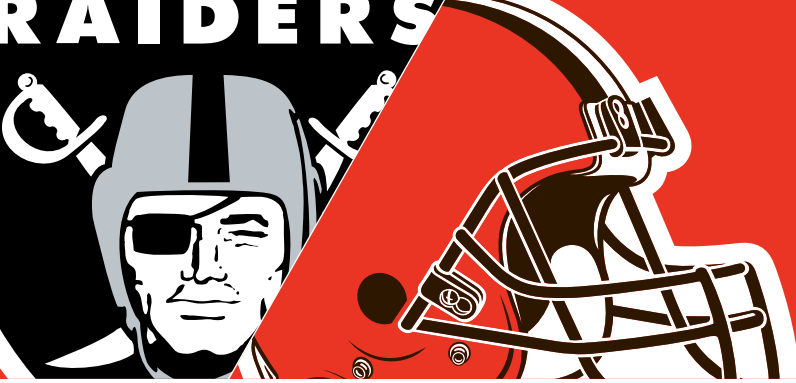

NOTABLE STORYLINES

• The Browns will go to battle in the Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum, taking on the Raiders in Oakland, Calif. to cap the first quarter of the regular season. The last time that the Browns paid a visit to the Bay Area was in 2012, coming away with a 20-17 win over the Silver and Black. The Week 4 matchup kicks off at 4:05 p.m. ET on FOX.

• Rookie QB **Baker Mayfield** lifted the Browns to a dramatic 21-17 win over the New York Jets last week, ending a winless streak that dated back to December 2016. Replacing injured starting QB **Tyrod Taylor** in the second quarter, Mayfield went 17-of-23 passing for 201 yards for a 100.1 passer rating. He also had a reception for a two-point conversion that tied the game in the third quarter.

• The Browns 1-1-1 record is the team's best start since 2011, when the team opened the season 2-1.

• WR **Jarvis Landry** recorded eight receptions for 103 yards against the Jets and has now caught at least two receptions in each of his past 66 games, the second-longest active streak in the NFL and the longest since 2014. He also extended his streak of at least five receptions to 20 games, which is tied for the second longest in NFL history and is the longest active streak. His 420 receptions are the third most all time by an NFL player through their first five seasons (2014-18).

• RB **Carlos Hyde** led the Browns with 98 rushing yards and two touchdowns last week. His four rushing scores on the season are the most by a Brown through the first three games of the year since Leroy Kelly in 1971. Additionally, he's the first Brown to have at least one rushing score in each of the first three games of a season since Peyton Hillis in 2010 and is tied for the league lead in the category.

• The Browns defense had three takeaways in Week 3 (two interceptions and one fumble recovery). The unit's 11 takeaways on the year are the most by the team through the first three weeks of a season since 2001 (11).

• DL **Myles Garrett** recorded two sacks last week and leads the team with four sacks this season. With 11 sacks in 14 career games (2017-18), Garrett ties for the fifth-most sacks by a Brown in their first two years. He's also tied for the NFL lead this season.

• Rookie DB **Denzel Ward** recorded four tackles and recovered his own forced fumble against the Jets. Paired with his two interceptions in Week 1 against the Pittsburgh Steelers, Ward accounts for three of the defense's 11 takeaways this season.

Hue Jackson: 10-40-1, fourth season as a head coach, third with the Browns. Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on Jan. 13, 2016. He's in the midst of his 32nd year as a coach, with the last 18 being in the NFL. He's spent 11 seasons coaching in the AFC North, helping his team advance to the postseason seven times in that span. Jackson was also head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He's also served as offensive coordinator with the Washington Redskins (2003), Atlanta Falcons (2007), Raiders (2010) and Cincinnati Bengals (2014-15). He spent 14 years coaching on the collegiate level and was a QB at Pacific from 1985-86.

Jon Gruden: 95-84, 12th season as a head coach, fifth with the Raiders (1998-2001, 2018-). Jon Gruden was named head coach of the Oakland Raiders on Jan. 6, 2018. Gruden makes his return to coaching after spending nearly a decade in broadcasting, which entailed color analyst duties on Monday Night Football from 2009-17. Gruden compiled a 95-81 (.540) regular season mark in 11 seasons as a head coach with the Raiders and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2002-08). He also has a 5-4 record (.556) in the playoffs, which includes a Super Bowl XXXVII victory. Gruden's career as a head coach began in Oakland in 1998, accruing a 38-28 record over that four-year span.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

• Browns head coach **Hue Jackson** served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011, going 8-8 at the helm. Jackson had multiple current Browns assistant coaches on his Raiders staff in 2011, including senior offensive assistant **Al Saunders**, OL coach **Bob Wylie** and defensive quality control coach **Eric Sanders**.

