BATTLE OF DIVISION LEADERS; PATRIOTS (8-5) TRAVEL TO TENNESSEE TO FACE THE TITANS (8-5)

This Week: The New England Patriots (8-5) will travel to Nashville, Tennessee and face the Titans (8-5) at The Coliseum (68,798 capacity) on Monday Night Football. The game will feature a battle between two of the hottest teams in the NFL. The Patriots have won five of their last six games, while the Titans have been victorious in seven of their last eight contests. It will be the Patriots second game on Monday night this year and the Titans first. New England defeated the Pittsburgh Steelers 30-14 in the opening weekend of the regular season on Monday Night Football. Kickoff is scheduled for 9:00 p.m.

Television: This week's game will be broadcast nationally on ABC (WCVB Channel 5 in Boston). The play-by-play duties will be handled by analyst **Al Michaels** who will be joined by color commentator **John Madden**. **Melissa Stark** will provide sideline reports throughout the game.

Radio: Every Patriots game can be heard in stereo on the Patriots official flagship station **WBCN 104.1 FM. Gil Santos**, now in his 26th season as the voice of the Patriots, will call the game along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**, who will provide in-depth analysis for his 22nd season. A complete list of the Patriots WBCN Rock Radio Network can be found on pages 462-463 of the 2002 Patriots media guide or at www.patriots.com.

National Radio: This week's game will be broadcast nationally on CBS Radio. **Marv Albert** and **Boomer Esiason** will be calling the play-by-play and **Bonnie Bernstein** will report from the sidelines.

The Road Ahead: The Patriots have won five of their last six games this season, including three road victories. The combined record of the Patriots final four opponents is 23-16, which is the toughest schedule in the AFC East and the second toughest in the entire AFC. While the Patriots will venture from Gillette Stadium this week to face the Titans, they will return to Gillette for their final two games of the season against division opponents.

Another December to Remember?: The Patriots have a 7-2 record in the month of December since Bill Belichick assumed the duties as head coach in 2000, including a current five-game winning streak. As the temperatures have cooled in recent years, the Patriots have heated up. Since 1993, New England is 13-4 when it's 36 degrees or colder.

Catch Him if You Can: Wide receiver Troy Brown leads all Patriots receivers with 79 receptions and is on pace to catch 97 passes, despite missing two games earlier this season due to injury. With one catch this week, Brown will become the only Patriot to ever record three 80-catch seasons (83, 2000; 101, 2001). Brown ranks sixth in the AFC and eighth in the NFL with 79 catches this season.

TAKE THAT!

The Patriots recorded a +5 turnover ratio against the Bills last week (4 interceptions, 1 fumble recovery). It was their highest total of the season and the most since they recorded a +6 ratio (4 interceptions, 2 fumble recoveries) at San Diego on Dec. 1, 1996. It's their seventh positive turnover ratio of the season and they have recorded a 6-1 record this season and a 39-12 record since 1996 when they have a positive turnover ratio. The Patriots have recorded a +16 ratio in their eight wins this season.

New England increased their season turnover ratio to ± 10 , the fourth highest total in the AFC (see below). The Patriots have finished 17 prior seasons with a positive turnover ratio and in 16 of those seasons they have had a winning record. New England has forced 28 turnovers through 13 games this season, the highest total in the AFC.

Patriots and Titans Series Results

SERIES HISTORY

This week's game will be the 35th meeting between the Patriots and the Titans organizations and their first since Sept. 20, 1998. The Patriots have won six out of the last eight meetings in the series, including a 27-16 victory in their last meeting. The Patriots scored two fourth quarter touchdowns to help propel them to a 27-16 victory.

The two teams will meet on Monday Night Football for the second time. The first time they met the then-Houston Oilers defeated the Patriots 38-34 at the Houston Astrodome on Nov. 10, 1980. Patriots quarterback Steve Grogan went 25-39 for 374 yards and three touchdowns. Oiler running back Earl Campbell ran for 130 yards on 30 attempts and two touchdowns. Tight end Russ Francis led all Patriots receivers with five receptions for 86 yards and two touchdowns. Frank Gifford, Howard Cosell, Don Meredith and Fran Tarkenton called the game for ABC and Monday Night Football. The Patriots have a 9-18 record on Monday Night Football, while the Titans have a 14-13 record. This season, the Patriots are 3-1 in nationally televised games.

