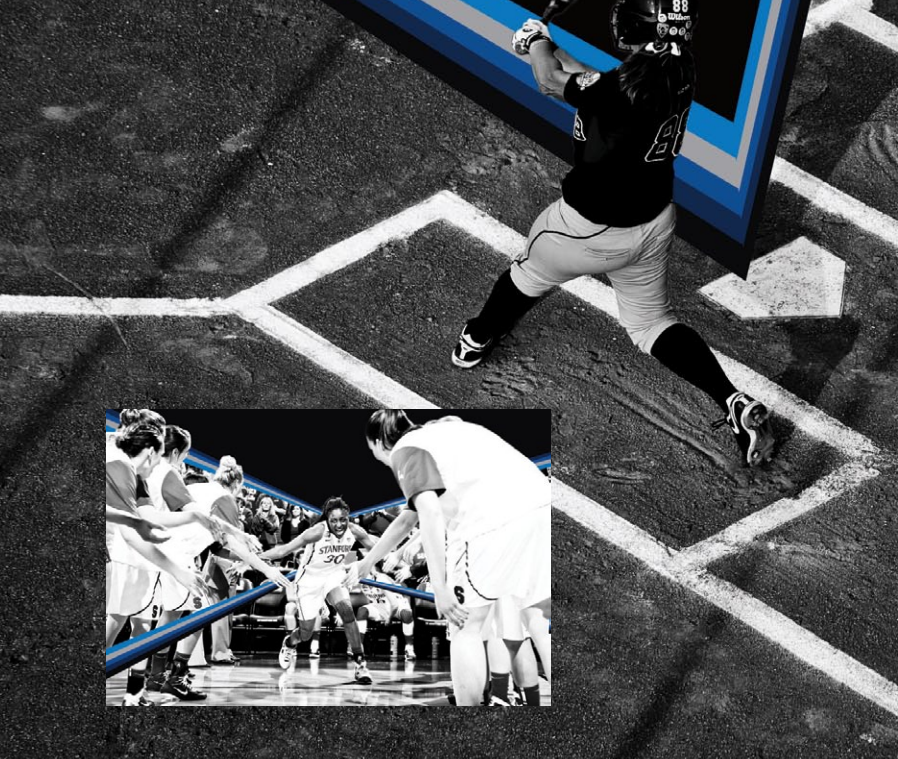

# CONFERENCE OF CHAMPIONS®

Built on a firm foundation of academic excellence and superior athletic performance, the Conference ushered in a new era on July 1, 2011, officially becoming the Pac-12 Conference with the additions of the University of Colorado and University of Utah.

Just 27 days after the Conference officially changed its name, Commissioner Larry Scott announced the creation of the Pac-12 Networks on July 27, 2011, solidifying a landmark television deal and putting the Conference on the forefront. The Networks, including one national network and six regional networks, in conjunction with four of the nation's largest cable operators, marked the first time a U.S. collegiate conference or any other programmer has launched a collection of networks across a variety of platforms, rather than a sole network. In addition, the "TV everywhere" rights will allow fans to access coverage outside the home on any digital device, including smartphones and tablet computers.

On the field, the Pac-12 rises above the rest, upholding its tradition as the "Conference of Champions" ®, claiming an incredible 119 NCAA team titles since 1999-2000, including nine in 2012-13. That is an average of over nine championships per academic year. Even more impressive has been the breadth of the Pac-12's success, with championships coming in 28 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-12 has led or tied the nation in NCAA Championships in 46 of the last 52 years. The only exceptions being in 1980-81, 1988-89, 1990-91 and 1995-96 when the Conference finished second, and only twice finished third (1998-99 and 2004-05).

For the seventh-consecutive year, the Pac-12 had the most NCAA titles or tied for the most of any conference in the country, winning at least six every year since 2000-01. No other conference has won double-digit NCAA crowns in a single year, the Pac-12 doing so six times, including a record 14 in 1996-97.

Spanning nearly a century of outstanding athletics achievements, the Pac-12 was the first conference to reach 400 championships in 2010-11. With the inclusion of Colorado and Utah, the Conference surpassed another major milestone, with league teams capturing 450 titles, outdistancing the next conference by nearly 200. In all, Conference teams have won 451 NCAA Championships (306 men's, 145 women's).

The Conference's reputation is further proven in the annual Learfield Sports Directors' Cup competition, the prestigious award that honors the best overall collegiate athletics programs in the country. STANFORD continued its remarkable run and won its unprecedented 18th-consecutive Directors' Cup in 2011-12. For the second-straight year, six of the top 25 Division I programs were Pac-12 member institutions: No. 1 STANFORD, No. 3 UCLA, No. 7 USC, No. 11 CALIFORNIA, No. 19 ARIZONA and No. 24 OREGON. With three teams in the top 10, it was the most of any conference.

The new era of the Pac-12 Conference and 2011-12 campaign kicked off with the Conference's first-ever Pac-12 Football Championship game, pitting OREGON for the North Division and UCLA from the South Division. The Ducks won the inaugural championship game, 49-31, in front of a sold-out stadium (59,376) in Eugene, Ore.

The Conference's nine national titles came in the form of five women's and four men's crowns. Six different league schools claimed NCAA titles and, of the five NCAA institutions to have won multiples titles, three were from the Pac-12.

CALIFORNIA, STANFORD and USC each won two NCAA Championships. The Golden Bears swept the men's and women's swimming and diving crowns for the second-consecutive year; the Cardinal raised the national championship trophy for the first time ever in women's soccer and added a second-consecutive crown in women's water polo; while the Trojans won their fourth-straight men's tennis and men's water polo crowns.

Arguably the best women's volleyball conference in the country, UCLA brought home the national title, the Pac-12's first in the sport in six years. OREGON also continued its remarkable streak in women's indoor track, winning a third-straight crown. And ARIZONA won its first baseball crown in over a quarter century as it claimed the Conference's ninth of the year.

In addition to the nine national championships, the Pac-12 also had runners-up in eight NCAA Championship events: women's volleyball (USC), cross country (WASHINGTON), men's water polo (UCLA), skiing (UTAH), women's tennis (UCLA), women's track & field (OREGON), men's volleyball (USC) and women's water polo (USC). Overall, the Conference had 39 teams finish in the top four at 25 NCAA Championship events.

Participation in the postseason was a common occurrence for the Pac-12

in 2011-12. Of the 22 sports sponsored by the Conference, 14 witnessed at least half its teams participating in NCAA or other postseason action. The men sent 53 of a possible 101 teams into the postseason (52.4 percent), while the women sent 67 of a possible 113 teams (59.3 percent).

The Conference experienced continued success in football as the league sent two teams to BCS Bowl games for the second-straight year. Overall, seven teams went to bowls games. OREGON claimed its 10th Pac-12 crown in the sport, winning the Conference's first-ever Football Championship Game, and claimed a spot in the Rose Bowl. Meanwhile, STANFORD (Totitos Fiesta Bowl), ARIZONA STATE (MAACO Las Vegas Bowl), CALIFORNIA (Holiday Bowl), WASHINGTON (Valero Alamo Bowl), UTAH (Hyundai Sun Bowl) and UCLA (Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl) also earned bowl bids. Oregon and Stanford were ranked in the top-5 of the Associated Press' poll at season's end, finishing fourth and fifth, respectively.

