RATINGS GAME

The broadcast of the Patriots-Chiefs game this past Sunday generated a 27.6 rating and 58 share. It was the number one rated show in the Boston market for the week of 9/16/02 – 9/22/02. The 58 share was the largest for a Patriots game this season.

BATTLE OF DIVISION LEADERS – NEW ENGLAND (3-0) TRAVELS TO SAN DIEGO (3-0)

This Week: The New England Patriots (3-0) will try to close out the month of September as only the fifth team in franchise history to begin a campaign with a four-game winning streak when they trek cross-country to face the San Diego Chargers (3-0). The New England passing attack, which is averaging an NFL-best 316 yards per game, will be challenged by the Chargers top rated pass defense. San Diego's defense leads the NFL, allowing only 132 passing yards per game and posting 16 sacks. The Patriots currently hold a 10-game winning streak in the series, their longest against any opponent. The last time the Chargers defeated the Patriots was on Nov. 15, 1970.

Television: This week's game will be broadcasted nationally on CBS (locally on WBZ Channel 4). The play-by-play duties will be handled by **Greg Gumbel**, who will be joined in the booth by **Phil Simms**. **Armen Keteyian** will provide sideline reports throughout the game.

Radio: Every Patriots game can be heard in stereo on the Patriots official flagship station **WBCN 104.1 FM. Gil Santos**, now in his 26th season as the voice of the Patriots, will call the game along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**, who will provide in-depth analysis for his 22nd season. Troy Brown: The Patriots wide receiver currently leads the NFL with 31 receptions following his 16-catch day against the Chiefs. His prolific day tied the fourth-highest total in NFL history and established a Patriots franchise record. He also set a personal high with 176 yards receiving and currently ranks third in the AFC with 292 yards receiving.

Winning Ways: The Patriots 41-38 overtime victory over the Chiefs was their ninth consecutive regular season victory, setting a franchise record. They eclipsed the previous mark of eight set from Nov. 3, 1994 – Sept. 3, 1995. Including postseason contests, the Patriots have now won 12 consecutive games. The streak started with a 34-17 victory over the New Orleans Saints on Nov. 25, 2001. Their last loss came against the St. Louis Rams on Nov. 18, 2001.

Turnovers: The Patriots lead the AFC and are second in the NFL with 10 takeaways this season. They have converted seven of those into scores (six touchdowns and one field goal). New England owns a +6 turnover ratio through three games this season and during their current nine-game regular season winning streak the Patriots have a takeaway ratio of +17.

Scoring is Soaring: The New England Patriots are 3-0 for just the fifth time in franchise history and have scored 115 points (38.3 ppg.) in those three games. The 115 points scored ranks second among the most prolific offensive performances by a defending Super Bowl Champion in NFL history. The 2000 St. Louis Rams were the most prolific offense of all the NFL defending champions, scoring 119 points in their first three games that year. But, the Rams allowed 94 points in those three games, while the Patriots have surrendered just 59 points.

LONG ROAD AHEAD

The Patriots next four opponents have a combined record of 11-1 (San Diego 3-0; Miami 3-0; Green Bay 2-1; Denver 3-0). New England will travel 7,480 miles over the next two weeks to play the Chargers and Dolphins and then return to Gillette Stadium to host the Packers and Broncos. Following this four game swing, the Patriots will embark on a three-game road trip against Buffalo, Chicago and Oakland, the longest road streak this year in the NFL.



PATRIOTS AND CHARGERS SERIES RESULTS

SERIES HISTORY

This week's game will be the 32nd meeting between the Patriots and Chargers, dating back to the first season of the AFL. The Patriots currently have a 10-game winning streak in the series. It's the longest current winning streak the Patriots hold over any other team in the NFL. The last time the Chargers beat the Patriots was in 1970, the final year of the AFL. This will be the Patriots first game in the state of California since the last time they played the Chargers in San Diego on Dec. 1, 1996. The Patriots, who will travel 19,510 miles this season, the 11th highest total in the league, will return to California on Nov. 17 to face the Oakland Raiders.

