## TITANS HOLD 29TH OVERALL PICK, SEVEN TOTAL SELECTIONS IN 2020 NFL DRAFT

*Draft to be held in virtual format from April 23-25*

NASHVILLE — Plans are in place for the 85th Annual National Football League Player Selection Meeting, set to take place from April 23-25.

The Titans currently own seven total picks in the draft, including the 29th overall selection in the first round.

The draft opens with the first round on Thursday, April 23 at 7 p.m. CDT. Rounds 2 and 3 are set for the following evening, beginning at 6 p.m., and the draft concludes with Rounds 4-7 on Saturday at 11 a.m.

The NFL will conduct the draft in a virtual format this year. NFL team personnel, including Titans executive vice president/general manager **Jon Robinson** and head coach **Mike Vrabel**, will remain away from club facilities in compliance with coronavirus-related government mandates and health recommendations, as well as to ensure equality among all 32 organizations.

The 2020 NFL Draft originally was scheduled to take place in Las Vegas, the new home of the Raiders. However, the league announced on March 16 that all public elements of the draft would be canceled.

In 2019, Nashville hosted the draft for the first time. A record 600,000 fans attended the three-day event, which is the premier event on the NFL's offseason calendar. The television audience reached 47.5 million viewers.

### DRAFT BROADCASTS

All three days of the 2020 NFL Draft will be televised on NFL Network, ESPN, ESPN Deportes and ABC. ESPN and NFL Network will combine to offer a singular presentation across both networks, while ABC will present its own distinctive, prime-time broadcasts on Thursday (Round 1) and Friday (Rounds 2-3). ABC will simulcast the ESPN/NFL Network coverage for rounds 4-7.

The television broadcasts will originate from ESPN studios in Bristol, Conn. NFL Commissioner **Roger Goodell** will announce the picks from his home in New York.

Coverage will be streamed live via NFL and ESPN digital properties across devices (phone, PC, tablet and connected TVs). NFL Network or ESPN authentication may be required.

The Titans Radio Network, including Nashville flagship 104.5 The Zone, will carry draft programming across the Mid-South with **Mike Keith**, **Dave McGinnis**, **Jonathan Hutton** and **Rhett Bryan**.

National radio coverage will be provided by SiriusXM, Westwood One, ESPN Radio and the TuneIn app.

Meanwhile, draft information will be updated continuously at [TennesseeTitans.com](http://TennesseeTitans.com), the Titans mobile app and on all official team social channels.

### SEVEN PICKS

The Titans' seven total picks are comprised of five of their seven original selections plus two choices acquired in trades.

In the seventh round, the Titans received the Cleveland Browns' 224th overall pick in exchange for wide receiver **Taywan Taylor**, and they got the 237th overall choice from the Denver Broncos (pick originally from New England) for defensive tackle **Jurrell Casey**.

The Titans dealt their fourth-round choice (135th overall) to the Miami Dolphins in last year's trade that brought quarterback **Ryan Tannehill** to Tennessee. Tannehill went on to lead the NFL and set a new franchise record with a 117.5 passer rating.

They also sent their sixth-round pick (208th overall) to the Green Bay Packers for outside linebacker **Reggie Gilbert**, who appeared in 11 games and recorded a career-high five starts in his first campaign in two-tone blue.

## THE 29TH SELECTION

In determining draft order, non-playoff clubs select first through 20th, according to the reverse order of their standing (i.e., the team with the worst record receives the first pick, the team with the second-worst record receives the second pick, etc.). Playoff teams select 21st through 32nd based on their level of advancement in the postseason.

The Titans finished 9-7 in the 2019 regular season but advanced to the AFC Championship game. That earned them the 29th overall pick and the 29th slot in each round thereafter. As a result, they own the 61st overall choice in the second round and the 93rd selection in the third round.

The only other occasion in franchise history the team used the 29th overall pick was 1984, when it took Auburn defensive lineman **Doug Smith**. At the time, the 29th pick was the first pick of the second round. Smith went on to have an eight-year career with the Oilers and was a key member of six playoff teams.

The last time Tennessee's first pick in the draft was 29th or lower was 2009. Coming off a 13-3 season and a divisional round playoff appearance in 2008, they had the 30th overall pick and used it on wide receiver **Kenny Britt**.

In 53 drafts since 1967, when the NFL and AFL agreed to a "common draft," there have been 11 No. 29 overall picks (20.8 percent) that have gone on to make at least one Pro Bowl: defensive back **Tommy Casanova** (selected in 1972 by the Cincinnati Bengals), linebacker **Dave Lewis** (1977, Tampa Bay Buccaneers), running back **Joe Cribbs** (1980, Buffalo Bills), defensive back **Nate Odomes** (1987, Buffalo Bills), linebacker **Chris Spielman** (1988, Detroit Lions), guard **Steve Wisniewski** (1989, Dallas Cowboys), defensive back **Ashley Ambrose** (1992, Indianapolis Colts), center **Nick Mangold** (2006, New York Jets), guard **Ben Grubbs** (2007, Baltimore Ravens), safety **Harrison Smith** (2012, Minnesota Vikings) and wide receiver **Cordarrelle Patterson** (2013, Minnesota Vikings).

