PATRIOTS (6-5) TO CELEBRATE THANKSGIVING IN DETROIT IN CLASH AGAINST LIONS (3-8)

This Week: The New England Patriots (6-5) will travel to Detroit, Mich. to face the Lions on Thanksgiving at Ford Field (65,000 capacity) on Thursday, Nov. 28. Kickoff is scheduled for 12:30 p.m. It will be the Patriots third appearance on Thanksgiving and their second in the past three years. It will be the Patriots fourth and final intraconference game of the regular season. They have a 2-1 record in their three games against the NFC, defeating the Minnesota Vikings 24-17 last week and the Chicago Bears 33-30 on Nov. 10. Their only loss against the NFC was a 28-10 decision against the Green Bay Packers on Oct. 13.

Television: This week's game will be broadcast nationally on CBS (WBZ Channel 4 in Boston). The play-by-play duties will be handled by **Greg Gumbel**, who will be joined in the booth by **Phil Simms**. **Armen Keteyian** will provide sideline reports throughout the game.

Radio: Every Patriots game can be heard in stereo on the Patriots official flagship station **WBCN 104.1 FM**. **Gil Santos**, now in his 26th season as the voice of the Patriots, will call the game along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**, who will provide in-depth analysis for his 22nd season. A complete list of the Patriots WBCN Rock Radio Network can be found on pages 462-463 of the 2002 Patriots media guide or at www.patriots.com.

National Radio: This week's game can also be heard nationally on CBS Radio. **Dave Sims** and **Jack Ham** will be calling the play-by-play and **Bonnie Bernstein** will report from the sidelines.

Giving Thanks: While the American tradition of Thanksgiving was first celebrated in 1621 to commemorate the harvest reaped by the Plymouth Colony after a harsh winter, the NFL's Thanksgiving tradition began in 1929 when the Chicago Bears defeated the Chicago Cardinals, 40-6. The Lions began their Thanksgiving tradition in 1934 when they hosted the defending World Champion Bears. Chicago won the inaugural game 19-16 on Nov. 28, 1934 at the University of Detroit Stadium. This week's game against the Patriots will be the Lions 63rd Thanksgiving game. The Lions have accumulated a 32-28-2 overall record on Thanksgiving.

Scoring in "Brady" Bunches: Patriots quarterback Tom Brady, who made his NFL debut two seasons ago against the Lions on Thanksgiving, leads the NFL with 24 touchdown passes this season. Last week, he completed three touchdowns against the Vikings, the fifth time this season he has thrown for three or more scores. He currently ranks sixth in Patriots single-season annals with 24 touchdown passes (with five games remaining). He reached 24 scoring passes in the fewest amount of games in Patriots history, 11. Vito 'Babe' Parilli held the previous mark of 12 games, set in 1964, the season he recorded the most touchdown passes in franchise history.

Christian Score-ia: The Patriots tight end caught two touchdown passes last week against the Vikings, to become the first Patriot tight end to record two scores in one game since Ben Coates on Sept. 19, 1999 vs. Indianapolis. Fauria leads the Patriots with a single-season career high six touchdown receptions this season. In his seven *years* prior to joining the Patriots, Fauria had caught seven touchdown passes. Fauria is tied with Kansas City's Tony Gonzalez for the league lead among the NFL's tight ends with six touchdown receptions. The last Patriot tight end to catch six touchdown passes in one season was Ben Coates in 1998.

THROWBACKS

The Patriots, along with the three other teams playing on Thanksgiving Day this Thursday, will be wearing "classic" uniforms. The Patriots will wear replica red jerseys and white pants, along with the white helmets featuring the 'Pat Patriot' logo with white facemasks from the 1985 team. New England finished 11-5 in 1985 and captured the franchise's first AFC championship trophy, qualifying for the Super Bowl after winning three consecutive road games, which is still an NFL record. Detroit players will sport Lions uniforms worn from 1934-61 with white pants and silver numerals, plain silver helmets with gray facemasks, blue jerseys and black belts.



PATRIOTS AND LIONS SERIES RESULTS

SERIES HISTORY

This week's matchup will mark just the seventh time the Patriots and Lions have faced one another and their second consecutive meeting on Thanksgiving. New England has won three of the last five meetings in the series.

Detroit has played 62 games on Thanksgiving and has recorded a 32-28-2 record. This will be their first Thanksgiving game at their new stadium, Ford Field. This week's game will be the first between teams who have debuted new stadiums this year. The Lions have a 3-2 record at home this year, while the Patriots are 3-3 away from Gillette Stadium.

