NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (13-2) vs. BUFFALO BILLS (6-9)

Saturday, Dec. 27, 2003 ★ Gillette Stadium (68,436) ★ 1:30 p.m.

The Patriots will close out the 2003 regular season this Saturday against Buffalo, the same team they opened against 111 days earlier. New England has come a long way since beginning its season with a loss to the Bills, winning 13 of their 14 games since then, including a franchise-record 11 games in a row. In the process, the Patriots have claimed their second AFC East crown in three seasons and have shown a flair for the dramatic, becoming the first team in NFL history to win 10 or more consecutive games all by 14 points or fewer. New England is 7-0 at Gillette Stadium and will bid to end the season undefeated at home for the first time in team history. But the Patriots' prior successes can be put aside for now, as their season-finishing clash deserves the spotlight on its own.

The symmetry of the schedule affords the Patriots the chance to avenge their season-opening defeat and try to end the regular season with a performance that can contrast their showing in September. Adding to the intensity is the return to Foxborough of former Patriots Lawyer Milloy and Drew Bledsoe, with Milloy making his first trip back to Foxborough as a member of the Bills. The Patriots will face a significant hurdle in Buffalo's defense, a unit ranked second in the NFL. With a sellout home crowd prepping for the playoffs and significant storylines surrounding the game, the Patriots' season finale promises to be another memorable chapter in what has already been a most memorable season in Foxborough.

TELEVISION: This week's game will be televised by CBS. The game can be seen locally on WBZ-TV Channel 4 in Boston. **Dick Enberg** will handle the play-by-play duties and **Dan Dierdorf** will provide analysis. **Bonnie Bernstein** will deliver reports from the sidelines throughout the game. Immediately following the game, the Fifth Quarter postgame show can be seen on WSBK-TV Channel 38 in Boston.

RADIO: WBCN 104.1 FM is the flagship station for the Patriots Rock Radio Network. Play-by-play broadcaster **Gil Santos** is in his 27th season as the voice of the Patriots and calls the action along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**. In 2003, Santos and Cappelletti celebrate their 20th season as a broadcast tandem.

SETTING THE MARK

In 2003, the Patriots have experienced the most regular-season success in team history. The 2003 squad is the first team in franchise history to win 13 regular-season games, besting the previous club mark of 11 wins (accomplished six times, most recently in 2001). New England has established the best 15-game record in franchise history with a 13-2 start to the 2003 season. The Patriots' previous best 15-game start was in 1978 when they held an 11-4 record after 15 games.

ELEVEN TAKES THE RECORD

The Patriots have won 11 games in a row, setting a franchise record for consecutive regular-season victories. New England owns the longest winning streak in the NFL since 1999, when Jacksonville and Indianapolis each won 11 in a row. All 11 of the Patriots' wins have been by 14 points or less, making the Patriots the first team in NFL history to win 11 consecutive games by two touchdowns or fewer. This week, the Patriots will try to become just the 10th team in NFL history to win 12 or more consecutive regular-season games.

PLAYOFF SCENARIOS

The Patriots have clinched the AFC East title and a first-round bye. They will host an AFC Divisional Playoff game the weekend of January 10-11 at Gillette Stadium. This season marks the third time the Patriots have earned a first-round playoff bye since the NFL Playoffs expanded to 12 teams in 1990. Both of the previous times the Patriots have earned a first-round bye (2001 and 1996), they have advanced to the Super Bowl. If the Patriots win this week, or if Kansas City loses, New England would earn the top seed in the AFC.

- New England can clinch homefield advantage throughout the playoffs with a win OR a Kansas City loss.
- If the Patriots lose AND the Chiefs win, KC would get homefield advantage.





THIS WEEK: PATRIOTS VS. BILLS

This week, the Patriots and Bills will meet for the 88th time since the series between the AFC East rivals began in 1960. The Patriots lead the series 46-40, with one tie. The Patriots' 46 wins over Buffalo are their most over any opponent, six more than they own over Indianapolis (40). New England has won

four of its last five games against Buffalo, dating



back to the 2000 season. The teams have had many memorable matchups over the years, including a five-game span from 1999 to 2001 where four of the five contests were decided in overtime. The Patriots have won in Foxborough two years in a row and six times in the last eight seasons.

