-12 team earned one of the four No. 1 seeds since UCLA in 2008, and the sixth time the Wildcats were the Tournament's No. 1 seed. The Pac-12 showed it was worthy of the six selections as it compiled a 8-6 record in the NCAA Tournament with Arizona, Stanford and UCLA each reaching the Sweet Sixteen. The Wildcats advanced to the Elite Eight before dropping a one-point overtime decision to Wisconsin. The eight wins in the NCAA Tournament were the most by the league since it posted an identical 8-6 mark in 2008.

Arizona's **Nick Johnson** and **Aaron Gordon**, and UCLA's **Kyle Anderson** picked up several All-America honors as Johnson earned consensus honors after being selected first team All-America by USBWA, NABC and The Sporting News, as well as the Wooden Award All-America team.

CALIFORNIA's **Mike Montgomery**, who retired after 32 years as a college head coach. Montgomery compiled a 677-316 record in 32 seasons (eight at Montana, 18 at Stanford, and six at California). His 282 wins in league play were third only to Hall-of-Famers Arizona's Lute Olson (327) and UCLA's John Wooden (305).

Pac-12 Player of the Year honors went to Arizona's Johnson, while teammate Aaron Gordon picked up Freshman of the Year and head coach **Sean Miller** was named Coach of the Year. Arizona State's **Jordan Bachynski** was Defensive Player of the Year, and **Anthony Brown** of Stanford was tabbed Most Improved Player of the Year. The Scholar-Athlete of the Year was **Dwight Powell** of Stanford.

Nine Pac-12 players were selected in the 2014 NBA Draft, tying for the most in the country, including six in the first round. Arizona's Johnson led the way as the No. 4 overall pick going to Orlando. UCLA had three players taken in the first round marking just the second time in Conference history three players from the same team were selected in the opening round. The Pac-12 has had 29 first round picks over the last seven years.

STANFORD returned to the NCAA Women's Final Four after a one year absence to make its sixth appearance in the semifinals in the last seven years, marking the Pac-12's seventh-straight Final Four appearance. The Cardinal earned its 14th-straight Pac-12 regular season crown, but failed to make the Pac-12 Tournament Championship game for the first time in the event's history. USC upset Stanford in the tournament semifinals and went on to beat OREGON STATE in the title game to win its first Pac-12 Tournament Championship in program history. Pac-12 teams saw tremendous success this year with five teams earning NCAA Tournament bids and four more receiving WNIT invitations. It was the most NCAA tournament bids since 2006 while the nine total teams competing in postseason play was a Pac-12 record.

A three-time consensus All-American, STANFORD's **Chiney Ogwumike** was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Year, as well as the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year for the third-straight year. Ogwumike was also named the Pac-12 Women's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year. WASHINGTON's **Kelsey Plum** was named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year. Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer and STANFORD head coach **Tara VanDerveer** was named the John R. Wooden Coach of the Year for the 14th time in 27 years at the helm. Early in the season, VanDerveer became just the fifth women's basketball coach in NCAA history to reach 900 wins. The Pac-12 also boasted the nation's leading rebounder in Oregon sophomore **Jillian Alleyne**, who collected a Pac-12 single-season best 476 (16.2 rpg) rebounds, as well as the top two scoring freshmen in the nation in Oregon's **Chrisae Rowe** (21.6 ppg) and Plum (20.9). Alleyne and CALIFORNIA's **Brittany Boyd** were also honored nationally as Associated Press honorable mention selections. Oregon State head coach **Scott Rueck** was named WBCA Region 8 Coach of the Year for leading the Beavers to one of their best seasons in program history.

Also of note in 2013-14, Ogwumike broke the all-time scoring record held by former Stanford star Candice Wiggins as she finished her career with 2,737 points in addition to breaking the career rebounding record with 1,567 rebounds and the record for career field goals made, finishing with 1,100 total. The Cardinal senior also broke single-season records for points (967), field goals made (402) and field goals attempted (669). She became the third player in Pac-12 history to be selected as the number one overall pick in the WNBA draft, going to the Connecticut Sun. Older sister Nnemkadi Ogwumike was also drafted number one overall out of Stanford in 2012. The Conference's five selections in the draft were the most since 2007.

COLORADO claimed the NCAA Men's Cross Country Championships, the program's fourth ever and first since 2006, after placing three runners in the top 25. It is the first for the Conference since 2008 and 14th all-time. OREGON's **Edward Cheserek** won the men's individual crown, becoming the first-ever Oregon freshman to claim the individual title. He came from behind in the final 2,000 meters of the race to win by a decisive 18-second margin. The wins for both Colorado and Cheserek followed up respective victories at the Pac-12 Championships where the Buffs claimed a third-straight team title in front of a home crowd after scoring just 28 points with all five scoring runners crossing the finish line in the top 10, including three in the top five.

Cheserek's debut season earned him USTFCCCA National Athlete of the Year honors, while also being voted Pac-12 Athlete of the Year and Pac-12 Newcomer of the Year by the league's coaches. Colorado's **Mark Wetmore** was tabbed the league's Coach of the Year for the third-consecutive season, as well as being named the USTFCCCA National Men's Coach of the Year. STANFORD's **Chris Miltenberg** also received USTFCCCA West Region Men's Coach of the Year nods after leading the Cardinal to the NCAA West Region title.

