The New England Patriots (7-5) return home to host the Cleveland Browns (6-5) this week. This will be the third consecutive season that the Patriots and the Browns have clashed since the Browns returned to the NFL in 1999. The Patriots defeated the Browns in 1999, 19-7, but lost in Cleveland last season, 19-11. A victory over the Browns this week would not only avenge last season's loss, but would also extend a Patriots win streak to three consecutive games. The Patriots have not won three straight since starting 4-0 in 1999.

Last week, the Patriots scored 17 second-half points to claim a 17-16 victory over the then-division leading New York Jets. The victory pulled the Patriots to within a half game of the Jets and kept them just 1-1/2 games behind the first place Miami Dolphins. With four games to play, the Patriots remain in third place in the AFC East, but moved into sole possession of sixth place in the conference standings.

The Patriots have not surrendered a turnover in either of their last two games, despite facing two of the NFL's most opportunistic teams. The Saints entered their game with the Patriots leading the NFC with a +10 turnover ratio, and last week, the Jets boasted a league-high +22 turnover ratio. The Patriots collected a pair of interceptions in each game for a +2 turnover ratio.

This week, the Patriots host another opportunistic team. The Cleveland Browns lead the league with 25 interceptions and are second in the league with 31 total takeaways. Their +13 turnover ratio is ranked second in the AFC and third in the NFL.

Patriots quarterback Tom Brady continues to lead the Patriots with a precision passing game. Last week, he completed over 70 percent of his passes (20-of-28) for the fourth consecutive game and fifth time this year (see box below). He led the Patriots on three consecutive scoring drives in the second half at New York to record his second come-frombehind victory as a Patriot and improved to 7-3 as a starter. That is the best start by a Patriots quarterback since Doug Flutie went 7-3 in his first 10 starts. Babe Parilli enjoyed the greatest success of any quarterback in franchise history, winning 9 games before suffering his fourth loss.

Troy Brown remains Brady's favorite target. His 78 receptions is tied for third in the AFC and fourth in the NFL. His 944 yards receiving ties the career-high he set last season. He is currently averaging 6.5 receptions per game. He is on pace to become the first Patriot to eclipse 100 receptions in a season (pace projects 104 receptions). Last week, he moved ahead of Gino Cappelletti (292) into fifth place on the all-time reception list with 298 career receptions.

Patriots RB Antowain Smith (7th in the AFC in rushing) scored his ninth touchdown of the season last week (5th in the AFC). He now has eight rushing touchdowns (4th in the NFL) and has scored five touchdowns in the last four games. In the six games he has scored, the Patriots are 5-1.

PRECISION PASSING

Patriots quarterback Tom Brady completed 71.4% of his passes last week against the Jets and became only the fifth player in NFL history to complete over 70 percent of his passes in four consecutive games in the same season, with a minimum 10 passes (see below). He increased his season completion percentage to 65.6 and is tied with Oakland's Rich Gannon for the highest total in the AFC.

Series Information

SERIES HISTORY

The New England Patriots and the Cleveland Browns will meet this weekend for the third consecutive year after a three-year hiatus. Cleveland holds a commanding 12-5 advantage in the series, including last season's 19-11 victory at Cleveland Browns Stadium. The last time the Patriots hosted the Browns at Foxboro was the 1995 season opener, which the Patriots won 17-14.

The Patriots faced the Browns six times while current head coach Bill Belichick was leading the Browns from 1991 to 1995. Belichick's Browns had a 4-2 record over the Patriots.

The two teams met in the wild-card round of the playoffs in 1994 and the Browns defeated the Patriots 20-13. A game-by-game look at the series is listed below:

- Patriots head coach Bill Belichick spent five seasons as the Cleveland Browns head coach (1991-95). He accumulated a 36-44 career record, including an 11-5 record during the 1994 season.
- Patriots assistant director of player personnel Scott Pioli served as the Cleveland Browns pro personnel assistant from 1992-95.
- Patriots defensive coordinator **Romeo Crennel** served as the Browns defensive coordinator last season.
- Patriots fullback Marc Edwards (1999-2000), wide receiver David Patten (2000) and defensive end Anthony Pleasant (1990-1995) all played with the Cleveland Browns.
- Patriots wide receiver **Terry Glenn** (1992-95) and linebacker **Mike Vrabel** (1993-96) played at Ohio State.
- Patriots assistant linebackers coach Pepper Johnson played with the Cleveland Browns (1993-95) and Ohio State Buckeyes (1982-85).
- Numerous Browns players have Patriots ties, including kicker Phil Dawson, who spent the 1998 season on the Patriots practice squad; defensive end Greg Spires played in 42 games with the Patriots from 1998-2000; and center Dave Wohlabaugh, who played for the Patriots from 1995-98.

