NOTABLE STORYLINES

- The Browns hit the road for the first time since September 24 when they travel to Houston to face the Texans at 1:00 p.m. ET on Sunday, Oct. 15. The Texans own a 5-3 advantage in the all-time series.
- Last season, the Browns finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense. Through five games this year, the Browns rank fifth in total defense and fifth in rushing defense. The Browns haven't had a top-10 rushing defense since 1992 and a top-five defense since 1988.
- The Browns are tied for third in the NFL with 22 passing plays of 20-plus yards this season. Ten different players have hauled in passes of 20-plus yards.
- DL Myles Garrett recorded two sacks, including one on his first NFL play against the Jets. Garrett is the only No. 1 overall pick to record multiple sacks in his NFL debut and the first Browns player to record multiple sacks in his NFL debut since DL Charles Buchanan had 2.5 in 1988. Despite playing just one game, Garrett ranks tied for fourth among all NFL rookies with two sacks.
- Rookie TE **David Njoku** is leading all NFL rookies and is tied for first among all NFL tight ends with three receiving touchdowns. His three receiving scores lead the team and are tied for the most by a Browns rookie tight end.
- RB Duke Johnson Jr. has scored a touchdown in three consecutive games (two rushing, one receiving). He is leading the Browns this season with 23 receptions and 270 receiving yards. Among all NFL running backs since 2015, Johnson ranks second in receptions (137) and receiving yards (1,255).
- ₱ DB Jason McCourty is leading the team this season in interceptions (two) and passes defensed (seven) and is tied for the team lead with two forced fumbles. McCourty joins Pittsburgh LB Ryan Shazier and Detroit DB Glover Quin as the only NFL players with two interceptions and two forced fumbles this season.
- OL Joe Thomas extended his snaps streak to 10,262, the longest active stretch in the league and believed to be the longest in NFL history. The 10-time Pro Bowler has started the past 165 games at left tackle, which is also the longest active streak in the NFL among offensive linemen and fourth-longest among all NFL players.

Coaching capsules:

Cleveland – Hue Jackson: 9-28, third season as head coach, second with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He enters his 31st year as a coach, including the last 17 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, helping his team advance to the post-season seven times over that span. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Houston -- Bill O'Brien: 29-24, fourth season as a head coach.

Named the third head coach in Houston Texans franchise history on January 3, 2014, Bill O'Brien owns 25 years of collegiate and NFL coaching experience. In just three seasons at the helm in Houston, O'Brien has led the Texans to the playoffs twice, including each of the last two years (2015-16). Prior to Houston, O'Brien spent two years as the head coach of Penn State, leading the school through one of the greatest periods of strife any major college program has endured, garnering national and conference coach of the year awards in the process. In the five years prior to his tenure at Penn State, O'Brien spent five seasons (2007-11) with New England, where he helped the Patriots to a pair of Super Bowl appearances, first as an offensive assistant in 2007 and then again in 2011 as offensive coordinator. O'Brien began his coaching career at his alma mater, Brown University, where he coached tight ends in 1993 and inside linebackers in 1994.

ON DECK

The Browns host the Tennessee Titans at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 22. The Browns hold a 35-29 advantage in the all-time series. This will mark the fourth straight season the teams have met with Cleveland holding a 2-1 record during that span.



BROWNS TO PLAY IN LONDON **=**

The NFL selected the Cleveland Browns to host the Minnesota Vikings at Twickenham Stadium in Week 8 for one of league's 2017 London Games. The Browns-Vikings matchup is one of four regular season games scheduled in London this year, the most in league history, and Cleveland's firstever regular season game outside of the United States. Including 2017 contests, the NFL will have held 21 games in the UK since 2007 with 27 of the league's 32 teams playing at least once in either London or Mexico during that time. Through the league's commitment to growing the game internationally, all 32 teams are expected to participate in the NFL's International Series. From 2007-17, 12 different clubs will have hosted a game outside of the United States. Since the league first held multiple games in London in 2013, 22 teams have been scheduled for at least one game in London or Mexico, including all four AFC North clubs.

