NEW ENGLAND (3-3) EXITS BYE WEEK; WELCOMES THE DENVER BRONCOS (5-2) TO GILLETTE STADIUM

This Week: The New England Patriots (3-3) will return to the field this weekend when they host the Denver Broncos at Gillette Stadium (capacity, 68,436) on Oct. 27 at 4:15 p.m.

Television: This week's game will be broadcast nationally on CBS (locally on WBZ Channel 4). The play-by-play duties will be handled by **Greg Gumbel**, who will be joined in the booth by **Phil Simms**. **Armen Keteyian** will provide sideline reports throughout the game.

Radio: Every Patriots game can be heard in stereo on the Patriots official flagship station **WBCN 104.1 FM**. **Gil Santos**, now in his 26th season as the voice of the Patriots, will call the game along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**, who will provide in-depth analysis for his 22nd season. A complete list of the Patriots WBCN Rock Radio Network can be found on pages 462-463 of the 2002 Patriots media guide or at www.patriots.com.

National Radio: This week's game can also be heard nationally on CBS Radio. **Dave Sims** and **John Dockery** will be calling the play-by-play.

By the Bye: Since the inception of the bye week in 1990, the Patriots have a 5-8 record in games following the bye. They have won three of their last six following a week off, including a 38-6 victory last year against the Carolina Panthers. Bill Belichick's teams have an 8-5 record following their bye and have won six of their last eight contests. This season in the NFL, teams coming off of the bye week have an 11-5 record.

Turnovers: The Patriots have totaled a -8 turnover ratio over the past three games, all losses. The Patriots have recorded a 0-3 record this season with a negative turnover ratio and they are 12-15 since 1996. The Patriots are 2-0 this year and 36-10 since 1996 when they have a positive turnover ratio. During their current three-game losing streak, Patriots opponents have scored 27 points off of turnovers and they've defeated the Patriots by a total of 38 points.

Touchdown Streak: Quarterback Tom Brady extended his consecutive games with a touchdown pass streak to eight games against Green Bay. It's the longest streak by a Patriots quarterback since Drew Bledsoe connected on a touchdown in nine straight games (11/1/98 – 9/19/99). Brady has thrown 14 touchdown passes through the first six games this year. He totaled 18 during 15 games last season.

Looking Sharp at Gillette: The Patriots have won eight of their last nine games at home (including preseason and postseason). The 28-10 loss to Green Bay was the Patriots first at Gillette Stadium. Foxborough has been a wonderful home to the Patriots since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. The team has compiled a 58-29 (.667) overall record at home during that time span. This week's game against the Broncos (10/27) will be the 88th consecutive sellout at Foxborough.

A Year Ago: Through the first six games of this season the New England Patriots are 3-3. Last year, the Patriots started 3-3, but won 11 of their next 13 games, including Super Bowl XXXVI. While the 2002 Patriots have allowed 37 more rushing yards than they did at this point last year, they have yielded 242 fewer total yards than in 2001. Also similar to last year, the Patriots have allowed four different running backs to eclipse the 100-yard mark through the first six games of the year. In 2001 the Patriots did not allow another opposing running back gain 100 rushing yards until the final game of the regular season.

THE ROAD AHEAD

Following the Patriots game against the Denver Broncos (5-2) at Gillette Stadium this weekend, they will embark on a three-game road trip traveling to Buffalo (4-3), Chicago (2-4) and Oakland (4-2). It will be the longest road streak this year in the NFL (in terms of games played). The Patriots will travel 7,872 miles during their three-game road trip.



PATRIOTS AND BRONCOS SERIES RESULTS

SERIES HISTORY

The New England Patriots and the Denver Broncos will meet this week for the eighth year in a row and the 37th time overall. The 8-year streak is the longest active streak among non-division rivals. The Patriots have won two of the last three games in the series. The home team has won four of the last five games of the series, with New England's 28-19 win at Mile High in 2000 being the only game not to go in favor of the home team. The Broncos hold a 21-14 advantage over the Patriots and a 1-0 record in the postseason. A game-by-game look at the series history is listed below:

LAST MEETING

The New England Patriots lost 31-20 to the Denver Broncos at Invesco Field at Mile High in their meeting last year (Oct. 28). The Patriots led 17-10 at the half, but were outscored 21-3 in the second half and had their two-game winning streak against the Broncos snapped.

Tom Brady completed 13-of-16 passes for 119 yards and two touchdowns in the first half, but threw four fourth quarter interceptions in the Patriots comeback bid. The Broncos scored the final 21 points of the game, including a 39-yard interception return by Denard Walker.

GAME RECAP – PACKERS 28, PATRIOTS 10

GAME RECAP

The Patriots lost for the third time in as many weeks, 28-10, to the Green Bay Packers on Oct. 13. For the second consecutive week, the Patriots committed four turnovers, which resulted in 14 Packer points. New England also equaled a season-high with 12 penalties.

The Patriots opened the scoring on an Adam Vinatieri 32-yard field goal in the second quarter. The drive started on New England's 36-yard line and took up 3:58 on 10 plays. Quarterback Tom Brady completed 5-of-8 passes on the drive for 50 yards.

On the Packers ensuing possession, the Patriots appeared to have held them to a Ryan Longwell field goal attempt, but a costly Patriots penalty gave the Packers a first down on the 21-yard line. The Packers took advantage of their opportunity as Brett Favre connected with William Henderson for a 3-yard touchdown five plays later.

