SURTAIN BECOMES PATON'S FIRST DRAFT SELECTION

NAMED TO A PRO BOWL

Since being named the team's general manager on Jan. 13, 2021, Paton has selected a total of 19 players between the 2021 and '22 NFL drafts. On Dec. 21, 2022, CB Pat Surtain II was named a starter in the 2023 Pro Bowl, becoming Paton's first draft selection to garner the distinction.

Surtain, who was selected by the club with the ninth overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft, started all 17 games played in 2022, recording a career-high 60 tackles (46 solo), two interceptions, 10 passes defensed and one forced fumble. He is the sixth Broncos cornerback—and first since Chris Harris Jr. in 2018—to be named to the Pro Bowl since its inception in 1970.

Surtain is 1-of-6 second-year players to be named to the 2023 Pro Bowl, and 1-of-4 to be named a starter.

2022 BRONCOS ROOKIE DRAFT CLASS

The Broncos' second draft under General Manager George Paton saw Denver make a total of nine selections, with six of the nine picks used on defensive players.

In total, Denver's 2022 draft class combined to appear in 102 games (20 starts). Cornerback Damarri Mathis started 11-of-16 games played in his rookie campaign, while defensive end Matt Henningsen was the lone drafted player to appear in all 17 games.

BRONCOS WIN 2022 BEST DRAFT AWARD

Following General Manager George Paton's first season at the helm, the Broncos were awarded the 2022 Best Draft Award in March during the 13th annual Inside the League Combine Seminar.

Capturing 31 percent of the 2022 vote, the Broncos edged five other teams (Kansas City, L.A. Chargers, Miami, New England, Pittsburgh) who were named finalists. Denver became just the second AFC club to garner the honor since its inception in 2017.

Cornerback Pat Surtain II (Rd. 1, Pick 9) and running back Javonte Williams (Rd. 2, Pick 35) headlined Paton's first draft class and were named to the Pro Football Writers of America All-Rookie Team. In total, the Broncos' 2021 rookie class appeared in 99 games (42 starts), logging nearly 3,500 combined snaps on offense and defense.

BRONCOS COLLECT 500TH FRANCHISE VICTORY AND 300TH HOME WIN IN SEASON FINALE

In the 2022 season finale against the L.A. Chargers, the Broncos collected its 500th victory in franchise history and 300th home win.

Denver is the 17th NFL franchise to reach 500 wins and the ninth to do so since the team's inception in 1960. The Broncos are one of only 10 teams with at least 300 victories at home.

With the win, the team owns a 500-456-10 (.523) all-time record and a 300-177-7 (.628) mark at home.

In 18 of the last 19 years, at least one rookie college free agent has made the Broncos' active roster out of training camp for the first week of the regular season. In 2022, wide receiver Jalen Virgil made Denver's Week 1 roster to give the Broncos 26 such players since 1997.

Virgil, who is a product of Appalachian State, appeared in all three preseason games for the Broncos, totaling nine receptions for 180 yards (20.0 avg.) with one touchdown. His 180 yards receiving were tied for fifth most in the preseason.

This season, Virgil has appeared in eight games (1 start), registering two catches for 75 yards (37.5 avg.) with one touchdown to go along with one kickoff return for 21 yards.

WILSON ECLIPSES 40,000 CAREER PASSING YARDS

AMONG BRONCOS PASS CATCHERS IN YEARS 1-3

Wide receiver Jerry Jeudy, who was drafted by the Broncos in first round (15th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft, has recorded 157 receptions for 2,295 yards (14.6 avg.) with nine touchdowns during the first three years of his NFL career. In 2022, Jeudy set career highs in receptions (67), yards (972) and touchdowns (6).

Jeudy's 2,295 receiving yards are the third most by a Broncos pass catcher in his first three professional seasons, trailing only wide receiver Brandon Marshall (2,899) and wide receiver Lionel Taylor (2,411).