THE LAST TIME

Bills 31, Patriots 0 - September 7, 2003

The Patriots began the 2003 season on a sour note by suffering a 31-0 loss to the Buffalo Bills in Orchard Park, N.Y. The Bills controlled the ball for 14-and-a-half minutes in the game's first 16:38, allowing them to build a 14-0 lead. The Patriots were never able to dig out of their early hole despite driving into Buffalo territory five times in their six second half drives. The Bills defense consistently came up with big plays that frustrated New England every time it tried to counter-punch.

Buffalo began the contest with a 9-play, 80-yard drive that ended in a 1-yard touchdown plunge by Travis Henry, putting the Bills in front with 5:02 gone in the game. After the Bills defense forced the Patriots to punt, Buffalo put together a lengthy drive, controlling the ball for 9:28 on a 15-play, 90-yard drive. By the time Buffalo took a 14-0 lead on a 7-yard touchdown pass from Drew Bledsoe to tight end Dave Moore, Buffalo had controlled the ball for 14:30, while the Patriots had possession for just 2:08.

The Bills pulled further ahead in the second quarter after the teams exchanged three-and-outs. Defensive tackle Sam Adams intercepted a Tom Brady pass and rumbled 37 yards for a touchdown that put Buffalo in front 21-0 with 19:46 gone in the game.

PATRIOTS – BILLS QUICK HITS

- The Patriots have 46 wins against the Bills, their most against any opponent.
- Bill Belichick holds a 5-3 career record against Buffalo, including a 5-2 record as head coach of the Patriots.
- Six of the last 11 games in the series have been decided by four points or less (NE 3-3).
- Four of the last eight games in the series have been decided in overtime (NE 2-2).
- The Patriots and Bills have played in 19 games decided by three points or less since 1972.
- The Patriots are 12-6 against the Bills in their last 18
- Since 1993, the two teams have played five overtime games, good for a total of 51:49 of extra time, almost equaling an entire game.

CONNECTIONS

- Patriots head coach Bill Belichick's defensive game plan from the Giants' Super Bowl XXV win over the Buffalo Bills is permanently on display at the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
- While Belichick was the head coach at Cleveland, he hired Don Blackmon as the linebackers coach. Blackmon is currently the linebackers coach for Buffalo. Blackmon also played for the Patriots for eight seasons (1981-87).
- Patriots running back Antowain Smith was originally drafted by the Bills in the first round (23rd overall) of the 1997 NFL Draft. Smith spent four seasons with the Bills (1997-2000) and gained 2,932 yards on 760 carries and scored 26 touchdowns.
- Patriots wide receivers coach Brian Daboll attended St. Francis High in Buffalo where he lettered in football. He also was a two-year starter at free safety at the University of Rochester, where he recorded three interceptions in one game during his senior year.
- Patriots fullback Larry Centers played for the Bills from 2001-02, and had 123 catches for 1,008 yards with Buffalo.
- Patriots nose tackle **Ted Washington** played for the Bills from 1995-2000 and earned three Pro Bowl nods in a Buffalo uniform.
- Patriots running back **Kevin Faulk** had a career-long, 45-yard touchdown run against the Bills on New England's first possession of the third quarter in a 38-7 win (11/03/02).
- Patriots safety Rodney Harrison, while playing for the Chargers, had a career-high three sacks in a 16-14 win over Buffalo in the 1998 season opener (9/6/98).
- Patriots linebacker **Ted Johnson** recorded a career-high 17 tackles against Buffalo on Nov. 15, 1998.
- Bills offensive coordinator Kevin Gilbride was born in New Haven, Conn., and earned a degree in physical education at Southern Connecticut State University. Gilbride was a linebackers coach at Tufts University (1976-77) and a head coach at Southern Connecticut (1980-84).
- Bills running backs coach Les Steckel served as the Patriots quarterbacks/wide receivers coach for four seasons (1985-88).
- Bills defensive tackle Sam Adams' father, Sam Adams, Sr., played guard for the Patriots for nine seasons (1972-80).
- Bills quarterback **Drew Bledsoe** was drafted by the Patriots with the first overall selection in the 1993 NFL draft. He spent nine seasons with New England and earned three Pro Bowl selections.
- Bills safety Lawyer Milloy was drafted by the Patriots in the second round (36th overall) in the 1996 NFL draft. He played in 112 games in eight seasons in New England and earned four Pro Bowl nods.
- Bills fullback Sam Gash was the Patriots eighth round selection (205th overall) in the 1992 NFL draft. Gash appeared in 88 contests as a Patriot, including 36 starts.
- Bills wide receiver Josh Reed was teammates with Patriots defensive end Jarvis Green and quarterback Rohan Davey at LSU.

