NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (6-2) at PITTSBURGH STEELERS (6-2)

Sun., Nov. 14, 2010 ★ Heinz Field (65,050) ★ 8:20 p.m. EST

The New England Patriots travel to play the Pittsburgh Steelers on Sunday Night Football in the second game of the only back-to-back road games for the Patriots in 2010. Last week, the Patriots lost at Cleveland, 34-14. Since the beginning of the 2003 season, the Patriots are 24-2 (.923) in games following a regular-season loss. Over the last seven seasons (2003-09), the Patriots have only lost back-to-back games on two occasions, once in 2006 and once in 2009.

Since 2001, the Patriots have an NFL-best 75-23 (.765) record in games played after Nov. 1. Pittsburgh has the second-best record after Nov. 1 since 2001 with a 66-30-1 (.685) record. Since Robert Kraft purchased the Patriots in 1994, the Patriots lead the league with 189 wins, while the Steelers are second with 181 victories

PATRIOTS vs. AFC NORTH

The Patriots are 14-3 all-time against the AFC North in the regular-season since the division was founded in 2002. Prior to the 34-14 loss to Cleveland last Sunday, the only AFC North losses for New England were to the Steelers, with a 34-20 loss at Pittsburgh (10/31/04) and a 33-10 loss vs. Pittsburgh (11/30/08). The Patriots only other loss to the AFC North during that time frame was a 33-14 loss in a 2009 Wild Card game at home against Baltimore. The Patriots are 2-1 so far in 2010 against the AFC North following a 38-24 win vs. Cincinnati (9/12), a 23-20 overtime win vs. Baltimore (10/17) and the 34-14 loss to Cleveland (11/7).

PATRIOTS VS. STEELERS

SERIES HISTORY

The Patriots and Steelers will square off for the 25th time overall and the 21st time in the regular season. While New England has won six of the last ten games, Pittsburgh prevailed in the last meeting, a 2008 matchup at Gillette Stadium with a 33-10 victory.

Pittsburgh leads the all-time regular-season series 13-7, but the Patriots lead the postseason series



by a 3-1 margin. The teams played in the AFC Championship Game following the 2001 and 2004 seasons, with the Patriots winning both times en route to Super Bowl titles. Of the previous



24 games in the series, 17 have been played in Pittsburgh, where the Steelers own a 10-7 advantage. The Patriots will travel to Pittsburgh for the first time since a 23-20 Patriots win on Sept. 25, 2005.

The Patriots posted a 30-14 win in the Grand Opening of Gillette Stadium on Monday Night Football

on Sept. 9, 2002 against the Steelers.

The New England Patriots fell to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 33-10 at Gillette Stadium to fall to 7-5 on the season. The teams were tied 10-10 at halftime, but the Steelers pulled away with 23 second-half points. On a 34-degree, rainy late afternoon, New England turned the ball over on five straight possessions in the second half, leading to four Pittsburgh scoring drives, two of which began inside the Patriots' 10-yard line.

Kevin Faulk led the way for the Patriots offensively, recording his second straight game with more than 100 scrimmage yards, leading the Patriots with 73 rushing yards and also pacing the club with seven receptions and 48 receiving yards. The Patriots gained 122 rushing yards – the highest total gained on the ground against Pittsburgh that season. New England also gained 267 total net yards – the third highest total against the Steelers' top-ranked defense that season.

Cleveland RB Peyton Hillis had a career-high 184 rushing yards to lift the Browns to a 34-14 victory over the New England Patriots. The Patriots were limited to just 14 points after entering the game with an NFL-leading 29.3 points per game. QB Tom Brady was 19-of-34 for 224 yards with two touchdown passes to rookie TE Aaron Hernandez but it was not enough as he lost for the first time to Cleveland.

