Home Sweet Home

The Patriots have won seven of their last eight games at home, including four in a row. Their last loss at home was on Nov. 18, 2001, when the Rams defeated the Patriots 24-17. Foxborough has been a wonderful home to the Patriots since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. The team has compiled a 57-28 (.671) overall record at home during that time span.

NEW ENGLAND (2-0) WELCOMES KANSAS CITY (1-1) TO GILLETTE STADIUM THIS WEEKEND

This Week: The New England Patriots (2-0) will return to their new home, Gillette Stadium, this weekend following their 44-7 victory over the New York Jets at the Meadowlands last weekend. The Chiefs (1-1) lost to the Jacksonville Jaguars 23-16 in week two and will try and be the first road team in the series to win in the last five games.

Television: This week's game will be broadcasted nationally on CBS (locally on WBZ Channel 4). The play-by-play duties will be handled by **Dick Enberg**, who will be joined in the booth by **Dan Dierdorf**. **Bonnie Bernstein** will provide sideline reports throughout the game.

Radio: Every Patriots game can be heard in stereo on the Patriots official flagship station **WBCN 104.1 FM. Gil Santos**, now in his 26th season as the voice of the Patriots, will call the game along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**, who will provide in-depth analysis for his 22nd season. Winning Ways: Last week's victory was the Patriots eighth consecutive regular season victory, tying the longest streak in franchise history (Nov. 3, 1994 - 9/3/95). Including postseason games, the Patriots have now won 11 consecutive games. The steak started with a 34-17 victor over the New Orleans Saints on Nov. 25, 2001. Their last loss came against the St. Louis Rams on Nov. 18, 2001.

Scoring is Soaring: The Patriots are averaging 37.0 points per game, while limiting their opponents to only 10.5 during their first two games of the year. Their 26.5 margin of victory is currently the largest in the NFL.

Take That: The Patriots are tied for the lead in the NFL with seven takeaways and a turnover ratio of +4 through the first two games of the 2002 season. During their current 8-game winning streak the Patriots have a takeaway ratio of +15.

First Impressions: In New England's season opener, three newcomers scored touchdowns for the Patriots when Christian Fauria, Donald Hayes and Deion Branch each made touchdown receptions. It was the first time in NFL history that such a feat had been accomplished (excluding expansion teams). That trend continued this past week when the Patriots fourth touchdown of the 2002 season was scored by tight end Cameron Cleeland, who joined the Patriots as an unrestricted free agent for the New Orleans Saints in 2002.

2-0; BUT A LONG WAY TO GO

Last year, the Patriots started the season 0-2 and faced the 2-0 Indianapolis Colts in Week 3. The Colts, who entered the season as a favorite to contend for the AFC title, were averaging over 43 points per game. Conversely, the Patriots had lost their first two games and Tom Brady was making his first professional start for the Patriots. At that time, few could have predicted the outcome of that game, as the Patriots scored a 44-13 victory. The Patriots went on to win 11 of their final 14 games to win the division with an 11-5 record en route to their first Super Bowl title, while the Colts finished 6-10.

"It's the same thing that everybody said last year with the Colts," said Patriots head coach Bill Belichick. "They were averaging over 40 points a game and they won their first two games big. Everybody's was talking about, 'this is the greatest team in the history of football,' and they came in here and they didn't have a good day here. This stuff can change in a hurry. We've played two games; that's it. We've got a big one coming up this week. I think it's way too early to clinch anything around here."



Patriots and Chiefs Series Results

SERIES HISTORY

The New England Patriots trail the Kansas City Chiefs 9-15-3 in a series that began along with the AFL in 1960. This will be the fourth time in the last five seasons the two teams have met. The Patriots hold a 2-1 advantage in the last three games and won the last meeting 30-24 in Foxboro on Monday Night Football (12/4/00).

The home team has an advantage in the series, winning 18 of the 27 games (67%), including the last five games. Below is a listing of the series results:

New England defeated Kansas City 30-24 on Monday Night Football in their last meeting. The Patriots scored in every quarter and tallied a season-high 30 points.

The teams traded field goals in the first quarter before running back Kevin Faulk recorded the first touchdown of the game on a 1-yard run. The Chiefs knotted the score at 10, when Elvis Grbac connected with Derrick Alexander on an 81yard touchdown strike.

New England tallied two more scores before the half ended, including a 17-yard touchdown pass to Troy Brown and took a 20-10 lead into the locker room. Brown set a career-high with 12 catches against the Chiefs, the second best single game performance in franchise history.

