NOTABLE STORYLINES

• After two consecutive road games, the Browns return home to Cleveland this week to take on the conference-leading Kansas City Chiefs at FirstEnergy Stadium. The matchup marks the Chiefs' first visit to Cleveland since 2012 and will kick off at 1 p.m. ET on CBS.

• The Browns will host their annual Browns Give Back First and Ten Food Drive, benefitting the Greater Cleveland Food Bank, prior to Sunday's game against the Kansas City Chiefs. Volunteers from the Greater Cleveland Food Bank will begin collecting donations outside of FirstEnergy Stadium when gates open at 11 a.m. Through the generosity of Browns fans, the Browns Give Back First and Ten Food Drive, presented by Sugardale, has helped provide nearly 140,000 meals to Northeast Ohio families in need during the past six years.

• Last week, the Browns rallied in the third quarter at Heinz Field, but the Pittsburgh Steelers' momentum proved to be too much as they fell to the Black and Gold, 33-18. Down 16-6 after a third-quarter safety, the Browns recovered the ensuing kickoff at Pittsburgh's 24-yard line when the Steelers failed to attempt a return. The Browns came within four points of the AFC North leaders after QB **Baker Mayfield** found WR **Antonio Callaway** for a one-yard touchdown catch, but Steelers RB James Connor and a field goal from K Chris Boswell made up Pittsburgh's response of 17 unanswered points.

• The Browns defense posted a pair of takeaways (one interception and one fumble recovery) to increase its total to 22 on the year. The total is its most through eight weeks since 1982 (25). The unit also has 12 interceptions, five more than it had in all of last season, and has picked off an opposing QB in six consecutive games. The unit has also improved its -28 2017 turnover ratio to a league-best +11.

• DL **Myles Garrett** recorded a sack against the Steelers and leads the team with eight sacks this season. Garrett's eight sacks are the most by a Brown through the first eight weeks of a season and his 15 career sacks are the fourth-most sacks by a Brown in their first two seasons.

• WR **Jarvis Landry** registered a game-high eight receptions in the loss to Pittsburgh. With at least a pair of catches in each of his past 71 games, Landry has the second-longest active streak in the NFL. His 449 career receptions are the most all-time by an NFL player through their first five seasons. He leads the team in receptions (49) and receiving yards (528) this year, with his receptions total tying for the most by a Brown through the first eight weeks of a season.

Gregg Williams: 17-31, fourth season as a head coach, first with the Browns. Gregg Williams was named Browns interim head coach on Oct. 29, 2018. He has served as the team's defensive coordinator since Jan. 7, 2017. Williams also served as the head coach of the Buffalo Bills from 2001-03 and has 17 seasons of experience as an NFL defensive coordinator. His defenses have finished in the top five in total defense five times, including the top defense in the NFL in 2000. Williams also oversaw a Saints defensive unit that won Super Bowl XLIV and a Titans defense that advanced to Super Bowl XXXIV.

KANSAS CITY CHIEFS (7-1)

Andy Reid: 190-121-1, 20th season as a head coach, sixth season with the Chiefs. Andy Reid was named the 13th head coach in Chiefs history on Jan. 7, 2013. Since his arrival, Kansas City has earned four playoff berths and won 60 games, the highest win total of any Chiefs head coach in a six-year span. In 2017, Reid led the Chiefs to a 10-6 record en route to the club's second consecutive AFC West title. It marked the first time in franchise history the club won the division in back-to-back years.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Browns General Manager **John Dorsey** served in the same capacity with Kansas City from 2013-16. During that span, the Chiefs had the fourth-highest winning percentage in the NFL (.672), recorded at least nine wins all four seasons, drafted three players to make the Pro Bowl as rookies and earned three playoff berths. Dorsey was named 2013 Executive of the Year by the Pro Football Writers of America.
- Browns head coach **Gregg Williams** is a native of Excelsior Springs, Mo., located approximately 30 miles northeast of Kansas City.
- Browns senior offensive assistant **Al Saunders** spent 15 seasons in Kansas City, serving as WR coach from 1989-98 and returning as offensive coordinator from 2001-05. Saunders also held the title of assistant head coach during his entirety with the Chiefs.
- Chiefs TE **Travis Kelce** (Cleveland Heights), RB **Kareem Hunt** (Willoughby) and LB **Anthony Hitchens** (Lorain) are Northeast Ohio natives. Kelce played collegiately at Cincinnati, while Hunt played at Toledo.
- Chiefs OL **Mitchell Schwartz** was a second-round pick by the Browns in 2017, playing his first four seasons in Cleveland.
- Browns TE **Orson Charles** also spent a portion of the 2017 season in Kansas City, playing in the team's final five games.
- Browns personnel coordinator **Dan Zegers** and scouts **Matt Donahoe** and **Jimmy Noel** spent time in Kansas City under Dorsey.
- Chiefs P **Dustin Colquitt** is the older brother of Browns P **Britton Colquitt**.
- Chiefs OL **Cam Erving** was drafted by the Browns with the 19th overall selection in 2015.
- Chiefs OL **Ryan Hunter** played collegiately at Bowling Green State University.
- Browns LB coach **Blake Williams** and assistant DB coach **Jerod Kruse** coached together at Division II William Jewell College in Liberty, Mo. from 2013-14. Kruse was the head coach during those two years, as Williams was his defensive coordinator.
- Chiefs OL **Austin Reiter** and **Andrew Wylie**, along with LB **Nate Orchard**, all spent time with the Browns.