Last year with the 29th-overall pick, the Seattle Seahawks selected defensive end **L.J. Collier**, who appeared in 11 games for the Seahawks as a rookie.

## ROBINSON PREPARES FOR FIFTH DRAFT AS GM

Robinson was named to his general manager post on Jan. 14, 2016, and in 2017, controlling owner **Amy Adams Strunk** added executive vice president to his title.



Jeffery Simmons was the 19th overall draft selection in 2019.

The Titans' original fourth-round pick (135th overall) was traded to the Miami Dolphins, and their original sixth-round pick (208th overall) was traded to the Green Bay Packers.



Since then, he has spearheaded the selection of 29 players, and 15 of those players remain with the club.

In 2016, Robinson finished his first draft process with 10 players after having his hands on 17 total selections at one time or another due to trades. All 10 members of the draft class appeared in at least one game for the team, and six of them remained with the team through 2019.

Two members of the 2016 draft class have earned Associated Press first-team All-Pro honors: first-round right tackle **Jack Conklin** as a rookie (departed in free agency in 2020) and third-round safety **Kevin Byard** in his second campaign. Byard, who led the NFL from 2017–2019 with 17 interceptions, also was named to the Pro Bowl in 2017.

**Derrick Henry**, a second-rounder in 2016, led the Titans in rushing every season from 2017 through 2019. He won the NFL's rushing crown in 2019 with 1,540 yards and tied for the NFL lead with 16 rushing touchdowns.

In 2017, Robinson made a total of nine draft picks, and four of them remained with the club through 2019 as starters: wide receiver **Corey Davis**, cornerback **Adoree' Jackson**, tight end **Jonnui Smith** and inside linebacker **Jayon Brown**.

Davis was chosen with the fifth-overall choice in 2017. After battling through multiple injuries as a rookie, he led the offense in receiving in 2018 with 65 catches for 891 yards and four touchdowns. In 15 games in 2019, he contributed 43 receptions for 601 yards and two scores.

Jackson, the Titans' second first-round choice in 2017 (18th overall), started every game and ranked second in the NFL in total snaps as a rookie (1,260). Through his first three seasons, he tallied 43 games played, 39 starts and two interceptions.

Smith played in 45 games in his first three years, tallying 39 starts. In 2019, he produced career highs with 35 receptions, 439 receiving yards and 14 starts.

Brown finished third on the Titans and set a career high with 117 tackles in 2019.

Robinson's 2018 draft class was smaller, comprised of only four players. However, three of those players were key contributors in their first two seasons.

First-rounder **Rashaan Evans** (22nd overall) played in 15 games as a rookie in 2018. In his second season, he started every game and paced the defense with 139 tackles.

Second-round outside linebacker **Harold Landry III** posted 4.5 sacks as a rookie. In 2019, his role increased, and he led the club with nine sacks in 16 starts.

Defensive back **Dane Cruikshank**, a fifth-round selection in 2018, became one of the team's leading special teams players in his first two campaigns. His 18 special teams tackles from 2018–2019 ranked second on the squad.



A.J. Brown led all 2019 rookies in receiving yards.

In 2019, the Titans drafted six total players, including Mississippi State defensive lineman **Jeffery Simmons** in the first round, Ole Miss wide receiver **A.J. Brown** in the second round and Charlotte offensive lineman **Nate Davis** in the third round.

Simmons (19th overall), who was injured prior to the draft, eventually joined the active roster for nine regular season games and three postseason contests. His contributions included two sacks and 14 quarterback pressures.

Brown ranked first on the Titans with 52 catches, 1,051 receiving yards and eight touchdown catches as a rookie. He led the 2019 NFL rookie class in receiving yards, tied for the rookie lead in touchdown receptions, and ranked second among all NFL players in receiving average (20.2).

Davis was the starting right guard by Week 5 of his rookie season. He started the final 12 games of the regular season and all three playoff contests.

**TIMING:** The first round will conclude on Thursday by approximately 10:30 p.m. CT. In 2019, the first round consumed three hours and 39 minutes. The second and third rounds will conclude on Friday by approximately 10 p.m. CT. The second and third rounds took a combined four hours and 12 minutes in 2019. The draft will conclude by approximately 5 p.m. CT on Saturday with the final four rounds. Rounds 4 through 7 took six hours and 23 minutes in 2019.

**ROUNDS:** Seven Rounds – Round 1 on Thursday, April 23; Rounds 2 through 3 on Friday, April 24; and Rounds 4 through 7 on Saturday, April 25.

There will be 255 total selections, including 32 compensatory choices that have been awarded to 15 teams that suffered a net loss of certain quality unrestricted free agents last year. Tennessee was not awarded any compensatory selections this year. Teams are permitted under NFL bylaws to trade compensatory picks.