The Browns jumped to a 10-0 lead before Brady and the offense ever reached the field. Cleveland started rookie QB Colt McCoy, who opened the game with a 21-yard pass that was followed by an 18-yard run by Hillis to move to the New England 24-yard line and set up a field goal. On the ensuing kick, there was miscommunication between RB Sammy Morris and TE Rob Gronkowski, resulting in a fumble that was recovered by the Browns at the New England 19-yard line. Two plays later, Hillis scored the first of his two touchdowns on a 2-yard run for a 10-0 lead

New England mounted an 11-play, 79-yard drive in the beginning of the second quarter that ended when Brady completed a 2-yard touchdown pass to Hernandez to make it 10-7. Cleveland responded on the next series with a 60-yard drive that ended in an 11-yard touchdown run by WR Chansi Stuckey for a 17-7 lead. On that play, Cleveland RB Joshua Cribbs lined up at quarterback on a trick play that saw Cribbs get the snap and handoff to Stuckey.

The Patriots had a chance to cut the lead before the half, reaching the Cleveland nine-yard line with 30 seconds to play in the first half. Brady hit Gronkowski for a short gain, but while fighting for extra yards Gronkowski was stripped of the ball, allowing the Browns to recover at the two-yard line and secure the 17-7 halftime lead.

Cleveland added a touchdown in the third quarter on their only offensive drive of the quarter when McCoy scrambled for a 16-yard touchdown run following a 10-play, 72-yard drive. After extending their lead to 27-7 early in the fourth quarter, Brady converted a fourth-and-two situation from the Cleveland 25-yard line in a drive that ended when Brady connected with Hernandez for a 1-yard touchdown to make it 27-14. WR Wes Welker was pressed into action as a kicker for Stephen Gostkowski, who was forced out due to a thigh injury. Welker kicked the extra point following the Hernandez touchdown and also handled the ensuing kickoff.

Cleveland put the Patriots away when Hillis scored on a 35yard touchdown run with under three minutes to play.

G LOGAN MANKINS MAKES DEBUT

G Logan Mankins, who reported to the Patriots earlier in the week, made his 2010 debut with a start at left guard. Mankins has now started all 81 regular-season games that he has played.

TE AARON HERNANDEZ RECORDS FIRST TWO NFL TOUCHDOWNS

Rookie TE Aaron Hernandez registered his first two NFL touchdowns. He scored his first NFL touchdown on a 2-yard reception in the second quarter and then had a 1-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.

HERNANDEZ MAKES BIG PLAYS

Hernandez had a 22-yard reception late in the second quarter and now has a reception of 20 or more yards in seven of eight games.

HERNANDEZ ON GOOD PACE

Hernandez led the team with five receptions for 48 yards against Cleveland and now has 34 receptions in 2010 to go along with his 436 receiving yards. The Patriots franchise records for rookie tight ends are 37 receptions (by Greg Baty in 1986) and 636 receiving yards (by Russ Francis in 1975).

WELKER EXTENDS STREAK

Wes Welker extended his streak to 71 straight regular-season games with at least one reception. He has caught at least one pass in each of his 57 games with the Patriots, including three postseason games. The last time that Welker did not catch a pass in a game was December 24, 2005 when he was with the Dolphins. He has caught at least one pass in 54 consecutive regular-season games as a member of the Patriots. The Patriots' record for most consecutive games with at least one pass is 63 by TE Ben Coates (12-17-92) to (12-15-96).

WELKER PRESSED INTO SERVICE AS A KICKER

Welker was pressed into service as a kicker for the second time in his career and was successful on an extra point attempt and handled a kickoff both in the fourth quarter. Welker was filling in for the injured Stephen Gostkowski (thigh). While with Miami in 2004, he was pressed into action in a game at New England (10/10/04) and converted one extra point, a 29-yard field goal and also handled kickoff duties.

LB BRANDON SPIKES LED TEAM WITH 10 TOTAL TACKLES; ON PACE TO FINSIH WITH OVER 100 TACKLES

Rookie LB Brandon Spikes finished with a team-high 10 total tackles to push his season total to 56 tackles. He is on pace to finish the season with 112 total tackles. Spikes has had four 10-plus tackle games in 2010 with 10 at the New York Jets (9/19), 13 vs. Baltimore (10/17), 10 vs. Minnesota (10/31) and 10 at Cleveland (11/7).