• Browns DB **T.J. Carrie** was a member of the Raiders for the first four years of his career. Carrie is also a native of Antioch, Calif.

• Raiders defensive coordinator **Paul Guenther** held the same role with the Cincinnati Bengals for the past 13 seasons, most of which were with Browns QBs coach **Ken Zampese** and Jackson.

• Raiders QB **Connor Cook** (Hinckley, Walsh Jesuit) and DB **Gareon Conley** (Massillon, Massillon Washington) are both natives of Northeast Ohio. Conley also played collegiately at Ohio State.

• Raiders K **Mike Nugent** is also an Ohio native (Centerville) and played collegiately at Ohio State.

• Raiders DL **Ahtyba Rubin** was a sixth-round pick in 2008 by the Browns, playing his first seven seasons in Cleveland. DL **Froste Rucker** joins Rubin on the Raiders DL of previous Browns players, as Rucker was a member of the Browns in 2012.

• Browns OL **Joel Bitonio** (Long Beach), Carrie (Antioch), TE **Darren Fells** (Fullerton), DB **Terrance Mitchell** (Sacramento) and Jackson (Los Angeles) are all natives of California.

• Browns offensive coordinator **Todd Haley** worked in the same capacity for the Steelers, where he coached Raiders WR **Martavis Bryant** from 2014-17.

• Jackson (2014-15) and Zampese (2014-17) both coached Raiders QB **AJ McCarron** in Cincinnati.

• Raiders senior defensive assistant **Jim O'Neil** was the Browns defensive coordinator from 2014-15.

• Browns WR coach **Adam Henry** spent five seasons (2009-11) as an assistant coach with the Raiders.

• Browns Assistant OL coach **Mark Hutson** spent three seasons (2012-14) as the Raiders TE coach.

• Browns WR **Rod Streater** was a member of the Raiders from 2012-15, collecting 109 receptions for 1,564 yards and eight touchdowns. Streater signed with Oakland as an undrafted free agent out of Temple.

A second-half Cleveland comeback fell short as the Browns lost to the Oakland Raiders, 27-20, at FirstEnergy Stadium. The Raiders opened the game with a 13-play, 72-yard drive that ended with Oakland's first points of the game as K Sebastian Janikowski split the uprights from 23 yards away. Oakland extended their lead to 10-0 with 12:13 to play in the second quarter when QB Derek Carr threw a 3-yard touchdown pass to WR Andre Holmes. On the ensuing drive, the Browns got on the scoreboard when K Travis Coons converted on a 24-yard FG attempt to cap a 13-play, 74-yard drive with 1:44 to play in the first half. The Raiders responded by driving 70 yards in five plays to score on a 13-yard touchdown pass from Carr to WR Seth Roberts with 18 seconds remaining in the half. Oakland extended its lead to 17 points on its first drive of the third quarter when Janikowski kicked a 35-yard field goal. Cleveland responded with a 13-play, 80-yard scoring drive as QB Josh McCown completed a 28-yard touchdown pass to TE Gary Barnidge with 3:32 to play in the third quarter. The Raiders scored on their second play of the fourth quarter on a 6-yard rush by RB Latavius Murray who rushed for a total of 139 yards on the day. Coons brought the Browns to within 14 points of the Raiders when he converted on a 41-yard field goal with 10:57 to play in the game. The Cleveland defense forced a turnover on the next drive when LB Chris Kirksey stripped Raiders WR Amari Cooper on Oakland's 44-yard line. DL John Hughes recovered the fumble on the play. The Browns made good on the takeaway when McCown threw a 4-yard touchdown pass to WR Travis Benjamin with 6:28 to play in regulation, making the score 27-20. The Cleveland defense stopped Oakland's offensive unit twice in the fourth quarter to preserve the Raiders' lead at seven points. After an Oakland punt was downed on the Browns' 2-yard line, Cleveland drove down into the Raiders' territory before S Charles Woodson picked off a McCown pass at the 12-yard line to seal the Oakland victory. McCown completed 28 passes for 341 yards and two touchdowns on the day, while Barnidge led Cleveland in receiving with six receptions for 105 yards and a Touchdown.

