The New England Patriots (1-3) return home to host the San Diego Chargers (3-1) this week. Both teams will attempt to rebound from disappointing Week 4 road losses. The Patriots were defeated by the division-leading Miami Dolphins, 30-10, while the Chargers were dealt their first loss of the season by the upstart Cleveland Browns, 20-16.

The Patriots enter this week's game with hopes of extending their nine-game win streak against the Chargers. The Patriots hold a 16-12-2 series advantage and have not been defeated by the Chargers since Nov. 15, 1970, when the Boston Patriots hosted their AFL rival at Harvard Stadium before a crowd of 30,597. Over the last 30 years, the Patriots have outscored the Chargers 288-149, including an 86-14 advantage in their last two meetings.

The Patriots last hosted the Chargers in the 1997 season opener and scored a convincing 41-7 victory. The Patriots largest margin of victory in the series came the year before when the team rolled to a 45-7 victory at San Diego on Dec. 1, 1996.

Patriots second-year quarterback Tom Brady, 20-5 as a starter at Michigan, is now 1-1 as an NFL starter. He returns to Foxboro, where he led the Patriots to a 44-13 victory over the Indianapolis Colts in his NFL starting debut two weeks ago. A victory this week over the Chargers would give Brady consecutive home victories. The last time a Patriots quarterback, other than Drew Bledsoe, led the Patriots to consecutive victories at home was Hugh Millen in 1991.

The Patriots run defense will face another daunting challenge as they prepare for rookie running back LaDainian Tomlinson. Through Week 4, Tomlison leads the NFL with 412 yards rushing (104.0 per game) and is tied with a league-leading six rushing touchdowns. The Patriots, who limited Edgerrin James to just 55 yards rushing in a victory over the Colts in Week 3, are 0-3 in games that they have allowed an individual 100-yard rushing performance.

Offensively, the Patriots will face one of the league's stingiest and most opportunistic defenses. The Chargers defense is ranked fourth in the NFL, allowing just 241.3 yards per game. They have also forced a league-high 14 turnovers, including eight interceptions. Five of those interceptions have been credited to cornerback Ryan McNeil, who earned September AFC Defensive Player of the Month honors for his efforts.

Chargers quarterback Doug Flutie, a Natick native, returns to Foxboro Stadium, where he is 7-1 as a starter, including a 5-0 record as the quarterback of the Patriots (1988-89). His last two victories in Foxboro came at the controls of the Buffalo Bills in 1999 and 2000. Both games were decided by field goals in overtime.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Patriots will return home to a sold-out Foxboro Stadium and face the Chargers this weekend. They will extend their sellout streak to 76 games, a streak that started in 1994. The Patriots have a 48-27 record in Foxboro during that streak.

This week's game will be the only home game played at Foxboro Stadium during the month of October. Next week, the Patriots travel to Indianapolis for their first of three road games before returning to host the Buffalo Bills on Nov. 11, 2001.



Series Information

SERIES HISTORY

This week's game will be the 31st encounter between the Patriots and Chargers, dating back to the first season of the AFL. The Patriots currently have a nine-game winning streak in the series. It's the longest current winning streak the Patriots hold over any other team in the NFL. The last time the Chargers won was 1970, the final year of the AFL. The two teams met once in the playoffs, in the 1963 AFL Championship Game, and the Chargers were victorious 51-10.

LAST MEETING

The Patriots defeated the Chargers 41-7 in the 1997 season opener at a sold-out Foxboro Stadium. Quarterback Drew Bledsoe led the charge by completing 26 of 39 passes for 340 yards and four touchdowns. The Patriots scored on five of their six first half drives (four touchdowns and one field goal). The Patriots defense forced three turnovers and sacked Charger quarterback Stan Humphries four times.

Game Review - Dolphins 30, Patriots 10

GAME REVIEW

New England fell 30-10 to division rival Miami last week at Pro Player Stadium. It was the largest margin of victory for the Dolphins in the series since they defeated the Patriots 23-3 on Oct. 30, 1994.