FAMILIAR FOE

Bills quarterback Drew Bledsoe played in 124 games while he was a member of the New England Patriots from 1993-2001. He holds the Patriots franchise records for passing yards (29,657), attempts (4,518), and completions (2,544). Bledsoe ranks second on the franchise list in touchdowns (166).

THE HEAD COACHES

BILL BELICHICK

Bill Belichick is celebrating his 29th consecutive season as an NFL coach and



has spent more consecutive seasons in the league than any other current head coach. He has been a part of three Super Bowl championship teams, including the memorable victory in Super Bowl XXXVI that brought the Patriots their first title in franchise history. Belichick has ensured that the spark of the Super Bowl season ignited a run of success that will last well into the future. Since Oct. 14, 2001, the Patriots have blossomed, rattling off 35 wins in their last 46 games and making Belichick the winningest NFL Head Coach since Week Four of the 2001 season. In 2003, Belichick has led the Patriots to their second AFC East title in his fourth season with the team. His overall record of 41-25 (including a 3-0 playoff mark) gives him the best winning percentage of any head coach in Patriots history.

GREGG WILLIAMS

Gregg Williams is in his third season as the head coach of the Buffalo Bills and



was named the 12th head coach in team history on Feb. 1, 2001. Williams presided over a five-win improvement between the 2001 and 2002 seasons, matching the biggest one-year turnaround in franchise history. In 2003, Williams' Bills boast the top-ranked defense in the AFC and the second-ranked defensive unit in the NFL. Williams came to the Bills after spending 11 seasons with the Tennessee Titans/Houston Oilers organization from 1990-2000. The last four seasons of his tenure in Tennessee were spent as the team's defensive coordinator. Under his leadership in 2000, the Titans led the NFL in total defense for the first time in team history. In 1999, Williams' defense was part of a team that represented the AFC in the Super Bowl. Prior to becoming the defensive coordinator, Williams was the Houston Oilers' linebackers coach (1994-96), the team's special teams coach (1993) and the club's quality control coach (1990-92).

PASSING PERFORMANCES

Tom Brady is slated to start against Buffalo for the sixth time in his career. The Patriots' signal caller recorded the second-highest passer rating of his career against the Bills on Nov. 3, 2002 (147.6). Bills signal caller Drew Bledsoe will start against his former team for the fourth time.

BIG MAC ATTACK

Willie McGinest picked off a Chad Pennington pass and returned it 15 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter to give New England a 14-7 lead. It was the third interception of McGinest's career and his second returned for a touchdown (46 yards vs. Buffalo, 10/27/96). McGinest now has four touchdowns in his career (two interception returns, two fumble returns). McGinest also sacked Chad Pennington in the fourth quarter, giving him 5.5 sacks this season and 62.5 for his career (fourth on the Patriots' all-time list).

DEFENSIVE SCORING

Willie McGinest's interception returned for a touchdown was the fifth pick the Patriots have returned for a score this season, tying a team record set in 2001. New England has a total of six defensive touchdowns this season, leading the NFL.