The Browns topped the Raiders, 20-17, in Oakland. After a scoreless opening quarter, Browns K Phil Dawson connected on a 41-yard second quarter field goal to give the Browns an early 3-0 advantage. The Browns took their next possession 62 yards on two plays after rookie QB Brandon Weeden connected rookie WR Josh Gordon down the sideline for a 44-yard touchdown pass. The Raiders closed the gap before the half after K Sebastian Janikowski converted on a 51-yard field goal with 4:33 remaining in the second quarter. In the second half, the Browns took their opening possession 48 yards on 10 plays and Dawson made his second field goal of the day, this time from 35 yards away to push the Browns lead to 13-3. Later in the third quarter, QB Carson Palmer hit WR Rod Streater for a 64-yard touchdown pass to cut the Browns lead to 13-10. Following a DB Sheldon Brown interception at the Cleveland 6-yard line, Weeden led the Browns on a 14 play, 94-yard drive, which was capped off by a 3-yard touchdown run by rookie RB Trent Richardson to extend the Browns lead to 20-13. On the drive, Weeden completed five of six passes for 70 yards, while the Browns were able to run more than six minutes off the clock and extended the lead to two scores. The Raiders added a late TD as Palmer found TE Brandon Myers for a 17-yard strike with 0:01 left in the game.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

OFFENSE

RB Carlos Hyde

- Will reach the 3,000 career rushing yards milestone with 68 rushing yards.
- With a rushing touchdown, becomes the first Brown since Peyton Hillis in 2010 to have at least one rushing score in each of the first four games of a single season.
- Two rushing scores will mark the second time he's done so in 2018 and will make him the first Brown to rush for multiple scores in at least two of the first four games of a single season since Leroy Kelly in 1971.
- Will be the first Brown to rush for at least two scores in back-to-back games since Trent Richardson in Weeks 14-15 of 2012.
- With a rushing touchdown, he would be the first Browns player to record a rushing touchdown in four consecutive games since Trent Richardson did it four straight games in 2012.
- With a rushing touchdown, he would join Jim Brown (nine in 1958 and six in 1963) and Leroy Kelly (five in 1966 and five in 1971) as only Browns to record five or more rushing touchdowns through the first four weeks of a season.

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

- With 50-plus receiving yards, will mark the 14th times he's done so in a single game and tie him for fifth (Theo Riddick) among all active RBs.
- With 106 scrimmage yards, will have 3,000 for his career.
- With seven receptions and 20 receiving yards, will have 200 career receptions for 1,800 receiving yards.

WR Jarvis Landry

- With at least five receptions, will mark the 21st consecutive game he's done so and will rank second all time.
- With at least 10 receptions, will have done so in eight games since 2015 and will tie Julio Jones for third in the category.
- With at least 11 catches, will have done so in five games since 2015 and can tie Jones and Keenan Allen for second in the category.
- With at least a pair of catches, will have done so in 67 consecutive games, the longest streak in the league since 2014.
- Landry could become the first Browns player with back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since Josh Gordon in 2013 (Dec. 1 and Dec. 8).

- With 100 receiving yards, will have done so in three of the first four games of the season and will make him the first player to accomplish the feat since Jones in 2015. He will also be the first Brown ever to do so.

- With 65 scrimmage yards, will have 4,500 for his career.

TE David Njoku

- A receiving touchdown will be the fifth of his career and the third most by a Browns TE in his first two seasons.

DEFENSE

- With any defensive player securing at least 2.0 sacks, it would be the first time in franchise history that a Browns player has at least 2.0 sacks in each of the first four games to start a season.

DL Myles Garrett

- With two sacks, Garrett will be the first Browns player to record two or more sacks in back-to-back games since Jamir Miller in 2001.
- With one sack, will tie Jamir Miller (five in 2001) for the most sacks by a Brown in the first four games of a season.

DB Derrick Kindred

- A TFL will be the 11th of his career and will give him sole possession of first place in the category among active DBs who have played in 30 or fewer games.

DB Terrance Mitchell

- With an interception, will be his seventh and will tie for first among active DBs who have appeared in 34 games or less.

DB Damarious Randall

- With a start and an interception, will break the record for most interceptions by an active player who has started 33 games or fewer.
- Another interception can tie Ha Ha Clinton-Dix and Earl Thomas for the fourth-most interceptions by a single player since 2015.

HALEY'S COMET

Todd Haley was named offensive coordinator on Jan. 24, 2018. Haley spent the past 21 years coaching in the NFL, including the past six as the offensive coordinator of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Haley oversaw one of the top offensive units in the league during his time in Pittsburgh, which led the NFL with six offensive players being selected to the Pro Bowl in 2017.