The Dolphins gained 209 yards rushing, the most against the Patriots since the Buffalo Bills gained 213 yards on Nov. 15, 1998. Dolphin running back Lamar Smith, who only gained a combined 68 yards against the Patriots last season, led the charge with 144 yards rushing on 29 carries (5.0 avg.).

The Patriots were forced into three turnovers and the Dolphins converted them into 10 points. The Patriots generated one turnover, an interception by Mike Vrabel, and finished the game with a –2 turnover ratio. New England is 0-2 this season and 9-21 since 1996 when they have a negative turnover ratio.

New England jumped out first, when Vrabel intercepted a Jay Fiedler pass on the Dolphins first play from scrimmage. Vrabel gained 15 yards on the return and the Patriots offense took over at the Miami 10 yard-line. Two plays later, running back Antowain Smith scored a 9-yard touchdown and the Patriots took a 7-0 lead with 12:09 remaining in the first quarter.

The Dolphins moved 80-yards on 14 plays in 8:24 on the very next drive and tied the score at seven on a 7-yard Smith run.

Two series later, the Dolphins punted the football and Troy Brown uncharacteristically muffed the fair catch and Miami recovered it on the 9 yard-line. The Patriots defense held their ground and forced the Dolphins to kick a field goal.

The Patriots answered the Dolphins score with one of their own on the next drive. Quarterback Tom Brady, who was making his second NFL start, moved the team 56 yards on 13-plays, for Adam Vinatieri's 37-yard field goal. Brady completed all three of his passes on the drive for 28-yards and also gained a first down on a 9-yard scramble.

The field goal increased Vinatieri's career point total to 601 and he became only the third Patriot to reach that mark, joining Gino Cappelletti (1,130) and John Smith (692). It was the 14th straight kick he's made this season.

Miami closed the first half by driving 64 yards on 8-plays and scored on a 14-yard pass from Fiedler to Jay Weaver. The score gave Miami a 17-10 lead at the half.

The Dolphins came out on their first drive of the second half and trekked 56 yards on 13-plays, adding a second Mare field goal and increased their lead to 20-10. Later in the quarter after trading punts, the Patriots suffered their second turnover of the game. Brady fumbled the football on his own 15 yard-line and as he dove to recover it, an offensive lineman inadvertently kicked the ball away from him. Dolphin defensive end Jason Taylor scooped up the loose ball on the 1 yard-line and went into the end zone for the touchdown to give the Dolphins a 27-10 lead.

Miami would add a late field goal and defeated the Patriots 30-10. It was the Dolphins fifth straight win against the Patriots.

MILLER LITE PLAYER OF THE GAME

Mike Vrabel was voted the Patriots Miller Lite Player of the Game against Miami. He intercepted the first pass of his career on the Dolphins first offensive play of the game and returned it 15-yards to the Miami 10-yard-line. The Patriots offense scored on a 9-yard run two plays later. He also had three tackles last week.

DID YOU KNOW...

In last week's game, the Patriots finished with 69 yards passing and the Dolphins totaled 87. The last time two NFL teams both passed for fewer than 100 yards in the same game was Oct. 4, 1998 when the Giants had 83 in a 20-3 victory against the Buccaneers, who had 85 ... It was the lowest passing production by the Patriots since passing for just 67 net yards vs. Buffalo on Dec. 26, 1999 ... The last time the Dolphins were held to fewer than 100 yards passing was Dec. 12, 1982 at Foxboro Stadium, in the 'Snow Plow Game' when they had 59.

INTERCEPTION NOTE

The Patriots have recorded four interceptions the past two weeks. In the 12 games prior to last week (10 in 2000 and 2 in 2001), the Patriots had recorded only two interceptions.

TURNOVER NOTE

The Patriots had a turnover ratio of -2 last week against the Dolphins. The Patriots are 0-2 this season when they have a negative turnover ratio and 9-21 since 1996. Conversely, they are 28-10 since 1996 when they have a positive turnover ratio.

