### NOTABLE STORYLINES

- The Browns kick-start the 2018 regular season by hosting their neighbors to the east and AFC North foe, the Pittsburgh Steelers. The matchup marks the second consecutive year the Browns have hosted the Steelers in Week 1 and is the 131st installment between the two clubs. Pittsburgh won both games by a narrow margin last season, defeating the Browns by a combined seven points in two games.
- The Browns completed their 2018 preseason slate with a 35-17 win over the Detroit Lions and a 3-1 record. QB **Tyrod Taylor** completed exhibition play with a 101.2 rating, while the defense posted a league-low average of 11.5 points allowed per game.
- The Cleveland Browns will celebrate cherished alumni this weekend, including the induction of DB **Erich Barnes** (1965-71) and LB **Eddie Johnson** (1981-90) into the Cleveland Browns Legends program on Saturday, as well as a halftime ceremony honoring the two during this week's game.
- The Browns bolstered their roster in 2018 by adding 31 new players, including eight draft picks, eight unrestricted free agents, five waiver claims and four trades.
- In 2017, the Browns finished with the seventh-best run defense in the NFL, holding opponents to a 3.35 rushing average. The No. 7 rank was the club's best finish in the category since 1992.
- Offensively, the Browns have the second-best rushing average (4.67) in the NFL since 2016. Cleveland finished sixth in the league last season with a 4.46 rushing average.
- LB **Joe Schobert** finished second in the NFL in tackles (142) in 2017, earning a Pro Bowl selection. Schobert and LB **Christian Kirksey** were two of only three players in the NFL last year to play every defensive snap for their respective team. Kirksey finished the season tied for fourth in the NFL with 138 tackles.
- RB **Duke Johnson Jr.** led Cleveland on the receiving end in 2017. His 74 receptions for 693 yards were both team bests and were the most by a RB in club history. Johnson Jr. joined Herschel Walker as the only two NFL RBs to accrue at least 500 receiving yards in each of their first three seasons. Since coming into the league in 2015, Johnson Jr. leads all NFL RBs in scrimmage yards per touch (6.3), receiving yards (1,741) and receptions (188).
- Garrett, the No. 1 overall selection of the 2017 draft, led Cleveland with seven sacks last year. Despite missing the first five games, Garrett's seven sacks were second best among all NFL rookies and were the third most by a Browns rookie in club history.

## CLEVELAND BROWNS (0-0)

**Hue Jackson: 9-39, fourth season as a head coach, third with the Browns.** Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on Jan. 13, 2016. He's in the midst of his 32nd year as a coach, with the last 18 being in the NFL. He's spent 11 seasons coaching in the AFC North, helping his team advance to the postseason seven times in that span. Jackson was also head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He's also served as offensive coordinator with the Washington Redskins (2003), Atlanta Falcons (2007), Raiders (2010) and Cincinnati Bengals (2014-15). He spent 14 years coaching on the collegiate level and was a QB at Pacific from 1985-86.

**Mike Tomlin: 116-60, 12th season as a head coach, 12th with the Steelers.** Mike Tomlin was named the 16th head coach in Steelers history on Jan. 22, 2007. Tomlin became the youngest coach (36 years, 323 days) in NFL history to win a Super Bowl when the Steelers defeated the Arizona Cardinals, 27-23, in Super Bowl XLIII on Feb. 1, 2009. He's the eighth head coach in NFL history to reach 100 wins in their first 10 seasons. Tomlin was also the defensive coordinator of the Minnesota Vikings in 2006 after five seasons (2001-05) as the DBs coach for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Up next, the Browns visit the New Orleans Saints, last year's NFC South champions. The appearance will be the Browns' first in the Mercedes-Benz Superdome since 2010 (W, 31-17). Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. EST on Sun., Sept. 16.

## NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Browns offensive coordinator **Todd Haley** spent the previous six seasons in the same role with the Pittsburgh Steelers. Haley led the Steelers' offensive efforts to three divisional championships and four playoff berths. He also helped guide multiple offensive players to Pro Bowl selections. In 2017, six Steelers on the offensive side of the ball made the Pro Bowl, a league best.
- Browns special teams coordinator **Amos Jones** was a member of the Steelers' staff from 2007-12 and helped WR Antonio Brown earn a Pro Bowl selection as a returner in 2011. He also won a Super Bowl with the Steelers (XLIII).
- Jones served as kicking game coordinator at the University of Pittsburgh in 1992.
- Steelers DB **Joe Haden** was originally drafted by the Browns in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft. Haden was selected to two Pro Bowls as a Brown.
- Browns OL **Chris Hubbard** was a Steeler from 2013-17. He played in 40 career games for Pittsburgh, including six playoff contests.
- **Dee** and **Jimmy Haslam** were part owners of the Steelers from 2008-12.
- Steelers defensive coordinator **Keith Butler** coached the Browns linebackers from 1999-02.
- Steelers offensive coordinator **Randy Fichtner** is a native of Cleveland and his father, Ross, played safety for the Browns from 1960-67.
- Steelers LB **L.J. Fort** was originally signed by the Browns as an undrafted free agent in 2012. He appeared in all 16 games with one start during his rookie season in Cleveland.
- Steelers assistant head coach/DL coach **John Mitchell** spent three seasons (1991-93) in Cleveland as an assistant coach.
- Steelers DL **Cameron Heyward** (Ohio State), FB **Roosevelt Nix** (Kent State) and QB **Ben Roethlisberger** (Miami) played collegiately in Ohio.
- Steelers RB **Le'Veon Bell** (Reynoldsburg), Nix (Reynoldsburg), Roethlisberger (Findlay) and Fichtner (Cleveland) are all Ohio natives.
- Browns OL **Earl Watford** (Philadelphia) is a Pennsylvania native.
- Steelers OL **Zach Banner** played in eight games for the Browns last season.

## THE LAST TIME IN THE REGULAR SEASON

The Browns dropped their 2017 season finale to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 28-24. On the game's opening possession, Steelers QB Landry Jones led an eight-play, 72-yard drive that ended in a 29-yard touchdown run by WR Darrius Heyward-Bey for a Steelers' 7-0 advantage. In the second quarter, Jones connected with WR JuJu Smith-Schuster for a 20-yard touchdown strike to extend Pittsburgh's lead, 14-0. QB DeShone Kizer responded by orchestrating a five-play, 75-yard drive capped by a two-yard touchdown run from RB Duke Johnson Jr. to cut the lead, 14-7. Later in the first half, Steelers RB Stevan Ridley found the end zone from two yards out to put the Steelers up, 21-7. However, a 56-yard touchdown strike from Kizer to WR Rashard Higgins would shrink Pittsburgh's halftime lead to 21-14. On the first drive of the second half, Kizer once again connected with Higgins for a five-yard touchdown, evening the score at 21-21. On the ensuing kickoff, Smith-Schuster broke free for a 96-yard return for a touchdown, putting the Steelers back in front, 28-21. K Zane Gonzalez would later connect from 51 yards out to bring the Browns within four points, but a late stand by Pittsburgh's defense would seal the 28-24 victory.

## THE LAST TIME AT HOME

The Cleveland Browns dropped the 2017 season opener to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-18. Despite limiting the Steelers to 290 yards, two touchdown receptions by Steelers TE Jesse James proved to be the difference in the contest. On the game's opening possession, Pittsburgh forced a three-and-out and on fourth down, deep in Browns' territory, its special teams unit opened the scoring. LB Tyler Matakevich blocked Britton Colquitt's punt and Steelers LB Anthony Chickillo recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to give the Steelers an early 7-0 advantage. Later in the quarter, rookie QB DeShone Kizer led the team on a 12-play, 68-yard drive, which he capped off by sneaking into the end zone from a yard out to even the scoring. With 45 seconds left in the first half, Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found James in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard score to give Pittsburgh a 14-7 lead heading into the locker room. As Cleveland's defense forced a three-and-out on Pittsburgh's first possession of the second half, Kizer led the offense down the field and set up fellow rookie K Zane Gonzalez, who notched a 24-yard field goal to cut Pittsburgh's lead to 14-10. On the game's next possession, Roethlisberger marched the Steelers 75 yards down the field and connected with James again for his second touchdown reception on the afternoon to extend their lead to 21-10. Late in the fourth quarter, DB Derrick Kindred picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 30 yards to the Cleveland 31-yard line. Later in the quarter, on fourth-and-two from the 3-yard line, Kizer hit WR Corey Coleman at the goal line for a touchdown, the first touchdown pass of his career. RB Isaiah Crowell punched in a two-point conversion to cut the lead to 21-18, but Pittsburgh would not let Cleveland get the ball back as they sealed 21-18 victory.

## WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

## OFFENSE

## QB Tyrod Taylor

- With a passing and a rushing score, will have done so in 11 contests since 2015 and will take sole possession of second place in the category (Cam Newton, 13).
- By completing the game without multiple interceptions, will continue his active streak of 42 games. The mark is an all-time NFL best.
- By throwing no interceptions in his start, will continue his trend of throwing the fewest amount of interceptions by a QB who's started 30-plus games since 2015.