Last year, Pittsburgh posted a 31:56 average time of possession for the league's fourth-best average and a 377.9 yards-per-game average, the NFL's third-best output.

Prior to leading one of the NFL's best offenses over the past six years, Haley had three seasons as the head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs. There, he helped the Chiefs win the AFC West Division title in 2010, when Kansas City led the NFL in rushing yards per game (164.3).

EXPERIENCE IS THE BEST TEACHER

Along with Haley, the Browns offense has added assistant coaches with decades of NFL experience. Quarterbacks coach **Ken Zampese** has joined Cleveland's staff for his 20th NFL season and like Haley, Zampese is familiar with the AFC North. Zampese has been either offensive coordinator or quarterbacks coach of the Cincinnati Bengals since 2003 and helped shape QBs Carson Palmer and Andy Dalton into two of the highest-rated statistical passers in Bengals history.

Moreover, running backs/associate head coach **Freddie Kitchens** spent the last 11 seasons with the Arizona Cardinals, having held coaching roles with the RBs, QBs and TEs.

GET REDY

The Browns offense is seventh in the NFL in the red zone with a 71.4 touchdown percentage, 12.4 percent ahead of the league average. Last year, the Browns finished tied for 25th in the NFL in red zone touchdown efficiency with 48.7, 4.7 percent below the league average.

The Browns offense posted 403 rushing yards on 98 attempts for five touchdowns through the first three weeks of the 2018 NFL season. The Browns' 403 total rushing yards are the fifth-best mark in the league, while their five rushing scores are tied for second.

The Browns have the third-best rushing average (4.60) in the NFL since 2016. Cleveland finished sixth in the league last season with a 4.46 rushing average.

BIG-TIME SECURITY

The 2018 Browns have a group of three players that each started all 16 games last season. OL **Joel Bitonio**, JC **Tretter** and **Kevin Zeitler** headline a front that helped the Browns offense rank sixth in rushing average (4.46). Since 2016, the Browns are second in the entire league in rushing average in such span (4.67). **Bitonio** enters his fifth NFL season, having spent his entire tenure in Cleveland.

SPECIAL FORCES UNIT

The Browns have also added experience to the special teams coaching staff, welcoming special teams coordinator **Amos Jones**. Jones, who most recently was special teams coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals for the past five seasons, is no stranger to the AFC North, having been on the Pittsburgh Steelers' staff from 2007-12. Under Jones' tutelage, two Cardinals special teamers were selected to Pro Bowls and K Chandler Catanzaro tied the NFL record for most consecutive made field goals to begin a career (17) in 2014. In his first season in the desert in 2013, Jones guided P Dave Zastudil to tie the NFL lead with 35 punts inside the 20-yard line. With the Steelers, Jones was a member of a staff that won Super Bowl XLIII, developed WR Antonio Brown into a Pro Bowl kick returner in 2011 and helped Pittsburgh lead the NFL with a franchise record of 1,581 return yards in 2009. Jones has a total of 37 years of coaching experience at the high school, college and professional levels.

AWAKEN THE SLEEPING GIANT

General Manager **John Dorsey** was named to his current position on Dec. 7, 2017, following Week 13 of the 2017 NFL season. Since then, Dorsey has enhanced the roster through free agency and trades, as well as taking advantage of the Browns' draft selections.

Dorsey also bolstered the roster off the field, headlined by the additions of Assistant General Manager **Eliot Wolf** and vice president of player personnel **Alonzo Highsmith**. Both Wolf and Highsmith's connection to Dorsey spans from the trio's time and experience with the Green Bay Packers. Dorsey was first hired by the Packers as a college scout, joining Hall of Famer Ron Wolf's staff, who is also the father of Eliot.

Dorsey served as general manager of the Kansas City Chiefs from 2013-16. During that time, Dorsey's teams earned three postseason berths and a 2016 AFC West title. The Chiefs also won at least nine games a year in that span and registered a 43-21 (.672) overall record, the NFL's fourth-highest winning percentage.

As the Chiefs' GM, Dorsey selected three players who went on to earn first team All-Pro honors and were also selected to multiple Pro Bowls, including TE Travis Kelce (third round, 2013), CB Marcus Peters (first round, 2015) and WR Tyreek Hill (fifth round, 2016). In 2017, he drafted RB Kareem Hunt (third round), who led the NFL in rushing during his rookie season and was selected to the Pro Bowl. The year prior in 2016, LB D.J. Alexander (sixth round, 2015) was also selected to the Pro Bowl.