QUICK STRIKE

Tom Brady hit David Givens for a 35-yard touchdown on the Patriots' first offensive play of the game, right after Tedy Bruschi's interception on the Jets' second offensive play of the game. It marks the second consecutive game the Patriots have scored a touchdown on their first offensive possession. Prior to last week's game against Jacksonville, the last time the Patriots scored a touchdown on their opening drive was against Minnesota on Nov. 24, 2002.

GIVENS GRABS TDs

David Givens caught a career-high two touchdown passes, giving him a team-leading five receiving touchdowns this season. Givens is tied with Michael Cloud for the team lead with five total touchdowns. Givens is the second Patriot receiver to catch two touchdowns in a game this season, joining Christian Fauria's two-touchdown performance on Sept. 14, 2003.

FULL TILT, FULL TIME

Tedy Bruschi set a career-high with his third interception of the season when he picked off Chad Pennington's second pass of the game. The pick broke Bruschi's NFL-record string of four consecutive interceptions returned for a touchdown. The last time Bruschi picked off a pass and did not return it for a touchdown was on Nov. 18, 2001, against the St. Louis Rams, when he intercepted a Kurt Warner pass and returned it four yards. Bruschi now has eight career interceptions and has returned four of them for touchdowns.

LAW AND ORDER

Ty Law grabbed his sixth interception of the season, tying him with Tyrone Poole for the team lead. It was the 35th interception of Law's career and he now needs one more pick to tie Raymond Clayborn's all-time franchise mark (36 picks). Law set a single-season career high in 1998 with nine interceptions.

RECORD SUCCESS

With their 21-16 win over the Jets, the Patriots are...

- 28-2 under Bill Belichick when scoring 21 points or more
- 24-4 after Nov. 1 since 2001
- 13-3 in their last 16 games against AFC East teams.

ABLE VRABEL

Mike Vrabel sacked Chad Pennington twice, marking his fourth multiple-sack game of the season and giving him a career-high and team-leading 9.5 sacks. He dropped Pennington for a 7-yard loss at the Jets' 6-yard line late in the first quarter, then forced him to fumble on a one-yard sack in the third quarter (the Jets recovered the ball). Vrabel's 9.5 sacks are the highest sack total for any Patriot in the Bill Belichick era. The last time a Patriot had 9.5 or more sacks in a season was in 1996, when Willie McGinest also notched 9.5 sacks.

MOVING ON UP

Tom Brady passed the 10,000-yard mark for his career with an 18-yard completion to Deion Branch in the third quarter. Brady is the fifth Patriots passer to reach the 10,000-yard milestone (Bledsoe, Grogan, Parilli, Eason). Brady also passed Jim Plunkett to move into fifth place on the Patriots' all-time passing yardage list. Brady's 7-yard completion to Troy Brown in the second quarter gave him 9,934 yards for his career, passing Plunkett's mark of 9,932 yards.

HUNDRED-YARD DAY

Antowain Smith ran for 121 yards on 18 carries, recording the 13th 100-yard game of his career. It is the first time the Patriots have had a 100-yard rusher in 22 games. The last time a Patriot ran for more than 100 yards was on Nov. 3, 2002, when Smith ran for 111 yards at Buffalo.

TURNING OVER WINS

With their five interceptions off of Chad Pennington, the Patriots have now recorded 37 takeaways this season. It's the highest number of takeaways by a Patriots team since 1994 (40 takeaways).

PICK PARTY

The Patriots recorded five interceptions off of Chad Pennington. It is the second time this season the Patriots have recorded four or more interceptions in a game, with both games coming against New York teams. New England recorded four picks against Kerry Collins of the New York Giants on Oct. 12, 2003. After Eugene Wilson's fourth-quarter pick, the Patriots have 27 interceptions this season, the most by any Patriots team since 1964 and the third-most in team history (31 in 1964 and 29 in 1963).

HOT WHEN IT'S COLD

At kickoff tonight, the temperature was 30 degrees with a 20degree wind chill. Since 1993, the Patriots are now 14-2 when the kickoff temperature is below 35 degrees. This was the third consecutive game the Patriots have played in below-freezing temperatures (25 degrees vs. Jacksonville and 28 degrees vs. Miami).

