2024 DRAFT CLASS



Kamari Lassiter | CB | Georgia | RD 2 NO. 42 (from MIN)

Hometown: Savannah, Ga.

Height: 6-0

Weight: 180

Played three seasons at Georgia (2021-23), where he played in 44 games (30 starts) and recorded 86 tackles, 15 passes defended, 8.5 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack and one interception. Through his career with the Bulldogs, Lassiter allowed just 56 receptions on 108 targets for 726 yards and two touchdowns. According to PFF, he played 408 coverage snaps in 2023 and held opposing quarterbacks to a 48.7 passer rating when targeting him, while also not allowing a single touchdown in coverage. Lassiter was also named to the Coaches 2023 All-SEC Second Team.



Blake Fisher | T | Notre Dame | RD 2 NO. 59

Hometown: Avon, Ind.

Height: 6-6

Weight: 312

Played three seasons at Notre Dame (2021-2023) and started in all 27 games he appeared in. In 2023, Fisher was a part of one of the most prolific offenses in Notre Dame history, ranking second in school history in points per game (39.1). Fisher also helped pave the way for the Fighting Irish rushing attack, which recorded 2,414 yards (185.7 per game). Fisher was a member of the Joe Moore Award semifinalist offensive line in 2023.



Calen Bullock | S | USC | RD 3 NO. 78 (from PHI)

Hometown: Pasadena, Calif.

Height: 6-3

Weight: 190

In three seasons at USC, Bullock played in 38 games and tallied 149 tackles (96 solo), nine interceptions, and 24 passes defended. In 2023, he was named to the First-Team All-Pac-12 Conference, starting in 12 games and recording 61 tackles (42 solo), seven passes defended while tying for the team lead with two interceptions (one return TD). The season prior, he was a second-team All-Pac-12 Conference recipient after recording a career-best five interceptions.



Cade Stover | TE | Ohio State | RD 4 NO. 123 (from PHI)

Hometown: Mansfield, Ohio

Height: 6-4

Weight: 251

Played five seasons (2019-23) at Ohio State, where he transitioned from linebacker to tight end in his final three seasons and went on to record 82 catches for 1,058 yards, which ranks second in program history by a tight end. In 2023, he racked up 36 catches for 406 yards, which were the most by a Buckeye tight end since 1995. His 10 touchdowns are tied for third-most in school history. Stover was voted this past season as the Kwalick-Clark Big Ten Tight End of the Year, and was also named to the First-Team All-Big Ten Conference and was a finalist for the John Mackey Award.



Jamal Hill | LB | Oregon | RD 6 NO. 188 (from MIN)

Hometown: Rex, Ga.

Height: 6-0

Weight: 226

Played five seasons (2019-23) at Oregon, where he transitioned from safety to linebacker in his final season and played in all 14 games as senior, making seven starts. In 2023, Hill finished the year with 31 tackles, including five tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks and two forced fumbles. Additionally, he ended his career with the Ducks, totaling 145 tackles, five tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, two forced fumbles and two interceptions.

Jawhar Jordan | RB | Louisville | RD 6 NO. 205 (from DET)

Hometown: Chandler, Ariz.

Height: 5-10

Weight: 185

Played in 36 games (17 starts) in five seasons (2019-23) at Louisville, where he totaled 2,214 yards and 18 touchdowns. In his final season with the Cardinals in 2023, he led the team in rushing with 1,128 yards in addition to a career-high 13 touchdowns. Jordan became the first Louisville running back to break the 1,000 rushing yard mark since 2019, and his 13 scores finished ranked 22nd in the country. In 2023, he also finished second in the ACC in rushing yards (1,123).



Solomon Byrd | DE | USC | RD 7 NO. 238 (from NO)

Hometown: Palmdale, Calif.

Height: 6-3

Weight: 250

Spent three of his four years at the collegiate level playing at Wyoming before transferring to USC, where he spent the last two seasons and accumulated 77 tackles (48 solo), 10 sacks, 18.5 tackles for loss, two passes defended, five forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. In his time with Wyoming (2018-21), he played in a combined 23 games and registered 10.0 sacks.



Marcus Harris | DT | Auburn | RD 7 NO. 247

Hometown: Montgomery, Ala.