THANKSGIVING RECAP CAPSULES

DALLAS 20, NE 17, Nov. 22, 1984

The Patriots first appearance on Thanksgiving was against the Dallas Cowboys on Nov. 22, 1984. The Cowboys won, 20-17. The Patriots fell behind early and trailed after three quarters, 17-3. Patriots quarterback Tony Eason led the team back and tied the game with a pair of 1-yard touchdowns. He threw a 1-yard touchdown pass to Derrick Ramsey at the beginning of the fourth quarter and with just 2:00 minutes remaining he ran in from 1-yard to tie the score at 17. Unfortunately, the Cowboys drove down the field and Raphel Septien kicked a 23-yard field goal with seven seconds remaining for the 20-17 win.

DETROIT 34, NE 9, Nov. 23, 2000

The New England Patriots dropped a 34-9 decision to the Detroit Lions on Thanksgiving Day two years ago in the Pontiac Silverdome. The Patriots fell victim to two costly second half turnovers, both of which the Lions converted into touchdowns as they closed out the scoring with 28 unanswered points. The two teams kicked a pair of field goals in the first half and were tied at six at halftime. The Patriots regained the lead, 9-6, following their opening drive of the second half, but the Lions finished the scoring on the day with the next 28 points.

BILL BELICHICK ON THANKSGIVING

Patriots head coach Bill Belichick has coached five times on Thanksgiving: twice as an assistant coach with the Detroit Lions (1976-77), once with the Denver Broncos (1978), N.Y. Giants (1982), and New England Patriots (2000). He has a 2-3 record in those games.

NATION WIDE

This week's game against the Lions will be the Patriots fourth nationally televised game of the 2002 season. New England will appear in a total of six nationally televised games this season, a single-season franchise record. Their previous high of five was set in 1998. GAME RECAP – PATRIOTS 24, VIKINGS 17

GAME RECAP

The Patriots returned to their winning ways by defeating the Minnesota Vikings 24-17 at Gillette Stadium last Sunday. New England improved to 6-5 on the season and is tied for second in the AFC East.

The Patriots scored touchdowns on their first three possessions to get out to an early 21-0 lead. It was the first time since Sept. 10, 1989 that the Patriots scored touchdowns on their first three drives of the game. Patriots tight end Christian Fauria scored the first two touchdowns, on 9 and 1-yard receptions. The third score came at the beginning of the second quarter on a pass from Brady to Troy Brown.

The Patriots gained possession early in the first quarter after a Gary Anderson field goal attempt was blocked by Patriots defensive tackle Richard Seymour. The Patriots took over on their own 33-yard line and went 67 yards on 12 plays in 5:40 for the score. Brady connected with Fauria for a 9-yard touchdown pass. It was Brady's first of three on the day.

On the Patriots next possession, Brady connected on two long plays, one to David Patten for a 19 yard gain, and another to Deion Branch for 20 yards. The drive culminated with a 1-yard touchdown from Brady to Fauria, their second of the afternoon.

On the ensuing Viking drive, quarterback Daunte Culpepper fumbled the football and safety Victor Green recovered the loose ball and the Patriots took over on the Minnesota 29-yard line. From that point, the Patriots took up 4:01 on seven plays for their third touchdown of the afternoon, a 5-yard pass from Brady to Brown. The drive was highlighted by a 17-yard reception from Brady to tight end Daniel Graham.

The Vikings finally got on the board at the end of the first half with a 6-yard touchdown reception from Culpepper to D'Wayne Bates.

On the Vikings second possession of the second half, Culpepper led his team down the field once again for another score, a 7-yard pass to Kelly Campbell. On the ensuing Viking drive, they added a 38-yard field goal by Gary Anderson, cutting the Patriots lead to 21-17.

The Patriots answered quickly at the beginning of the fourth quarter on a 34-yard field goal by Adam Vinatieri, increasing their lead to 24-17. Brady completed a 26-yard pass to Antowain Smith and a 27-yard pass fullback Marc Edwards to help move the Patriots into field goal position.

A late Minnesota comeback attempt was foiled by the Patriots secondary, as Culpepper's final four passing attempts fell incomplete.

LOOKING SHARP AT GILLETTE

The Patriots have won nine of their last 11 games at home (including preseason and postseason). Foxborough has been a wonderful home to the Patriots since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. The team has compiled a 59-30 (.663) overall record at home during that time span.