THE LAST TIME IN THE REGULAR SEASON

BROWNS 17
CHIEFS 13Dec. 27, 2015
Arrowhead Stadium, Kansas City, Mo.

Time in regulation ran out as the Browns drove down the field late in the fourth quarter, attempting to erase a 14-point deficit at Arrowhead Stadium against the Chiefs. The game ended with Cleveland falling to Kansas City, 17-13, despite the Browns getting down to the Chief's 18-yard line in the final seconds. Chiefs QB Alex Smith got his team on the scoreboard first on the its first possession of the day. Smith hit WR Jeremy Maclin for an 11-yard touchdown to cap the opening 11-play, 65-yard scoring drive. Chiefs K Cairo Santos added a 40-yard field goal on the Chief's second offensive possession to close the first quarter with a 10-0 lead. The Browns cut the Chiefs lead to a touchdown, 10-3, after a K Travis Coons field goal with 9:02 remaining in the second quarter got the Browns on the board. Seven plays later, following the Coons field goal, rookie LB Nate Orchard recorded his first career interception after picking off a Smith pass that was intended for Chiefs TE Travis Kelce. The Browns were unable to take advantage of the turnover, as Chiefs DB Marcus Peters intercepted a QB Johnny Manziel pass two plays later. With 0:36 seconds remaining in the half the Chiefs extended their lead, 17-3, as Smith connected with Kelce for a 13-yard TD pass. Manziel started the second half running for a career-long and game-long rush of 34 yards on the first play of the third quarter. Eight plays later, RB Isaiah Crowell took a handoff from Manziel and scampered down the right end for a 10-yard touchdown run, bringing the Browns within seven with the score, 17-10. On the 9-play, 82-yard scoring drive the Browns rushed seven times for 72 yards. On their next offensive possession, the Browns orchestrated their longest drive of the season, in terms of number of plays. Cleveland rattled off 21 plays, totaling 62 yards, and capping the drive with a 36-yard Coons field goal. The 21-play series marked the most plays in a drive by an NFL team since Miami had a 21-play drive on Jan. 1, 2012. After the Cleveland defense forced a three-and-out, the Browns offense got the ball one final time trailing, 17-13, with 1:52 remaining in the game. However, the Browns were unable to score as the clock expired after Manziel hit WR Darius Jennings for a first down and 14-yard gain to move inside the Kansas City 20-yard line.

THE LAST TIME IN CLEVELAND

CHIEFS 7
BROWNS 30Dec. 9, 2012
Cleveland Browns Stadium
Cleveland, Ohio

The Browns won their third consecutive game as they defeated the Chiefs, 30-7, in Cleveland, Ohio. Kansas City struck first on its first offensive snap as running back Jamaal Charles broke an 80-yard run for a touchdown for a 7-0 advantage. That would be all the scoring the Chiefs could muster on the day as the Browns defense shut them out the rest of the way and Cleveland outscored Kansas City 30-0 the rest of the way. Kicker Phil Dawson connected on his 300th career field goal to put the Browns on the board with 3:53 left in the first quarter. Rookie wide receiver Travis Benjamin then returned a punt for a Browns record 93 yards in the second quarter to give the Browns a 10-7 lead heading into halftime. In the third stanza, rookie running back Trent Richardson scored on a one-yard run to push the Browns lead to 17-7. Dawson then connected on his second field goal of the day, this time from 24 yards out, giving the Browns the 20-7 advantage. In the fourth quarter, Richardson tied Jim Brown's rookie rushing touchdown record as he scored his ninth rushing touchdown of the season from one yard out giving the Browns a 27-7 lead. The score also tied Eric Metcalf's total rookie touchdown record of nine (both rushing and receiving). Dawson would then connect on his third field goal of the afternoon from 34 yards out to give the Browns the 30-7 victory.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

TEAM

- A win would improve the Browns to 3-5-1 (.389) on the year and would be the team's best start to a season since 2014, when they started the year 6-3 (.667).