Height: 6-3

Weight: 295

Spent two seasons at Kansas (2019-20) and three seasons at Auburn (2021-23), where he recorded a total of 125 tackles, 31 tackles for loss, 11.0 sacks, four fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles and two passes defended. In 2023, Harris had his best season, recording 11 tackles for loss, 7.0 sacks, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.



LaDarius Henderson | G | Michigan | RD 7 NO. 249 (from DET)

Hometown: Waxahachie, Texas

Height: 6-4

Weight: 309

Spent the 2023 season with Michigan after spending the previous four years at Arizona State. Henderson played in 47 games (39 starts). In 2023, he appeared in 14 games with 10 starts at left tackle and also contributed on special teams to earn his first varsity letter at Michigan. Henderson was a First-Team All-Big 10 selection by the coaches and a Second-Team All-Big 10 selection by the media.

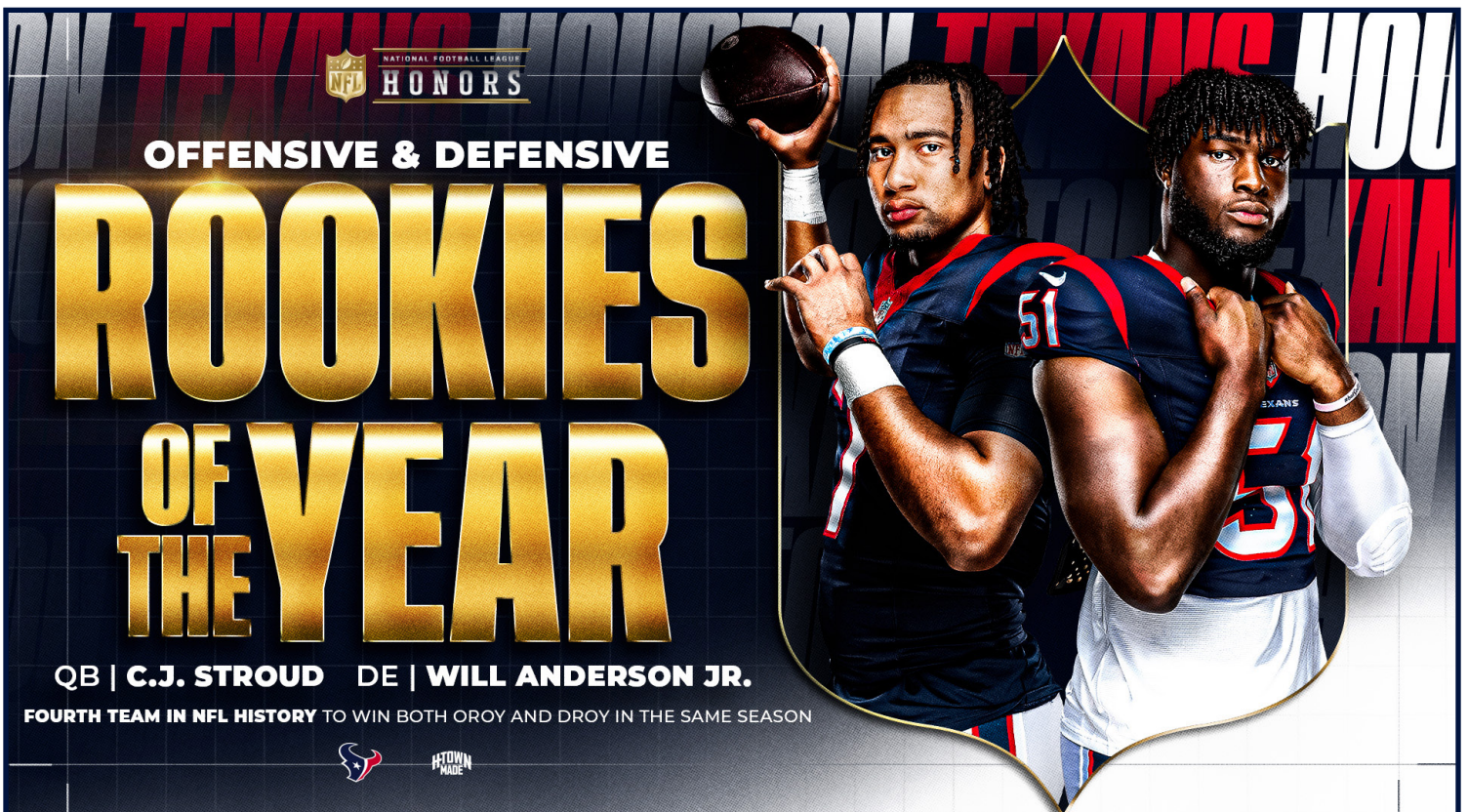
AP NFL OFFENSIVE AND DEFENSIVE ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