Conference newcomer COLORADO won the Pac-12 Tournament men's basketball title and represented the league in the NCAA Tournament. Regular-season champion WASHINGTON and STANFORD headed to the NIT where the Cardinal put together an impressive run that resulted in the Pac-12's sixth-ever NIT title. The Huskies advanced to New York City, but fell in the semifinals. The Conference's 10-3 record in NIT play were the most wins ever by Pac-12 teams in the nation's oldest tournament. WASHINGTON STATE narrowly missed out on becoming the third Pac-12 team in four years to capture a postseason title in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI), advancing to the championship series before falling, two games to one.

On the women's side, two teams competed in the NCAA Tournament and five others competed in the WNIT. STANFORD made its fifth-consecutive NCAA Women's Final Four appearance after winning its sixth-straight Pac-12 Tournament crown. CALIFORNIA made a return to the postseason after a two-year absence. With COLORADO and WASHINGTON advancing the furthest in the WNIT, Pac-12 teams went 12-4 in the postseason in games against non-Conference opponents.

The Conference has dominated the volleyball field, winning a record 14 NCAA titles in the sport since 1982. UCLA captured its first NCAA title since 1991, while USC advanced to the national semifinals for the second-straight year. Seven Pac-12 teams earned postseason bids, the 12th-consecutive year the Conference has sent at least six teams to the NCAA Tournament.

ARIZONA won the Conference's 27th all-time NCAA baseball championship in 2012, becoming only the second team in NCAA history to go 10-0 in postseason play. Five Pac-12 teams received NCAA Tournament bids, with UCLA joining the Wildcats at the NCAA College World Series. In addition, OREGON and STANFORD reached the Super Regionals, and OREGON STATE also represented the Conference in the postseason event.

Without question, the Conference has dominated the softball field, winning 23 national championships in the sport since 1982, most recently capturing six in a row from 2006-11. Eight Pac-12 teams earned NCAA Tournament bids in 2012, including the No. 1-overall seed CALIFORNIA. The eight postseason teams were the most for the Conference since 2007. Cal, ARIZONA STATE and OREGON punched their tickets to the NCAA Women's College World Series, the ninth time the Conference had sent three teams to the WCWS.

The Pac-12 swept two men's and women's sports, capturing national championships in swimming & diving, and water polo. CALIFORNIA took home both swimming & diving crowns for the second-straight year. In water polo, USC was the top men's team for the fourth year in a row, while the STANFORD women repeated as national champions.

Pac-12 members have won 306 NCAA team championships on the men's side, 89 more than the next closest conference. Men's NCAA crowns have come at a phenomenal rate for the Pac-12 - 16 basketball titles by six schools (more than any other conference), 53 tennis titles, 45 outdoor track & field crowns, and 27 baseball titles. Pac-12 members have won 25 of 43 NCAA titles in volleyball, 38 of 42 in water polo, 27 in skiing, and 23 in swimming & diving national championships.

Individually, the Conference has produced an impressive number of NCAA men's individual champions, as well, boasting 2,073 individual crowns.

On the women's side, the story is much the same. Since the NCAA began conducting women's championships 31 years ago, Pac-12 members have claimed at least four national titles in a single season on 22 occasions, including the last 12-consecutive years. Overall, the Pac-12 has captured 145 NCAA



women's titles, easily outdistancing the SEC, which is second, with 88. Pac-12 members have dominated a number of sports, winning 23 softball titles, 19 tennis crowns, 14 volleyball titles, 14 of the last 23 trophies in golf, and 13 in swimming & diving.

Pac-12 women student-athletes shine nationally on an individual basis, as well, having captured an unmatched 642 NCAA individual crowns, an average of nearly 21 championships per season.

## PAC-12 CONFERENCE HISTORY

The roots of the Pac-12 Conference date back 97 years to December 2, 1915, when the Pacific Coast Conference (PCC) was founded at a meeting at the Oregon Hotel in Portland, Ore. The original membership consisted of four schools - the University of California at Berkeley, the University of Washington, the University of Oregon, and Oregon State College (now Oregon State University). All still are charter members of the Conference.

Pacific Coast Conference play began in 1916 and, one year later, Washington State College (now Washington State University) was accepted into the league, with Stanford University following in 1918.

In 1922, the PCC expanded to eight teams with the admission of the University of Southern California (USC) and the University of Idaho. In 1924, the University of Montana joined the league roster, and in 1928, the PCC grew to 10 members with the addition of UCLA.

The Pacific Coast Conference competed as a 10-member league until 1950, with the exception of 1943-45 when World War II curtailed intercollegiate athletic competition to a minimum. During that time, the league's first commissioner was named. Edwin N. Atherton was Commissioner in 1940 and was succeeded by Victor O. Schmidt in 1944. In 1950, Montana resigned from the Conference and joined the Mountain States Conference. The PCC continued as a nine-team Conference through 1958.

In 1959, the PCC was dissolved and the Athletic Association of Western Universities was formed and Thomas J. Hamilton was appointed Commissioner of the new league. The original AAWU membership included California, Stanford, Southern California, UCLA and Washington. Washington State joined the membership in 1962, while Oregon and Oregon State joined in 1964. Under Hamilton's watch, the name Pacific-8 Conference was adopted in 1968. In 1971, Wiles Hallock took over as Commissioner of the Pac-8.

Ten years later, on July 1, 1978, the University of Arizona and Arizona State University were admitted to the league and the Pacific-10 Conference became a reality. In 1986-87, the league took on a new look, expanding to include 10 women's sports. Since then, the Conference has been considered the premiere league in women's athletics, securing the most NCAA titles in women's sports of any conference nearly every year.

Thomas C. Hansen was named the Commissioner of the Pac-10 in 1983, a role he would hold for 26 years until 2009. Hansen was succeeded by current Commissioner Larry Scott, who took on the new role in July 2009.

During the 2010-11 academic year, Scott helped deliver monumental changes that transformed the Conference into a modern 12-team league. The Conference expanded to add two more teams, agreed to equal revenue sharing for the first time in Conference history, created two divisions - the North and the South, for football only, established a Football Championship Game for the first time ever, secured a landmark media rights deal that dramatically increased national exposure and revenue for each school and established the Pac-12 Network and Pac-12 Digital Network that guaranteed enhanced exposure across all sports.

The University of Colorado accepted its invitation to join the Pac-12 on June 11, 2010, and on June 17, 2010, the University of Utah agreed to join the Conference. The Buffaloes and Utes officially became the 11th and 12th members of the Conference July 1, 2011, the first additions to the league since 1978. During the 33 years between expansions, Conference teams claimed 258 NCAA titles, including 130 women's and 128 men's.

Currently, the Pac-12 sponsors 11 men's sports and 11 women's sports. Additionally, the Conference is a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) in four other men's sports and three women's sports.

The Pac-12 Conference offices are located 25 miles east of San Francisco in Walnut Creek, Calif.

