LONG ROAD AHEAD

The Patriots next three opponents have a combined record of 9-3 (Miami 3-1; Green Bay 3-1; Denver 3-1). New England will travel to Miami this weekend to face the Dolphins and then return to Gillette Stadium to host the Packers and Broncos. Following this three game swing, the Patriots will embark on a three-game road trip against Buffalo, Chicago and Oakland, the longest road streak this year in the NFL.

NEW ENGLAND (3-1) HITS ROAD AGAIN TO FACE DIVISION RIVAL MIAMI (3-1)

This Week: The New England Patriots (3-1) will begin the month of October on the road when they face division rival Miami Dolphins (3-1) this weekend at Pro Player Stadium (75,000 capacity). New England has won seven of their last eight games inside the division, including four straight division road games. The last time they won in Miami was a 14-12 victory on Dec. 22, 1997.

Television: This week's game will be broadcast nationally on CBS (locally on WBZ Channel 4). The play-by-play duties will be handled by **Greg Gumbel**, who will be joined in the booth by **Phil Simms**. **Armen Keteyian** will provide sideline reports throughout the game.

Radio: Every Patriots game can be heard in stereo on the Patriots official flagship station **WBCN 104.1 FM**. **Gil Santos**, now in his 26th season as the voice of the Patriots, will call the game along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**, who will provide in-depth analysis for his 22nd season. A complete list of the Patriots WBCN Rock Radio Network can be found on pages 462-463 of the 2002 Patriots media guide or at www.patriots.com.

National Radio: This week's game will also be broadcast nationally on CBS Radio. **Dave Sims** and **Rick Walker** will be calling the play-by-play.

Deion Branch: The Patriots rookie wide receiver recorded 13 catches for 128 yards against the Chargers last week. He tied the second highest single-game reception mark by a rookie in NFL history behind Don Looney of the Philadelphia Eagles. Looney established the mark on Dec. 1, 1940 against the Washington Redskins. He tied running backs Sid Blanks (Houston, 1964) and LaDainian Tomlinson (San Diego, 2001) for the second spot. Branch is on pace to break the record for most receptions by a rookie in NFL history, 90, set by Terry Glenn in 1996.

Streakin': The Patriots have gained over 400 yards in each of their last three games (456.0 average). It was the first time the Patriots had accomplished the feat since the first three games of the 1994 season when they averaged 462 yards per game. The last time the Patriots accumulated over 400 yards in more than three games was during a five-game stretch from 9/27/81 - 10/25/81.

Super Streak: The Patriots have never lost to the Dolphins in the season after they have appeared in the Super Bowl (5-0). In 1997, the Patriots defeated the Dolphins three times, twice in the regular season and once in the postseason and became just the sixth team since 1970 to defeat an opponent three times in one season. In 1986, the Patriots outscored the Dolphins 68-34 in their two meetings.

PATRIOTS AND DOLPHINS SERIES RESULTS

SERIES HISTORY

This week's game will be the 74th meeting between the Patriots and Dolphins, dating back to the 1966 season. The Patriots trail the Dolphins in the series with a 27-43 record (2-1 in the playoffs). The Patriots snapped a five-game losing streak in the last meeting of the series, defeating the Dolphins 20-13 in the last regular season game in Foxboro Stadium. The last time the Patriots won in Miami was Dec. 22, 1997.

The teams have met three times in the playoffs and the Patriots were victorious two out of the three games, including a 17-3 wild-card victory in 1997.

CONNECTIONS

Patriots CB **Terrell Buckley** was with the Dolphins from 1995-99 and recorded 22 interceptions, including a career-high eight in 1998 ... Quarterback **Damon Huard** was with the Dolphins from 1997-2000 and earned a 5-1 record as a starter ... Linebacker **Larry Izzo** was with the Dolphins from 1996-2000 and earned a Pro Bowl selection in the 2000 season ... Cornerback **Ben Kelly** was originally a third round (84th overall) draft choice of the Dolphins in 2000 ... Offensive lineman **Grey Ruegamer** was originally drafted by the Dolphins in the third round (72nd overall) in the 1999 NFL draft ... Dolphins defensive coordinator **Jim Bates** was on Patriot head coach Bill Belichick's staff in Cleveland (1991-93, '95) ... DE **Rob Burnett** was coached by Belichick in Cleveland from 1991-95 ... Burnett also played with Patriots DE Anthony Pleasant in Cleveland from 1990-95 and in Baltimore in 1996. The two were Browns draft choices in the 1990 draft (Pleasant, 73rd overall; Burnett 129th) ... RB **Robert Edwards** was originally drafted by the Patriots with the 18th overall pick in the 1998 draft and gained 1,115 yards rushing during his rookie season ... QB **Jay Fiedler** attended Dartmouth (1990-93) in Hanover, NH ... QB **Ray Lucas** was with the Patriots in 1996 ... FB **Rob Konrad** is a native of Andover, MA and attended St. Johns Prep.

