Based on their finish in the AFC East, the Patriots will place the corresponding team in the AFC West (Las Vegas), AFC South (Tennessee) and NFC East (N.Y. Giants).



Under Kraft's leadership since he purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports.

Kraft has led the two most dominant decades in NFL history in terms of overall wins – 141 (2010-19) and 126 (2000-09).

Kraft is the most successful owner since he purchased the team in 1994 in terms of wins (357), division titles (19), winning percentage (.650), playoff wins (33) and playoff seasons (22).



Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In his 31 seasons of ownership, he is credited with transforming one of the league's least successful clubs into one of the most valuable. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.), the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a champi-



onship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (19), conference crowns (10) and Super Bowl championships (6) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (24) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LIII was the 10th Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's 31 seasons, the Patriots qualified for the playoffs 22 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

A WINNING TRADITION I

Robert Kraft won his 300th game overall as owner of the New England Patriots against Miami on Sept. 30, 2018. Kraft reached the milestone in his 25th NFL season and in his 432nd game, the fastest an owner has reached the mark. Al Davis of the Raiders accomplished the feat in 495 games (31 seasons) while Pat Bowlen of Denver reached 300 career wins in 501 games (30 seasons).

Under Kraft, the Patriots are 357-192 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.

CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the first team in NFL history to win six Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 28 times in their 63-year history. Twenty-two of those playoff berths have come in the 29 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 22 division crowns.

Since the 1994 season, the Patriots have won 64.8 percent of their regular season games (324-176), which is the highest winning percentage in men's major American professional sports over that period. Since 1994, there have been 148 franchises that have fielded teams in the five major American sports leagues (NFL, MLB, NBA, NHL and MLS) and completed more than two full seasons of competition. On the women's side, the Toronto Six (29-5-3) and the Boston Pride (90-29-10) of the PHF hold the two highest winning percentages of all women's professional sports teams.

- The New England Patriots are tied with the Pittsburgh Steelers for the most Super Bowl wins in NFL history with six.
- The Patriots have played in 11 Super Bowls, the most by any team in NFL history. Dallas, Denver, Pittsburgh and San Francisco have played in eight.
- The New England Patriots have 37 postseason victories, tied with Green Bay for the second-most in NFL history to the 38 postseason wins by San Francisco.
- The Patriots are third in NFL history with 15 Conference Championship Game appearances, behind San Francisco (19) and Pittsburgh (16).
- The New England Patriots have earned seven No. 1 seeds, trailing only San Francisco (10) and Denver (8) since playoff seeding began in 1975.
- The Patriots have earned a first-round playoff bye an NFL-best 14 times since 1990. San Francisco is second with 10 byes since 1990. New England is the only team in NFL history with nine-straight first-round byes (2010-18).
- The Patriots have played in 59 postseason games, the fifth-most in NFL history, behind Dallas (67), Pittsburgh (65), Green Bay (64) and San Francisco (62).
- The Patriots are third with 13 seasons of 12 wins since 1970, behind San Francisco's 16 and Dallas' 15 seasons with 12 victories.
- New England has won 13 games in a single season seven times in franchise history. Only San Francisco (11) and Green Bay (80) have more 13-win seasons.
- The New England Patriots have won 14 or more games in a season five times, most in NFL history. San Francisco is second with four 14-win seasons.
- The Patriots have 35 winning seasons since 1970, third all-time, behind Pittsburgh's 41 and Dallas' 36.
- The Patriots have 582 total victories, the fourth-most wins since their inception in 1960, behind the 606 by Pittsburgh, the 605 by Dallas and the 596 by Green Bay.
- New England (1,059) played their 1,000th game in franchise history (regular season and playoffs combined) against Cleveland on Nov. 14, 2021, and became the first original AFL team to play in 1,000 games.
- The Patriots ended a 10-year streak of finishing in the top 10 for fewest points allowed (2012-2021) after finishing 11th in 2022 with 20.4 points allowed. The Patriots and Tampa Bay (1996-2005) are the last two teams to reach 10-straight seasons in the top 10 for fewest points allowed.

- The Patriots finished with a positive turnover ratio for 17-straight seasons (2006-22), the longest streak since the 1970 merger before the streak ended in 2023. Seattle is second with 13-straight seasons with a positive turnover ratio.
- The Patriots finished ranked seventh in total defense in 2023. The Patriots have finished in the top 10 in defense 11 times since 2000.
- The Patriots played in their fifth international game when they faced
 Jacksonville in London on Oct. 20. It was their second-straight year
 with an international game after playing in Frankfurt, Germany in
 2023. The Patriots played in London in 2009 and 2012 and in Mexico City in 2017. The five international games are tied for fourth alltime with Las Vegas, behind the 13 by Jacksonville, eight by Buffalo
 and seven by Miami.
- The Patriots went 19-straight seasons (2001-19) without being swept in a series by a division opponent, the longest such streak since the 1970 NFL merger.
- The Patriots are 110-6 all-time at Gillette Stadium in the regular season when leading at halftime.

TALE OF THE TWOS

- The Patriots 2008 NFL Draft produced two NFL head coaches with Patriots head coach Jerod Mayo in the first round and Minnesota head coach Kevin O'Connell in the third round. The only other instance in the common draft era that produced two head coaches was the 1981 Chicago Bears who picked former San Francisco head coach Mike Singletary in the second round and former Rams and Tennessee head coach Jeff Fisher in the seventh round.
- The Patriots had two members of head coach Jerod Mayo's staff that
 were teammates with him when the Patriots earned a victory in Super
 Bowl XLIX over Seattle. Dont'a Hightower serves as inside linebackers coach and Matthew Slater serves as a special assistant to the
 head coach.
- The Patriots have two Paul Hornung Award winners as the nation's most versatile player with DB Jabrill Peppers (2016) and DB Marcus Jones (2021).
- The Patriots have two sets of twins on the team with Kyle Dugger (Kaelyn) and Davon Godchaux (Devin).
- Christian Elliss has two brothers playing in the NFL with Jonah (Denver) and Kaden (Atlanta). The Elliss brothers are one of two families with three brothers currently playing in the NFL, joining the Sewell family Penei (Detroit), Nephi (New Orleans) and Noah (Chicago). Christian's father, Luther, was selected in the first round (20th overall) by Detroit in the 1995 NFL Draft out of Utah and was a two-time Pro Bowl selection. He coaches the defensive line at Utah.
- The Patriots had two players on the current roster that were teammates with head coach Jerod Mayo during his final season with the Patriots in 2015 C David Andrews and LS Joe Cardona. The only other current NFL coach that was teammates with two of his current players is Houston's DeMeco Ryans, who was teammates with S Kareem Jackson and C Jon Weeks in 2011 with Houston and then served as their head coach in 2023.