At the 2024 NFL Honors, QB **C.J. Stroud** won AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year and DE **Will Anderson Jr.** won AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, marking a Texans sweep of the top rookie awards.

Selected No. 2 overall in the 2023 NFL Draft, **Stroud** took the NFL by storm, starting in all 15 of his appearances and completing 319-of-499 pass attempts for a rookie franchise-record 4,108 yards, 23 touchdowns, five interceptions and a passer rating of 100.8, marking the third-best passer rating by a rookie in NFL history. His 4,108 passing yards rank third in NFL annals among rookie signal callers, while leading all rookies this past season in all major passing categories. Stroud finished the 2023 campaign with 4,557 total passing yards, including the postseason, which is the second-most ever by a rookie. He also began his career with a record 192 consecutive pass attempts without an interception, the most ever by a player to begin a career. Stroud led the league in passing yards per game (273.9), while also pacing the NFL in touchdown-interception ratio (4.60), becoming just the third player in NFL history to finish first in both categories, joining Joe Montana (1989) and Tom Brady (2007). Among his numerous record-setting performances was his 470-yard, five-touchdown performance in Week 9 that earned him his first of two AFC Offensive Player of the Week honors, as he also captured the award in Week 18 after clinching a playoff spot and division crown for the franchise's first time since 2019. Stroud also won NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month and AFC Player of the Month for November, becoming just the second rookie quarterback in league history to win AFC Offensive Player of the Month and just the fifth player ever to earn NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month in the same month.

Anderson Jr., the club's third overall selection and very next pick after Stroud this past April, started in 13 games, totaling 45 tackles including 10 tackles for loss, 67 pressures, 7.0 sacks, one pass defended and one blocked field goal. Anderson's 7.0 sacks this season set a new rookie franchise record for most sacks in a single-season and his 67 pressures led all rookies in the NFL this year. Anderson turned in arguably his best performance of the season in the Week 13 win against Denver, in which he racked up five tackles (three solo), 2.0 sacks, four quarterback hits, two tackles for loss and one pass defended. He also made his presence felt on special teams in Week 3 at Jacksonville when he blocked a field goal, becoming the first Texans rookie to block a field goal since J.J. Watt in 2011. Anderson also had a pair of sacks in Week 17 against Tennessee, and a six-tackle game in Week 5 at Atlanta.

Stroud and Anderson become the fourth teammate duo since 1967 to win both Offensive and Defensive Rookie of the Year in the same season, joining the 2022 New York Jets (WR Garrett Wilson, CB Sauce Gardner), the 2017 New Orleans Saints (RB Alvin Kamara, CB Marshon Lattimore) and the 1967 Detroit Lions (RB Mel Farr, CB Lem Barney).

ROOKIE NOTES TO KNOW

- The **Texans** become the fourth team since 1967 to win both Offensive and Defensive Rookie of the Year in the same season, joining the 2022 New York Jets (WR Garrett Wilson, CB Sauce Gardner), the 2017 New Orleans Saints (RB Alvin Kamara, CB Marshon Lattimore) and the 1967 Detroit Lions (RB Mel Farr, CB Lem Barney).
- QB **C.J. Stroud** led the league in passing yards per game (273.9), while also pacing the NFL in touchdown-interception ratio (4.60), joining Joe Montana (1989) and Tom Brady (2007) as the only three players in NFL history to finish first in both categories.
- Additionally, **Stroud** holds the NFL record most passing yards in a single game by a rookie quarterback (470 vs. Tampa Bay, 11/5), most passing touchdowns in a single game by a rookie quarterback (five) and most games with at least 350 passing yards by a rookie quarterback (three).
- **Stroud**, along with rookie WR **Tank Dell**, became just the sixth rookie quarterback-receiver duo in NFL history to connect for at least seven touchdowns since Indianapolis' Andrew Luck and T.Y. Hilton (2012).
- **Dell** owns the Texans franchise rookie record for touchdowns (seven) while his 149 receiving yards in Week 11 vs. Arizona (11/19) marks the most receiving yards in a single game by a rookie in Texans franchise history, surpassing Hall of Fame finalist Andre Johnson.
- **Dell** eclipsed the 100-yard receiving mark three times this season, tying Andre Johnson (2003) for the most such games by a rookie in franchise history, and the second-most by any rookie this season, trailing Rams WR Puka Nacua (7).
- DE **Will Anderson Jr.** became the first Texans rookie to block a field goal since J.J. Watt in 2011.