The Miami Dolphins currently hold three choices in the first round (5, 18, 26). Four clubs possess two choices in the first round: the Jacksonville Jaguars (9, 20), Las Vegas Raiders (12, 19), San Francisco 49ers (13, 31) and Minnesota Vikings (22, 25). Six teams do not have a pick in the opening round: the Indianapolis Colts, Pittsburgh Steelers, Chicago Bears, Los Angeles Rams, Buffalo Bills and Houston Texans.

**TIME LIMITS:** Round 1: 10 minutes per selection. Round 2: Seven minutes per selection. Rounds 3 through 6, including compensatory picks: Five minutes per selection. Round 7, including compensatory picks: Four minutes per selection.

**TELEVISION:** The draft will be televised on ABC, NFL Network, ESPN and ESPN Deportes.

ESPN and NFL Network will combine to simulcast across both networks, while ABC will present its own distinctive, prime-time telecasts for rounds 1-3. ABC will simulcast the ESPN and NFL Network telecast for rounds 4-7.

The 2020 NFL Draft telecasts will originate from ESPN's Bristol, Conn., studios and adhere to proper social distancing guidelines and local workplace rules due to COVID-19. Draft hosts and a limited number of commentators will be in-studio while a majority of the analysts, reporters and other experts will contribute remotely from home studios. NFL Commissioner **Roger Goodell** will introduce the picks from his home.

ESPN talent includes **Trey Wingo, Mel Kiper Jr., Louis Riddick, Booger McFarland, Suzy Kolber, Chris Mortensen and Adam Schefter**.

NFL Network talent includes **Rich Eisen, Daniel Jeremiah, Michael Irvin and Kurt Warner**.

ABC talent includes **Rece Davis, Jesse Palmer, Maria Taylor, Todd McShay** (also featured on ESPN/NFL Network coverage on Saturday), **Kirk Herbstreit, Desmond Howard, David Pollack and Tom Rinaldi**.

ESPN Deportes will provide exclusive Spanish-language coverage. Commentators include Monday Night Football voices **Eduardo Varela** and **Pablo Viruega**. In addition, ESPNDeportes.com will have a team dedicated to covering the draft

## DRAFT-A-THON TO HELP RELIEF EFFORTS

The NFL announced that the 2020 NFL Draft will serve as a three-day virtual fundraiser benefiting six charities – selected by the NFL Foundation – that are battling the spread of COVID-19 and delivering relief to millions in need.

The “Draft-A-Thon” will be featured across the live draft coverage on ABC, ESPN, ESPN Deportes and NFL Network April 23-25 and pay tribute to healthcare workers and first responders in a variety of ways, including raising funds for the work being done to combat the impact of COVID-19. Funds will help support six national nonprofits and their respective COVID-19 relief efforts including:

- **American Red Cross** and its work to maintain a sufficient supply of blood while continuing to deliver its lifesaving mission due to the Coronavirus Outbreak
- **CDC Foundation's All of Us: Combat Coronavirus Campaign** to support vulnerable communities and bolster laboratory capacity, clinical research, data and technology infrastructure and local response efforts
- **Feeding America's COVID-19 Response Fund** to help member food banks meet the increased need due to school closures, job disruptions, and current health risks
- **Meals on Wheels COVID-19 Response Fund** to ensure local communities have what they need to feed the at-risk elderly population

## PROSPECTS PARTICIPATING FROM HOME

Fifty-eight prospects are confirmed to participate virtually in the 2020 NFL Draft.

Louisiana State leads all colleges with eight participating players while Alabama will have seven players take part. The Southeastern Conference leads all conferences with 24 prospects confirmed to participate in the event.

**Jon Robinson** was hired as Titans general manager on Jan. 14, 2016 after spending two years as director of player personnel for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Nearly one year later, on Jan. 5, 2017, he was promoted to executive vice president/general manager.

In his first four years on the job, the Titans finished with four consecutive 9-7 seasons. It marked the first time the organization produced at least four consecutive winning seasons since a seven-year run of winning records from 1987–1993. The Titans were one of four NFL teams to accomplish the feat from 2016–2019, joining New England, Seattle and Kansas City.

Robinson became only the second general manager in franchise history whose first four teams finished above the .500 mark, joining **Mike Holovak** (1989–92).

Robinson's work helped the team go from three wins in the season prior to his arrival (2015) to a divisional round playoff finish following the 2017 campaign. He became the fifth general manager in franchise history to have the team in the playoffs within his first two full seasons.

Then, in 2019, the team he constructed advanced to the AFC Championship game. It was the organization's first appearance in the conference title game in 17 seasons (2002).

When the Titans took the field for the 2019 postseason, only seven players remained on the 53-man roster from prior to Robinson's arrival—a turnover rate of 87 percent. That included 23 free agents, 18 draft picks, four players acquired via trade and one waiver pickup. An additional six players he acquired (four free agents, one draft pick and one waiver claim) ended 2019 on injured reserve.

Robinson selected 29 total players in his first four drafts as general manager, and 19 of those picks remained with the club at the end of the 2019 season. During the same four years, he engineered 18 trades and made 11 waiver claims (through December 2019).

