NOTABLE STORYLINES

• This week, the Browns travel to Denver, Colo. for the team's second primetime game of the season on Sat., Dec. 15 at 8:20 p.m. ET against the Denver Broncos. The Browns look to take down the Broncos for the first time since 1990 and last saw them in 2015.

• Last week against the Carolina Panthers, the Browns moved to 5-7-1 on the season and grabbed their third win in the past four games. The back-and-forth battle ended in a 26-20 Browns victory at home, after rookie RB **Nick Chubb** rushed for the go-ahead touchdown in the fourth quarter and the Browns defense kept the Panthers off the scoreboard in the game's final 15 minutes.

• The win helped the Browns improve to 4-2-1 at home, their second-best winning percentage in Cleveland since 1999.

• WR **Jarvis Landry** caught three passes for 57 yards and a score, while also rushing for 54 yards on two carries and his second-career rushing touchdown against the Panthers. He also became the first Brown since Leroy Hoard (Nov. 24, 1991) with a 50-yard rush and a 50-yard catch in the same game. Landry has recorded at least two receptions in each of his past 76 games, the second-longest active streak in the NFL, and his 469 receptions are the most all time by an NFL player through their first five seasons. He leads the team in receptions (69) and receiving yards (790) this season and his 69 receptions tie for the sixth most by a Brown through the first 14 weeks of a season.

• Rookie QB **Baker Mayfield** completed 18 of 22 passes for 238 yards with one touchdown and zero interceptions and a 126.9 rating. Mayfield has thrown at least one touchdown pass in each of his 10 starts, joining St. Louis' Kurt Warner (1999) and Minnesota's Brad Johnson (1996-97) as the only NFL players since 1966 to throw at least one score in each of their first 10 career starts. He's also the first Browns QB since Bernie Kosar (1987) to throw for at least one touchdown in 10 consecutive starts. Mayfield's 19 passing touchdowns this season are the most by a Browns rookie, while his 2,877 passing yards are third.

• DL **Myles Garrett** recorded one sack to increase his 2018 team-leading total to 12.5, third all time by a Brown in a season. With 19.5 sacks in just 24 career games, Garrett possesses the record for most sacks by a Brown in their first two seasons, which are also tied for ninth most by any NFL player in their first 24 career games.

• Chubb's go-ahead rushing touchdown last week marked his fifth-straight game with at least one rushing score, the first Brown to accomplish the feat since Greg Pruitt in 1975.



Gregg Williams: 20-33, fourth season as a head coach, first with the Browns. Gregg Williams was named Browns interim head coach on Oct. 29, 2018. He has served as the team's defensive coordinator since Jan. 7, 2017. Williams also served as the head coach of the Buffalo Bills from 2001-03 and has 17 seasons of experience as an NFL defensive coordinator. His defenses have finished in the top five in total defense five times, including the top defense in the NFL in 2000. Williams also oversaw a Saints defensive unit that won Super Bowl XLIV and a Titans defense that advanced to Super Bowl XXXIV.

Vance Joseph: 11-18, second season as a head coach, second with the Broncos. Vance Joseph was named head coach of the Denver Broncos on Jan. 11, 2017. Joseph has spent the past two seasons at the helm of the Denver Broncos, after spending the 2016 season as defensive coordinator of the Miami Dolphins. Prior to Miami, Joseph was an assistant DBs coach for 10 seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals, Houston Texans and San Francisco 49ers. As a player, Joseph accrued seasons with the Jets and the Colts, logging two INTs in 13 games played in his rookie season with New York.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Browns P **Britton Colquitt** was a member of Denver's Super Bowl 50 championship team. Colquitt spent six seasons in the Mile High City, and set the Broncos franchise record for net punting average (42.1) in 2012.
- Broncos CB **Jamar Taylor** spent 2016-17 in the secondary of the Cleveland Browns. Taylor was a team captain for Cleveland in 2017 and started 15 of 16 games played.
- Broncos QB **Kevin Hogan** spent 2016-17 with the Browns, playing in eight total games and starting one. Hogan set the club record for longest TD run by a QB in 2016, becoming the first rookie QB to rush for over 100 yards in a game.
- Broncos head coach **Vance Joseph** coached the DBs at Bowling Green State University in 2004. Broncos WR coach **Zach Azzanni** was also on BGSU's staff in 2004 alongside of Joseph, assisting in the same capacity.
- Browns RB **Nick Chubb** and Broncos OLB **Bradley Chubb** are cousins. Both were selected in the first two rounds of the 2018 NFL Draft.
- Browns OL coach **Bob Wylie** served in the same capacity in Denver in 2010. Wylie was also Colorado State's OL coach from 1988-89.
- Broncos assistant DL coach **Chris Beake** was an offensive assistant for the Browns from 2011-12.
- Broncos offensive coordinator **Bill Musgrave** was QB coach of the Washington Redskins in 2005, where Browns head coach **Gregg Williams** served on the same staff as assistant head coach/defense.
- Broncos defensive coordinator **Joe Woods** started his coaching career in the state of Ohio, coaching the DBs at Muskingum College (New Concord, Ohio) in 1992. Broncos QB coach **Mike Sullivan** also has coaching ties to Ohio, having coached the DBs at Youngstown State University from 1997-98 and at Ohio University in 2001.
- Broncos director of pro personnel **A.J. Durso** was a pro scout for the Browns from 2010-12.
- Browns defensive quality control coach **Scott Kaniecki** was an assistant coach at the Colorado School of Mines from 2012-14.
- Broncos assistant to the head coach **Rob Grosso** is a graduate of John Carroll University (2016).
- Broncos TE **Jake Butt** (Pickerington), S **Dymonte Thomas** (Alliance), CB **Linden Stephens** (Euclid) and DE **Derek Wolfe** (Lisbon) are Ohio natives.
- Broncos TE **Jeff Heurman** and DB **Bradley Roby** played collegiately at Ohio State, while Stephens and Wolfe played at Cincinnati.

