NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (3-4) at ATLANTA FALCONS (3-3)

DATE: November 4, 2001

SITE: Georgia Dome (71,228) - Turf

TIME: 1:00 p.m. EST

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast regionally on CBS (locally on WBZ Channel 4 in Boston). **Craig Bolerjack** will provide the play-by-play detail and will be joined by broadcast partner **Trevor Matich**.

RADIO: WBCN's Rock Radio Network 104.1 FM. **Gil Santos**, now in his 25th season as voice of the Patriots, will call the action along with former Patriots center **Peter Brock**.

The New England Patriots (3-4) will travel to Atlanta to face the Falcons (3-3) this Sunday. It will be their third and final game on their current road swing before returning to Foxboro, where the Patriots will host three consecutive games. The Patriots and the Jacksonville Jaguars are the only teams that have had to play three consecutive road games this season.

Atlanta returns to action this week after enjoying a Week 7 bye. Prior to the bye, the Falcons snapped a two-game losing streak with a 20-13 victory over the Saints in New Orleans. While the Patriots have struggled on the road this year (1-3 record), the Falcons have struggled at home (1-2). Their only home win was a Week 2 victory over the Carolina Panthers, 24-16.

This week's game will be the 10th in the series between the two non-conference teams and the Falcons have proven over time to be a formidable foe, boasting a 6-3 series advantage. The Patriots' last victory in the series was a 25-17 win in 1986. Their only win in five tries in Atlanta was a 16-10 victory in 1977. The last time the Patriots traveled to Atlanta, Scott Zolak led the team into battle in 1995 after replacing Drew Bledsoe, who had sustained a separated shoulder the previous week. Last week, Patriots quarterback Tom Brady extended his NFL-record for pass attempts without an interception to start a career to 162 career attempts before Denard Walker snared a pass intended for David Patten in the end zone 1:48 into the fourth quarter at Denver. Unfortunately for the Patriots, the picks came in bunches. Brady was intercepted on each of the team's four fourth quarter possessions, including a 39-yard return for a touchdown that capped the scoring, 31-20. The loss dropped the Patriots to fourth place in the division.

A victory this weekend would give the Patriots a 4-4 record at midseason and the momentum of winning two-out-of-three on the road prior to returning home to host three consecutive games in November.

FORMIDABLE FOES

Including the Falcons, none of the Patriots' first eight opponents have a losing record as the NFL enters its eighth week. Those opponents have a combined record of 27-19 (.587). Unfortunately, their upcoming opponents don't offer much relief either. Of their remaining nine opponents (including the Falcons), only Buffalo (1-5) and Carolina (1-6) have losing records. The other six opponents have a combined record of 25-13 (.658).

LAST MEETING

The Patriots were defeated 41-10 by the Falcons at Foxboro Stadium on Nov. 8, 1998. The Falcons jumped out to an early lead, scoring touchdowns on their first two possessions. Running back Jamal Anderson opened the scoring on a 1-yard run and quarterback Chris Chandler connected with tight end O.J. Santiago on a 7-yard touchdown pass. The Patriots added a field goal, but the Falcons scored two more touchdowns before the end of the half and led 28-3. Patriots cornerback Ty Law intercepted two passes, the second resulted in quarterback Drew Bledsoe hitting tight end Ben Coates on a 2-yard touchdown pass. The score cut their deficit to 31-10, but the Falcons added 10 more points in the fourth quarter for the 41-10 victory.

PATRIOTS VERSUS NFC WEST

When the Patriots square off against the Falcons this weekend it will be their first clash with a member of the NFC West. New England was scheduled to play the Carolina Panthers on Sept. 16, but the game was postponed until Jan. 6. The last time the Patriots faced the NFC West, 1998, they finished with a 2-2 record. They defeated New Orleans 30-27 and San Francisco 24-21, but lost to Atlanta 41-10 and St. Louis 32-18. Last season the Patriots lost all four of their meetings with the NFC Central.

SERIES NOTES

- Patriots cornerback **Ty Law** intercepted two passes in the last meeting (11/8/98). It was the third time he accomplished the feat in his career.
- A pair of Falcon kickers share the record for longest field goal against the Patriots. **Morten Anderson** (10/1/95) and **Norm Johnson** (11/29/92) both kicked 54-yard field goals against the Patriots.
- Cornerback **Deion Sanders** made his NFL starting debut against the Patriots on Oct. 15, 1989.