GAME NOTES

Safety **Lawyer Milloy**, who had averaged 11.8 tackles in the last four games against the Dolphins, led all defenders with nine tackles ... Kicker **Adam Vinatieri** increased his streak of consecutive kicks against the Dolphins to 15 ... Miami's defensive end **Jason Taylor** returned a fumble 1-yard for a touchdown last week against the Patriots. The last time the Patriots had a fumble returned for a touchdown against them was when Atlanta Falcons defensive end Chuck Smith ran 71-yards vs. Atlanta (11/8/98).

BILL BELICHICK'S COMMENTS

Re: The loss to the Dolphins:

BB: We just got our butts kicked today. I thought that Miami played a really good football game. We just didn't play as well as they did, not even close. We gave away a lot of points and just handed them a lot of opportunities. We handed them some points on the board, and you can't do that against a good football team. They ran the ball well. They made a couple plays in the kicking game that were big plays. Defensively they kind of stifled us. They were just a better football team in every phase of the game. No ifs, ands or buts about it.

Re: The difference between stopping Edgerrin James (last week) and Lamar Smith (this past Sunday)?

BB: Last week is last week. It is two different teams playing a different game.

Re: Where do you start off after a week like this?

BB: We need to learn from some of the mistakes here today. More importantly I would say we need to refocus and reenergize our efforts toward a more efficient football game. We can't be turning the ball over. We can't have penalties that cost us a lot of field position. We can't be giving the other team opportunities that just make it hard for us to overcome. We can't be donors. We can't donate stuff to our opponents. We have to make them work for it. That's where it starts. We were too generous.

THE TURNOVER STORY

In the Patriots 30-10 loss last week they had a -2 turnover ratio and currently have a -1 ratio for the season. They are 0-2 this year when they have a negative turnover ratio and 9-21 since 1996.

Since 1996, New England is 28-10 (.737) when they have a positive turnover ratio. The last four times the team finished the season with a positive turnover ratio, they qualified for the playoffs (1994, 1996, 1997 and 1998). In the history of the franchise, the team has finished their season with a positive turnover ratio 16 times. The team had a winning record 15 of those 16 seasons.

TACKLING MEN

Patriot defenders Bryan Cox and Roman Phifer, who were both signed this past offseason, are currently the top two tacklers on the defense. Cox leads the team with 29 tackles and Phifer has 25. Phifer has also recorded an interception, a fumble recovery and forced a fumble, which drew a compliment from Head Coach Bill Belichick.

"Roman has been a real good addition to this team and a good veteran presence," said Belichick. "He's had a lot of experience. He really knows what he is doing out there. Roman is a smart guy and he's very athletic."

600 CLUB

Patriots kicker Adam Vinatieri nailed a 37-yard field goal in the second quarter last week against the Dolphins and became only the third player in Patriots history to eclipse the 600 point mark. He joined Gino Cappelletti (1,130 points) and John Smith (692) in the Patriots record book. Vinatieri has been successful on each one of his eight extra points and six field goals this season.

MR. SMITH GOES TO FOXBORO

Patriots running back Antowain Smith scored his third touchdown of the season, on a 9-yard run in the first quarter. It was his 29th career touchdown and his third score in the past two weeks. The last Patriot to score rushing touchdowns in consecutive games was Drew Bledsoe (10/15/00-10/22/00). If Smith scores a rushing touchdown this week, it would be the first time in his career he has done so in three consecutive weeks. The last time a Patriot rushed for a score in three consecutive weeks was Robert Edwards who rushed for a touchdown in the first six games of the 1998 season.

Smith, who was signed as a free agent this past offseason by the Patriots, leads the team with 194 yards on 57 carries (3.4 avg.).

TROY BROWN

Patriots wide receiver Troy Brown led all receivers with five catches and 47 yards receiving last week against the Dolphins. Through the first four games of the season, Brown ranks seventh in the AFC with 256 yards and ninth with 20 receptions. Over half of Brown's catches this season, 11, have resulted in first downs. Last week versus Miami, two of his five catches were for first downs. The AFC leaders in catches and receiving yards are listed below:
