PATRIOTS (5-4) HOPE TO WIN THIRD STRAIGHT ROAD GAME WHEN THEY TRAVEL TO OAKLAND TO FACE THE RAIDERS (5-4)

This Week: The New England Patriots (5-4) will travel to Oakland, Calif. this weekend to face the Raiders (5-4) at Network Associates Coliseum (63,132 capacity). The game will be televised on ESPN. Kickoff is scheduled at 8:30 p.m. This will be the Patriots final game of their three-game road trip.

Television: This week's game will be broadcast nationally on ESPN (locally on WCVB Channel 5). The play-by-play duties will be handled by Mike Patrick, who will be joined in the booth by Paul Maguire and Joe Theismann. Suzy Kolber will provide sideline reports throughout the game.

Radio: Every Patriots game can be heard in stereo on the Patriots official flagship station **WBCN 104.1 FM. Gil Santos**, now in his 26th season as the voice of the Patriots, will call the game along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**, who will provide in-depth analysis for his 22nd season. A complete list of the Patriots WBCN Rock Radio Network can be found on pages 462-463 of the 2002 Patriots media guide or at www.patriots.com.

National Radio: This week's game can also be heard nationally on CBS Radio. Joel Meyers and Bob Trumpy will be calling all the action and Warren Moon will be reporting from the sidelines.

Patriots in Prime Time: This weekend's game against the Raiders will be the Patriots third nationally televised game of the 2002 season. New England will appear in a total of six nationally televised games this season, a single-season franchise record. Their previous high of five was set in 1998. They faced the Philadelphia Eagles in a preseason prime-time match up and opened the 2002 season with a 30-14 victory over the Pittsburgh Steelers on Monday Night Football. The Patriots will be featured on Thanksgiving against the Lions (11/28) and will appear on Monday Night Football against the Tennessee Titans (12/16) and again on ESPN versus the New York Jets (12/22).

Kickin' It: Patriots kicker Adam Vinatieri boomed the longest field goal in Patriots history last week against the Bears when he nailed a 57-yard attempt in the first quarter. This season Vinatieri has made 15-of-16 field goals and has converted 22 of his last 23 attempts. Vinatieri is the most accurate kicker in Patriots history, having made 81.4 percent of his kicks (175 of 215) and also ranks fifth in NFL history over his seven-year career.

On the Road Again: The Patriots will conclude their three-game road trip this weekend when they travel to Oakland to face the Raiders. The road trip, which will cover 7,872 miles, is the longest road streak this year in the NFL. This week's game will be the first of three games played over an 11-day span, including two on the road. After traveling to Oakland, the Patriots return home to host the Vikings (11/24) before traveling to Detroit to battle the Lions on Thanksgiving (11/28/02).

COMEBACK KID

Patriots quarterback Tom Brady completed four of seven passes for 53 yards on the final drive of last week's 33-30 come-from-behind victory over the Bears, including a 20-yard game-winning touchdown pass in the final seconds. It was Brady's seventh game-winning drive to break a tie or deficit in his 26 career starts. It was also the fifth time he led a fourth-quarter comeback drive. Brady's passing statistics from his seven game-winning performances are listed below.

Against the Raiders in the playoffs last year, Brady led the Patriots back from a 13-3 fourth quarter deficit to a 16-13 overtime victory. He completed 20-of-27 passes for 138 yards in the fourth quarter and overtime. He also scored on a 6-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots and Raiders will renew acquaintances this weekend on Sunday Night Football. They met in the AFC Divisional Playoff game last year and the Patriots defeated the Raiders 16-13 in overtime. The game, which was the last contest in Foxboro Stadium, was played under arctic conditions: a constant snowfall and a temperature of 25 degrees. New England scored the game's final 13 points, including two Adam Vinatieri field goals, a 45yarder at the end of regulation to tie the game and a 23-yard kick in overtime for the win.

The Patriots and Raiders were two of the eight charter teams of the AFL in 1960 and have met 30 times over the past 42 years. While the two teams clashed 22 times in the 1960s and '70s, this will be just the eighth time they have met since 1981 and their first meeting in the regular season since 1994. The series is knotted at 14-14-1, including playoffs.

- Patriots safety Tebucky Jones (1994-97) and Raiders tight end Roland Williams (1994-97) were teammates at Syracuse.
- Patriots quarterback Tom Brady (1996-99), cornerback Ty Law (1992-94) and Raiders running back Tyrone Wheatley (1991-94) and cornerback Rod Woodson (1995-97) all attended the University of Michigan.

GAME RECAP

The Patriots won their second consecutive game and improved to 5-4 on the season after their 33-30, come-from-behind victory over the Bears. The Patriots trailed 27-6 with 6:42 remaining in the third period and scored 27 of the game's final 30 points to defeat the Bears.