The Denver Broncos defeated the Browns, 26-23, in OT at FirstEnergy Stadium with Broncos K Brandon McManus sealing the game in OT with a 34-yard field goal. Cleveland obtained the lead late in the game after scoring 16 fourth-quarter points and not allowing an offensive TD until eight minutes remained in the game. The Browns played in consecutive OT games for the first time since 2002. LB Karlos Dansby recorded the first of his two interceptions of the day on Denver's first offensive possession of the game. Following a turnover on downs by Cleveland, McManus put the Broncos on the board first with a 29-yard field goal with 2:53 remaining in the first quarter. On the ensuing Browns drive, Broncos CB Aqib Talib intercepted a McCown pass, returning the takeaway 63 yards for a TD to propel Denver to a 10-0 halftime lead. The Browns received the ball after the half and marched down the field on an 8-play, 74-yard scoring drive, capped by TE Gary Barnidge's 11-yard touchdown reception from McCown. Barnidge joined Pro Football HOF TE Ozzie Newsome as the only Browns TEs to record a receiving TD in four consecutive games. The Broncos extended their lead, 13-7, late in the third quarter on 25-yard McManus field goal, then added another FG early in the fourth to go up, 16-7. Cleveland responded with an 80-yard drive, which was finished off with another Barnidge TD catch. The Browns took the lead, 20-16, on the following Denver series when Dansby intercepted Broncos QB Peyton Manning for the second time and returned it for a score. Denver regained the lead, 23-20, down the stretch. Then, for the second week in a row, McCown led the offense on a game-tying fourth quarter drive, which was finished off with a 26-yard Coons FG. In OT, Denver had first possession, but Cleveland's LB Barkevious Mingo intercepted Manning 36 seconds into the extra frame. The Browns were unable to capitalize on the turnover and were forced to punt the ball away. Following the punt, Manning helped set up McManus for a game-winning FG.

The Cleveland Browns fell to the Denver Broncos, 34-12, at Sports Authority Field at Mile High. On the first drive of the game, Broncos QB Peyton Manning connected with Demaryius Thomas for a 22-yard touchdown to give the Broncos the early 7-0 advantage. The Browns responded on their first possession as QB Brandon Weeden led a 14-play, 63-yard drive capped off by a 27-yard field goal from K Phil Dawson to cut the lead to 7-3. In the second quarter, Manning would connect with WR Eric Decker for a 10-yard touchdown to give the Broncos a 14-3 advantage heading into the half. In the second half, the Browns took the opening possession 45 yards over nine plays to set up Dawson for a 53-yard field goal which cut the lead to 14-6. Manning would then connect with Decker for a second time, this time from eight yards out, giving the Broncos a 21-3 advantage. In the fourth quarter, the Broncos would tack on 10 more points before QB Colt McCoy would throw his first touchdown of the season to WR Greg Little to cut the lead to 31-12 as the two point conversion failed. A Broncos K Matt Prater FG with two minutes to go would account for the Broncos' final three points.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

Team

- A rushing score by any Brown will give the team 15 on the year and will be the most by a Browns team through the first 14 games of a season since 2014 (16).
- With another successful two-point conversion, the 2018 Browns would set the franchise record for most in a single season (five).
- With a takeaway, will become the first Browns team since 2008 (29) to have at least 29 takeaways through the first 14 games of a season.
- A win would mark the team's sixth victory this season and would be the fifth time a Browns team won six times through the first 14 games since the team returned in 1999 (2014, 2007, 2002 and 2001).

RB Nick Chubb

- With another multi-rushing touchdown performance, would become the first Browns rookie since Isaiah Crowell in 2014 to do so twice in a season. The total would tie for the second-most multi-touchdown games by a Browns rookie in the category.
- With another 100-yard performance, would become the first Browns rookie to do so three times in a season since Trent Richardson in 2012 (three), tying a franchise record.
- With another 40-plus-yard rushing touchdown, would join New York Giants rookie RB Saquon Barkley in becoming the first NFL players since Doug Martin and Adrian Peterson in 2012 to do so four times in a season.
- Is 90 scrimmage yards away from 1,000 and tying William Green in 2002 for the fourth most by a Browns rookie in history. He would also become just the second Browns rookie since 2012 to eclipse 1,000 scrimmage yards in a season and the fifth overall.
- A rushing and receiving score will mark the first time since Gale Sayers in 1965 a rookie has done so in three games.
- With at least 50 scrimmage yards and a score of any kind, will be the first Brown to have done so in six straight games since Bo Scott in 1970. He will be the first Browns rookie to have done so in seven games since Trent Richardson in 2012 and will tie Paul Warfield in 1964 for third in the category.
- Could become the first Brown to rush for a touchdown in six straight games since Leroy Kelly in 1968 (nine).

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

- With 50-plus receiving yards, will mark the 16th times he's done so in a single game and will tie him fifth among all active RBs in the category (LeSean McCoy).
- With a receiving touchdown, will have nine for his career and will have the second most by a Browns RB since 1999, behind Steve Heiden (12).

WR Jarvis Landry

- With at least 10 receptions, will have done so in nine games since 2015 and will tie him with Larry Fitzgerald for third in the category since that time. With at least 11 catches, will have done so in five games since 2015 and can place fourth in the category.
- With at least a pair of catches, will have done so in 77 consecutive games, the longest streak in the league since 2014 and the second-longest active mark.
- With 100 receiving yards, will have done so in four of 14 games this season and will make him the first Brown to accomplish the feat since Josh Gordon in 2013 (seven). The four games will also tie for the second-best total by a Brown in a season.
- With 13 catches, will pass Ozzie Newsome (82) in 1984 for the most receptions by a Brown through the first 14 games of a season.

