**EAGLES (0-2) vs. BROWNS (1-1)**
CAPACITY 67,431 | SURFACE GRASS**NOTABLE STORYLINES**

- On Thurs., Aug. 23, the Browns will host their second and final home preseason game of 2018, welcoming the reigning Super Bowl champion Philadelphia Eagles. The FOX Thursday Night Football broadcast will kick off at 8 p.m.
- Last week, the Browns rallied late, but lost 19-17 to the Buffalo Bills. The starting defense dominated the Bills' first-string offense, forcing three-and-outs on its four drives. Offensively, the Browns boosted their run game with 164 rushing yards and touchdowns from RBs **Carlos Hyde** and **Nick Chubb**.
- This offseason, the Cleveland Browns bolstered their roster by adding multiple players through free agency and trades, along with nine selections in the 2018 NFL Draft. Of the veteran players added, two have been Pro Bowl selections (QB **Tyrod Taylor**, WR **Jarvis Landry**), five appeared in the 2017 postseason (Taylor, LB **Mychal Kendricks**, DB **E.J. Gaines**, DB **Terrance Mitchell**, OL **Chris Hubbard**) and one is coming off of a Super Bowl victory (Kendricks).
- In 2017, the Browns finished with the seventh-best run defense in the NFL, holding opponents to a 3.35 rushing average. The No. 7 rank was the club's best finish in the category since 1992.
- Offensively, the Browns have the second-best rushing average (4.67) in the NFL since 2016. Cleveland finished sixth in the league last season with a 4.46 rushing average.
- LB **Joe Schobert** finished second in the NFL in tackles (142) in 2017, earning a Pro Bowl selection. Schobert and LB **Christian Kirksey** were two of only three players in the NFL last year to play every defensive snap for their respective team. Kirksey finished the season tied for fourth in the NFL with 138 tackles.
- RB **Duke Johnson Jr.** led Cleveland on the receiving end in 2017. His 74 receptions for 693 yards were both team bests and were the most by a RB in club history. Johnson Jr. joined Herschel Walker as the only two NFL RBs to accrue at least 500 receiving yards in each of their first three seasons. Since coming into the league in 2015, Johnson Jr. leads all NFL RBs in scrimmage yards per touch (6.3), receiving yards (1,741) and receptions (188).
- DL **Myles Garrett**, the No. 1-overall selection of the 2017 draft, led Cleveland with seven sacks last year. Despite missing the first five games, Garrett's seven sacks were second best among all NFL rookies and were the third most by a Browns rookie in club history.

Hue Jackson: 9-39, fourth season as head coach, third with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on Jan. 13, 2016. He's in the midst of his 32nd year as a coach, with the last 18 being in the NFL. He's spent 11 seasons coaching in the AFC North, helping his team advance to the postseason seven times in that span. Jackson was also head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He's also served as offensive coordinator with the Washington Redskins (2003), Atlanta Falcons (2007), Raiders (2010) and Cincinnati Bengals (2014-15). He spent 14 years coaching on the collegiate level and was a QB at Pacific from 1985-86.

Doug Pederson: 23-12, third season as head coach, third with the Eagles.

Doug Pederson was named head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles on January 18, 2016, following a three-year run as the Kansas City Chiefs' offensive coordinator. In just his second season as an NFL head coach, Pederson led the Eagles to a 13-3 record and the first Super Bowl title in franchise history with a 41-33 victory over the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LII. As a first-year head coach with the Eagles in 2016, Pederson helped develop rookie QB Carson Wentz.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Philadelphia Eagles head coach **Doug Pederson** was a QB for the Browns during the 2000 season, playing in 11 games and starting eight. Pederson completed 117 passes for 1,047 yards and two touchdowns.
- Browns LB **Mychal Kendricks** was a member of the Eagles' Super Bowl LII-winning team last year.
- Browns DL coach **Clyde Simmons** played his first eight seasons in the NFL with the Eagles and was drafted by Philadelphia in 1986. Simmons started every game on the defensive line for the Eagles from 1988-93.
- Browns QB coach **Ken Zampese** secured his first NFL job with the Eagles as an offensive assistant in 1998.
- Eagles defensive coordinator **Jim Schwartz's** first NFL job came as a college/pro scout for the Browns in 1993.
- Eagles S coach **Tim Hauck** was the Browns' DBs coach in 2012.
- Eagles LBs coach **Ken Flajole** coached the Browns' ILBs in 2016.
- Browns DL **Carl Nassib** is a Pennsylvania native (West Chester) and was an All-American for Penn State in 2015.
- Eagles C **Jason Kelce** (Cincinnati), OL **Brandon Brooks** (Miami), LB **Jordan Hicks** (Cincinnati) S **Malcolm Jenkins** (Ohio State) and P **Cameron Johnston** (Ohio State) all attended college in Ohio.
- Kelce also attended Cleveland Heights High School.
- Eagles DB coach **Cory Undlin** was an assistant coach for the Browns from 2005-08.
- Hicks was a three-year starter at Lakota West High School (Beckett Ridge, Ohio) and was Gatorade's Ohio High School Football Player of the Year in 2009.
- Eagles WR **Shelton Gibson** (Cleveland), Kelce (Cleveland Heights) and Hicks (Cincinnati) are all Ohio natives.
- Eagles WR **Bryce Treggs** and QB **Joe Callahan** both spent time with the Browns.