MATCHING TOTALS

On opening day against Cincinnati (9/8), the Patriots forced and recovered 2 fumbles against the Bengals, who had lost just two fumbles in 2023. S Kyle Dugger forced a fumble on TE Tanner Hudson at the 2-yard line that was recovered by CB Marcus Jones. In the third quarter, LS Joe Cardona forced a fumble on a punt that was recovered by S Jaylinn Hawkins. In 2023, Cincinnati had just 2 lost fumbles with every other team having at least five. It was also tied for the fewest fumbles lost by a team in the Super Bowl era, matching the (2019 Saints, 2014 Vikings and 2002 Chiefs.

MAYO JOINS KRAFT

Head Coach Jerod Mayo earned his first regular season win with the 16-10 victory at Cincinnati on opening day, Sept. 8, 2024. He joins owner Robert Kraft in earning their first regular season wins at Cincinnati. The Patriots gave Robert Kraft his first victory as Patriots owner with a 31-28 win over the Bengals at Riverfront Stadium in Cincinnati on Sept. 18, 1994.



PATRIOTS RUN THE BALL

The Patriots followed a 170-yard rushing performance in the season-opener at Cincinnati (9/8) with 185 yards rushing against Seattle (9/15). It was the first time the team has had back-to-back games with at least 170 yards rushing since the 2020 season when they had 250 yards rushing vs. Las Vegas (9/27) followed by 185 yards rushing at Kansas City (10/5). It is the first time the Patriots opened the season with at least 170 yards rushing in their first two games since 1974 when they had 196 yards rushing vs. Miami (9/15) followed by 173 yards rushing at the New York Giants (9/22).

DYNAMIC DUO

RB Antonio Gibson rushed for 96 yards and **RB** Rhamondre Stevenson rushed for 81 yards against Seattle (9/15). It is the first time that the Patriots had two players reach at least 80 rushing yards in a game since Oct. 5, 2014, when RB Stevan Ridley gained 113 yards and Shane Vereen had 90 yards vs. Cincinnati on Oct. 5, 2014.

TEAM RECORD

The Patriots rushed 19 times for 151 yards for a 7.9-yard average vs. Miami (10/6), the team's highest rushing average in a game in team history. The previous high was a 7.8-yard average when the team rushed 25 times for 196 yards vs. Miami on Dec. 23, 2007.

PATRIOTS CORRAL BEARS WITH 9 SACKS

The Patriots defense generated a season-high 9 sacks at Chicago on Nov. 11, 2024, tied for the second-most sacks in team history and the most since the team had 9 sacks vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 6, 2022. It is the seventh time in team history the team has registered 9 sacks in a game, tied for second all-time in team history to the 11 sacks at Oakland on Sept. 22, 1963.

PATRIOTS HOLD BEARS TO 142 NET YARDS

The Patriots held Chicago to 142 yards on Nov. 10, the lowest total since holding the Jets to 103 total yards on Nov. 20, 2022. In addition, the Patriots held Chicago to 1-for-14 on third down.

PATRIOTS 400 YARDS

The Patriots offense produced a season-high of 422 total yards vs. Indianapolis on Dec. 1, the highest since gaining 409 total yards at Minnesota on November 24, 2022. The Patriots previous season high was the 382 yards vs. the Los Angeles Rams on Nov. 17.

RUSH FOR 200

The Patriots finished with 200 yards on 31 rushing attempts for a 6.5-yard average vs. Indianapolis on Dec. 1, the highest rushing total for the team since gaining 206 yards on Dec. 18, 2022, at Las Vegas. The Patriots have now rushed for at least 200 yards in a game 19 times since 2000. The previous season-high for the Patriots was 185 rushing yards vs. Seattle on Sept. 15.

MEET JEROD MAYO

6TH COACHING SEASON 14TH NFL SEASON 15T SEASON AS PATRIOTS HEAD COACH

JEROD'S JOURNEY

Jerod Mayo was born Feb. 23, 1986, in Hampton, Va., and played college football at Tennessee. Mayo was drafted in the first round (10th overall) of the 2008 draft and spent his entire NFL career in New England before retiring following the 2015 season. After his retirement, Mayo served as an executive in finance at Optum as senior vice president of business development before returning to the Patriots to start his coaching career as inside linebackers coach in 2019. Without a defensive coordinator by title in the past five seasons, Mayo's role and responsibilities grew each year. Jerod was introduced by Patriots Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft as the 15th head coach in franchise history in a press conference held at Gillette Stadium on Jan. 17, 2024.

A TRACK RECORD OF SUCCESS

AS A PLAYER: Mayo played linebacker and appeared in 103 games, racking up 905 total tackles. He was is a 2014 Super Bowl Champion and made the Pro Bowl after the 2010 and 2012 seasons, leading the league in tackles each season. He led the Patriots in tackles in each of his first five seasons and became just the second Patriots player to win the Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year award.

IN THE BUSINESS WORLD: While at Optum from 2016 through 2019, Mayo took the skills and understanding that he mastered in football and transformed himself into a business executive. While at Optum, he worked on consumer solutions with clients and consulted on mergers and acquisitions.

AS A COACH: In his five seasons with the Patriots, the defense finished in the top 10 in total defense four times. Under Mayo's tutelage in his first coaching season, former linebacker and current linebacker coach Dont'a Hightower earned his second career Pro Bowl nod. Former Patriots LB Matthew Judon tallied career highs in sack totals in back-to-back seasons, recording 12½ sacks in 2021 and 15½ in 2022. Judon earned his second straight Pro Bowl invitation with the Patriots. Last season, the defense ranked seventh overall in yards allowed.

"Jerod is a great leader, a great captain, a great friend. I think he had a tremendous amount of success in football and then had success in other parts of his life when he retired. And then him coming back into coaching, I think it's great for the NFL and certainly great for the Patriots. He's got a great understanding of how things need to be done. I think Jerod does an incredible job relating to everybody in the locker room, all the coaches, and I think he'll do a great job."

A Natural leader

- Mayo learned his values and leadership style through the people he met in both football and business. Mayo's grandfather, Walter Johnson, was a Chief Master Sergent in the Air Force, and Mayo credits him for helping him learn the discipline to reach success. Mayo also credits his manager at Optum, Mike Mateo, his mom and Coach Belichick with influencing his coaching style.
- As a player, Mayo was named captain for seven consecutive seasons (2009-15), starting in his second year on the team, and is a 2014 Super Bowl Champion. "You're a captain in your second year. That spoke about not only his leadership, but I think also how he got along with everybody on the team. I think of a guy who can stand in front of a room, and no matter what they say, the men in the room walk away saying, I'll follow that guy," said former Patriots S Devin McCourty about Mayo.