## PAC-12 TOPS FINAL LEARFIELD DIRECTORS' CUP

**WALNUT CREEK, Calif.** - Six Pac-12 Conference institutions finished the 2011-12 academic year ranked in the final Learfield Sports Directors' Cup top 25, the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) announced. Three institutions, STANFORD, UCLA, and USC were in the top 10, the most of any conference.

The Cardinal won its 18th-consecutive cup after claiming national championships in women's soccer and women's water polo, and top-four finishes in men's and women's swimming, women's basketball and women's gymnastics, accumulating an impressive 1,448.25 points.

UCLA and USC were among eight teams to tally better than 1,000 points, finishing third (1,142.75 points) and seventh (1,006.75 points), respectively. Together, the Bruins and Trojans each posted top-four finishes in women's volleyball, women's water polo, and men's and women's tennis. CALIFORNIA placed 11th overall with 979.00 points after sweeping the men's and women's swimming and diving titles. ARIZONA's national title in baseball pushed the Wildcats into the top 20, where they placed 19th (827.75), OREGON rounded out the top 25, finishing 24th (747.25).

ARIZONA STATE placed 30th with 625.25 points, with WASHINGTON right behind in 31st with 622.50 points. COLORADO was 57th overall (391.50), followed by OREGON STATE (66th, 300.91), UTAH (74th, 260.0), and WASHINGTON STATE (T106th, 171.00).

The success of the Pac-12 in the Director's Cup was bolstered by the capturing of nine NCAA titles, most among all conferences. In addition, 10 of the Pac-12's league members finished among the top four in 24 NCAA championships, while the ACC was next with its league members placing among the top four in 16 NCAA championships.

The Directors' Cup was developed as a joint effort between the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and USA Today. Points are awarded based on each institution's finish in up to 20 sports - 10 women's and 10 men's.

ARIZONA rolled through its competition in June, going 10-0 in the postseason to capture the program's fourth College World Series championship, and its first since 1986. In Omaha, the unseeded Wildcats downed national two-seed UCLA, three-seed Florida State and defending back-to-back champions, eight-seed South Carolina, on their perfect run to Tittletown. UCLA's appearance in the CWS was the program's second in three years as the Bruins finished in a tie for fifth place.

ARIZONA, OREGON, OREGON STATE, STANFORD and UCLA all earned NCAA postseason bids, with all but Oregon State hosting a regional. Arizona, Oregon, Stanford and UCLA advanced to Super Regional play, putting four Pac-12 teams in a Super Regional for the second consecutive year. The Pac-12 now has 27 NCAA baseball championships, by far the most of any conference. With Arizona and UCLA advancing to the CWS, the Pac-12 now has sent a team to Omaha each year since 1997.

Arizona shortstop **Alex Mejia** received Pac-12 Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year honors, while Oregon right-handed pitcher **Alex Keudell** was named Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year. Oregon State outfielder **Michael Conforto** was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, and Arizona's **Andy Lopez** was voted Pac-12 Coach of the Year after leading the Wildcats to a share of the Pac-12 Championship and, later on, the national title.

# MEN'S BASKETBALL

In its debut season in the Pac-12, COLORADO became the first league team to win four tournament games to capture the Conference's postseason crown. Senior G **Carlton Brown**, the Pac-12 Tournament Most Outstanding Player, led the way by averaging 15.8 points and 4.8 rebounds. The Buffaloes earned the league's automatic NCAA Tournament bid and knocked off No. 23 UNLV in second round action. It was the first NCAA Tournament win for the Buffaloes since 1997. . . The STANFORD Cardinal put together an impressive postseason run that resulted in the Pac-12's sixth ever NIT title. Sophomore G **Aaron Bright**, the NIT's Most Outstanding Player, led the Cardinal to a dominating 75-51 victory over Minnesota in the NIT championship game at Madison Square Garden. In five NIT games, Bright shot 25-of-39 (.641) from the field, including 12-of-18 (.667) from three-point range, and 22-of-25 (.880) from the free throw line to average 16.8 points/4.2 assists. It was the second NIT title for the Cardinal, as they won the 1991 NIT crown as well. . . With WASHINGTON's run to the NIT semifinal, the Pac-12 tallied a 10-3 record in NIT play, the most wins ever by the Conference in the nation's oldest postseason tournament. . . WASHINGTON STATE narrowly missed out on becoming the third Pac-12 team in four years to capture a postseason title in the College Basketball Invitational (Oregon State in 2009; Oregon in 2011). Despite playing the three-game championship series without junior F **Brock Motum**, the Pac-12's Most Improved Player and the league's leading scorer (18.0 ppg), the Cougars fell just short to Pittsburgh, two games to one. . . In all, the Pac-12 posted an impressive 17-8 (.680) record in postseason play, which equals the most wins ever in postseason play for the Pac-12. The league also produced 17 wins (17-8, .680) during the 1996-97 season in which Arizona won the national title. No other conference won more games during the 2011-12 postseason. . . CALIFORNIA's **Jorge Gutierrez** was named the Pac-12 Player of the Year as he led Cal to its third 20-win season in four years and becomes the sixth Golden Bear to earn Pac-12 Player of the Year honors. He averaged 12.9 ppg/12th in Pac-12, posted 5.3 rebounds per game, and a team-best 1.2 steals per game/12th in Pac-12. Washington's **Tony Wroten** was tabbed Pac-12 Freshman of the Year after posting a team-best 16.3 ppg and 2.0 spg. Washington coach **Lorenzo Romar** was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year after guiding the Huskies to their second Pac-12 regular season crown under his watch, and fourth consecutive 20-win season.

# WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

STANFORD put together a second-straight undefeated Pac-12 campaign and made a fifth-straight trip to the NCAA Women's Final Four. The Cardinal also claimed the Pac-12 Tournament title, its sixth-straight postseason crown. CALIFORNIA made a return trip to the "Big Dance" after a three-year absence, advancing to the second round. Five more teams participated in postseason action, with ARIZONA STATE, COLORADO, OREGON STATE, UTAH and WASHINGTON each earning bids to the WNIT. The Buffs and Huskies both advanced the furthest, reaching the quarterfinals. Pac-12 teams posted a 12-4 postseason record in games versus non-conference opponents.

Stanford SR F **Nnemkadi Ogwumike** capped a successful collegiate career and was a unanimous All-American, receiving nods from the Associated Press, USBWA and WBCA. In addition, Ogwumike was selected the No. 1 overall pick by the Los Angeles Sparks in the WNBA Draft, becoming only the second player in the history of the Conference to be picked No. 1 and the first since 1997.

Ogwumike was voted the Pac-12 Player of the Year for the second time in her career. Her younger sister, SO F **Chiney Ogwumike**, was also an All-American and was named the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year. Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honors went to UW's **Jazmine Davis**, the first Husky to earn the postseason honor in 24 years. UTAH's **Michelle Plouffe** and ARIZONA's **Davellyn Whyte** garnered Honorable Mention *Associated Press* All-America nods, as well. After being enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame last summer, **Tara VanDerveer** was named the John R. Wooden Coach of the Year for the 12th time in 26 years at the helm. She was only the eighth female coach to be inducted.