MAYO ON A HIGH TACKLE PACE AS HE GOES OVER 100 TACKLES FOR THE SEASON

LB Jerod Mayo finished with nine tackles to push his total to 103 tackles in 2010. He is on pace for a career high 206 total tackles. That number will be the highest since LB Steve Nelson had 207 tackles in 1984. Mayo had 139 tackles as a rookie in 2008 and 114 in 2009 and with 103 tackles in 2010 he is the first Patriots player to have three consecutive 100-tackle seasons since Lawyer Milloy registered five straight 100-tackle seasons from 1997 through 2001.

WOODHEAD HAS A CAREER-HIGH 26-YARD RECEPTION

RB Danny Woodhead had a career-long 26 yard reception in the second quarter to help set up the Patriots first touchdown. His previous best was a 24-yard reception at Tampa Bay (12-13-09) when he was with the Jets. Woodhead finished the game with nine rushing attempts for 54 yards and a 6.0-yard average and two receptions for 38 yards.

BRADY MOVES UP ALL-TIME TOUCHDOWNS LIST

Tom Brady entered the Cleveland game tied with Jim Kelly for 17th place on the NFL's All-Time Touchdown list with (237). His 2-yard touchdown pass to TE Aaron Hernandez moved him to sole possession of 17th place with 238 career touchdown passes and his 1-yard touchdown pass to Hernandez moved him into a 16th place tie with Len Dawson at 239 career touchdowns.

BRADY MOVES PAST UNITAS ON THE NFL'S ALL-TIME COMPLETIONS LIST

Tom Brady had 19 completions to move past Johnny Unitas (2,830) into 20^{th} place on the NFL's All-Time completions list with 2,838 completions.

BRADY THROWS FOR TWO TOUCHDOWNS

Tom Brady threw two touchdown passes to TE Aaron Hernandez. It is the fourth time in 2010 that Brady has thrown two or more touchdowns in game. He has thrown for at least one touchdown in every game in 2010.

ROBERT KRAFT NEWS & NOTES

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In 16 seasons of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what many observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93),



the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.311 pct.) and recording the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won nine division titles, five conference crowns and three Super Bowl championships. The Patriots have made five Super Bowl appearances since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other NFL franchise has earned more than three

SELLOUT STREAK

In the early 1990s, the Patriots seemed destined for relocation until Robert Kraft's purchase of the team rejuvenated local interest. In 1991, the season ticket base was just 17,635, barely enough to support the club. Now, the season-ticket base stands at a capped total of 61,759 and more than 50,000 fans are on a waiting list. The Patriots have sold out 176 consecutive home games (dating back to the 1994 regular-season opener).

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have been one of the NFL's elite franchises. Over the first 16 seasons of Kraft's ownership, the Patriots own the NFL's highest winning percentage and have won more Super Bowl titles, more conference championships and more playoff games than any other NFL team. The Patriots have now won nine or more games in 13 of the 16 seasons that Robert Kraft has owned the team.

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. He spent 20 years as an assistant coach in the NFL and this is his 16th season as a head coach. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the only man in NFL history to serve 20 or more seasons as an assistant coach and at least 15 seasons as a head coach. Over a 100-game span from 2003-08, Belichick directed the team to an 82-18 record, marking the best 100-game span for any team in NFL history. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in the NFL's 90-year history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. He has led the Patriots to the Super Bowl four times and has produced seven division championships, including five straight from 2003-07. Belichick's Patriots teams own the alltime NFL records for consecutive total victories (21 from 2003-04), and established the record for consecutive regular-season victories (21 from 2006-08) and consecutive playoff victories (10 from 2001-05). Belichick owns the second-best postseason record in NFL history (15-5) and is the winningest NFL head coach since 2001 (127-43). From 2003-04, he directed the Patriots to back-to-back Super Bowl titles while posting consecutive 17-win campaigns. Belichick has spent more seasons in the league than any other current NFL head coach, and in that time has been a part of five Super Bowl championship teams. His overall record of 132-54 with the Patriots gives him the most victories and the best winning percentage of any head coach in franchise history.