- A rushing and receiving touchdown will mark the ninth time in Browns history a player has done so twice in a season and will be the second time a Brown has accomplished the feat in consecutive games (Nick Chubb, 2018).

QB Baker Mayfield

- With at least 20 completions for 200-plus yards, will mark the seventh game he's done so and will be the second-highest total by a Browns rookie QB in a season. It will also tie Dak Prescott (2016), Marcus Mariota (2015), Sam Bradford (2010) and Jim Kelly (1986) for the fifth most by a rookie QB in the first 14 games of a season and will tie Mariota and Prescott for the seventh most in a season.
- By throwing for a touchdown, 20 completions and 200 yards, will have done so in seven games this season. He'll be in second place on the list of rookies who have accomplished the feat in their first 12 career games.
- By throwing multiple touchdowns, will have done so in seven games this season, already the most by a Browns rookie in a year. The seven games will also be the most by Browns QB since Derek Anderson (10) in 2007. He will also tie for the fourth most by an NFL rookie in a season, along with Prescott (2016), Dan Marino (1983) and Peyton Manning (1998).
- A passing score will mark the first time a Brown has done so in 11 straight starts in a season since Bernie Kosar (12) in 1987.
- Is 18 passing yards away from passing DeShone Kizer (2,894) for the second-most passing yards by a Browns rookie.
- Would tie Marino's record (1983) for most touchdown passes in a rookie's first 12 career games since the 1970 merger with one passing score.
- Could become the first QB since Kurt Warner (1999) to throw for at least one touchdown in a player's first 11 consecutive starts.
- Could become the first Brown since Bill Nelsen in 1968 to throw a completion for 60 yards or longer in three consecutive games.

DL Myles Garrett

- With at least 1.5 sacks, will have 21 in his first 25 career games, tying Reggie White (1985-86) and Dwight Freeney (2002-03) for seventh in the category.
- With multiple sacks, will have notched at least two in four of the first 14 games of the season, tying Jamir Miller in 2001 for the team record. It will also tie Miller for the most by a Brown in a year.
- With at least two sacks, will have done so in five career games to tie for the fourth-best mark by a player in his first two seasons and will tie for the most since Joey Bosa (five) in 2016-17.
- With a sack, will have dropped a QB in four consecutive games for the first time by a Brown since Anthony Pleasant in 1995 (five).

DB Damarious Randall

- Another interception can tie him with Darius Slay for the third-most interceptions by a single player since 2015 with 15.
- Another interception will be his fifth of the season and will be the first time a Brown has recorded that many through the first 14 games of a season since Tashaun Gipson in 2014 (six).

DB Denzel Ward

- Another interception will be his fourth of the season and will be the first time a Brown has recorded that many through the first 14 games of a season since Tashaun Gipson in 2014 (six). It will also be the first time a Browns rookie has done so since Anthony Henry in 2001. Ward will become the first Browns rookie to have at least four total interceptions in a season since Joe Haden in 2010 (six).

P Britton Colquitt

- With three punts inside the 20, will mark a new team record for a single season (33).

GIVE AND TAKE

After only forcing 13 turnovers in 2017, the Browns defense has already surpassed last season with a second-ranked 28 takeaways this year (15 interceptions, 13 fumble recoveries). The Browns' Week 12 35-20 win over Cincinnati Bengals, marked their first on the road since October 2015 and gave the club its first back-to-back victories since November 2014. Additionally, they won back-to-back games by double digits for the first time since 2013 and moved to 4-6-1 on the season, their most wins since 2014. The Browns are currently 2-1-1 in division play, their best start since the formation of the AFC North in 2002.

SPECIAL FORCES UNIT

The Browns added experience to the special teams coaching staff, welcoming special teams coordinator **Amos Jones**. Jones, who most recently was special teams coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals for the past five seasons, is no stranger to the AFC North, having been on the Pittsburgh Steelers' staff from 2007-12. Under Jones' tutelage, two Cardinals special teamers were selected to Pro Bowls and K Chandler Catanzaro tied the NFL record for most consecutive made field goals to begin a career (17) in 2014. In his first season in the desert in 2013, Jones guided P Dave Zastudil to tie the NFL lead with 35 punts inside the 20-yard line. With the Steelers, Jones was a member of a staff that won Super Bowl XLIII, developed WR Antonio Brown into a Pro Bowl kick returner in 2011 and helped Pittsburgh lead the NFL with a franchise record of 1,581 return yards in 2009. Jones has a total of 37 years of coaching experience at the high school, college and professional levels.

AWAKEN THE SLEEPING GIANT

General Manager **John Dorsey** was named to his current position on Dec. 7, 2017, following Week 13 of the 2017 NFL season. Since then, Dorsey has enhanced the roster through free agency and trades, as well as taking advantage of the Browns' draft selections.

Dorsey also bolstered the roster off the field, headlined by the additions of Assistant General Manager **Eliot Wolf** and vice president of player personnel **Alonzo Highsmith**. Both Wolf and Highsmith's connection to Dorsey spans from the trio's time and experience with the Green Bay Packers. Dorsey was first hired by the Packers as a college scout, joining Hall of Famer Ron Wolf's staff, who is also the father of Eliot.

Dorsey served as general manager of the Kansas City Chiefs from 2013-16. During that time, Dorsey's teams earned three postseason berths and a 2016 AFC West title. The Chiefs also won at least nine games a year in that span and registered a 43-21 (.672) overall record, the NFL's fourth-highest winning percentage.