The Patriots opened the second half by forcing a turnover and converting it into a touchdown, increasing their lead to 27-10. The Chiefs responded with a touchdown making the score 27-17 early in the fourth quarter. The two teams traded scores and the Patriots led 30-24 with just under four minutes remaining.

The Patriots defense held off a late Chiefs drive when Tebucky Jones tackled Tony Gonzalez in the middle of the field as the final seconds ticked off the clock.



GAME RECAP -PATRIOTS 44, N.Y. JETS 7

GAME RECAP

The New England Patriots continued their successful 2002 campaign defeating their AFC East rival N.Y. Jets 44-7 last week. The Patriots offense totaled 432 yards while their defense limited the Jets to only 200 yards. The road team has now won the last four games in the series and seven of the last nine games.

The Patriots scored 34 points in the second half en route for their second straight win versus the Jets. In usual Patriots style, the offense and defense contributed to the scoring as the Patriots offense scored four touchdowns and the defense scored two.

The Patriots opened the scoring in the second quarter as quarterback Tom Brady drove the team 80 yards on six plays for a score, a 1-yard pass to tight end Cam Cleeland. On the Patriots next possession, Brady led a 19-play drive that spanned 70 yards in 6:40 and resulted in a 28-yard field goal by Adam Vinatieri, increasing their lead to 10-0 at the half. The 19-play drive was the longest in franchise history, topping the previous mark of 18 set twice before.

Three plays into the second half, Patriots cornerback Tebucky Jones sacked Vinny Testaverde and stripped him of the football. Jones picked up the loose ball and galloped 24 yards for a touchdown. The Patriots added another Vinatieri field goal on the next offensive possession and led 20-0. The Patriots defense struck again when Victor Green returned an interception 90 yards for a touchdown.

After the Jets scored on an Anthony Becht touchdown reception, the Patriot offense went back to work. Rookie wide receiver Deion Branch caught a 49-yard touchdown pass from Brady, increasing their lead to 34-7. The catch was the longest reception of the day for either team, and the longest of Branch's young career.

After another Vinatieri field goal, Kevin Faulk closed out the scoring with a two-yard touchdown run. The 37-point victory was the second largest by the Patriots in the series and their seventh largest in franchise history.

The Patriot defense limited the Jets to only 200 total yards, including only 32 rushing yards. The leading rusher for the Jets was their punter, Matt Turk, who picked up 14 yards on a fake punt in the third quarter. The New England defense did not allow a Jet receiver to touch the ball until the 3:52 mark of the third quarter. The defense also recorded five sacks in the game, equaling their total from last week against Pittsburgh. Also, like last week, five different Patriots recorded sacks: Willie McGinest, Bobby Hamilton, Anthony Pleasant, Bernard Holsey and Tebucky Jones all brought down Jets quarterbacks. This season, nine different players have recorded the 10 sacks by the defense. McGinest is the only player who has recorded multiple sacks this season (2.0).

SERIES NOTES

- The average margin of victory in the last six games of the Patriots-Jets series prior to last week's game was six points.
- The visiting team has now won seven of the last nine games in the series.

CAMERON CLEELAND

Patriots tight end Cameron Cleeland caught his first touchdown pass with the Patriots and the 12^{th} of his career on a 1-yard reception in the second quarter. He finished the game with three receptions for 11 yards.

KEVIN FAULK

Faulk rushed for his seventh career touchdown on a 2-yard run in the fourth quarter. He gained 48 yards on 10 carries and caught two passes for 14 yards. Faulk converted a 3rd-and-3 in the second quarter when the ball was directly snapped to him and he gained 4 yards for the first down.

SUNDAY DRIVE

The Patriots offense set a franchise record with a 19-play scoring drive to end the first half. The drive, which covered 65 yards, culminated with a 25-yard field goal by Adam Vinatieri. The previous record was an 18-play drive, which was accomplished twice (10/22/00-89 yards in 8:43) (12/13/81-64 yards in 2:05). The Patriots converted four of five third downs and one fourth down during their record-setting drive.

TEBUCKY JONES

Jones recorded his second career sack when he brought down Vinny Testaverde in the third quarter of last week's game. He also stripped Testaverde of the football, recovered the loose ball and returned it 24 yards for a touchdown. It was the first score of his five-year career. The last Patriot to return a fumble for a touchdown was Chad Eaton (23 yards) vs. Baltimore on Jan. 2, 2000.