ELITE COMPANY

Bill Belichick is one of nine NFL head coaches to win three or more championships since the league began postseason play in 1933. With the Patriots' victory in Super Bowl XXXIX, Belichick joined an exclusive club in which each of the eight other members has been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

WELKER FINISHES WITH SECOND MOST RECEPTIONS AND SECOND HIGHEST AVERAGE IN NFL HISTORY in 2009

Welker led the NFL with 123 receptions in 2009, despite missing two games due to injury and most of the season-finale due to an injury. He averaged 8.8 receptions in the 14 games he played. The 123 receptions are a Patriots record and match Herman Moore (Detroit in 1995) for the second most receptions in a single season in NFL history, behind Marvin Harrison's NFL record of 143 receptions in 2002. Welker's 8.8 catches per game in 2009 rank second in NFL history to the 8.9 average set by Harrison in 2002.

WELKER GOES OVER 100 RECEPTIONS IN 2009

Wes Welker's 10-catch game vs. Carolina on Dec. 13, 2009 pushed him over 100 receptions for the third straight season. He joins Marvin Harrison (4), Jerry Rice (3), Herman Moore (3) and Brandon Marshall (3) as the only players to catch 100 passes in three consecutive seasons. WELKER MOVES PAST FRYAR

Wes Welker moved past Irving Fryar (363) into fifth place on New England's all-time reception list and now has 390 receptions as a member of the Patriots. Welker passed Fryar on an 8-yard reception from QB Tom Brady in the third quarter vs. Buffalo (9/26/10). RB Kevin Faulk is in fourth place with 424 receptions.

WELKER'S ROUTE TO THE NFL

Despite being named the Oklahoma football player of the year by both *USA Today* and the *Daily Oklahoman*, Wes Welker's only scholarship offer came from Texas Tech, and only after a player that committed to Texas Tech backed out.

"I was thinking I'd get a scholarship somewhere," Welker said. "When it didn't happen when it was supposed to I was pretty hurt by it."

Welker had an impressive collegiate career, accumulating 259 receptions and eight punts returned for touchdowns. He even won a national award as the best special teams player in the country. Despite those accolades, he was passed over in the 2004 NFL draft and signed with San Diego as a free agent. He made the team, then was cut after the first game. He signed with Miami soon after and was used just on special teams. He caught New England's eye with a 71-yard punt return on Monday Night Football in a game against the Patriots. He was acquired by the Patriots in a trade with Miami in 2007.



WELKER TIES NFL RECORD FOR FEWEST INDIVIDUAL GAMES PLAYED TO REACH 100 RECEPTIONS

Welker reached 100 receptions in his 11th game of the 2009 season to tie Marvin Harrison for the fewest individual games played to reach 100 receptions in a season in NFL history. Harrison caught 100 passes in his first 11 games of the 2002 season en route to an NFL-record 143 catches. (Welker missed two games in 2009 due to injury).

DEION BRANCH RETURNS TO THE PATRIOTS

Deion Branch was acquired by the Patriots in trade with Seattle on Oct. 12, 2010. Originally a second-round pick of the Patriots in 2002, Branch was traded to Seattle in 2006. Branch returns to a team that he helped win two Super Bowls. Branch was awarded the Pete Rozelle Trophy as the Most Valuable Player of Super Bowl XXXIX. His 11 receptions in the game tied the Super Bowl record, also achieved by Jerry Rice, Dan Ross and Wes Welker. On the day of Super Bowl XXXIX, Deion called a dozen of his former football coaches to thank them for the support that they gave him throughout his high school, junior college and college careers. Hours after talking to his coaches, he tied the Super Bowl record with 11 receptions and was named MVP of the game. Branch has turned in his biggest performances on the greatest stage in sports, leading all receivers in Super Bowls XXXVIII and XXXIX. He recorded a combined 21 receptions in the two games and owns two of the top seven receiving performances in Super Bowl history. His career reception total in the Super Bowl ranks third all-time, trailing only Jerry Rice (33) and Andre Reed (27).

