PATRIOTS (8-6) ENTER HOME STRETCH; WELCOME NEW YORK JETS (7-7) TO GILLETTE STADIUM

This Week: The New England Patriots (8-6) will return home to Gillette Stadium (68,436 capacity) to face their division rivals, the New York Jets (7-7) on Sunday Night Football. The game will be the Patriots first of two against division opponents at home to end the regular season. The Patriots own a two-game winning streak in the series and will attempt their first season series sweep since 1996. Earlier this season, the Patriots defeated the Jets 44-7 at The Meadowlands, the second widest margin of victory in the 43-year series and the seventh largest victory in Patriots history.

Television: This week's game will be broadcast nationally on ESPN (locally on WCVB Channel 5). The play-by-play duties will be handled by **Mike Patrick**, who will be joined in the booth by **Paul Maguire** and **Joe Theismann**. **Suzy Kolber** will provide sideline reports throughout the game.

Radio: Every Patriots game can be heard in stereo on the Patriots official flagship station **WBCN 104.1 FM. Gil Santos**, now in his 26th season as the voice of the Patriots, will call the game along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**, who will provide in-depth analysis for his 22nd season. A complete list of the Patriots WBCN Rock Radio Network can be found on pages 462-463 of the 2002 Patriots media guide or at www.patriots.com.

National Radio: This week's game can also be heard nationally on CBS Radio. **Joel Meyers** and **Bob Trumpy** will be calling all the action and **John Riggins** will be reporting from the sidelines.

Another December to Remember?: The Patriots have compiled a 7-3 record in the month of December since Bill Belichick assumed the duties as head coach in 2000, including five wins in their last six games. As the temperatures have cooled in recent years, the Patriots have heated up. Since 1993, New England is 13-4 when it's 36 degrees or colder.

Home Sweet Home: The Patriots have won 10 of their last 12 games at home (including preseason and postseason). Foxborough has been a wonderful home to the Patriots since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. The team has compiled a 60-30 (.667) overall record at home during that time span.

This week's game against the Jets will be the Patriots 91st consecutive sellout at home and the 191st consecutive game broadcast locally. The last local blackout was against the Indianapolis Colts on Dec. 26, 1993.

The Beast of the East: The Patriots have won nine of their last 11 games against the AFC East, including three of four this season. Their 3-1 record in 2002 is the best in the division. New England has outscored their divisional opponents 122-57 this season, including a 44-7 victory over the Jets on Sept. 15. The Patriots final two games this season weigh heavily with playoff implications in a race for the AFC East title. If the Patriots win out, they will claim their second consecutive AFC East title.

CATCH HIM IF YOU CAN

Troy Brown became the first Patriot in franchise history to record three seasons with 80 or more receptions (2000, 2001, 2002) last week against the Titans. He currently has 87 receptions this season, despite missing two games due to injury. His 2002 total ranks fourth in franchise history (see below). He needs 14 catches over the next two weeks to equal his career-high and franchise record of 101 receptions set in 2001.

PATRIOTS AND JETS SERIES RESULTS

SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots and Jets will meet this Sunday for the second time this season and the 86th time in the series. The Patriots have a 38-46-1 overall record against the Jets, including a current two-game winning streak. New England will be going for their first seasonal sweep of the Jets since 1996, following their 44-7 victory earlier this season.

The two teams have met once in the playoffs, following the 1985 season. The Patriots defeated the Jets 26-14 in the AFC wildcard game at The Meadowlands on their way to Super Bowl XX.

PATRIOTS IN PRIME TIME

This week's game against New York Jets will be the Patriots second consecutive prime time game and their sixth nationally televised game of the season. They have a 3-2 record in their five previous nationally televised games, including a 24-7 loss to the Titans on Monday Night Football. New England will appear in a total of six nationally televised games this season, a single-season franchise record. Their previous high of five was set in 1998.

THE LAST TIME, PATRIOTS 44, JETS 7

The Patriots defeated the N.Y. Jets, 44-7, at the Meadowlands on Sept. 15. The Patriots offense totaled 432 yards while their defense limited the Jets to only 200 yards. The 37-point victory was the second largest by the Patriots in the series and their seventh largest in franchise history. The Patriots scored 34 points in the second half en route for their second straight win versus the Jets. In usual Patriots style, the offense and defense contributed to the scoring as the Patriots offense scored four touchdowns and the defense scored two.