CONNECTIONS

- Patriots fullback **Patrick Pass**, defensive tackle **Richard Seymour** and tight end **Jermaine Wiggins** attended the University of Georgia.
- Falcons wide receiver **Shawn Jefferson** caught 178 passes for 3,081 yards and 14 touchdowns while playing with the Patriots from 1996-99.
- Falcons defensive coordinator **Don Blackmon** played with the Patriots from 1981-87 and totaled 541 tackles. Blackmon was a starting linebacker on the Patriots Super Bowl XX team. He also spent the 1991 season as a linebackers coach on **Bill Belichick's** staff with the Cleveland Browns.
- Patriots defensive end **Anthony Pleasant** played in 11 games with the Falcons during the 1997 season.



GAME REVIEW – BRONCOS 31, PATRIOTS 20

GAME REVIEW

The New England Patriots lost 31-20 to the Denver Broncos at Invesco Field at Mile High. New England dropped to 3-4 while Denver improved to 4-3. The Patriots were outscored 21-3 in the second half and lost for the first time this season and just the 10th time since 1996 when they led at the half.

The Patriots opened the game by driving 74 yards on 10 plays and scored on a 24-yard field goal by Adam Vinatieri. Quarterback Tom Brady completed all five of his passes on the drive to four different receivers. It was the third consecutive game the Patriots scored on their opening drive.

New England's defense held the Broncos on their first drive to only three plays before they punted away the football. The Patriots offense covered 69 yards on four plays and scored on a 30-yard pass from Brady to wide receiver David Patten, increasing their lead to 10-0. It was the first time this season, they scored on their first two drives of the game.

Denver rebounded on their next drive with a touchdown cutting the Patriots lead to 10-7. Broncos running back Mike Anderson ran 8 yards up the middle for the score.

The Patriots attempted a wide receiver pass at the beginning of the second quarter, but Patten's throw was intercepted by Eric Brown on the Broncos 2-yard line.

Later in the quarter, Griese was intercepted by linebacker Tedy Bruschi and the Patriots quickly capitalized on the turnover. Brady connected with wide receiver Troy Brown on a 5-yard score and New England led 17-10 at the half.

The second half started well for the Patriots when safety Matt Stevens intercepted Griese on their third play from scrimmage in the half. They added a 44-yard field goal by Vinatieri and led 20-10.

The Broncos cut their deficit by seven on their next play when Griese teamed up with wide receiver Rod Smith for a 65-yard touchdown pass. The Broncos moved 80 yards on nine plays and took a 24-20 lead on a 6-yard touchdown pass from Griese to Dwayne Carswell.

New England moved into scoring position at the beginning of the fourth quarter when they drove to the Denver 13-yard line. Unfortunately, Brady was intercepted in the end zone by Denard Walker. The interception ended Brady's NFL record streak of 162 passes without an interception to start a career. The streak also ranked third on the Patriots all-time list.

Brady threw three more interceptions in the quarter, one that was returned 39 yards for a score by Walker and capped all scoring, 31-20.

The Broncos win ended the Patriots two-game winning streak in the series.

MILLER LITE PLAYER OF THE GAME

Patriots defensive end Willie McGinest was named Patriots Miller Lite Player of the Game. McGinest started and recorded his first two sacks of the season. He now has 47.5 sacks in his career.

NOW THAT'S SCARY

The Patriots are 15-27 (.357) in their last game played prior to the Halloween holiday (2-4 on Halloween) and are just 2-10 since 1990.

QUICK STRIKE

The Patriots scored on the first drive of the game for the third consecutive week. Kicker Adam Vinatieri nailed a 24-yard field goal attempt, capping a 59-yard, 10-play drive. They have also scored first in every game this season.

On their second possession, quarterback Tom Brady connected with wide receiver David Patten on a 30-yard touchdown pass. The drive covered 59 yards on four plays in 2:01. It marked the first time this year that the Patriots scored on their first two drives.

DAVID PATTEN

Patten caught a 30-yard touchdown pass from Brady in the first quarter. It was his third receiving touchdown this season and the seventh of his five-year career.

TEDY BRUSCHI

Bruschi recorded his first interception of the season and the second of his 6-year career. His other career interception was at Philadelphia (12/19/01). It was the Patriots fifth interception of the season.

MATT STEVENS

Stevens intercepted a Brian Griese pass in the third quarter. It was his first interception as a Patriot and the 11th of his career. His last interception came when he was a member of the Washington Redskins against the Jacksonville Jaguars (10/22/00).