ROOKIE TIGHT ENDS ARE MAKING AN IMPACT

Rookie tight ends Rob Gronkowski and Aaron Hernandez are making an impact in the Patriots offense. Gronkowski has three touchdown receptions and needs one more touchdown reception to tie the Russ Francis (4 in 1975) and Don Hasselbeck (4 in 1977) for the most touchdown catches by a rookie tight end in Patriots history. Hernandez leads the 2010 Patriots with 436 receiving yards on 34 receptions. He is threatening the franchise record for a rookie tight end. Greg Baty had 37 receptions in 1986 and Francis had 636 receiving yards in 1975.

AARON HERNANDEZ STARTS BIG

Rookie TE Aaron Hernandez's first NFL reception was a 45-yard catch in the first quarter of the season-opener vs. Cincinnati (9/12). It is the longest reception by a Patriots rookie on his first catch since WR Tony Simmons had a 47-yard reception in his debut on Oct. 15, 1998. Hernandez had a second 40-plus catch in Week 2 at the NY Jets (9/19) with a 46-yard reception. Hernandez had 27-yard reception vs. Minnesota (10/31) and now has had a reception of 20 or more yards in six of his seven NFL games. Hernandez caught his first two touchdown passes at Cleveland (11/7).

BRANDON TATE HAS TWO KICKOFFS RETURNED FOR TOUCHDOWNS IN 2010

Brandon Tate has blossomed into a dual threat in both the return game and the receiving game this year. He has returned two kickoffs for touchdowns to provide the Patriots a spark on special teams, after returning the second half kickoff vs. Cincinnati 97 yards for a touchdown and the second half kickoff at Miami 103 yards for a touchdown. He is the first Patriots player to return two kicks for a touchdown in a season since Kevin Faulk returned two for a touchdown in 2002. The Patriots record for most kickoff returns for a touchdown in a season is three by Raymond Clayborn in 1977. His prowess for returns carries over from his collegiate days where he holds numerous NCAA and ACC career records including the NCAA career record for combined kick and punt return yards with 3,523. A native of North Carolina, Tate was a four-year return man for the Tar Heels. Tate suffered a knee injury against Notre Dame as a senior and missed the final seven games of the season. Tate joined the Patriots in the third round of the 2009 draft, but his rookie year was derailed by injury as he was placed on injured reserve on Nov. 14 after seeing action in only two games.



WOODHEAD GOES FROM DIVISION II TO THE NFL

Danny Woodhead was a standout at Division II Chadron State in Nebraska. He averaged 178.9 yards per game and totaled 101 rushing touchdowns during his collegiate career. Woodhead's outstanding junior and senior seasons earned him two Harlon Hill Trophies, the Division II equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. He is one of just three players to ever win two or more Harlon Hill Trophies, joining Texas A&M University-Kingsville running back Johnny Bailey, who won it three times (1987-89) before playing six seasons in the NFL for the Bears, Cardinals, and Rams. Valdosta State University's Dusty Bonner was the only other player to win the Harlon Hill Trophy multiple times (2000 and 2001). Cincinnati Bengals running back Bernard Scott (2008—Abilene Christian) joins Woodhead as active NFL running backs who have won the award. In his first game with the Patriots, Woodhead scored on a 22-yard run in the win vs. Buffalo (9/26).

EDELMAN GOES FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Julian Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Ca.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56% of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003.

WILFORK WEARS HIS HEART ON HIS NECK

Vince Wilfork wears No. 75 over his shoulder pads. Underneath hangs a gold chain locket for those who were number one in his heart: his parents. In 2002, parents David and Barbara Wilfork both passed away within five months of each other, leaving the then University of Miami star without his greatest support system. Wilfork, who lost his father to diabetes, has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for diabetes-related causes. His annual draft day fundraiser, a bowling event he has held for seven years, is one of the signature fundraising events held by a pro athlete in New England. For his charity work, Wilfork was awarded the 2010 New England Patriots Ron Burton Community Service Award. While he will always cherish his National Championship and Super Bowl rings, his constant reminder lies closest to his heart, a picture of his late parents at their high school prom. "I carry them with me wherever I go", Wilfork said of his parents' keepsake. "My parents pushed me to be the best I could be. The things I do and my wife does, we do out of the kindness of our heart, and we do it for the community. I never look for anything in return. My teammates are my second family. My kids, my wife, the New England Patriots - that's all I have."