**2020:** Prior to the 2020 free agent signing period, the Titans reached an agreement on a multi-year contract to keep quarterback **Ryan Tannehill** in Tennessee. The Titans also retained running back **Derrick Henry** by using the franchise tag and re-signed tackle **Dennis Kelly** and outside linebacker **Kamalei Correa**, among others.



The Titans used their first-round pick in 2018 on Rashaan Evans.

Robinson also led the acquisition of unrestricted free agent outside linebacker **Vic Beasley** from the Atlanta Falcons. The former first-round pick spent his first five NFL seasons (2015–19) in Atlanta, capping his tenure there with eight sacks in 2019. He led the NFL with 15.5 sacks in 2016, and from his rookie season through 2019, he ranked 16th in the NFL in sacks by edge rushers (outside linebackers and defensive ends).

**2019:** Near the beginning of the 2019 free agent signing period, Robinson worked quickly to add several veterans from other teams who played key roles in 2019: Buccaneers wide receiver **Adam Humphries**, Rams guard **Roger Saffold** and Dolphins quarterback **Ryan Tannehill** via trade. Robinson also worked to re-sign starting safety **Kenny Vaccaro** and punter **Brett Kern**.

Then, in the 2019 NFL Draft, Robinson directed the selection of six total players, including Mississippi State defensive lineman **Jeffery Simmons** in the first round (19th overall), Ole Miss wide receiver **A.J. Brown** in the second round (51st overall) and Charlotte offensive lineman **Nate Davis** in the third round (82nd overall).

Tannehill, who proved to be one of the NFL's top acquisitions of 2019, started every game after Week 6, leading the team into the playoffs. He led the NFL and set franchise records with a 117.5 passer rating and a 9.6-yard passing average. In addition to being named to his first Pro Bowl, he earned Associated Press Comeback Player of the Year honors.

As a rookie, Brown led the Titans in every major receiving category. Among all rookies in 2019, he ranked first in receiving yards (1,051), tied for the rookie lead in touchdown receptions (eight) and placed fifth in receptions (52). Among all NFL players in 2019—rookies and veterans—Brown finished second in receiving average (20.2), behind only the Los Angeles Chargers' **Mike Williams** (20.4).

**2018:** The Titans' 2018 free agent class included Pro Bowl cornerback **Malcolm Butler**. In his first two seasons in Tennessee, Butler played in 25 games (20 starts) and totaled five interceptions. In early August, the Titans signed Vaccaro, who went on to start 13 games his first season in Tennessee and all 16 games in 2019.

Robinson's 2018 draft class was comprised of four players after he used multiple trades to go up and get his targets. It included first-round linebacker **Rashaan Evans** from Alabama (22nd overall pick) and second-round outside linebacker **Harold Landry III** from Boston College (41st overall). Evans started all 16 games in 2019 and led the team with 139 tackles. Landry appeared in 31 games (19 starts) in his first two seasons, and his 13.5 sacks from 2018–2019 (nine in 2019) ranked first on the team.

**2017:** During the 2017 offseason, Robinson used free agency to address needs on defense and special teams. Most notably, he spearheaded deals for cornerback **Logan Ryan** (New England) and special teams contributor and 2017 Pro Bowler **Brynden Trawick** (Oakland).

In the 2017 NFL Draft, Robinson spent first-round picks on wide receiver **Corey Davis** (fifth overall) and cornerback **Adoree' Jackson** (18th overall). It marked the first time the franchise had a pair of first-round draft selections since 1987. The Titans' 2017 draft haul also featured tight end **Jonnu Smith** in the third round and linebacker **Jayon Brown** in the fifth round.

The 2017 Titans advanced to the playoffs for the first time since 2008. Robinson became the fifth general manager in franchise history to have the team in the postseason within his first two full seasons.

**2016:** In his first year as an NFL general manager, Robinson's leadership and decision-making helped the Titans triple their win total from the previous season, finishing 9-7 in 2016 after a 3-13 finish in 2015. The six-win improvement tied for the most in franchise history (1967 and 1974) and doubled the previous club benchmark for the most wins in the first year under a new general manager (three by **Bum Phillips** in 1975).

Within the first four months at his post, Robinson pulled the trigger on several key personnel decisions. On March 9, 2016, he made his first major acquisition, swapping fourth-round draft picks with the Philadelphia Eagles in exchange for running back **DeMarco Murray**. The trade provided major dividends in 2016, as Murray led the AFC and ranked third in the NFL with 1,287 rushing yards.

Around the same time, Robinson began to work the free agent market. Center **Ben Jones** and wide receiver **Rishard Matthews** highlighted the haul, and both were instrumental in helping to transform the Titans offense into the 11th-ranked unit in the NFL.

On April 14, 2016, two weeks before the NFL Draft, Robinson and

the Titans dealt the first overall pick to the Los Angeles Rams in one of the biggest trades in recent NFL history. The Titans gave up the No. 1 pick and a fourth-rounder in order to receive the 15th overall pick, two second-rounders and a third-rounder in 2016, plus the Rams' first- and third-round picks in 2017. From 1990–2015, there were seven trades involving the No. 1 overall pick, but this was the first since 2004, when the San Diego Chargers selected **Eli Manning** with the first pick and dealt his rights to the New York Giants.