2023 DRAFT CLASS



C.J. Stroud | QB | Ohio State | RD 1 NO. 2

Hometown: Rancho Cucamonga, Calif.

Height: 6-3

Weight: 218

The No. 2 overall pick, Stroud finished the regular season completing 319-of-499 passes for 4,108 yards, 23 touchdowns, five interceptions and a passer rating of 100.8. Stroud's 4,108 passing yards are the third-most by a rookie quarterback in NFL history and his 23 touchdowns to five interceptions led the league in touchdown-interception ratio this season, crowning him as the youngest player in NFL history to lead the league in pass touchdown-interception ratio in a season.



Will Anderson Jr. | DE | Alabama | RD 1 NO. 3

Hometown: Hampton, Ga.

Height: 6-4

Weight: 243

A 2021 CFP National Champion and the No. 3 overall pick, Anderson Jr. finished the 2023 regular season with 45 tackles (29 solo), 10 tackles for loss, 7.0 sacks, 23 quarterback hits, one pass defended and one blocked field goal. At the conclusion of the 2023 season, Anderson ranked fourth among all rookie sack leaders, trailing only NT Kobie Turner (9.0), LB Byron Young (8.0) and LB Yaya Diaby (7.5) while his 67 pressures and 23 quarterback hits led all rookies in the NFL this year.



Juice Scruggs | C/G | Penn State | RD 2 NO. 62

Hometown: Ashtabula, Ohio

Height: 6-3

Weight: 310

Played five seasons (2018-22) at Penn State, where he played in 34 games with 26 starts. In 2022, Scruggs served as a team captain and started 13 games at center. He was selected to the 2022 All-Big Ten third team by coaches and tabbed as an All-Big Ten honorable mention by media. Scruggs started in six of the seven regular season games he played in, paving the way for RB **Devin Singletary** to rush for 100-plus yards rushing at Tennessee (12/17).



Tank Dell | WR | Houston | RD 3 NO. 69

Hometown: Daytona Beach, Fla.

Height: 5-10

Weight: 165

Despite finishing the 2023 season on injured reserve, Dell posted 47 receptions for 709 yards and seven touchdowns, while rushing 11 times for 51 yards. Dell's 149 receiving yards in Week 11 set a new single-season franchise record for most touchdown receptions by a rookie and broke the single game receiving yardage record by a Texans rookie, surpassing his own previous record of 145 yards in the Week 3 win at Jacksonville on 9/24/23. Along with rookie QB **C.J. Stroud**, the tandem becomes the sixth rookie quarterback-receiver duo in NFL history to connect for at least seven touchdowns since Indianapolis' Andrew Luck and T.Y. Hilton (2012).



Dylan Horton | DE | TCU | RD 4 NO. 109

Hometown: Frisco, Texas

Height: 6-4

Weight: 275

Spent three seasons (2020-22) at TCU, where he played in 35 games and recorded 108 total tackles (69 solo), 24.5 tackles for loss, 15.0 sacks, four passes defended and two forced fumbles. Horton finished the 2023 season with 13 tackles (eight solo), one tackle for loss, two quarterback hits and one fumble recovery after being placed on the reserve/non-football related illness list.

Henry To'oTo'o | LB | Alabama | RD 5 NO. 167

Hometown: Sacramento, Calif.

Height: 6-2

Weight: 228

A 2021 CFP National Champion, To'oTo'o tallied 61 tackles (32 solo), two tackles for loss, one quarterback hit, two passes defensed and one forced fumble in his rookie season with the Texans and finished third among all rookie linebackers in combined tackles (61).