THE LAST MEETING - NE 20, Miami 13 (12/22/01)

The last meeting between the two teams saw the Patriots defeat the Dolphins 20-13 in a crucial divisional match up that eventually secured the AFC East crown for the Patriots. The game was also the last regular season game ever played in Foxboro Stadium. The Patriots scored 20 unanswered points in the second quarter to secure the victory and extend their streak of five consecutive wins. Running back Antowain Smith had a career day rushing for 156 yards and one touchdown. His 156 yards ranks 13th in Patriots history and was a career high for Smith.

The Patriots first score came off of an Smith two-yard run in the second quarter. The run capped a five-play drive that went 52 yards in only 1:41. The Patriots struck again four minutes later with a Patrick Pass 23-yard touchdown reception from Tom Brady. Kicker Adam Vinatieri kicked two straight field goals (32, 23) in a span of four minutes and the Patriots were up 20-0 at the half. The Patriots defense limited the Dolphins rushing attack to only 58 yards on 19 carries.

Late in the second half the Dolphins scored their first touchdown of the day, a 10-yard pass from Jay Fiedler to Jonathan Ogden, but the comeback attempt was too late as time expired in the fourth quarter.

GAME RECAP – CHARGERS 21, PATRIOTS 14

GAME RECAP

The Patriots were handed their first loss of the season last week, a 21-14 defeat at the hands of the San Diego Chargers. It was their first loss since the Rams beat them 24-17 on Nov. 18, 2001, a streak of 12 games (including three postseason games). The Patriots totaled 440 yards of total offense, 358 yards passing and 87 yards rushing, but could only manage two scores the entire game. The Patriots finished the month of September 3-1 and they tied the third best start in franchise history.

Rookie wide receiver Deion Branch had a record-setting day with 13 receptions for 128 yards. His 13 receptions tied the second highest total in franchise history just behind Troy Brown's 16-reception performance last week versus Kansas City. He established personal single-game highs in receptions (13) and receiving yards (126). He now leads all rookies in the NFL with 28 receptions and 309 receiving yards.

Quarterback Tom Brady had another strong passing day, throwing for 358 yards and two touchdowns. Brady now has 11 touchdown passes, which leads the NFL, and his 129 completions are also tops in the league.

The Patriots got on the scoreboard first with a five-yard touchdown pass from Brady to tight end Christian Fauria on their first possession. The 11-play drive went 67 yards in 5:34 and was constituted of six rushes and five pass plays.

The Chargers answered quickly by scoring at the end of the first quarter on a 52-yard touchdown pass from Drew Brees to Curtis Conway. The score was the longest pass play against the Patriots this season.

On the Patriots next possession, Brady drove the offense down the field 65 yards on 10 plays for a Mike Vrabel one-yard touchdown reception. The touchdown was the first of Vrabel's career.

At the end of the first half the Chargers evened the score with a 37-yard run by running back LaDainian Tomlinson.

On the second play of the third quarter, Tomlinson broke for another score on a 58-yard run. The score was the longest rushing touchdown of the season for Tomlinson and the longest against the Patriots in 2002. Tomlinson's 217-yard rushing performance ranks as the third-best rushing performance by an opponent behind O.J. Simpson, who holds the top two spots (250 and 219 yards).

The Patriots drove into Charger territory four times during the second half, but they did not reach the end zone. Two of their drives concluded with turnovers, one on a punt and one on downs. Brady was intercepted twice during the second half, both in the third quarter. The Patriots final comeback attempt was thwarted with eight seconds remaining when Kevin Faulk's hook and lateral was recovered by the Chargers.

YARDS GALORE

The Patriots gained over 400 yards for the third straight week, totaling 1,368 yards. The last time the Patriots gained over 400 yard in three consecutive games was in the first three games of the 1994 season.

