The 2005 AFC East Champion New England Patriots will travel to Denver on Saturday night to face the Broncos with a berth in the AFC Championship Game on the line. Denver, the AFC West champions and the bearer of the second seed in the AFC playoffs, is coming off of a first-round playoff bye and won eight of its last nine regular season games. New England has won seven of its last nine games, including a 28-3 victory over the Jacksonville Jaguars in last week's Wild Card Round, the Patriots' NFL-record 10th consecutive playoff win. This week's game is a rematch of an Oct. 16 battle won by Denver, 28-20.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience by CBS and can be seen in Boston on WBZ Channel 4. **Jim Nantz** will handle play-by-play duties and will be joined by analyst **Phil Simms. Bonnie Bernstein** will report from the sidelines.

RADIO: WBCN 104.1 FM is the flagship station for the Patriots Rock Radio Network. A complete listing of the network's 36 stations can be found in this press release. Play-by-play broadcaster **Gil Santos** is in his 29th season as the voice of the Patriots and will call the action along with Patriots Hall of Famer **Gino Cappelletti**. Santos and Cappelletti are celebrating their 22nd season as a broadcast tandem.

RULERS OF THE REMATCH

Since 2001, the Patriots are 18-3 (.857) when playing a team for the second time in a season and are 6-0 when facing an opponent against whom they had suffered a loss earlier in the same season. New England dropped a 28-20 decision in Denver on Oct. 16, and will have a rematch with the Broncos this week. The Patriots have outscored their opponents 516-315 in their 21 rematches since 2001.

PLAYOFF WINNING STREAK

The Patriots have won an all-time NFL record 10 consecutive playoff games and have surpassed the previous record of nine, held by the 1960s Green Bay Packers teams coached by Vince Lombardi. The Patriots have not lost a playoff game since Jan. 3, 1999, when they dropped a 25-10 decision to the Jacksonville Jaguars, in a Wild Card Weekend game in Jacksonville. Since then, the Patriots have gone 10-0 in the playoffs and have won Super Bowls XXXVI, XXXVIII and XXXIX.

PATRIOTS VS. BRONCOS

SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots and Broncos will meet for the second time this season and for the second time in the teams' playoff history. The game is a rematch of a Week Six clash, which the Broncos won 28-20 in Denver. Despite the limited playoff meetings between the teams, the non-divisional foes are quite familiar with each other, with this week's game serving as the 40th overall meeting between the clubs in a



series that dates back to 1960. New England and Denver will meet for the 11th time in the last 11 seasons, with Denver holding a 7-3 edge in the previous 10 games. The teams have split the last six



meetings dating back to 1999. The history between the teams dates back to the first days of the American Football League in 1960. The Patriots played the Broncos in the inaugural game of each franchise, a 13-10 Denver win on Sept. 9, 1960 at B.U. Field. The teams squared off twice a year in the decade prior to the AFL-NFL merger, with the Patriots taking a 10-7 advantage out of those games.

The Patriots fell to 3-3 on the season, dropping a 28-20 decision to the Broncos in Denver. New England scored 17 unanswered points in the second half, but the comeback bid was not enough to rebound from a 28-3 third-quarter deficit.

New England got on the board first with a 39-yard field goal from Adam Vinatieri, making the score 3-0. But the Broncos then proceeded to roll off 28 consecutive points over exactly 17 minutes of clock time. Denver's first score came with 12:36 remaining in the second quarter, and by the time the clock read 10:36 left in the third quarter, the Broncos had built a 28-3 lead.

True to its character, New England did not see the 25-point deficit as an insurmountable one, and began a spirited comeback bid that fell just short. Vinatieri got the Patriots back on the scoreboard with a 38-vard field goal with 5:53 left in the third quarter to make the score 28-6. After New England's defense forced a three-and-out from the Broncos to keep the momentum on the Patriots' side, Tom Brady engineered a 9-play, 73-yard drive that ended in an 8-yard touchdown run by Patrick Pass on the first play of the fourth quarter, making the score 28-13. The Patriots defense forced another Denver punt and the offense proceeded to continue the comeback with a 7-play, 71-yard drive that ended in a 8-yard scoring pass from Brady to Givens that made it a one-score game, 28-20. The Patriots defense forced yet another punt, giving New England possession at its own 8-yard line with 5:02 left in the game, but an intentional grounding penalty slowed the Patriots momentum and forced a punt. Denver was able to run out the clock on the ensuing possession, thwarting the Patriots comeback bid.