- Texans assistant strength and conditioning coach **Ian Jones** was an intern with the Browns last season.
- Texans college scout **Nathan Trott** served as an intern with the Browns during the summers of 2005 and 2006.
- DL Myles Garrett (Arlington), K Zane Gonzalez (Deer Park), S Derrick Kindred (San Antonio), WR Rashard Higgins (Dallas) and Emmnauel Ogbah (Houston) are all natives of Texas.
- OL **Spencer Drango** (Baylor), DL **Myles Garrett** (Texas A&M) and DB **Derrick Kindred** (TCU) played collegiately in the state of Texas.
- Texans football operations manager **Khalil Reed** was an events and operations summer intern for the Browns in 2006.
- Texans WR **Braxton Miller** is a Springfield native and attended Ohio State University.
- Texans defensive coordinator **Mike Vrabel** is a native of Akron and attended Ohio State University. He also coached at OSU from 2011-13.
- Defensive coordinator **Gregg Williams** was a graduate assistant at the University of Houston from 1988-89.
- \bullet Quarterbacks coach <code>David Lee</code> served as the head coach at the University of Texas El-Paso from 1989-93.
- Strength and conditioning assistant **Evan Marcus** held the same position at the University of Texas from 1995-97.
- Texans defensive assistant **Shane Bowen** was a defensive graduate assistant at Ohio State in 2012.
- Texans C Greg Mancz played at the University of Toledo (2011-14).

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

Browns Defense

A forced fumble by any defender will give the Browns defense seven on the season, tying the most ever recorded by a Browns defensive unit in its first six games of a single season (2001, 2003, and 2005).

RB Isaiah Crowell

With 100 rushing yards, would record his sixth career 100yard rushing game and tie him for first on the Browns' 100vard rushing games list since 1999 (William Green, Peyton Hillis and Jamal Lewis.)

His next rushing TD will mark the 20th of his career.

Is 55 receiving yards away from 700 for his career. The mark would also make him the first Browns running back since Kevin Mack (1985-88) to record at least 2,400 rushing yards and 700 receiving yards in his first four NFL seasons.

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

A score would mark his fourth consecutive game with a touchdown and would make him the first Brown to do so since Gary Barnidge in 2015.

Is 13 catches away from tying for No. 10 on the Browns' all-time receptions by a running back list with 150 (Dub Jones).

With 82 receiving yards, would become the first Browns running back to register at least 1,400 receiving yards and 800 rushing yards in his first three NFL seasons.

A reception of 25-plus yards would tie him for the most big-play receptions (4) ever recorded by a Browns running back in a single season (Himself, 2015-16; Jamel White, 2001).

TE David Njoku

A receiving TD would mark his fourth of the season and would be the most ever recorded by a Browns rookie tight end.

DL Myles Garrett

With two sacks, Garrett will be the first Browns player to record two or more sacks in back-to-back games since Jamir Miller in 2001.

OL Joe Thomas

Has started all 165 career games and has not missed an offensive snap since joining the Browns as the third overall selection of the 2007 draft. His consecutive snaps streak of 10,262 is the longest active stretch in the league and believed to be the longest in NFL history.

The Browns fell to the visiting Texans, 23-7. Houston got on the scoreboard first after QB Ryan Mallett completed a 2-yard touchdown pass to DE J.J. Watt at the 7:13 mark in the first quarter. On the ensuing drive, K Billy Cundiff missed a 38-yard field goal wide right. On the Texans' next drive, a Mallett pass to the end zone was intercepted by DB Joe Haden, marking Haden's first of the season and giving the Browns the ball back on their own 20-yard line. Cleveland tied the game less than four minutes into the second quarter after QB Brian Hoyer and WR Andrew Hawkins connected for a 32-yard touchdown. On their next possession, the Browns drove 51 yards in eight plays before LB Brian Cushing stripped RB Isaiah Crowell on the Houston 19-yard line. Watt recovered the fumble on the play, completing the defensive stop inside the Houston red zone. The Texans offense drove down the field and took back the lead after Mallett found TE Garrett Graham for a 20-yard touchdown with 28 seconds remaining in the first half. After missing his first attempt from 52 yards on the Texans' first drive of the second half, K Randy Bullock split the uprights from 46 yards with 5:16 to play in the third quarthe fourth quarter from 37 yards away. With 4:06 to play and the Browns down 20-7, DB Mike Mohamed intercepted a tipped Hoyer pass. The Texans took advantage of Cleveland's second turnover when Bullock added his third field goal of the game on a 50-yard attempt to lengthen Houston's lead to 16. After driving 44 yards and crossing into Houston territory on their final possession, the Browns turned the ball over on downs with 1:15 remaining in regulation.

- FB Danny Vitale Saw action in every game with one start this year...Registered three special teams tackles...Signed by the Browns off the Buccaneers' practice squad in Week 6...Originally a sixth-round draft pick by Tampa Bay in 2016 out of Northwestern.