Last week's game against the Vikings (11/24) was the 89th consecutive sellout at home and was also the 188th consecutive game broadcast locally. The last local blackout was against the Indianapolis Colts on Dec. 26, 1993.

HOME GAME + POSITIVE TURNOVER RATIO = WIN

The Patriots have won 12 of their last 15 at home when they've had a positive turnover ratio dating back to the 1999 season.

TAKE THAT

The Patriots recorded a +3 turnover ratio last week against the Vikings, their second highest turnover ratio of the season (+4, vs. Pittsburgh 9/9/02). New England has a 4-1 record this season and a 38-11 record since 1996 when they have a positive turnover ratio.

GREEN MONSTER

Patriots safety Victor Green recovered a Daunte Culpepper fumble in the second quarter, his third fumble recovery of the season. The Patriots turned his takeaway into a 5-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Troy Brown. Green has been part of six turnovers this season (five fumbles, one interception) and all six of those have resulted in Patriots touchdowns.

RICHARD SEYMOUR

Patriots defensive tackle Richard Seymour blocked Gary Anderson's 43-yard field goal in the first quarter. It was the second consecutive week that he blocked a field goal. The last Patriot to block two field goals in the same season was defensive tackle Chad Eaton (2000). Seymour added six tackles, including his team-leading fifth sack of the season and recovered a Randy Moss fumble in the second quarter.

BLOCK THAT KICK

Patriots opponents have either missed or had field goals blocked 12 times this season, the most in the NFL.

SCORING NOTE

The Patriots scored 21 points in the first half against the Minnesota Vikings last Sunday, their highest total of the season. It's also their highest output since they generated 28 first half points at Indianapolis (10/21/01).

POINTS APLENTY

The Patriots lead the AFC East with 283 points (25.7 avg.) through their first 11 games this year. They are on pace to score 412 points, which would be tied for the fourth highest total in franchise history (441, 1980; 418, 1996; 413, 1961; 412, 1986). The Patriots magic number this season has been 21. The Patriots have won all six games when they have scored 21 points or more and are 0-5 when they don't.

PATRIOTS SACK ATTACK

The Patriots recorded four sacks against the Vikings last week and increased their season total to 28. They are tied for second in the AFC and tied for seventh in the NFL with 28 sacks.

TEDY BRUSCHI

Patriots linebacker Tedy Bruschi dropped Daunte Culpepper for a 2-yard loss in the second quarter. It was his fourth sack of the season, equaling his career high (4, 1996 and 1997).

JARVIS GREEN

Patriots defensive lineman recorded his second sack of the season in the third quarter.

ROMAN PHIFER

Phifer led the Patriots defense with 10 tackles (8 solos) and forced two fumbles last week against the Vikings. It was his fourth double-digit tackle performance of the season. Phifer leads the team with 75 tackles (52 solos) this season. He stripped Vikings running back Michael Bennett of the football on the New England 10-yard line, thwarting a Minnesota scoring opportunity. He also forced Vikings wide receiver Randy Moss to fumble on their next series.



PATRIOTS NEWS AND NOTES

TROY BROWN

Brown caught four passes for 33 yards, including a 5-yard touchdown reception last week against the Vikings. He has led the team in receptions in seven of the nine games he has played in this year. Brown has also led the team or was tied for the team lead in receptions in 21 of the 25 games he has played in over the past two seasons.

Brown leads the Patriots with 66 receptions for 604 yards (9.2 avg.) and two touchdowns, despite missing two games with an injury. Brown set a Patriots franchise record with 16 catches against the Chiefs on Sept. 22, 2002. His previous high was also set against Kansas City when he was credited with 12 receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown on Dec. 4, 2000. He also gained a single-game career-high 176 yards.

PATTEN PENDING

Patriots wide receiver David Patten leads the Patriots with 675 receiving yards through 11 games this season. He needs 75 yards receiving to establish a new career-high (749 yards, 2001). He has already equaled a career high with four receiving touchdowns this season. Patten leads all Patriots receivers with two 100-yard receiving games this season. He has increased his career total to five 100-yard games (see below). Patten also caught two touchdowns against the Dolphins (10/6/02) to tie his career high.

CENTURY MARK

Four different Patriots have totaled five 100-yard receiving games this season. The Patriots are the only team in the NFL to have four different receivers with 100-yard receiving games.