**PAC-12 MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR**

Tyler Stutzman, Stanford

ARIZONA had an outstanding year, posting its best-ever finishes at the NCAA Championships and Pac-12 Championships. The Wildcats were second at the national meet after winning the program's first-ever Conference crown in Louisville, Colo. Five league teams placed in the top 20 at the NCAA Championships with COLORADO coming in seventh, STANFORD was 11th, OREGON was 14th and WASHINGTON was 17th.

At the Pac-12 Championships, the Wildcats had three runners in the top six, led by Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year **Elvin Kibet's** second-place showing, to edge out the host-Buffs for the title, 69-75. Pac-12 Newcomer of the Year **Kayla Beattie** was fifth overall at the Conference meet. STANFORD's **Aisling Cuffe** was the individual winner, the second-straight Cardinal to win the race, and was named Pac-12 Athlete of the Year after coming in fourth place at the NCAA Championships. Arizona's **James Li** was voted Pac-12 Coach of the Year and was tabbed West Region Coach of the Year by the USTFCCA after leading his squad to its first West Region title since 1998. Colorado's **Mark Wetmore** was the USTFCCA's Mountain Region Coach of the Year.

PAC-12 WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

Elvin Kibet, Arizona

The 2013 Pac-12 Football season culminated with a record nine Pac-12 teams earning bowl berths as six went on to record victories in those games, also a Pac-12 record. The previous record was set in 1998 when the Pac-12 went 5-1 in postseason play and was tied in 2008 after a 5-0 bowl record. In 2013, the Pac-12 outscored opponents 228-97 in six bowl wins while the losses were by a combined 21 points. A record-tying eight teams produced winning records during the 2013 season—only other seasons equaling that feat 2012 and 2002.

STANFORD earned its second-consecutive and 14th overall trip to the Rose Bowl by virtue of its 38-14 victory over the South Division's ARIZONA STATE Sun Devils in the Pac-12 Football Championship Game. The Cardinal dominated the Sun Devils on the road to claim its second-straight Conference title. Stanford running back **Tyler Gaffney** carried the ball 22 times for 133 yards and three touchdowns en route to earning the game's most valuable player award while kick returner/wide receiver **Ty Montgomery** added 150 all-purpose yards (22 rushing, 69 receiving, 59 kick return) and two touchdowns.

ARIZONA junior RB **Ka'Deem Carey**, the 2013 Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year and two-time Consensus All-American, lead the Conference in rushing for the second-consecutive year, finishing second in the nation in average yards per game (157.10). ARIZONA STATE senior DT **Will Sutton** was named the Pac-12's Pat Tillman Defensive Player of the Year and was honored by the league's offensive linemen with the Morris Trophy as the league's top defensive lineman--the second-straight year he has received both honors. UCLA junior offensive lineman **Xavier Su'a Filo** was honored with the Morris Trophy as the league's top offensive lineman. Sun Devil head coach **Todd Graham** was named the Pac-12 Coach of the Year in just his second season at the helm after guiding Arizona State to a Pac-12 South Division title and first 10-win season since 1996. UCLA linebacker turned running back **Myles Jack** was named both the Offensive and Defensive Freshman of the Year after a stellar first year as a two-way player for the Bruins. Stanford offensive lineman **David Yankey** was a Consensus All-American, while five additional Conference players also garnered All-America status. Oregon State junior WR **Brandin Cooks**, also a Consensus All-American, received the Biletnikoff Award, given to the nation's top wide receiver while UCLA LB **Anthony Barr** was the Lott IMPACT Award recipient and WASHINGTON junior TE **Austin Seferian-Jenkins** was honored as the nation's top tight end with the John Mackey Award.

The Pac-12 enjoyed another remarkable season in men's golf, highlighted by Stanford's run to the NCAA Championships and a bevy of national individual honors for Conference golfers. The Conference was well represented on the national awards circuit, as a pair of Pac-12 golfers garnered national accolades and four were named PING first team All-Americans. Four teams were ranked among the top 12 in the final GolfWeek rankings, and a fifth cracked the top 25. Additionally, three individuals found themselves ranked among the top 10 in GolfWeek's final individual rankings. Eight Conference teams received NCAA Regional bids and six qualified for the NCAA Championships, where Stanford senior **Cameron Wilson** earned the 2014 NCAA men's golf individual title after sinking a birdie putt in the third playoff hole. Wilson became the third Cardinal to capture the title, joining Sandy Tatum (1942) and Tiger Woods (1996). Stanford, which posted the low team score in stroke play, was eliminated in the match-play semifinals by eventual runner up Oklahoma.

Stanford (1,438, -2) posted a 15-stroke victory at the Gallery Golf Club in Marana, Ariz. to capture its first Pac-12 title in 20 years. The Cardinal, who led the entire tournament and held a five-stroke lead after 54 holes, picked up eight strokes on Sunday to become the seventh different Pac-12 school to win the title since 2004. Washington, which made a furious run on day three to card a 13-over 1,453 for the tournament, took second, while California finished third at 27-over (1,479). **Patrick Rodgers** became the Cardinal's 21st individual winner after recording a 7-under 281 for the tournament.