Chargers coach **Marty Schottenheimer** was a linebacker for the Patriots from 1969-1970. Schottenheimer holds a 5-1 record against the Patriots ... Chargers quarterback **Doug Flutie** grew up in Natick, Mass., played collegiate football at Boston College and was a member of the Patriots from 1987-89 ... Chargers wide receiver **Curtis Conway** was coached by Patriots running back coach **Ivan Fears** at Chicago from 1993-98 ... Chargers tackle **Ed Ellis** played with the Patriots from 1997-99 ... Chargers defensive tackle **Marcellus Wiley** played with Patriots guard/tackle **Adrian Klemm** while at St. Monica High in Los Angeles ... Chargers kicker **Steve Christie**, Wiley and Flutie all played with Patriots running back **Antowain Smith** in Buffalo from 1997-2000 ... Patriots tackle **Matt Light** teamed with tackle **Brandon Gorin** to protect Chargers quarterback **Drew Brees** while at Purdue from 1998-2000.

THE LAST MEETING - PATRIOTS 29, CHARGERS 26 (10/14/01)

The Patriots defeated the Chargers 29-26 in a thrilling game from behind victory in overtime at Foxboro Stadium. New England scored 10 points in the final 3:36 of regulation to push the game into overtime. In the extra session, Adam Vinatieri kicked a 44-yard field goal to seal the victory for the Patriots. In just his third career start, quarterback Tom Brady established then career-highs in completions (33) attempts (54) and passing yards (364) while engineering two scoring drives in the final 3:36 of regulation to tie the game and one in overtime for the win. Wide receiver Troy Brown led all receivers with 11 catches for 117 yards, which at the time tied him for fourth place in Patriots annals.

GAME RECAP – PATRIOTS 41, CHIEFS 38 OT

GAME RECAP

The Patriots improved to 3-0 last week after defeating the Kansas City Chiefs 41-38 in overtime at Gillette Stadium. The Patriots offense totaled 496 yards, their highest output since they gained 506 yards vs. Seattle (9/21/86) and scored five touchdowns. The Patriots have now defeated the Chiefs in four out of the last five meetings.

Wide receiver Troy Brown recorded 16 receptions for 176 yards and one touchdown against the Chiefs, setting a franchise record for receptions in a game, tying him for fourth place in NFL history. Brown also recorded a career high with 176 yards, which ranks fourth in Patriots annals.

Quarterback Tom Brady threw for a career-high 410 yards and tied a career high with four touchdowns. He also became the first player in franchise history to record a passer rating of over 100.0 in the first three games of the season.

The Chiefs got off to a 3-0 lead in the first quarter and it marked the first time the Patriots had trailed in a regular season game since week 14 last year when the Patriots trailed the Bills 9-6 in the fourth quarter. The Chiefs added a touchdown and increased their lead to 10-0. The Patriots answered quickly with an eight-play drive that went 86 yards and resulted in a Kevin Faulk 23-yard touchdown catch from Brady. New England added an Adam Vinatieri field goal with five seconds remaining in the first half and trailed 10-9 at the half.

In the second half the Chiefs added a quick touchdown and increased their lead to 17-9. The Patriots tied the game on their next possession, as Brady led the offense on an 11-play, 71-yard drive that resulted in a nine-yard touchdown reception by Brown. Later in the third quarter, cornerback Ty Law picked off a Trent Green pass intended for Johnnie Morton. The pick was the 26th of his career. The turnover resulted in an 18-yard touchdown reception from Brady to rookie tight end Daniel Graham. The touchdown was the first of Graham's career. The score gave the Patriots their first lead of the game, 24-17.

On the Chiefs second play from scrimmage following the touchdown, safety Victor Green forced a fumble, which Tebucky Jones recovered. Wide receiver David Patten caught a 38-yard pass from Brady three plays later for another score, increasing the Patriots lead to 31-17. On the next Chiefs possession, Green threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Kennison to get the Chiefs to within seven. After exchanging Antowain Smith and Priest Holmes touchdown runs the Patriots led 38-31.

With 2:30 remaining in the game, Kansas City drove 54 yards on 11 plays, and Holmes recorded his second touchdown run of the game knotting the score at 38 at the end of regulation.