The game was a tale of two halves, as the teams combined for 12 points in the first half and 51 in the second half, including 31 in the third quarter.

It was the Patriots largest comeback since they rebounded from a 21-point deficit against the Indianapolis Colts on Sept. 19, 1999.

The Bears opened the scoring with a 39-yard field goal by Paul Edinger at 14:51 in the second quarter. New England tied the game at three with a 57-yard field goal by Adam Vinatieri. It was the longest field goal in Patriots history.

The Bears edged out ahead on their next drive with a 40-yard field goal by Edinger. The Patriots struck back before the half, moving 55 yards on seven plays and tied it up at six on a 31-yard field goal with 44 seconds remaining in the half.

On the Patriots first drive of the second half, Tom Brady was stripped of the football by Phillip Daniels and the Bears gained possession. Two plays later, Jim Miller completed an 11-yard pass to Stanley Pritchett and the Bears led 13-6.

The Bears added to their lead when wide receiver Marty Booker completed a 44-yard touchdown pass to fellow wide receiver Marcus Robinson and the Bears led 20-6.

Two series later, Brady was intercepted by Brian Urlacher and the Bears mounted another scoring drive. Three plays later Bears running back Anthony Thomas rushed in from three yards out and the Patriots were trailing by 21, 27-6.

New England began their comeback on their next drive when they moved 75 yards on eight plays and Brady threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Kevin Faulk. On the next play from scrimmage, Patriots cornerback Otis Smith intercepted Miller and returned the pass 22 yards, setting up Vinatieri for a 42-yard field goal, his third of the game.

The Patriots regained the ball and moved 54 yards on 16 plays and cut the Bears lead to 27-19 on Vinatieri's fourth field goal. Chicago struck back with a field goal of their own, a 32-yarder by Edinger to take a 30-19 lead with 5:16 left in the game.

The never-say-die Patriots took the next drive 63 yards on seven plays and Brady completed a 36-yard touchdown pass to Kevin Faulk to make the score 30-25. It was Faulk's second touchdown of the game, a career-high.

On the Bears next drive, the Patriots defense stopped them from converting a first down on 2^{nd} -and-1 and 3^{rd} -and-1 and forced them to punt. The Patriots regained the ball with 1:50 remaining in the game and began their drive. With 1:21 remaining, Brady's pass attempt was ruled an interception, but after a review it was changed to an incomplete pass. The Patriots converted their 4^{th} -and-3 on the next play with a 3-yard run by Brady. Brady gave the Patriots their first lead on a 20-yard touchdown pass to David Patten with 28 seconds remaining in the game. The Patriots converted the two-point conversion and won by three, 33-30.

ARTIFICIAL TURF

The Patriots won their seventh consecutive game on artificial turf, including their second consecutive game this season. Their last loss on artificial turf was at Detroit on Thanksgiving (11/23/00).

POINTS APLENTY

The Patriots have not scored less than 30 points in any of their five wins this season and are averaging 37.2 points in those wins. They have scored 239 points (26.5 average) in their nine games this year and are on pace to score 425 points this season. It would rank as the second-highest point production in franchise history (441, 1980).

PATRIOTS SACK ATTACK

The Patriots have recorded 23 sacks this season, which ranks third in the AFC and is tied for seventh in the NFL.

TEDY BRUSCHI

Patriots linebacker Tedy Bruschi sacked Chris Chandler for a 6-yard loss in the first quarter. It was his third sack of the season, $18^{\rm th}$ of his career.

MIKE VRABEL

Vrabel dropped Bears quarterback Jim Miller for a 3-yard loss on the Bears final possession to thwart any hopes of a Chicago comeback. It was his fourth sack of the season, setting a singleseason career-high.

DAMON HUARD

Patriots backup quarterback Damon Huard ran for a 4-yard gain on 4th-and-1 in the second quarter. The Patriots lined up in punt formation but shifted to a regular offensive formation with Huard behind center. The Patriots continued the drive and evened the game at three with a 57-yard field goal by Adam Vinatieri.

OTIS SMITH

Recorded his second interception of the season and the 28^{th} of his career (10^{th} as a Patriot) in the third quarter. He returned the interception 22 yards. Smith increased his career return yardage to 645, including 278 with the Patriots. He needs 11 more yards to move past Ross O'Hanley (288 yards) into 10^{th} place on the Patriots all-time list.

TURNOVER NOTES

- The Patriots 33-30 win was their first win in a game where they recorded a negative turnover ratio since they came from behind to defeat the Buffalo Bills 12-9 in overtime last year.
- When Tom Brady fumbled in the third quarter it snapped a streak of 12 quarters without a turnover. The last Patriots turnover was a Brady interception in the third quarter against the Green Bay Packers (10/13).
- •When Brady was intercepted by Brian Urlacher in the third quarter, it snapped his streak of 94 pass attempts without an interception. His last interception was against the Green Bay Packers (10/13).