The Browns suffered their first defeat of the preseason follow a 27-10 loss to the Philadelphia Eagles in Cleveland Browns Stadium. The Eagles struck first as quarterback Nick Foles connected with tight end Brent Celek for a seven-yard touchdown with 4:27 remaining in the first quarter. The Eagles would extend their lead to 14 as Foles connected with running back Dion Lewis for a two-yard touchdown completion. The Eagles were set by for the score after linebacker Keenan Clayton blocked a Reggie Hodges punt and Curtis Marsh recovered it at the Cleveland three-yard line. Foles would then start the second quarter by leading his squad on a five-play 17-yard drive which resulted in an Alex Henery 41-yard field goal to give the Eagles a 17-0 advantage. The Browns got on the scoreboard following a 12-play 65-yard drive led by quarterback Brandon Weeden who completed four-of-seven passes for 40 yards. Phil Dawson converted a 33-yard field goal to make the score 17-3. The Eagles started the second half off with a 13-play drive which covered 77 yards and resulted in a four-yard touchdown pass from Trent Edwards to Brett Brackett to give the Eagles a 24-3 advantage. Edwards completed all five passes he attempted for 70 yards including three balls to Brackett for 49 yards. Colt McCoy would lead the Browns on their only touchdown drive of the evening after he drove the team 78 yards over 15 plays and connected with tight end Evan Moore for a three-yard touchdown. McCoy completed five-of-seven passes for 65 yards. Alex Henery would tack on a 28-yard field goal with 8:08 remaining in the contest to extend the Eagles lead to 27-10.

Despite trailing by just three points in the third quarter, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Eagles, 29-10, after Philadelphia pulled away late for the season-opening victory at Lincoln Financial Field. Eagles' rookie QB Carson Wentz got out to a fast start as he led a nine-play, 75-yard TD drive on their first possession of the game. Wentz connected with WR Jordan Matthews on a 19-yard TD pass to cap the drive and take a 7-0 lead. Cleveland's defense would bounce back including a sack from LB Christian Kirksey at the end of the first quarter. In the opening minutes of the second quarter, Eagles' K Caleb Sturgis converted a 22-yard field goal attempt to give Philadelphia a 10-0 advantage. The Browns responded on the ensuing possession, however, as QB Robert Griffin III found WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. along the sideline on a 44-yard pass play. Four plays later, RB Isaiah Crowell finished off the seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 2-yard TD rush that left Cleveland trailing 10-7. Sturgis split the uprights once more at the end of the second quarter on a 38-yard field goal attempt, giving the Eagles a 13-7 lead at the half. In the third quarter, the Browns cut into the lead on their first drive of the half as Griffin connected with rookie WR Corey Coleman on a 58-yard pass that would lead to K Patrick Murray capping off Cleveland's drive with a 35-yard field goal and cutting the lead to 13-10. However, the Browns' following possession ended with the Eagles defense forcing a safety to take a 15-10 advantage. Philadelphia capitalized and scored once more on their next possession when Wentz conducted a nine-play, 73-yard scoring drive that finished with a 35-yard TD pass to WR Nelson Agholor. The Browns defense closed the third quarter with rookie DL Carl Nassib registering his first NFL sack. The final points of the game came late in the fourth quarter as Eagles' RB Ryan Mathews punched in a 1-yard TD run with just over a minute remaining in the game.