PATRIOTS VS. BRONCOS

PASSING PERFORMANCES

The Patriots have compiled a 1-3 record against the Denver Broncos in games that Tom Brady has started. The Broncos are one of just four teams against which Brady has a losing record. The others are Washington (0-1), Green Bay (0-1) and San Diego (1-2). Brady owns a record of .500 or better against 27 of the 31 NFL teams.

SOLID DOWN THE STRETCH

Over the last four seasons, the Patriots have stepped things up a notch as the calendar has flipped to November. Since 2001, New England has done a remarkable job of finishing the season strong, compiling a 46-8 (.852) record after Nov. 1, including playoff games. In fact, since the 2003 season, the Patriots are 29-4 (.879) in games played in November or later, and New England has won 30 of its last 34 games post-Nov. 1. Their record in such games is the best in the NFL since 2001. Additionally, since 2001, the Patriots are 32-5 (.865) in games played after Thanksgiving Day.

CONNECTIONS

- Patriots head coach **Bill Belichick** was an assistant special teams coach and an assistant to the defensive coordinator for the Denver Broncos in 1978. While Belichick was the head coach of the Cleveland Browns he hired **Jacob Burney** as a defensive line coach. Burney is currently the defensive line/ends coach for the Broncos.
- Patriots tight end **Daniel Graham** was raised in Denver. His father, Tom, played three seasons for the Broncos. Graham played his high school football at Thomas Jefferson High in Denver and played his college football for the University of Colorado in Boulder, Colo.
- Patriots tackle **Tom Ashworth** was born in Denver and played football and baseball at Cherry Creek High in Englewood, Colo., a suburb of Denver. He played his college football at the University of Colorado.
- Patriots linebacker Chad Brown was a four-year starter at the University of Colorado, where he was a two-time firstteam All-Big Eight Conference selection. Brown and his family have a permanent home in Lone Tree, Colo., a suburb just south of Denver.
- Patriots tight end Christian Fauria played at the University of Colorado, where he had 98 receptions, 1,058 yards and 12 touchdowns and was team captain as a senior. He set the Big Eight conference record for career receptions by a tight end.
- Broncos wide receiver David Terrell was with the Patriots for 2005 training camp and was a teammate of Patriots quarterback Tom Brady at the University of Michigan in 1998 and 1999.
- Broncos center **Tom Nalen** was born in Foxborough, Mass., attended Foxboro High and attended Boston College.
- Patriots quarterback **Tom Brady** and Broncos linebacker **Ian Gold** were four-year teammates at the University of Michigan.
- Patriots defensive end Richard Seymour, Patriots tight end Benjamin Watson and Patriots fullback Patrick Pass were all teammates of Broncos tackle George Foster at the University of Georgia.
- Patriots linebacker Willie McGinest and Broncos safety Marques Anderson both attended Long Beach Polytechnic High School in Long Beach, Calif.
- Patriots assistant secondary coach Joel Collier's father, Joe Collier, was an assistant coach for the Broncos for 20 seasons from 1969-1988. Joel Collier served as a ballboy for the Broncos while growing up and went on to attend Northern Colorado University, where he was a three-year starter at inside linebacker.
- Patriots tight ends coach **Pete Mangurian** was an assistant coach for the Broncos for five seasons from 1988-92. He served as Denver's tight ends/H-Backs coach (1988-90) and also as the Broncos' offensive line coach (1991-92).
- Broncos defensive line/tackles coach Andre Patterson was a defensive assistant for the Patriots in 1997.
- Patriots special teams coach Brad Seely was a graduate assistant at Colorado State in 1979 and served as the Rams' offensive line coach in 1980. Seely also served on the New York Jets coaching staff in 1994 with Broncos defensive coordinator Larry Coyer.
- Patriots wide receiver **Deion Branch** caught the longest pass of his career – a 66-yard touchdown – at Denver on Nov. 3, 2003.
- Patriots wide receiver **Troy Brown** caught a career-high two touchdown passes at Denver on Oct. 1, 2000.
- Patriots fullback **Patrick Pass** had the most productive game of his career at Denver on Oct. 16, 2005, totaling 153 yards from scrimmage, nearly three times his previous career high in that category.







