NOTABLE STORYLINES

The Browns return home to host the Cincinnati Bengals at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 1. The game will conclude a stretch of three AFC North divisional games in Cleveland's first four games. The Bengals lead the all-time series 48-39, but the Browns hold a 24-19 advantage in Cleveland. The teams will also meet in Week 12 at Cincinnati.

In conjunction with Alumni Weekend, DB **Bernie Parrish** (1959-66) and LB/FB **Tony Adamle** (1947-51, 54) will be inducted into the Cleveland Browns Legends program on Saturday. The pair will also be honored at halftime of Sunday's game. Parrish helped the Browns appear in 10 league title games and capture four NFL championships. He totaled 29 career interceptions and was selected to two Pro Bowls. Adamle helped the Browns to three AAFC championships and two NFL championships. He was selected to two Pro Bowls before working as a doctor in Northeast Ohio for more than 35 years. The Browns created the Cleveland Browns Legends program in 2001 to honor former players annually who have made a major impact on the organization.

Rookie QB **DeShone Kizer** threw for 242 yards with two touchdowns and added 44 rushing yards and a score at Indianapolis. He is leading the team this season and tied for the NFL lead among quarterbacks with two rushing touchdowns. Kizer's 646 passing yards are the second-most by a Browns rookie through their first three games.

Rookie TE **David Njoku** recorded two receptions for 12 yards and a touchdown at Indianapolis. He leads the team and is tied for first among all NFL rookies with two touchdown receptions. He is also tied for second among all NFL tight ends in touchdowns. Among all rookie tight ends this season, he is tied for first in touchdowns (two), third in receptions (seven) and third in yards (59).

RB **Duke Johnson Jr.** led the team in receptions (six) and receiving yards (81) and rushed for 23 yards, including his first touchdown of the season at Indianapolis. Among all NFL running backs since 2015, Johnson ranks second in receiving yards (1,208) and fourth in receptions (125).

OL **Joe Thomas** extended his snaps streak to 10,131, the longest active stretch in the league and believed to be the longest in NFL history. The 10-time Pro Bowler has started the past 163 games at left tackle, which is also the longest active streak in the NFL among offensive linemen and fourth-longest among all NFL players.

LB **Christian Kirksey** recorded five tackles, half of a sack and a fumble recovery at Indianapolis. He is leading the team with 1.5 sacks this season. Since 2016, he is fourth in the NFL in tackles.

Coaching capsules:

Cleveland -- Hue Jackson: 9-26, third season as head coach, second with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He enters his 31st year as a coach, including the last 17 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, helping his team advance to the postseason seven times over that span. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Cincinnati -- Marvin Lewis: 118-106-3, 15th season as head coach.

Marvin Lewis has led the Bengals to the postseason in six of the last eight years, including five straight from 2011-15. Lewis has 118 career victories, 54 more than any other Bengals' coach (Sam Wyche 64). In 2015, the Bengals won the AFC North title for the second time in three years, equaling the franchise record with 12 victories. Lewis was the consensus choice as NFL Coach of the Year in 2009, when the Bengals won the AFC North title while sweeping all six division games. Lewis was named the ninth head coach in Bengals history on January 14, 2003. In 2002, he was the Washington Redskins defensive coordinator and assistant head coach. He spent six seasons (1996-01) as defensive coordinator with the Baltimore Ravens, a tenure that included a Super Bowl victory in the 2000 season. Lewis also spent four seasons (1992-95) as the Pittsburgh Steelers linebackers coach.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Hall of Fame coach **Paul Brown** was the Browns' first head coach and general manager. He coached the Browns from 1946-62. Brown helped Cleveland capture four AAFC championships (1946-49) and three NFL titles (1950, 1954-55). He registered a 111-44-5 record in the NFL with the Browns. He later founded the Cincinnati Bengals and became their first head coach and general manager. Brown coached the Bengals from 1968-75 and recorded a 55-56-1 record.
- Head Coach **Hue Jackson** spent seven seasons (2004-06 and 2012-15) coaching in Cincinnati during two stints. Most recently, he was the Bengals offensive coordinator from 2014-15. He helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason in each of his last four years.
- OL **Kevin Zeitler** was originally selected by the Bengals in the first round (27th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft. He started 71 of 72 games for the Bengals from 2012-16.
- Defensive line coach **Clyde Simmons** played for the Bengals in 1998.
- Tight ends coach **Greg Seamon** spent 13 seasons (2003-15) with the Bengals in a variety of roles.
- Offensive line coach **Bob Wylie** served as the Bengals tight ends coach from 1997-98. Wylie also coached at the University of Cincinnati, serving as the Bearcats' offensive line coach in 1996.
- Sports scientist **Jamey Mroz** served as a strength and conditioning coaching assistant with the Bengals in 2015.
- Bengals DL coach **Jacob Burney** spent two seasons (1996-98) on the Browns coaching staff.