The Titans had their hands at one point or another on 17 selections in the 2016 draft due to five different trades (including one trade in 2015), and in the end, they ended up with a class of 10 players, including four of the top 45 picks. Robinson swung a draft-day trade with the Cleveland Browns to move back up to the eighth slot to choose Michigan State tackle **Jack Conklin**.

All 10 members of Robinson's first draft class played in at least one game in 2016. They accumulated a total of 110 games played and 38 starts, including 16 starts at right tackle by Conklin. The eighth-overall pick capped his successful rookie campaign by being named first-team All-Pro by Associated Press.

Henry, a second-rounder in 2016, led the Titans in rushing every season from 2017 through 2019. In 2019, he won the NFL's rushing crown with 1,540 yards and tied for the NFL lead with 16 rushing touchdowns.

Third-round safety **Kevin Byard** earned first-team All-Pro honors in his second campaign. He led the NFL from 2017–2019 with 17 total interceptions also was named to the Pro Bowl in 2017.

**PRIOR HISTORY:** Robinson arrived in Tennessee with a wide range of experience from working his way up on the personnel side of the NFL. From 2014–2015, he served as director of player personnel for the Buccaneers and oversaw both college and pro departments as the team rebuilt its roster. The 2015 Buccaneers draft class made a significant impact, including four rookie starters: quarterback **Jameis Winston**, tackle **Donovan Smith**, guard **Ali Marpet** and linebacker **Kwon Alexander**.

Prior to joining Tampa Bay, Robinson spent 12 years with the New England Patriots, including his last five years (2009–13) as the director of college scouting. In the five years heading up their college scouting, the Patriots added a number of key components to their roster that won the Super Bowl in 2014, including wide receiver **Julian Edelman**, defensive back **Devin McCourty**, tight end **Rob Gronkowski**, tackle **Nate Solder** and defensive end **Chandler Jones**. He joined the Patriots as an area scout in 2002, a role he served for four seasons. Robinson then spent two years (2006–07) as a regional scout, before being promoted to assistant

director of college scouting in 2008 and then director of college scouting in 2009. In his time scouting for the Patriots the team won 10 division titles, four conference titles and two Super Bowls (2003, 2004).

Robinson played three years at Southeast Missouri State as a defensive lineman after starting his college career at the Air Force Academy. Following his college career as a player, he spent one season (1998) coaching at his alma mater and three years (1999–2001) coaching at Nicholls State.

A native of Union City, Tenn., Robinson and his wife, Jaimie, have two daughters, Taylor and Bailey.

## FOUR WINNING SEASONS

**Jon Robinson** constructed a roster that produced four consecutive winning seasons in Robinson's first four years on the job. The club went 9–7 in 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 with postseason berths following the 2017 and 2019 campaigns.

Robinson became only the second general manager in franchise history whose first four teams finished above the .500 mark, joining **Mike Holovak** (1989–92).

## FIRST-ROUND PICKS BY POSITION

Since the team's initial draft as a charter member of the American Football League in 1960, the Titans have made 56 first-round selections, using that pick on an offensive player 32 times and on defense 24 times.

On offense, running backs lead the list, having been chosen eight times in the first round, three of which were Heisman Trophy winners: **Billy Cannon** (1960), **Earl Campbell** (1978) and **Eddie George** (1996). The most recent was **Chris Johnson**, the 24th overall selection in 2008 who went on to rush for 1,228 yards as a rookie and eclipse 2,000 yards in his second season.

On the defensive side of the ball, linebackers have been selected the most—eight times—by the Titans in the first round. **Robert Brazile** (1975), **Lamar Lathon** (1990) and **Keith Bulluck** (2000) headline the linebackers chosen. Most recently, the Titans selected linebacker **Rashaan Evans** with their first-round pick in 2018.

During the franchise's "Titans era" (since 1999), Tennessee has chosen an offensive player with its initial pick 11 times and a defensive player 10 times (including second-round picks in years without a first-round selection).

Their 2019 first-round pick was defensive lineman **Jeffery Simmons**.

## ALL-TIME DRAFT PICKS BY POSITION

In 60 drafts in the history of the franchise, the team has drafted more offensive linemen than any other position. There have been a total of 193 tackles, guards and centers drafted, 78 more than the next highest drafted position, running back/fullback, which has had 115 players drafted by the Titans.

Below is a breakdown of the team's 817 all-time draft picks by position groups.

For the past 11 years, more defensive backs (cornerbacks and safeties) have been drafted into the NFL than any other position. Among the entire 256-member 2019 NFL draft class, there were 51 defensive backs selected, 11 more than the 40 offensive linemen chosen. The last time another position group out-numbered the defensive backs was 2006, when 50 offensive linemen were chosen, versus 49 corners/safeties.

## THE TITANS AND DRAFT TRADES

More often than not in recent history, the Titans' draft is altered by at least one trade. The 2007 and 2011 drafts were the only selection processes in the last 17 years in which the Titans did not deal or acquire picks via trade.

Heading into the 2020 NFL Draft, the Titans already have dealt two draft picks and acquired two draft picks in trades.