ZOLTAN MESKO: COMING TO AMERICA

Rookie P Zoltan Mesko was born in Timosoara, Romania, on the Romania-Hungary border. On Many occasions in 1989, during the communist revolutions, his family was forced to take cover by diving on the floor to avoid gun shots from the armies. Even after the fall of the Berlin Wall, his family lived in poverty. His family was finally able to escape Romania when his father won a United States Permanent Resident Card (green card) in the Diversity Immigrant Visa Lottery in 1997 when Mesko was 11.

MESKO DISCOVERS FOOTBALL

An avid soccer player from his days in Romania, Mesko had a strong leg. It was only when he came to America that he discovered his leg could take him places. In eighth grade, Mesko was playing kickball in the gym when he kicked the ball so high that he broke a light fixture. He was given a choice: pay for the light fixture or play football. With his family still struggling with money and football being a more popular sport than soccer at his school, the choice was an obvious one—Mesko decided to play football. His leg would land him numerous Division I Scholarships and admission offers from Ivy League schools. From these, Mesko chose to play football at Michigan.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: CB DEVIN MCCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 11th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin and Jason were cornerbacks in the Rutgers secondary from 2005-08. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother Wasswa played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox.

ALL IN THE FAMILY: TE ROB GRONKOWSKI

Rookie TE Rob Gronkowski grew up playing football against his brothers in the backyard. Now, he has a chance to play against them in the NFL. Dan Gronkowski, the oldest of the bunch, is currently in his second season as a TE for the Denver Broncos, while 23-year old Chris is currently a rookie with the Dallas Cowboys as a fullback. The Gronkowskis are among 22 different sets of brothers currently in the NFL, yet they are the only family that can claim to have three siblings in the league. According to the Pro Football Hall of Fame, the Gronkowski brothers join nine other familes to have at least three brothers playing at the same time.

GREETINGS FROM KAARST, GERMANY: SEBASTIAN VOLLMER MAKES HIS MARK

A native of Kaarst, Germany, Vollmer did not begin playing football until the age of 14 when he started playing for the Dusseldorf club team. Vollmer helped lead his German prep school team to two national football championships. His early football success landed him an appearance in the 2004 Global Junior Championships in San Diego, which led him to a scholarship at Houston. He spoke almost no English when he signed with Houston, but he became fluent in the language as he developed from a 250-pound tight end into a 315-pound lineman who started his final 25 games at tackle for the Cougars. Vollmer's collegiate career created interest from the NFL where the Patriots drafted him in the second round of the 2009 draft. Earned the nickname, Seabass, during his playing days at Houston. The nickname has carried over to the NFL.

PATRICK CHUNG'S JOURNEY TO THE NFL

Long before S Patrick Chung picked up flag football as a teen, his mother, Jamaican recording artist Sophia George, had preached about being a tough man in a song. Her hit single, "Girlie Girlie" - a traditional reggae song about poking fun at a boy who was not man enough - topped the charts in 1985. Chung is aware that among his talents he was born with, speed and agility, singing is not one of them. Chung, who possesses a great sense of pride in his unique heritage - his mother is Jamaican and his father is half Jamaican and half Chinese, was born in Jamaica and moved to California at age 12 where he started to play football as a freshman in high school. Chung went on to star at Oregon, where he holds the distinction of starting more games than any other defensive player in school history with 51 starts. He original entered the draft as junior but ultimately decided to return for his senior season. Pinned to the back of his locker is a reminder of the support he has gotten to this stage, a Jamaican flag that indicates his family's importance to him.