Also of note in 2011-12, ASU broke the Pac-12's defensive scoring record, limiting opponents to just 53.2 points per game. Nine teams in all appeared in the top 25 of the NCAA's final statistical rankings. OREGON's **Amanda Johnson** was named the Toyo Tires Women's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year. She, along with Nnemkadi, and USC's **Jacki Gemelos** and **Briana Gilbreath**, were drafted by WNBA teams.

# MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Conference-newcomer COLORADO claimed the first league title of the academic season, placing five runners in the top 15 and all scoring runners in the top 25. ARIZONA's **Lawi Lalang** captured the individual crown by eight seconds ahead of the second-place finisher and went on to win the NCAA individual title, as well. Lalang had an outstanding rookie campaign, going the entire season undefeated. He went on to be named the Pac-12 Athlete of the Year and Newcomer of the Year. CU head coach **Mark Wettmore** was the Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

Three teams qualified for the NCAA Championships and two placed in the top-five. The Buffaloes were third overall in the team standings, while STANFORD was fifth. Stanford's **Chris Derrick** capped a successful cross country career finishing second behind Lalang at the national meet. An All-American, he was also selected the Toyo Tires Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Lalang also took home national top honors and was voted the USTFCCA National Men's Athlete of the Year.

OREGON's **Jordan Hasay** made a push towards the finish line, but was edged out, coming in second place at the NCAA Championships, just .6 seconds behind the winner. Hasay was voted the Pac-12 Athlete of the Year for the second-straight year. She was also the USTFCCA West Region Athlete of the Year for the second-straight year. ARIZONA STATE's **Shelby Houlihan**, who was the only freshman to place in the top 10 at the Pac-12 meet, was voted the Pac-12 Newcomer of the Year. UW's **Greg Metcalf** was voted by his peers as the Pac-12 Coach of the Year, the third time he has won the honor in four years. ### TOYO TIRES PAC-12 WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

Christine Babcock, Washington

OREGON won the inaugural Pac-12 Football Championship Game with a 49-31 win over UCLA, securing its third consecutive Conference title and 10th overall. The Ducks were the North Division representative, and with the best overall conference record (8-1), served as host of the inaugural game, while the Bruins were the South Division representative. A sold out Autzen Stadium of 59,376 fans watched the Ducks capture the Pac-12 Championship behind the efforts of Championship MVP **LaMichael James**, who rushed for 219 yards on 25 carries (8.8 ypc) and scored three touchdowns. Oregon quarterback **Darron Thomas** completed 20 of 36 passes for 219 yards and three touchdowns, while rushing for 60 yards.

The Pac-12 sent a record-tying seven teams to the postseason for the second time in three years and third time overall. The Conference placed two teams in BCS bowls for the second straight season and fourth overall, with Oregon playing in the Rose Bowl and STANFORD earning an invitation to the Fiesta Bowl. In its second Rose Bowl in three years, the Ducks defeated Wisconsin 45-38 to finish the year with a 12-2 record. The Cardinal fell to Oklahoma State 41-38 in overtime.

STANFORD quarterback **Andrew Luck** became the 16th Pac-12 player selected No. 1 overall in the NFL Draft when the Indianapolis Colts made him their top pick. Of the 31 quarterbacks selected as the No. 1 overall pick, 11 have come from the Pac-12. Luck became Stanford's fourth quarterback taken first after Bobby Garrett (1954), Jim Plunkett (1971) and John Elway (1983).

Luck was named Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year, becoming the fifth player to earn the award twice. California linebacker **Mychal Kendricks** was named Pat Tillman Defensive Player of the Year. Wide receiver **Marqise Lee** of USC and Oregon running back **De'Anthony Thomas** were voted Freshman Offensive Co-Players of the Year while USC linebacker **Dion Bailey** earned Freshman Defensive Player of the Year. Stanford's **David Shaw** was named Coach of the Year in his first season leading the Cardinal.

# MEN'S GOLF

For the second straight year, the Pac-12 Men's Golf Championship was decided on extra holes as the sixth-ranked CALIFORNIA Golden Bears rallied to defeat the 11th-ranked OREGON Ducks at Trysting Tree Golf Club in Corvallis, Ore., for their first-ever Conference title. California, which trailed Oregon by six strokes entering the final round of competition, needed a 25-foot birdie putt from sophomore **Brandon Hagy** on the final hole of regulation to force the playoff. Hagy finished the final round with a 4-under 68 to pace the Bears. California finished regulation at 12-under (1428), while Oregon carded a 2-over 362 in the final round to match the Bears at 12-under for the Championship. The teams started on No. 18 for the first playoff hole and each posted a team score of 1-over. The playoff continued on No. 16 where California posted a 1-under, thanks to another birdie by Hagy, to Oregon's 4-over to capture the title.

STANFORD junior **Andrew Yun** won the Pac-12 individual title, marking the 12th time a Cardinal claimed medalist honors. Yun fired a final round 4-under 68 to finish the championship at 13-under 275 (68-70-69-68), two strokes ahead of Oregon's **Daniel Miernicki**.

The Pac-12 had eight teams earn bids to compete at the 2012 NCAA Men's Golf Championships in one of six regional tournaments. Six teams went on to advance to the NCAA Championships, most among all conferences. UCLA, California, WASHINGTON and OREGON finished among the top eight teams in stroke-play competition and advanced to match-play round that determined the NCAA Champion. For the second straight year, UCLA sophomore **Patrick Cantlay** was the top Pac-12 individual finisher at the NCAA Championships, finishing in a tie for fourth with a 1-under 212 (74-72-66). Cantlay was named recipient of the Ben Hogan Award, which recognizes the top amateur and collegiate golfer.

Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honors went to Stanford's **Patrick Rodgers**, while Oregon senior **Eugene Wong** was named the Pac-12 Player of the Year. California coach **Steve Desimone** was tabbed Pac-12 Coach of the Year after guiding the Bears to a school-record six victories during the season.

# WOMEN'S GOLF

CALIFORNIA claimed its second Conference title, posting a 54-hole total of 881 (+17) to win the 2012 Pac-12 Championships. The Golden Bears' first crown came in 2003. USC finished in second place by one stroke. Trojan freshman **Doris Chen** earned medalist honors with a 1-over 217.

Ten teams were selected to the NCAA Regionals, with five Pac-12 squads advancing to the NCAA Championships. The NCAA Championships came down to one stroke, as USC finished with a 20-over 1172, one off Alabama's 19-over 1171. It was the Trojans' 13th top-five finish overall. Arizona State senior **Giulia Molinaro** was the highest finishing Pac-12 golfer, tying for eighth with a 3-over 291.

Molinaro was named Pac-12 Golfer of the Year, while UCLA's **Erynnee Lee** was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year as well as NGCA Freshman of the Year honors. UCLA head coach **Carrie Forsyth** was named the 2012 Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

# WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

The Pac-12 Gymnastics Championships, held in Salt Lake City, showcased some of the best talent in collegiate gymnastics. The Bruins rallied from behind to score a 197.425 to take home the title in dramatic fashion. UCLA was led by junior **Vanessa Zamarripa**, who placed second in the all-around competition with a score of 39.575. Head coach **Valorie Kondos Field** led the Bruins to its 17th Conference Championship, most of any other school in the Conference. Kondos Field was also named 2012 Pac-12 Coach of the Year. OREGON STATE senior **Leslie Mak** earned Gymnast of the Year honors for the second year in a row and UTAH's **Georgia Dabritz** was named Freshman of the Year.