Jarrett Patterson | C/G | Notre Dame | RD 6 NO. 201

Hometown: Laguna Hills, Calif.

Height: 6-4

Weight: 310

Played five seasons at Notre Dame (2018-2022) and started in 21 of the 24 career games he played in. While at Notre Dame, Patterson helped the Fighting Irish average 4.6 yards per carry, racking up 2,457 rushing yards and 25 touchdowns. Patterson started at center in seven games for the Texans, becoming the sixth Texans rookie to start at center in franchise history before being placed on injured reserve for the remainder of the 2023 season.



Xavier Hutchinson | WR | Iowa State | RD 6 NO. 205

Hometown: Jacksonville, Fla.

Height: 6-3

Weight: 205

A three-time first team All-Big 12 recipient, Hutchinson played in 37 games and recorded 254 receptions for 2,929 yards and 15 touchdowns at Iowa State. In 16 games played during the 2023 regular season, Hutchinson recorded eight receptions for 90 yards, while recording five rushing attempts for 49 yards.



Brandon Hill | S | Pittsburgh | RD 7 NO. 248

Hometown: Apopka, Fla.

Height: 5-11

Weight: 195

Played in 40 career games (27 starts) at Pittsburgh and recorded 175 total tackles (92 solo), including three tackles for loss. Additionally, Hill recorded nine passes defensed, three interceptions, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries through his four seasons at Pittsburgh (2019-22). Hill spent a majority of the 2023 season on the practice squad, and was elevated to the active roster once in Week 11 vs. Arizona. (11/19), where he played snaps at safety and on special teams.

TEXANS DRAFT NOTES

QUICK IMPACT

The Texans' 2023 draft class made their presence known on the field last season, as the rookie class played a combined 3,714 snaps and made 55 total starts on offense and defense.

QB C.J. STROUD (1ST ROUND, 2ND OVERALL)

Finished the regular season completing 319-of-499 passes for 4,108 yards, 23 touchdowns, five interceptions and a passer rating of 100.8 en route to being named the Associated Press Offensive Rookie of the Year. Stroud's 4,108 passing yards are the third-most by a rookie quarterback in NFL history and his 23 touchdowns to five interceptions led the league in touchdown-interception ratio this season, crowning him as the youngest player in NFL history to lead the league in pass touchdown-interception ratio in a season.

DE WILL ANDERSON JR. (1ST ROUND, 3RD OVERALL)

Joined his rookie teammate QB C.J. Stroud in winning the 2023 Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year after finishing the 2023 regular season with 45 tackles (29 solo), 10 tackles for loss, 7.0 sacks, 23 quarterback hits, one pass defended and one blocked field goal. He ranked fourth among all rookie sack leaders, trailing only NT Kobie Turner (9.0), LB Byron Young (8.0) and LB Yaya Diaby (7.5) while his 67 pressures and 23 quarterback hits led all rookies in the NFL this year.

WR TANK DELL (3RD ROUND, 69TH OVERALL)

Completed a promising rookie campaign with 47 receptions, 709 yards and seven touchdowns through 11 games played despite his season being cut short due to injury. Currently owns three of the five top performances by a first-year wideout in club history, including a 149-yard performance in the Week 11 win vs. Arizona, which was the most receiving yards in a single game by a Texans rookie.

LB HENRY TO'OTO'O (5TH ROUND, 167TH OVERALL)

Appeared in 15 games (6 starts) and tallied 61 tackles (32 solo), two tackles for loss, one quarterback hit, two passes defended and one forced fumble in his rookie season with the Texans and finished third among all rookie linebackers in combined tackles (61).

C/G JARRETT PATTERSON (6TH ROUND, 201ST OVERALL)

Started at center in seven games for the Texans, becoming the sixth Texans rookie to start at center in franchise history before being placed on injured reserve for the remainder of the 2023 season.

THE EIGHTH ROUND

The Texans have had success beyond the draft with college free agents, including various players on the current roster.

LS JON WEEKS (2010) - Played in every game since joining the Texans as a college free agent in 2010, holding the franchise record for the most games played and consecutive games played (227).

K KA'IMI FAIRBAIRN (2016) - Posted the most accurate season in Texans history (96.4 percent) in 2023, and currently the second-most points in franchise history (731) behind K Kris Brown.