As the Chiefs' GM, Dorsey selected three players who went on to earn first team All-Pro honors and were also selected to multiple Pro Bowls, including TE Travis Kelce (third round, 2013), CB Marcus Peters (first round, 2015) and WR Tyreek Hill (fifth round, 2016). In 2017, he drafted RB Kareem Hunt (third round), who led the NFL in rushing during his rookie season and was selected to the Pro Bowl. The year prior in 2016, LB D.J. Alexander (sixth round, 2015) was also selected to the Pro Bowl.

APRIL SHOWERS BRING PRO BOWL FLOWERS

Dorsey's career success in the spring has been evident in the winter, as he's selected a rookie Pro Bowler in each NFL Draft since 2015.





Among active players, Garrett has posted multiple sacks on four occasions to tie for the NFL's eighth-best total in a player's first two career seasons.





He also joined Aaron Rodgers (Weeks 7, 9-10 in 2011) and Pro Football Hall of Famer Kurt Warner (Weeks 3-5 in 1999) as the only QBs in NFL history to record a passer rating of 140 or higher in consecutive games (minimum 20 attempts). 
Now, Mayfield has thrown at least one touchdown pass in each of his first 10 career starts and joined Pro Football Hall of Famer Kurt Warner (1999) and Brad Johnson (1996-97) as the only QBs in the Super Bowl era with a touchdown pass in each of his first 10 career starts.

A NOT-SO-HALF EFFORT

In the second half against the Houston Texans in Week 13, Mayfield completed 24 of 30 passes for 351 yards. His 351 passing yards in second half were the most in a half by a QB since Patriots QB Tom Brady had 367 passing yards in the second half on Dec. 16, 2012.

IN THE NICK OF TIME

Rookie RB **Nick Chubb** has been running with purpose since entering the league this season. Chubb rushed for 105 yards on three carries, including a 63-yard touchdown, at Oakland in Week 4. The score was the longest run by a Browns rookie since Lee Suggs (78t) in Week 17 of 2003 and was the third-longest run in the NFL this season. Chubb also became the first Browns rookie RB to eclipse the 100-yard rushing mark since Terrence West in Week 1 of 2014.

That was until Week 10 against Atlanta, when Chubb registered a career-high 176 rushing yards, including a 92-yard touchdown. The score became the longest in Browns history and the second-longest by a rookie in NFL history, behind Pittsburgh's Bobby Gage in 1949 (97). He now has nine (seven rushing, two receiving) touchdowns on the season, with three of the scores coming from 40-plus yards (92, 63 and 41). Chubb is the first player since Doug Martin in 2012 with at least three rushing touchdowns of 40-plus yards in his first 10 career games.

With three rushing touchdowns coming from at least 40 yards out (92, 63 and 41), Chubb became the first player to do so in a season since Adrian Peterson in 2015, first rookie since Doug Martin in 2012, first Brown since Leroy Kelly in 1966 and is the first Browns rookie to reach the mark.

New York Giants' rookie RB Saquon Barkley joined Chubb (78, 68, 51 and 50) in the category following Week 12.



He joined Clarence Scott (Sept. 19, 1971) as the only Browns rookies to record two interceptions in their NFL debut. He's the first Browns rookie to record two interceptions in a game since T.J. HEAD COACH GREGG WILLIAMS

Gregg Williams was named Browns interim head coach on Oct. 29, 2018. He has served as the team's defensive coordinator since Jan. 7, 2017. Williams also served as the head coach of the Buffalo Bills from 2001-03 and has 17 seasons of experience as an NFL defensive coordinator. His defenses have finished in the top five in total defense five times, including the top defense in the NFL in 2000. Williams also oversaw a Saints defensive unit that won Super Bowl XLIV and a Titans defense that advanced to Super Bowl XXXIV.

In his first season, the Browns defense made significant improvements in many categories. The Browns, who finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense in 2016, ranked 14th in total defense and seventh in rushing defense in 2017. Cleveland recorded its best finish in rush defense since 1992 and held opponents to a 3.35 rushing average. That figure was the second-best by a Browns team in a season, second in the NFL in 2017 and fifth in the NFL since 2009.

Williams helped Joe Schobert become the first Browns linebacker named to the Pro Bowl in 16 years. Schobert tied for first in the NFL with 144 tackles. Williams also helped develop defensive lineman Myles Garrett, the first overall pick of the 2017 NFL Draft. Garrett led the Browns with seven sacks, tied for second among all NFL rookies and third-most by a Browns rookie. Garrett joined Oakland defensive tackle Tommy Kelly (2004) and Cleveland linebacker Barkevious Mingo (2013) as the only NFL players since 2004 to record at least one sack in each of their first three NFL games. In his first game, Garrett recorded a sack on his first NFL play and became the only No. 1 overall pick to record multiple sacks in his NFL debut.

Williams spent the previous three seasons (2014-16) as the defensive coordinator for the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams. In 2016, the Rams defense finished in the top 10 in the NFL in total defense and passing defense. During his three seasons with the Rams, the team recorded 281 tackles for a loss, the second-most in the NFL during that span.

Williams also helped oversee the development of 2014 first-round pick Aaron Donald. Donald was voted the NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year and was selected to the Pro Bowl all three seasons under Williams.

Prior to his time with the Rams, Williams served as senior assistant defensive coach in Tennessee in 2013 and helped the team make significant improvements in nearly every defensive category. The Titans improved in points per game (16th from 32nd), total defense (14th from 27th), pass defense (11th from 26th) and third down defense (7th from 21st).