Seven of the eight Conference teams were selected to participate in the NCAA Women's Gymnastics Regional Championships (ARIZONA, ARIZONA STATE, OREGON STATE, STANFORD, UCLA, UTAH, and WASHINGTON). Additionally, CALIFORNIA's **Dallas Crawford** and **Nicolette Lew** competed individually on the bars and beam, respectively. Oregon State, Stanford, UCLA, and Utah each advanced to the NCAA Championships. Individually, Arizona's **Aurbree Cristello** (all-around) and **Katie Matusik** (beam) both made trips to the Championship round. Washington's **Aliza Vaccher** also qualified for Nationals by placing first in the vault during regional competition. UCLA, Stanford, and Utah placed third, fourth, and fifth during Super Six competition.

The Pac-12 Conference produced 20 All-Americans in 2012, including 13 first-team All-Americans. Stanford had seven All-America honors, UCLA and Utah both had five, Oregon State had two, and Arizona had one.

# MEN'S AND WOMEN'S ROWING

The WASHINGTON men completed an undefeated season, winning all five Grand Finals at the IRA National Championships. The Huskies became the first crew to sweep all five events. It was their 15th National Championship and first repeat title in more than 70 years. Washington also won the Ten Eyck Trophy for the sixth straight season, finishing as the overall team points champion.

Five women's teams were selected to race at the NCAA Championships, and all five finished in the top 10 of the team standings. CALIFORNIA led all Pac-12 teams with a third place finish (78 points). In the varsity eight grand final, USC was the highest Conference finisher, placing third. Cal was fifth and Washington was sixth.

The Washington men and California women defended their Conference titles at the 2012 Pac-12 Rowing Championships on Lake Natoma. The Huskies hoisted the team trophy for the third straight year and swept all four races for the second time in three years. Cal captured its fifth consecutive league crown by sweeping the races for the first time in program history.

# MEN'S SOCCER

UCLA advanced to its first NCAA College Cup since 2006, falling to top-seeded and eventual national champion North Carolina 2-2 (3-1 PKs) in the semifinals. The Bruins captured their third Conference title in four years and seventh overall, finishing with a perfect 10-0-0 record in league play. UCLA finished the season ranked third in the NSCAA poll.

UCLA sophomore midfielder **Kelyn Rowe** was named Pac-12 Player of the Year while his head coach **Jorge Salcedo** earned Coach of the Year for the third time. Salcedo has guided the Bruins to the NCAA Tournament in each of his eight seasons and extended UCLA's streak to 29 consecutive postseason appearances. California midfielder **Seth Casiple** became the first Bear to win Freshman of the Year.

Two UCLA players were named NSCAA/Continental Tires All-Americans. Redshirt senior goalkeeper **Brian Rowe** was a second-team selection and junior forward **Chandler Hoffman** was named to the third team. Hoffman was a semifinalist for the MAC Hermann Trophy, the most prestigious individual award in college soccer. He led the Pac-12 with 18 goals and 42 points, both Conference season records.

Washington senior forward **Brent Richards**, the 2011 Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year for men's soccer, earned Capital One Academic All-America and NSCAA Scholar All-America first team honors. Hoffman was selected to the Capital One Academic All-America second team.

Rowe went on to be drafted third by the New England Revolution in the 2012 MLS SuperDraft. Hoffman joined him in the first round when the Philadelphia Union drafted him at No. 13. Washington midfielder **Jacob Hustedt** went in the second round (25th overall) to the San Jose Earthquakes.

# WOMEN'S SOCCER

In STANFORD's third consecutive appearance in the NCAA title match, the Cardinal defeated Duke 1-0 to win the program's first national championship. The 2011 season also marked the third straight regular season in which the Cardinal went undefeated to capture the conference championship. Five Pac-12 teams competed in the 2011 NCAA Tournament, with CALIFORNIA, UCLA and WASHINGTON STATE advancing to the second round, and OREGON STATE playing through the first round.

Stanford seniors **Lindsay Taylor** and **Teresa Noyola** cleaned up on the national awards circuit: They were two of the three finalists for the MAC Hermann Trophy, with Noyola taking home the hardware. Noyola was also named the NSCAA Scholar Athlete of the Year, while Taylor was named Soccer America's Women's Player of the Year in addition to Pac-12 Player of the Year. Stanford freshman forward **Chioma Ubogagu** and Cardinal coach **Paul Ratcliffe** joined Taylor in a sweep of All-Conference awards, with Ubogagu winning Freshman of the Year and Ratcliffe winning Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

# SOFTBALL

CALIFORNIA, ARIZONA STATE and OREGON represented the Pac-12 at the Women's College World Series. Cal and Arizona State tied for third, each finishing with a 2-2 record. Oregon tied for fifth, going 1-2 in Oklahoma City. It was the ninth time the Pac-12 had sent three teams to the WCWS. ASU's **Amber Freeman** and Oregon's **Samantha Pappas** and **Alexa Peterson** were named to the All-Tournament Team.

Eight of the Pac-12's nine teams made the NCAA postseason. ARIZONA, ARIZONA STATE, CALIFORNIA, OREGON, UCLA and WASHINGTON all hosted regionals while OREGON STATE and STANFORD went on the road. Five of those squads advanced to play in the Super Regionals.

In Conference play, Cal won its second outright league title and its first since 1987. The Golden Bears shared the Pac-10 crown in 2005. Cal senior utility player **Valerie Arioto** was named Pac-12 Player of the Year while teammate, junior **Jolene Henderson** earned her second straight Pitcher of the Year honor. Their coach **Diane Ninemire** was voted Coach of the Year. UCLA third baseman **Stephany LaRosa** was named Freshman of the Year, and Stanford senior shortstop **Ashley Hansen** was named Defensive Player of the Year. Arizona State senior shortstop **Katelyn Boyd** earned the Conference Batting Champion title after hitting .457 in the regular season.

# MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

CALIFORNIA scored 535.5 points to win its second straight national title, and three other Pac-12 teams finished in the top-10 at the 2012 NCAA Championships in Federal Way, Wash. STANFORD placed third (426.5), followed by ARIZONA in fourth (396) and USC in seventh (192). ARIZONA STATE placed 20th with 36 points in diving.

Cal junior **Tom Shields** was named Pac-12 Men's Swimmer of the Year after helping the Golden Bears win the NCAA crown. The Huntington Beach, Calif., native was named NCAA Swimmer of the Meet after capturing the 100 butterfly and 100 backstroke and swimming on the victorious 400 medley relay team. He is a nine-time NCAA champion, winning four individual titles and swimming on five national championship relays. At the Pac-12 Championships, Shields won the 100 and 200 fly along with two relays. The Pac-12 Men's Swimming Freshman of the Year, Stanford's **David Nolan** was named Swimmer of the Meet at the Pac-12 Championships after winning three individual events while also helping three Cardinal relay teams to titles. The Hershey, Pa., native won the 100 backstroke, 200 backstroke and 200 individual medley. At the NCAA Championships, Nolan finished second in the 100 and 200 backstroke and third in the 200 individual medley. **David Durden** earned Pac-12 Men's Swimming Coach of the Year for the third year in a row after leading Cal to its fourth NCAA championship in program history. The Bears also won back-to-back titles in 1979-80. Cal, which entered the NCAA Championships ranked sixth, won four individual events and two relays. In addition to Tom Shields' two wins, **Will Hamilton** captured the 200 butterfly and **Marcin Tarczynski** won the 200 individual medley.