LB JAKE HANSEN (2022) - Has appeared in 25 games (two starts), totaling 37 defensive tackles (23 solo), 1.0 sack, two tackles for loss, two quarterback hits, one fumble recovery, one forced fumble and four special teams tackles.

DL KURT HINISH (2022) - Appeared in all 17 regular season games (one start) and registered 22 tackles (11 solo), two tackles for loss, 0.5 sack, two quarterback hits and one pass defended. In his first two career postseason games, he tallied six combined tackles (four solo), 2.0 sacks, two tackles for loss and two quarterback hits.

BUILDING THE TEXANS

Following a historic 2023 season under Head Coach **DeMeco Ryans** which saw the Texans capture their seventh AFC South title in franchise history, the 2024 offseason has seen the franchise continue to embed their philosophy of aggressive, attacking football by adding at all three phases on offense, defense and special teams. Some of the notable free agent additions include four-time Pro Bowl DE **Danielle Hunter**, LB **Azeez Al-Shaair**, DE **Denico Autry**, CB **Jeff Okudah**, CB **CJ Henderson**, DT **Folorunso Fatukasi**, DT **Tim Settle**, S **Lonnie Johnson Jr.**, T **David Sharpe**, CB **Mike Ford** and P **Tommy Townsend**.

Houston also added Pro Bowl-caliber talent on offense via a pair of trades, first in acquiring RB **Joe Mixon** from Cincinnati. Mixon, who was the Bengals' lead back in each of his six seasons with the club, started all 17 games in 2023, finishing with his fourth 1,000 rushing yard season, tallying 1,034 yards and nine touchdowns. He is currently one of 14 active players with 5,000 career rushing yards.

The Texans further bolstered their offense by trading for All Pro WR **Stefon Diggs** at the beginning of April. Diggs, who spent the last four seasons with the Bills, is coming off his sixth consecutive 1,000 yard season and his fourth consecutive Pro Bowl nod. This past season, Diggs surpassed 800 career receptions, becoming the youngest player (30 years, 32 days) in NFL history to do so.

Additionally, Houston re-signed key contributors from the 2023 season, including TE **Dalton Schultz**, K **Ka'imi Fairbairn**, DE **Derek Barnett** and CB **Desmond King II**.

BEYOND THE FIRST & SECOND

RB JONATHAN WELLS (2002, 4TH ROUND, 99TH PICK)

Played in 60 games (18 starts) for the Texans from 2002-05. Ran for 1,167 yards and 10 touchdowns on 374 attempts (3.1 avg.). Caught 44 passes for 323 yards (7.3 avg.) and two touchdowns.

DB DEMARCUS FAGGINS (2002, 6TH ROUND, 173RD PICK)

Appeared in 82 games (36 starts) for the Texans from 2002-08, logging 191 total tackles (167 solo), 38 passes defended, five interceptions, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, 1.0 sack and 26 special teams tackles. Returned an interception 43 yards for a touchdown in 2004.

RB DOMANICK WILLIAMS (2003, 4TH ROUND, 101ST PICK)

Named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2003 after rushing for 1,031 yards. Went on to post back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons. Ranks second in team history with 3,195 career rushing yards and was named to the Pro Football Weekly All-Rookie Team. Played for the Texans from 2003-05 and started 36-of-40 games played.

WR JEROME MATHIS (2005, 4TH ROUND, 114TH PICK)

Named to the 2006 Pro Bowl and All-Pro Team after returning 54 kickoffs for 1,542 yards and two touchdowns in 12 games. Ranked second in the NFL with a 28.6 avg. and was named to the PFWA All-Rookie Team. Played for the Texans from 2005-07.

DB C.C. BROWN (2005, 6TH ROUND, 188TH PICK)

Started 47-of-50 games he played in for the Texans from 2005-08 and tallied 251 total tackles (193 solo), three interceptions, 16 passes defended, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and 1.0 sack.

OL ERIC WINSTON (2006, 3RD ROUND, 66TH PICK)

Started 87 consecutive games at right tackle from 2006-11 and helped the Texans offense to three consecutive top-five finishes from 2008-10.