ON DECK

The Browns host the New York Jets at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 8. The Browns own a 12-11 advantage in the all-time regular season series, including an 8-7 mark at home. This marks the third consecutive season that the two clubs have met.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

WR Kenny Britt

Is 50 receiving yards away from reaching 5,000 for his career.

RB Isaiah Crowell

With 100 rushing yards, would record his sixth career 100-yard rushing game and tie him for first on the Browns' 100-yard rushing games list since 1999 (William Green, Peyton Hillis and Jamal Lewis).

His next rushing TD will mark the 20th of his career.

Is 69 receiving yards away from 700 for his career. The mark would also make him the first Browns running back since Kevin Mack (1985-88) to record at least 2,300 rushing yards and 700 receiving yards in his first four NFL seasons.

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

With 50 or more receiving yards, will have sole possession of second place among running backs since 2015 in games with 50-plus receiving yards (10).

QB DeShone Kizer

A rushing TD will make him the first quarterback to rush for at least three scores in the first four weeks of a season since 2012 when Robert Griffin III and Cam Newton accomplished the feat.

With 54 passing yards and 13 rushing yards, will be the first rookie quarterback to accrue 700 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in the first four games of his career since Griffin III and Andrew Luck in 2012.

A rushing TD and a passing TD will make him the first rookie quarterback to do so in at least three of his first four career games since Newton in 2011.

A rushing TD would give him three on the season, the most by a Browns QB since Derek Anderson had three in 2008.

TE David Njoku

A receiving TD will mark his third of the season and tie him for the most recorded by a Browns rookie tight end.

Could be the first Browns TE with a receiving TD in three consecutive games since Gary Barnidge in Weeks 3-6 in 2015.

OL Joe Thomas

Has started all 163 career games and has not missed an offensive snap since joining the Browns as the third overall selection of the 2007 draft. His consecutive snaps streak of 10,131 is the longest active stretch in the league and believed to be the longest in NFL history.

The Bengals topped the Browns 23-10 at FirstEnergy Stadium. The Bengals began the day with consecutive scoring drives. First, QB Andy Dalton mounted a six-play, 73-yard possession that culminated in a 14-yard TD pass to Bengals TE Tyler Eifert. Dalton then led a nine-play, 45-yard drive capped off by a 1-yard TD rush from Bengals RB Jeremy Hill. Bengals K Mike Nugent missed the PAT attempt leaving Cincinnati with an early 13-0 advantage. A little over midway through the second quarter, Dalton connected with Eifert on another TD pass – this time just a 5-yard strike – to help garner Cincinnati's 20-0 lead at the half. The Browns struck first in the third quarter when RB Isaiah Crowell jump started the Cleveland offense via a 42-yard rush off the right guard. Eight plays later, QB Robert Griffin III, who returned to the field for the first time after missing the previous 11 games with a shoulder injury, finished the 10-play, 80-yard drive by punching in a 1-yard TD rush that left the Browns trailing 20-7. To begin the fourth quarter, K Cody Parkey converted his only field goal attempt of the day from 30-yards out, leaving Cleveland's deficit at 20-10. The Browns were unable to keep chipping away as the final points of the day came from the foot of Nugent when he split the uprights on a 44-yard field goal.

WR Rashard Higgins - Played in two games with one start this season, tallying nine receptions for 105 yards...Led the team in receiving Week 2 with seven catches for 95 yards, both career highs...Was elevated to the team's active roster from the practice squad on Sept. 16... Selected by Cleveland in the fifth round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

LT Joe Thomas - 10-time Pro Bowl selection who has started at left tackle in all 163 career contests...Has not missed an offensive snap since being selected as the third overall pick in the 2007 NFL Draft (10,139).

LG Joel Bitonio - Started all 34 games he's appeared in since being drafted by the Browns in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft...Inked a five-year contract extension in March.