OFFENSE

- A rushing score by any Brown will give the team 10 on the year and will be the most by a Browns team through the first nine games of a season since 2014 (12).
- With another successful two-point conversion, the 2018 Browns would set the franchise record for most in a single season (five).

RB Nick Chubb

- With another multi-touchdown performance, would become the first Browns rookie since Isaiah Crowell in 2014 to do so twice in a season. The total would tie for the second-most multi-touchdown games by a Browns rookie in the category.
- With another 100-yard performance, would become the first Browns rookie to do so multiple times in a season since Trent Richardson (three) in 2012. The two games would also tie for the second most in the category.

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

- With 50-plus receiving yards, will mark the 15th times he's done so in a single game and place him fifth among all active RBs in the category.
- With 56 receiving yards, will have 2,000 for his career.
- With 56 receiving yards, will have at least 1,200 rushing yards and 2,000 receiving yards, becoming the first player since Le'Veon Bell (2013-16) to have done so in the first four years of his career. Additionally, he will be just the 15th player ever and first Brown to accomplish the feat. He'll also join Bell as the only two active players to reach the milestone.

WR Jarvis Landry

- With at least 10 receptions, will have done so in nine games since 2015 and will tie him with Larry Fitzgerald and Julio Jones for second in the category since 2015.
- With at least 11 catches, will have done so in five games since 2015 and can tie Jones and Keenan Allen for second in the category.
- With at least a pair of catches, will have done so in 72 consecutive games, the longest streak in the league since 2014 and the second-longest active mark.
- With 100 receiving yards, will have done so in three of the first nine games of the season and will make him the first Brown to accomplish the feat since Gary Barnidge in 2015. The three games will also tie for the second-best total by a Brown in the category.
- With seven catches, will tie Kellen Winslow (56) for the most by a Brown through the first nine games of a season.

QB Baker Mayfield

- With at least 20 completions for 200-plus yards, will mark the fifth game he's done so and will be the second-highest total by a Browns rookie QB in a season. It will also tie for the most by a rookie Brown through the first nine games of a season and will tie for the fourth most by an NFL rookie over the same span.
- By throwing for a touchdown, 20 completions and 200 yards, he will join Andrew Luck (2012) and Marc Bulger (2002) as the only rookies ever to have done so in five of his first seven career games.
- By throwing multiple touchdowns, will have done so in four games this season, tying Tim Couch (1999) for the second most by a Browns rookie in a season.

TE David Njoku

- A receiving touchdown will be the seventh of his career and will tie Oscar Roan (1975-76) for the second most by a Browns TE in his first two career seasons.

DL Myles Garrett

- With at least one sack, will have 16 in his first 20 career games, tying for the seventh most in the category in league history.
- A half-sack will tie him with Jabaal Sheard (15.5, 2011-12) for third most by a Brown in his first two seasons.
- With multiple sacks, will have notched at least two in four games in the first nine games of the season, tying him for the third-best total in league history. It will also be the first instance since Justin Houston in 2014. His total of three is already the most ever in franchise history.
- Four games with multiple sacks will also tie him with Jamir Miller (2001) for the most by a Brown in a single season.
- With at least two sacks, will have done so in five career games to tie for the ninth-best mark by a player in his first two seasons and will tie for the most since Joey Bosa (five) in 2016-17.

DB Damarious Randall

- Another interception can tie him with Ha Ha Clinton-Dix and Darius Slay for the third-most interceptions by a single player since 2015 with 13.

DB Denzel Ward

- Another interception will be his fourth of the season and will be the first time a Brown has recorded that many through the first nine games of a season since Tashaun Gipson in 2014 (six). It will also be the first time a Browns rookie has done so since Anthony Henry in 2001. Ward will become the first Browns rookie to have at least four total interceptions in a season since Joe Haden in 2010 (six).

GIVE AND TAKE

After only forcing 13 turnovers in 2017, the Browns defense has already surpassed last season with a league-leading 22 takeaways this year (12 interceptions, 10 fumble recoveries), two of which came in last week's game at Pittsburgh. It's the unit's most takeaways through the first eight weeks of a season since 1982 (25). The unit currently has the most interceptions and has the most fumble recoveries in the NFL.

With the offense giving away eight interceptions and three fumbles this season, the Browns' turnover differential (+11) is the NFL's top tally. Last season, the Browns ranked last in the league with a -28 turnover differential.

