
NOTABLE STORYLINES

- The Cleveland Browns will host the first of back-to-back home preseason games on Fri., Aug. 17, as the Buffalo Bills travel to FirstEnergy Stadium. The Browns hold a 8-4 all-time advantage over the Bills in exhibition play and the matchup will mark the first between the teams in the preseason since 2015. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m.
- Last week, the Browns opened the preseason with a 20-10 win over the New York Giants. QBs **Tyrod Taylor** and **Baker Mayfield** went a combined 16 of 25 for 311 yards and three touchdowns, while TE **David Njoku** led all scorers with two touchdowns. Rookie WR **Antonio Callaway** registered a game-high 87 receiving yards and a 54-yard score.
- This offseason, the Cleveland Browns bolstered their roster by adding multiple players through free agency and trades, along with nine selections in the 2018 NFL Draft. Of the veteran players added, two have been Pro Bowl selections (Taylor, WR Jarvis Landry), five appeared in the 2017 postseason (Taylor, LB Mychal Kendricks, DB E.J. Gaines, DB Terrance Mitchell, OL Chris Hubbard) and one is coming off of a Super Bowl victory (Kendricks).
- Last season, the Browns finished with the seventh-best run defense in the NFL, holding opponents to a 3.35 rushing average. The No. 7 rank was the club's best finish in the category since 1992.
- Offensively, the Browns have the second-best rushing average (4.67) in the NFL since 2016. Cleveland finished sixth in the league last season with a 4.46 rushing average.
- LB Joe Schobert finished second in the NFL in tackles (142) in 2017, earning a Pro Bowl selection. Schobert and LB Christian Kirksey were two of only three players in the NFL last year to play every defensive snap for their respective team. Kirksey finished the season tied for fourth in the NFL with 138 tackles.
- RB **Duke Johnson Jr.** led Cleveland on the receiving end in 2017. His 74 receptions for 693 yards were both team bests and were the most by a RB in club history. Johnson Jr. joined Herschel Walker as the only two NFL RBs to accrue at least 500 receiving yards in each of their first three seasons. Since coming into the league in 2015, Johnson Jr. leads all NFL RBs in scrimmage yards per touch (6.3), receiving yards (1,741) and receptions (188).
- DL **Myles Garrett**, the No. 1-overall selection of the 2017 draft, led Cleveland with seven sacks last year. Despite missing the first five games, Garrett's seven sacks were second best among all NFL rookies and were the third most by a Browns rookie in club history.

Hue Jackson: 9-39, fourth season as head coach, third with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on Jan. 13, 2016. He is in the midst of his 32nd year as a coach, including the last 18 in the NFL. He has spent 11 seasons coaching in the AFC North, helping his team advance to the postseason seven times over that span. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Sean McDermott: 9-7, second season as head coach of the Bills.

The Buffalo Bills named Sean McDermott the 20th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 11, 2017. McDermott joined the Bills after spending six seasons as the defensive coordinator of the Carolina Panthers. In his first year in Buffalo, McDermott led the Bills to their first playoff berth since 1999 with a 9-7 record. He became the third coach in Bills history to earn a playoff berth in his first season at the helm, joining Joe Collier (1966) and Wade Phillips (1998). The Bills finished seventh in the NFL in turnover differential (+9) and 10th in fewest penalties (98). The 2017 Bills also won six home games for the first time since 1999.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Browns QB **Tyrod Taylor** spent the previous three seasons as a member of the Bills, most recently leading the team to the 2017 AFC Wild Card. The playoff appearance was Buffalo's first in the last 17 seasons the longest playoff drought by an NFL team at the time.
- Browns defensive coordinator Gregg Williams served as head coach of the Bills from 2001-03.
- Browns DB **E.J. Gaines** was also a part of the 2017 Bills, starting in 11 games with 59 tackles, nine passes defensed, three forced fumbles and one interception.
- Bills S **Jordan Poyer** spent four seasons with Cleveland, logging 39 games played, 10 starts, 74 tackles, six passes defensed and two interceptions during his tenure.
- Browns OL JC Tretter hails from Akron, N.Y. and played collegiately at Cornell.
- Bills S **Micah Hyde** (Fostoria), DL **Adolphus Washington** (Cincinnati) and Hughes (Columbus) all hail from the state of Ohio.
- Buffalo RB **Chris Ivory** (Tiffin), Hughes (Cincinnati) and Washington (Ohio State) played their collegiate ball in the Buckeye State.
- Bills WR **Corey Coleman** was a first-round pick (15th overall) by the Browns in the 2016 NFL Draft.
- Bills offensive coordinator **Brian Daboll** served in the same capacity with the Browns from 2009-10.
- Bills S coach **Bobby Babich** was an assistant DBs coach for the Browns from 2013-15.
- Buffalo WR coach **Terry Robiskie** was the Browns' WR coach from 2001-03 and again from 2005-06. He was also Cleveland's offensive coordinator and interim head coach in 2004.