ROBERT KRAFT: BUILDING SUCCESS

SINCE ROBERT KRAFT PURCHASED THE TEAM IN 1994.

ince Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 12th season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five



seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.311 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won six division titles, four conference crowns and three Super Bowl championships. Since Kraft took ownership, the Patriots are 13-4 in the playoffs and have won more Super Bowl championships than any other team in the NFL.

A CHAMPIONSHIP TRADITION

The Patriots are the only team from North America's four major professional sports leagues to have won three titles since 2001. Additionally, the Patriots trail only the New York Yankees in having won three titles in the period since Robert Kraft purchased the team, and their four championship game appearances over that span also rank behind just the Yankees.

SELLOUT STREAK

In the early 1990s, the Patriots franchise appeared destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the team's season ticket base consisted of just 17,635 fans, barely enough to support the club. Eleven years later, the season-ticket base stands at a capped total of 61,759 and more than 50,000 fans are on a waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 126 consecutive home games (dating back to the 1994 regular-season opener) including regular-season, preseason and playoff games. Patriots fans in New England have never been faced with a TV blackout under Kraft's ownership.

SUCCESS STORY

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have been one of the NFL's elite teams. Over the first 12 years of Kraft's ownership, the Patriots are tied for the second highest win total among all NFL teams - a remarkable record considering the fact that the Patriots were a combined 19-61 (.311) in the four years immediately preceding the purchase. Since 2001, the Patriots have been the top team in the NFL, compiling a 68-22 record.

Bill Belichick is now in his 31st season as an NFL coach and is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. He has led the Patriots to three consecutive AFC East titles and has directed four division championships in the last five seasons, including 2005. Belichick's Patriots teams own the all-time NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), consecutive regular-season victories (18 from 2003-04) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001 to present). Belichick owns the best postseason record in NFL history (11-1) and is the winningest NFL head coach since 2001 (68-22). In 2004, he directed the Patriots to their second consecutive Super Bowl title on the heels of a 14-win campaign. Belichick has spent more seasons in the league than any other current NFL head coach, and in that time has been a part of five Super Bowl championship teams. His overall record of 72-33 with the Patriots gives him the most victories and the best winning percentage of any head coach in franchise history.

BELICHICK'S PATRIOTS RENAISSANCE

Any successful project requires a sound plan, and once head coach Bill Belichick implemented his design on the Patriots, his approach has given him the best record of any NFL head coach since 2001. After the team endured a 5-11 rebuilding year in his first season, the Patriots have compiled the best record in the NFL since 2001. The remarkable run includes postseason play, where Belichick and the Patriots own a perfect 9-0 record.

BOUNCING BACK

The Patriots have not lost back-to-back games since December, 2002. Their streak of 49 consecutive regular season games without back-to-back losses is the longest current streak in the NFL and the longest such mark in franchise history. The post-merger NFL record for consecutive games without two straight losses is 60, set by the San Francisco 49ers from 1995-99. The last time the Patriots had a losing streak was when they dropped a game at Tennessee (24-7, 12/16/02), and followed that with a home loss to the N.Y. Jets (30-17, 12/22/02).