BIG-TIME SECURITY

The 2018 Browns have a group of three players that each started all 16 games last season. OL **Joel Bitonio**, JC **Tretter** and **Kevin Zeitler** headline a front that helped the Browns offense rank sixth in rushing average (4.46). Since 2016, the Browns are second in the entire league in rushing average in such span (4.65). Bitonio is in his fifth NFL season, having spent his entire tenure in Cleveland.

SPECIAL FORCES UNIT

The Browns added experience to the special teams coaching staff, welcoming special teams coordinator **Amos Jones**. Jones, who most recently was special teams coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals for the past five seasons, is no stranger to the AFC North, having been on the Pittsburgh Steelers' staff from 2007-12. Under Jones' tutelage, two Cardinals special teamers were selected to Pro Bowls and K Chandler Catanzaro tied the NFL record for most consecutive made field goals to begin a career (17) in 2014. In his first season in the desert in 2013, Jones guided P Dave Zastudil to tie the NFL lead with 35 punts inside the 20-yard line. With the Steelers, Jones was a member of a staff that won Super Bowl XLIII, developed WR Antonio Brown into a Pro Bowl kick returner in 2011 and helped Pittsburgh lead the NFL with a franchise record of 1,581 return yards in 2009. Jones has a total of 37 years of coaching experience at the high school, college and professional levels.

RETURN POLICY

The Browns returners have combined for the league's seventh-most punt return yards (191), fourth-most kickoff return yards (459) and fourth-most total kick return yards (650) through the first eight games of 2018. On the opposite end, the Browns are ranked eighth in the league with 208 kickoff return yards against.

BONUS BALL

The Browns tied a franchise record by playing in their fourth overtime game in Week 7 this year. The team also played in four in 1989. The Browns are the first NFL team since Arizona in 2011 to play four overtime games in a season.

AWAKEN THE SLEEPING GIANT

General Manager **John Dorsey** was named to his current position on Dec. 7, 2017, following Week 13 of the 2017 NFL season. Since then, Dorsey has enhanced the roster through free agency and trades, as well as taking advantage of the Browns' draft selections.

Dorsey also bolstered the roster off the field, headlined by the additions of Assistant General Manager **Eliot Wolf** and vice president of player personnel **Alonzo Highsmith**. Both Wolf and Highsmith's connection to Dorsey spans from the trio's time and experience with the Green Bay Packers. Dorsey was first hired by the Packers as a college scout, joining Hall of Famer Ron Wolf's staff, who is also the father of Eliot.

Dorsey served as general manager of the Kansas City Chiefs from 2013-16. During that time, Dorsey's teams earned three postseason berths and a 2016 AFC West title. The Chiefs also won at least nine games a year in that span and registered a 43-21 (.672) overall record, the NFL's fourth-highest winning percentage.

As the Chiefs' GM, Dorsey selected three players who went on to earn first team All-Pro honors and were also selected to multiple Pro Bowls, including TE Travis Kelce (third round, 2013), CB Marcus Peters (first round, 2015) and WR Tyreek Hill (fifth round, 2016). In 2017, he drafted RB Kareem Hunt (third round), who led the NFL in rushing during his rookie season and was selected to the Pro Bowl. The year prior in 2016, LB D.J. Alexander (sixth round, 2015) was also selected to the Pro Bowl.

APRIL SHOWERS BRING PRO BOWL FLOWERS

Dorsey's career success in the spring has been evident in the winter, as he's selected a rookie Pro Bowler in each NFL Draft since 2015.

Rookie RB **Nick Chubb** ran with purpose in Week 4, rushing for 105 yards on three carries, including a 63-yard touchdown. The score was the longest run by a Browns rookie since Lee Suggs (78t) in Week 17 of 2003 and is the third-longest run in the NFL this season. Chubb is the first Browns rookie RB to eclipse the 100-yard rushing mark since Terrence West in Week 1 of 2014.

HEAD COACH GREGG WILLIAMS

Gregg Williams was named Browns interim head coach on Oct. 29, 2018. He has served as the team's defensive coordinator since Jan. 7, 2017. Williams also served as the head coach of the Buffalo Bills from 2001-03 and has 17 seasons of experience as an NFL defensive coordinator. His defenses have finished in the top five in total defense five times, including the top defense in the NFL in 2000. Williams also oversaw a Saints defensive unit that won Super Bowl XLIV and a Titans defense that advanced to Super Bowl XXXIV.

In his first season, the Browns defense made significant improvements in many categories. The Browns, who finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense in 2016, ranked 14th in total defense and seventh in rushing defense in 2017. Cleveland recorded its best finish in rush defense since 1992 and held opponents to a 3.35 rushing average. That figure was the second-best by a Browns team in a season, second in the NFL in 2017 and fifth in the NFL since 2009.

