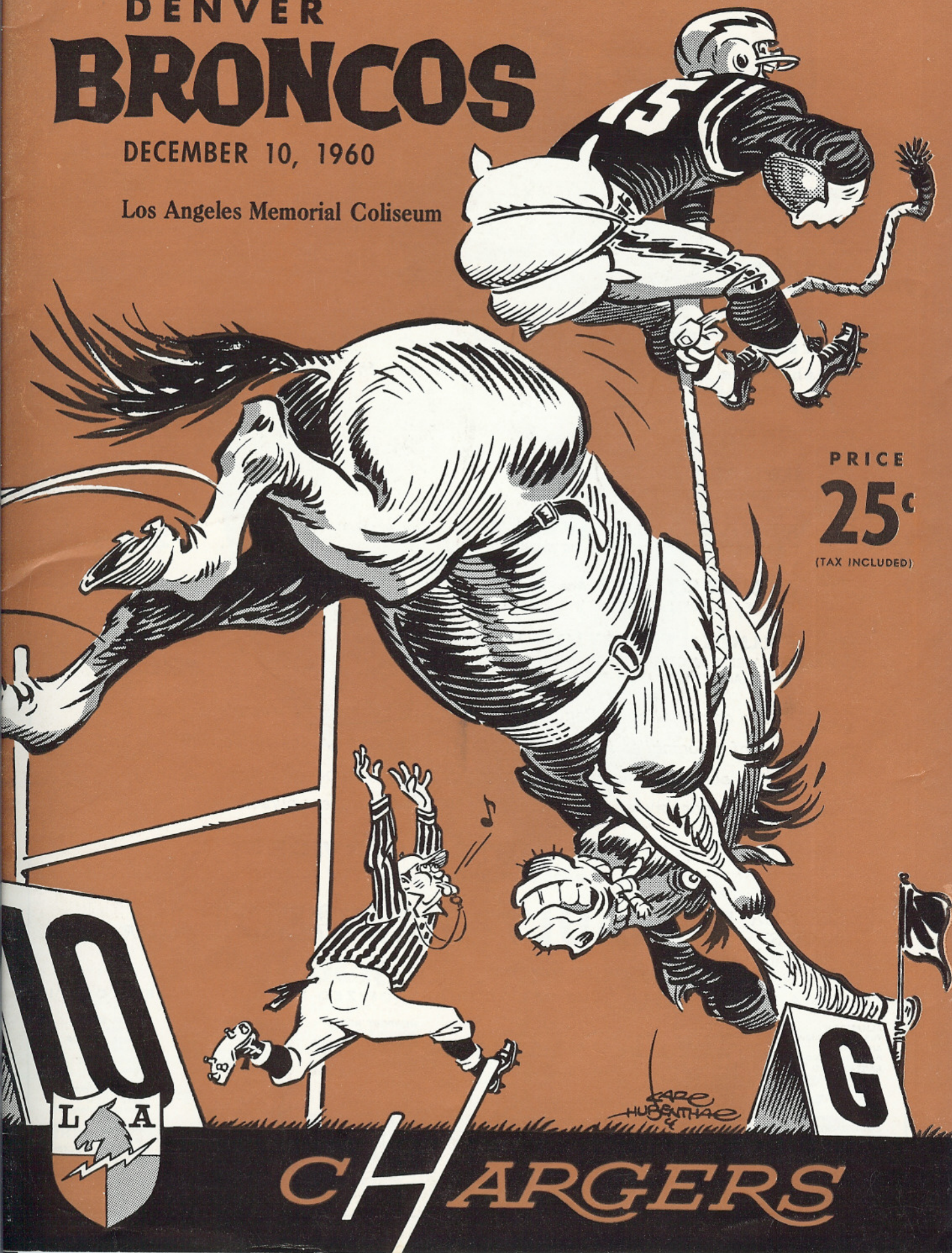

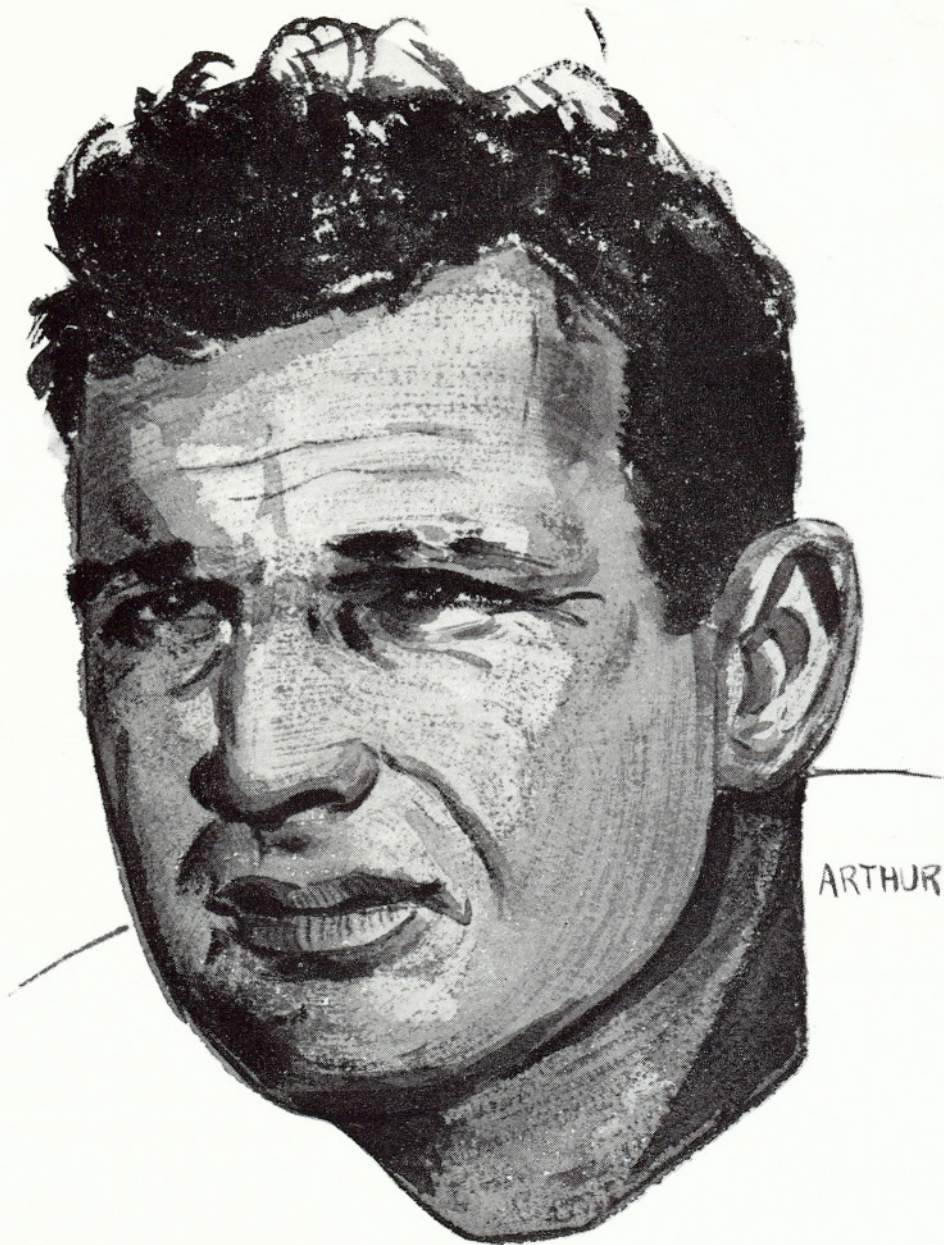

THE NEW LOS AN CHARGE

When Sid Gillman departed from the Los Angeles Rams last year, he sat down for thought and reflection. He could, he figured, play the piano for a living. A piano player

has never been hanged in effigy, and one in fact even got to the White House with a singing daughter named Margaret.

Then there were stocks and bonds. He got an offer to sell both. Here was a sweet business involving no risk on the part of the salesman. He collected fees even if the client went bust.

Whatever path he would choose, football coaching, Gillman swore solemnly, was out. His team of 1959, which won but two of twelve games, left him with an emotional scar not easy to shake. Nor, in his elderliness, would he recall fondly the press notices which suggested that perhaps he was unfit to vote.

So it is, you can see, no triumph of consistency, but at least one of justice that Gillman has returned to football and finds himself on the doorsill of playing in a championship game. If his Los Angeles Chargers defeat Denver today, or New York next week, they win the Western Division title of the American Football League and advance to the finals against the champion of the East.

Getting teams together in the new professional league this year was no joy for the coaches. Gillman, for instance, screened more than 300 athletes before finally selecting his current roster. He looked at young players, old ones, experienced ones, and tenderfeet.

He had to talk fast to lure some athletes from the clutches of the rival National League, went to court to win others. It has, in every respect, been an uphill battle this season, but Gillman has come through with more than his share of merit badges.

Since emigrating to this city from the University of Cincinnati where he never had a losing season, Gillman has experienced some pretty rigorous times. In the field of second guessing, Los Angeles football fans rank second to none.

While coaching the Rams, Gillman was belabored for his choice of quarterbacks, for his trades, for sending in plays and a parcel of other moves accepted as normal functions of a coach in most cities.

But Los Angeles fans are committed to ex-

cellence and Gillman had his hands full, as any losing coach will in this community.

So, as pointed out above, the triumphal return of Sid in the new league is a gratifying accomplishment. In a situation where everyone started from scratch, he has taken his team to the top, and you can't go higher than first.