In 2019, general manager **Jon Robinson** made four total trades and one trade during the draft. In the fourth round, he traded up five spots (121st to 116th) with the New York Jets to take defensive back **Amani Hooker**. The deal also netted the Titans the fifth-round choice they used on outside linebacker **D'Andre Walker**.

Robinson has been more likely to trade in the first round than other recent Titans general managers. The team was not involved in a first-round trade from 2005 through 2015. Then, in Robinson's first year, the Titans made one of the biggest trades in franchise history. Originally the owners of the No. 1 pick, the Titans dealt the selection to the Los Angeles Rams along with a fourth-round pick (113th overall) and a sixth-rounder (177th overall). In exchange, the Titans received the 15th overall pick in the first round, two second-rounders (43rd and 45th overall), a third-rounder (76th overall) and first- and third-round picks in 2017.

In 2018, Robinson traded up three spots in the first round (25th to 22nd) in order to select linebacker **Rashaan Evans**.

## PICKS BY COLLEGE CONFERENCE

Since 1994, the first year of the current seven-round draft format, the Titans have picked 42 players from the Southeastern Conference, more than any other conference. The Big Ten is second on the list, having sent 34 players to the organization, followed by the Pacific 12 Conference (30; formerly the Pac-10) and the Atlantic Coast Conference (22).

In 2019, the Titans selected three players from the SEC, taking Mississippi State defensive lineman **Jeffery Simmons** in the first round, Ole Miss wide receiver **A.J. Brown** in the second round and Georgia outside linebacker **D'Andre Walker** in the fifth round. The remaining three players came from Conference USA (Charlotte guard **Nate Davis**, third round), the Big Ten (Iowa defensive back **Amani Hooker**) and the Big 12 (West Virginia linebacker **David Long Jr.**, sixth round).

## UNDRAFTED TALENT

At the conclusion of Round 7 of the draft, the Titans personnel department remains at work. At that point, general manager **Jon Robinson** and his staff along with head coach **Mike Vrabel** and his assistants begin the process of contacting undrafted players the team hopes to sign as free agents.

In 2019, the Titans signed 18 rookie free agents in the days following the draft. They finished the season with two of those players on the 53-man roster: defensive tackle **Isaiah Mack** and outside linebacker **Derick Roberson**. Another undrafted rookie, fullback **Khari Blasingame**, was originally signed by the Minnesota Vikings before joining the Titans later in the year.

When the Titans played the 2019 AFC Championship Game in Kansas City in January, a total of 18 undrafted players had a spot on the 53-man roster.

Three of the Titans' original undrafted free agents in 2019 ended their rookie seasons on the practice squad: defensive end **Amani Bledsoe**, tight end **Parker Hesse** and cornerback **Kareem Orr**.

The list of former undrafted free agents who were originally signed by the Titans and remain with the team also includes long snapper **Beau Brinkley** (2012), defensive back **Joshua Kalu** (2018), defensive end **Matt Dickerson** (2018) and wide receiver **Cameron Batson** (2018).

There are several more players with the Titans who were initially signed as undrafted free agents with other teams, including the following: punter **Brett Kern**, cornerback **Malcolm Butler**, wide receiver **Adam Humphries**, wide receiver **Kalif Raymond**, outside linebacker **Reggie Gilbert** and kicker **Greg Joseph**.

## 2019 TITANS DRAFT REVIEW

**DL JEFFERY SIMMONS** | 6-4, 305, Mississippi State  
1st round, 19th overall

**Rookie Season:** As a rookie, Simmons began the season on the reserve/non-football injury list. He eventually joined the active roster, appearing in nine games and producing 40 tackles, two sacks, two tackles for loss, 14 quarterback pressures and one pass defensed. He added four tackles, three quarterback pressures and a fumble recovery in three playoff contests.

**College:** During a three-year career as a defensive tackle at Mississippi State (2016-18), Simmons appeared in 38 contests with 28 starts. He finished his career ranked sixth in school history with 32.5 tackles for loss. He also tied for sixth in MSU annals with five forced fumbles and tied for fourth with three blocked kicks.

**WR A.J. BROWN** | 6-1, 226, Mississippi  
2nd round, 51st overall

**Rookie Season:** Brown led the Titans with 52 catches, 1,051 receiving yards and eight touchdown catches. He led the 2019 NFL rookie class in receiving yards, tied for the rookie lead in touchdown receptions, and ranked second among all NFL players in receiving average (20.2).

**College:** In three seasons at Ole Miss (2016-18), Brown became the program's all-time leading receiver with 2,984 yards. He ranked third in school history with 189 receptions and fifth all-time with 19 touchdowns.

**OL NATE DAVIS** | 6-3, 316, Charlotte  
3rd round, 82nd overall

**Rookie Season:** Davis played in 13 games with 12 starts at right guard. It was the highest number of starts at guard by a Titans rookie since Chance Warmack's 16 starts in 2013. He also started all three of the team's postseason games.

**College:** In four seasons at Charlotte (2015-18), Davis appeared in 41 career games with 37 starts. He started at guard from 2015-17 before switching to right tackle for his senior season in 2018.