## RB Duke Johnson Jr.

- With at least two rushing attempts and two receptions, will continue his active streak of doing so in each of the last 15 games. Continuing the streak will be a new personal best (16 games).
- With 50-plus receiving yards, will mark the 14th times he's done so in a single game and tie him for fifth (Theo Riddick) among all active RBs.
- The contest will mark his 49th consecutive game played, the third most among active RBs.
- With 174 scrimmage yards, will have 3,000 for his career.

## WR Jarvis Landry

- With at least five receptions, will mark the 18th consecutive game he's done so and will tie him for the third-longest streak all-time in the NFL.
- Five-plus receptions will also be the 50th occurrence of his career.
- With at least five receptions and 50 receiving yards, will be the 38th time he's done so in a single game.

## HALEY'S COMET

**Todd Haley** was named offensive coordinator on Jan. 24, 2018. Haley spent the past 21 years coaching in the NFL, including the past six as the offensive coordinator of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Haley oversaw one of the top offensive units in the league during his time in Pittsburgh, which led the NFL with six offensive players being selected to the Pro Bowl in 2017.

Last year, Pittsburgh posted a 31:56 average time of possession for the league's fourth-best average and a 377.9 yards-per-game average, the NFL's third-best output.

Prior to leading one of the NFL's best offenses over the past six years, Haley had three seasons as the head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs. There, he helped the Chiefs win the AFC West Division title in 2010, when Kansas City led the NFL in rushing yards per game (164.3).

## EXPERIENCE IS THE BEST TEACHER

Along with Haley, the Browns offense has added assistant coaches with decades of NFL experience. Quarterbacks coach **Ken Zampese** has joined Cleveland's staff for his 20th NFL season and like Haley, Zampese is familiar with the AFC North. Zampese has been either offensive coordinator or quarterbacks coach of the Cincinnati Bengals since 2003 and helped shape QBs Carson Palmer and Andy Dalton into two of the highest-rated statistical passers in Bengals history.

Moreover, running backs/associate head coach **Freddie Kitchens** spent the last 11 seasons with the Arizona Cardinals, having held coaching roles with the RBs, QBs and TEs.

## SPECIAL FORCES UNIT

The Browns have also added experience to the special teams coaching staff, welcoming special teams coordinator **Amos Jones**. Jones, who most recently was special teams coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals for the past five seasons, is no stranger to the AFC North, having been on the Pittsburgh Steelers' staff from 2007-12. Under Jones' tutelage, two Cardinals special teamers were selected to Pro Bowls and K Chandler Catanzaro tied the NFL record for most consecutive made field goals to begin a career (17) in 2014. In his first season in the desert in 2013, Jones guided P Dave Zastudil to tie the NFL lead with 35 punts inside the 20-yard line. With the Steelers, Jones was a member of a staff that won Super Bowl XLIII, developed WR Antonio Brown into a Pro Bowl kick returner in 2011 and helped Pittsburgh lead the NFL with a franchise record of 1,581 return yards in 2009. Jones has a total of 37 years of coaching experience at the high school, college and professional levels.

## DEFENDING THE LAND

In 2016, the Browns finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense. Last year, the Browns ranked 14th in total defense and seventh in rushing defense. The rushing defense mark that finished seventh best in the NFL was the highest mark by a Browns defense since 1992. Prior to the 2017 season, the highest the Browns finished in run defense since 1999 was in 2013 when the team finished 18th.

Defensive coordinator **Gregg Williams** spearheaded the turnaround of the Cleveland Browns defensive unit last year, aiding the development of 2017 first-round picks DL **Myles Garrett** and DB **Jabrill Peppers**. Garrett finished the year tied for second among rookie sack leaders (seven).

Second-year LB **Joe Schobert** finished second in the NFL with 144 tackles and earned his first career Pro Bowl selection in 2017. He and fellow LB **Christian Kirksey** were two of only three NFL players to play all defensive snaps for their respective teams.

The Browns' defense also finished second in the NFL in rushing yards per attempt, holding opponents to an average of 3.4 yards per touch. Cleveland's defense also finished top-10 in the league in opposing team's average yards per drive (27.8).

### RUNNING THE FIELD

Since 2016, the Browns are second in the NFL with a 4.67 rushing average and finished 2017 sixth in the league with a 4.46 average.

### HARD KNOCK LIFE

The Browns were selected to be featured on HBO's Hard Knocks documentary series in 2018. "Hard Knocks: Training Camp with the Cleveland Browns" is produced by HBO Sports and NFL Films and is a five-episode reality series that provides an all-access look as the Browns went through training camp and the preseason. The Browns were the feature of the 13th edition of the award-winning series, which debuted in 2001 and has won 16 Sports Emmys. The series ran from Tuesday, Aug. 7 (10-11 p.m. EST/PT) through its Sept. 4 season finale.