STREAKS UNDONE

- The Patriots 12-game winning streak (including three postseason games) was snapped by the Chargers last week. The last time the Patriots lost was on Nov. 18, 2001 vs. St. Louis, 24-17.
- The Patriots 10-game winning streak against the Chargers was broken. The last time the Chargers had beaten the Patriots was Nov. 15, 1970.
- The Patriots five-game road winning streak fell last weekend against the Chargers. The last time the Patriots lost on the road was Oct. 28, 2001 at Denver, 31-20.

SUNDAY DRIVES

The Patriots opened the game with an 11-play, 67-yard scoring drive, capped by a 5-yard touchdown reception by Christian Fauria, his second of the season. It was the first time this season that the Patriots scored on their opening drive. It was the first time the Patriots have scored a touchdown on their opening possession since completing a 6-play, 85-yard touchdown drive against the New Orleans Saints on 11/25/01. The Patriots went on to win that game, 34-17. It was their first victory of a season-ending 9-game win streak.

OFFENSE GETTING DEFENSIVE

Linebacker Mike Vrabel scored his first career touchdown in the second quarter against San Diego when he caught a 1-yard pass from Tom Brady. It was Brady's 11th touchdown pass of the 2002 season and the ninth different Patriots player employed in the scoring arsenal. The last time a Patriots defensive player scored an offensive touchdown was on 11/24/74 at Baltimore Colts when LB John Tanner scored on a 2-yard pass from Jim Plunkett.

LIGHTNING STRIKE

The 52-yard touchdown reception by Curtis Conway was the longest reception allowed by the Patriots defense this season and the longest since Willie Jackson was credited with a 56-yard reception for New Orleans on 11/25/01.

CHARGED UP

LaDainian Tomlinson opened the second half with a 58-yard touchdown run, the longest of his career. The run gave the Chargers a 21-14 lead. It was the longest run allowed by the Patriots defense this season and the longest against the Patriots since Maurice Smith picked up 58 yards on a run for the Falcons in Atlanta on Nov. 4, 2001.

NEGATIVE TURNOVER RATIO

For the first time in the 2002 season and the first time in eight regular season games, the Patriots recorded a negative turnover ratio (-2). Since 1996, the Patriots are 12-13 when they have a negative turnover ratio. New England was 3-3 in 2001 when they recorded a negative turnover ratio and 7-1 when they had a positive turnover ratio.

GOING THE DISTANCE

The San Diego Chargers scored all three of their touchdowns from beyond 20 yards last week (52-yard pass and touchdown runs of 37 and 58 yards). It was the first time in almost six years that an opponent has scored more than twice beyond 20 yards in a game. Jacksonville scored on three touchdown passes of 51, 41 and 61 yards on Sept. 22, 1996.



PATRIOTS OFFENSIVE NOTES

TROY BROWN

Brown set a Patriots franchise high with 16 catches against the Chiefs on Sept. 22, 2002. His previous high was also set against the Kansas City Chiefs when he was credited with 12 receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown on Dec. 4, 2000. He also gained a single-game career-high 176 yards. It was Brown's 12th 100-yard game of his career, tying him with Irving Fryar for third in Patriots history.

Brown recorded his 12th career 100-yard receiving game against the Chiefs and is now tied for third in Patriots history (listed below). It was the first recorded by the Patriots this season.

Deion Branch established career-highs in receptions (13) and receiving yards (128) against the Chargers last week. His 13 receptions also tied the second-highest single-game reception total in franchise history (Terry Glenn, at Cleveland Oct. 3, 1999). He became the first Patriots rookie to eclipse the 100-yard mark since Tony Simmons gained 109 yards on four catches, including one touchdown at Indianapolis (11/1/98).

Last week, the Patriots tight end position caught six passes for 59 yards, including a five-yard touchdown reception by Christian Fauria. They have combined for 21 catches for 146 yards and four touchdowns through their first four games. During the entire 2001 season, the tight end position yielded 19 catches for 168 yards and four touchdowns.

SCORING IS SOARING

The New England Patriots have scored 129 points in their first four games of the season (32.3 avg.). They rank fifth in the AFC and sixth in the NFL. Their 129 points are the second highest in franchise history, narrowly missing the 1997 total of 130 points – set the year after their trip to Super Bowl XXXI.