KEVIN FAULK

Registered a kickoff return of 42 yards in the second quarter. It was the longest for the Patriots this season and the longest since Curtis Jackson recorded a 47-yard return vs. Kansas City 12/4/00.

GAME NOTES

The Patriots rushed for more yards than the Broncos (117 to 86). The Patriots are now 25-10 in games they have outrushed their opponent since 1996 ... The Patriots failed to score in the fourth quarter, snapping a 12-quarter streak (including overtime). It was their longest streak of the year ... New England has outscored their opponents 97-52 in the first half, but have been outscored 69-16 in the third quarter this year ... The Patriots five first downs by penalty was a season-high.

BILL BELICHICK'S COMMENTS

Re: The 31-20 loss to the Broncos:

"I think we found out some things about our team today. I think we just have to play a little bit better than we played. There's enough there to work with if we can just be a little bit more precise, a little bit more exact and execute the game plan just a little bit better than we did today. There were a lot of big plays in the game and Denver had more than we did and that's why they deserved to win."

Re: What he found out about his team:

"I thought we did some good things out there. We didn't do enough of them to win, so that's not good. But I thought we worked against a pretty good running game and we worked against a pretty good secondary and we were able to put some plays up there and put some points up there. We just didn't put enough of them up."



NEWS AND NOTES

TROY BROWN

- Brown led the Patriots with nine catches for 86 yards and one touchdown against the Broncos. It was the third consecutive game Brown had recorded eight catches or more.
- Brown leads the Patriots with 48 receptions for 579 yards (12.1 avg.) and three touchdowns this season.
- He ranks second in the NFL with 48 catches and fifth in the NFL with 579 yards receiving (see below).

- With 48 receptions in the first seven games, Brown is on pace to record 110 catches this season. The Patriots record is 96 catches set by tight end Ben Coates in 1994.
- Brown is averaging 82.7 yards receiving per game this season and is on pace to record 1,323 yards. Wide receiver Stanley Morgan holds the Patriots franchise record with 1,491 yards in 1986. Coates is second in franchise history with 1,174 yards in 1994.
- Brown moved past running back Tony Collins (261) into seventh place on the Patriots all-time reception list. He also ranks seventh on the team's all-time yardage list with 3,350 yards.

- Brown recorded a 31-yard run on the Patriots first possession of last week's game. It was his second longest run. (35 yards vs. Tampa Bay on 9/3/00).
- Over half of Brown's receptions this season (28) have resulted in first downs. He also has rushed for two first downs, increasing his total to 30 and is second among AFC wide receivers.

RUNNING MEN

Patriots wide receivers David Patten (53 yards) and Troy Brown (51) rank fourth and fifth in rushing, respectively. Combined, the two have more yards rushing than any other Patriots back, with the exception of team leader Antowain Smith (357). It's the first time in franchise history that the Patriots have had two wide receivers rush for over 50 yards in a season.

TURNOVERS

The Patriots have yet to win this season when they surrender more turnovers than their opponent. New England is 0-3 this season and 9-22 since 1996 with a negative turnover ratio. When they force more turnovers than their opponent, the Patriots are 2-1 (this season) and 29-10 since 1996.

FREE AGENT FLURY

The Patriots have added 16 new veterans to their roster since the end of the 2000 season. Since Head Coach Bill Belichick arrived in 2000, the Patriots have added 38 new players to the current 53-man roster, including 20 free agents. GROWING UP BRADY

Tom Brady extended his NFL record streak of passes attempted without an interception to start a career to 162 before being intercepted in the fourth quarter last week. His streak of 162 passes without an interception ranks third in team history (see below).

START ME UP

Brady started last week's game by completing his first eight passes against the Broncos, while he led the offense to two scores. In the game against the Indianapolis Colts (10/21), Brady began by throwing seven straight completions, while the Patriots scored four touchdowns.

MAKING A POINT

Kicker Adam Vinatieri has accumulated 53 points during the Patriots first seven games of the season. He is projected to total 121 points this season at his current pace. His single-season career-high was 127 points in 1998. Vinatieri has been near perfect in 2001, making 12-of-13 field goals (.923) and 17-of-18 extra points (.944).

TOUCHDOWN MAKERS

Patriots wide receiver David Patten and running back Antowain Smith each have scored four touchdowns this season. They are the only scoring tandem in the AFC to each have at least four scores. Patten has rushed for one score and caught three others, while Smith has rushed for all four of his touchdowns.
