2019 SAINTS FINISH 13-3 AND CAPTURE THIRD STRAIGHT NFC SOUTH DIVISION TITLE; TEAM HOLDS 24TH PICK IN 2020 NFL DRAFT

2019 NEW ORLEANS SAINTS SEASON IN REVIEW

The New Orleans Saints (13-3) secured their third consecutive NFC South crown and hosted a playoff game for their third straight season for the first time in franchise history. The Saints, who posted a 7-1 record on the road, tied for the best mark away from home in franchise history and went 6-2 at home, have won 37 regular season games in the past three seasons under Head Coach **Sean Payton**, the highest win total in the league since 2017 as the first club to win at least 13 games in back-to-back campaigns since the 2016-17 New England Patriots.

WR **Michael Thomas** won his second consecutive NFL receiving title, totaling an NFL-record 149 receptions for 1,725 yards, the seventh-highest single-season total in league history and also a team record. Thomas' nine touchdown grabs tied for the team lead. Thomas was selected as a Pro Bowl starter and as a first-team AP All-Pro.

The quarterback position also featured significant contributions from all three players on the roster. QB **Drew Brees** became the NFL's all-time touchdown pass leader, as he completed 281-of-378 passes for 2,979 yards (74.3%) with 27 touchdowns and only four interceptions with a career-high 116.3 passer rating. Brees led the league in completion percentage for the third straight season and ranked second in passer rating. While Brees was sidelined with a right thumb injury, **Teddy Bridgewater** stepped in and won all five of his starts, completing 133-of-196 passes (67.9%) with nine touchdowns, two interceptions and a 99.1 passer rating. **Taysom Hill** excelled in a hybrid offense/special teams role, completing three of six passes for 55 yards, carrying 27 times for 156 yards with a TD and catching 19 passes for 234 yards and six scores.

Brees took advantage of two other weapons in his arsenal. TE **Jared Cook** posted 43 receptions for 705 yards and nine touchdowns, leading league tight ends with 16.4

yards per reception. RB **Alvin Kamara** became only the second Saint to post 1,300 total yards from scrimmage in three straight seasons and the first to be named to the Pro Bowl in each of his first three seasons. New Orleans ended the regular season having the fewest turnovers (eight) in a single season in NFL history and tied for the fewest lost fumbles (two). Brees, Thomas and T **Terron Armstead** were selected to the Pro Bowl. C **Erik McCoy**, the club's second round draft pick opened every contest and was named to the PFWA's All-Rookie team

The Saints defense, led by a group with a mix of youth and experience, advanced even further in defensive coordinator **Dennis Allen**'s fourth full season, posting 50 sacks for the first time since 2001, ranked third in the league with 51, led by Pro Bowl DE **Cameron Jordan** who posted 15.5 takedowns. LB **Demario Davis** led the team with 111 tackles and added four sacks in spearheading a unit ranked in the top-five in rushing defense for the first time since 1986-87. Both who provided the Saints defense with a solid veteran presence, were selected as *Associated Press* All-Pros. In the secondary, S **Vonn Bell** led the NFL with five fumble recoveries, CB **Marshon Lattimore** was selected to his second Pro Bowl, joining Jordan on defense and S **Marcus Williams** led the Black and Gold with four interceptions. DB **C.J. Gardner-Johnson** posted 46 tackles, one interception, eight passes defensed, one forced fumble and one recovery as he was PFWA All-Rookie.

Under the supervision of **Darren Rizzi** for the first season, the Saints boasted one of the top special teams in the NFL in 2019. Special teams were led by Pro Bowl selections in K **Wil Lutz**, who set a club-record with 32 field goals and a career-high 144 points and rookie WR/RS **Deonte Harris**, who averaged 26.8 yards per kickoff return and 9.4 yards per punt return with one touchdown. P **Thomas Morstead** ranked among league leaders with a 43.1 net punting average and second-year DB **J.T. Gray** led the coverage units with 16 special teams tackles and one blocked punt. Harris, who was selected with Lutz to the Pro Bowl, joined Gray as All-Pro selections.

GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Saints 30, Texans 28; September 9, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – After a rough start and trailing by as much as 11 points at halftime, the Saints pulled off a thrilling 30-28 comeback victory, complete with six sacks, a safety **Marcus Williams** pick, a balanced offense and a 58-yard field goal as time expired.