Williams helped Joe Schobert become the first Browns linebacker named to the Pro Bowl in 16 years. Schobert tied for first in the NFL with 144 tackles. Williams also helped develop defensive lineman Myles Garrett, the first overall pick of the 2017 NFL Draft. Garrett led the Browns with seven sacks, tied for second among all NFL rookies and third-most by a Browns rookie. Garrett joined Oakland defensive tackle Tommy Kelly (2004) and Cleveland linebacker Barkevious Mingo (2013) as the only NFL players since 2004 to record at least one sack in each of their first three NFL games. In his first game, Garrett recorded a sack on his first NFL play and became the only No. 1 overall pick to record multiple sacks in his NFL debut.

Williams spent the previous three seasons (2014-16) as the defensive coordinator for the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams. In 2016, the Rams defense finished in the top 10 in the NFL in total defense and passing defense. During his three seasons with the Rams, the team recorded 281 tackles for a loss, the second-most in the NFL during that span.

Williams also helped oversee the development of 2014 first-round pick Aaron Donald. Donald was voted the NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year and was selected to the Pro Bowl all three seasons under Williams.

Prior to his time with the Rams, Williams served as senior assistant defensive coach in Tennessee in 2013 and helped the team make significant improvements in nearly every defensive category. The Titans improved in points per game (16th from 32nd), total defense (14th from 27th), pass defense (11th from 26th) and third down defense (7th from 21st).

Williams served as defensive coordinator in New Orleans from 2009-11. He helped the Saints advance to the postseason all three years, capture division titles (2009 and 2011) and win Super Bowl XLIV. During his three seasons in New Orleans, the Saints posted a 37-11 regular season record, tied for the best in the NFL during that span. In 2010, the Saints allowed the fewest touchdown passes (13) in the league. In his first season with the Saints, he was in charge of a unit that recorded 35 defensive takeaways and returned seven for touchdowns.

He spent one season (2008) with Jacksonville as defensive coordinator/assistant head coach following four seasons (2004-07) as assistant head coach/defense with Washington. The Redskins had one of the NFL's top defenses over that span, allowing just 19.4 points per game and ranking sixth overall in defense during the four-season stretch. In 2005, the Redskins' defense was a key factor in the club making its first postseason appearance since 1999.

Prior to joining the Redskins, Williams spent three seasons (2001-03) as head coach of the Buffalo Bills, where the defense improved each season. The defense improved from 21st in the NFL in 2001 to 15th in 2002 to second in 2003.

Williams joined the NFL ranks in 1990 and spent 11 seasons with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans working his way up from defensive quality control coach (1990-92) to defensive coordinator (1997-00). He also served as special teams coach (1993) and linebackers coach (1994-96). In 1999, he helped the Titans advance to Super Bowl XXXIV. In 2000, Tennessee led the NFL in total defense for the first time in franchise history and allowed 191 points, the third-fewest in league history since the adoption of a 16-game schedule in 1978. The Titans also set club records for sacks (55), fewest passing yards allowed (2,424) and fewest touchdowns allowed (17).

Prior to arriving in the NFL, Williams was a graduate assistant at the University of Houston from 1988-89. From 1984-87, Williams was the head coach at Belton (Mo.) High School after opening his coaching career at his alma mater Excelsior Springs (Mo.) High School.

Williams graduated from Truman State University, where he played quarterback and also played baseball. He later earned a master's degree from Central Missouri.

Williams is passionate about giving back to the youth. Since 2004, Williams has helped raise more than \$2 million for Excelsior Springs young people through the Gregg Williams Foundation. The money raised annually provides two scholarships for Excelsior Springs High School graduates and funds both school and local youth athletics. In January of 2016, Williams was inducted into the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame. The induction celebrated his decorated NFL coaching career, as well his unwavering commitment to his home state of Missouri and the mentorship of young men.



THE GREGG WILLIAMS FOUNDATION

The Gregg Williams Foundation, Inc. was founded in December 2004 as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization to fund programs for kids in the Excelsior Springs, Mo. area. The Foundation also donates funds to various community organizations to help improve the community as a whole.

The Foundation hosts several fund-raising events throughout the Excelsior Springs area and beyond, but the primary source of income for the Foundation is derived from the various fund-raising activities around the annual Gregg Williams Tiger Classic Golf Tournament. This is a 3-day event which includes the Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony and Dinner, a Tiger Classic Reception & Dinner for all golfers, the Tiger Golf Classic Golf Tournament with various auctions, raffles, donations and sponsorships. The Tiger Classic is a large community event and sells out quickly each year with over 80 golf teams.