Kirby Wilson was named the Browns running backs coach/ run game coordinator in 2016. He has 19 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #12, Adrian Peterson #16 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1.000-vard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. In Wilson's first season in Cleveland, the Browns finished second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average. The average was the seventh-best in team history and the team's best mark since 1966.



The Browns are focusing on education and youth football because children represent the future of our city. When the children of Northeast Ohio succeed and accomplish their goals on their way to becoming adults, everyone in the area, including the Browns, benefits and wins. The same goes for volunteerism, which is encouraged and amplified through First and Ten, not only locally but in the cities in which our fans and teammates live.







JOHN ADAMS STADIUM

On Friday, the Cleveland Browns, City of Cleveland and Cleveland Metropolitan School District hosted a field dedication ceremony at John Adams High School. It was the final field dedication ceremony for the two-year project made possible by Dee and Jimmy Haslam that provided high-quality synthetic turf to five CMSD sites. In 2017, John Adams High School and John Marshall High School received high-quality playing surfaces during the final stages of the two-year project. Announced in 2016, Roye Kidd Stadium, James F. Rhodes Stadium and Bump Taylor Stadium were renovated prior to the 2016 high school football season.

BROWNS PRO SHOP

Last week, the Browns announced multiple changes to the operations of the Browns Pro Shop at FirstEnergy Stadium, highlighted by the team's pledge to donate all of its net proceeds from items purchased in the store to support Browns Give Back's commitment to education and youth football. Beginning retroactively with transactions on April 1, 2017, 100 percent of the Browns' net proceeds from product sales at FirstEnergy Stadium's Pro Shop on gameday and throughout the year will benefit educational initiatives and additional neighborhood fields projects. The Browns will no longer individually profit from transactions made within the Pro Shop.

BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

The Cleveland Browns will honor National Breast Cancer Awareness Month throughout October, in partnership with the American Cancer Society. This year, the National Football League and the American Cancer Society are expanding their efforts to support the fight against cancer through the "Crucial Catch: Intercept Cancer" campaign. After nearly a decade of supporting breast cancer, the NFL and ACS have evolved the campaign to address early detection and risk reduction efforts for all cancers to increase their impact. The Browns elected to continue their commitment toward raising awareness and funds for breast cancer testing and research with the American Cancer Society. The team hosted its dedicated breast cancer awareness game during this Sunday's matchup against the New York Jets.

HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 30 years of coaching experience, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In his first year with Cleveland, he helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie. Third-round pick quarterback Cody Kessler registered the second-highest single-game passing yardage total by a Browns rookie with 336 in Week 6.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the post-season all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed

the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, , Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

The Hue Jackson Foundation

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. The foundation also focuses its efforts to further awareness, prevention and healing for victims of human trafficking. The foundation's website is www.huejackson.org.

The Cleveland Browns dropped the 2017 season opener to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-18. Despite limiting the Steelers to 290 yards, two touchdown receptions by Steelers TE Jesse James proved to be the difference in the contest. On the game's opening possession. Pittsburgh forced a three-and-out and on fourth down, deep in Browns territory, its special teams unit opened the scoring. LB Tyler Matakevich blocked Britton Colquitt's punt and Steelers LB Anthony Chickillo recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to give the Steelers an early 7-0 advantage. Later in the quarter, rookie QB DeShone Kizer led the team on a 12-play, 68-yard drive, which he capped off by sneaking into the end zone from a yard out to even the scoring. With 45 seconds left in the first half, Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found James in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard score to give Pittsburgh a 14-7 lead heading into the locker room. As Cleveland's defense forced a three-and-out on Pittsburgh's first possession of the second half, Kizer led the offense down the field and set up fellow rookie K Zane Gonzalez, who notched a 24-yard field goal to cut Pittsburgh's lead to 14-10. On the game's next possession, Roethlisberger marched the Steelers 75 yards down the field and connected with James again for his second touchdown reception on the afternoon to extend their lead to 21-10. Late in the fourth quarter, DB Derrick Kindred picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 30 yards to the Cleveland 31-yard line. Later in the quarter, on fourth-and-two from the 3-yard line, Kizer hit WR Corey Coleman at the goal line for a touchdown, the first touchdown pass of his career. RB Isaiah Crowell punched in a two-point conversion to cut the lead to 21-18, but Pittsburgh would not let Cleveland get the ball back as they sealed 21-18 victory.