Arizona senior **Ben Grado** was named Pac-12 Men's Diver of the Year. The Conifer, Colo., native became the first diver to sweep all three events at the Pac-12 Championships since Arizona State's Micky Benedetti in 2008. Grado then capped his collegiate career by winning the platform title at the NCAA Championships in Federal Way, Wash., with a score of 487.25. He also placed ninth on the 1-meter and 3-meter. Stanford's **Kristian Ipsen** was named Pac-12 Men's Diving Freshman/Newcomer of the Year after winning the 3-meter at the NCAA Championships and placing second on the 1-meter. Hailing from Clayton, Calif., he missed the Pac-12 Championships while competing at the World Cup in London. Ipsen won all 12 regular season springboard events and then swept them again at the Zone E Championships. Arizona's **Omar Ojeda** was named Pac-12 Men's Diving Coach of the Year after his first season at his alma mater. He coached two of his divers, **Andres Guerra** along with Grado, at the NCAA Championships. Ojeda was a five-time All-American for Arizona from 2000 to 2002, earning Pac-10 Men's Diver of the Year in 2001 and 2002.

# WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING

CALIFORNIA scored 412.5 points to capture its third NCAA Championship in four years. Three other Pac-12 teams finished in the top-five in Auburn, Ala. USC finished third (325.5), followed by STANFORD in fourth (318) and ARIZONA in fifth (299). ARIZONA STATE placed 12th (123), and UCLA was 37th (9).

Cal junior **Caitlin Leverenz** was named Pac-12 Women's Swimmer of the Year and also received the Honda Sport Award for swimming and diving, awarded to the nation's top collegiate female student-athlete. The Tucson, Ariz., native captured the 200 individual medley and 200 breaststroke and swam on the winning 200 and 400 medley relay teams en route to earning Swimmer of the Meet at the NCAA Championships. She scored 57 points for the Golden Bears in Auburn. Leverenz was also voted Swimmer of the Meet at the Pac-12 Championships after winning the 200 breaststroke, 400 individual medley and 400 medley relay. Stanford's **Maddy Schaefer**, from Los Altos, Calif., earned Pac-12 Women's Swimming Freshman/Newcomer of the Year after capping her freshman campaign by swimming on the Cardinal's victorious 200 and 400 freestyle relay teams at both the Pac-12 and NCAA Championships. Both winning times at the national meet were school records, and the 400 free relay time of 3:10.77 broke the American record of 3:11.03 by Georgia in 2011. Individually, Schaefer finished eighth in the 100 freestyle. Cal head coach **Teri McKeever** earned Pac-12 Women's Swimming Coach of the Year for the fifth time overall. The Bears claimed five individual events and two relays at the NCAA Championships. In addition to Leverenz's two wins, **Liv Jensen** (50 freestyle), **Sara Isakovic** (100 butterfly) and **Cindy Tran** (100 backstroke) captured titles. McKeever will serve as the U.S. head women's coach for at the 2012 Olympic Games in London.

USC junior **Victoria Ishimatsu** became the first athlete to win four Pac-12 Women's Diver of the Year awards. The Seal Beach, Calif., native was named Women's Diver of the Meet at the Pac-12 Championships after claiming both springboard events for the third straight year. She also made history with her win on the 3-meter, becoming the first women's diver to win the same event all four years. Ishimatsu capped her USC career by winning the 1-meter at the NCAA Championships, scoring 354.10 for her first title. UCLA's **Emma Ivory-Ganja**, the Women's Diving Freshman/Newcomer of the Year, placed third on both the 3-meter and platform at the Pac-12 Championships. A native of The Woodlands, Texas, she went on to finish fourth on the platform, seventh on the 3-meter and ninth on the 1-meter at the Zone E Championships. USC's **Hongping Li** has been honored as the Pac-12 Women's Diving Coach of the Year for the fourth year in a row and a record nine times overall. Since joining the Trojans in 1999, Li has directed men's and women's divers to six NCAA titles. Ishimatsu will leave USC as one of the most decorated divers in Pac-12 history under Li's guidance.

# MEN'S TENNIS

USC won its fourth consecutive national title, putting the exclamation point on a 33-1 season with a 4-2 win over third seed Virginia. The Trojans won the first-ever team Conference title at the 2012 Pac-12 Championships in Ojai, Calif., defeating rival UCLA, 4-2. USC's sole loss of the season was to the Bruins in the final dual match of the regular season.

USC senior **Steve Johnson** also finished the season and his collegiate career on top, winning the NCAA singles championship for the second straight year. He also earned Conference Player of the Year honors for the second consecutive year.

USC's Johnson and **Roberto Quiroz** were named Pac-12 Doubles Team of the Year, USC's **Yannick Hanfmann** was voted Pac-12 Freshman/Newcomer of the Year, and USC's **Peter Smith** and UCLA's **Billy Martin** were named Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year

The Pac-12 finished the season with four teams ranked in the ITA Top 25: USC finished first, UCLA finished third, STANFORD finished ninth and CALIFORNIA finished 13th.

# WOMEN'S TENNIS

STANFORD and USC finished Pac-12 play with one loss apiece, resulting in a tie for the Conference championship. The Cardinal and Trojans split individual championships at the Pac-12 Championships in Ojai, Calif., as well, with Stanford sophomore **Nicole Gibbs** rolling to the singles title and USC duo **Kaitlyn Christian** and **Sabrina Santamaria** claiming the doubles title.

Stanford continued its dominance in the postseason, with Gibbs defeating teammate **Mallory Burdette** to win the NCAA singles title, and then Gibbs and Burdette pairing up to take the NCAA doubles championship. The doubles victory provided the third straight national doubles title for the Cardinal, and the fifth straight NCAA doubles crown for a Pac-12 school. UCLA coach **Stella Sampras Webster** led her team to a second-place finish in the team tournament, earning Wilson/ITA National Coach of the Year in the process.

Stanford's Nicole Gibbs was named the Pac-12 Singles Player of the Year, USC duo Kaitlyn Christian and Sabrina Santamaria were named Pac-12 Doubles Team of the Year, UCLA's **Robin Anderson** took home Pac-12 Freshman/Newcomer of the Year honors and WASHINGTON STATE's **Lisa Hart** earned Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

The Pac-12 finished the season with four teams ranked in the ITA Top 25: UCLA finished second, USC finished fourth, Stanford finished fifth and CALIFORNIA finished seventh.