Williams served as defensive coordinator in New Orleans from 2009-11. He helped the Saints advance to the postseason all three years, capture division titles (2009 and 2011) and win Super Bowl XLIV. During his three seasons in New Orleans, the Saints posted a 37-11 regular season record, tied for the best in the NFL during that span. In 2010, the Saints allowed the fewest touchdown passes (13) in the league. In his first season with the Saints, he was in charge of a unit that recorded 35 defensive takeaways and returned seven for touchdowns.

He spent one season (2008) with Jacksonville as defensive coordinator/assistant head coach following four seasons (2004-07) as assistant head coach/defense with Washington. The Redskins had one of the NFL's top defenses over that span, allowing just 19.4 points per game and ranking sixth overall in defense during the four-season stretch. In 2005, the Redskins' defense was a key factor in the club making its first postseason appearance since 1999.

Prior to joining the Redskins, Williams spent three seasons (2001-03) as head coach of the Buffalo Bills, where the defense improved each season. The defense improved from 21st in the NFL in 2001 to 15th in 2002 to second in 2003.

Williams joined the NFL ranks in 1990 and spent 11 seasons with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans working his way up from defensive quality control coach (1990-92) to defensive coordinator (1997-00). He also served as special teams coach (1993) and linebackers coach (1994-96). In 1999, he helped the Titans advance to Super Bowl XXXIV. In 2000, Tennessee led the NFL in total defense for the first time in franchise history and allowed 191 points, the third-fewest in league history since the adoption of a 16-game schedule in 1978. The Titans also set club records for sacks (55), fewest passing yards allowed (2,424) and fewest touchdowns allowed (17).

Prior to arriving in the NFL, Williams was a graduate assistant at the University of Houston from 1988-89. From 1984-87, Williams was the head coach at Belton (Mo.) High School after opening his coaching career at his alma mater Excelsior Springs (Mo.) High School.

Williams graduated from Truman State University, where he played quarterback and also played baseball. He later earned a master's degree from Central Missouri.

Williams is passionate about giving back to the youth. Since 2004, Williams has helped raise more than \$2 million for Excelsior Springs young people through the Gregg Williams Foundation. The money raised annually provides two scholarships for Excelsior Springs High School graduates and funds both school and local youth athletics. In January of 2016, Williams was inducted into the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame. The induction celebrated his decorated NFL coaching career, as well his unwavering commitment to his home state of Missouri and the mentorship of young men.



THE GREGG WILLIAMS FOUNDATION

The Gregg Williams Foundation, Inc. was founded in December 2004 as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization to fund programs for kids in the Excelsior Springs, Mo. area. The Foundation also donates funds to various community organizations to help improve the community as a whole.

The Foundation hosts several fund-raising events throughout the Excelsior Springs area and beyond, but the primary source of income for the Foundation is derived from the various fund-raising activities around the annual Gregg Williams Tiger Classic Golf Tournament. This is a 3-day event which includes the Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony and Dinner, a Tiger Classic Reception & Dinner for all golfers, the Tiger Golf Classic Golf Tournament with various auctions, raffles, donations and sponsorships. The Tiger Classic is a large community event and sells out quickly each year with over 80 golf teams.

The Foundation has given back nearly \$750,000 to the schools and our community with a total community impact of over \$1 million since 2005.

The Cleveland Browns kicked off the 2018 season with a tie against the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-21. In the first tie for the Browns since 1989, the team's defense forced six turnovers for the first time since 2010. Rookie DB Denzel Ward became the first Browns DB to secure two interceptions in his NFL debut since 1971 (Clarence Scott). Browns DL Myles Garrett forced a career-best two fumbles, while matching career-best marks in tackles (six) and sacks (two). Following a scoreless first quarter, Steelers RB James Conner culminated a 10-play, 88-yard scoring drive ending in a four-yard touchdown run. After the 7-0 halftime break, Browns QB Tyrod Taylor led Cleveland on an opening-half possession that he ended with a 20-yard touchdown run by him, tying the game at 7-7. Pittsburgh answered as QB Ben Roethlisberger found WR Antonio Brown for a 22-yard touchdown pass on the ensuing possession. After forcing the Browns to punt, Conner found the end zone again for his second score of the game, giving the Steelers their largest lead of the game, 21-7. After recovering the team's second fumble of the game, Browns RB Carlos Hyde punched in a one-yard score. Before the final whistle of regulation, Taylor found WR Josh Gordon for a 17-yard strike with 1:58 remaining in regulation to tie the game, 21-21. In the OT period, each team exchanged possessions with punts, before the Steelers put together an eight-play, 31-yard drive to set up a K Chris Boswell game-winning field goal attempt, but Boswell's try missed to the left. Following a Cleveland punt, Roethlisberger was strip-sacked by LB Genard Avery on the following possession. The ensuing Browns K Zane Gonzalez game-winning field goal attempt was blocked by Steelers LB TJ Watt, forcing the teams to tie, 21-21.