C JC Tretter - Started at center in every contest this season...Originally selected by the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round (122nd overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft... Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RG Kevin Zeitler - Started every game this year and has now started 74 of 75 career games...Originally drafted by the Cincinnati Bengals in the first round (27th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft...Joined the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RT Shon Coleman - Made all three starts this season... Selected by the Browns in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

TE Randall Telfer - Caught two passes for 24 yards this year... Selected by the Browns in the sixth round of the 2015 NFL Draft out of USC.

WR Kenny Britt - Recorded season highs in receptions (3), receiving yards (54) and TDs (1) against the Colts last week... Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017...Totaled 1,002 receiving yards last season.

QB DeShone Kizer - Completed 22 of 47 passes for 242 yards with two touchdowns in Week 3...Added 44 rushing yards and a rushing score...Leads the team in rushing TDs with two...Thrown for the second-most passing yards by a Browns rookie through their first three games (646)...Drafted by the Browns in the second round (52nd overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft.

RB Isaiah Crowell - Has rushed for a team-leading 114 yards on 39 carries this season...Became the fifth Browns player and second running back to surpass 3,000 scrimmage yards since 1999 against the Colts last week...Moved into ninth place on the Browns all-time rushing list against the Steelers in Week 1... Originally came to the Browns as an undrafted free agent out of Alabama State.

WILLIAMS NAMED D-COORDINATOR

Gregg Williams was named the Browns defensive coordinator on Jan. 7, 2017. Williams is in his 27th season in the NFL, including three as a head coach and 16 as a defensive coordinator. His defenses have finished in the top five in total defense five times, including the top defense in the NFL in 2000. Williams also oversaw a Saints defensive unit that won Super Bowl XLIV and a Titans defense that advanced to Super Bowl XXXIV. Williams spent the past three seasons (2014-16) as the defensive coordinator for the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams. In 2016, the Rams defense finished in the top 10 in the NFL in total defense and passing defense.

WILSON SPEARHEADS RUN GAME

Kirby Wilson was named the Browns running backs coach/run game coordinator in 2016. He has 19 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #12, Adrian Peterson #16 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1,000-yard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. In Wilson's first season in Cleveland, the Browns finished second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average. The average was the seventh-best in team history and the team's best mark since 1966.

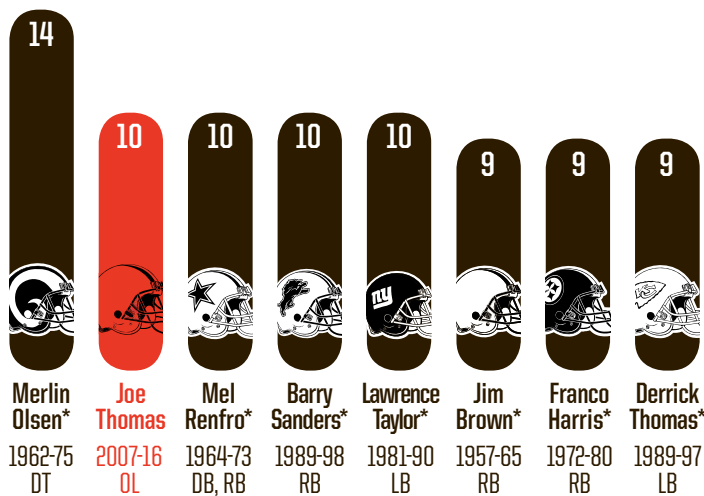

HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 30 years of coaching experience, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In his first year with Cleveland, he helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie. Third-round pick quarterback Cody Kessler registered the second-highest single-game passing yardage total by a Browns rookie with 336 in Week 6.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed

the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

The Hue Jackson Foundation

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. The foundation also focuses its efforts to further awareness, prevention and healing for victims of human trafficking. The foundation's website is www.huejackson.org.