GREEN MONSTER

Victor Green intercepted a Vinny Testaverde pass in the third quarter and returned it 90 yards for a touchdown.

THE LAST TIME

The Patriots defense scored two touchdowns against the N.Y. Jets. Tebucky Jones returned a fumble 24 yards for a score and Green returned an interception 90 yards into the end zone. The last time the Patriots recorded two defensive scores in one game was 1/6/02 vs. Carolina. Ty Law (46-yards) and Otis Smith (76-yards) both returned interceptions for scores.

OUTSIDE THE MARGINS

The Patriots margin of victory over the Jets (37 points) was their second largest in the series and the seventh widest margin in franchise history. It was their largest victory since the Patriots defeated the San Diego Chargers by 38 points on Dec. 1, 1996.

The Patriots have won their last three regular season games by a combined total of 85 points (+32 at Carolina; +16 vs. Pittsburgh and +37 at N.Y. Jets). It's the largest margin of victory in any three-game span in the franchise's 43-year history. The previous high was 76 from 11/24/96-12/8/96.

STREAKS

Patriots safety Lawyer Milloy played in his 98th consecutive regular season game since entering the league in 1996. It also marked his 92nd consecutive start.

Patriots wide receiver Troy Brown extended his consecutive streak of games with a reception to 42.

TOMMY GUN

Tom Brady has effectively and efficiently opened the 2002 campaign recording back-to-back passer ratings over 100.0, the fourth and fifth time of his young career. It is the first time since Drew Bledsoe accomplished the feat in back-to-back games at Denver (10/1/00) and vs. Indianapolis (10/8/00). No Patriots quarterback has ever opened the season with three consecutive games with passer ratings over 100.0 (minimum of 15 attempts).

BRADY BUNCHES

Patriots quarterback Tom Brady registered his second consecutive game with a passer rating of over 100.0. It was the fifth time in his 16 career starts that he has recorded a passer rating of over 100.0 and the first time in back-to-back games. The Patriots have been victorious in all five of those games (see below). Brady has recorded a passer rating of 105.9 through two games this season, the fourth highest ranking in the NFL.

FIRST THINGS FIRST

Tom Brady has quarterbacked the Patriots to victories in 13 of his 16 regular season starts during his career, compiling a winning percentage of 81 percent, the highest of any active starting quarterback in the NFL. Including the playoffs, he is 16-3 as a starter. Last season, Brady became the only quarterback in franchise history to win 11 of his first 14 regular season starts as a Patriot. Vito "Babe" Parilli ranks second in Patriots annals with 10 wins in his first 14 starts.

THIRD DOWN IS A CHARM

The Patriots converted 63 percent (10-16) of their third downs last week against the N.Y. Jets. It was their highest single-game total since they converted 67% of their third downs at Miami (12/28/87). New England ranks third in the AFC and fifth in the NFL with a third down conversion rate of 51 percent (15-29). During their current eight-game winning streak, the Patriots have converted 43.9 percent of their third downs. Last season the Patriots converted 41.2 percent of their third downs, their highest total since they recorded a 46.7 conversion rate in 1980 (they also recorded a 41.2 rate in 1994).

TROY BROWN

Brown led all receivers with nine catches for 94 yards last week against the N.Y. Jets. It tied the third-highest reception performance of his career (10/28/01 - at Denver). His career-high for receptions is 12 against this week's opponent Kansas City (12/4/00).

Brown now has 336 receptions during his 10-year career and moved past Terry Glenn (329 catches) into fourth place on the Patriots all-time receiving list on a 19-yard reception in the first quarter.

Brown earned the first 1,000-yard receiving season of his nineyear playing career in 2000 and established a Patriots franchise record with 101 catches. His 1,199 receiving yards rank second in Patriots history behind Stanley Morgan's 1,491. Brown's nine seasons before his first 1,000-yard season tie him for the secondlongest streak in NFL history.

DEION BRANCH

Branch caught his second touchdown in as many weeks on a 49-yard reception in the fourth quarter. Vinatieri became the first kicker in Super Bowl history to kick a game-winning field goal on the final play of the game. His Super Bowl-winning 48-yard field goal against the Rams was also the longest kick in Patriots postseason history.

Vinatieri kicked four field goals during the 2001 season in the final minute of the fourth quarter or in overtime to give his team the victory, increasing his career total to 12. Against the Raiders in last season's Divisional playoff game, Vinatieri boomed a 45-yard kick with 27 seconds remaining in regulation to tie the game at 13 and send it into overtime.