"The ability to communicate with anyone and make them feel like you are on an equal level, and he can speak on a level that is educated and that is personable. When you have those two things, you get people listening to you. They listen to what you say, and it's easier for you to convey what you need from them, or what you want from them on the field, and that is something that I think he is exceptional at."

FROM THE FIELD TO THE SIDELINE

Jerod Mayo is the fourth person to be named head coach after playing for the previous coach (Bill Belichick) with the same team since the 1970 merger. The others are Mike Tice of Minnesota (under Dennis Green), Jack Pardee of Washington (under George Allen) and Bart Starr of Green Bay (under Dan Devine).



Jerod Mayo is the first head coach for the Patriots that was formerly a Patriots' player. He is the fifth Patriots head coach in team history to have played professional football. The four other Patriots' head coaches that played in professional football include: Lou Saban (1960-61), Mike Holovak (1961-68), Clive Rush (1969-70) and Raymond Berry (1984-89).

LOU SABAN | 1960-61

Linebacker - Cleveland Browns (1946-49)



- Selected in the 10th round of the 1944 Draft by Card-Pitt, a temporary merger between the Chicago Cardinals and Pittsburgh Steelers.
- Joined the Cleveland Browns under the AAFC (All-America Football Conference) coached by Paul Brown, where he played as linebacker and placekicker.
- Won the AAFC Championship in 1946, 1947, 1948 and 1949.
- Coached the Boston Patriots in 1960-61 as head coach, the inaugural year of the team.



MIKE HOLOVAK | 1961-68

Running Back - Los Angeles Rams (1946), Chicago Bears (1947-48)



- Selected fifth overall by the Cleveland Rams in the 1943 NFL Draft, but enlisted in the U.S. Navy during World War II before eventually playing as running back for the Los Angeles Rams in 1946.
- Traded to the Chicago Bears in 1947 and led the team in rushing yards in back-to-back seasons.
- From 1960-61, Holovak served as the Boston Patriots running backs coach before becoming the head coach from 1961-68.



CLIVE RUSH | 1969-70

Wide Receiver - Green Bay Packers (1953)



- Played one season as wide receiver with the Green Bay Packers in
- Entered the collegiate coaching realm with Dayton (1954), Ohio State (1955-57), Oklahoma (1958) and back to Ohio State (1959) before becoming the head coach at Toledo (1960-62).
- Became the offensive coordinator for the New York Jets from 1963-68.
- Was named the head coach of the Boston Patriots from 1969-70.



A HALL OF FAME FRIENDSHIP

One bond that hits close to home with QB Jacoby Brissett is with former Patriots head coach and Pro Football Hall of Famer Bill Parcells, who first met Jacoby at his Palm Beach high school football practice at age 15. Parcells served as a key mentor in the development of Brissett's quarterback skills during a key juncture of his life where Brissett was deciding between football or basketball. With football being the path forward, Parcells aided Brissett while in college and during the NFL draft process. The "longstanding relationship" between Parcells and Brissett has endured throughout Jacoby's second career stint with the Patriots. Parcells recently said to MassLive, "I really do love him. I really do. I have a strong affection for him. He is an absolute No. 1, high-class kid."





FAMILY TIES

C Ben Brown comes from a rich history of Ole Miss football players, as he is the seventh member of his family to play for the school. Brown's father, Tim (1988-89); his maternal grandfather, Bobby (1962-64); paternal grandfather, Allen (1962-64); great uncle, Jerry (1959-61); father's cousin, Alton (1971-72); and uncle, Burkes (1991-92) all played for the Rebels. As a tight end, Allen was a First-Team All-American in college and a two-time Super Bowl Champion for the Green Bay Packers.

- Said Jerod Mayo on Brown, "This is one of those things, I've never seen it before. A guy being able to come in here after four or five days and become the starting center. So, he did a great job. He did a good job all through the week during practice, and then went out there and performed pretty well."





THE MEANING BEHIND THE NICKNAME

 DeMario Douglas is more commonly referred to by his nickname, "Pop". Although the nickname is fitting for his quickness on the field, the name actually comes from family ties. Douglas' granddad passed away on his first birthday. The wide receiver was commonly referred to as 'Poppa' from his granddad – a nickname that was quickly shortened to just 'Pop'.

NUMBER CHANGE

 Pop Douglas changed his jersey number from No. 81 to No. 3 this season. He wore No. 3 in college at Liberty, as well as in little league, middle school and high school. He explained its meaning to him: "It's big because I was raised by three strong ladies -- my mom, grandma and great grandma," he said.

 Douglas finished the 2023 season with 49 receptions for a team-leading 561 yards. He has the most receptions and receiving yards by a Patriots rookie wide receiver since 2000.

DOUGLAS HAS CAREER-HIGH IN RECEIVING YARDS

 Douglas finished the game with a career-high 92 yards receiving on 6 receptions vs. Houston (10/13/24). His previous high was 84 yards receiving vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 12, 2023, in Frankfurt, Germany.

GIBSON HAS CAREER-HIGH 45-YARD RUSH

 RB Antonio Gibson broke free for a career-long 45-yard run in the fourth quarter vs. Seattle on Sept. 15, 2024. His previous best was a 40-yard run vs. Dallas on Oct. 25, 2020, when he played for Washington. In 2023, the Patriots had just one 40-yard run, a 64-yard touchdown run by RB Rhamondre Stevenson vs. Washington on Nov. 5.

GIBSON HAD AN 8.7-YARD AVERAGE

• Gibson finished the game vs. Seattle (9/15/24) with 96 yards rushing on just 11 carries for an 8.7-yard average. It was the highest average of his career in games where he had at least 10 carries. His previous high was a 7.0-yard average when he had 21 carries for 146 yards at the New York Giants on Jan. 9, 2022. It is the highest average for a Patriots player since RB Rhamondre Stevenson had a 9.1-yard average with 19 carries for 172 yards rushing at Las Vegas on Dec. 18. 2022.



NOTES OF INTEREST

- TE Hunter Henry is in fifth place on the Patriots all-time reception list among New England tight ends with 199 reception, sixth in receiving yards with 2,205 and is tied for fifth with 19 touchdown receptions. He needs 1 receptions to become fifth Patriots tight end with 200 receptions and is one of six to reach 2,000 receiving yards. He needs 1 touchdown to become the fifth New England tight end with 20 touchdowns.
- Henry has logged 40-plus receptions in all four seasons with the Patriots, the second-longest streak by a Patriots tight end all-time (Ben Coats six)
- Henry set career-highs in 2024 with 66 receptions and 674 yards. His
 previous bests were 60 receptions in 2020 and 652 yards in 2019.