TE OWEN DANIELS (2006, 4TH ROUND, 98TH PICK)

Had 385 receptions for 4,617 yards (12.0 avg.) and 29 touchdowns (2006-13). Elected to 2009 and 2013 Pro Bowl. Named to PFWA All-Rookie Team with 34 receptions for 352 yards (10.4 avg.) and five touchdowns.

WR JACOBY JONES (2007, 3RD ROUND, 73RD PICK)

Ranks first all-time in franchise history in punt return yards with 1,820 to go along with three touchdowns on 179 returns (10.2 avg.). Played in 75 games for the Texans, recording 127 catches for 1,741 yards (13.7 avg.) and 11 touchdowns from 2007-11.

LB ZAC DILES (2007, 7TH ROUND, 218TH PICK)

Played in 50 games (30 starts) from 2007-10 with Houston, compiling 212 total tackles (154 solo), 1.0 sack, an interception, five quarterback hits, 14 tackles for loss, three forced fumbles, a fumble recovery, three passes defended and 11 special teams tackles.

RB STEVE SLATON (2008, 3RD ROUND, 89TH PICK)

Set a team record as a rookie with 1,282 yards rushing and led the AFC in total yards from scrimmage with 1,659. Ranks sixth in team history in career rushing yards with 1,832. Played in 42 games (26 starts) for the Texans from 2008-2011.

DB GLOVER QUIN (2009, 4TH ROUND, 112TH PICK)

Notched 310 total tackles (248 solo), 47 passes defended, five interceptions, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and 14 tackles for loss in 63 games played (60 starts) with the Texans (2009-12). Also started all 16 games for three straight seasons (2010-12) for the team.

TE JAMES CASEY (2009, 5TH ROUND, 152ND PICK)

Appeared in 61 games (20 starts) and caught 66 passes for 752 yards (11.4 avg.) and four touchdowns (2009-12). Also had 28 special teams tackles.

DB BRICE MCCAIN (2009, 6TH ROUND, 152ND PICK)

Appeared in 72 games from 2009-13 and posted 105 total tackles (88 solo), 33 passes defended, five interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, and 19 special teams tackles.

DL EARL MITCHELL (2010, 3RD ROUND, 81ST PICK)

Played in 63 games (17 starts) from 2010-13. Recorded 134 total tackles (81 solo), 3.5 sacks, six quarterback hits, six tackles for loss, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and four passes defended.

TE GARRETT GRAHAM (2010, 4TH ROUND, 118TH PICK)

Registered 100 receptions for 1,059 yards (10.6 avg.) and 10 touchdowns in six seasons with the Texans (2010-15). Started 31-of-60 games played and tied for the team lead in receiving touchdowns with five in 2013.

QB T.J. YATES (2011, 5TH ROUND, 152ND PICK)

Led Houston to its first playoff appearance, first division crown and first postseason win in franchise history. Became the first rookie quarterback in 43 years to lead a team to back-to-back fourth-quarter wins and was the fourth fifth-round pick since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to win his first start. Has served three stints with the Texans (2011-13, 2015 and 2017) and appeared in 21 games (10 starts).

OL DEREK NEWTON (2011, 7TH ROUND, 214TH PICK)

Started in 68-of-82 games he played in from 2011-16, including a 56-game start streak from 2012-16, which marked the fifth-longest active streak in the league at the time. Blocked for four 1,000-yard rushers and played every position besides center along the offensive line.

OL BRANDON BROOKS (2012, 3RD ROUND, 76TH PICK)

Started 44-of-50 games played for the Texans at guard from 2012-15 and blocked for two 1,000-yard rushers.

OL BEN JONES (2012, 4TH ROUND, 99TH PICK)

Named Texans Rookie of the Year in 2012 after starting 10 games and playing in 16. Became a mainstay for the Texans on the offensive line and played in 64 consecutive games, including starting all 16 games in 2014 and 2015. Blocked for two 1,000-yard rushers. Spent the 2012-15 seasons with the Texans.

RB ALFRED BLUE (2014, 6TH ROUND, 181ST PICK)

Set the franchise record for carries in a game (36) and tied a rookie rushing record with 156 yards at Cleveland (11/16/14). Became the first player in franchise history with a rushing, receiving and return touchdown in the same season in 2014. Had 2,407 rushing yards and 10 total touchdowns for Houston from 2014-18.