APRIL SHOWERS BRING PRO BOWL FLOWERS

Dorsey's career success in the spring has been evident in the winter, as he's selected a rookie Pro Bowler in each NFL Draft since 2015.

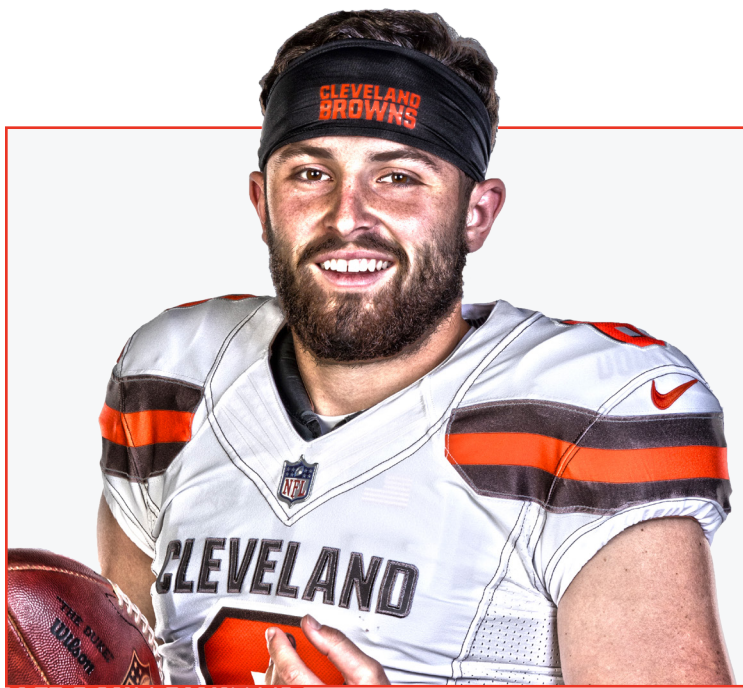

HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 31 years of coaching experience, including the last 17 in the NFL. He has spent 11 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In 2017, the Browns defense made significant improvements in many categories. The Browns, who finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense in 2016, ranked 14th in total defense and seventh in rushing defense in 2017. Cleveland recorded its best finish in rush defense since 1992 and held opponents to a 3.35 rushing average. Joe Schobert became the first Browns linebacker named to the Pro Bowl in 16 years, as he was second in the NFL with 142 tackles. Defensive lineman Myles Garrett, the first overall pick of the 2017 NFL Draft, led the Browns with seven sacks, tied for second among all NFL rookies.

Offensively, running back Duke Johnson Jr. led the team in receptions (74) and receiving yards (693), while totaling seven touchdowns. He averaged 6.7 scrimmage yards per touch, third most in the NFL among running backs in 2017. Rookie tight end David Njoku led the Browns with four receiving touchdowns, the most ever by a Browns rookie tight end. Rookie quarterback DeShone Kizer recorded the second-most passing yards by a Browns rookie and third-most touchdown passes.

In his first year with Cleveland, Jackson helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011.

HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON CONTINUED

Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.



THE HUE JACKSON FOUNDATION

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. The foundation also focuses its efforts to further awareness, prevention and healing for victims of human trafficking.

On July 17, 2018, the Hue Jackson Foundation opened the Hue Jackson Foundation Survivors of Human Trafficking Residence. This residence is approximately 4,500 sq. ft. and provides a safe environment for up to 12 recovered adult survivors of human trafficking. It offers collaborative and holistic services, and provides shared office space for law enforcement, healthcare, and social services providers, to help assist these survivors on their road to recovery.