The Patriots have done a remarkable job of finishing strong over the past two-plus seasons, as they have compiled a 24-4 (.857) record after November 1 since the 2001 season. In 2001, the Patriots hit their groove as the calendar turned to the 11th month, winning 11 of their last 12 games en route to the Super Bowl XXXVI title.

POLITING START

Through 15 games, the Patriots have used almost enough different starters to field two full teams of offense and defense. New England has used 42 different starters through its first 15 games and has clinched the AFC East title with a 13-2 record. Players who have started for the Patriots have missed a total of 98 games because of injuries, and five opening day starters are now on injured reserve. New England has used a different combination of 22 starters in each game and has only been able to start the same offensive lineup in consecutive games on one occasion (Weeks 12-13). On defense, the Patriots have used 10 different combinations in their 15 games. Despite the changing lineups, the Patriots and their coaching staff have seamlessly made transitions with multiple starters out of the lineup, winning 11 games in a row and 13 of their last 14 games.

TEAM NEWS AND NOTES

BELICHICK'S PATRIOTS RENAISSANCE

Patriots Head Coach Bill Belichick was facing one of the biggest challenges of his coaching career on Oct. 14, 2001. Going into a game against the San Diego Chargers at Foxboro Stadium, the coach was faced with a 1-3 record, a young quarterback and a team that few people expected would eventually hoist the Lombardi Trophy less than four months later. The Patriots rebounded from a 10-point deficit and won that day, topping San Diego 29-26 in overtime and igniting a run that took New England to the top of the NFL world in winning Super Bowl XXXVI. The victory came near the beginning of a run that has seen Belichick compile the best record of any NFL head coach since the beginning of the 2001 season, leading his team to wins in 36 of its last 50 games. The remarkable run includes postseason play, where Belichick and the Patriots own a perfect 3-0 record.

TURNING OVER WINS

The Patriots are 10-0 this season when they record a positive or even turnover ratio, and are 3-2 when they have a negative turnover ratio. Since the beginning of the 2001 season, the Patriots are 22-2 when they record a positive turnover differential. New England notched a +5 turnover differential in its Week Six win over the New York Giants. It was their greatest turnover advantage since they also came out ahead by five turnovers in a 27-17 win over Buffalo (12/08/02). New England ranks second in the NFL with a +14 turnover differential this season.

RISING TO THE OCCASION

The Patriots are 7-0 this season against teams that currently have winning records, showing their ability to beat the NFL's top teams. New England has tied the 1969 Minnesota Vikings for the best record in NFL history against teams above .500. In 2002, the Patriots allowed their opponents to convert on third down 43 percent of the time. So far this season, the Patriots have held their opponents to less than a 30 percent third-down conversion rate on six separate occasions and have won five of the six games, including a 12-0 shutout win over Miami to clinch the AFC East title. CLINCHING DIVISION AT HOME

This season marks the second time the Patriots have clinched a division title at home and the first time since 1978. Out of their six previous division titles, the Patriots clinched just one at home. On Dec. 10, 1978, New England defeated the Buffalo Bills, 26-24, at Schaefer Stadium to claim just the second division title in franchise history and the team's first crown since the AFL-NFL merger. On a frigid 28-degree afternoon with off-and-on snow, New England came back from a 24-21 fourth-quarter deficit to clinch the division on a 21-yard field goal by David Posey with eight seconds left in the game. The Patriots' five other division titles have all been clinched on the road, in the final game of the season.

PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have now qualified for the playoffs 12 times in their 44-year history, including six times in the 10 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994. New England has won seven division crowns and has qualified as a Wild Card team on four occasions (1998, 1994, 1985 and 1976). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 as part of a 16-team tournament following a players' strike.