# MEN'S OUTDOOR TRACK AND FIELD

Oregon scored 140 points on its home facility, Hayward Field, to win its sixth-consecutive Conference title, the longest streak of victories since USC won 15-straight Pacific Coast Conference titles from 1936-55. It was the Ducks' 13th overall title, as well. Six Pac-12 teams finished in the top 20 of the NCAA standings with ARIZONA leading the way, placing seventh overall. UO also finished in the top-10, placing in a tie for ninth. Two Pac-12 athletes won national championships. STANFORD's **Amaechi Morton** claimed the 400-meter hurdles title, improving on a second-place showing from the previous year. A Pac-12 athlete has won the 400-meter hurdle national championship the last four years, after WASHINGTON STATE's Jeshua Anderson won it from 2009-10. ARIZONA STATE's **Jordan Clarke** was a repeat winner in the shot put. Clarke was also named the Athlete of the Meet at the Pac-12 Championships after winning the shot put, placing second in the hammer throw and was third in the discus.

Stanford's **Chris Derrick** was voted the Pac-12 Athlete of the Year, the first Cardinal to win the honor since 1976. Derrick set the American collegiate record in the 10,000 meter in late April, won the 5,000-meter race at the Pac-12 Championships and was the runner-up in the 1,500 meter. He placed third overall at the 10,000-meter distance at the NCAA Championships. ARIZONA's **Nick Ross** was the Pac-12 Field Athlete of the Year, becoming the first Wildcat to earn the honor. He was the Pac-12 Champion in the high jump, placed fourth in the event at the NCAA Championships and qualified for the NCAA finals in the triple jump. The Pac-12 coaches selected Oregon's **Jonathan Cabral** the Newcomer of the Year after he won the 110-meter hurdle title at the Pac-12 meet. He posted the fastest time in the event by a Pac-12 athlete at the West Regionals to qualify for the national meet. The Ducks' **Vin Lananna** won the Pac-12 Coach of the Year honor for third time in the last four years.

# WOMEN'S OUTDOOR TRACK AND FIELD

OREGON was far out in front of the rest of the field, scoring 200.50 points to claim its fourth-consecutive Pac-12 Conference title in front of a hometown crowd at Hayward Field in Eugene, Ore. It was only the second time ever, and the second time in three years, a team had scored over 200 points at the Conference meet (UO scored 215 points in 2010). The Ducks went on to place second at the NCAA Championships, being edged out in the final two events of the championships. STANFORD and WASHINGTON also placed in the top 10 at the national meet, finishing sixth and eighth, respectively.

Six Pac-12 athletes and a relay team won individual national championships. UO sophomore **English Gardner** and senior **Brianne Theisen** helped the Ducks to its second-place showing claiming individual crowns in the 100-meter race and the heptathlon, respectively. Theisen became only the third woman in NCAA history to win three heptathlon titles. She completed the second-best heptathlon in collegiate history, scoring an NCAA-meet record 6,440 (second best all-time in NCAA history). UO's 4x400-meter relay squad also claimed top honors, posting a come-from-behind win in a meet-record time of 3:24.54. At season's end, Gardner was tabbed the Pac-12 Track Athlete of the Year, while Theisen was awarded the Pac-12 Field Athlete of the Year honor. ARIZONA STATE's **Shelby Houlihan** was the Pac-12 Newcomer of the Year and Oregon head coach **Vin Lananna** was voted the Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the third time in four years.

Others to win NCAA titles were ARIZONA's **Brigetta Barrett**, who repeated in the high jump. She, along with Theisen, were finalists for the prestigious Bowerman Award. UW's **Katie Flood** was the 1,500-meter champion, claiming the title in her hometown of Des Moines, Iowa. COLORADO's **Shalaya Kipp** cruised to victory in the 3,000-meter steeplechase and Stanford's **Katerina Stefanidi** won the pole vault crown. Theisen was also named the USTFCCA National Field Athlete of the Year.

# WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL

UCLA won its fourth NCAA title and seventh national crown, overall, in San Antonio, Texas. It was the Pac-12's 14th all-time NCAA women's volleyball championship, as well, and first since winning five in a row from 2001-05. The Bruins upset three higher-seeded teams en route to their national title.

Boasting the most storied history in the 31 years of the NCAA Tournament, the Pac-12 had two teams in the national semifinals with USC advancing that far for the second-straight year, the 14th time at least two Conference teams have played in the semifinals and the 28th time at least one league team has participated. It was the second-straight year a Pac-12 team was playing in the national championship match and the 10th time in the last 11 years.

Seven Pac-12 teams earned NCAA Tournament bids this year, the 12th-consecutive year the Conference has sent at least six teams. Half of the Pac-12 teams were ranked in the AVCA National Coaches poll all year, including the final ranking of the season. Three different Conference teams were ranked No. 1 in the nation at different times throughout the 2011 campaign and four were among the top five in the country for most of the year.

Individually, eight league players earned AVCA All-American honors, including four first-team honorees. USC's **Alex Jupiter** was named the AVCA National Player of the Year and UCLA's **Mike Sealy** was the National Coach of the Year.

# WRESTLING

OREGON STATE claimed its second Conference championship in three years, upending defending champions BOISE STATE on the Broncos' home turf. OSU finished 10th at the NCAA Championships in March, posting the program's highest finish since 2001.

STANFORD senior **Nick Amuchastegui** was named the Pac-12 Wrestler of the Year and Pac-12 Wrestling Scholar-Athlete of the Year. He finished the season 24-1, dropping his only match of the 2012 campaign in the NCAA Final. The three-time All-American also won the 2012 Pac-12 Championship for 174 pounds.

# MOUNTAIN PACIFIC SPORTS FEDERATION

(Capsule Reviews of 2011-12 Pac-12 Highlights in the MPSF)

## MEN'S GYMNASTICS

Entering the NCAA Championships ranked eighth, CALIFORNIA scored 353.000 to place fourth at the national meet. Defending national champion STANFORD was fifth with a total team score of 352.650. Cal senior **Glen Ishino** capped his season with the NCAA individual championship on the pommel horse (15.600) and finished his career as a seven-time All-American. Ishino also placed second on the high bar (15.050) and was fourth in the all-around (88.400). Teammate **Dennis Manhart** was right behind him with a fifth-place finish (87.550). Cardinal junior **Eddie Penev** captured a pair of individual titles, winning the floor exercise with a 16.100 and sharing the vault crown with Illinois' Paul Ruggeri after posting a 15.500. Penev led Stanford in the all-around with a score of 86.450 to finish eighth. Stanford was the runner-up at the MPSF Championships (352.100) behind champion Oklahoma. Penev was a double winner on vault and floor while claiming silver in the all-around. Cal placed third (345.950). **Donothan Bailey** won the pommel horse with a 14.900.

## MEN'S INDOOR TRACK AND FIELD

The ARIZONA STATE men won their first MPSF title, scoring 131.5 points to STANFORD's 81.5. It was the highest point total and largest margin of victory since WASHINGTON began hosting the MPSF Championships a decade ago. Sun Devils coach **Greg Kraft** was named MPSF Coach of the Year as his squad claimed five individual wins at the conference championships. ARIZONA sophomore **Lawi Lalang** was named MPSF Male Athlete of the Year for the second straight season after breaking the championship record in the 3,000 meters (7:44.48), shaving nearly 10 seconds off his winning mark from 2011. On Feb. 11, Lalang broke the all-time collegiate record in the 5,000 meters (13:08.28), also by nearly 10 seconds. He went on to win both the 3,000 and 5,000 meters at the NCAA Championships. OREGON's **Mike Berry** (400m), ASU's **Mason McHenry** (800m) and **Jordan Clarke** (shot put) and Arizona's **Nick Ross** (high jump) also claimed NCAA titles.

