NEW ENGLAND (3-4) TRAVELS TO BUFFALO TO FACE THE BILLS (5-3) AND DREW BLEDSOE

This Week: The New England Patriots (3-4) will travel to Orchard Park, N.Y. to face the Bills at Ralph Wilson Stadium (73,967 capacity) on Nov. 3 at 1:00 p.m. This will only be the Patriots third game against an AFC East opponent this season and their first against the Bills.

Television: This week's game will be broadcast nationally on CBS (locally on WBZ Channel 4). The play-by-play duties will be handled by **Greg Gumbel**, who will be joined in the booth by **Phil Simms**. **Armen Keteyian** will provide sideline reports throughout the game.

Radio: Every Patriots game can be heard in stereo on the Patriots official flagship station **WBCN 104.1 FM**. **Gil Santos**, now in his 26th season as the voice of the Patriots, will call the game along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**, who will provide in-depth analysis for his 22nd season. A complete list of the Patriots WBCN Rock Radio Network can be found on pages 462-463 of the 2002 Patriots media guide or at www.patriots.com.

National Radio: This week's game can also be heard nationally on CBS Radio. **Harry Kalas** and **Jack Ham** will be calling the play-by-play.

Versus the AFC East: The Patriots have recorded a 7-1 record against their AFC East rivals in their last eight meetings. This week's game will be the Patriots third division game of the season. All three games have been on the road. This season the Patriots have a 1-1 record against the AFC East, defeating the Jets at the Meadowlands, 44-7, and losing to the Dolphins at Pro Player Stadium, 26-13.

The Road Ahead: The Patriots will embark on a three-game road trip this week, starting with a trip to Buffalo to face the Bills. Next week, the Patriots will travel to Chicago (2-5) followed by another trip to the west coast to play Oakland (4-3). The Patriots are the only team in the NFL to play three consecutive road games this season. They will travel 7,872 miles during their three-game road trip.

As defending champions, the New England Patriots drew one of the most difficult schedules in the NFL this year. After opening the season 3-0 with victories over the Pittsburgh Steelers (30-14), New York Jets (44-7) and Kansas City Chiefs (41-38, OT), the Patriots have now lost four straight for the first time since 2000. Their opponents in those games are a combined 23-6 with Green Bay (6-1), San Diego (6-1) and Miami (5-2) all leading their divisions. The first team the Patriots will play this season with a sub-.500 record will be their Week 10 matchup against the Chicago Bears (currently 2-5). The Patriots next four opponents have a combined record of 13-16.

In 1994, the Patriots rebounded from a four-game losing streak to win their last seven games of the regular season to qualify for the playoffs. The Patriots have not lost five consecutive games since 1995.

Touchdown Streak: Quarterback Tom Brady extended his consecutive games with a touchdown pass streak to nine on an 8-yard pass to tight end Christian Fauria against Denver last week. It equals the longest streak by a Patriots quarterback since Drew Bledsoe connected for a touchdown in nine straight games (11/1/98 - 9/19/99). If he continues the streak this weekend, Brady will be only the fifth quarterback in franchise history to record a double-digit streak. Babe Parilli owns the longest consecutive streak of games with a touchdown pass with 14 (12/3/61 - 9/8/63).

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS

Whenever the Patriots and Bills have met, the game has often gone right down to the wire. In their 85 meetings, 39 have been decided by single-digit differences, including 19 by three points or less since 1970. Their 19 three-point or less results is tied for fourth in the NFL since 1970 (see below). Four of the last five meetings have been decided in overtime. Each team has won two of the extra session games.

PATRIOTS AND BILLS SERIES RESULTS

SERIES HISTORY

This week's game will be the 85th encounter between the two AFC East rivals, dating back to the inception of the AFL in 1960. The Patriots have recorded 44 wins against the Bills, the most against any opponent. They currently hold a three-game winning streak against the Bills, their longest since they won 11 straight games from 1982-87.

The last time the Patriots faced the Bills was Dec. 16, 2001 at Ralph Wilson Stadium. The Patriots won 12-9 in overtime on a 23-yard field goal by Adam Vinatieri, his fourth of the game. The Patriots drove 75 yards on eight plays, including a 40-yard run by former Bill Antowain Smith to set up the game-winning field goal. The game was the fourth of the past five meetings that was decided in overtime. The results of the series are listed below:

The Patriots have 44 wins against the Bills, which is their most against any opponent ... **RB Antowain Smith** spent four seasons with the Bills (1997-2000) and gained 2,932 yards on 760 carries and scored 26 touchdowns ... In their two meetings in 2001, Smith gained 195 yards on 40 carries (4.9 avg.) and scored two touchdowns ... Fifteen of this 40 career rushing touchdowns have been in Ralph Wilson Stadium. **BOTH TEAMS:** Six of the last eight games in the series have been decided by four points or less (NE 4-4)... Four of the last five games have been decided in overtime (NE 2-2) ... The Patriots are 10-5 against the Bills in their last 15 meetings ... The Patriots have won the last two meetings at Ralph Wilson Stadium in Buffalo ... The visiting team has won four out of the last five meetings in the series.