SNAPSHOTS OF SUCCESS

The Patriots are in the midst of one of the most prosperous periods for any team in NFL history. The recent run of success began with a 29-26 overtime victory against the San Diego Chargers on Oct. 14, 2001, sparking a streak of 67 wins in the Patriots' last 86 games, including the playoffs. The Patriots entered that contest with a 1-3 record, and Tom Brady was making just the third start of his career against a 3-1 San Diego team. New England rallied back from a 26-16 deficit with less than four minutes left in the game, beginning a stretch of 13 wins in the final 15 games of the 2001 season as the Patriots won their first title in Super Bowl XXXVI.

START ME UP

The Patriots used 45 different players in their starting lineups this season, setting a post-merger NFL record for a division champion. New England's total of 45 starters beat the old record of 42 starters by a division champion, set by the Patriots in 2003. In 2004, the Patriots utilized 40 different starters. In 2005, the Patriots used 22 different starters on offense and 23 different starters on defense. The defensive total included 13 different players who have started in the secondary, a number that eclipsed last season's total of nine. New England's 45 starters were the third most in the NFL this season, behind Arizona (47) and San Francisco (47).

THE GREATEST SHOW IN SNOW

The Patriots are 9-0 all-time in snowy games in Foxborough, including a 16-3 victory over the New York Jets at Gillette Stadium on Dec. 4, 2005. In addition to that game, three of the Patriots' last four home playoff games have involved frozen precipitation, with all three contests ending in memorable victories. In 2003, New England played in three games under snowy conditions, including a 24-14 victory over Indianapolis in the AFC Championship Game. PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

New England has now qualified for the playoffs 14 times in its 46-year history. The Patriots have earned eight playoff berths in the 12 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths that the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots clinched their ninth division title with two games remaining on the schedule. The Patriots have clinched the division title with games remaining on the schedule for the fourth time in team history and for the third consecutive season. New England wrapped up the AFC East on Dec. 10, 1978, with one game left in the season, clinched the 2003 crown on Dec. 7 against Miami with three games left on the slate, and clinched the 2004 crown on Dec. 12 against Cincinnati with three games remaining. Four of the Patriots' division titles were clinched on the final day of the season, with a fifth being clinched in a tiebreaking playoff game in 1963.

PATRIOTS IN THE PRO BOWL

QB TOM BRADY

Three-Time Pro Bowler

DL RICHARD SEYMOUR

Four-Time Pro Bowler

Tom Brady is in his sixth NFL season and has earned his third career Pro Bowl selection, heading to Hawaii for the second consecutive season. The two-time Super Bowl MVP was also named to the Pro Bowl following the 2001 and 2004 seasons. Brady's three Pro Bowl nods tie Vito "Babe" Parilli and Drew Bledsoe for the most selections by a Patriots quarterback. In 2005, Brady led the NFL with a career-high 4,110 passing yards, a number that ranks second on the Patriots' all-time list behind only Drew Bledsoe's franchise-record 4,555 yards (1994). Brady threw a career-high 32 passes of 25 yards or more this season, a figure that tied for the NFL lead (Jake Delhomme). His passer rating of 92.3 was just 0.3 points away from his career high (92.6 in 2004) and ranks third in franchise history.

Richard Seymour was named to his fourth Pro Bowl and has earned his fourth consecutive trip to Hawaii, becoming the first Patriots player to earn as many as four straight nods since tight end Ben Coates was named to five consecutive Pro Bowls from 1994-98. Seymour's four Pro Bowl seasons are the most by any Patriots defensive lineman since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, and he is one of just nine Patriots to earn four or more Pro Bowl selections since the merger 36 seasons ago. This season, Seymour played in 12 games and recorded 69 tackles (41 solo). His 4.0 sacks led all Patriots defensive linemen. He missed four games due to injury and from the time he returned to the lineup on Nov. 13 until the end of the season, the Patriots allowed just 14.8 points per game while recording a 6-2 record.

ICE MEN

New England is 16-1 in its last 17 games when the kickoff temperature has been 35 degrees or colder. The Patriots are 25-3 (.893) since 1993 when the kickoff temperature is 35 degrees or colder. Also since 1993, the Patriots are 21-2 when the temperature is 34 degrees or colder, and 15-1 when it's 30 degrees or colder. Additionally, Tom Brady is 21-1 as a starter when the temperature is less than 40 degrees. His only loss came in the 2005 regular season finale (1/1/06), when he saw just one quarter of action.