FirstEnergy Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio

The Cleveland Browns dropped the 2017 season opener to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-18. Despite limiting the Steelers to 290 yards, two touchdown receptions by Steelers TE Jesse James proved to be the difference in the contest. On the game's opening possession, Pittsburgh forced a three-and-out and on fourth down, deep in Browns' territory, its special teams unit opened the scoring. LB Tyler Matakevich blocked Britton Colquitt's punt and Steelers LB Anthony Chickillo recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to give the Steelers an early 7-0 advantage. Later in the quarter, rookie QB DeShone Kizer led the team on a 12-play, 68-yard drive, which he capped off by sneaking into the end zone from a yard out to even the scoring. With 45 seconds left in the first half, Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found James in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard score to give Pittsburgh a 14-7 lead heading into the locker room. As Cleveland's defense forced a three-and-out on Pittsburgh's first possession of the second half, Kizer led the offense down the field and set up fellow rookie K Zane Gonzalez, who notched a 24-yard field goal to cut Pittsburgh's lead to 14-10. On the game's next possession, Roethlisberger marched the Steelers 75 yards down the field and connected with James again for his second touchdown reception on the afternoon to extend their lead to 21-10. Late in the fourth quarter, DB Derrick Kindred picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 30 yards to the Cleveland 31-yard line. Later in the quarter, on fourth-and-two from the 3-yard line, Kizer hit WR Corey Coleman at the goal line for a touchdown, the first touchdown pass of his career. RB Isaiah Crowell punched in a two-point conversion to cut the lead to 21-18, but Pittsburgh would not let Cleveland get the ball back as they sealed 21-18 victory.

M&T Bank Stadium, Baltimore, Md.

The Cleveland Browns dropped their second game as Baltimore's defense forced five turnovers in a 24-10 Ravens victory. Early in the first quarter, a strip-sack by Ravens LB Terrell Suggs gave Baltimore's offense a short field and a 4-yard TD run by RB Terrence West for a 7-0 lead. Midway through the second quarter, Ravens QB Joe Flacco led Baltimore on a six-play, 64-yard drive capped by a 4-yard TD strike to RB Javorious Allen, extending the lead to 14-0. Replacing injured QB DeShone Kizer, QB Kevin Hogan responded with a five-play, 83-yard drive. Hogan connected with rookie TE David Njoku for a 23-yard TD, the first TD pass of Hogan's career and the first TD reception of Njoku's, to cut the deficit, 14-7. Later in the second quarter, Ravens rookie LB Tyus Bowser intercepted a Hogan pass, resulting in a 27-yard return and a 2-yard TD pass from Flacco to WR Jeremy Maclin for a 21-7 Ravens lead at halftime. Midway through the third quarter, rookie K Zane Gonzalez connected on a 38-yard field goal to shrink Baltimore's lead, but Ravens K Justin Tucker converted a 28-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to make the score 24-10. On the game's next possession, Kizer marched the Browns 70 yards down the field before Ravens DB Lardarius Webb intercepted a Kizer pass in the end zone. Cleveland's offense wasn't able to muster any more points as Baltimore's defense sealed the 24-10 victory with a late fourth quarter stand. Early in the first quarter, OL Joe Thomas exceeded 10,000 straight snaps for his career, the longest-known streak in NFL history.

Lucas Oil Stadium, Indianapolis, Ind.

In a Week 3 road contest, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Indianapolis Colts, 31-28. Trailing 7-0 early in the second quarter, RB Duke Johnson Jr. avoided a couple would-be tacklers and leaped over the pylon for a 19-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 7-7. On the Colts' ensuing possession, QB Jacoby Brissett spun away from a defender and scampered into the end zone for a 7-yard touchdown to give the Colts a 14-7 advantage. After Browns P Britton Colquitt pinned Indianapolis inside its own 5-yard line, Brissett led the Colts on a five-play, 97-yard drive capped off by a 61-yard touchdown pass to WR T.Y. Hilton to extend their lead to 21-7. Indy would tack on its third score of the quarter as RB Frank Gore found the end zone from four yards out to give the Colts a 28-7 lead. With 44 seconds to play in the half, QB DeShone Kizer linked up with WR Jordan Leslie, who made a one-handed grab for a 26-yard gain down to the Colts' 2-yard line. Two plays later, Kizer found TE David Njoku in the back of the end zone for his second touchdown reception in as many games to cut Indy's lead to 28-14 at the half. After a scoreless third quarter, Colts K Adam Vinatieri notched a 33-yard field goal to extend their lead to 31-14. Later in the fourth, Kizer found WR Kenny Britt for an 11-yard touchdown to make it 31-21. Cleveland got the ball back with 4:05 to play and went on an 11-play, 70-yard drive in 2:01, capped off with a QB sneak by Kizer to cut the lead to 31-28. However, a final effort would see Colts S Malik Hooker intercept a Kizer pass with no time remaining to seal the victory, 31-28.