PATRIOTS IN PRIME TIME

This week's game against Tennessee on Monday Night Football will be the Patriots fifth nationally televised game of the season. They have a 3-1 record in their four previous nationally televised games, including a 20-12 victory over the Lions on Thanksgiving. New England will appear in a total of six nationally televised games this season, a single-season franchise record. Their previous high of five was set in 1998.



GAME RECAP -PATRIOTS 27, BILLS 17

GAME RECAP

The Patriots improved to 8-5 and finished off a season sweep of the Buffalo Bills with a 27-17 win at Gillette Stadium. New England jumped out to a 20-0 halftime lead and held off Buffalo's second half charge as the Patriots defense recorded five takeaways on the afternoon, including four interceptions of former teammate Drew Bledsoe. Patriots quarterback Tom Brady completed a total of 15 passes to 10 different receivers, including a pair of touchdowns, and recorded his sixth passer rating of over 100.0 this season.

The Patriots started out the afternoon by scoring on their first four possessions to jump out to a quick 20-0 lead. On New England's first play from scrimmage, Brady hooked up with Deion Branch for a 41-yard gain as their opening drive ended in a 39-yard field goal by Adam Vinatieri. After a Buffalo punt, the Patriots proceeded to march 86 yards on eight plays to take a 10-0 lead on a 10-yard touchdown toss from Brady to David Patten.

New England's defense came alive on the Bills' second offensive possession. Anthony Pleasant tipped Bledsoe's pass at the line of scrimmage and Richard Seymour grabbed the deflected ball for an interception that gave the Patriots possession at Buffalo's 9-yard line. Two plays later, Brady threw his second touchdown pass of the afternoon, a 9-yard completion to Donald Hayes that made the score 17-0 with less than 12 minutes gone off the clock.

The Patriots defense continued its clutch play, coming up with a key stop as Buffalo was poised to score early in the second quarter. Tebucky Jones picked off a Bledsoe pass three yards deep in the end zone, to keep the Bills off of the scoreboard and give the Patriots the ball back. New England then marched down the field and Adam Vinatieri converted a 46-yard field goal to put New England firmly in command, 20-0, as the first half came to a close.

Buffalo began to scrape back into the game in the second half, scoring on its first two possessions to cut the Patriots lead in half, 20-10. The Bills drove 72 yards in 13 plays to begin the half, and got on the board with a 26-yard field goal by Mike Hollis. On their next possession, the Bills marched back into Patriots territory and found the end zone for the first time on a 12-yard touchdown toss from Bledsoe to Eric Moulds to cut the Patriots lead to 10 heading into the final quarter.

The teams exchanged punts before the Patriots forced the first of three fourth-quarter takeaways and were able to keep the Bills from getting back into the game. Otis Smith stripped the ball from Peerless Price and recovered the fumble to give the Patriots the ball back at Buffalo's 28-yard line. Antowain Smith then proceeded to gain all 28 yards the Patriots needed to get into the end zone, with the last of his six rushes coming in the form of a 4-yard touchdown plunge to make the score 27-10.

After Smith's touchdown, the Patriots defense ended the Bills next two series by forcing interceptions, helping them seal the win. Following Smith's touchdown run, Ty Law stepped in front of a Bledsoe pass and picked it off for his team-leading fifth interception of the season and his second against his former teammate this season. On the Bills next possession, the Patriots came up with one final takeaway, as Terrell Buckley picked off Bledsoe and returned the ball 39 yards. It was Buckley's third interception of the season. A late Bledsoe to Moulds touchdown pass cut the Patriots lead to 27-17, but the Patriots recovered the onside kick and ran out the clock on their fifth victory in their last six games.

POINTS APLENTY

The Patriots have scored 330 points through their first 13 games this season (25.4 avg.). They rank fourth in the AFC in total points. They are on pace to score 406 points. It would be just the sixth time the Patriots eclipsed the 400-point plateau. The Patriots magic number this season has been 21. The Patriots have won all seven games when they have scored 21 points or more and are 1-5 when they don't.

LOOKING SHARP AT GILLETTE

The Patriots have won 10 of their last 12 games at home (including preseason and postseason). Foxborough has been a wonderful home to the Patriots since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. The team has compiled a 60-30 (.667) overall record at home during that time span.