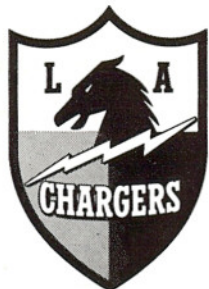

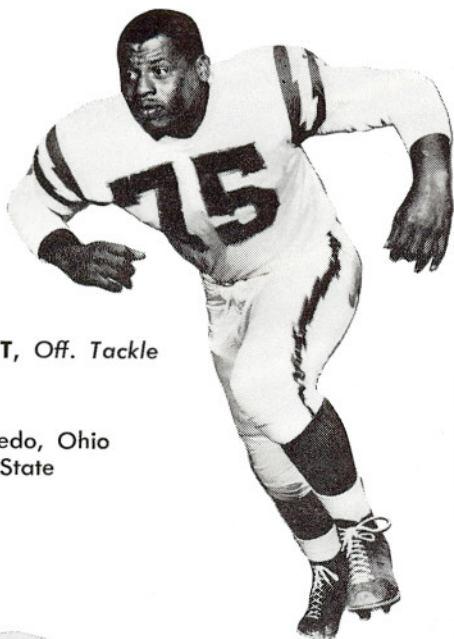

A PROFILE OF HOWIE FERGUSON

Among the defensive halfbacks of the American Football League there's a common bond, especially when the opposition is the Los Angeles Chargers and the fullback is Howie Ferguson.

"When Ferguson gets the ball," one defensive veteran said, "you are rooting like mad for the linebackers to stop him.

"Some call Fergie a hard runner. I say he's just a roughhouse runner with reckless disregard for anything in his way, particularly defensive halfbacks."

There are some who would almost be willing to share their salary with the linebacker consistently able to pin Ferguson down.

Ferguson, who never played college football, is a seven year veteran of the professional wars. "I just run," the 30-year-old fullback said. "You've got to deliver the blow rather than take it. I try to throw everything I've got into the tackler."

Everything is a large package. Standing

6 ft. 2½ in., Ferguson packs 217-pounds on his lean, angular frame which has been seasoned to the rigors of football by an extensive career on the field despite no college experience.

"I played four years at New Iberia (La.) High," the darkhaired, brown-eyed native of the bayous explained.

"I joined the Navy in January 1948," he added, "and played four more years." Two of those campaigns he was All-Navy and the main weapon in the PhiPac (Amphibious, Pacific Base) team in San Diego.

Professional football didn't beckon until he was out of Navy blue a year. "I was working as a derrick hand on an oil drilling rig in Freeport, Texas," Howie recalls, "when I got questionnaires from the Rams and the Chicago Bears."

A tryout with the Rams in 1952 was not successful and Ferguson returned to the roughneck work of a derrickman.

In 1953, the Green Bay Packers tendered Ferguson a trial. It turned into tenure and the lament of the defensive backs began with his rookie season as this rock ribbed runner began busting defenses apart.

By mid-season, Ferguson's reputation as a bruising, battering type of a ball carrier was made. By 1955 he ranked with the great power runners of the league and was selected to the West squad for the Pro Bowl classic in January 1956.

That was Ferguson's introduction to Sid Gillman for the Charger headman coached the West that year. Here Gillman gained an even closer insight into Ferguson as an offensive back naming him to start at fullback ahead of Alan (The Horse) Ameche and Rick Casares.

"Ferguson was then and is now one of the most interested, dedicated football players I've ever come across," Sid said.

"If there's a better blocker in all of football," he added, "Howard has got to be second best."

This is supreme praise to a back who retired from professional football Sept. 16, 1959 with a series of injuries that included major knee and shoulder ailments.

In six seasons with the Packers, the non-college man from New Iberia had gained 2120 yards, been called the roughest runner

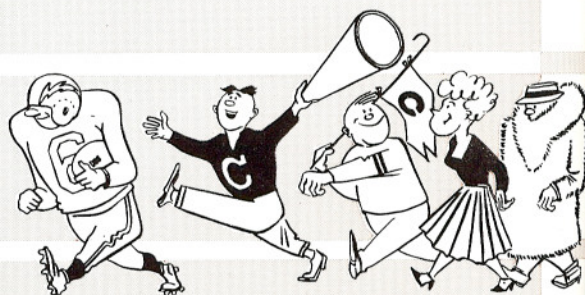

in the game and the most deadly blocker in any backfield.

"Howard has exceeded our every hope this year," Gillman said about his comeback. "He has stayed healthy despite being practically wired for sound."

By that Gillman meant that many of Ferguson's injuries were repaired by the use of surgical wire to help mend damaged bone structure.

An avid hunter, water skier and a golfer,

who shoots in the high 70's, Fergie now lives in the Woodland Hills area of the San Fernando Valley with his wife "Teedee", an eight-year-old daughter, Cathy, and a five-year-old son, Mark.

"We like living here so much," Howie said, "that we'd like to stay if I can find a good job." Ferguson fears this may be his last season in football. Gillman hopes otherwise.

"Howie has as many good years left in football as he wants," Sid insists. "We hope he wants to play some more for the Chargers." It's a hope that all opposing defensive backs prefer not to come true.