The Cleveland Browns kicked off the 2018 season with a tie against the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-21. In the first tie for the Browns since 1989, the team's defense forced six turnovers for the first time since 2010. Rookie DB Denzel Ward became the first Browns DB to secure two interceptions in his NFL debut since 1971 (Clarence Scott). Browns DL Myles Garrett forced a career-best two fumbles, while matching career-best marks in tackles (six) and sacks (two). Following a scoreless first quarter, Steelers RB James Conner culminated a 10-play, 88-yard scoring drive ending in a four-yard touchdown run. After the 7-0 halftime break, Browns QB Tyrod Taylor led Cleveland on an opening-half possession that he ended with a 20-yard touchdown run by him, tying the game at 7-7. Pittsburgh answered as QB Ben Roethlisberger found WR Antonio Brown for a 22-yard touchdown pass on the ensuing possession. After forcing the Browns to punt, Conner found the end zone again for his second score of the game, giving the Steelers their largest lead of the game, 21-7. After recovering the team's second fumble of the game, Browns RB Carlos Hyde punched in a one-yard score. Before the final whistle of regulation, Taylor found WR Josh Gordon for a 17-yard strike with 1:58 remaining in regulation to tie the game, 21-21. In the OT period, each team exchanged possessions with punts, before the Steelers put together an eight-play, 31-yard drive to set up a K Chris Boswell game-winning field goal attempt, but Boswell's try missed to the left. Following a Cleveland punt, Roethlisberger was strip-sacked by LB Genard Avery on the following possession. The ensuing Browns K Zane Gonzalez game-winning field goal attempt was blocked by Steelers LB TJ Watt, forcing the teams to tie, 21-21.

In the first road game of 2018, the Cleveland Browns fell to the New Orleans Saints, 21-18. Despite leading 12-3 going into the final quarter, the Saints rallied to score 18 points in the final 8:41 of the contest, securing the victory. K Zane Gonzalez opened the scoring for the Browns with his first of two 39-yard, first-half field goals. However, Saints K Wil Lutz provided an equalizing field goal on the ensuing possession. At the half, the Browns went into the locker room with a 6-3 lead. New Orleans punted on the opening possession of the second half, as RB Carlos Hyde capped a 12-play, 79-yard drive with a one-yard rushing touchdown. On the Saints' first drive of the fourth quarter, WR Michael Thomas caught his first of two fourth quarter touchdowns from QB Drew Brees. Following a Browns QB Tyrod Taylor interception, New Orleans took their first lead of the game after another with Thomas' second score. Saints RB Alvin Kamara ran in the ensuing two-point conversion attempt. Following the two-minute warning, Taylor found WR Antonio Callaway for a 47-yard touchdown reception to tie the game at 18, as Gonzalez missed the extra point attempt. With 1:16 remaining, Brees orchestrated a six-play, 49-yard drive to set up th go-ahead field goal, which Lutz made from 44 yards out with 0:21 remaining. Taylor found Browns WR Jarvis Landry for a 25-yard reception, followed by a 16-yard catch from Callaway to set-up the game-tying field goal for Cleveland, but Gonzalez missed the attempt wide right.

The Cleveland Browns defeated the New York Jets on Thursday Night Football, 21-17, securing the team's first win since Week 16 of the 2016 season. Browns rookie QB Baker Mayfield entered the game prior to the end of the first half due to a QB Tyrod Taylor injury, propelling Cleveland to 14 unanswered points and a fourth quarter touchdown, giving the Browns the home victory. Mayfield finished the game with 17 completions on 23 attempts for 201 yards, scoring on the receiving end of a two-point conversion attempt thrown by WR Jarvis Landry. Landry added eight receptions for 103 yards, his best single-game showing as a Brown. Following a scoreless first quarter, Jets RB Isaiah Crowell opened the scoring for New York, rushing in from seven yards out four seconds into the second quarter. After a Cleveland punt on the ensuing possession, Crowell hit pay dirt for the second time of the evening from two yards out, capping a 10-play, 63-yard touchdown drive. Down 14-0, and following the Taylor injury, Mayfield entered the game and led the Browns on a six-play, 39-yard drive capped by a 45-yard FG from newly acquired K Greg Joseph. The Jets took their 14-3 lead into the intermission. Following a strip forced fumble by Browns DB Denzel Ward of Jets WR Robby Anderson, Joseph connected on his second FG attempt of the game, this time from 27 yards out, to draw the Browns within one score. Before the final whistle of the third quarter, Browns RB Carlos Hyde capped a 69-yard scoring drive with a goal line plunge from 1 yard out. The ensuing two-point conversion attempt was successful, as Landry's end around pass found Mayfield in the corner of the end zone. Jets K Jason Myers ended Cleveland's 14-point burst with a FG from 28 yards out, giving Cleveland the ball back with 8:55 remaining in regulation. On the next drive, Hyde scored his second 1-yard touchdown rush of the game to cap a 15-play drive, giving the Browns their first lead of the contest four seconds prior to the two minute warning. On a third down attempt, Jets QB Sam Darnold's pass was intercepted by LB Joe Shobert, giving the 2018 Pro Bowl selection his second takeaway of the season. Following a Browns punt, Darnold threw his second INT of the game, as DB Terrance Mitchell picked off his sixth career INT to secure the win for Cleveland.