**Rodgers** was named the Pac-12 Men's Golfer of the Year, **Rico Hoey** of USC was tabbed Pac-12 Freshman of the Year and Cardinal coach **Conrad Ray** picked up Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors for the second time in his career on The Farm. Rodgers also became Stanford's second recipient of the Jack Nicklaus Award, which recognizes the top players at the Division I, II, III, NAIA and NJCAA levels, joining former Stanford golfer Tiger Woods, who earned the honor in 1996. The awards continued to roll in for Rodgers as he also won the prestigious Ben Hogan Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate men's golfer, taking into account all collegiate and amateur competitions during the past 12-month period. Rodgers and teammate Wilson joined Cal's **Joël Stalter** and **Brandon Hagy** in being named Division I PING first team All-Americans. Hagy was also named the 2014 Pac-12 Men's Golf Scholar-Athlete of the Year and earned the Byron Nelson Award--a national Golfer of the Year award that honors athletic, academic and community service accomplishments.

The 2014 Pac-12 Championships hosted by CALIFORNIA showcased some of the best talents in the nation as seven of the eight Conference teams went into the event ranked in the Top 25. UTAH scored a 197.925 to cap a spectacular regular season as Conference champions. **Georgia Dabritz** took home the bar title with a perfect 10.0 and tied for the top spot on vault with a 9.950 with WASHINGTON's **Aliza Vaccher** and ARIZONA's **Allison Flores** and **Shelby Edwards**. Dabritz made her mark once more as she shared the floor title with teammate **Nansy Damianova**. Utah's **Lia Del Priore** and **Becky Tutka** tied for third as the Utes swept the top four spots in the event. UCLA's **Samantha Peszek** took home the title on beam with a score of 9.925. The all-around title went to Utah's **Tory Wilson** (39.450) with CALIFORNIA's **Alicia Asturias** and UCLA's **Peszek** tying for second place (39.425). Utah's co-head coaches **Greg** and **Megan Marsden** were named the Pac-12 Coaches of the Year. Utah's **Tory Wilson** was crowned Gymnast of the Year with teammate Georgia Dabritz named the Special Performer of the Year. STANFORD's freshman **Nicolette McNair** was named the Pac-12 Freshman/Newcomer of the Year.

For the second year in a row, all eight Conference teams were selected to compete in the NCAA Women's Gymnastics Regional Championships. The Pac-12 was represented by three teams and five individuals at the NCAA Championships with claiming the highest seed in the Pac-12 at No. 4. Stanford and UCLA followed with the No. 5 and No. 10 seed, respectively. California's Asturias and OREGON STATE's **Chelsea Tang** and **Madeline Gardiner** advanced to the championships in the all-around; Cal's **Dallas Crawford** competed on bars and the Beavers' **Kay-tianna McMillan** advanced on beam.

Ten Pac-12 gymnasts qualified for the individual event finals. On vault, UCLA's **Olivia Courtney** and Utah's **Georgia Dabritz** placed eighth and ninth, respectively. Stanford's **Samantha Shapiro** took the highest finish for the Pac-12, earning second place on bars with teammate **Kristina Vaculik** coming in third. Beaver freshman **Madeline Gardiner** tied for third on the balance beam.

The Pac-12 produced 20 All-Americans for the third year in a row, including 13 first-team All-Americans. UCLA led the Conference with seven, Utah and Stanford each had five. Oregon State and California had two and one, respectively.

PAC-12 WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS SCHOLAR ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

WASHINGTON continued its dominance of men's collegiate rowing, capturing its fourth-straight national title by winning three of five grand finals at the IRA National Championships. The championship was the 17th for the Huskies, who have won four titles in a row for the first time in program history. Since 1895, the first year the IRAs were held, only three programs have accomplished the difficult feat. Washington also claimed the Ten Eyck Trophy for an unprecedented eighth-straight season, extending its IRA record. CALIFORNIA, which earned gold medals in the second varsity eight and third varsity eight, also turned in top-three performances in the varsity eight and varsity four races, while the freshman eight rowed to a silver medal finish. The Bears' 188 points earned them second-place overall, just four shy of the first-place Huskies. STANFORD finished in 13th-place for the second-consecutive year and OREGON STATE came in 18th.

Washington successfully defended its Conference title at the Pac-12 Rowing Championships on Lake Natoma, hoisting the team trophy for the fifth year in a row. The Huskies won three of the four men's races, including the varsity eight. Cal turned in a time of 5:46.4 in the second varsity eight to upend top-seeded Washington while adding second-place performances in the varsity eight, varsity four and the freshman/novice eight races to finish second in the team standings. Oregon State tied its highest overall finish ever, placing third in the team standings after earning third-place finishes in three of the four races on the day. Stanford, which raced to a third-place finish in the varsity eight, placed fourth, followed by WASHINGTON STATE in fifth and COLORADO in sixth.

Stanford's **Austin Hack** was named the Pac-12 Men's Rowing Athlete of the Year for the second-consecutive year. He rowed in the Cardinal's varsity eight crew that placed third at the Pac-12 Championships and first in the C final at the IRA Championships. The senior, who is in his third year in the varsity eight shell, was also named the Pac-12 Men's Rowing Scholar-Athlete of the Year. It was the first time since both of the awards' inception that a rower earned both honors in the same year. **Justin Murphy** of California was tabbed the Newcomer of the Year after becoming the driving force for the freshmen eight in just his first year with the Bears, in addition to setting the standard on the erg for the team. He is projected to be an integral part of Cal's varsity eight for the next three years. Washington's **Michael Callahan** earned top coaching honors for the fifth year in a row. Callahan, in his seventh year at Washington, led the team to victories in three of the four men's races and the team title at the Conference regatta. Under Callahan, the Huskies have experienced an unprecedented level of success, winning four-consecutive national titles. They have also won the Ten Eyck Award during each of his seven seasons at the helm.