Aug. 20, 2015 FirstEnergy Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio



The Bills' two-point conversion inside the final two minutes of regulation vaulted Buffalo ahead of Cleveland, 11-10, as the Browns suffered their second loss of the preseason at FirstEnergy Stadium. The deciding points were scored after Bills QB EJ Manuel completed a 2-yard pass to RB Bronson Hill for the two-point play following a 14-yard Manuel TD pass to WR Andre Davis. The game opened with a scoreless quarter by both teams before Buffalo took the early lead in the second quarter after K Dan Carpenter kicked a 36-vard field goal at the 9:20 mark. Cleveland responded with a K Travis Coons field goal to tie the game, 3-3, from 41 yards. The Browns' field goal capped a 15-play drive with 28 seconds remaining in the first half. The Browns' longest drive of the night came in the fourth quarter, traveling 96 yards in 11 plays to take the lead, 10-3. The drive was led by QB Johnny Manziel, who completed six passes for 95 yards, including a 36-yard completion to WR Darius Jennings and a 21-yard TD pass to WR Shane Wynn. The Bills responded with the 12-play, 86-yard drive that ultimately decided the game. Cleveland was unable to mount a comeback with just 1:31 remaining in regulation. Jennings led all Browns' receivers with two catches for 40 yards, while RB Terrance West ran for a game-high 42 yards on 11 carries. Manziel led all passers with 118 yards through the air, completing 10 of his 18 attempts.

Browns QB Robert Griffin III led the Browns on an eight-play, 80-yard TD drive in the third quarter that brought the team within one score, 17-10, but the Buffalo Bills scored on three consecutive possessions in the second half to claim a 33-13 victory at Buffalo. RB Duke Johnson Jr., who joined Mike Pruitt. Greg Pruitt and Earnest Byner as the only Browns running backs to record 50 or more receptions in multiple seasons, led the team with five receptions and 62 receiving yards while adding 31 rushing yards (93 scrimmage yards). The Browns and Bills exchanged field goals to open the game's scoring, including a 35-yard conversion by K Cody Parkey. Buffalo recorded two touchdowns - a 3-yard rush by Bills RB Mike Gillislee and a 19-yard reception by TE Charles Clay from QB Tyrod Taylor - in the first half to hold a 17-10 lead at halftime. Cleveland forced Buffalo to punt on the second half's opening possession and responded with a touchdown drive, capped by an 18-yard run by Griffin. It marked the second TD run in as many games for Griffin, who became the first Browns quarterback to rush for a touchdown in back-to-back games since Charlie Frye in 2006. Parkey added a 40-yard FG in the third quarter, but the Bills registered two touchdowns and one FG three of their final four series to earn the win. DL/LB Emmanuel Ogbah posted one sack in the game to total a team-best 5.5 sacks on the season, while LB Demario Davis led the Browns with 10 tackles (eight solo).

Todd Haley was named offensive coordinator on Jan. 24, 2018. Haley spent the past 21 years coaching in the NFL, including the past six as the offensive coordinator of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Haley oversaw one of the top offensive units in the league during his time in Pittsburgh, which led the NFL with six offensive players being selected to the Pro Bowl in 2017.

Last year, Pittsburgh posted a 31:56 average time of possession for the league's fourth-best average and a 377.9 yards-per-game average, the NFL's third-best output.

Prior to leading one of the NFL's best offenses over the past six years, Haley had three seasons as the head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs. There, he helped the Chiefs win the AFC West Division title in 2010, when Kansas City led the NFL in rushing yards per game (164.3).

EXPERIENCE IS THE BEST TEACHER

Along with Haley, the Browns offense has added assistant coaches with decades of NFL experience. Quarterbacks coach **Ken Zampese** has joined Cleveland's staff for his 20th NFL season and like Haley, Zampese is familiar with the AFC North. Zampese has been either offensive coordinator or quarterbacks coach of the Cincinnati Bengals since 2003 and helped shape QBs Carson Palmer and Andy Dalton into two of the highest-rated statistical passers in Bengals history.

Moreover, running backs/associate head coach **Freddie Kitchens** spent the last 11 seasons with the Arizona Cardinals, having held coaching roles with the RBs, QBs and TEs.