### BIG-TIME SECURITY

The Browns return with the a group of three players that each started all 16 games last season. OL **Joel Bitonio**, JC **Tretter** and **Kevin Zeitler** headline a front that helped the Browns offense rank sixth in rushing average (4.46). Since 2016, the Browns are second in the entire league in rushing average in such span (4.67). **Bitonio** enters his fifth NFL season, having spent his entire tenure in Cleveland.

### AWAKENING THE SLEEPING GIANT

General Manager **John Dorsey** was named to his current position on Dec. 7, 2017, following Week 13 of the 2017 NFL season. Since then, Dorsey has enhanced the roster through free agency and trades, as well as taking advantage of the Browns' draft selections.

Dorsey also bolstered the roster off the field, headlined by the additions of Assistant General Manager **Eliot Wolf** and vice president of player personnel **Alonzo Highsmith**. Both Wolf and Highsmith's connection to Dorsey spans from the trio's time and experience with the Green Bay Packers. Dorsey was first hired by the Packers as a college scout, joining Hall of Famer Ron Wolf's staff, who is also the father of Eliot.

Dorsey served as general manager of the Kansas City Chiefs from 2013-16. During that time, Dorsey's teams earned three postseason berths and a 2016 AFC West title. The Chiefs also won at least nine games a year in that span and registered a 43-21 (.672) overall record, the NFL's fourth-highest winning percentage.

As the Chiefs' GM, Dorsey selected three players who went on to earn first team All-Pro honors and were also selected to multiple Pro Bowls, including TE Travis Kelce (third round, 2013), CB Marcus Peters (first round, 2015) and WR Tyreek Hill (fifth round, 2016). In 2017, he drafted RB Kareem Hunt (third round), who led the NFL in rushing during his rookie season and was selected to the Pro Bowl. The year prior in 2016, LB D.J. Alexander (sixth round, 2015) was also selected to the Pro Bowl.

### APRIL SHOWERS BRING PRO BOWL FLOWERS

Dorsey's career success in the spring has been evident in the winter, as he's selected a rookie Pro Bowler in each NFL Draft since 2015.

Taylor also threw for a 92.5 passer rating from 2015-17, the best in Buffalo's franchise history. Since entering the league in 2011, he's one of only four NFL QBs who have played five seasons or more and have reached a 90.0 passer rating or better (91.2), along with a rushing average of 5.0 or more (5.5). Only Aaron Rodgers, Russell Wilson and Alex Smith accompany Taylor.

Following Week 4 last year, Ogbah became the first Brown in franchise history to record at least two sacks, two pass breakups and two forced fumbles through the first four weeks of a single season. He also became the first NFL DL to do so since Osi Umenyiora in 2013 and just the 15th all time.

## D.K. ALL DAY

DB **Derrick Kindred** has collected 99 total tackles and 10 tackles for loss in 26 career games. The marks rank him fifth and tied for first, respectively, among active DBs who have appeared 30 games or less.

# HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 31 years of coaching experience, including the last 17 in the NFL. He has spent 11 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In 2017, the Browns defense made significant improvements in many categories. The Browns, who finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense in 2016, ranked 14th in total defense and seventh in rushing defense in 2017. Cleveland recorded its best finish in rush defense since 1992 and held opponents to a 3.35 rushing average. Joe Schobert became the first Browns linebacker named to the Pro Bowl in 16 years, as he was second in the NFL with 142 tackles. Defensive lineman Myles Garrett, the first overall pick of the 2017 NFL Draft, led the Browns with seven sacks, tied for second among all NFL rookies.

Offensively, running back Duke Johnson Jr. led the team in receptions (74) and receiving yards (693), while totaling seven touchdowns. He averaged 6.7 scrimmage yards per touch, third most in the NFL among running backs in 2017. Rookie tight end David Njoku led the Browns with four receiving touchdowns, the most ever by a Browns rookie tight end. Rookie quarterback DeShone Kizer recorded the second-most passing yards by a Browns rookie and third-most touchdown passes.

In his first year with Cleveland, Jackson helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011.



## HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON CONTINUED

Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.



## THE HUE JACKSON FOUNDATION

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. The foundation also focuses its efforts to further awareness, prevention and healing for victims of human trafficking.

On July 17, 2018, the Hue Jackson Foundation opened the Hue Jackson Foundation Survivors of Human Trafficking Residence. This residence is approximately 4,500 sq. ft. and provides a safe environment for up to 12 recovered adult survivors of human trafficking. It offers collaborative and holistic services, and provides shared office space for law enforcement, healthcare, and social services providers, to help assist these survivors on their road to recovery.