LAST TIME (11/12/00)

The New England Patriots lost 19-11 to the Cleveland Browns at Cleveland last season. The New England offense turned the ball over four times leading to 13 points for the Browns.

The Browns opened the scoring with a 39-yard field goal, but the Patriots answered with a 38-yard boot by Adam Vinatieri.

The Patriots turned the ball over on their next possession and the Browns cashed the turnover in, with a 9-yard touchdown pass and jumped out to a 10-3 lead.

The Browns added a field goal before the quarter ended, making the score 16-3. The Patriots turned the ball over a fourth time at the beginning the fourth quarter and Cleveland turned it into their fourth field goal, increasing the margin to 19-3.

The Patriots put together a 12-play, 73-yard touchdown drive. Bledsoe found tight end Rod Rutledge in the back of the end zone for his first career touchdown. Faulk converted the two-point attempt to bring the Patriots within one score at 19-11.

The Patriots were unable to score on their final possession, as the Browns exhausted the final 3:09 off the clock to claim the victory.



Game Review – Patriots 17, Jets 16

GAME REVIEW

The New England Patriots (7-5) defeated the New York Jets (7-4) 17-16, snapping a four-game losing streak in the series. The Patriots spotted the Jets 13 points in the first half and outscored them 17-3 in the second half for the win. The Patriots improved their record within the AFC East to 4-2.

The Jets opened the game by driving 72 yards on six plays and scored on a 34-yard pass from Vinny Testaverde to Laveranues Coles. It was the first time this season the Patriots defense allowed their opponent to score on their first drive of the game. The last time they allowed their opponent to score on their opening possession was at Indianapolis (10/22/00).

After forcing the Patriots to punt on their first drive, the Jets traveled 53 yards on nine plays and added a 19-yard field goal by John Hall for a 10-0 lead.

The two teams traded numerous punts until the Jets added their second field goal of the game, a 40-yard kick by Hall, and they led 13-0 at the half.

The Jets had outgained the Patriots 219-67 in the first half and held the ball for 19:24 compared to the Patriots 10:36.

The Patriots turned the tide in the second half, outgaining the Jets 197-63 and outscoring them 17-3.

New England's defense began the comeback when linebacker Mike Vrabel intercepted Testaverde on the Jets first drive of the second half. Five plays later, running back Antowain Smith put the Patriots on the board with a 4-yard touchdown run, cutting the Jets lead to 13-7.

The Jets countered with a 50-yard field goal by Hall, increasing their lead to 16-7. It would be the Jets last score on the afternoon.

On the Patriots next drive, they trekked 82 yards on nine plays and cut their deficit to 16-14 on a 4-yard scoring run by fullback Marc Edwards. Quaterback Tom Brady completed all five of his passes on the drive, including a 40-yarder to Smith.

Following a Jets punt, the Patriots took the lead for good, 17-16 on a 28-yard field goal by Adam Vinatieri with just 6:29 remaining in the game. Brady completed six-of-seven passes for 56 yard on the drive, including three to wide receiver David Patten for 44 yards.

The game-winning kick was the 10th of Vinatieri's career and his second this season.

On the ensuing drive, the Patriots defense forced the Jets into a 4^{th} -and-5 with 2:07 remaining in the game. Testaverde attempted a pass to tight end Anthony Becht for the first down, but cornerback Terrell Buckley stepped in front of it and recorded his second interception of the season.

The Patriots ran out the clock to earn their seventh win in 10 games, including four of the last five.

FOR THE RECORD

The Patriots are now 1-2 when they trail at the half and 1-5 when they trail after three quarters ... They are 2-0 in games decided by three points or less ... They are 4-1 when they have a positive turnover ratio.

VERSUS THE AFC EAST

Last week's victory against the Jets improved the Patriots record against the AFC East to 4-2. The last time they finished a season with a winning record against the AFC East was in 1997, 7-1. Their two remaining division games are against the Buffalo Bills (12/16) and Miami Dolphins (12/22).

TAKEAWAY NOTE

The Patriots recorded two interceptions against the Jets last week and increased their takeaway total to 21 for the season, 15 by way of interceptions. Eleven of their last 12 takeaways have been interceptions.

NFL MILLER LITE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Patriots linebacker Roman Phifer recorded a team-high nine tackles against the Jets and was named Miller Lite Player of the Game. He led a defense that held the Jets to three points and 63 yards in the second half. Phifer ranks second on the team this season with 69 tackles (51 solo).

MARC EDWARDS

Edwards scored his third touchdown of the season (1 rushing, 2 receiving) on a 4-yard run in the third quarter.

MIKE VRABEL

Vrabel intercepted his second pass of the season and of his career against the Jets last week. He returned the interception 12 yards. The Patriots cashed in on the turnover, driving 57-yards on five plays and scored on a 4-yard touchdown run by Antowain Smith.