HENRY SCORES TWO LONGEST TD PASSES OF HIS CAREER

Henry scored on a 31-yard touchdown pass from QB Bailey Zappe in the third quarter at Cleveland on Oct. 16, 2022, and had a 37-yard touchdown from Mac Jones at Minnesota in the third quarter on Nov. 24, 2022, the longest touchdown receptions of his career. His previous best was a 30-yard touchdown pass at Jacksonville on Dec. 8, 2019, when he played for the Chargers.

AMONG THE LEADERS

 Since entering the league in 2016, Henry is fifth in receiving touchdowns among all tight ends in the NFL with 40. He also ranks sixth in career receiving yards with 4,527 and seventh in receptions with 395. He joins teammate Austin Hooper on those lists, as Hooper ranks sixth in receptions (409), seventh in receiving yards (4,178) and tied for 10th with 28 touchdowns.

HUNTER HENRY HAD CAREER HIGH

Henry finished with 8 receptions for 109 yards vs. Seattle on Sept. 15, 2024. The 8 receptions tied a career-high and his 109 yards are a career-high. It is his second-career 100-yard game. He had 100 yards receiving and 8 receptions vs. Pittsburgh on Oct. 13, 2019, as a member of the Los Angeles Chargers. Henry set a new career-high for receptions and receiving yards in one half with 7 receptions for 98 yards in the first half. It is the Patriots first 100-yard receiving day since WR Kendrick Bourne had 6 receptions for 100 yards vs. Cincinnati on Dec. 24, 2022. Henry tied his career-high with his second 8-reception game at Jacksonville (10/202/24).

HENRY ACCOUNTED FOR SEVEN FIRST DOWNS

 Henry recorded a career-high 7 receptions for a first down against Seattle (9/15/24). His previous career-high was 6 receptions for a first down, which he accomplished three times, the last being at Indianapolis on Dec. 18, 2021.



LOWE SCORES ON A 4-YARD TOUCHDOWN PASS

T Vederian Lowe reported as an eligible receiver and caught a 4-yard touchdown pass from QB Drake Maye in the fourth quarter vs. the L.A. Rams on Nov. 17, 2024. Lowe is the fourth Patriots offensive lineman to catch a touchdown pass and first since T Nate Solder caught a 16-yard touchdown pass from QB Tom Brady in the third quarter of the 2014 AFC Championship game vs. Indianapolis on Jan. 18, 2015. T Tom Ashworth caught a 1-yard touchdown pass from QB Tom Brady in the first quarter on Dec. 17, 2005, vs. Tampa Bay. C Pete Brock caught a 6-yard touchdown pass from QB Steve Grogan in the fourth quarter at the New York Jets on Nov. 21, 1976. It was the 10th time that a Patriots offensive lineman caught a pass in a game.

TOP OF THE ORDER

• The Patriots used the third pick in the 2024 draft for the first time in team history and used the pick to select QB Drake Maye from North Carolina. It marked the fifth time since 1970 that the team drafted a quarterback in the first round - Jim Plunkett from Stanford (1st overall in 1971), Tony Eason from Illinois (15th overall in 1983), Drew Bledsoe from Washington State (1st overall in 1993), Mac Jones from Alabama (15th overall in 2021) and Drake Maye from North Carolina (3rd overall). Maye is the first Patriots drafted in the top 10 since 2008 when the team selected current head coach and former LB Jerod Mayo with the 10th pick overall out of Tennessee.

PRO BOWL

Maye was added to the Pro Boel roster to cap his rookie season.
 Maye is the sixth Patriots player to be selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie, joining Mike Haynes (1976), John Stephens (1988), Curtis Martin (1995), Devin McCourty (2010) and Mac Jones (2021).



THE MAYE WAY

• Maye, the youngest of four boys, hails from a family of athletes. His father, Mark, also played quarterback at the University of North Carolina from 1983-1988. His brother, Luke, played basketball at North Carolina (2015-19), winning a national title in 2017 with the Tar Heels. Luke now plays overseas in Japan. His brother, Cole, won a baseball national championship in 2017 with the University of Florida as a pitcher. His brother, Beau, also played basketball at the University of North Carolina. Despite the rich tradition of family athleticism, Drake Maye, measuring at 6'4, is the shortest of the four brothers (Luke at 6'8; Cole at 6'7; Beau at 6'8).

DRAKE MAYE MAKES FIRST NFL START

 Maye made his first NFL start vs. Houston (10/13/24). and finished 20-of-33 for 243 yards with 3 touchdowns. Two of Maye's touchdown passes were for over 30 yards, recording 40- and 35-yard touchdowns respectively.

THIRD-LONGEST FIRST TD PASS BY A ROOKIE

Maye's 40-yard touchdown pass to WR Kayshon Boutte on his first-career touchdown pass vs. Houston (10/13/24) is the third-longest for a rookie Patriots quarterback on his first career touchdown pass. Fellow rookie QB Joe Milton had a 48-yard touchdown pass to Boutte vs. Buffalo on Jan. 5, the longest since QB Drew Bledsoe's first career touchdown pass resulted in a 54-yard touchdown to TE Ben Coates on Sept. 5, 1993, vs. Buffalo.

FOURTH PATRIOTS ROOKIE QB TO THROW 3 TDS IN A GAME

 Maye became the fourth Patriots rookie quarterback to throw at least 3 touchdown passes in a single game vs. Houston (10/13/24), joining Drew Bledsoe, Jim Plunkett and Mac Jones.

14TH ROOKIE TO THROW FOR AT LEAST 3 TDS IN 1ST START

 Maye became the 14th rookie quarterback in NFL history to throw for at least 3 touchdowns in his first-career start vs. Houston (10/13/24), joining M.C. Reynolds (3), Jacky Lee (3), Dan Marino (3), Kevin Sweeney (3), Ed Rubbert (3), Todd Marinovich (3), Tony Banks (3), John Stofa (4), Josh Freeman (3), Matt McGloin (3), Marcus Mariota (4), Trevor Lawrence (3) and Will Levis (4) as the only rookie quarterbacks to accomplish the feat in their first-career start.

FIRST TO THROW AT LEAST 3 TDS AND LEAD HIS TEAM IN RUSHING IN FIRST START SINCE AT LEAST 1950

Maye threw 3 touchdowns and led his team in rushing with 38 yards vs. Houston (10/13/24). He is the first quarterback to lead his team in rushing and throw for at least 3 touchdown passes in his first career start since at least 1950.