FIRST DOWN RECORD

The Patriots offense gained a total of 32 first downs against the Bills on Dec. 11, setting a team record for most first downs in a game. New England eclipsed the previous record of 31 first downs, a number that was achieved three times – Oct. 11, 1998 against Kansas City, Nov. 29, 1987 against Philadelphia and 39 years ago to the day, Dec. 11, 1966 against the Houston Oilers. New England's team-record 32 first downs came via passes (20), rushing (11) and penalty (1).

The Patriots had 12 players catch at least one touchdown pass from Tom Brady this season, tying an NFL record for the greatest touchdown distribution by a quarterback (Tampa Bay Buccaneers/Brad Johnson, 2003). The mark bested New England's old team record of 11 players catching a scoring pass, set by Brady in 2002. New England's dozen scorers of receiving touchdowns break down as follows: 6 wide receivers; 3 tight ends; 1 running back; 1 linebacker; 1 offensive tackle.

DOMINATING DEFENSE

Over a three-game span from Dec. 4-17, the Patriots allowed a total of just 10 points, setting a franchise record for the fewest number of points allowed during any three-game span. New England's defense allowed just one touchdown and one field goal over that span. One of the keys to the Patriots' defensive dominance was their ability to shut down the run, allowing an average of just 28.3 rushing yards per game in the three contests.

MOVING ON UP

COREY DILLON became the 18th player in NFL history to rush for 10,000 yards when he tore off a 12-yard run at Atlanta on Oct. 9. Dillon passed Ottis Anderson to move into 17th place on the NFL's all-time rushing list at Buffalo on Dec. 11. Dillon has recorded two 100-yard games in 2005 and has reached the milestone 11 times since being acquired by the Patriots in exchange for a second-round draft choice prior to the 2004 season. NEON DEION

Wide receiver DEION BRANCH established new career highs with 78 receptions and 998 receiving yards in 2005. The 78 receptions for the Super Bowl XXXIX Most Valuable Player are the most by a Patriot since 2002, when Troy Brown grabbed 97 passes. Branch's 998 yards rank ninth in single-season



franchise history and are the most for a Patriots receiver since 2001, when Troy Brown totaled 1,199 yards. Branch also set a career high in 2005 with five touchdown receptions.

CAREER NUMBERS FOR GIVENS

Wide Receiver DAVID GIVENS set a single-season career high with 59 receptions, besting his previous mark of 56 catches in 2004. Givens had two 100-yard games in 2005 and established a single-game career high with 137 yards and a touchdown on six receptions against Tampa Bay on Dec. 17. He also broke the 100-yard mark when he recorded 130 yards at Pittsburgh on Sep. 25, 2005.

CATCHIN' KEVIN

KEVIN FAULK led all Patriots running backs with 29 receptions in 2005, recording at least 25 catches for the sixth straight season. Faulk ranks second in receptions among all-time Patriots running backs, passing Sam Cunningham with his first reception of the game against Pittsburgh on Sept. 25. Faulk, who was drafted by the Patriots in the second round out of LSU in 1999, has 233 career receptions and trails only Tony Collins' team-record 261 receptions from the running back position. Faulk's reception total ranks ninth among all Patriots receivers. Faulk is also the team's all-time leading kickoff returner, and has recorded at least 40 rushes and 25 catches in each of the last six seasons (2000-05).

BIG BENJAMIN

Tight end BENJAMIN WATSON scored four touchdowns in 2005, including a pair of scores at Miami on Nov. 13. Watson became the first Patriot to score two receiving touchdowns since David Givens grabbed a pair at Pittsburgh on Oct. 31, 2004, and he became the first Patriots tight end to turn the trick since Daniel Graham did it at Arizona on Sept. 19, 2004. Watson, a secondyear pro who missed all but one game of his rookie season, led all Patriots tight ends with 29 receptions for 441 yards in 2005.