CALIFORNIA captured the varsity four title for the second time in the last four years at Eagle Creek Park in Indianapolis en route to earning a second-straight second-place finish at the NCAA Championships. The Golden Bears, who finished just eight points behind repeat national champion Ohio State in the team standings, has placed among the top three at the NCAA Championships in 10 of the last 11 years. Stanford, fresh off its first Conference championship in program history, finished fourth in the team standings, followed by WASHINGTON in seventh, USC in 10th and UCLA in 12th. WASHINGTON STATE, which placed 11th in the second varsity eight standings, came in 14th.

Stanford posted victories in three of four races, including the varsity eight race, at the Pac-12 Championships on Lake Natoma to claim its first-ever league title and earn the league's automatic NCAA berth. It ended a streak of six-straight Conference championships by the Cardinal's Bay Area rival California. Washington finished second, led by a second-consecutive gold medal finish by the novice eight and a second-place finish by the varsity eight. Cal finished third at the Conference regatta after third-place finishes in three of four races, while UCLA took fourth with two silver medal finishes on the day. USC, the defending champion in the varsity eight, finished fifth overall, while Washington State came in sixth followed by Oregon State in seventh.

Stanford's **Anna Dawson** was named the Pac-12 Women's Rowing Athlete of the Year. A captain and four-year contributor, she helped the Cardinal to their first win over rival California since 2009. Women's Newcomer of the Year **Lauren Still** finished her first full year of rowing at any level for Oregon State, helping the Beavers' varsity to its strongest year since 2009. Cardinal coach **Yasmin Farooq** earned her second Pac-12 Women's Coach of the Year honor after guiding Stanford to a first-ever Pac-12 Championship for the program. She was also honored as the West Region Coach of the Year by the Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association (CRCA).

Four Pac-12 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths, with three receiving a top-five seed. UCLA was the top-seeded team in the tournament, while Pac-12 Champion WASHINGTON was seeded second and CALIFORNIA fourth. STANFORD received an at-large bid. Both Washington and California made it to the quarterfinals as UCLA was defeated by Connecticut in the third round on penalty kicks and the Huskies shut out Pac-12 rival Stanford. UW was upset by New Mexico and Cal fell to Maryland in the quarterfinal round.

UCLA junior **Leo Stolz** was the Pac-12 Player of the Year, the third-consecutive Bruin to receive the award. He finished the season leading the Conference in points (30) and goals (11). Washington head coach **Jamie Clark** was voted the Pac-12 Coach of the Year. Clark led UW to its first national quarterfinal in school history and its first Pac-12 title since 2000. UW's **Cristian Roldan** was tabbed Freshman of the Year, finishing his freshman campaign first on the team in points (19) and tied for first in goals (7). He was also third in the Conference in shots with 58 and tied for first in game-winning goals with four.

Eight Pac-12 seniors were invited to participate in the adidas MLS Combine this year. California had the most selections with three invitations, while Washington and UCLA had two apiece and Stanford had one.

Three players earned NSCAA All-American first-team honors: California's Steve Birnbaum, UCLA's **Leo Stolz** and Washington's **Taylor Peay**. In addition to the all-America selections, 14 Pac-12 student-athletes received All-West Region accolades. A league-record 13 student-athletes from Pac-12 men's soccer teams were selected as Capital One Academic All-District first-team honorees. UCLA senior **Joe Sofia** was named a first-team member for the 2013 men's soccer Senior CLASS Award. Sofia has led the Bruins to four-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances over his career with UCLA as well as Pac-12 titles in 2011 and 2012.

**PAC-12 MEN'S SOCCER SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR**  
Joe Sofia, UCLA

Six Pac-12 teams earned NCAA Tournament bids in 2013, and three teams hosted first round matches. Conference champion UCLA, which made its first trip to the College Cup since 2009, knocked off Florida State in the College Cup final to win their first NCAA National Championship in program history and third overall for the Pac-12. STANFORD reached the third round before falling to the eventual-champion Bruins while COLORADO pulled off two upsets over Denver and BYU to reach the round of 16 before falling to Florida State. CALIFORNIA, UTAH and WASHINGTON STATE all failed to advance to the second round, with the Cougars falling on penalty kicks and the Bears and Utes getting beat on the road. Pac-12 teams posted a 77-31-19 (.681) record against non-conference competition this season, and two teams claimed spots in the final NSCAA rankings. UCLA finished the season at No. 1, while Stanford came in a No. 9, and Washington State, California and Colorado received votes.

Four players represented the Pac-12 on NSCAA All-America teams — **Abby Dahlkemper** (first team), **Katelyn Rowland** (second team), and **Darian Jenkins** (third team) of UCLA, and **Micaela Castain** (second team) of Washington State. Additionally, 23 of the 33 players named to the NSCAA All-Pacific Region team are from Pac-12 schools. Washington State head coach **Keidane McAlpine** claimed his first Pac-12 Coach of the Year award, while Cougars forward Castain was the Pac-12 Player of the Year, the first WSU player to earn the award in Conference history.

**PAC-12 WOMEN'S SOCCER SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR**

Top-seeded OREGON represented the Pac-12 in the 2014 Women's College World Series, advancing to the national semifinal round for the deepest postseason run in Ducks history. Five teams participated in the NCAA Tournament, all of which were seeded in the top 12 led by the No. 1 overall seed in Oregon. The Ducks claimed their second-consecutive Pac-12 Championship.