MAYE FINISHES WITH 95 YARDS RUSHING

Maye finished the game at Tennessee (11/3/24) with 95 yards rushing. It is the fourth time in team history a New England quarterback reached at least 90 yards rushing in a game and the first time since Steve Grogan had 103 yards rushing vs. the New York Jets on Oct. 18, 1976. Maye's 95 yards are the third-most in team history. Maye had 8 rushing attempts for 95 yards for a 11.9-yard average.

BEST TWO-GAME RUSHING TOTAL BY A PAT QB

Maye followed a 46-yard rushing performance vs. the New York Jets (10/27) with a 95-yard rushing performance at Tennessee (11/3) for 141 total yards. It is the best two-game rushing total by a Patriots quarterback, besting the 132 rushing yards by QB Steve Grogan in 1976 with 103 rushing yards vs. the New York Jets (10/18) followed by 29 yards rushing at Buffalo (10/24).

MAYE RUNS LONG

Maye had a 41-yard run in the first quarter vs. Indianapolis on Dec. 1.
The run is tied for the third-longest run by a Patriots quarterback and it
is the fifth time a Patriots quarterback had a 40-yard run in a game. It is

MAYE-KING HISTORY

 Since 1950, Drake Maye and Dan Marino are the only quarterbacks with at least 500 passing yards and at least 5 touchdown passes in their first two starts. Maye threw for 243 yards and 3 touchdowns in his first career start vs. Houston (10/13) and 276 yards and 2 touchdowns last week at Jacksonville (10/20).

MAYE THROWS 10TH TD PASS TO 10TH RECEIVER

Maye recorded his 10th touchdown to a different receiver on a 38-yard touchdown pass to TE Austin Hooper in the fourth quarter at Miami (11/24), tying former Denver Broncos QB Steve Ramsey (1971-73) for the most consecutive touchdown to a different receiver to start a career. Maye completed touchdown passes to WR Kayshon Boutte, TE Hunter Henry, WR DeMario Douglas, RB JaMycal Hasty, WR K.J. Osborn, RB Rhamondre Stevenson, WR Ja'Lynn Polk, WR Kendrick Bourne and LT Vederian Lowe in addition to Hooper.

DEDICATION TO HIS GOALS

While in high school, Stevenson started gaining attention for the impressive stats he posted as a junior. Unfortunately, due to his grades, Stevenson was academically ineligible to receive a football scholarship despite being recruited. Following his senior year of high school, Stevenson took a year off from football and worked part-time jobs at Wal-Mart and Jimmy John's. But after a year away, he decided to follow a group of his friends and enroll in Cerritos Community College. During his time at Cerritos, he shared a two-bedroom apartment with up to six other guys at times and rode his bicycle 20 minutes to and from practice every day. After putting up monster stats in his second season at Cerritos, he committed to Oklahoma. Oklahoma led him to the 2021 NFL Draft where in the fourth round on the third day the Patriots selected Stevenson. In addition, he worked on his academics and made the Dean's List while at Oklahoma.

STEVENSON RECORDS FIRST RECEIVING TOUCHDOWN

 Stevenson had his first career touchdown reception on a 3-yard pass from QB Mac Jones in the second quarter vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 6 2022.

CAREER HIGHS IN RECEPTIONS AND RECEIVING YARDS

Stevenson set career highs in receptions and receiving yards after finishing with nine receptions for 76 yards at Minnesota on Nov. 24, 2022. His previous high in receptions was eight vs. Chicago on Oct. 24, 2022, and his previous high in receiving yards was 72 yards on Oct. 30, 2022, at the New York Jets.

STEVENSON HAD CAREER LONG RUN

Stevenson had a career-long 64-yard touchdown run in the second quarter vs. Washington on Nov. 5, 2023. His previous long was a 49-yard run vs. Detroit on Oct. 9, 2022, and his previous longest touchdown run was a 34-yard touchdown run at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022. It is the longest touchdown run for a Patriots player since RB Damien Harris had a 64-yard touchdown run at Buffalo on Dec. 6, 2022. It is tied with Harris for the longest touchdown run by a Patriot player in the regular seasons since a 70-yard run by Curtis Martin on Sept. 21, 1997 vs. Chicago.

STEVENSON HAS FIFTH CAREER 100-YARD GAME

Stevenson had his fifth 100-yard game in the 2024 season-opener with 120 yards in the win vs. Cincinnati on Sept. 8. He had a career-high 172 yards rushing at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022. It was his second 100-yard game of the year and fourth overall. He has two 100-yard games of 160 or more yards. In addition to the 172, he had 161 yards rushing vs. Detroit on Oct. 9, 2022. He has two of the teams 14 games with at least 160 yards rushing. Only Curtis Martin and Jim Nance with three have more.

STEVENSON HAS THIRD GAME WITH 9.0 AVERAGE

 Stevenson finished nine carries for 87 yards for a 9.7-yard average vs. Washington on Nov. 5, 2023, the highest average of his career and the third time he had at least a 9.0-yard average. He had a 9.1-yard average at Las Vegas on Dec. 18, 2022 and a 9.0-yard average at Buffalo on Jan. 8, 2023.



STRANGE FACEMASK

2022 first-round draft pick OL Cole Strange started wearing the vertical bar facemask his senior season at Chattanooga. The idea started when the veteran offensive line group, who had been together for four years, wanted to do something different to finish out their final season playing alongside each other. They decided to all wear the same facemask and landed on the vertical bar. Strange brought the bar with him to the NFL and is one of only three NFL regulars to sport the vertical bar in their facemask.









JOURNEY TO THE NFL

As a high school sophomore, football wasn't on Christian Barmore's radar. Barmore played basketball in high school until his junior year, when the football coach at Delaware Valley Charter High School convinced him to give football a chance. Moving to Neumann Goretti High School as a senior after his previous high school closed, Barmore became a highly-recruited prospect in just his second season of organized football, committing to the University of Alabama. Additionally, Barmore has faced plenty of adversity in his life, including the process of overcoming blood clots to return to the field in 2024. PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAMER RICHARD SEYMOUR SEES GREATNESS AHEAD FOR CHRISTIAN BARMORE

- For a defensive lineman, if Patriots and Pro Football Hall of Famer Richard Seymour is in your corner, there are few better compliments or endorsements.
- "I think he has a ton of ability, natural ability, and he plays hard," Seymour told the Boston Herald. "I think he's going to be a problem for (opposing teams) for a long time to come. Hopefully he stays healthy and continues on the path he's on. I think he has a really bright future."

SECOND-MOST QUARTERBACK PRESSURES

 Barmore posted the second-most quarterback pressures for a first-year defensive tackle since 2006, according to Pro Football Focus. His 48 pressures in 2021 were two more than Aaron Donald had during his rookie season.

