### PATRIOTS (5-5) RETURN HOME TO GILLETTE STADIUM FOLLOWING THREE GAME ROAD TRIP TO FACE THE VIKINGS (3-7)

**This Week:** The New England Patriots (5-5) return home for the first time in nearly a month and will host the Minnesota Vikings (3-7) at Gillette Stadium (68,436 capacity) on Sunday, Nov. 24. Kickoff is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. The Vikings enjoyed an emotional boost last week after gaining 218 rushing yards and 425 total yards in a 31-21 victory over the Green Bay Packers. The Patriots, on the other hand, return home after suffering their only loss on a three game road trip to the Raiders in Oakland. The Patriots need a victory to keep pace in the AFC East, where they currently trail the Miami Dolphins by a game and are tied with the Buffalo Bills and New York Jets for second place with a 5-5 record. The Vikings will be the first of two games in five days against NFC opponents. The Patriots have split their first two games against the NFC, defeating the Chicago Bears on the road, but losing to the Green Bay Packers at home. Next week, the Patriots travel to Detroit for a Thanksgiving Day game against the Lions on Thursday, Nov. 28. It will be their second appearance on Thanksgiving in the past three years.

**Television:** This week's game will be broadcast regionally on FOX (locally on WFXT Channel 25). The play-by-play duties will be handled by **Kenny Albert**, who will be joined in the booth by **Tim Green**.

**Radio:** Every Patriots game can be heard in stereo on the Patriots official flagship station **WBCN 104.1 FM**. **Gil Santos**, now in his 26<sup>th</sup> season as the voice of the Patriots, will call the game along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**, who will provide in-depth analysis for his 22<sup>nd</sup> season. **Home Stretch:** This week's game against the Vikings will be the Patriots first of four home games during the final six weeks of the regular season. The Patriots have won eight of their last 10 home games, including preseason, regular season and postseason games. Foxborough has been a wonderful home to the Patriots since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. The team has compiled a 58-30 (.659) overall record at home during that time span. This week's game will be the 89<sup>th</sup> consecutive sellout at Foxborough. It will also be the 188<sup>th</sup> consecutive game broadcast locally.

**Movin' On Up:** Patriots kicker Adam Vinatieri became the franchise's all-time field goal leader last week when he nailed his 177<sup>th</sup> career field goal, a 31-yarder, and passed Gino Cappelletti (176). Vinatieri is the most accurate kicker in Patriots history, as well as the fifth most accurate kicker in NFL history, having made 81.2% of his kicks (177-218). He boomed the longest field goal in Patriots history earlier this season against the Bears (11/10) when he nailed a 57-yard attempt. It is also the longest in the NFL this season.

**Happy Returns:** Patriots running back and kickoff returner Kevin Faulk returned a fourth-quarter kickoff 86 yards for a touchdown against the Raiders last week. The last Patriots kickoff return for a touchdown was recorded by Derrick Cullors at Buffalo (11/9/97). Faulk now leads the Patriots with six touchdowns this season (two rushing, three receiving and one kickoff return). He is the only player in the NFL who has scored a rushing, receiving and return touchdown this season. He's also the first Patriot since Irving Fryar to accomplish the triple play. Fryar had one rushing, seven receiving and two punt return touchdowns in 1985.

### RATINGS GAME

The Patriots-Raiders game earned a 30.4 rating (48 share) last week and was the highest rated program in the Boston market. It was the eighth consecutive Patriots game that was the highest rated program in the Boston market. Three of the top five programs in the Boston market last week were football related (see below).

## GAME RECAP

The New England Patriots dropped a 21-13 decision to the Minnesota Vikings at Foxboro Stadium on Sept. 17, 2000. The Patriots were only able to capitalize on two of five trips inside the red zone against Minnesota.

The Vikings started the scoring on their opening possession, moving 73 yards on 17 plays in 8:54. The drive culminated with a 4-yard touchdown run by running back Robert Smith.

The Patriots answered immediately with a touchdown on their opening drive when running back Kevin Faulk put the finishing touches on the 61-yard, five play drive with a 2-yard touchdown run.

The Vikings responded with a 16-play, 80-yard scoring drive, controlling the ball for 9:22. quarterback Daunte Culpepper ended the drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass that gave the Vikings a 14-7 edge.

The Patriots next drive ended after only three plays and the Vikings regained possession at Minnesota's 47 yard line. Five plays and 53 yards later, Culpepper connected with WR Matthew Hatchette on a 39-yard touchdown pass, extending the Vikings lead to 21-7 at the half.