Thirteen Pac-12 players received NFCA All-America honors, the second highest tally of any conference on the list. The Pac-12 also saw a league-record 42 NFCA All-Region honors.

UCLA's **Ally Carda** was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Year, while Pitcher of the Year accolades went to Oregon's **Cheridan Hawkins**. The Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year was **Kellie Fox** of Arizona, and fellow Wildcat **Katiana Mauga** was named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year. **Mike White** of Oregon took home his second-consecutive Coach of the Year honor. **Courtney Ceo** was the Pac-12 Batting Champion after leading the league in batting average through the regular season.

Pac-12 men's swimming and diving had another banner year, with CALIFORNIA capturing the NCAA Championship, their third in four years. The Golden Bears were also Conference champions for the second-straight season, headlining a strong year for Pac-12 programs. Head coach **Dave Durden** received NCAA Division I Coach of the Year honors, as well.

ARIZONA, USC, STANFORD and ARIZONA STATE joined the Bears in the top 25 at the national championships. The Wildcats, Trojans and Cardinal claimed the seventh, eighth and ninth spots in the final results, respectively, with the Sun Devils coming in at 23rd. UTAH weighed in at 35th overall, while CAL POLY was 46th.

Individually, Pac-12 teams claimed 10 titles, including four of the five relay events. California claimed the 200 freestyle relay title, as well as the 200 and 400 medley relay championships, while USC picked up the 800 freestyle relay title. A Pac-12 student athlete finished in the top eight in all 21 events. Arizona junior **Kevin Cordes** repeated in the 100 and 200 breaststroke events, setting a new American record in the process. Cal freshman **Ryan Murphy** capped his first season with the Golden Bears with two individual championships in the 100 and 200 backstroke. USC junior **Cristian Quintero** led the Trojans, picking up a title in the 500 free and placing in the top five in the 200 free (second) and 100 free (third). UA's **Brad Tandy** made history in the 50 free, tying for first place in only the third tie in the event in NCAA history.

At the Conference championship, teams competed in record-breaking fashion, setting new meet records in eight total events: the 200 medley relay, 800 freestyle relay, 500 free, 200 IM, 50 free, 200 free, 100 breast and 200 breast. Utah made history with its first-ever individual titles, as Ute **Bence Kiraly** won the 1650 free and teammate **Nick Soedel** won the 100 free. Arizona State also grabbed its first-ever individual title in the 200 fly thanks to **Alex Coci**, making it the first overall individual championship for ASU since 2008.

Kevin Cordes received Pac-12 Men's Swimmer of the Year honors and Ryan Murphy received Pac-12 Men's Swimming Freshman/Newcomer of the Year while **Dave Durden** was voted Pac-12 Men's Swimming Coach of the Year. On the diving side, Stanford's **Kristian Ipsen** was voted Pac-12 Men's Diver of the Year, while teammate **Bradley Christiansen** was named Pac-12 Men's Diving Freshman/Newcomer of the Year and Cardinal head coach **Rick Schavone** was tabbed Pac-12 Men's Diving Coach of the Year.

STANFORD capped an impressive year, scoring 402.5 points to place second at the NCAA Championships. It was their highest point total since 2000 and best finish since 2010. In all, three Pac-12 schools finished in the top five and four total in the top 10, tying the SEC for the highest total of any conference. CALIFORNIA, which claimed one individual national title and one relay title, finished third (386), while USC placed fifth (252) and ARIZONA took eighth (156). Cardinal senior **Maya DiRado** propelled Stanford to its 17th top three finish all-time by sweeping the individual medley events, contributing to two other national title relays and adding two additional top-three finishes.

Bolstered by a series of strong finishes on the third and fourth day of competition, CALIFORNIA captured its second Pac-12 Championship in three years. After two days of competition and strong swimming by DiRado, Stanford found themselves in first place; however, the Bears used four individual titles and two relay titles to topple the Cardinal with 1,552.5 points. Second-place Stanford finished with 1,364 points, while USC collected 1,327 to take third. Helping the Bears to victory was freshman **Missy Franklin**, who set meet records in winning the 100, 200 and 500 freestyle events while contributing to three Cal relay titles in the 800 freestyle, 400 freestyle and 400 medley events.

Franklin, who collected Pac-12 Newcomer/Freshman of the Year accolades, was named Swimmer of the Meet at the Pac-12 Championships after her record-setting performance. After collecting three individual titles at the Pac-12 Championships in addition to her NCAA titles, DiRado was named Pac-12 Swimmer of the Year. In just his second year at the helm, Stanford head coach **Greg Meehan** garnered Pac-12 Women's Swimming Coach of the Year honors after leading the Cardinal to a stellar year.

USC's **Haley Ishimatsu** was named Pac-12 Women's Diver of the Year after capturing Pac-12 titles in the three-meter and platform and repeating as NCAA champion on the platform. She was the first women's diver to repeat on platform since 1992-93. She was also named Pac-12 Diver of the Meet for the second-consecutive year. ARIZONA freshman **Michal Bower** was named Pac-12 Women's Diving Freshman/Newcomer of the Year after second-place finishes in the one-meter and three-meter at the Pac-12 Championships. During month of February, Bower never finished lower than second in either of those two events. USC's **Hongping Li** was tabbed the Pac-12 Women's Diving Coach of the Year for the sixth-consecutive year and a record 11th time overall. Under his tutelage, Ishimatsu and her older sister Victoria, a former diver under Li, have been named Pac-12 Diver of the Year five times and own a combined 10 Pac-12 individual titles.