FIRST CAREER 3-SACK GAME

• Barmore finished with his first career 3-sack game, all in the third quarter, at Denver on Dec. 24, 2023. He had two 8-yard sacks and one 9-yard sack of Denver QB Russell Wilson. He increased his 2023 total to 8½ sacks. He is the first Patriots player with a 3-sack game since LB Joshua Uche had a 3-sack game at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022. The last defensive lineman with a 3-sack game for New England was Deatrich Wise Jr. on Sept. 25, 2022 vs. Baltimore.



100 TACKLES

 LB Ja'Whaun Bentley registered 100 total tackles in three straight seasons (108 in 2021, 122 in 2022 and 114 in 2023).

CAREER HIGH IN TACKLES

Bentley set a single-season career-high with 122 tackles in 2022. He became the 13th New England player to reach at least 120 total tackles in a season and the first Patriots player to do so since Jerod Mayo had 147 total tackles in 2012.



Ja'Whaun and his family were homeless starting his freshman year of high school, living with one set of grandparents, then the other, then an aunt. Ja'Whaun and his brother slept on floors at times over the course of several years. Once Ja'Whaun entered the NFL, he was able to secure permanent housing for his family.

DUGGER PLAYS ROLE IN FOUR OF THE 7 DEFENSIVE TDS

 Dugger played a major role in four of the NFL-best 7 defensive touchdowns in 2022. In addition to his pick-6 against Miami, he returned an interception 16 yards for a touchdown at Las Vegas, returned a fumble 59 yards for a touchdown vs. Detroit and forced a fumble that LB Raekwon McMillan returned 23 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter at Arizona (12/12).

DUGGER EARNS HIS DEGREE

- Dugger helped put Lenoir-Rhyne University on the map, becoming the highest-drafted athlete in the Division II football program's history.
- Three years after being selected in the second round of the 2020 NFL Draft, a diligent Dugger worked hard to finish his degree, earning a Bachelor's degree in psychology in 2023.

DUGGER SCORES ON A 59-YARD FUMBLE RETURN

 Dugger recovered a fumble vs. Detroit (10/9/22) that was forced on a 13-yard sack by LB Matthew Judon, and returned the ball 59 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. It is the fifth-longest fumble return in team history. It was Dugger's first career touchdown.

 Elliss has two brothers that also play linebacker in the NFL: Jonah (Denver Broncos) and Kaden (Atlanta Falcons). Another one of his brothers, Noah, played for the Philadelphia Eagles. His father, Luther, was a first-round draft pick by the Detroit Lions in 1995. As a defensive lineman, he was a two-time Pro Bowler in nine seasons with Detroit and Denver. He is currently the defensive tackles coach at the University of Utah where Christian's younger brother, Elijah, plays defensive end.

ELLISS HAS CAREER-HIGH IN TACKLES

 Elliss set a single-game career high vs. Buffalo on Jan. 5, 2025, with a team-leading 13 total tackles. His previous high was 9 tackles at the Jacksonville Jaguars on Oct. 20, 2024, and vs. the New York Jets on Oct. 27, 2024. Elliss' tackle total was the highest of the 2024 season for any Patriots player. LB Ja'Whaun Bentley had 12 total tackles at Cincinnati on Sept. 8, 2024.



IN RARE COMPANY

 DL Davon Godchaux, DL DeForrest Buckner and DT Zach Seiler are the only NFL defensive lineman to have at least 55 total tackles in each of the past four seasons (2021-2024) Godchaux accumulated 65 tackles in 2021, 62 tackles in 2022, 56 tackles in 2023 and 67 tackles in 2024.



GONZALEZ EARNS SECOND TEAM ALL-PRO HONORS

 CB Christian Gonzalez earned second-team Associated Press All-Pro Honors for his 2024 season.



ROOKIE OF THE MONTH

Gonzalez was named the Defensive Rookie of the Month for September by the National Football League, becoming the fifth Patriots player to win a rookie of the month honor and the third defensive player to earn the award. Gonzalez joins QB Mac Jones (November of 2021), DE Chandler Jones (September of 2012), LB Jerod Mayo (October of 2008) and WR Deion Branch (September of 2002).

GONZO'S JOURNEY

- Before his collegiate success, even the prospect of going to college seemed out of reach for Gonzalez. He didn't want his family to have to pay his college tuition, and as a sophomore, he was a backup quarterback on his high school's junior varsity team that went 1-9. He almost gave up the sport, but after his family's encouragement and transferring schools, Gonzalez's new coaches switched him to defense, and he quickly attracted the attention of colleges around the nation.
- To understand the athleticism of Christian Gonzalez, look no further than his family. His father, Hector, played basketball at UTEP and professionally overseas. Gonzalez's two older sisters were both on the Colombian National Team for track & field and were college All-Americans. His eldest sister competed in the 2020 Olympics, and his younger sister is a rising star in soccer.

PATRIOTS SCORE ON DEFENSE FOR FIRST TIME IN 2024

• The Patriots scored on defense for the first time in 2024 at Miami (11/24/24) when CB Christian Gonzalez returned a RB Jaylen Wright fumble 63 yards for a touchdown that was forced by S Marte Mapu. It was the Patriots first fumble returned for a touchdown since LB Raekwon McMillan returned a fumble for a 23-yard touchdown at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022. It was Gonzalez's first NFL touchdown. The fumble return is tied for the third-longest in team history.

• LB Jahlani Tavai starred in high school as a nose guard. He was undersized and did not attract the attention of many colleges. But after finding out one of the English teachers at his high school was the son of then-Hawaii coach Norm Chow, he reached out to the teacher, Cameron Chow, and asked if Cameron could tell his dad to scout his tape. Cameron followed up and passed along Jahlani's tape to his dad, and the very next day, Jahlani had a scholarship offer. According to Jahlani, his football career would have been over after high school if it wasn't for this connection.

ONE AND ONLY

Tavai is the only NFL player within the last decade to play at least 70% of the snaps on offense or defense and 70% of the snaps on special teams, a feat he accomplished in 2023. Among 252 players that played at least 40 percent of his team's special teams snaps in 2024, Tavai and Minnesota S Josh Metellus are the only players to have also played 80 percent of his team's defensive snaps.

TAVAI SETS CAREER HIGH IN TACKLES

 Tavai finished the 2024 season with a single-season career best 109 total tackles. His previous best was his 107 total tackles during the 2023 season.



THIRD TIME TEAM CAPTAIN

 DL Deatrich Wise Jr. has been named a team captain for the last three seasons.