GAME RECAP – BRONCOS 24, PATRIOTS 16

GAME RECAP

The New England Patriots couldn't buck their losing trend last Sunday, falling to the Denver Broncos for their fourth straight defeat. The Patriots closed the gap to five points in the fourth quarter, but could not get over the hump and fell by a score of 24-16, dropping to 3-4 on the season.

Tom Brady threw for a touchdown in his ninth straight game, while Antowain Smith rushed for another score and averaged 4.5 yards per carry. However, the Patriots couldn't corral the Broncos offensive output, as Clinton Portis ran for 111 yards. The Broncos passing game was potent as well, as Brian Griese completed 78 percent of his passes for 229 yards and Ed McCaffrey grabbed eight passes for 116 yards.

The Broncos opened the scoring on a one-yard plunge by Portis on their first offensive series. The Patriots tried to rally back later in the quarter as Ty Law snared his 27th career interception. New England could not capitalize on the turnover and the Broncos entered the second quarter with a 7-0 lead.

Denver quickly jumped further in front, taking a 14-0 lead on an eight-yard touchdown toss from Griese to tight end Shannon Sharpe on the first play of the second quarter.

The Patriots clawed back and forced another Bronco miscue when Victor Green forced Rod Smith to fumble and Law pounced on the loose ball. The Patriots converted the turnover into a touchdown, as Antowain Smith rumbled into the end zone from three yards out. It was his second score of the season and the 40th of his five-year career. The Broncos regained their two-touchdown advantage as Portis found paydirt again with 2:49 left before halftime, as Denver took a 21-7 lead into the break.

Denver got the ball to start the second half and was chugging down the field, but Willie McGinest sacked Griese and derailed the Denver attack, forcing the Broncos into a missed field goal. The Patriots immediately rebounded driving down to the 8-yard line with the help of a 46-yard pass interference call forced by David Patten and added a field goal. Adam Vinatieri's 26-yard kick cut the score to 21-10. New England then gained great field position after Deion Branch returned a punt 40 yards to give the Patriots the ball in Denver territory.

On the first play of the final quarter, Brady found Christian Fauria in the corner of the end zone from eight yards out and the tight end made a tumbling grab for his third touchdown of the season. Fauria established a single-season career-high with his third touchdown grab. New England elected to try a two-point conversion to pull within a field goal, but couldn't convert and trailed by five points, 21-16. On the ensuing possession, the Broncos moved down the field only to see Tedy Bruschi stonewall fullback Mike Anderson at the one-yard line on third-and-goal. Denver had to settle for a field goal, which put the score at 24-16. The Patriots had two more chances to claw back but were stymied by the Denver defense. New England dropped to 3-4 and Denver improved to 6-2.

BY THE BYE

Since the inception of the bye week in 1990, the Patriots now have a 5-9 record in games following the bye.

GAME NOTE

The Patriots lost for the first time in nine games when they had a positive turnover ratio at home dating back to the 1999 season.

LAW AND ORDER

Ty Law recorded his second interception of the season and the 27th of his career in the first quarter last week. Law is tied with Maurice Hurst for sixth place in Patriots history. Cornerback Mike Haynes is ranked fifth with 28 interceptions (see below).

Law also recovered a Rod Smith fumble in the second quarter against Denver. It was his first fumble recovery of the season and the fourth of his career. It was the first multiple takeaway game by a Patriot since Terrell Buckley intercepted two passes against Pittsburgh (9/9/02).

SACK ATTACK

Willie McGinest sacked Bronco quarterback Brian Griese for a seven-yard loss last week. It was his team-leading third sack of the season giving him 54.5 for his career. He moved past DL Ray Hamilton (54.0) into fourth place on the Patriots all-time sack list.

GREEN MONSTER

Patriots safety Victor Green forced Broncos wide receiver Rod Smith to fumble in the second quarter and cornerback Ty Law recovered the loose ball. It was his third forced fumble of the season. Green has also recovered two fumbles and intercepted one pass in 2002. Each of the five takeaways Green has been involved in have resulted in touchdowns for the Patriots.

FORCED TUROVERS

The Patriots forced two turnovers against the Broncos (one fumble, one interception), increasing their season total to 14. Through their first seven games last season, the Patriots recorded 11 takeaways and ended up finishing the season with 35 takeaways, their highest takeaway total since 1994 (40).

DEION BRANCH

Branch returned a punt 40 yards in the third quarter last week, the longest of his career. It was the longest punt return of the season for the Patriots, and the longest since Troy Brown returned a punt 68 yards for a touchdown at Carolina (1/6/02).



PATRIOTS NEWS AND NOTES

TROY BROWN

Brown led the Patriots with seven receptions for 59 yards against the Broncos. It was the fifth game this season he either led or was tied for the team lead in receptions. The only two games he did not led the team were the two he missed due to injury. Over the past two seasons, Brown led the Patriots or was tied for the lead in receptions in 19 of 23 games.

Brown set a Patriots franchise record with 16 catches against the Chiefs on Sept. 22, 2002. His previous high was also set against Kansas City when he was credited with 12 receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown on Dec. 4, 2000. He also gained a single-game career-high 176 yards.