In the first road game of 2018, the Cleveland Browns fell to the New Orleans Saints, 21-18. Despite leading 12-3 going into the final quarter, the Saints rallied to score 18 points in the final 8:41 of the contest, securing the victory. K Zane Gonzalez opened the scoring for the Browns with his first of two 39-yard, first-half field goals. However, Saints K Wil Lutz provided an equalizing field goal on the ensuing possession. At the half, the Browns went into the locker room with a 6-3 lead. New Orleans punted on the opening possession of the second half, as RB Carlos Hyde capped a 12-play, 79-yard drive with a one-yard rushing touchdown. The Cleveland Browns defeated the New York Jets on Thursday Night Football, 21-17, securing the team's first win since Week 16 of the 2016 season. Browns rookie QB Baker Mayfield entered the game prior to the end of the first half due to an injury suffered by QB Tyrod Taylor, propelling Cleveland to 14 unanswered points and a fourth-quarter touchdown en route to a victory. Mayfield finished the game with 17 completions on 23 attempts for 201 yards, scoring on the receiving end of a two-point conversion attempt thrown by WR Jarvis Landry. Landry added eight receptions for 103 yards, his best single-game showing as a Brown. Following a scoreless first quarter, Jets RB Isaiah Crowell opened the scoring for New York, rushing in from seven yards out four seconds into the second quarter. After a Cleveland punt on the ensuing possession, Crowell scored for the second time of the evening from two yards out, capping a 10-play, 63-yard touchdown drive. Down 14-0, and following the Taylor injury, Mayfield entered the game and led the Browns on a six-play, 39-yard drive for a 45-yard field goal from newly-acquired K Greg Joseph. The Jets took their 14-3 lead into the intermission. Following a strip forced fumble by Browns DB Denzel Ward of Jets WR Robby Anderson, Joseph connected on his second field goal, this time from 27 yards out to draw the Browns within one score. Before the final whistle of the third quarter, Browns RB Carlos Hyde capped a 69-yard scoring drive with a goal-line plunge from one yard out. The ensuing two-point conversion attempt was successful, as Landry's end around pass found Mayfield in the corner of the end zone. Jets K Jason Myers ended Cleveland's 14-point burst with a field goal from 28 yards out, giving Cleveland the ball back with 8:55 remaining in regulation. On the next drive, Hyde scored his second one-yard touchdown rush of the game to end a 15-play drive, giving the Browns their first lead of the contest. On a third-down attempt, LB Joe Schobert intercepted Jets QB Sam Darnold's pass. Following a Browns punt, Darnold threw his second pick of the game, as DB Terrance Mitchell picked off his sixth career interception to secure the win for Cleveland.

The Cleveland Browns fell to the Oakland Raiders, 45-42, in the team's second overtime game of the season. Though leading by 14 points midway through the fourth quarter, the Browns allowed the Raiders to score 21 fourth-quarter points and the eventual game-winning field goal in the overtime period. Rookie QB Baker Mayfield, in his first career NFL start, threw for 295 yards and two touchdowns on 21 completions. Fellow rookie, RB Nick Chubb, rushed for 105 yards and a pair of scores on just three carries, a franchise rookie record. DBs E.J. Gaines and Damarious Randall each had an interception, giving the Browns 13 takeaways through the first four games of the season for the first time since 1989. RB Carlos Hyde also scored on the ground for a league-best fifth time this season. Following an exchange of punts to begin the game, Mayfield's second drive ended in an interception returned for a touchdown by Oakland DB Gareon Conley. Down, 7-0, the Browns rallied by scoring 17 unanswered points before the end of the first half. A field goal from K Greg Joseph with two minutes remaining in the first quarter got Cleveland on the board, along with a 63-yard score by Chubb. Following an Oakland missed field goal, Mayfield found TE Darren Fells for a 49-yard passing score, capping a four-play, 70-yard drive. Mayfield's connection with Fells was his first career touchdown pass. The Browns' ensuing two-point conversion attempt was successful, as RB Duke Johnson Jr. ran around the left end to put the Browns ahead by 10 points. However, the Raiders answered with a receiving score from WR Amari Cooper, leading to the halftime score of 17-14 in favor of Cleveland. The Browns scored on each of their first two drives in the second half, with a Joseph field goal and a WR Jarvis Landry touchdown reception, the first in his Browns career. After two fumbles and three punts on five possessions, the Raiders scored 13 unanswered points to take a 34-28 lead with less than 11 minutes remaining in regulation. Returning the favor, Hyde capped a seven-play, 77-yard drive with a one-yard rushing score after WR Antonio Callaway's 59-yard reception to set it up. Later, Chubb scored again with a 41-yard touchdown before Oakland put together a six-play, 53-yard scoring drive with a touchdown pass to TE Jared Cook from QB Derek Carr. The Raiders converted the two-point conversion attempt with a WR Jordy Nelson catch, taking the game into overtime, 42-42. Raiders K Matt McCrane missed his first field goal attempt on the team's first possession, but after forcing a Browns punt on the following drive, he redeemed himself and connected on a 29-yard attempt to secure Oakland's first win of the season.

The Cleveland Browns defeated the Baltimore Ravens in overtime, 12-9, the franchise's first win on a Sunday since 2015. With the win, Cleveland advanced to 2-2-1 on the season, the team's best start to a season since 2014 (3-2). Browns rookie QB Baker Mayfield threw for 342 yards on 25 completions and a touchdown. The 342 yards in a single game are the second most by a Browns rookie in franchise history. After a Mayfield pick on Cleveland's first offensive drive, Baltimore capped a four-play drive with a 44-yard field goal by K Justin Tucker to give the Ravens the early 3-0 lead. The three-point lead was Baltimore's only lead of the contest. With 40 seconds before the halftime whistle, Mayfield found WR Rashard Higgins for Higgins' first score of the 2018 season. Each team notched on a field goal in the third quarter, with Browns K Greg Joseph and Tucker connecting from 35 yards and 25 yards out, respectively. Later, Tucker would register his third field goal of the contest, this time from 32-yarder, to draw the score at 9-9. In the Browns' third overtime game of the year, each team exchanged punts after the Browns took the ball to start the overtime period. Getting the ball at the Cleveland 16 yard line, Mayfield orchestrated a seven-play, 65-yard drive to set up Joseph for a 37-yard game winner.