The Patriots defense held Minnesota to a three-and-out forcing them to punt and gave the Patriot offense possession at Minnesota's 43. The Patriots drove 43 yards on six plays and scored, but did not get the extra point and trailed 21-13.

The Patriots defense stood firm, forcing the Vikings to punt on their two remaining possessions, but the Patriots offense was unable to find the end zone. They moved the ball as close at the Vikings 14-yard line on their last drive but didn't get a score.

## HOME GAME + POSITIVE TURNOVER RATIO = WIN

The Patriots have won 11 of their last 14 at home when they've had a positive turnover ratio dating back to the 1999 season.



# GAME RECAP – RAIDERS 27, PATRIOTS 20

## GAME RECAP

The Patriots dropped to 5-5 on the season with a 27-20 loss to the Raiders in Oakland last Sunday night. New England finished its three-game road trip with a 2-1 record.

The Patriots scored two touchdowns on returns, the first coming on a 48-yard interception return by linebacker Tedy Bruschi and the second on an 86-yard kickoff return by running back Kevin Faulk in the game's final moments. Adam Vinatieri added a pair of field goals to round out the Patriots scoring.

Tom Brady had his string of 11 consecutive games with a touchdown pass snapped, as he completed 18 of 30 passes for 172 yards.

The Patriots jumped on the board first, as Brady completed his first seven passes for 33 yards, leading to a 31-yard field goal by Vinatieri to give the Patriots a quick 3-0 lead. Brady spread the field, completing passes to five different receivers on the Patriots opening drive. Oakland answered back with a Sebastian Janikowski field goal to tie the score at three by the end of the first quarter.

Oakland took the lead in the second quarter, jumping ahead by a 10-3 margin courtesy of a 2-yard touchdown run by Zack Crockett. The Patriots pulled a counterpunch, as Vinatieri added another field goal to cut the lead to 10-6. But, the Raiders took advantage of a Brady fumble at the Patriots 8-yard line, scoring again on a 2-yard run by quarterback Rich Gannon to take a 17-6 lead, which Oakland carried into the intermission.

The Raiders got the ball to open the second half and used their opportunity to gain control of the game by extending their lead to 24-6. Oakland held the ball on a 15-play, 85-yard drive that lasted 9:42 and ended with a 2-yard touchdown plunge by Crockett. The Patriots were able to close the gap on a 46-yard interception return for a touchdown by Tedy Bruschi, who scored the second touchdown of his career. Bruschi grabbed the ball after it had bounced off Lawyer Milloy's foot and rumbled to the end zone to make the score 24-13 heading into the fourth quarter.

The Patriots defense was able to halt the Raiders on their first two possessions of the final quarter, forcing a punt then a missed field goal that was partially blocked. But the New England offense couldn't capitalize on their chances to mount a comeback, as the Raiders defense came up with two fourth-down stops. Janikowski kicked a 28-yard field goal to widen the gap 27-13, before Faulk returned the ensuing kickoff 86 yards for a touchdown to bring the Patriots to within a touchdown with 69 seconds remaining. The kickoff return for a touchdown was the first of Faulk's career, but the Patriots could not recover the onside kick as the Raiders held on to win, 27-20.

## POINTS APLENTY

The Patriots have scored 259 points (25.9 average) in their 10 games this year and are on pace to score 414 points. It would rank as the third-highest point production in franchise history (441, 1980; 418, 1996).

The Patriots magic number this season has been 21. The Patriots have won all five games in which they have scored 21 points or more and are 0-5 when they don't.

## PATRIOTS SACK ATTACK

The Patriots have recorded 24 sacks this season, which is tied for seventh in the AFC and tied for 13<sup>th</sup> in the NFL.

## TEDY BRUSCHI

Patriots linebacker Tedy Bruschi intercepted a Rich Gannon pass in the third quarter and returned it 48 yards for a touchdown. It was his first interception of the season and the fourth of his career. It was the second touchdown of Bruschi's career and his first on an interception return. He had returned a blocked punt four yards for a touchdown at Baltimore (10/6/96).

Bruschi shared the team lead with 10 tackles against the Raiders with Ty Law. It was Bruschi's second double-digit tackle total of the season (11, at San Diego). He ranks second on the team this season with 55 tackles (40 solos).

## RICHARD SEYMOUR

Seymour recorded his fourth sack of the season against the Raiders, establishing a new career high. He had recorded three sacks last year.