PASS-ING THE TEST

PATRICK PASS set a career high with 472 yards from scrimmage in 2005 (245 rushing and 227 receiving). Pass had the most productive game of his career against Denver on Oct. 16, gaining a total of 153 yards from scrimmage, nearly three times his previous career high in that category. Against Denver, Pass set career highs with 89 receiving yards (which led all Patriots receivers) and 64 rushing yards (which led all Patriots rushers).

RARE FEAT BY FLUTIE

In the Patriots' regular-season finale against Miami on Jan. 1. backup quarterback DOUG FLUTIE converted the NFL's first drop kick since 1941 when he booted an extra point in the fourth quarter. Prior to Flutie's play, the NFL's last drop kick came on Dec. 21, 1941, when Ray McLean of the Chicago Bears booted an extra point in the 1941 NFL Championship Game.

NO RUSHING ZONE

The New England defense allowed just 125 total rushing vards in the month of December for an average of just 31.3 rushing yards per game. Entering the game against the New York Jets on Dec. 4, the Patriots were allowing an average of 118.8 rushing yards per game a number that ranked 21st in the NFL. RICHARD SEYMOUR

Defensive lineman RICHARD SEYMOUR was named to his fourth consecutive Pro Bowl in 2005 and was voted a defensive captain by his teammates again this season. The former 2001 first-round draft pick recorded his first career multiple-sack game against Pittsburgh on Sept. 25. This season he recorded 69 tackles and four sacks. Seymour has recorded 262 tackles since 2002, leading all Patriots defensive linemen over that span.

TOUCHDOWN TEDY

Linebacker TEDY BRUSCHI's nose for the ball has helped to create seven defensive touchdowns since the 2002 season. He has scored four touchdowns himself on interception returns (two each in 2002 and 2003), forced two fumbles that were picked up and returned for scores (10/03/04 at Buffalo and 11/28/04 vs.

SANDERS SCORES

Rookie safety JAMES SANDERS returned an interception 39 yards for a touchdown at Buffalo on Dec. 11, recording his first career touchdown and his first career interception. Sanders, a fourthround selection in the 2005 NFL Draft, was in the backfield on a blitz and grabbed a ball that Tedy Bruschi had deflected into the air and raced to the end zone untouched. Sanders became the first Patriots rookie to return an interception for a touchdown since Asante Samuel did it against the N.Y. Jets on Sept. 21, 2003.

ALL-TIME LEADING SCORER

ADAM VINATIERI is the all-time leading scorer in Patriots history, totaling 1,158 points in his 10 seasons with the club. He passed Gino Cappelletti to claim the franchise record on a 34-yard field goal at the end of the first half against the New York Jets at Gillette Stadium on Dec.4, 2005. Vinatieri made the team as a rookie



free agent in 1996 and has scored 100 points or more in each of his first 10 seasons (including an even 100 in 2005), joining Jason Elam of the Denver Broncos as the only two kickers in NFL history to accomplish the feat. Vinatieri is the Patriots all-time leader having tallied 263 successful boots in a Patriots uniform.

IRON MAN

Adam Vinatieri has played in 160 consecutive regular-season games and needs to play in just two more games to claim the Patriots all-time record. Vinatieri, who has also played in 15 straight playoff games and has not missed a game in his 10-year career, passed Gino Cappelletti's mark of 152 consecutive games, which was established from 1960-70, on Nov. 13 at Miami. Vinatieri now trails only Raymond Clayborn's record of 161 consecutive games, established from 1977-87.

AUTOMATIC ADAM

Adam Vinatieri has nailed two game-winning field goals so far this season, bring his career total of game-winning boots to 20. Vinatieri is the only kicker in NFL history to kick a game-winning field goal in the final minute of the Super Bowl and has accomplished the feat twice, including his 48-yarder to win Super Bowl XXXVI and a 41-yarder to win Super Bowl XXXVIII.