BENJARVUS GREEN-ELLIS - THE LAW FIRM

BenJarvus Green-Ellis, who earned the nickname the Law Firm from his Patriots teammates because of his multi-part name. was signed by the Patriots as an undrafted free agent in 2008 out of the University of Mississippi. As a rookie, he recorded touchdowns in four straight games after being called up from the practice squad in October. His knack for finding the end zone has continued this season as he has reached the end zone a career-high six times, including his first two-touchdown performance vs. Minnesota (10/31). Green-Ellis also had a 112-yard rushing performance against the Vikings with 62 yards on the Patriots' final fourth quarter touchdown drive that extended a 3-point lead to a 10-point cushion in a 28-18 victory.

PRO BOWL BALLOTING BEGINS

NFL Pro Bowl balloting has begun and runs from through Dec. 20. Fans may vote for their favorite NFL players to represent the AFC and NFC in the 2011 Pro Bowl on Sunday, Jan. 30 from Aloha Stadium in Honolulu, Hawaii. Fans may vote online or on Web-enabled mobile



phones by going to nfl.com/probowl. The AFC and NFC All-Star squads are determined by the consensus votes of fans, players and coaches. Each group's vote counts one-third towards determining each conference's 43-man roster. NFL players and coaches will cast their votes on Dec. 22-23. The Pro Bowl teams will be announced at 4:00 p.m. EST on Tuesday, Dec. 28 in a Pro Bowl Selection Show on NFL Network. The NFL is the only sports league that combines voting by fans, coaches and players to determine its all-star teams.

PATRIOTS HAVE TOP TELEVEISION RATINGS

The Patriots are on a record-setting pace for household ratings through eight weeks in their designated market area with a 32.1 HH rating. This season, the Patriots have also been part of two record-setting NFL broadcasts. New England's 23-20 overtime victory over Baltimore on Sunday, Oct. 17 helped CBS set the mark for the highest rating for its single game window since it acquired the current AFC package in 2008. The Patriots-Jets game on Sunday, Sept. 19 was the most watched September CBS game ever.

BRADY-TO-TATE FOR LONGEST PLAY FROM SCRIMMAGE IN 2010

Brandon Tate's 65-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter of the Patriots win vs. Minnesota (10/31) was the Patriots' longest play from scrimmage in 2010 and was the team's longest play from scrimmage since Dec. 6, 2009, when Sam Aiken hauled in an 81-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady at Miami.

FREE AGENTS MAKE AN IMPACT

Fifteen players on the New England 53-man roster entered the NFL as rookie free agents. Two that came to the Patriots as rookie free agents have been consistent contributors on offense. Stephen Neal been a regular in the starting lineup at right guard since 2004. BenJarvus Green-Ellis, who came to the Patriots as a rookie free agent in 2008, has scored a touchdown in five straight games. Defensively, the Patriots have five players who have made a big impact. Mike Wright came to New England as a rookie free agent in 2005. He has recorded a sack in four consecutive games this season. Gary Guyton came to New England as a rookie free agent in 2008. In the opening game of the season, Guyton recorded his first career interception, which he returned for a touchdown. Kyle Arrington came to the Patriots as a rookie free agent in 2009 and has been a regular starter at cornerback this season. Both Sergio Brown and Dane Fletcher are rookie free agent signees from this past offseason who have made regular defensive and special teams contributions. Brown had five tackles including one that saved a first down against San Diego TE Antonio Gates that helped preserve the Patriots 23-20 victory over the Chargers. Fletcher had a forced fumble and three defensive tackles in that same game against the Chargers.



THE TEAM OF THE DECADE

hen Robert Kraft purchased the New England Patriots in 1994, few would have thought that just 16 years later the franchise would be the undisputed team of the decade in the first decade of the new millennium. Kraft brought a winning vision to the organization and dedicated his resources to building a consistent winner. On Jan. 27, 2000, Kraft hired Bill Belichick to coach the team, and three months later the team drafted then-unheralded quarterback Tom Brady, putting the final pieces in place for the Patriots to become the most successful NFL team of the 2000s.