The Foundation has given back nearly \$750,000 to the schools and our community with a total community impact of over \$1 million since 2005.

The Cleveland Browns kicked off the 2018 season with a tie against the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-21. In the first tie for the Browns since 1989, the team's defense forced six turnovers for the first time since 2010. Rookie DB Denzel Ward became the first Browns DB to secure two interceptions in his NFL debut since 1971 (Clarence Scott). Browns DL Myles Garrett forced a career-best two fumbles, while matching career-best marks in tackles (six) and sacks (two). Following a scoreless first quarter, Steelers RB James Conner culminated a 10-play, 88-yard scoring drive ending in a four-yard touchdown run. After the 7-0 halftime break, Browns QB Tyrod Taylor led Cleveland on an opening-half possession that he ended with a 20-yard touchdown run by him, tying the game at 7-7. Pittsburgh answered as QB Ben Roethlisberger found WR Antonio Brown for a 22-yard touchdown pass on the ensuing possession. After forcing the Browns to punt, Conner found the end zone again for his second score of the game, giving the Steelers their largest lead of the game, 21-7. After recovering the team's second fumble of the game, Browns RB Carlos Hyde punched in a one-yard score. Before the final whistle of regulation, Taylor found WR Josh Gordon for a 17-yard strike with 1:58 remaining in regulation to tie the game, 21-21. In the OT period, each team exchanged possessions with punts, before the Steelers put together an eight-play, 31-yard drive to set up a K Chris Boswell game-winning field goal attempt, but Boswell's try missed to the left. Following a Cleveland punt, Roethlisberger was strip-sacked by LB Genard Avery on the following possession. The ensuing Browns K Zane Gonzalez game-winning field goal attempt was blocked by Steelers LB TJ Watt, forcing the teams to tie, 21-21.

In the first road game of 2018, the Cleveland Browns fell to the New Orleans Saints, 21-18. Despite leading 12-3 going into the final quarter, the Saints rallied to score 18 points in the final 8:41 of the contest, securing the victory. K Zane Gonzalez opened the scoring for the Browns with his first of two 39-yard, first-half field goals. However, Saints K Wil Lutz provided an equalizing field goal on the ensuing possession. At the half, the Browns went into the locker room with a 6-3 lead. New Orleans punted on the opening possession of the second half, as RB Carlos Hyde capped a 12-play, 79-yard drive with a one-yard rushing touchdown. On the Saints' first drive of the fourth quarter, WR Michael Thomas caught his first of two fourth quarter touchdowns from QB Drew Brees. Following a Browns QB Tyrod Taylor interception, New Orleans took their first lead of the game after another with Thomas' second score. The Cleveland Browns defeated the New York Jets on Thursday Night Football, 21-17, securing the team's first win since Week 16 of the 2016 season. Browns rookie QB Baker Mayfield entered the game prior to the end of the first half due to an injury suffered by QB Tyrod Taylor, propelling Cleveland to 14 unanswered points and a fourth-quarter touchdown en route to a victory. Mayfield finished the game with 17 completions on 23 attempts for 201 yards, scoring on the receiving end of a two-point conversion attempt thrown by WR Jarvis Landry. Landry added eight receptions for 103 yards, his best single-game showing as a Brown. Following a scoreless first quarter, Jets RB Isaiah Crowell opened the scoring for New York, rushing in from seven yards out four seconds into the second quarter. After a Cleveland punt on the ensuing possession, Crowell scored for the second time of the evening from two yards out, capping a 10-play, 63-yard touchdown drive. Down 14-0, and following the Taylor injury, Mayfield entered the game and led the Browns on a six-play, 39-yard drive for a 45-yard field goal from newly-acquired K Greg Joseph. The Jets took their 14-3 lead into the intermission. Following a strip forced fumble by Browns DB Denzel Ward of Jets WR Robby Anderson, Joseph connected on his second field goal, this time from 27 yards out to draw the Browns within one score. Before the final whistle of the third quarter, Browns RB Carlos Hyde capped a 69-yard scoring drive with a goal-line plunge from one yard out. The ensuing two-point conversion attempt was successful, as Landry's end around pass found Mayfield in the corner of the end zone. Jets K Jason Myers ended Cleveland's 14-point burst with a field goal from 28 yards out, giving Cleveland the ball back with 8:55 remaining in regulation. On the next drive, Hyde scored his second one-yard touchdown rush of the game to end a 15-play drive, giving the Browns their first lead of the contest. On a third-down attempt, LB Joe Schobert intercepted Jets QB Sam Darnold's pass. Following a Browns punt, Darnold threw his second pick of the game, as DB Terrance Mitchell picked off his sixth career interception to secure the win for Cleveland.