**HALEY'S COMET**

Todd Haley was named offensive coordinator on Jan. 24, 2018. Haley spent the past 21 years coaching in the NFL, including the past six as the offensive coordinator of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Haley oversaw one of the top offensive units in the league during his time in Pittsburgh, which led the NFL with six offensive players being selected to the Pro Bowl in 2017.

Last year, Pittsburgh posted a 31:56 average time of possession for the league's fourth-best average and a 377.9 yards-per-game average, the NFL's third-best output.

Prior to leading one of the NFL's best offenses over the past six years, Haley had three seasons as the head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs. There, he helped the Chiefs win the AFC West Division title in 2010, when Kansas City led the NFL in rushing yards per game (164.3).

EXPERIENCE IS THE BEST TEACHER

Along with Haley, the Browns offense has added assistant coaches with decades of NFL experience. Quarterbacks coach **Ken Zampese** has joined Cleveland's staff for his 20th NFL season and like Haley, Zampese is familiar with the AFC North. Zampese has been either offensive coordinator or quarterbacks coach of the Cincinnati Bengals since 2003 and helped shape QBs Carson Palmer and Andy Dalton into two of the highest-rated statistical passers in Bengals history.

Moreover, running backs/associate head coach **Freddie Kitchens** spent the last 11 seasons with the Arizona Cardinals, having held coaching roles with the RBs, QBs and TEs.

SPECIAL FORCES UNIT

The Browns have also added experience to the special teams coaching staff, welcoming special teams coordinator **Amos Jones**. Jones, who most recently was special teams coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals for the past five seasons, is no stranger to the AFC North, having been on the Pittsburgh Steelers' staff from 2007-12. Under Jones' tutelage, two Cardinals special teamers were selected to Pro Bowls and K Chandler Catanzaro tied the NFL record for most consecutive made field goals to begin a career (17) in 2014. In his first season in the desert in 2013, Jones guided P Dave Zastudil to tie the NFL lead with 35 punts inside the 20-yard line. With the Steelers, Jones was a member of a staff that won Super Bowl XLIII, developed WR Antonio Brown into a Pro Bowl kick returner in 2011 and helped Pittsburgh lead the NFL with a franchise record of 1,581 return yards in 2009. Jones has a total of 37 years of coaching experience at the high school, college and professional levels.

DEFENDING THE LAND

In 2016, the Browns finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense. Last year, the Browns ranked 14th in total defense and seventh in rushing defense. The rushing defense mark that finished seventh best in the NFL was the highest mark by a Browns defense since 1992. Prior to the 2017 season, the highest the Browns finished in run defense since 1999 was in 2013 when the team finished 18th.

Browns defensive linemen collected 259 total stops last season, the fourth most in the NFL and the most by a Browns unit since 2012.



WILLIAMS REIGNS SUPREME

Defensive coordinator **Gregg Williams** spearheaded the turnaround of the Cleveland Browns defensive unit last year, aiding the development of 2017 first-round picks DL **Myles Garrett** and DB **Jabrill Peppers**. Garrett finished the year tied for second among rookie sack leaders (seven).

Second-year LB **Joe Schobert** finished second in the NFL with 144 tackles and earned his first career Pro Bowl selection in 2017. He and fellow LB **Christian Kirksey** were two of only three NFL players to play all defensive snaps for their respective teams.

The Browns' defense also finished second in the NFL in rushing yards per attempt, holding opponents to an average of 3.4 yards per touch. Cleveland's defense also finished top-10 in the league in opposing team's average yards per drive (27.8).

RUNNING THE FIELD

Since 2016, the Browns are second in the NFL with a 4.67 rushing average and finished 2017 sixth in the league with a 4.46 average.

HARD KNOCK LIFE

The Browns were selected to be featured on HBO's Hard Knocks documentary series in 2018. "Hard Knocks: Training Camp with the Cleveland Browns" is produced by HBO Sports and NFL Films and is a five-episode reality series that provides an all-access look as the Browns go through training camp and the preseason. The Browns are the feature of the 13th edition of the award-winning series, which debuted in 2001 and has won 16 Sports Emmys. The series will run from Tuesday, Aug. 7 (10-11 p.m. ET/PT) through its Sept. 4 season finale.

BIG-TIME SECURITY

The Browns return with the a group of three players that each started all 16 games last season. OL **Joel Bitonio**, JC **Tretter** and **Kevin Zeitler** headline a front that helped the Browns offense rank sixth in rushing average (4.46). Since 2016, the Browns are second in the entire league in rushing average in such span (4.67). **Bitonio** enters his fifth NFL season, having spent his entire tenure in Cleveland.