In the Monday night opener, QB **Drew Brees** finished with 370 passing yards, two touchdowns and a 105.8 rating. WR **Michael Thomas** topped the receiving corps with 123 yards on ten receptions. WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** added seven receptions for 101 yards and a 41-yard grab. RB **Alvin Kamara** led the team in rushing with 97 yards on 13 carries and had seven receptions for 72 yards. **Latavius Murray** carried six times for 43 yards with a 30-yard TD.

The rough start began with an unproductive first offensive drive for New Orleans followed by a series where Texans OLB **Whitney Mercilus** picked off a Brees pass intended for Murray at the Houston four-year line. Houston QB **Deshawn Watson** then engineered a seven-play, 94-yard drive that ended with a 21-yard rushing touchdown by the third-year signal-caller. New Orleans' offense wouldn't remain scoreless for long though as K **Wil Lutz** drilled a 32-yard field goal. The Texans then extended the lead to 14-3 on a two-yard touchdown from Watson to WR **Deandre Hopkins**.

The Saints got the ball first in the third quarter and scored their first touchdown of 2019 and moved within four on Murray's scoring run. But the Texans answered with a 16-yard touchdown connection from Watson to Hopkins. However on New Orleans' next possession, the Saints answered back with a seven-yard touchdown pass from Brees to QB **Taysom Hill**, followed up by Williams' pick.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, New Orleans took their first lead of the night when Brees connected with wide receiver **Tre'Quan Smith** on a 14-yard touchdown. Following another Lutz field goal, the Texans answered when Watson found Texans wide receiver **Kenny Stills** for a 37-yard touchdown connection with 37 seconds left in the contest.

Brees then completed three quick passes and spiked the ball twice. After New Orleans used their final timeout, Lutz, who missed a 56-yard field goal near the end of the first half, connected on a career-long 58-yard field goal as time expired to give the Saints the win. For his last-second heroics, saints head coach **Sean Payton** awarded Lutz with a game ball.

Lutz was perfect on all three point after tries, and drove all five of his kickoffs out for touchbacks. It was New Orleans' first season opening victory since 2013.

WEEK 2: Rams 27, Saints 9; September 15, 2019 @ Los Angeles Veterans Memorial Coliseum – New Orleans struggled to put together consistent drives on offense and despite a gritty defensive effort, struggled on offense when both **Drew Brees** and **Teddy Bridgewater** quarterbacked the team after Brees was sidelined with a right thumb injury that required surgery and sidelined him for five subsequent contests. After struggling with penalties, the Saints offense was unable to overcome that on third down, finishing just 4-of-13 on their third down attempts.

Following an interception by Rams S **John Johnson**, Los Angeles capped their first drive, a seven-play 3:43 minute drive with a 24-yard field goal by K **Greg Zuerlein** to get on the scoreboard first, a lead they never relinquished. After a second unsuccessful series by the Saints Brees was forced to leave the game with a thumb injury. However, the Rams offense was unable to score on their next three offensive drives, as a sack by defensive end **Cameron Jordan** ended one and a fumble recovery by the All-Pro end the other.

On the Saints' first possession of the second quarter, powered by a 19-yard punt return by WR/RS **Deonte Harris**, K **Wil Lutz** connected on a 30-yard field goal to put the Saints on the board. Following a failed fourth down attempt by the Saints and a subsequent 20-yard run by Rams RB **Todd Gurley**, Zuerlein converted a 22-yard field goal at the end of the first half. Besides a pair of field goals, the Saints offense wasn't able to get going in the second half and the Rams used an four-yard touchdown run by Gurley and a two-yard touchdown connection between QB **Jared Goff** and WR **Brandin Cooks** to extend the lead.

WEEK 3: Saints 33, Seahawks 27; September 22, 2019 @ CenturyLink Field – RB **Alvin Kamara** powered the New Orleans offense, grinding out 161 total yards from scrimmage and two touchdowns to stake the Saints to a 33-27 victory. The Saints defense and special teams did the rest, stopping four fourth down conversions and dominating the kicking game, while creating 13 points.

Kamara rushed for 69 yards and caught nine passes for 92 yards, scoring touchdowns on the ground and through the air. QB **Teddy Bridgewater**, starting in place of an injured **Drew Brees**, completed 19-of-27 passes for 177 yards with two touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 112.7 rating as the Saints garnered their first road win of 2019.