**DB AMANI HOOKER** | 5-11, 210, Iowa  
4th round, 116th overall

**Rookie Season:** Hooker played in all 16 games during the regular season and in all three playoff contests. He was used on defense in various sub-packages and ranked third on the team with eight special teams tackles.

**College:** During a three-year career at Iowa (2016-18), Hooker played in 36 games with 19 starts and totaled six interceptions. As a junior, he was selected second-team All-America by The Associated Press and USA Today. He recorded four interceptions in 2018.



**OLB D'ANDRE WALKER** | 6-2, 251, Georgia  
5th round, 168th overall

**Rookie Season:** Walker spent his entire rookie season on injured reserve. **College:** During a four-year career at Georgia (2015-18), Walker appeared in 54 games (13 starts). His career totals included 113 tackles, 13.5 sacks, 27.5 tackles for loss, four passes defensed, five forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and two blocked punts. As a senior, he established a career high with a team-best 7.5 sacks.

**LB DAVID LONG JR.** | 5-11, 227, West Virginia  
6th round, 188th overall

**Rookie Season:** Long appeared in 14 games and totaled 15 tackles, two tackles for loss, one pass defensed, one forced fumble and two special teams tackles. In three playoff contests (one start), he contributed 16 tackles, two tackles for loss and one special teams tackle.

**College:** During a three-year career at West Virginia (2016-18), Long played in 34 games with 31 starts. His totals included 252 tackles, 14 sacks and 40 career tackles for loss, which tied for third place on West Virginia's all-time list. In 2018, he was named Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year by the coaches and Associated Press. He garnered second-team All-America honors from the Associated Press.

**Mike Vrabel** enters his third season as head coach in 2020. He was named to the position on Jan. 20, 2018, becoming the 19th head coach in franchise history.

In Vrabel's first two years, he directed the Titans to a 20-15 record, including a 2-1 mark in the 2019 playoffs. His 20 wins made up the second-highest total in franchise history for a head coach's first two seasons, behind only **Jack Pardee's** 21 wins from 1990–1991.

Vrabel became the first head coach in the organization's history to win multiple playoff games within his first two seasons. The Titans won a pair of road games—at New England in the wild card round and at Baltimore in the divisional round—to advance to the 2019 AFC championship game, falling at Kansas City to the eventual Super Bowl champion Chiefs.

The Titans began the 2019 campaign with two wins in their first six games but rallied to win seven of their final 10 games in the regular season. From the time the NFL went to its current playoff format in 1990 through 2019, 345 teams went 2-4 or worse in their first six games of a season. From that group, the Titans became only the third team to advance to a conference championship game, joining the 2002 Titans (2-4) and the 1996 Jacksonville Jaguars (2-4).

The 2019 Titans ranked in the NFL's top 10 in scoring margin (eighth, +71), turnover margin (sixth, +6), offensive yards per play (fourth, 6.12), rushing offense (third, 138.9 yards per game), red zone efficiency (first, 75.6 percent), total touchdowns (tied for third, 54) and third-down defense (eighth, 36.3 percent).

From 2018–2019, Vrabel's Titans were the second-least penalized NFL team (181). Over the same period of time, they were the fourth-best rushing offense (129.2 yards per game), the fifth-best scoring defense (19.8

points allowed per game) and the seventh-best third-down defense (36.4 percent).

In his first season as head coach, Vrabel directed the Titans to a 9-7 record. His nine wins tied for the fourth-highest total in franchise history by a first-year head coach.

With only 82 penalties enforced against the Titans in 2018, Vrabel's team led the NFL and set a franchise record (16-game season) for fewest penalties in a season. The 2018 Titans also placed third in points allowed (18.9 per game), eighth in total defense (333.4 yards per game), sixth in passing defense (216.9), second in red zone defense (44.7 percent touchdown rate) and seventh in rushing offense (126.4) in the league rankings.

Vrabel arrived in Tennessee with 18 years of NFL experience, including four seasons as a coach and 14 seasons as a player. His distinguished playing career included three Super Bowl wins (2001, 2003 and 2004), one Pro Bowl selection (2007) and an All-Pro honor (2007). Vrabel played in 206 NFL games and totaled 57 sacks, 496 tackles, 11 interceptions, 20 forced fumbles, nine fumble recoveries and 10 touchdown receptions. Additionally, his teams advanced to the playoffs eight times (20 postseason games), with Vrabel recording eight postseason sacks and two postseason touchdown receptions.

Vrabel joined the Titans after four seasons with the Houston Texans, spending the first three seasons (2014–16) coaching linebackers and one year (2017) as the team's defensive coordinator. During his time in Houston, the Texans built one of the best defenses in the NFL and experienced tremendous success as a team – earning two division titles (2015, 2016).

Between 2014–16, the Texans defense ranked third in the NFL in yards allowed per game (319.9) and net passing yards (218.4). Houston also ranked first in third-down defense (33.6), fourth in opponent completion percentage (59.5) and sixth in points allowed per game (19.8). The 2016 defense ranked number one in the NFL, for the first time in franchise history, in yards allowed (301.3).