DEFENSE NEWS AND NOTES

SOLID SECONDARY

The Patriots overhauled their secondary in 2003 and the move has paid clear dividends across the board. New England leads the NFL in opponents' passer rating (56.9) and is tied for the NFL lead in interceptions (27) and fewest touchdown passes allowed (11). The Patriots lead the AFC in opponents' completion percentage (53.0) and opponents' points per game (15.9). Of New England's top five defensive backs, four were not with the team in 2002. Ty Law is once again leading the secondary with another solid season, and has been joined by free agents Rodney Harrison and Tyrone Poole, along with rookies Eugene Wilson and Asante Samuel to shut down opposing passing attacks in impressive fashion.

The Patriots have held five opposing quarterbacks to their lowest passer rating of the season. HOME FIELD DEFENSE

The Patriots defense was practically impenetrable in a span of three home games this season. The Patriots gave up a total of just three points at Gillette Stadium Between Oct. 26 and Dec. 7. New England did not give up a TD at home for four straight games. They went three home games without allowing a TD in 1993.

TEDY BRUSCHI: FULL TILT, FULL TIME

TEDY BRUSCHI is the first player in NFL history to return four consecutive interceptions for touchdowns. He had his touchdown streak snapped on Dec. 20, 2003, when he picked off a pass against the Jets and did not reach the end zone. The first three touchdowns of Bruschi's streak came in a span of five games in which he played. Bruschi ranks second on



the Patriots all-time list with four career picks brought back for touchdowns. Teammate Ty Law holds the club record with six interceptions returned to the end zone. Bruschi's four interception returns are listed below.

KEVIN FAULK leads the Patriots with 1,052 total yards from scrimmage. The fifth-year pro from LSU leads the Patriots with 169 carries and ranks second on the club with 48 receptions. He is on track to have the most productive offensive season of his career, with his contributions in the running game and receiving game projected to set a career high in yards from scrimmage. GIVENS' STOCK IS RISING

Second-year wide receiver DAVID GIVENS is one of New England's most improved players. The seventh-round pick has emerged as a serious threat in the Patriots offense, leading the team with five touchdown receptions. He has made the most of his catches, with eight of his 27 grabs going for 20 yards or more. He set a career high with two touchdown grabs in Week 16 against the Jets. Two of Givens' other touchdowns have proven to be game-turning plays. Against Miami in Week Seven, he acrobatically hauled in a 24-yard touchdown to tie the score at 13 late in the third quarter of a 19-13 overtime win. Two weeks later in Denver, Givens grabbed a game-winning, 18-yard touchdown with 30 seconds left to give New England a 30-26 win on Monday Night Football.

TAKING AIM

ADAM VINATIERI is the most accurate kicker in franchise history and is the seventh most accurate kicker in NFL history. He has recorded an 80.8 percent conversion rate (211/261) over his eightvear career. So far this season, Vinatieri has hit 78.1 percent of his kicks (25/32). He has made 58 of his last 69 kicks, good for an 84.1 percent clip.

ADAM VINATIERI is the second leading scorer in Patriots history, totaling 910 points in his eighth year with the club. SOLID DOWN THE STRETCH

Tom Brady has compiled a 24-4 (.857) career record as a starter in games played after November 1. The streak includes the Patriots' 2001 playoff run. So far this year, Brady has led the team to wins in all seven of his starts since the beginning of November. Last season, Brady and the Patriots were 6-3 in the final two months of the season, rebounding from a 3-4 start to finish with a 9-7 record. In 2001, Brady led the team to an 11-1 record after November 1 as the team marched to a victory in Super Bowl XXXVI.

COMEBACK KID

TOM BRADY has engineered 13 game-winning drives to break a tie or take the lead in the fourth quarter or overtime in his career. He has accomplished the feat five times this season, all on the road. Brady's most recent game-winning drive came against the Indianapolis Colts in Week 13, breaking a 31-31 tie with a 4-play, 31-yard drive that ended in a 13-yard touchdown pass to Deion Branch that gave New England a 38-34 win. This season, Brady has also led comebacks against Houston, Tennessee, Miami and Denver. In 2002, Brady led three comebacks from a tie or deficit. Brady's record includes his dramatic performance to lead the Patriots to victory in Super Bowl XXXVI and his memorable performance in the snow against the Oakland Raiders in the 2001 Divisional Playoffs.