The Cleveland Browns fell to the Los Angeles Chargers, 38-14, for the second time in as many seasons, at FirstEnergy Stadium. Led by RB Melvin Gordon III's three rushing touchdowns and WR Tyrell Williams' two receiving touchdowns, the Chargers scored five total times and collected 449 yards of total offense. Browns QB Baker Mayfield accounted for 238 yards on 22 completions, adding a fourth-quarter touchdown to TE David Njoku. K Greg Joseph connected on two second-quarter field goals and Mayfield found WR Antonio Callaway on a successful two-point conversion attempt to account for Cleveland's 14 points. The Browns have now successfully converted four two-point conversion attempts on the season, the first time that a Browns team has had four in a single season since 1994. After Gordon III's first rushing touchdown in the first quarter, Joseph connected on a 33-yard field goal less than three minutes into the second frame to give the Browns their first points. Los Angeles tallied on Williams' two receiving touchdowns, before Joseph hit his second field goal of the game, this time from 28 yards out. At the half, the score was 21-6, in favor of the Chargers. Out of the intermission, Gordon III had his final two out of three total rushing touchdowns, giving the Bolts their largest lead of the game (29 points) through three quarters of play. In the fourth quarter, Mayfield orchestrated a seven-play, 42-yard drive that was capped by Njoku's touchdown. K Michael Badgley made a 44-yard field goal with four minutes remaining to finalize the score, 38-14.

In Cleveland's fourth overtime game of the season, the Browns fell on the road to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, 26-23. The overtime matchup tied a franchise record for overtime games in a season. Despite scoring two touchdowns in the fourth quarter and overcoming a 14-point halftime deficit, the Browns fell to 2-4-1 on the season when Buccaneers K Chandler Catanzaro made a 59-yard field goal in extra time. Browns QB Baker Mayfield completed 23 of 34 passes for 215 yards and two touchdowns. WR Jarvis Landry paced Cleveland's offense by setting a season-high mark of 10 receptions and accounted for 97 yards. Landry also caught his second touchdown of the season. The Browns forced four turnovers against the Buccaneers, advancing their season mark to 20 takeaways. Browns P Britton Colquitt averaged a season-best 51.7 yards per punt, notching a career-long 79 yard punt before the end of the first half to pin the Buccaneers at their own one-yard line. On Tampa Bay's opening drive, Browns DL Trevon Coley stopped Bucs RB Peyton Barber in the end zone for a safety, opening the afternoon's scoring. However, Cleveland would punt on each of their first six possessions, while Tampa Bay took a 16-2 lead after the first half. After the half and down by two touchdowns, Mayfield threw his first touchdown pass of the afternoon to TE David Njoku to bring the Browns within one score. Tampa Bay answered with RB Ronald Jones' rushing score from two yards out, capping a 13-play, 73-yard series. Cleveland answered by orchestrating their longest drive of the game, as rookie RB Nick Chubb rushed for a one-yard score less than three minutes into the fourth quarter. After a DB Jabrill Peppers 32-yard punt return to put the Browns inside of Tampa Bay's 20-yard line, Mayfield found Landry for the game-tying score with less than three minutes remaining in regulation. Set up for a game-winning field goal, Catanzaro missed wide right as time expired to force overtime. Browns LB Jamie Collins Sr. intercepted Bucs QB Jameis Winston on the first drive, but after an exchange of punts, Catanzaro redeemed himself by connecting on a 59-yard boot to down the Browns.

The Cleveland Browns fell to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 33-18, at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh, Pa. The loss was Cleveland's first in 2018 division play. The 1-1 start against division opponents is the club's best mark through the first three divisional games since 2013 (2-1). The Browns opened the game with an 11-play, 66-yard scoring drive that was capped by K Greg Joseph's 34-yard field goal, which was Cleveland's first score on an opening possession this season. Following Browns DB Derrick Kindred's interception, Joseph connected on his second attempt of the day from 45 yards out to give the Browns a 6-0 lead at the end of the first quarter. Pittsburgh answered early in the second quarter with a 43-yard touchdown pass from QB Ben Roethlisberger to WR Antonio Brown. Steelers DB Joe Haden intercepted Mayfield, as Pittsburgh orchestrated a 16-play, 87-yard drive, capped by a Brown receiving touchdown to lead 14-6 at the half. In the second half, Pittsburgh gained two points off a safety, as Browns OL Desmond Harrison was called for a holding penalty in the Browns' end zone. A free kick ensued, which the Browns recovered, setting up a WR Antonio Callaway one-yard receiving touchdown from Mayfield. After the missed extra point, Pittsburgh put together a five-play, 75-yard scoring drive, capped by a Conner 12-yard touchdown run. After regaining possession off of an exchange of punts, Steelers K Chris Boswell connected from 49 yards out, his longest kick of the season, to give Pittsburgh a 26-12 lead through three and a half quarters. Conner added an exclamation point to Pittsburgh's day, scoring a 22-yard rushing touchdown just before the two-minute warning. Browns TE Seth DeVale caught his first touchdown of the season with six seconds remaining in regulation to give Mayfield his second passing score of the game. A failed two-point conversion attempt drew the final tally to 33-18.

