NEW ENGLAND (3-2) RETURNS HOME; WELCOMES GREEN BAY (4-1) TO GILLETTE STADIUM

This Week: The New England Patriots (3-2) will return home to the friendly confines of Gillette Stadium (68,436 capacity) this week to face the Green Bay Packers (4-1). Kickoff will be at 1:02 p.m. This will be the first meeting between the two clubs since Oct. 27, 1997 when the Packers defeated the Patriots 28-10.

Television: This week's game will be broadcast nationally on FOX (locally on WFXT Channel 25). The play-by-play duties will be handled by **Dick Stockton**, who will be joined in the booth by **Troy Aikman** and **Cris Collinsworth**. **Pam Oliver** will provide sideline reports throughout the game.

Radio: Every Patriots game can be heard in stereo on the Patriots official flagship station **WBCN 104.1 FM. Gil Santos**, now in his 26th season as the voice of the Patriots, will call the game along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**, who will provide in-depth analysis for his 22nd season. Versus the NFC: The Patriots will face their first NFC opponent of the season this weekend when the Packers visit Gillette Stadium. Last season, the Patriots won three of their four games against the NFC during the regular season. Their only loss came to the St. Louis Rams (11/18). The Patriots avenged that loss with a 20-17 victory in Super Bowl XXXVI.

Tom Brady: Brady leads the NFL with 13 touchdown passes and has completed at least two scoring throws in each of the first five games this season. He's the first Patriot to accomplish that feat and the first Patriot to throw for at least two touchdowns in five straight games in a single season since Butch Songin (10/23/60-11/18/60).

Looking Sharp at Gillette: The Patriots have won eight of their last nine games at home, including five in a row. Their last loss at home was on Nov. 18, 2001, when the Rams defeated the Patriots 24-17. Foxborough has been a wonderful home to the Patriots since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. The team has compiled a 58-28 (.671) overall record at home during that time span. This week's game will be the 87th consecutive sellout at Foxboro.

Home Field Advantage: After scoring a combined 27 points at San Diego and at Miami the past two weeks, the Patriots return home to Gillette Stadium where they are undefeated and averaging 35.5 points per game. The Patriots opened the season with an impressive 30-14 victory over the Pittsburgh Steelers and returned home in Week 3 to record a thrilling 41-38 victory over the Kansas City Chiefs in overtime. Thirty one of those 71 points were converted from turnovers. The Patriots have forced eight turnovers in two games at home and just four turnovers in three games on the road this year. The Patriots enter this week's game with a +6 turnover ratio at home and a -5 turnover ratio on the road.

RATINGS GAME

For the third consecutive week, the telecast of the Patriots game was the highest rated program in the Boston market. The Patriots-Dolphins game generated a 24.0 rating (52 share), defeating Everybody Loves Raymond for the top spot.

PATRIOTS AND PACKERS SERIES RESULTS

SERIES HISTORY

This week's game will only be the seventh regular season meeting between the two teams, and their first since Oct. 27, 1997. The Packers defeated the Patriots 28-10 on Monday Night Football. The regular season series is tied at three wins a piece. The home team has won five out of the six meetings between the two teams and the Patriots have a 3-1 record against Green Bay at home. The two teams met in Super Bowl XXXI and the Packers held off a late Patriots comeback bid to win 35-21. New England cut the Packers lead to six, 27-21, but Desmond Howard returned the ensuing kickoff 99-yards for a touchdown, ensuring the Packers victory.

THE LAST MEETING – GB 28, NE 10 (10/27/97)

Green Bay scored 21 unanswered points and defeated the Patriots 28-10 in a Monday Night game at Foxboro Stadium. It was the first meeting between the two teams since Super Bowl XXXI the previous year. The Packers got on the scoreboard first on a 6-yard touchdown pass from Brett Favre to Dorsey Levens. The Patriots answered quickly with an 11-yard touchdown pass from Drew Bledsoe to Ben Coates. The drive was highlighted by a 50-yard reception by then-Patriot Terry Glenn. Near the end of the first half, the Patriots drove 57 yards on 13 plays in 5:19 and Adam Vinatieri gave them a 10-7 lead on a 38-yard field goal. The Patriots lead was short lived as the Packers answered right back at the end of the half with a 32-yard pass from Favre to Mark Chmura and led 14-10.

The second half was all Packers, as they scored on two of their three possessions in the half. After stopping the Patriots on the 1-yard line, the Packers went 99 yards on 17 plays in 9:31, and increased their lead to 21-10 with a 20-yard scoring pass from Favre to Robert Brooks. Their next and final score came in the fourth quarter following a 15 play, 85 yard drive that ended in a 3-yard run by Dorsey Levens, his second of the game.