FB JAY PROSCH (2014, 6TH ROUND, 211TH PICK)

Played in 63-of-64 possible games since getting drafted in 2014, including 13 starts. Blocked for two 1,000-yard rushers in four seasons. Also had 16 special teams tackles from 2014-17.

DB ANDRE HAL (2014, 7TH ROUND, 216TH PICK)

Played in 69 games (40 starts) and posted 180 total tackles (124 solo), 12 interceptions, 31 passes defended, six tackles for loss, two forced fumbles, two quarterback hits and 1.0 sack. Led the Texans with 12 interceptions from 2014-18.

DL CHRISTIAN COVINGTON (2015, 6TH ROUND, 216TH PICK)

Appeared in 50 games, including nine starts, after getting drafted in 2015. Registered 65 total tackles (39 solo), 7.5 sacks, 16 quarterback hits, 11 tackles for loss, one forced fumble and one pass defended from 2015-18.

DL D.J. READER (2016, 5TH ROUND, 166TH PICK)

Started 52-of-61 games from 2016-19 and compiled 154 total tackles, 6.5 sacks, 24 quarterback hits, 16 tackles for loss and one pass defended. Became the third rookie in franchise history to record a sack in the postseason in the 2016 Wild Card, joining LB Brooks Reed and DL J.J. Watt.

DB JUSTIN REID (2018, 3RD ROUND, 68TH PICK)

Played in 44 games (40 starts) and accumulated 240 total tackles (181 solo), 19 passes defended, nine tackles for loss, five interceptions, 2.0 sacks and six quarterback hits. Owns the second most total tackles by a defensive back in their first three seasons in franchise history and the seventh-most total tackles by a defensive back.

DE JONATHAN GREENARD (2020, 3RD ROUND, 90TH PICK)

Since his rookie season in 2020, his four seasons with the Texans saw him play in 48 games (32 starts), accumulating 23.0 sacks, 120 tackles, one interception TD, three forced fumbles and 41 quarterback hits. In 2023, he recorded a career-best 12.5 sacks, which was tied for 10th most in the NFL and also currently stands as the sixth most sacks in a season in franchise history.

QB DAVIS MILLS (2021 3RD ROUND, 67TH PICK)

As a rookie, played in 13 games (11 starts), completing 263-of-394 passes (66.8 percent) for 2,664 yards, the most by a rookie in Texans history. In two seasons, has played in 28 games (26 starts), completing 555-of-873 passes (63.6 percent) for 5,782 yards and 33 touchdowns.

DL ROY LOPEZ (2021 6TH ROUND, 195TH PICK)

Appeared in 33 games (29 starts) in his first two seasons, totaling 67 tackles (39 solo), 10 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, five quarterback hits, one pass defended, one fumble recovery and one safety.

LB CHRISTIAN HARRIS (2022 3RD ROUND, 75TH OVERALL)

As a rookie, appeared in 12 games (11 starts) and finished with 74 tackles (46 solo), six tackles for loss, 1.0 sack, three quarterback hits, one interception, five passes defended and one forced fumble. Made his first NFL start and had a team-high seven tackles (five solo) vs. Tennessee (10/30). Recorded his first career interception, returning it for 20 yards, and a career best two passes defended at Tennessee (12/24), becoming the fourth Texan rookie linebacker to record an interception.

RB DAMEON PIERCE (2022 4TH ROUND, 107TH OVERALL)

Started all 13 games he appeared in as a rookie, recording 220 carries for 939 yards (4.3 avg.) and four touchdowns, while catching 30 passes for 165 yards (5.5 avg.) and one touchdown. Finished the season with 1,104 scrimmage yards, which was the third-most in franchise history and the fifth-most among all rookies in the league.

WR TANK DELL (2023 3RD ROUND, 69TH PICK)

Played in 11 games (eight starts) during his rookie season, finishing with 47 receptions, 709 yards and seven touchdowns, which broke the franchise record for receiving touchdowns by a rookie. His 149 receiving yards in Week 11 vs. Arizona (11/19) marks the most receiving yards in a single game by a rookie in Texans franchise history, surpassing Hall of Fame inductee Andre Johnson. Dell eclipsed the 100-yard receiving mark three times this season, tying Andre Johnson (2003) for the most such games by a rookie in franchise history, and the second-most by any rookie this season, trailing Rams WR Puka Nacua (7).