New England quarterback Tom Brady passed for two touchdowns (Cam Cleeland and Deion Branch), Kevin Faulk rushed for one and the defense added two scores. Patriots safety Tebucky Jones sacked Jets quarterback Vinny Testaverde on the third play of the second half, forced him to fumble and he picked up the loose ball and returned it 24 yards for the touchdown. Another Patriots safety, former Jet Victor Green, intercepted a pass and returned it 90 yards for a touchdown later in the third quarter.



GAME RECAP - TITANS 24, PATRIOTS 7

GAME RECAP

The Patriots dropped to 8-6 with a 24-7 loss to the Tennessee Titans at The Coliseum in Nashville on Monday Night Football. Tennessee quarterback Steve McNair ran in a pair of touchdowns, while running back Eddie George broke the 100-yard plateau to pace the 9-5 Titans. For New England, Troy Brown set the tone for the offense, snaring eight passes for 73 yards and becoming the first Patriot to record three 80-catch seasons. Antowain Smith rumbled for 72 total yards from scrimmage, while Ted Johnson and Lawyer Milloy paced the defense with 12 and 11 tackles respectively. Tom Brady ran the ball into the end zone from 10 yards out for the first rushing touchdown of his career, but the Patriots could not come up with enough firepower to take down the Titans.

The first quarter ended with neither team breaking onto the scoreboard, as both clubs failed to convert in the other team's territory. Tennessee drove deep into the Patriots end, but Joe Nedney missed a 45-yard field goal. The Patriots came up with a pair of first down catches by David Patten and Brown in the quarter, but could not get into striking distance.

The Titans got on the board in the second quarter, putting up two touchdowns on two 12-play drives to take a 14-0 lead into the intermission. To open the scoring, McNair called his own number and ran the ball in from 11 yards out to put the Titans ahead by seven with 2:36 gone in the quarter. The Patriots came close to breaking out of their shell when Terrell Buckley picked off a McNair pass at midfield, but a fumble on the interception return put the ball back in the Titans hands. Tennessee converted their opportunity and extended the drive, eventually adding another touchdown on a 1-yard plunge by McNair with 37 seconds left to take a 14-0 lead into the break.

As the second half began, New England wasted no time in chipping into the Titans lead, driving down the field on their first possession to cut the gap to 14-7 on a 10-yard touchdown run by Brady. The Patriots were aided by two key penalties on the drive, a 15-yard roughing the passer call and a pass interference penalty drawn by Patten that netted another 15-yard gain. Brady completed two passes to Brown on the drive, netting a total of 23 yards. At the 10-yard line, Brady called an audible and ran up the middle untouched for the first rushing touchdown of his career. The New England defense came up with a stop, forcing the Titans to punt and they regained control on the 11-yard line. However, the Titans defense came alive to put more points on the board for Tennessee. A Brady pass bounced off the hands of Patten and into the waiting arms of Tennessee's Rich Coady, who ran the ball back 24 yards for a touchdown that put the Titans ahead 21-7 with 10:06 left in the guarter. The teams then exchanged punts as the third guarter ended with the Titans in control.

The Patriots defense bore down in the final stanza, allowing just a 28-yard field goal by Nedney, but the offense could not kick into high gear as Tennessee protected its lead and held on for a 24-7 victory.

MAGIC NUMBER = 21

The Patriots magic number this season has been 21. The Patriots have won all seven games when they have scored 21 points or more and are 1-5 when they don't.

MISSED FIELD GOALS

Titans kicker Joe Nedney missed his 45-yard field goal attempt against the Patriots last week. It was the 13th missed field goal attempt against the Patriots this season (including three blocked field goals), the highest total in the NFL. The Cowboys have had the second most kicks missed against them this season, 11.

SCORING FIRST

The Titans were just the fifth team all season to score before the Patriots scored this season. The Patriots are 2-3 when their opponent has scores first.