CONNECTIONS

Patriots guard **Joe Andruzzi** played in 23 games, including four starts with the Packers from 1997-99 ... Wide receiver **Donald Hayes** attended Wisconsin (1994-97) and recorded 106 catches for 1,575 yards ... Packers head coach **Mike Sherman** grew up in Norwood, Mass. and attended Central Connecticut State University ... Sherman also coached at Holy Cross from 1985-88 ... Two additional Packer coaches spent time at Holy Cross, **Tom Rossley** (1986-87) and **Frank Novak** (1978-83) ... Packers linebacker coach **Bo Pelini** served in the same role with the Patriots from 1997-99 ... Packers tight ends coach **Jeff Jagodzinski** served as Boston College's offensive coordinator from 1997-98 during Patriots center **Damien Woody's** final two years with the Eagles ... Packers wide receiver **Terry Glenn** spent six seasons (1996-01) with the New England Patriots and caught 329 passes for 4,669 yards.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Patriots have won eight of their last nine games at home, including five in a row. Their last loss at home was on Nov. 18, 2001, when the Rams defeated the Patriots 24-17. This week's game will be the Patriots 87th consecutive sellout since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. It will also be the 183rd consecutive game that has been broadcast locally. Foxborough has been a wonderful home to the Patriots since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. The team has compiled a 58-28 (.671) overall record at home during that time span.

Since 1996, the Patriots rank fourth in the AFC and eighth in the NFL with a home record of 34-16. This week's opponent, the Green Bay Packers, hold the best home record in the NFL over that time span with a 43-7 record.

HOME GAME + POSITIVE TURNOVER RATIO = WIN

The Patriots have won their last nine games and 11 of their last 13 at home when they've had a positive turnover ratio dating back to the 1999 season. The Patriots have recorded a +6 ratio in their two home games this season, both wins.



GAME RECAP – DOLPHINS 26, PATRIOTS 13

GAME RECAP

The Patriots lost for the second week in a row, 26-13, to their AFC East rival Miami Dolphins. The Patriots committed three turnovers, two of which the Dolphins converted into first half touchdowns. Miami jumped out to a 16-0 lead in the first half and the Patriots were unable to make a second half recovery.

Patriots wide receiver David Patten caught five passes for 102 yards and tied a career-high with two touchdown receptions. It was Patten's second 100-yard receiving game of the season and the fifth of his career. Patten scored on passes of 34 and 25 yards from Tom Brady. Last year he caught two touchdown passes in a game at Indianapolis (10/21/01).

Miami opened the scoring at the end of the first quarter when quarterback Jay Fiedler escaped the clutches of two Patriots defenders and scrambled eight yards for a touchdown. Patriots safety Tebucky Jones blocked the extra point and Miami led 6-0. The Dolphins acquired the football when Jason Taylor stripped Brady of the football and Adewale Ogunleye recovered the ball. Miami drove 39 yards on nine plays, converting three third downs on the drive.

On the ensuing Patriots possession, Brady was intercepted by Patrick Surtain at the Patriots 29-yard line. The Dolphins attempted a 36-yard field goal, but extended their drive on a penalty, giving the Dolphins a first down on the 9-yard line. Three plays later, Fiedler connected with Chris Chambers for a 7-yard touchdown to give the Dolphins a 13-0 lead.

Miami added a 40-yard field goal before the end of the half and the Dolphins took a 16-0 lead.

New England came out in the second half and regained some momentum when Tedy Bruschi forced a Ricky Williams fumble on the Dolphins first series of the second half, and Victor Green recovered the loose ball. New England capitalized on the turnover by driving 68 yards on five plays and Brady hit Patten for a 34-yard touchdown pass. Brady rolled out of the pocket and found Patten alone along the sideline and he scampered into the end zone. They failed on a two-point conversion and trailed 16-6.

Fiedler tossed his second touchdown pass of the game at the end of the third quarter, when he lobbed up a 1-yard touchdown pass to tight end Randy McMichael, giving the Dolphins a 23-6 lead.

Two plays into the fourth quarter, Brady threw his second interception of the game trying to connect with wide receiver Donald Hayes, but cornerback Sam Madison came up with the football. The Patriots forced the Dolphins to punt and started their next drive with the ball on the 20-yard line.

Brady led his troops 80 yards on eight plays and cut the Dolphin lead to 10 at 23-13 with a 25-yard touchdown pass to Patten. It was the second of the game for both Brady and Patten.

The Dolphins added another Mare field goal, extending their lead to 26-13 with 1:30 remaining. The Patriots attempted another scoring drive, but surrendered the ball on downs.

FIRST HALF SCORING

The 16 points scored by the Dolphins in the first half last week were the most allowed by the Patriots in a first half since the Dolphins scored 17 points in the first half almost one year earlier, Oct. 7, 2001. Last year, the Dolphins rode a 17-10 halftime lead to a 30-10 victory.

THIRD DOWNS

The Patriots recorded their lowest third down conversion rate of the season, 30 percent (3-of-10), last week against Miami. Their previous low was a 38.5 percent (5-of-13) against Pittsburgh in the season opener. Despite last week, the Patriots rank third in the AFC and fourth in the NFL with a 47.1 conversion rate on third down.