The Cleveland Browns dropped their second game as Baltimore's defense forced five turnovers in a 24-10 Ravens victory. Early in the first quarter, a strip-sack by Ravens LB Terrell Suggs gave Baltimore's offense a short field and a 4-yard TD run by RB Terrence West for a 7-0 lead. Midway through the second quarter, Ravens QB Joe Flacco led Baltimore on a six-play, 64-yard drive capped by a 4-yard TD strike to RB Javorious Allen, extending the lead to 14-0. Replacing injured QB DeShone Kizer, QB Kevin Hogan responded with a five-play, 83-yard drive. Hogan connected with rookie TE David Njoku for a 23-yard TD, the first TD pass of Hogan's career and the first TD recep-tion of Njoku's, to cut the deficit, 14-7. Later in the second quarter, Ravens rookie LB Tyus Bowser intercepted a Hogan pass, resulting in a 27-yard return and a 2-yard TD pass from Flacco to WR Jeremy Maclin for a 21-7 Ravens lead at halftime. Midway through the third quarter, rookie K Zane Gonzalez connected on a 38-yard field goal to shrink Baltimore's lead, but Ravens K Justin Tucker converted a 28-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to make the score 24-10. On the game's next possession, Kizer marched the Browns 70 yards down the field before Ravens DB Lardarius Webb intercepted a Kizer pass in the end zone. Cleveland's offense wasn't able to muster any more points as Baltimore's defense sealed the 24-10 victory with a late fourth quarter stand. Early in the first quarter, OL Joe Thomas exceeded 10,000 straight snaps for his career, the longest-known streak in NFL history.

COLTS 31 **BROWNS 28**



Sept. 24, 2017

Lucas Oil Stadium, Indianapolis, Ind.

In a Week 3 road contest, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Indianapolis Colts, 31-28. Trailing 7-O early in the second quarter, RB Duke Johnson Jr. avoided a couple would-be tacklers and leaped over the pylon for a 19-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 7-7. On the Colts' ensuing possession, QB Jacoby Brissett spun away from a defender and scampered into the end zone for a 7-yard touchdown to give the Colts a 14-7 advantage. After Browns P Britton Colquitt pinned Indianapolis inside its own 5-yard line, Brissett led the Colts on a five-play, 97-yard drive capped off by a 61-yard touchdown pass to WR T.Y. Hilton to extend their lead to 21-7. Indy would tack on its third score of the quarter as RB Frank Gore found the end zone from four yards out to give the Colts a 28-7 lead. With 44 seconds to play in the half, QB DeShone Kizer linked up with WR Jordan Leslie, who made a one-handed grab for a 26-yard gain down to the Colts' 2-yard line. Two plays later, Kizer found TE David Njoku in the back of the end zone for his second touchdown reception in as many games to cut Indy's lead to 28-14 at the half. After a scoreless third quarter, Colts K Adam Vinatieri notched a 33-yard field goal to extend their lead to 31-14. Later in the fourth, Kizer found WR Kenny Britt for an 11-yard touchdown to make it 31-21. In the second quarter, Dalton connected with WR A.J. Green, TE Tyler Kroft and RB Giovani Bernard for a trio of touchdowns, giving the Bengals a 21-0 halftime lead. Cincinnati opened up the second half with a 41-yard field goal from K Randy Bullock to extend the lead to 24-0. Later in the quarter, Dalton led the Bengals on a 10play drive, ending in a second touchdown strike to Kroft. Despite outgaining the Jets 419-212, the Browns fell to New York, 17-14. On the game's opening possession, Browns rookie DL Myles Garrett, who was making his NFL debut, reached Jets OB Josh McCown to record the first sack of his career on his first NFL snap. Garrett would register another sack in the second quarter to become the first No. 1 overall pick to record multiple sacks in his NFL debut. Scoring opportunities plagued the Browns throughout the contest as the team had two red zone turnovers (one fumble and one interception) and two missed field goals. With time winding down in the first half, Jets K Chandler Catanzaro notched a 57-yard field goal to give New York a 3-0 lead at the half. To start the second half, Browns QB Kevin Hogan relieved rookie DeShone Kizer and led the team on a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped by a onehanded touchdown reception by rookie TE David Njoku to give the Browns a 7-3 advantage. Njoku's third touchdown reception of the year tied for the most by a Browns rookie tight end in a single season. Later in the quarter, McCown connected with TE Austin Seferian-Jenkins for a 2-yard score to regain the lead, 10-7. In the final frame, the Jets took over on downs and marched 97 yards down the field as McCown found WR Jermaine Kearse for a 24-yard touchdown to extend their lead as McCowin found would tack on another late score as Hogan dumped off a short pass to RB Duke Johnson Jr., who scampered 41 yards to the end zone, to cut New York's lead to 17-14. However, after recovering an onside kick, New York would kneel out the clock to secure the victory.