COIN TOSS

The Patriots lost the opening coin toss for just the third time all season and two have been on Monday Night Football (Pittsburgh 9/9/02). The Patriots are 2-1 in those games.

TOM BRADY

His 10-yard rush for a touchdown in the third quarter was the first regular season touchdown run of his career. The last Patriot quarterback to rush for a touchdown was Drew Bledsoe who scrambled 1-yard for a score at Indianapolis (10/22/00).

HAPPY RETURNS

Kevin Faulk's 35-yard kickoff return just before the half was the fourth longest return by the Patriots this season. Faulk owns the longest return of the season, an 86-yard touchdown return at Oakland (11/17/02).

Faulk is tied with Christian Fauria for second on the team with six touchdowns this season (two rushing, three receiving and one kickoff return). He was the first of two players in the NFL this season to score touchdowns rushing, receiving and on returns (Dennis Northcutt). He's also the first Patriot since Irving Fryar to accomplish the triple play: Fryar had one rushing, seven receiving and two punt return touchdowns in 1985.

Faulk became the Patriots all-time kickoff return leader earlier this season against Green Bay (10/13). He moved ahead of David Meggett (2,561 yards). He currently has 2,822 career kick return yards on 125 returns.

FIRST QUARTER

The Patriots and the Titans were scoreless after the first quarter. For the Patriots, it was the first time in five weeks that they had been shut out in the opening quarter (Nov. 10 at Chicago). Last week, the Patriots scored a season-high 17 first quarter points against the Bills (12/8/02). Defensively, the Patriots have allowed just 36 first quarter points all season and just six points in the first quarter in their last seven games.

The Patriots were held scoreless in the first half for just the second time this season. The first was at Miami on Oct. 6. The Patriots scored 13 second-half points in a 26-13 loss.

THIRD DOWN

The Patriots rank fourth in the AFC and sixth in the NFL with a third down conversion rate of 43.3 percent. The Patriots have already recorded three games with a third down conversion rate of 60% or higher this season (all victories). In their eight victories this season, the Patriots have converted 48.7% of their third downs (56-115). Conversely, in their six losses this season, they have only converted 34.7 percent (25-72). In their 24-7 loss against the Titans, New England recorded it's lowest conversion rate of the season (2-11, 18%).

TED JOHNSON

Johnson led the team in tackles for the second consecutive week with 12 tackles. It was his second highest tackle total of the season (13, vs. Kansas City). He now ranks third on the team with 78 tackles (49 solos).

TROY BROWN

Brown led all Patriots receivers with eight catches last week against the Titans. He has led the team in receptions in 10 of the 12 games he has played in this year. Brown has also led the team or was tied for the team lead in receptions in 24 of the 28 games he has played in over the past two seasons. He has recorded three double-digit catch performances this season, including 10 catches for 111 yards against the Lions on Thanksgiving. It was also his second 100-yard receiving game of the season and the 13th of his

Brown leads the Patriots with 87 receptions for 815 yards (9.4 avg.) and two touchdowns, despite missing two games with an injury. Brown set a Patriots franchise record with 16 catches against the Chiefs on Sept. 22, 2002. His previous high was also set against Kansas City when he was credited with 12 receptions for 119 yards and a touchdown on Dec. 4, 2000. He also gained a single-game career-high 176 yards.

SINGLE SEASON HIGHS

On his first catch of the game last week, an 8-yard reception, Troy Brown became just the first Patriot in franchise history to record three seasons with 80 or more receptions (2000, 2001, 2002). He completed the game with eight catches and increased his season total to 87, the fourth-highest single-season total in club history. Brown established the Patriots single-season reception record with 101 in 2001.

- 2. Head-to-head sweep (apply only if one club has defeated each of the others or one club has lost to each of the others.)

When the first Wild Card team has been identified, the procedure is repeated to name the second Wild Card (i.e., eliminate all but the highest ranked club in each division prior to proceeding to Step 2.) In situations where three teams from the same division are involved in the procedure, the original seeding of the teams remains the same for subsequent applications of the tie-breaker if the top-ranked team in that division qualifies for a Wild Card berth.