Defensively, the Patriots were unable to end Dolphins drives, allowing them to convert 53 percent of their third downs into first downs. It was the second highest ratio of the season, just behind Kansas City's 54.5 (6-of-11) rate (9/22/02). All three of Miami's touchdowns came on third downs.

RECORD WHEN...

- The Patriots are now 0-13 against the Dolphins in Miami during the months of September and October
- The Patriots are now 0-2 this season when they have a negative turnover ratio.
- The Patriots are 1-2 this season when they allow a 100-yard rusher.
- The Patriots are 0-2 this season and 2-4 over the past two seasons when Tom Brady throws multiple interceptions in a game.

VERSUS AFC EAST

The Patriots had their four-game winning streak against the AFC East snapped in last week's 26-13 loss to Miami. The Patriots are now 1-1 against division foes this season and 7-2 in their last nine division games.

EXTRA EFFORT

Patriots free safety Tebucky Jones became the first Patriot in seven years to block an opponent's extra point when he blocked Olindo Mare's first attempt of the game in the first quarter. The last Patriot to block a PAT was Troy Barnett, who was credited with a blocked PAT on Nov. 26, 1995 at Buffalo (Steve Christie).

THIRD QUARTER SCORING

Tom Brady's 34-yard touchdown pass to David Patten in the third quarter ended a four-quarter scoring drought. The Patriots have now scored 48 points in the third quarter this year, a reversal of fortunes from last year, when the team scored just 58 points in the third quarter all season. By comparison, the Patriots have allowed just 28 points in the third quarter this season. The 48 points is also more than the Patriots have scored in the first half of all five games this season (43 points).

SACK ATTACK

Patriots linebacker Mike Vrabel recorded his second sack of the season, the 12th of his career, against the Dolphins last week.

GAME NOTES

Tom Brady's touchdown passes were the 30th and 31st of his young career and the 12th and 13th of the season to lead the NFL ... **David Patten** caught both of Brady's scores, the second time in his career he caught two touchdown passes in the same game ... **Roman Phifer** led the Patriots defense with 15 tackles. It was his highest total as a Patriot and the highest by a Patriot since **Lawyer Milloy** totaled 16 tackles vs. Baltimore (1/2/00).



PATRIOTS OFFENSIVE NOTES

TROY BROWN

Brown, who has missed the past two games due to an injury, set a Patriots franchise record with 16 catches against the Chiefs on Sept. 22, 2002. His previous high was also set against the Kansas City Chiefs when he was credited with 12 receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown on Dec. 4, 2000. He also gained a single-game career-high 176 yards. It was Brown's 12th 100-yard game of his career, tying him with Irving Fryar for third in Patriots history.

CENTURY MARK

Wide receiver David Patten totaled 102 yards receiving last week and extended the Patriots streak of at least one receiver eclipsing the 100-yard mark to three games. It's only the fourth time in franchise history the Patriots have accomplished such a feat. The three previous times occurred in 1981 (9/27, 10/4, 10/11), 1989 (12/10, 12/17, 12/24), and 1994 (9/4, 9/11, 9/18).

They are also one of only two teams, along with Buffalo Bills, who have three different receivers who have recorded a 100-yard receiving games: Eric Moulds (3), Peerless Price (2) and Josh Reed (1). The Patriots also rank second, behind Buffalo (6) in 100-yard receiving games in the NFL.

TOP ROOK

Patriots wide receiver Deion Branch earned AFC Rookie of the Month honors for September to become the first Patriot to earn the honor. Branch leads all NFL rookies with 32 catches and 370 yards receiving and is tied for second with two touchdowns. Below is a comparison of Branch and the 10 receivers taken before him in the 2002 draft.

Earlier this season, Branch established career-highs in receptions (13) and receiving yards (128) against the Chargers (9/29/02). He recorded the second-highest single-game reception total by a rookie wide receiver in NFL history against the Chargers when he caught 13 passes for 128 yards. Wide receiver Don Looney established the mark of 14 catches on Dec. 1, 1940. Branch also tied the second highest reception total by a Patriot, equaling the mark set by Terry Glenn on Oct. 3, 1999. His 13 receptions also tied the second-highest single-game reception total in franchise history (Terry Glenn, at Cleveland Oct. 3, 1999). He also became the first Patriots rookie to eclipse the 100-yard mark since Tony Simmons gained 109 yards on four catches, including one touchdown at Indianapolis (11/1/98).

PATTEN PENDING

Patriots wide receiver David Patten led all receivers with 102 yards receiving on five catches, including two touchdown receptions at Miami last week. It was the second 100-yard receiving game of the season and the fifth of his career (see below). Patten also tied a career-high of two touchdown receptions he set last season against the Colts (10/21/01).

TOMMY GUN

Brady has kept the pedal to the metal during the first five weeks of the 2002 campaign by throwing at least two touchdown passes in each of the first five games of the season, totaling a league-high 13 scores.