**PAC-12 WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR**  
Margo Geer, Arizona

USC took home the national championship for its 100th NCAA Championship all-time and fourth men's tennis crown in the last five years. The team went undefeated in Pac-12 play with an overall record of 32-3 to finish the season.

UCLA's **Marcos Giron** won a national championship of his own, taking home the singles title after entering the tournament as the second overall seed. It marked the Bruins' 11th NCAA singles champion in school history as the junior lost just one set in his six matches during the tournament.

UCLA knocked off the top-seeded Trojans in the Pac-12 Tournament to take home the title in Ojai, Calif., for its second-consecutive tournament championship. The Bruins went 6-1 in Pac-12 play with their lone loss coming against USC before coming back to upset their rival for the Tournament crown.

The Pac-12 had five men's teams in the tournament, including USC with the top seed, No. 6 UCLA, CALIFORNIA, STANFORD and OREGON. In addition, seven men's singles players and three doubles teams represented teams in the individual tournament, with UCLA's **Clay Thompson** and Giron earning the top two seeds in the singles draw and USC's **Ray Sarmiento** and **Yannick Hanfmann** with the top seed in doubles.

USC's Hanfmann was voted the Singles Player of the Year, while he and teammate Sarmiento teamed up to earn Doubles Team of the Year. UCLA's **Mackenzie McDonald** took home Freshman/Newcomer of the Year honors while Bruins head coach **Billy Martin** earned Coach of the Year for the second-consecutive year.

The Pac-12 Conference tennis season concluded with the crowning of UCLA women's tennis team at the NCAA Championships for the Conference's second-consecutive NCAA women's team tennis title. The win marked the Pac-12's 468th national title and UCLA's 111th, as well as the second tennis title in the last seven years as the team also won it in 2008.

UCLA and USC split individual championships at the Pac-12 Championships in Ojai, Calif. UCLA freshman **Jennifer Brady** was crowned the singles champion as the USC duo of **Kaitlyn Christian** and **Giuliana Olmos** claimed the doubles title.

CALIFORNIA was crowned the regular season Pac-12 Champion, finishing with a perfect, 10-0 Conference record and an overall record of 20-5. The Golden Bears advanced to the round of 16 in the NCAA team tournament with four singles players in the field, including national runner-up **Lynn Chi**.

The NCAA women's team tournament featured six of the 11 Pac-12 schools that sponsor tennis. STANFORD advanced to the semi-finals before falling to eventual runner-up North Carolina and after defeating Pac-12 rival CALIFORNIA in the round of 16 to go through to the quarterfinals. USC also reached the round of 16 before losing to top seed and host Georgia. ARIZONA and ARIZONA STATE both fell in close, 4-3 matches in the opening round.

UCLA swept Player of the Year honors as **Robin Anderson** was named Singles Player of the Year, Brady was voted Freshman/Newcomer of the Year and both players were elected the Doubles Team of the Year. California head coach **Amanda Augustus** was voted Coach of the Year.

The OREGON men capped the 2014 track & field season capturing its first NCAA title since 1984 and the Pac-12's first since 2000. The Ducks also took home the Pac-12 crown for the eighth-consecutive year.

In addition to the Ducks, three more Pac-12 teams placed in the top 15 at the NCAA Championships, including a tie for fourth place for USC, a seventh-place showing for ARIZONA and ARIZONA STATE tied for 13th. Six men from three league teams claimed individual NCAA titles, including four UO men who helped the team claim its first national title in 30 years. Individual champions were UA's **Lawi Lalang** (5000m) and ASU's **Bryan McBride** (high jump). For UO, **Mac Fleet** (1500m), **Edward Cheserek** (10,000m), **Devon Allen** (110m hurdles) and **Sam Crouser** (javelin).

Pac-12 honors went to Lalang, who was voted Pac-12 Men's Track Athlete of the Year and teammate **Nick Ross** was the Pac-12 Men's Field Athlete of the Year for the second time in his career. Named Pac-12 Newcomer of the Year, Allen set a Pac-12 record in the 110-meter hurdles at the NCAA Championships (13.16), also a meet record, becoming the first-ever Duck to claim the individual title in the event and the first Pac-12 hurdler since 2003. It was also the second-fastest time ever run in NCAA history. He went on to also win a U.S. title in the event a few weeks later. UO's **Robert Johnson** was voted the Pac-12 Men's Coach of the Year for the second-straight year.

Cheserek, a freshman, and Lalang were also named finalists for the prestigious Bowerman Award. The duo have been involved in some of the best races in collegiate history. At the Pac-12 Championships, a wire-to-wire battle in the 1,500-meter saw Lalang claim the league title by .16 seconds, the pair posting two of the top-10 times in NCAA history. At the NCAA Championships, the pair were pitted against each other, again at the longer distance of 5,000 meters. Both posted meet-record times, but Lalang came out victorious again by just under half a second.

**PAC-12 MEN'S TRACK & FIELD SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR**

Lawi Lalang, Arizona

The Oregon women claimed the Pac-12 Championship crown for the sixth year in a row then went on to place third at the NCAA Championships, the team's sixth-straight top-three finish at the national meet. STANFORD also had a strong showing at NCAA's, placing 11th, while USC was just out of the top 15, finishing tied for 16th.