SPECIAL FORCES UNIT

The Browns have also added experience to the special teams coaching staff, welcoming special teams coordinator Amos Jones. Jones, who most recently was special teams coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals for the past five seasons, is no stranger to the AFC North, having been on the Pittsburgh Steelers' staff from 2007-12. Under Jones' tutelage, two Cardinals special teamers were selected to Pro Bowls and K Chandler Catanzaro tied the NFL record for most consecutive made field goals to begin a career (17) in 2014. In his first season in the desert in 2013, Jones guided P Dave Zastudil to tie the NFL lead with 35 punts inside the 20-yard line. With the Steelers, Jones was a member of a staff that won Super Bowl XLIII, developed WR Antonio Brown into a Pro Bowl kick returner in 2011 and helped Pittsburgh lead the NFL with a franchise record of 1,581 return yards in 2009. Jones has a total of 37 years of coaching experience at the high school, college and professional levels.

DEFENDING THE LAND

In 2016, the Browns finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense. Last year, the Browns ranked 14th in total defense and seventh in rushing defense. The rushing defense mark that finished seventh best in the NFL was the highest mark by a Browns defense since 1992. Prior to the 2017 season, the highest the Browns finished in run defense since 1999 was in 2013 when the team finished 18th.

A FORCE UP FRONT

Browns defensive linemen collected 259 total stops last season, the fourth most in the NFL and the most by a Browns unit since 2012.

WILLIAMS REIGNS SUPREME

Defensive coordinator **Gregg Williams** spearheaded the turnaround of the Cleveland Browns defensive unit last year, aiding the development of 2017 first-round picks DL **Myles Garrett** and DB **Jabrill Peppers**. Garrett finished the year tied for second among rookie sack leaders (seven).

Second-year LB **Joe Schobert** finished second in the NFL with 144 tackles and earned his first career Pro Bowl selection in 2017. He and fellow LB **Christian Kirksey** were two of only three NFL players to play all defensive snaps for their respective teams.

The Browns' defense also finished second in the NFL in rushing yards per attempt, holding opponents to an average of 3.4 yards per touch. Cleveland's defense also finished top-10 in the league in opposing team's average yards per drive (27.8).

RUNNING THE FIELD

Since 2016, the Browns are second in the NFL with a 4.67 rushing average and finished 2017 sixth in the league with a 4.46 average.

HARD KNOCK LIFE

The Browns were selected to be featured on HBO's Hard Knocks documentary series in 2018. "Hard Knocks: Training Camp with the Cleveland Browns" is produced by HBO Sports and NFL Films and is a five-episode reality series that provides an allaccess look as the Browns go through training camp and the preseason. The Browns are the feature of the 13th edition of the award-winning series, which debuted in 2001 and has won 16 Sports Emmys. The series will run from Tuesday, Aug. 7 (10-11 p.m. ET/PT) through its Sept. 4 season finale.

BIG-TIME SECURITY

The Browns return with the a group of three players that each started all 16 games last season. OL **Joel Bitonio**, **JC Tretter** and **Kevin Zeitler** headline a front that helped the Browns offense rank sixth in rushing average (4.46). Since 2016, the Browns are second in the entire league in rushing average in such span (4.67). **Bitonio** enters his fifth NFL season, having spent his entire tenure in Cleveland.

AWAKENING THE SLEEPING GIANT

General Manager **John Dorsey** was named to his current position on Dec. 7, 2017, following Week 13 of the 2017 NFL season. Since then, Dorsey has enhanced the roster through free agency and trades, as well as taking advantage of the Browns' draft selections.

Dorsey also bolstered the roster off the field, headlined by the additions of Assistant General Manager Eliot Wolf and vice president of player personnel Alonzo Highsmith. Both Wolf and Highsmith's connection to Dorsey spans from the trio's time and experience with the Green Bay Packers. Dorsey was first hired by the Packers as a college scout, joining Hall of Famer Ron Wolf's staff, who is also the father of Eliot.

Dorsey served as general manager of the Kansas City Chiefs from 2013-16. During that time, Dorsey's teams earned three postseason berths and a 2016 AFC West title. The Chiefs also won at least nine games a year in that span and registered a 43-21 (.672) overall record, the NFL's fourth-highest winning percentage.

As the Chiefs' GM, Dorsey selected three players who went on to earn first team All-Pro honors and were also selected to multiple Pro Bowls, including TE Travis Kelce (third round, 2013), CB Marcus Peters (first round, 2015) and WR Tyreek Hill (fifth round, 2016). In 2017, he drafted RB Kareem Hunt (third round), who led the NFL in rushing during his rookie season and was selected to the Pro Bowl. The year prior in 2016, LB D.J. Alexander (sixth round, 2015) was also selected to the Pro Bowl.