The Cleveland Browns fell to the Oakland Raiders, 45-42, in the team's second overtime game of the season. Though leading by 14 points midway through the fourth quarter, the Browns allowed the Raiders to score 21 fourth-quarter points and the eventual game-winning field goal in the overtime period. Rookie QB Baker Mayfield, in his first career NFL start, threw for 295 yards and two touchdowns on 21 completions. Fellow rookie, RB Nick Chubb, rushed for 105 yards and a pair of scores on just three carries, a franchise rookie record. DBs E.J. Gaines and Damarious Randall each had an interception, giving the Browns 13 takeaways through the first four games of the season for the first time since 1989. RB Carlos Hyde also scored on the ground for a league-best fifth time this season. Following an exchange of punts to begin the game, Mayfield's second drive ended in an interception returned for a touchdown by Oakland DB Gareon Conley. Down, 7-0, the Browns rallied by scoring 17 unanswered points before the end of the first half. A field goal from K Greg Joseph with two minutes remaining in the first quarter got Cleveland on the board, along with a 63-yard score by Chubb. Following an Oakland missed field goal, Mayfield found TE Darren Fells for a 49-yard passing score, capping a four-play, 70-yard drive. Mayfield's connection with Fells was his first career touchdown pass. The Browns' ensuing two-point conversion attempt was successful, as RB Duke Johnson Jr. ran around the left end to put the Browns ahead by 10 points. However, the Raiders answered with a receiving score from WR Amari Cooper, leading to the halftime score of 17-14 in favor of Cleveland. The Browns scored on each of their first two drives in the second half, with a Joseph field goal and a WR Jarvis Landry touchdown reception, the first in his Browns career. After two fumbles and three punts on five possessions, the Raiders scored 13 unanswered points to take a 34-28 lead with less than 11 minutes remaining in regulation. Returning the favor, Hyde capped a seven-play, 77-yard drive with a one-yard rushing score after WR Antonio Callaway's 59-yard reception to set it up. Later, Chubb scored again with a 41-yard touchdown before Oakland put together a six-play, 53-yard scoring drive with a touchdown pass to TE Jared Cook from QB Derek Carr. The Raiders converted the two-point conversion attempt with a WR Jordy Nelson catch, taking the game into overtime, 42-42. Raiders K Matt McCrane missed his first field goal attempt on the team's first possession, but after forcing a Browns punt on the following drive, he redeemed himself and connected on a 29-yard attempt to secure Oakland's first win of the season.

The Cleveland Browns defeated the Baltimore Ravens in overtime, 12-9, the franchise's first win on a Sunday since 2015. With the win, Cleveland advanced to 2-2-1 on the season, the team's best start to a season since 2014 (3-2). Browns rookie QB Baker Mayfield threw for 342 yards on 25 completions and a touchdown. The 342 yards in a single game are the second most by a Browns rookie in franchise history. After a Mayfield pick on Cleveland's first offensive drive, Baltimore capped a four-play drive with a 44-yard field goal by K Justin Tucker to give the Ravens the early 3-0 lead. The three-point lead was Baltimore's only lead of the contest. With 40 seconds before the halftime whistle, Mayfield found WR Rashard Higgins for Higgins' first score of the 2018 season. Each team notched on a field goal in the third quarter, with Browns K Greg Joseph and Tucker connecting from 35 yards and 25 yards out, respectively. Later, Tucker would register his third field goal of the contest, this time from 32-yarder, to draw the score at 9-9. In the Browns' third overtime game of the year, each team exchanged punts after the Browns took the ball to start the overtime period. Getting the ball at the Cleveland 16 yard line, Mayfield orchestrated a seven-play, 65-yard drive to set up Joseph for a 37-yard game winner.

The Cleveland Browns fell to the Los Angeles Chargers, 38-14, for the second time in as many seasons, at FirstEnergy Stadium. Led by RB Melvin Gordon III's three rushing touchdowns and WR Tyrell Williams' two receiving touchdowns, the Chargers scored five total times and collected 449 yards of total offense. Browns QB Baker Mayfield accounted for 238 yards on 22 completions, adding a fourth-quarter touchdown to TE David Njoku. K Greg Joseph connected on two second-quarter field goals and Mayfield found WR Antonio Callaway on a successful two-point conversion attempt to account for Cleveland's 14 points. The Browns have now successfully converted four two-point conversion attempts on the season, the first time that a Browns team has had four in a single season since 1994. After Gordon III's first rushing touchdown in the first quarter, Joseph connected on a 33-yard field goal less than three minutes into the second frame to give the Browns their first points. Los Angeles tallied on Williams' two receiving touchdowns, before Joseph hit his second field goal of the game, this time from 28 yards out. At the half, the score was 21-6, in favor of the Chargers. Out of the intermission, Gordon III had his final two out of three total rushing touchdowns, giving the Bolts their largest lead of the game (29 points) through three quarters of play. In the fourth quarter, Mayfield orchestrated a seven-play, 42-yard drive that was capped by Njoku's touchdown. K Michael Badgley made a 44-yard field goal with four minutes remaining to finalize the score, 38-14.