After winning the overtime coin toss, the Patriots elected to receive the ball and Brady led the offense 53 yards on nine plays into field goal position. With the ball spotted at the Chiefs 35-yard line, Adam Vinatieri kicked his second field goal of the game and the 13th game-winning field goal of his career.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Patriots have won eight of their last nine games at home, including five in a row. Their last loss at home was on Nov. 18, 2001, when the Rams defeated the Patriots 24-17. Foxborough has been a wonderful home to the Patriots since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. The team has compiled a 58-28 (.671) overall record at home during that time span.

STREAKS

- Last week's game was the Patriots 86th consecutive sellout since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. It was also the 180th consecutive game that has been broadcast locally.
- Patriots safety **Lawyer Milloy** played in his 99th consecutive regular season game since entering the league in 1996. It also marked his 93rd consecutive start ... Patriots safety **Victor Green** played in his 141st straight regular season game last week against the Chiefs.
- Wide receiver **Troy Brown** extended his consecutive streak of games with a reception to 43.
- The Patriots established a new franchise high of nine consecutive regular season victories.
- The Patriots win also marked the sixth consecutive time in the series that the home team was victorious.

TURNOVERS

The Patriots forced three turnovers (2 interceptions-1 fumble) while only relinquishing one (interception) against the Chiefs for a turnover ratio of +2. The Patriots own a +6 ratio through three games this season. During their current nine-game regular season winning streak the Patriots have a takeaway ratio of +17.

HOME GAME + POSITIVE TURNOVER RATIO = WIN

The Patriots have won their last nine games and 11 of their last 13 at home when they've had a positive turnover ratio dating back to the 1999 season. The Patriots had a +2 turnover ratio in today's 41-38 victory over the Chiefs.

OTIS, MY MAN

Otis Smith recorded the 27th interception of his career, his ninth as a Patriot and his first of the season at 6:50 in the second quarter.

LAW AND ORDER

Ty Law recorded his 26th career interception in the third quarter of last week's game. His interception led to a Patriots touchdown (18-yard pass from Tom Brady to Daniel Graham). Law ranks seventh in Patriots history with 26 interceptions. He needs two interceptions to surpass Maurice Hurst (27 interceptions) for sixth place in Patriots history.

GREEN MONSTER

For the third consecutive game, safety Victor Green had a hand in forcing a turnover. Green stripped Chiefs running back Priest Holmes of the football at the beginning of the fourth quarter. The turnover resulted in a 38-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady to David Patten. Green intercepted a pass against the Jets in week two and forced a Jerome Bettis fumble, which he recovered, against Pittsburgh in week one.

KEVIN FAULK

Faulk scored his 12th career touchdown on a 23-yard reception from Tom Brady in the second quarter. It was his 12th career touchdown (fifth receiving) and his second of the season (first receiving).

TIGHT ENDS

Last week, each Patriots tight end chipped in with a reception, including Daniel Graham's one-handed 18-yard touchdown grab. Through the first three games the Patriots tight ends have totaled 15 catches for 87 yards and three touchdowns. In 2001, the tight end position yielded 19 catches for 168 yards and four touchdowns all season.



PATRIOTS OFFENSIVE NOTES

TROY BROWN

Brown set a Patriots franchise high with 16 catches against the Chiefs. His previous high was also set against the Kansas City Chiefs when he was credited with 12 receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown on Dec. 4, 2000. The Patriots won that game 30-24. He also gained a single-game career-high 176 yards. It was Brown's 12th 100-yard game of his career, tying him with Irving Fryar for third in Patriots history.

Patriots wide receiver David Patten totaled 108 yards receiving on seven catches, including a one-handed, 38-yard touchdown catch against the Chiefs. It was his first 100-yard receiving game of the season and the fourth of his career.

Brady has recorded 973 yards passing this year, increasing his career total to 3,822 passing yards. He currently ranks ninth on the all-time list and needs just 83 yards to move ahead of Butch Songin and 98 yards to pass Mike Taliaferro for seventh place on the Patriots list.

COMPLETING THE PICTURE

During the first 17 starts of Tom Brady's career, he has completed 65.8 percent of his passes (535-352). It's the highest completion percentage of any quarterback's first 17 starts since the AFL/NFL merger in 1970. Kurt Warner ranks second with a 65.5 percentage. Last season, Brady completed 63.9% of his passes and established a Patriots franchise completion percentage record.