DEATRICH WISE JR. RECORDS 3 SACKS VS. BALTIMORE

- Wise had his first career 3-sack game after a 3-yard sack in the first quarter, an 8-yard sack and a 1-yard sack in the second quarter vs. Baltimore on Sept. 25, 2022. His previous best was 1½ sacks, which he accomplished three times vs. Buffalo (12/24/17), vs. Houston (9/9/18) and vs. Cleveland (11/14/21).
- Wise is the fifth Patriots player to register 3 sacks in a half. DL Henry Thomas had 3 sacks in the first half at St. Louis on Dec. 13, 1998. LB Tully Banta-Cain had 3 sacks in the second half at Buffalo on Dec. 20, 2009, DL Jarvis Green had 3 sacks in the second half at Cincinnati on Oct. 1, 2006, and Joshua Uche at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022. DL Christian Barmore had t3 third quarter sacks at Denver on Dec. 24, 2023.



WISE HAS SECOND CAREER MULTI-SACK GAME

• Wise had his second career game with two or more sacks after finishing with 2 sacks at Chicago (11/10/24). He dropped QB Caleb Williams for an 8-yard loss on a third-down play in the first quarter and a sack for 0 yards on a third-down play in the third quarter. Wise had a career-high 3 sacks vs. Baltimore on Sept. 25, 2022. Wise has three games with 1½ sacks.

• Wise was honored with the 2022 Ron Burton Community Service Award at the Patriots Premiere for his dedication to serving his community. After receiving the award, Wise said, "You don't go out in the community for the gratification. You just do it because it's in your heart to do. It's an honor to win an award of this prestige and to be in the same group as everybody who's won that before and have my name with the Burton family."

P Bryce Baringer led the NFL and set a team record in 2023 with 38 punts inside the 20-yard line. Baringer became the second Patriots punter with back-to-back seasons with at least 30 punts inside the 20-yard line after finishing with 31 in 2024. Jake Bailey had 36 in 2019 and 31 in 2020.

FROM WALK-ON TO ALL-AMERICAN

Baringer had an unconventional path to the NFL. He began his collegiate career by earning a walk-on spot at Illinois in 2018 as a true freshman, but due to being buried on the depth chart and the cost of out-of-state tuition, he transferred home to Michigan State as a regular student. Outside of a four-game stint on the Michigan State team due to injuries on the roster, Baringer did not have a walk-on spot available to him in 2019. After a year serving as the team's photographer to maintain access to the facilities to train, Baringer attended an open tryout with a new coaching staff at the Spartans and made the team, establishing himself as the Spartans top punter in 2020 and going on to have record-breaking seasons in 2021 and 2022. In 2022, he was named the Big 10 Punter of the Year and a consensus All-American by all five major associations.

BARINGER SETS TEAM MARK

Baringer had at least one 50-yard punt in all 17 games in 2023 to set
the team record for the longest single season streak in team history
(at any point of the season). Zoltan Mesko had a 12-game streak in
2011. Baringer extended his record to 27 games with a 50-yard punt
after connecting on a 50-yard punts in the first 10 games of 2024
before the streak ended in the game vs. the LA Rams (11/17/24).

RECORD BREAKING

Baringer connected on a 79-yard punt in the second quarter vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 12, 2023 in Frankfurt, Germany, the fifth-longest punt in team history.

Baringer had three games in 2023 when he drilled at least two 60-yard punts, with a 60-yard and 63-yard punt at Miami on Oct 29, a 79-yard and a 65-yard punt vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 12 and a 63 and 60-yard punt vs. the NY Jets on Jan. 7. He is the only Patriots punter with at least two games with two 60-yard punts in a season. He had three such games in 2024 after he had a 65 and 67-yard punt vs. Seattle on Sept. 15, a 61 and 75-yard punt at Chicago on Nov. 10 and a 62 and 64-yard punt vs. L.A. Chargers on Dec. 28 for his sixth game with at least two 60-yard punts.

- CB Marcus Jones finished second in the NFL in 2024 with a 14.8-yard punt return average (26 returns for 386 yards).
- Jones scored on a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022. If he scores on offense again, he will join LB Mike Vrabel (8 touchdown receptions) as the only defensive player with more than one touchdown on offense in team history. Vrabel also has the most offensive touchdowns by an NFL defensive player with 10 in the regular season.
- Jones returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20, 2022. If he returns a kickoff for a touchdown, he will become the first New England player to return a punt and a kickoff for a touchdown
- If Jones returns another punt for a touchdown, he will join Julian Edelman (4), Troy Brown (3), Irving Fryar (3) and Mike Haynes (2) as the only Patriots players with more than one punt returned for a touchdown.
- Jones handled kickoff and punt return duties as a rookie in 2022. JONES NAMED FIRST-TEAM ALL-PRO

 Jones, who won the 2021 Paul Hornung Award as the nation's most versatile player after returning two punts and two kickoff returns for a touchdown in college in 2021, finished second in the NFL with a 12.5yard punt return average, second in total return yards with 1,007 and seventh in kickoff return average with a 23.9 average. He was named to the Associated Press All-Pro First Team as a punt returner, the first Patriots rookie to be named All-Pro First Team.

JONES SCORES ON OFFENSE, DEFENSE AND SPECIAL TEAMS

Jones returned a third quarter interception 69 yards for a touchdown vs. Cincinnati on Dec. 24, 2022. He scored on a punt return for a touchdown, a touchdown reception and an interception returned for a touchdown to become the fourth player in NFL history to do so in a season, joining Frank Bacon (1920), Bill Dudley (1947) and Tommy Harmon (1947). Jones returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20 and scored on a 48-yard touchdown pass vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1 in addition to the pick-6 against the Bengals. The only other player in the Super Bowl era to score a 40-plus yard touchdown in each of those ways in their entire career is Deion Sanders.

FIRST DB TO CATCH A TD ON OFFENSE SINCE 2000

Jones, who made his first career start on defense vs. Buffalo on Dec. 1, 2022, also lined up on offense and scored on a 48-yard touchdown pass from QB Mac Jones on his first play from scrimmage in the first quarter. Jones became the first defensive back to record a touchdown reception on offense since 2000 when S Marcus Coleman of the New York Jets caught a 45-yard touchdown pass from QB Vinny Testaverde against Buffalo on Sept. 17, 2000. Jones caught 15 passes for 137 yards with one receiving touchdown during his college career. He scored on a 47-yard touchdown pass vs. Navy on Sept. 25, 2021. Jones joins LB Mike Vrabel (six 1-yard touchdowns and four 2-yard touchdowns from Tom Brady), LB Elandon Roberts (38-yard touchdown pass from Brady vs. Miami on Dec. 29, 2019) and LB/DE John Tanner (2-yard as the only pass from QB Jim Plunkett on Nov. 24, 1974 at Baltimore) as the only New England defensive players to catch touchdowns.