## ROAD TRIP

The Patriots finished their three-game road trip with a 2-1 record after their 27-20 loss to the Oakland Raiders. This was the Patriots 16<sup>th</sup> road trip of at least three games and it was the sixth time they finished with two wins. In 1961, the Patriots recorded their only three-game sweep.

## PATRIOTS IN PRIME TIME

The Patriots are now 2-1 this season in prime time and are 6-6 overall on ESPN. The Patriots will also be featured on Thanksgiving against the Lions (11/28) and will appear on Monday Night Football against the Tennessee Titans (12/16) and on ESPN versus the New York Jets (12/22). New England will appear in a total of six nationally televised games this season, a single-season franchise record. Their previous high of five was set in 1998.

## THREE'S COMPANY

The Patriots converted only 33% of their third downs (4-12) last week against the Raiders, while allowing Oakland to convert half of their attempts (7-14). In their five wins, the Patriots have held their opponents to a 31.7% (20-63) third down conversion rate, while the Patriots have converted nearly half, 49.3% (37-75). This season, the Patriots rank second in the AFC and fifth in the NFL with a conversion rate of 44.1% (60-136).

Conversely, in their five losses this season, the Patriots have only converted 37.7% (37-75) of their third downs, while their opponents have converted half (35-70).

## CHRISTIAN FAURIA

The Patriots tight end caught a career-high, 33-yard pass against the Raiders last week. Fauria leads all Patriots tight ends with 19 receptions for 175 yards and is tied for the team lead with four receiving touchdowns. His previous high was two touchdown receptions, which he set in both 1998 and 2000 with Seattle.

Through the first 10 games of this season, the Patriots tight ends have eclipsed all receiving totals of their 2001 counterparts (see below).

## FOUR WHEELING

Through the first 10 weeks of the season, the Patriots have already scored 92 points in the fourth quarter, their highest total in any one quarter. They currently rank fourth in the NFL behind Kansas City (119), Indianapolis (96) and Denver (93). They have scored more in the final stanza this season than they had during the fourth quarter of 22 different seasons.

## BOWLING THEM OVER

During his five seasons with the Cleveland Browns, Coach Belichick was responsible for the hiring of two dozen coaches and personnel staff who have since advanced their careers in the NFL and/or in the college ranks. Coach Belichick's offensive line coach, Kirk Ferentz, and his defensive coordinator, Nick Saban, have built very successful programs in the college ranks and are bowling over some NCAA powerhouses. Ferentz's Iowa Hawkeyes are now 11-1 and currently ranked fourth in the nation (ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll) and have a very good chance of being invited to the granddaddy of all college bowl games, the Rose Bowl. Meanwhile, Saban's LSU Tigers have clawed their way to the top of the SEC Western Division. They are now 7-3 overall and ranked 20th in the nation (Coaches Poll).



# PATRIOTS NEWS AND NOTES

## TROY BROWN

Brown led the Patriots with five catches for 55 yards last week against the Raiders. It was the seventh game of the eight he has played in this year that he has led the team in receiving. Brown has either led the team or was tied for the team lead in receptions in 21 of the 24 games he has played in over the past two seasons.

Brown leads the Patriots in receptions with 57 for 516 yards (9.1 avg.) and one touchdown, despite missing two games with an injury. Brown set a Patriots franchise record with 16 catches against the Chiefs on Sept. 22, 2002. His previous high was also set against Kansas City when he was credited with 12 receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown on Dec. 4, 2000. He also gained a single-game career-high 176 yards.

## BROWN'S 100-YARD RECEIVING GAMES

Brown recorded his 12<sup>th</sup> career 100-yard receiving game against the Chiefs on Sept. 22 and is now tied for third in Patriots history (listed below).

## HAPPY RETURNS

Patriots running back and kickoff returner Kevin Faulk returned a fourth-quarter kickoff 86 yards for a touchdown against Oakland last week. The last Patriots kickoff return for a touchdown was recorded by Derrick Cullors at Buffalo (11/9/97). Faulk's 86-yard return tied Cullors' return as the shortest kickoff returned for a touchdown in team history.

Faulk now leads the Patriots with six touchdowns this season (two rushing, three receiving and one kickoff return). He is the only player in the NFL who has scored touchdowns rushing, receiving and on returns this season. He's also the first Patriot since Irving Fryar to accomplish the triple-play with one rushing, seven receiving and two punt return touchdowns in 1985.