AWAKENING THE SLEEPING GIANT

General Manager **John Dorsey** was named to his current position on Dec. 7, 2017, following Week 13 of the 2017 NFL season. Since then, Dorsey has enhanced the roster through free agency and trades, as well as taking advantage of the Browns' draft selections.

Dorsey also bolstered the roster off the field, headlined by the additions of Assistant General Manager **Eliot Wolf** and vice president of player personnel **Alonzo Highsmith**. Both Wolf and Highsmith's connection to Dorsey spans from the trio's time and experience with the Green Bay Packers. Dorsey was first hired by the Packers as a college scout, joining Hall of Famer Ron Wolf's staff, who is also the father of Eliot.

Dorsey served as general manager of the Kansas City Chiefs from 2013-16. During that time, Dorsey's teams earned three postseason berths and a 2016 AFC West title. The Chiefs also won at least nine games a year in that span and registered a 43-21 (.672) overall record, the NFL's fourth-highest winning percentage.

As the Chiefs' GM, Dorsey selected three players who went on to earn first team All-Pro honors and were also selected to multiple Pro Bowls, including TE Travis Kelce (third round, 2013), CB Marcus Peters (first round, 2015) and WR Tyreek Hill (fifth round, 2016). In 2017, he drafted RB Kareem Hunt (third round), who led the NFL in rushing during his rookie season and was selected to the Pro Bowl. The year prior in 2016, LB D.J. Alexander (sixth round, 2015) was also selected to the Pro Bowl.

APRIL SHOWERS BRING PRO BOWL FLOWERS

Dorsey's career success in the spring has been evident in the winter, as he's selected a rookie Pro Bowler in each NFL Draft since 2015.

WR Jarvis Landry

- With 100 catches and 1,000 yards, Landry would stay par for his career course of averaging 100 catches and at least 1,000 yards per season.

Taylor also threw for a 92.5 passer rating from 2015-17, the best in Buffalo's franchise history. Since entering the league in 2011, he's one of only four NFL QBs who have played five seasons or more and have reached a 90.0 passer rating or better (91.2), along with a rushing average of 5.0 or more (5.5). Only Aaron Rodgers, Russell Wilson and Alex Smith accompany Taylor.

Moreover, Gonzalez converted the longest field goal ever made by a Browns rookie (54 yards). It was also the longest made by a Browns K since Phil Dawson in 2011.

Gonzalez also made three field goals in Week 12 at Cincinnati, joining Jeff Jaeger (Nov. 8, 1987) as the only Browns rookie kickers to make three field goals in a game.

Following Week 4 last year, Ogbah became the first Brown in franchise history to record at least two sacks, two pass breakups and two forced fumbles through the first four weeks of a single season. He also became the first NFL DL to do so since Osi Umenyiora in 2013 and just the 15th all time.

D.K. ALL DAY

DB **Derrick Kindred** has collected 99 total tackles and 10 tackles for loss in 26 career games. The marks rank him fifth and tied for first, respectively, among active DBs who have appeared 30 games or less.



HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 31 years of coaching experience, including the last 17 in the NFL. He has spent 11 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In 2017, the Browns defense made significant improvements in many categories. The Browns, who finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense in 2016, ranked 14th in total defense and seventh in rushing defense in 2017. Cleveland recorded its best finish in rush defense since 1992 and held opponents to a 3.35 rushing average. Joe Schobert became the first Browns linebacker named to the Pro Bowl in 16 years, as he was second in the NFL with 142 tackles. Defensive lineman Myles Garrett, the first overall pick of the 2017 NFL Draft, led the Browns with seven sacks, tied for second among all NFL rookies.

Offensively, running back Duke Johnson Jr. led the team in receptions (74) and receiving yards (693), while totaling seven touchdowns. He averaged 6.7 scrimmage yards per touch, third most in the NFL among running backs in 2017. Rookie tight end David Njoku led the Browns with four receiving touchdowns, the most ever by a Browns rookie tight end. Rookie quarterback DeShone Kizer recorded the second-most passing yards by a Browns rookie and third-most touchdown passes.

In his first year with Cleveland, Jackson helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to

the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems

in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

It offers collaborative and holistic services, and provides shared office space for law enforcement, healthcare, and social services providers, to help assist these survivors on their road to recovery.