On the Patriots next possession, Brady threw a backward pass to Kevin Faulk, who dropped the ball, making it a free ball. Packers defensive lineman Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila recovered the loose ball, giving the Packers offense possession on the Patriot 8-yard line. The Packers needed only one play, an 8-yard pass from Favre to Ahman Green, for their next score and the Packers led 14-3 at the half.

After missing a field goal on their first possession of the second half, the Packers scored on their second and third possessions. Favre connected with tight end Bubba Franks on a 2-yard touchdown pass, increasing their lead to 21-3. The drive started on the Packer 6-yard line and was highlighted by a 34-yard pass interference penalty on Patriots cornerback Ben Kelly, who was filling in for the injured Ty Law.

The Patriots comeback attempt was foiled at the end of the third quarter as the Packers Marques Anderson intercepted a Brady pass intended for David Patten. The Packers converted the turnover into a one-yard touchdown run by Green. The Packers moved 65 yards on seven plays, including a 38-yard run by Green.

The Patriots added a late touchdown when Brady completed a 4-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver David Givens. The touchdown was the first of Givens' short career and it capped off a day in which he caught the first three passes of his career for a total of 22 yards.

The Patriots had their bye week last weekend and will host the Denver Broncos this Sunday, Oct. 27, at 4:15 p.m.

PATRIOTS AT GILLETTE STADIUM

The Patriots 28-10 loss to the Green Bay Packers on Oct. 13 was their first loss at Gillette Stadium. It snapped an eight-game winning streak at home (including preseason and postseason). Their last loss at home was on Nov. 18, 2001, when the Rams defeated the Patriots 24-17.

Foxborough has been a wonderful home to the Patriots since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. The team has compiled a 58-29 (.667) overall record at home during that time span. This week's sellout will be the 88th consecutive sellout at Foxborough.

THE RETURNS ARE IN

Kickoff returner Kevin Faulk became the Patriots all-time kickoff return leader against Green Bay following his 27-yard return in the fourth quarter. Faulk increased his career total to 2,582 return yards. He moved ahead of David Meggett (2,561 yards). Faulk already holds the record for most returns with 117.

TOUCHDOWN STREAK

Tom Brady threw a touchdown pass in his eighth straight game against Green Bay, becoming the first Patriots quarterback to have a streak that long since Drew Bledsoe connected in nine straight games (11/01/98 – 09/19/99). Brady's 4-yard touchdown pass to David Givens in the fourth quarter was his 16th touchdown pass over the eight-game span.

SHARING THE WEALTH

The Patriots scored their 14th receiving touchdown of the season today against the Packers when rookie wide receiver David Givens caught a 4-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter. Givens was the 10th different Patriot player to catch a touchdown pass this season.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

The Patriots currently have a three-game losing streak against the Packers and have not beaten them since a 17-16 victory on Oct. 2, 1994 at Foxboro Stadium. Since the 1994 season, there are only four NFL teams that the Patriots have not defeated, excluding the Houston Texans, whom the Patriots have never played. Since 1994, the Patriots have at least one victory over 27 different NFL teams, including all 15 AFC teams they have played.

The 18-point loss was the largest since the Patriots lost by 20 points to the Dolphins (10/7/01 at Miami). The Patriots rebounded and went 10-2 during the remainder of the regular season ... Patriots guard **Stephen Neal** started his first professional game ... Defensive end **Bobby Hamilton** led all defenders with 11 tackles, including a sack ... Linebacker **Roman Phifer** recorded 10 tackles against the Packers, marking the second consecutive week he recorded double-digit tackles (he recorded 15 at Miami).



PATRIOTS NEWS AND NOTES

TROY BROWN

Brown returned to action against the Packers and tied for the team lead with five catches for 37 yards. He set a Patriots franchise record with 16 catches against the Chiefs on Sept. 22, 2002. His previous high was also set against Kansas City when he was credited with 12 receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown on Dec. 4, 2000. He also gained a single-game career-high 176 yards. It was Brown's 12th 100-yard game of his career, tying him with Irving Fryar for third in Patriots history.

TOP ROOK

Patriots wide receiver Deion Branch earned AFC Rookie of the Month honors for September to become the first Patriot to earn the honor. Branch totaled five catches for 38 yards against the Packers and leads all NFL rookies with 37 catches and 408 yards receiving. Earlier this season, Branch established career highs in receptions (13) and receiving yards (128) against the Chargers (9/29/02). It was the second-highest single-game reception total by a rookie wide receiver in NFL history. Wide receiver Don Looney established the mark of 14 catches on Dec. 1, 1940. TURNOVERS

The Patriots did not force a turnover against the Packers and had a 19-game streak with a turnover halted. They had averaged 2.4 takeaways per game this season prior to play Green Bay.

NEGATIVE TURNOVER RATIOS

The Patriots recorded a -4 turnover ratio against the Packers last week (three interceptions, one fumble), marking their third consecutive game with a negative turnover ratio. They have yielded a -8 turnover over the last three weeks. New England had a -2 ratio in each of the two previous games against the Dolphins (10/6/02) and the Chargers (9/29/02). It's the first time since weeks 7-9 of last season that the Patriots had succumbed to negative turnover ratios in three consecutive weeks. The Patriots are now 0-3 this season and 12-15 when they have a negative ratio since 1996. Conversely, they are 38-10 when they record a positive turnover ratio since 1996, including a 2-0 record this season.