In 2017, his first year as a defensive coordinator, the Texans finished the campaign with 19 players on injured reserve. Despite the injuries, Vrabel led the defense to the fifth-best third-down percentage in the NFL and a franchise-record 3.97 yards per carry by opponents. Houston also

## VRABEL LEADS TITANS TO AFC TITLE GAME

Titans head coach **Mike Vrabel** became the franchise's sixth head coach in franchise annals to have the team in the playoffs within his first two full seasons.

Vrabel is the fourth head coach in Titans/Oilers history to win at least one playoff game in his first two full seasons, joining **Mike Mularkey** (2017 playoff victory), **Jack Pardee** (1991) and **Lou Rymkus** (1960 and 1961). ## 20 WINS IN FIRST TWO YEARS

**Mike Vrabel** won nine games as a rookie head coach in 2018. Of the 19 head coaches in the organization's history, beginning in 1960, Vrabel became the eighth to reach nine wins in his first full season as head coach.

Then, in 2019, Vrabel's team again went 9-7 in the regular season. The club earned a wild card playoff berth and won two postseason games before falling in the AFC title game.

Including regular season and postseason games, Vrabel's 20 wins from 2018-2019 give him the second-highest total in franchise history for a head coach's first two seasons (not including interim seasons). Only **Jack Pardee**'s 21 wins from 1990-1991 rank better than Vrabel's total.



April 17	Deadline for Restricted Free Agents to sign offer sheets.
April 20	First day in which the nine-week offseason workout program can begin. Clubs that hired a new head coach after the end of the 2019 season may begin the Virtual Period for three consecutive weeks, plus a voluntary veteran minicamp, for a total of four weeks. All other Clubs may begin the Virtual Period for three consecutive weeks.
April 23-25	2020 NFL Draft
April 27	No Club may begin the Virtual Period after this date.
May 15	Virtual Period ends for all Clubs, unless it has already been discontinued as the result of the reopening of all NFL Club facilities.
May 14-16	NFLPA Rookie Premiere (in-person or virtual).
May 18	Each Club may elect to continue its offseason workout program beginning on May 18, either under a virtual format or under an on-field format, depending upon conditions. The Virtual Period will end and the On-Field Period will begin for all Clubs at any point during the offseason workout program when all NFL Club facilities have reopened.
June 26	All offseason workout programs end for all Clubs.
May 19-20	Spring League Meeting, Marina Del Ray, California.
July 15	At 3 p.m. CT, deadline for any club that designated a Franchise Player to sign such player to a multiyear contract or extension. After this date, the player may sign only a one-year contract with his prior club for the 2020 season, and such contract cannot be extended until after the club's last regular season game.
Mid-July	Clubs are permitted to open preseason training camp for rookies beginning seven days prior to the club's earliest permissible mandatory reporting date for veteran players. Veteran players other than quarterbacks or "injured players" may report to a club's preseason training camp no earlier than 15 days prior to the club's first scheduled preseason game or July 15, whichever is later. Veteran quarterbacks and injured players may be required to report to the club's preseason training camp no earlier than five days immediately prior to the mandatory reporting date for all other veteran players, provided the club has already opened (or simultaneously opens) its official preseason training camp for all rookies and first-year players. A three-day acclimation period will apply to players who are on a club's roster up to and including the mandatory veteran reporting date. Players who rejoin the roster after that date may practice (including wearing pads) and play immediately after passing a physical.

September 5	Prior to 3:00 p.m. CT, clubs must reduce rosters to the league-mandated maximum of players on the Active/Inactive List. Simultaneously with the cut-down, clubs that have players in the categories of Active/Physically Unable to Perform or Active/Non-Football Injury or Illness must select one of the following options: place player on Reserve/Physically Unable to Perform or Reserve/Non-Football Injury or Illness, whichever is applicable; request waivers; terminate contract; trade contract; or continue to count the player on the Active List.
September 6	Clubs may establish a practice squad.
September 10-14	NFL Kickoff Weekend.

## 2020 OPPONENTS DETERMINED

The Titans know the 16 opponents they will face during the 2020 regular season.

As always, the Titans have home and road games against each of the AFC South rival Houston Texans, Indianapolis Colts and Jacksonville Jaguars.

Based upon the NFL's schedule rotation, the Titans also will face every team from the AFC North. They will host the Cleveland Browns and Pittsburgh Steelers and travel to meet the Baltimore Ravens and Cincinnati Bengals.

Additionally, the Titans will square off against the NFC North. They will have dates at Nissan Stadium against the Chicago Bears and Detroit Lions and road games versus the Green Bay Packers and Minnesota Vikings. It will be their first appearance at Minnesota's U.S. Bank Stadium.

Every team plays two intraconference games that are determined by order of finish within its division, and those matchups are set as well. The Titans finished second in the AFC South, resulting in a 2020 home matchup with the AFC East's equivalent finisher, the second-place Buffalo Bills. The Titans will go on the road to meet the AFC West's equivalent finisher from 2019, the Denver Broncos.