Last week's game against the Bills was the 90^{th} consecutive sellout at home and the 190^{th} consecutive game broadcast locally. The last local blackout was against the Indianapolis Colts on Dec. 26, 1993.

VERSUS THE AFC EAST

The Patriots won for the ninth time in their last 10 games against the AFC East last week against the Bills. This season they hold the best record against division opponents in the AFC East, 3-1 and have outscored their divisional opponents 122-57 this season. Two of the Patriots last three games this season will be against AFC East teams at Gillette Stadium.

VERSUS THE BILLS

The Patriots recorded their 46th win against the Bills, their most against any opponent. They extended their winning streak to five games against the Bills, their longest since they won 11 straight from 1982-87.

LONG DISTANCE DEDICATION

Tom Brady's 41-yard completion to Deion Branch on the first play of the game was the second longest completion of the season for the Patriots. The longest is a 49-yard pass from Brady to Branch at NY Jets (9/15/02).

FIRST THINGS FIRST

The Patriots scored on their first possession of last week's game on a 39-yard Adam Vinatieri field goal. It marked the fourth consecutive game in which the Patriots have scored on their first drive.

SCORING STREAK

The Patriots scored on their first four drives of the game against the Bills. It's the most consecutive scoring drives to start a game since they scored on their first five possessions at Indianapolis Colts (10/22/00).

OUICK STRIKE

The Patriots scored two touchdowns 21 seconds apart in the first quarter against the Bills. Tom Brady completed a touchdown pass to Patten (3:40) and two plays following a Richard Seymour interception, he completed a scoring strike to Donald Hayes (3:17).

It was the fastest the Patriots scored two touchdowns since they scored two in 18 seconds vs. Tennessee (9/20/98). Drew Bledsoe completed a 51-yard touchdown pass to Terry Glenn (4:25) and then Lawyer Milloy intercepted a Steve McNair pass and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown (4:07).

TED JOHNSON

Patriots linebacker Ted Johnson led the team in tackles with nine, including a sack. He increased his season tackle total to 66. It was his second highest tackle total of the season (13, vs. Kansas City).

TOSS UP

The Patriots won the coin toss for the 11th time in 13 games this season (12 of 14 including overtime vs. Kansas City, 9/22).



TROY BROWN

Brown led all Patriots receivers with three catches last week against the Bills. He has led the team in receptions in nine of the 11 games he has played in this year. Brown has also led the team or was tied for the team lead in receptions in 23 of the 27 games he has played in over the past two seasons. He has recorded three double-digit catch performances this season, including 10 catches for 111 yards against the Lions on Thanksgiving. It was also his second 100-yard receiving game of the season and the 13th of his

Brown leads the Patriots with 79 receptions for 742 yards (9.4 avg.) and two touchdowns, despite missing two games with an injury. Brown set a Patriots franchise record with 16 catches against the Chiefs on Sept. 22, 2002. His previous high was also set against Kansas City when he was credited with 12 receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown on Dec. 4, 2000. He also gained a single-game career-high 176 yards.

Patten also became the fourth Patriot to score five or more touchdowns this season (Antowain Smith, 7; Kevin Faulk, 6; Christian Fauria, 6; D. Patten, 5). It's the first time since 1994 the Patriots have accomplished the feat (Marion Butts, 8; Ben Coates, 7; Leroy Thompson, 7; Vincent Brisby, 5).

THREE OR MORE CLUBS

The original seeding within a division upon application of the division tie-breaker remains the same for all subsequent applications of the procedure that are necessary to identify the Wild Card participants.
- 2. Head-to-head sweep (apply only if one club has defeated each of the others or one club has lost to each of the others.)
 - 3. Best w-l-t % in games played within the conference.
 - 4. Best w-l-t % in common games, minimum of four.
 - 5. Strength of victory.
 - 6. Strength of schedule.

When the first Wild Card team has been identified, the procedure is repeated to name the second Wild Card (i.e., eliminate all but the highest ranked club in each division prior to proceeding to Step 2.) In situations where three teams from the same division are involved in the procedure, the original seeding of the teams remains the same for subsequent applications of the tie-breaker if the top-ranked team in that division qualifies for a Wild Card berth.