Three women claimed individual NCAA titles: UO's **Laura Roesler** (800m) and **Jenna Prandini** (long jump) took home NCAA crowns, as did ARIZONA STATE's **Shelby Houlihan** (1500m). Prandini scored 24 points at the NCAA Championships, the most by a female athlete since 2001. Roesler was the heavy favorite in the 800 meters after posting the top time in the country and she claimed the title by over one second ahead of the second-place finisher. She is the third Duck to win the event since 2006 and first since 2011.

Prandini became the first male or female athlete to sweep the Conference's track and field honors, winning Pac-12 Women's Track Athlete of the Year and Pac-12 Women's Field Athlete of the Year honors as voted on by the league's head coaches. Stanford's **Valarie Allman** was tabbed the Pac-12 Women's Newcomer of the Year. The Ducks' **Robert Johnson** was voted Pac-12 Women's Coach of the Year for the second-straight year.

Roesler was named one of three finalist for the USTFCCA's prestigious The Bowerman Award, collegiate track & field's highest individual honor. She earned a spot after a dominating season in the 800 meters, sweeping both the indoor and outdoor titles. She was also a member of UO's 4x400 relay squad that set a collegiate record to claim a NCAA indoor national crown.

**PAC-12 WOMEN'S TRACK & FIELD SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR**

Laura Roesler, Oregon

Third-seeded WASHINGTON advanced to the NCAA Tournament semifinals for the first time since 2006 marking the fourth-consecutive year a Pac-12 team advanced that far. UW's national semifinal appearance headlined a successful postseason run that saw a league-record nine Pac-12 volleyball teams earn NCAA Tournament bids, the most of any conference in the nation.

The Huskies won was the Pac-12 Champion, the third all-time and first since 2005. Finishing a game ahead of STANFORD to claim the regular-season crown, Washington's 18 Conference wins were a team record.

A league-record nine Pac-12 teams earned NCAA Tournament bids, the most of any conference in the nation in 2013. USC, the Cardinal and UW all earned top-16 seeds. Conference teams were dominant in the postseason, going 8-1 in the first round. Collectively, Pac-12 teams posted a 15-9 tournament record and is 399-212 all-time in postseason play. USC and Stanford also advanced to the regional finals. At least one Pac-12 team has advanced that far every year of the NCAA Tournament. Also joining UW, USC and Stanford in the postseason were ARIZONA STATE, CALIFORNIA, COLORADO, OREGON and UTAH.

Eight of the 12 Pac-12 teams have earned a top-25 ranking at least once during the 2013 campaign, with 10 receiving votes or better. The Pac-12 boasts a record 14 NCAA titles in women's volleyball. UW's appearance in the national semifinals marked the 30th time in the history of the NCAA Tournament at least one league squad had advanced that far. The last team to win a NCAA title was UCLA in 2011.

League coaches voted UW's **Krista Vansant** the Pac-12 Player of the Year and Pac-12 Freshman of the Year of honors went to USC's **Ebony Nwanebu**. Stanford's **Madi Bugg** was tabbed the Pac-12 Setter of the Year, while USC's **Natalie Hagglund** was voted the Pac-12 Libero of the Year for the third-straight year. UW's **Jim McLaughlin** was voted the Pac-12 Coach of the Year. Vansant was named the AVCA National Player of the Year, the fourth-consecutive year the honor has been given to a Pac-12 player. Additionally, 11 league players were named AVCA All-Americans, the 12th-straight year the Pac-12 has had eight or more honored and the most since 13 were selected in 2009.

Stanford's **Carly Wopat** and Vansant were selected finalists for the Honda Award, with Vansant eventually winning the prestigious honor.

OREGON STATE claimed its third-consecutive Pac-12 title and its fourth in the past five years, finishing 28th at NCAA Championships. BOISE STATE led the Pac-12 charge at the national championships, finishing tied for 25th. All six participating institutions recorded at least one point in the Championship.

Boise State's **Jake Swartz** was named Pac-12 Wrestler of the Year, finishing in seventh place at the national championships for his first All-America honors in his career as a Bronco. The redshirt senior went 17-3 in his final season, with a career record of 91-30. It was Boise State's second-consecutive Pac-12 Wrestler of the Year award and fourth all-time.

Oregon State head coach **Jim Zalesky** was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the third-straight year. STANFORD freshman **Jim Wilson** was voted Pac-12 Wrestling Freshman/Newcomer of the Year, going 35-8 and helping Stanford to a program-best 17 wins on the year, besting the previous record of 15 wins set in 1975.

## (Capsule Reviews of 2013-14 Pac-12 Highlights in the MPSF)

## MEN'S GYMNASTICS

STANFORD finished third with a 436.300 at the NCAA Championships, marking its eighth top-three finish in the past nine seasons. Stanford freshman **Akash Modi** finished second in the all-around (89.200), second on parallel bars (15.550) and third on pommel horse (15.200). Modi--an All-American in three of those events--earned 2014 MPSF Gymnast of the Year honors after an impressive first year of collegiate gymnastics. The Cardinal recorded top-10 finishes in all but one event of the championships, including a third-place finish by junior **Michael Levy** on the floor (15.450), a fourth-place finish by sophomore **Dennis Zaremski** on the rings (15.050) and a tie for fifth-place by junior **Sean Senters** on the vault (15.150). While California didn't compete as a team, the Bears saw two gymnasts in redshirt senior **Donothan Bailey** and sophomore **Kyle Zemeir** finish in the top-10 in the all-around competition, earning sixth and seventh overall, respectively, after recording scores of 86.250 and 86.100. The Cardinal was the runner-up at the MPSF Championship (436.700) behind Oklahoma with California placing third (427.150). Modi was crowned the parallel bars champion with a 15.800 and earned the all-around title totaling an 89.650. The Bear's Bailey nabbed the title in the pommel horse with a 14.900 while Stanford redshirt senior **Paul Hichwa** came away with the high bar championship (15.450). Stanford head coach **Thom Glielmi** was named MPSF Co-Coach of the Year for the second time. The first came during the NCAA and Conference championship season of 2009.