FIRST PAT TO CATCH A TD ON FIRST RECEPTION SINCE 2019

Jones was the first Patriots player to catch a touchdown on his first reception since LB Elandon Roberts caught a 38-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter vs Miami on Dec. 29, 2019. Jones's 48-yard touchdown on his first offensive play is the longest by a Patriots player on his first play since WR Stephen Starring caught a 73-yard touchdown pass from Steve Grogan on his first offensive play vs. Baltimore on Sept. 4, 1983.

JONES RETURNS PUNT 84 YARDS FOR A TOUCHDOWN

Jones returned a fourth quarter punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets on Nov. 20, 2022 with five seconds to play. It is tied with Julian Edelman (84-yard touchdown return vs. Denver on Nov. 2, 2014) for the fifth-longest punt return in team history. Jones was the first player with a punt return for a touchdown in 2022. Jones' punt return for a touchdown is the first for the Patriots since Gunner Olszewski's 70-yard return at the LA Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020.

LAST MINUTE GAME WINNER

- Jones is the sixth player in the NFL to record a game-winning punt-return for a touchdown in the final two minutes of regulation or in overtime since 1970, joining Patrick Peterson (Nov. 6, 2011), DeSean Jackson (Dec. 19, 2010), Brian Westbrook (Oct. 19, 2003), Tamarick Vanover (Oct. 9, 1995) and Walter Stanley (Nov. 27, 1986).
- Jones' punt return for a touchdown with five seconds remaining vs. the New York Jets (11/20) marked the second-latest game-winning punt return for a touchdown in regulation since 1970, trailing only DeSean Jackson (no time remaining on Dec. 19, 2010) who returned a punt 65-yards for a touchdown in Philadelphia's win at the New York Giants.

JONES' 84-YARD PUNT RETURN IS SECOND LONGEST GO-AHEAD TD IN 4TH QUARTER IN TEAM HISTORY

 Jones' 84-yard punt return for a touchdown is the second longest goahead 4th quarter touchdown in team history. The only longer return was the 91-yard missed field goal return for a touchdown by Ron Burton at Denver on Nov. 11, 1962.

WEEK 11 AFC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

 Jones was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week by the National Football League for his performance in the Patriots 10-3 victory over the New York Jets in Week 11.

JONES JOINS DEION SANDERS AS TRIPLE-THREAT

 Jones registered his first career interception in the third quarter at Arizona on Dec. 12, 2022. He had a 48-yard touchdown reception vs. Buffalo (12/1/22) and returned a punt 84 yards for a touchdown vs. the New York Jets (11/20/22). The only other NFL player with a receiving touchdown, a punt or kick returned for a touchdown and an interception in the same season is Deion Sanders in 1992.



PRO BOWL HONORS

S Brenden Schooler was named to the Pro Bowl on special teams in 2024 after leading the team with 9 special teams tackles. He was also named Associated Press All-Pro First Team, PFWA All-NFL and as an NFLPA Players All-Pro. Schooler led the Patriots in special teams tackles in each of his first two seasons with 14 in 2022 and 13 in 2023. Schooler had a career-high with 3 solo special teams tackles in the 2024 season-opener at Cincinnati on Sept. 24. It was the most special teams tackles in a game since S Cody Davis had 4 solo special teams tackles vs. the New York Jets on Oct. 24, 2021.

SCHOOLER ROOKIE SPECIAL TEAMS ACE

 Schooler recovered his second fumble of the 2022 season on the punt return team when he recovered a muffed punt return by WR Chester Rogers in the fourth quarter at Cleveland (10/16/22). Schooler also recovered a muffed punt at Pittsburgh (9/18/22). Schooler had a team-leading 14 special teams tackles in 2022, including 11 solo special teams tackles.

SCHOOLER RECORDS 1ST CAREER BLOCKED FIELD GOAL

Schooler blocked a 49-yard field goal attempt in the third quarter vs. Miami on Sept. 17, 2023 for his first career field goal block. It was the Patriots first blocked field goal attempt since DB Cody Davis blocked a 58-yard attempt at the LA Chargers on Dec. 6, 2020 that was returned 44 yards for a touchdown by S Devin McCourty. In 2022, the Patriots had one blocked kick when DB Jonathan Jones blocked a punt vs. Indianapolis on Nov. 6, 2022. Schooler blocked at punt vs. Miami in the second quarter on Oct. 6, 2024.

TIED FOR SECOND WITH 13 SPECIAL TEAMS TACKLES IN 2023

Schooler reached double-digit special teams tackles in 2023 with 13 for the second straight season. As a rookie in 2022, he had a team-leading 14 special teams tackles. He is the first NFL player to begin his career with two straight 10-plus special teams tackle seasons since LB Grant Stuard with 11 special teams tackles in 2021 when he played with Tampa Bay and 11 special teams tackles in 2022 when he played for Indianapolis. Schooler finished tied for second in the NFL with 13 special teams tackles in 2023 and was named All-Pro as a core special teams player by the NFLPA.

SCHOOLER SEES ACTION AT SAFETY; RECORDS FIRST-CAREER SACK

Schooler saw action at safety in the second quarter at Chicago on Nov. 14, 2024. Last season, he played in his first and only defensive snaps of his career on a Hail Mary attempt on the final plays vs. Buffalo (10/22/23) and at Denver (12/24/23). Schooler had his first-career sack in the third quarter on a 9-yard sack of QB Caleb Williams on a third-down play. He added his second sack of the year on a 7-yard sack of QB Tua Tagovailoa at Miami on Nov. 24, 2024 in the fourth quarter.



SLYE SETS TEAM RECORD WITH A 63-YARD FIELD GOAL

K Joey Slye set a team record with a 63-yard field goal at the end of the second quarter at San Francisco on Sept. 29, 2024. The previous record was a 62-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski at Oakland on Nov. 19, 2017, in Mexico City. Slye's previous best was a 61-yard field goal in the second quarter vs. Philadelphia on Oct. 29, 2023, when he played for Washington. Gostkowski and Slye are the only Patriots to ever kick a successful 60-yard field goal. Slye's field goal is tied for the fourth-longest in NFL history.

With every field goal he makes, Slye holds up six fingers in honor of his older brother, A.J., who passed away after battling acute myeloid leukemia. A.J. wore No. 6 throughout his football career, and memories from his and Joey's time together on the field are tattooed on Joey's right arm and back. Also illustrated on his back is the logo for the SlyeStrong#6 Foundation, the Slye family's organization that aims to find a cure for adult and childhood cancer.

SHARP AT GILLETTE

The Patriots not only have the second-best home record at their home stadium in the NFL since 1970, but the club also owns three 20-plus home win streaks in Gillette Stadium history: a 20-game regular season win streak from 2008-11 and two 21-game win streaks that includes the playoffs.