## WOMEN'S INDOOR TRACK AND FIELD

Wins by **Brianne Theisen** and **English Gardner**, along with an outstanding all-around team performance, led OREGON to its third consecutive NCAA indoor crown. The Ducks joined LSU as the only teams to have won three titles in a row. Oregon scored 49 points to runner-up Kansas' 30. Theisen won the pentathlon for the third straight year, tallying 4,536 points. She is only the second three-time pentathlon champion, joining Arizona State's Jacquelyn Johnson (2006-08). Gardner captured the 60-meter title in 7.12 seconds, the fourth-fastest time ever run by a collegian. ARIZONA's **Brigetta Barrett**, the MPSF Female Athlete of the Year, defended her high jump championship, clearing 6-1.5 (1.87m) to defeat the field. Barrett's best clearance was 6-5 (1.97m), just missing on her collegiate-record attempt at 6-6.25 (1.99m). WASHINGTON won its first distance medley title in 11:05.20. STANFORD won the MPSF team crown with 125 points to Arizona's 110. Cardinal coach **Edrick Floreal** was named MPSF Coach of the Year for the fifth time.

## WOMEN'S LACROSSE

OREGON snapped STANFORD's seven-year lock on the MPSF Championship with a 13-10 win in the MPSF Tournament. Tournament MVP goalkeeper **Caroline Federighi** collected nine saves while **Nikki Puszc** scored a hat trick against the Cardinal. **Kristina Barrett** became Oregon's all-time assists leader (76) in the 14-11 semifinal win over CALIFORNIA. Federighi and Puszc joined **Colleen Taggart**, **Jana Drummond** and **Jess Drummond** to represent Oregon on the all-tournament team. The Ducks made their first program postseason appearance by hosting Navy, falling to the Midshipmen 10-9 in overtime. Cal junior attacker **Megan Takacs** was named MPSF Player of the Year and earned IWLCIA All-Region first team honors after finishing the season ranked second in the nation with 4.08 goals per game. Stanford's **Emilie Boeri** and Oregon's **Jana Drummond** and Federighi all earned second team recognition. The Ducks' **Jen Larsen-Beck** was named MPSF Coach of the Year. Federighi added to her decorated season by being named to the Capital One Academic All-District At-Large Team.

## MEN'S VOLLEYBALL

No. 2 UC Irvine upset No. 1 USC in the NCAA Championship final in May, sweeping the Trojans, 25-22, 34-32, 26-24, on USC's home court. It was USC's third NCAA Final Four appearance in the last four years. Senior outside hitter **Tony Ciarelli** made the NCAA All-Tournament team after posting 18 kills and eight digs in the final. Ciarelli was named the AVCA National Player of the Year just a few days prior to the title match. He was also named MPSF Men's Volleyball Player of the Year in April, when USC freshman setter **Micah Christenson** was voted MPSF Freshman of the Year. USC head coach **Bill Ferguson** also took home some hardware, earning the honor of AVCA Division I-II Men's National Coach of the Year in May. It marks the second AVCA National Coach of the Year award in his six-year career at Troy. He was previously honored in 2009.

## MEN'S WATER POLO

USC (24-3) claimed its fourth consecutive national championship in December, making it 14-straight years since a non-Pac-12 school won the national title. The No. 1 Trojans defeated No. 2 UCLA, 7-4, in Berkeley, Calif., to become the first men's water polo team in NCAA history ever to win four consecutive national championships. Trojan goalkeeper **Joel Dennerley** was named the NCAA Tournament MVP after a 15-save performance in the championship match. The following were named to the All-Tournament first team: Dennerley (USC), **Peter Kurzeka** (USC), **Josh Samuels** (UCLA), **Nikola Vavic** (USC), **Cullen Hennessy** (UCLA). The following earned second-team recognition: **Matt Rapacz** (UCLA), **Jeremy Davie** (USC), **Griffin White** (UCLA), **Cristiano Mirarchi** (UCLA) and **Mace Rapsey** (USC). USC's Dennerley was named the 2012 Peter J. Cutino Award winner, becoming the first-ever goalie on the men's side to win the annual honor for the nation's top male and female collegiate water polo players.

## WOMEN'S WATER POLO

No. 1 STANFORD (26-2) claimed its second straight NCAA Championship and the program's third overall title with a 6-4 win over No. 3 USC (23-6) in May. Cardinal junior goalkeeper **Kate Baldoni** made 15 saves in the championship match, earning her the NCAA Tournament Most Valuable Player honor. Stanford's **Kaley Dodson** and **Alyssa Lo** joined Baldoni on the All-Tournament first team, while **Kaleigh Gilchrist**, **Patrician Jansco** and **Monica Vavic** represented USC on the first team. USC's **Flora Bolonyai** was named to the All-Tournament second team. The Cardinal also dominated in national awards: Freshman driver **Kiley Neushul** was named the ACWPC National Player of the Year and the 2012 Peter J. Cutino Award winner, making her the second straight Stanford player to receive the annual honor. Stanford head coach **John Tanner** was also named the ACWPC National Coach of the Year.

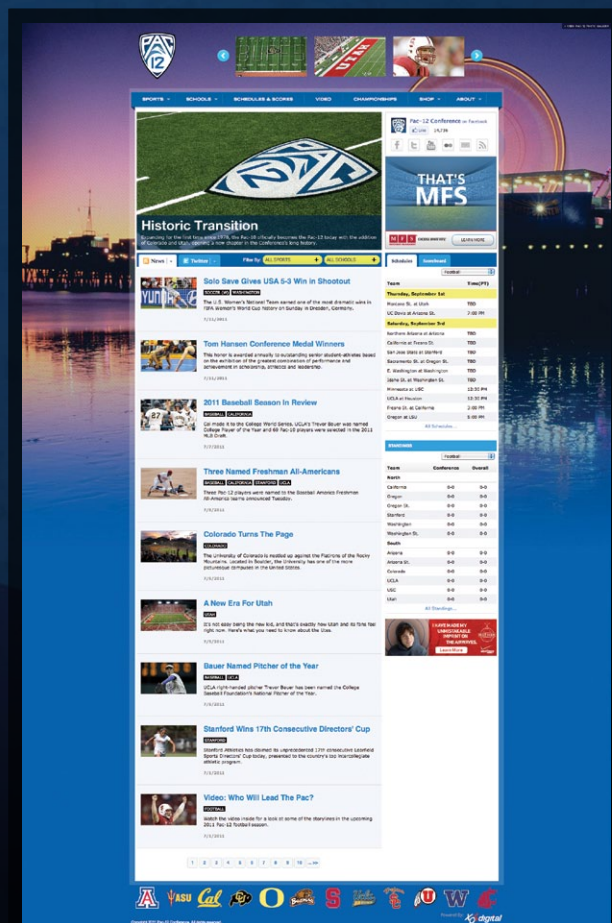