- Adam Vinatieri has been successful on 25 consecutive fourthquarter field goal attempts, dating back to Dec. 8, 2002, when he missed a 43-yarder against the Buffalo Bills at Gillette Stadium.
- Since the beginning of the 2001 season, Vinatieri is 22-for-23 (95.7 percent) in the fourth quarter when the point differential between the teams is a touchdown or less.
- Vinatieri has hit 32 of his last 33 field goals (97.0 percent) in the second half, dating back to the 2003 regular-season finale (including playoffs).
- In games when the kickoff temperature is less than 40 degrees, Vinatieri has hit 36 of his last 40 field goal attempts (90.0 percent). The performance dates back to Dec. 16, 2001 and includes a 13-for-14 performance in playoff games where the temperature is less than 40 degrees.

TAKING AIM

Adam Vinatieri is the most accurate kicker in franchise history and ranks seventh among the most accurate kickers in NFL history. He has recorded an 81.9 percent conversion rate (263/321) over his 10-year career. In 2005, Vinatieri was successful on 80 percent of his kicks (20/25). He was 31-for-33 in 2004, setting a career high for accuracy with a 93.9 percent success rate.

MILLER TIME

Punter JOSH MILLER had one of the best seasons of his 10-year career finishing with the second highest single-season punting yardage figure in Patriots history. The 10th-year veteran ranked fourth in the NFL, averaging 45.1 yards per punt. He put 22 punts inside the 20-yard line against just four touchbacks. Miller's punting average was the second highest of his career, just 0.1 yards behind his career-best 45.2 yards per punt, set in 1999 with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

HOME OF THE THREE-TIME SUPER BOWL CHAMPIONS

Overall record at Gillette Stadium: 30-6



The Patriots and their fans at Gillette Stadium have established one of the biggest home-field advantages in the country. Since its Grand Opening on Sept. 9, 2002, the Patriots have compiled a 30-6 record at their privately financed, state-of-the art stadium. Patriots fans have embraced the team's new home with unprecedented fervor, using the most fan-friendly venue in the region to express their passion for the Patriots and spur the team on to unparalleled success. In the four seasons that New England has called Gillette Stadium home, the Patriots have won three AFC East titles, hosted the second AFC Championship Game in franchise history and are 4-0 in home playoff games.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Patriots have recorded a 30-6 (.833) alltime record at Gillette Stadium, including regular-season and postseason games. New England has won 26 of its last 29 regularseason and postseason contests at home.

HOMELAND DEFENSE

New England's .833 home winning percentage is the highest of any NFL team since Gillette Stadium opened in time for the 2002 season. The Patriots achieved perfect 8-0 regularseason home records in 2003 and 2004 and have also notched a 4-0 home playoff record at Gillette Stadium. New England won a franchise-record 21 consecutive home games between 2002 and 2005. Below is a list of the NFL's top home records (including regularseason and playoff games) since the Patriots moved into Gillette Stadium in time for the 2002 season.

HOME WINNING STREAK: 21 GAMES

The Patriots set a team record with 21 consecutive home victories from Dec. 29, 2002 to Sept. 8, 2005. The streak extended into parts of four seasons and lasted more than two-and-a-half years.

DOMINATING DEFENSE

Since Gillette Stadium opened in 2002, the Patriots have defended their home turf better than any other team in the NFL. New England has allowed an average of just 15.67 points per game on their home turf, a figure that leads the NFL since 2002, including regular season and playoff games. The Tampa Bay Buccaneers rank second better over that span, allowing 15.88 points per game since 2002.

FOXBOROUGH NOT FRIENDLY TO OPPOSING KICKERS

Since Gillette Stadium opened in 2002, it has been the toughest place in the NFL for opposing kickers to be successful. Opposing kickers have a 68.85 percent success rate at Gillette Stadium since the Patriots' home opened in 2002 and have converted only 58.3 percent of their kicks from 30 yards or longer. Despite the inhospitable kicking conditions, Patriots kicker Adam Vinatieri has thrived, hitting 15 percent more of his boots than Patriots opponents, including nearly 20 percent more of his kicks from 30-plus yards.