APRIL SHOWERS BRING PRO BOWL FLOWERS

Dorsey's career success in the spring has been evident in the winter, as he's selected a rookie Pro Bowler in each NFL Draft since 2015.

OFFENSE

WR Jarvis Landry

- With 100 catches and 1,000 yards, Landry would stay par for his career course of averaging 100 catches and at least 1,000 yards per season.
- Can become the first receiver since 1992-93 (Sterling Sharpe) to lead the NFL in receptions in back-to-back seasons.
- With at least two catches per game in 2018, continues a career mark of never having a game without at least two receptions.

Taylor also threw for a 92.5 passer rating from 2015-17, the best in Buffalo's franchise history. Since entering the league in 2011, he's one of only four NFL QBs who have played five seasons or more and have reached a 90.0 passer rating or better (91.2), along with a rushing average of 5.0 or more (5.5). Only Aaron Rodgers, Russell Wilson and Alex Smith accompany Taylor.


TOUCHDOWN TYROD

Taylor is also one of only three active quarterbacks with 50 passing touchdowns and 10 rushing touchdowns since 2015, along with Cam Newton and Kirk Cousins. He and Newton are also the only two players in the NFL to register a minimum of 8,000 passing yards and 1,500 rushing yards in that span.

With a 62.4 completion percentage and a 5.6 rushing average since 2015, Taylor and just two other QBs (min. of 1,200 pass att.) have established a rushing average greater than 5.0 to go along with a 60.0-plus completion percentage.

Following Week 4 last year, Ogbah became the first Brown in franchise history to record at least two sacks, two pass breakups and two forced fumbles through the first four weeks of a single season. He also became the first NFL DL to do so since Osi Umenyiora in 2013 and just the 15th all time.

D.K. ALL DAY

DB **Derrick Kindred** has collected 99 total tackles and 10 tackles for loss in 26 career games. The marks rank him fifth and tied for first, respectively, among active DBs who have appeared 30 games or less.





HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 31 years of coaching experience, including the last 17 in the NFL. He has spent 11 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In 2017, the Browns defense made significant improvements in many categories. The Browns, who finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense in 2016, ranked 14th in total defense and seventh in rushing defense in 2017. Cleveland recorded its best finish in rush defense since 1992 and held opponents to a 3.35 rushing average. Joe Schobert become the first Browns linebacker named to the Pro Bowl in 16 years, as he was second in the NFL with 142 tackles. Defensive lineman Myles Garrett, the first overall pick of the 2017 NFL Draft, led the Browns with seven sacks, tied for second among all NFL rookies.

Offensively, running back Duke Johnson Jr. led the team in receptions (74) and receiving yards (693), while totaling seven touchdowns. He averaged 6.7 scrimmage yards per touch, third most in the NFL among running backs in 2017. Rookie tight end David Njoku led the Browns with four receiving touchdowns, the most ever by a Browns rookie tight end. Rookie quarterback DeShone Kizer recorded the second-most passing yards by a Browns rookie and third-most touchdown passes.

In his first year with Cleveland, Jackson helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to

the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/ assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems

in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. The foundation also focuses its efforts to further awareness, prevention and healing for victims of human trafficking.

On July 17, 2018, the Hue Jackson Foundation opened the Hue Jackson Foundation Survivors of Human Trafficking Residence. This residence is approximately 4,500 sq. ft. and provides a safe environment for up to 12 recovered adult survivors of human trafficking. It offers collaborative and holistic services, and provides shared office space for law enforcement, healthcare, and social services providers, to help assist these survivors on their road to recovery.





The Cleveland Browns defeated the New York Giants, 20-10, in their first preseason game of 2018. New York struck first in the game's opening possession with a 42-yard field goal by K Aldrick Rosas. The Browns answered as QB Tyrod Taylor led the Browns on a four-play, 66-yard drive, capped by a 46-yard touchdown pass to TE David Njoku. Later in the contest, Browns QB Baker Mayfield orchestrated a 14-play, 72-yard touchdown drive that ended with Njoku's second receiving score of the day. Down 13-3 to open the second half, the Giants converted a forced fumble on Browns punt return in the third quarter into a five-yard rushing touchdown from RB Jalen Simmons. Mayfield answered in the fourth quarter, connecting with WR Antonio Callaway on a 54-yard touchdown to extend Cleveland's lead by 10 points and solidify the victory.