A-TRAIN

Patriots running back Antowain Smith scored on a 4-yard run last week against the Jets and established a career-high with his ninth touchdown of the season (8 rushing, 1 receiving). He also tied his career-high of eight rushing touchdowns, set in 1997 and 1998. The last Patriot rusher to score eight touchdowns in a season was Terry Allen (8, 1999). The Patriots have a 5-1 record in games when Smith has scored a touchdown this year. The score was his third in the last four games.

Last week, Smith caught a 4-yard pass across the middle on $3^{\rm rd}$ -and-3 and turned it into a 40-yard gain. The Patriots scored their second touchdown four plays later. The reception was Smith's second for at least 40 yards -- tied for most by a running back in the NFL (Ricky Williams).

TERRELL BUCKLEY

Buckley intercepted his second pass of the season and the 40th of his career last week versus the Jets. The theft gave the Patriots back possession of the football with 2:02 remaining in the game and they were able to run the clock out for the 17-16 victory. Buckley ranks **sixth** among active defenders with 40 career interceptions (see below).

DAVID PATTEN

Patten established single-season career-highs in both receptions and receiving yards last week against the Jets. Through 12 games this year, Patten has caught 41 passes for 589 yards (14.4 avg.) and four touchdowns. His previous highs were 38 receptions and 546 yards, both set during the 2000 season.

TROY BROWN

Last week against the Jets, Brown led all receivers with eight catches for 59 yards. He increased his 2001 season totals to 78 catches for 944 yards (12.1 avg.) and five touchdowns. Brown has tied his single-season career-high with 944 receiving yards which he set during the 2000 season. He needs only 56 yards to reach the 1,000 receiving yard mark for the first time in his career. The last Patriots wide receiver to reach 1,000 yards was Terry Glenn with 1,147 yards in 1999. He has also closed in on his single-season career-high reception mark, 83, which he also set in 2000. Brown is tied for fourth in the NFL with 78 receptions and fourth in the AFC with 944 yards receiving.

BRADY'S BUNCH

Quarterback Tom Brady became only the third quarterback in franchise history to win seven of his first 10 starts as a Patriot last week, joining Doug Flutie and Babe Parilli. Brady will try this week and become only the second quarterback in team history (along with Parilli) to record eight wins in his first 11 starts.

COMPLETING THE PICTURE

Brady completed 71.4% of his passes last week against the Jets, increasing his season total to 65.6. He is tied with Rich Gannon of the Oakland Raiders for the highest completion percentage in the AFC. They both trail St. Louis Kurt Warner who leads the NFL with a 66.8 completion percentage.

The Patriots single-season record was established by Tony Eason in 1986 with a 61.6 mark (448-276). At his current pace, Brady would jump into first place in team history. Hugh Millen (61.1, 1992), Steve Grogan (60.8, 1986) and Drew Bledsoe (60.2, 1997) round out the top five.

Last week, Brady became the first player since Troy Aikman in 1995 and only the fifth player in NFL history to complete at least 70 percent of his passes (at least 10 attempts) in four consecutive games (see front page).

RATINGS GAME

Brady ranks second in the AFC and fifth in the NFL with a quarterback rating of 93.4 while starting in 10 games this season. He has recorded five games with a rating of 93.3 or better and three of 124.4 or more, including a season-high of 148.3 at Indianapolis (10/21). The top AFC passers are listed below:

SEEING RED

The Patriots have scored in their last seven trips inside the opponents red zone, including six touchdowns. Last week against the Jets they converted all three of their chances inside the 20, with two touchdowns, both 4-yard runs and a field goal.

This season, New England has converted 30 of their 39 opportunities in the red zone, including 21 touchdowns. They rank fifth in the AFC and eighth in the NFL with a 53.8 percentage of touchdowns in the red zone. Last season they converted only 23 of 53 opportunities into touchdowns (43.4 %).

THIRD DOWN IS A CHARM

One of the many categories the Patriots have improved in this year is third down efficiency. Through the first 12 weeks of the season the Patriots lead the AFC with a third down conversion rate of 42.9. Last year, they ranked 24^{th} in the NFL and 12^{th} in the AFC with a conversion rate of 35.0.

Two weeks ago against the Saints the Patriots posted their highest conversion rate, 62% (8-of-13), since 1987, when they converted 66% of their third downs (10-of-15) against the Miami Dolphins (12/28/87).

In the Patriots seven wins this season, they have converted almost half of their third downs (47.8). In their five losses, they have made only 35.8% of their third downs.

KICKING IT

Patriots kicker Adam Vinatieri boomed his 10th career gamewinning kick and his third against the Jets last week. His 28-yard field goal gave the Patriots a 17-16 lead with 6:29 remaining in the contest. A summary of his game-winning kicks is listed below.