MOVIN' ON UP

The Patriots 21-point come-from-behind victory against the Bears was their largest since they rebounded from a 21-point deficit against the Indianapolis Colts on Sept. 19, 1999. The Patriots trailed the Colts 28-7 at halftime and scored the final 24 points of the game and won 31-28.

THREE'S COMPANY

The Patriots converted 35% (6-17) of their third downs against the Bears last weekend, including 6-of-12 in the second half. It was the lowest conversion rate in a win since they recorded a 28.6% (4-14) conversion rate in their 27-16 victory over the Cleveland Browns (12/9/01).

This season, the Patriots rank first in the AFC and third in the NFL with a conversion rate of 45.2% (56-124). Defensively, the Patriots limited the Bears to a 33.3% (5-15) conversion rate on third down last week. In their five wins this season, the Patriots have held their opponents to a 31.8% (20-63) third down conversion rate.

FOUR WHEELING

The Patriots converted all three of their fourth down attempts against the Bears last weekend, including a 4th-and-3 on their game-winning touchdown drive. Quarterback Tom Brady ran over right guard for three yards and a first down. The Patriots have converted 8-of-12 fourth downs this season. Their eight fourth down conversions are the second most in the NFL along with Philadelphia.



TROY BROWN

Brown led the Patriots with 11 catches for 90 yards last week against the Bears. It was his second double-digit reception game this season and the fourth of his career. Five of Brown's 11 receptions against the Bears resulted in first downs, including a 14-vard reception on 4th-and-3 in the fourth quarter. The Patriots scored a touchdown three plays later and cut their deficit to 30-25.

Brown leads the Patriots in receptions with 57 for 516 yards (9.1 avg.) and one touchdown, despite missing two games with an injury. Brown set a Patriots franchise record with 16 catches against the Chiefs on Sept. 22, 2002. His previous high was also set against Kansas City when he was credited with 12 receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown on Dec. 4, 2000. He also gained a single-game career-high 176 yards.

PATTEN PENDING

Patriots wide receiver David Patten caught four passes for 51 yards last week against Chicago, including the game-winning 20 yard touchdown grab in the back of the end zone. It was his fourth touchdown reception of the season, equaling a career-high set in 2001.

Through nine games this season, Patten has accumulated 597 receiving yards and ranks ninth in the AFC. He is projected to total 1,061 yards this season, which would be his first career 1,000-yard season. Patten leads all Patriots receivers with two 100-yard receiving games this season. He has increased his career total to five 100-yard games (see below). Patten also caught two touchdowns against the Dolphins (10/6/02) to tie his career-high.

CENTURY MARK

Four different Patriots have totaled five 100-yard receiving games this season, including running back Kevin Faulk's 109-yard performance against the Bears last week. The Patriots are the only team in the NFL who have four different receivers who have recorded a 100-yard receiving game. Buffalo and Oakland rank second with three apiece. The Patriots are tied for third, along with this week's opponent Oakland, behind Buffalo (9) and Indianapolis (6) with five 100-yard receiving games this season (see below).

CAREER DAY

Patriots running back Kevin Faulk established career-highs with 109 yards receiving and two touchdown receptions against the Bears last week. It was the first multiple touchdown game of his four-year career and he became the first running back to record a 100-yard receiving performance since Tony Collins gained 109 yards receiving on six catches at Tampa Bay (10/27/85). Faulk is currenlty tied with fellow running back Antowain Smith for the team lead with five touchdowns (two rushing, three receiving). He has tied a career-high with five touchdowns, which he set in 2000.

MR. SMITH GOES TO FOXBOROUGH

Patriots running back Antowain Smith has gained 21 more yards through nine games this year, than he did last year, on 10 fewer carries (see below). Last year, Smith finished the season with a career-high of 1,157 yards rushing on 287 attempts. He has also caught 16 passes for 98 yards and two touchdowns this season. At this point last year, Smith had 11 receptions for 107 yards, but no touchdowns.

BOWLING THEM OVER

During his five seasons with the Cleveland Browns, Coach Belichick was responsible for the hiring of two dozen coaches and personnel staff who have since advanced their careers in the NFL and/or in the college ranks. Coach Belichick's offensive line coach, Kirk Ferentz, and his defensive coordinator, Nick Saban, have built very successful programs in the college ranks and are bowling over some NCAA powerhouses. Ferentz's Iowa Hawkeyes are now 10-1 and currently ranked fifth in the nation (ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll) and have a very good chance of being invited to the granddaddy of all college bowl games, the Rose Bowl. Meanwhile, Saban's LSU Tigers have clawed their way to the top of the SEC Western Division. They are now 7-2 overall and ranked 12th in the nation (Coaches Poll). With a victory over Alabama this weekend, the Tigers are sure to accept an invitation to one of college football's premier bowl games this January.