The Cleveland Browns defeated the Atlanta Falcons, 28-16, for the team's third home win of the season. Browns QB Baker Mayfield completed each of his first 13 attempts to begin the game, carrying a perfect passer rating (158.3) into the third quarter. Mayfield finished the game with 17 completions for 216 yards and a career-best three passing touchdowns, recording his fourth consecutive multi-touchdown game. Mayfield finished the contest with a 151.2 rating, the best ever by a Browns rookie QB in a single contest. Browns RB Nick Chubb rushed for a career-best 176 yards, recording the franchise's longest run in history on a 92-yard score in the third quarter. For the second consecutive week, RB Duke Johnson Jr. led the team in receptions, recording four for 31 yards and a touchdown. Following an exchange of punts, Mayfield found WR Rashard Higgins for a 28-yard score, his second of the season, to give Cleveland an early 7-0 lead following a K Greg Joseph PAT. The Falcons answered on the ensuing possession, then again one possession later following a Browns interception. With a subsequent WR Julio Jones one-yard touchdown reception, Atlanta had their largest lead of the game, 10-7, with a little over five minutes remaining in the half. Chubb then put an exclamation point on an eight-play, 80-yard scoring drive with a 13-yard receiving touchdown, giving the Browns the lead, 14-10, heading into the intermission. Out of the break and after an Atlanta fumble, Johnson Jr. caught an 11-yard passing touchdown, Mayfield's third passing score of the game, with 10:27 remaining in the third quarter. After forcing Atlanta to punt, Chubb broke free on the second play of the drive for his 92-yard rushing score to grant Cleveland their third-straight scoring possession. Following Chubb's third quarter score, the Browns had their largest lead of the game, 28-10. Atlanta TE Austin Hooper scored with 4:24 remaining in regulation to draw the final score to 28-16.

The Cleveland Browns defeated the Cincinnati Bengals, 35-20, to secure the team's first road win since Week 5 of 2015. The Browns scored touchdowns on all four of their first-half possessions and continued the trend into the second half with a touchdown on the opening drive of the third quarter. QB Baker Mayfield threw for a career-best four touchdowns on 19 completions, along with 258 yards and no interceptions. Mayfield's four touchdown passes broke the franchise's rookie record for most passing touchdowns in a season (17), doing so in just his eighth NFL start. The Browns opened the game with Mayfield completing all six of his opening-drive pass attempts for 71 yards, which was capped by a rushing touchdown from RB Nick Chubb. Following a blocked field goal by DL Myles Garrett, Cleveland capped a four-play, 56-yard series with a 13-yard passing touchdown from Mayfield to WR Antonio Callaway. On the Browns' third possession of the game, they amassed a 12-play, 96-yard touchdown drive, ending with a TE David Njoku six-yard receiving score. After DB Damarious Randall recorded his third interception of the season, Mayfield found Chubb for the rookie RB's second score of the half, connecting from 14 yards out to give the Browns the team's largest lead over an opponent this season, 28-0. Bengals WR John Ross caught a two-yard touchdown pass before the half to cut into Cleveland's lead. Following the intermission, the Browns capitalized on a DL Emmanuel Ogbah fumble recovery, as TE Darren Fells caught Mayfield's fourth scoring pass of the game. Cincinnati rallied for touchdowns on back-to-back possessions later in the game, narrowing Cleveland's lead to two scores. Cleveland's defense ended the game by converting Cincinnati's final two possessions to consecutive turnovers on downs, cementing the final score, 35-20.

Despite two second-half red zone touchdowns, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Houston Texans, 29-13, on the road in Week 13. Browns QB Baker Mayfield finished the game with 397 passing yards and a touchdown, doing most of his work in the second half. Mayfield completed 24 of 30 attempts for 351 yards and a touchdown in the second half alone. His 351 second-half passing yards were the most by any NFL QB since 2016. Houston K Ka'imi Fairbairn converted a Texans field goal on the team's opening possession of the game. Following a Browns punt, Houston scored on an 11-yard touchdown reception to TE Jordan Thomas. Midway through the second quarter, Texans ILB Zach Cunningham returned a Mayfield interception 38 yards for a touchdown. After two more Fairbairn field goals, Houston took a 23-0 lead into the halftime period. Out of the break, Mayfield orchestrated a nine-play, 75-yard scoring drive, which was capped by a Nick Chubb two-yard touchdown rush to put the Browns on the scoreboard. On the scoring drive, Mayfield completed all five of his pass attempts for 73 yards to set up Chubb's club-record seventh rushing score of his rookie campaign. Fairbairn added a 53-yard field goal in the third quarter and a 38-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to extend Houston's lead. Toward the end of the fourth quarter, Mayfield again put together a nine-play, 75-yard scoring drive, ending with a WR Rashard Higgins 17-yard touchdown reception. Following an opening-drive incompleteness, Mayfield connected on eight consecutive passes for all 75 of the possession's accrued yards. The two second-half touchdowns helped Cleveland close the scoring differential gap, leading to the final score of 29-13.

The Cleveland Browns defeated the Carolina Panthers, 26-20, to advance to 5-7-1 on the season. Cleveland secured their fourth home win, honing the club's second-best winning percentage (643) at home since the team returned in 1999. Cleveland's nine fourth-quarter points propelled the Browns to a come from behind victory. Carolina scored on a RB Christian McCaffrey rush to take the early 7-0 lead on the game's opening possession. Then, on the Browns' first offensive play of the game, QB Baker Mayfield hit WR Breshad Perriman on a 66-yard reception, leading to the team's first score of the game. WR Jarvis Landry rushed for a three-yard touchdown, tying the game up at 7-7 through one quarter of play. McCaffrey then capitalized on a Cleveland fumble to take a 14-7 lead early in the second quarter, before Landry caught a 50-yard touchdown pass from Mayfield to tie the game up, 14-14. An exchange of field goals from Panthers K Chandler Catanzaro and Browns K Greg Joseph took the halftime score to 17-17. Catanzaro logged the only score in the third frame, a 34-yard field goal, before Browns RB Nick Chubb punched in a four-yard rushing score to give Cleveland their first lead of the game, less than two minutes into the fourth quarter. With over 8:50 remaining, Joseph connected on a 41-yard field goal, as the Browns defense stopped Carolina's final two drives down the stretch. Browns DB Damarious Randall logged his fourth interception of the season on Carolina's final possession to forbid a Panthers rout and lead to the final score of 26-20.
