

VANCOUVER WHITECAPS FC | VANCOUVER FC | TSS ROVERS



The 2023 season opened with the **first-ever Derby** between Pacific and Vancouver at

Starlight Stadium on April 15th.

PFC came away with a 1-0 victory to silence the large group of away supporters and send the rest of the stadium into a frenzy.

The Tridents would forever hold the upper hand over their new rivals by being "forever first" in this new Derby.

We also met Burnaby's semi-pro Leaguel BC team TSS Rovers in the Canadian Championship quarter-finals at Starlight.

A 2-0 victory for Pacific meant it was another All-BC clash when **Vancouver Whitecaps FC** came to the Island for the second time ever.

Although PFC was unable to best their MLS opponents for a second time – having beaten the 'Caps 4–3 in 2021 – the match provided another example of the **incredible progress soccer in British Columbia** has experienced in just the last five years.







### NORTH LANGFORD

TURF UNVEILING





In July, Pacific FC took part in the launch of an artificial turf field in North Langford hosted by Sooke School District 62 and the City of Langford. Pacific players joined members of the Royal Bay Soccer Academy to test out the new pitch that boasts some of the best views in Langford.


In keeping with the City of Langford's commitment to a adaptive reuse, the turf was sourced from BC Place in Vancouver and lights that used to shine at Starlight Stadium. Youth teams can use the pitch year-round thanks to this community access facility





### pacific fc YOUTH \* DEVELOPMENT

Pacific FC provides a vertically integrated program of training and competition opportunities from grass roots to professional, local to national.



### VANISLE VANIS VANI

### Van Isle Wave is the highest level of performance-based youth soccer on Vancouver Island.

With 10 teams in total, six boys and six girls' teams from U13 to U18, VI Wave serves over 200 young elite athletes across the Island.

On the boys' side, two VI Wave players - Sami Marvasti and Jack Garner - signed Development Contracts with Pacific FC meaning they could train alongside professional players while maintaining their eligibility with their youth team. In both the girls' and boys' sides, approximately 85% of our graduating players move into post-secondary soccer (and studies).



## ST. JOHN'S ACADEMY

Pacific FC and St. John's Academy, a Shawnigan Lake-based private school partnered to launch a youth soccer academy, complete with coaching by Pacific's Manager of Football and Player Development Jamar Dixon. The academy allows select students to dedicate a portion of their school day to intensive training alongside their studies, including tutelage from former Pacific captain Dixon.

The objective of St. John's Soccer Academy (SJSA) is to develop complete soccer players by focusing on specific fundamentals of the game such as team morale and culture, mental and physical aspects of the game, as well as technical and tactical awareness. – Jamar Dixon



## DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Over 250 children participate in the Trident Development Program, which provides young players supplemental training and development opportunities in addition to their club teams. The Trident Development Program also provides a clear pathway to joining Van Isle Wave for the elite players. Players in the program train with certified coaches, including Pacific FC coaches and players, and are driven by PFC philosophy and game model.

In addition to shaping the progress of over 450 young athletes in our programs, we couldn't do it without the dedication of our over 35 coaches in 3 locations. Their dedication to their players and to improving their craft provides inspiration and drive to all our programs.





The Island Training Centre offers space for countless different sports and camps inside its 55,000 square foot facility. Located in Langford, it is the largest indoor field house in British Columbia and houses Van Isle Wave teams, one of the Trident Development Program locations, as well as multiple camps and tournaments throughout the year.



Capable of also hosting parties and large-scale events, the ITC has quickly become a key part of the Langford and Lower Island sports and recreation community.








This year, Pacific FC took the school visits initiative to a new level. The Club tripled our visits to local schools to 43 player appearances at 10 different schools, as well as visits to soccer clubs, and local events.

Through the school visits, community-based program elementary and middle school aged children were able to meet their local sporting heroes up close, learn from these visible role models, and later come out to a PFC match with their family.

Pacific FC supports this important work.



PFC was welcomed by the WSÁNEĆ School Board, and the Tsartlip, Pauquachin, Tseycum, and Tsawout Nations onto their lands to celebrate the official opening at the ŁÁU, WELNEW Tribal School.



### Improving access to quality and inspiring spaces for play

Through this long-standing partnership between Pacific FC and the WSÁNEĆ School Board, the mini pitch project aims to provide a safe and nurturing environment for the WSÁNEĆ youth to experience growth and joy through soccer. At the unveiling, elders from the community spoke about the historical importance of soccer in their communities especially for its ability to support youth in moving through real hardships. There is a mutual belief that emerging Indigenous talent will be identified and realized on this new facility.

The WSÁNEĆ Mini-Pitch will stand for generations to come and demonstrates the power of a strong connection between grassroots activities and professional sport on the Island.



### **Promoting active living**





## ORANGE SHRT

Pacific FC, along with our fans and Indigenous groups from throughout the region marked Truth and Reconciliation Day on September 30. The pre-match ceremony on the pitch and activities in the stadium included representatives from local Indigenous nations and a moment of silence.

While fans wore orange to this significant match, Pacific FC players wore their kit designed by Coast Salish artist Maynard Johnny Jr. The black, white, and teal jersey was designed in the spirit of truth and reconciliation highlighting the work that continues to need to be done throughout the country.









## WOMEN IN SPORT

Pacific FC continues to promote **gender equity in sports.** The club hosted their second annual Women & Girls in Sport match in July. Olympians, Paralympians and local women from various sporting disciplines including rowing, swimming, basketball, triathlon and rugby were present to create a space where girls could hear about their athletic accomplishments and experiences in sport.

The match included a special ceremony at half time and the opportunity for fans to take photos and have autographs signed. The match was timed to align with the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup and was presented in partnership with local organization **Her Love of Sports**.





### December 1, 2023

Pacific FC hosted the penultimate match for Canada's top goal scorer Christine Sinclair at Starlight Stadium to a sold-out crowd. The teeming rain couldn't keep the fans away from celebrating the GOAT as she played in one of her last matches with the national team.

The VI Wave girls teams enjoyed a private once in a lifetime opportunity to attend a training session at Starlight Stadium and were addressed by the team's Head Coach Bev Priestman.

True professionals, Sinclair and her teammates spent more than 45 minutes post-match visiting with fans, predominately young girls, signing autographs and posing for photos. The 5-0 win over the FIFA darlings the Matildas from Down Under made for one of the most memorable nights at Starlight Stadium to date.

### HOLIDAY FOOD DRIVE

Pacific FC and City of Langford partnered on a Food Drive at the Canada Women's match in December to gather food for the Goldstream Food Bank. The rising cost of food has resulted in local food banks being hard hit with less donated food to serve families in need.











Pacific FC fans dipped into their wallets and the dunk tank to raise money for **Help Fill a Dream.** The organization was started by a BC Transit worker in 1986, to help families whose kids have been diagnosed with a serious medical condition.

Pacific FC fans contributed through a variety of activities including a dunk tank, balloon animals and 50/50 tickets. The funding provides financial support to families, as well as medical equipment, home and vehicle accessibility modifications, travel expenses and accommodation.





### Pacific FC joined our local Tim Hortons for the 25th anniversary of Smile Cookie Week.

During Smile Cookie Week, 100% of all proceeds from each Smile Cookie bought goes to local charities. In 2023, Pacific FC partnered with the historic Canadian chain's Westshore location and the Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island to raise funds for Jeneece Place, where children and their families can stay while receiving medical care in Victoria.

With the help of local volunteers, some Pacific FC players, the hard-working staff of Westshore Tim Hortons and the Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island, and of course the members of our community who bought Smile Cookies, our local Tim Hortons raised a record-breaking