BUCCANEERS 26**Oct. 21, 2018 (OT)
Raymond James Stadium, Tampa, Fla.

In Cleveland's fourth overtime game of the season, the Browns fell on the road to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, 26-23. The overtime matchup tied a franchise record for overtime games in a season. Despite scoring two touchdowns in the fourth quarter and overcoming a 14-point halftime deficit, the Browns fell to 2-4-1 on the season when Buccaneers K Chandler Catanzaro made a 59-yard field goal in extra time. Browns QB Baker Mayfield completed 23 of 34 passes for 215 yards and two touchdowns. WR Jarvis Landry paced Cleveland's offense by setting a season-high mark of 10 receptions and accounted for 97 yards. Landry also caught his second touchdown of the season. The Browns forced four turnovers against the Buccaneers, advancing their season mark to 20 takeaways. Browns P Britton Colquitt averaged a season-best 51.7 yards per punt, notching a career-long 79 yard punt before the end of the first half to pin the Buccaneers at their own one-yard line. On Tampa Bay's opening drive, Browns DL Trevon Coley stopped Bucs RB Peyton Barber in the end zone for a safety, opening the afternoon's scoring. However, Cleveland would punt on each of their first six possessions, while Tampa Bay took a 16-2 lead after the first half. After the half and down by two touchdowns, Mayfield threw his first touchdown pass of the afternoon to TE David Njoku to bring the Browns within one score. Tampa Bay answered with RB Ronald Jones' rushing score from two yards out, capping a 13-play, 73-yard series. Cleveland answered by orchestrating their longest drive of the game, as rookie RB Nick Chubb rushed for a one-yard score less than three minutes into the fourth quarter. After a DB Jabrill Peppers 32-yard punt return to put the Browns inside of Tampa Bay's 20-yard line, Mayfield found Landry for the game-tying score with less than three minutes remaining in regulation. Set up for a game-winning field goal, Catanzaro missed wide right as time expired to force overtime. Browns LB Jamie Collins Sr. intercepted Bucs QB Jameis Winston on the first drive, but after an exchange of punts, Catanzaro redeemed himself by connecting on a 59-yard boot to down the Browns.

Heinz Field, Pittsburgh, Pa.

The Cleveland Browns fell to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 33-18, at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh, Pa. The loss was Cleveland's first in 2018 division play. The 1-1-1 start against division opponents is the club's best mark through the first three divisional games since 2013 (2-1). The Browns opened the game with an 11-play, 66-yard scoring drive that was capped by K Greg Joseph's 34-yard field goal, which was Cleveland's first score on an opening possession this season. Following Browns DB Derrick Kindred's interception, Joseph connected on his second attempt of the day from 45 yards out to give the Browns a 6-0 lead at the end of the first quarter. Pittsburgh answered early in the second quarter with a 43-yard touchdown pass from QB Ben Roethlisberger to WR Antonio Brown. Steelers DB Joe Haden intercepted Mayfield, as Pittsburgh orchestrated a 16-play, 87-yard drive, capped by a Brown receiving touchdown to lead 14-6 at the half. In the second half, Pittsburgh gained two points off a safety, as Browns OL Desmond Harrison was called for a holding penalty in the Browns' end zone. A free kick ensued, which the Browns recovered, setting up a WR Antonio Callaway one-yard receiving touchdown from Mayfield. After the missed extra point, Pittsburgh put together a five-play, 75-yard scoring drive, capped by a Conner 12-yard touchdown run. After regaining possession off of an exchange of punts, Steelers K Chris Boswell connected from 49 yards out, his longest kick of the season, to give Pittsburgh a 26-12 lead through three and a half quarters. Conner added an exclamation point to Pittsburgh's day, scoring a 22-yard rushing touchdown just before the two-minute warning. Browns TE Seth DeVale caught his first touchdown of the season with six seconds remaining in regulation to give Mayfield his second passing score of the game. A failed two-point conversion attempt drew the final tally to 33-18.