## MEN'S INDOOR TRACK AND FIELD

OREGON won its first NCAA indoor title since 2009 thanks in large part to freshman **Edward Cheserek**, who earned NCAA titles in both the 5,000 meter race (12:46.67) and the 3,000-meter race (8:11:59). The Ducks finished with 62 points--eight more than runner-up Arkansas. Joining Oregon in the top-5 was ARIZONA, who finished with 24 points at the championships. At the MPSF Championships, it was California who took the crown with 96 total points, followed by ARIZONA STATE (93), OREGON (88.5) and UCLA (75.5). The Bears' championship performance was highlighted by first-place finishes from **Hammed Suleman** in the long jump (24'-6.50') and **Jordan Locklear's** mile run (4:04.03). Two MPSF Championship records were set at the 2014 event as the Wildcats' **Lawi Lalang** posted a 13:41.58 in the 5,000-meter race and Oregon's **John Cabral** tied the record of 7.46 in the 60-meter hurdles.

## WOMEN'S INDOOR TRACK AND FIELD

Powered by record-setting runs by **Phyllis Francis**, OREGON won its fifth-straight NCAA Indoor Track & Field title after Francis and her teammates swept the distance relays. Two Pac-12 teams placed in the top-10 at the NCAA Championships, with STANFORD finishing in a tie for seventh. Francis also earned an individual national championship in the 400-meter, while teammate **Laura Roesler** placed third in the 800-meter race. At the conference championships, newcomer USC won the MPSF title in just its first year as a member of the league. The Trojans scored 106 points to finish ahead of Arizona State (81), Arizona (75) and eventual NCAA Indoor champion Oregon (66.5).

## WOMEN'S LACROSSE

STANFORD was ousted in the first round of the NCAA tournament, falling to Duke, 13-8, after finishing second in the MPSF Championship. Junior midfielder **Hannah Farr** of Denver was named MPSF Player of the Year, while COLORADO freshman goalkeeper **Paige Soenksen** was voted MPSF Rookie of the Year. Pac-12 teams had eight players on the All-MPSF Tournament team: USC's **Courtney Tarleton**; OREGON's **Sami Kiser** and **Nikki Puszc**; Colorado's Soenksen and **Johnna Fusco**; and Stanford's Farr, **Rachel Ozer** and **Adrienne Anderson**.

## MEN'S VOLLEYBALL

STANFORD advanced to the national championship match but fell in four sets to Loyola Chicago to finish the season as national runner-up. Cardinal head coach **John Kosty** was named MPSF Coach of the Year while USC outside hitter **Lucas Yoder** was named MPSF Freshman of the Year. Earning first team All-MPSF honors were UCLA's **Gonzalo Quiroga**, USC's **Micah Christenson**, and Stanford's **Brian Cook**, **James Shaw** and **Steven Irvin**. Quiroga, Christenson and Cook were also first-team AVCA Division I-II All-America honorees.

## MEN'S WATER POLO

USC became the first-ever collegiate water polo team to win a sixth-consecutive national championship, defeating Pacific, 12-11, in double overtime in a battle of the top-two national seeds. STANFORD placed third in the NCAA Tournament, hosting the event. Trojan senior driver **Nikola Vavic** was the ACWPC National Co-Player of the Year as well as the MPSF Player of the Year, scoring 81 goals on the year for a career total of 254, which makes him USC's all-time leading scorer. Fellow Trojan **Kostas Genidounias** was honored as first-team All-American while Stanford's **Alex Bowen** and **Bret Bonanni** were also first-team recipients. USC, UCLA, CALIFORNIA and Stanford combined for 20 All-America honors, with four first-team, six second-team, six third-team and four honorable mention. UCLA redshirt freshman **Garrett Danner** was the MPSF Newcomer of the Year, receiving honorable mention All-America accolades.

## WOMEN'S WATER POLO

STANFORD captured its fourth NCAA title and third in four years with a 9-5 victory over UCLA. The title was also the 105th for the Cardinal, which extended the school's national-best streak to 38 years with at least one NCAA championship. The Pac-12 had the top five finishers in the NCAA tournament as Stanford was followed by UCLA, USC, CALIFORNIA and ARIZONA STATE in the top five. UCLA junior goalkeeper **Sami Hill** was named the MPSF Player of the Year after recording a career-best 5.05 goals against average in 2014 to become the seventh player of the year for the Bruins. California freshman attacker **Dora Antal** earned MPSF Newcomer of the Year honors as she scored 71 goals throughout the regular season, including the conference tournament, while becoming the first Cal player to lead the league in goals-per-game since 1997. In all, 24 student-athletes from Pac-12 schools were named to the All-MPSF teams while an additional eight freshmen from the Conference earned spots on the All-MPSF Newcomer team.