While the Saints defense surrendered 515 total net yards, they made big plays at the most opportune times, including stopping four fourth down attempts for the first time since at Jacksonville, Oct. 2, 2011. Seattle running backs only accounted for 58 yards on 19 carries, while CB **Eli Apple** forced Seahawks RB **Chris Carson** to fumble in the second quarter and it was picked up by S **Vonn Bell**, returned 33 yards for a touchdown. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

Special teams also played an important role in the victory in several facets. Early in the first quarter, rookie WR/RS **Deonte Harris** returned a punt 53 yards for a TD to give New Orleans a 7-0 lead. P **Thomas Morstead** and the club's coverage units were dominant in the kicking game as he punted six times for 324 yards for a 52.0 net. Four of Morstead's punts fell inside the 20-yard line, two inside the five. DB **J.T. Gray** had a career-high and game-high three special teams stops.

- Bell finished with nine total tackles, one pass defended and the fumble recovery returned for a touchdown
- Kamara led New Orleans in receiving with nine grabs for 92 yards with a 29-yard scoring touchdown. WR **Michael Thomas** caught five passes for 54 yards and a one-yard touchdown as he joined Odell Beckham Jr. and Anquan Boldin as the only players in NFL history with at least 300 catches and 4,000 receiving yards in their first 50 games.
- An inspired effort against the run surrendered only 58 yards rushing on 19 carries to Seattle running backs, including only 53 yards on 15 carries (3.5 avg.) with one fumble lost for Seahawks starter **Chris Carson**. CB **Marshall Lattimore** led the Saints with a career-high 12 tackles (ten solo), while LB **Demario Davis** finished tied for second with Bell with nine stops.
- With the punt return for a touchdown by Harris and the fumble return for a score by Bell, it marked the third time in franchise history the Saints scored an offensive, defensive and special teams touchdown in the same game, joining at 31-24 win over Philadelphia at Tulane Stadium on Nov. 5, 1967 and a 31-24 loss at Minnesota on Nov. 8, 1998.
- The victory gave New Orleans an 8-6 all-time record against the Seahawks in the regular season, their second consecutive victory against Seattle. After two postseason losses and one regular season loss in Seattle, it marked the first time the Saints won at CenturyLink Field since the 2007 season.

WEEK 4: Saints 12, Dallas Cowboys 10; September 29, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The New Orleans Saints won their second consecutive game, defeating Dallas at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in a contest dominated by defense and special teams. It marked the first time New Orleans won a game without scoring a touchdown since an Oct. 25, 1998 9-3 victory over Tampa Bay.

The Saints won the coin toss and deferred receiving until the second half of the contest. After the Cowboys punted

following their first offensive possession, Dallas took advantage of an interception off a bobbled ball by WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** and took possession at their 46-yard line. Dallas jumped out to a 3-0 lead compliments of a 28-yard field goal by K **Brett Maher**. New Orleans started pushing back in the contest when WR/RS **Deonte Harris** returned a kick-off 29 yards in a drive that spanned the first and second quarters and went nine plays and 52 yards, K **Wil Lutz** drilled a 40-yard field goal. New Orleans then forced a quick three-and-out, Harris returned the punt to the Saints 49-yard line and Lutz hit a 42-yard field goal to give New Orleans the edge. A potential score was averted when on a completion from Cowboys QB **Dak Prescott** to TE **Jason Witten**, LB **A.J. Klein** punched the ball out and it was recovered by S **Vonn Bell**. Towards the end of the quarter, Bell forced a fumble by Cowboys RB **Ezekiel Elliott** and recovered it, setting the stage for a 19-yard field goal by Lutz and a 9-3 Saints halftime lead.

Midway through the third quarter, Prescott completed a pass for a 35-yard gain to TE **Blake Jarwin**, that set up a one-yard rushing TD by Elliott to give the Dallas a 10-9 lead.

Between the third and fourth quarters, QB **Teddy Bridgewater** drove the offense 67 yards in 15 plays on a drive that lasted 9:06 and Lutz drilled a 26-yard field goal for the lead. New Orleans held on for the win with DT **David Onyemata** dropping Prescott for a 11-yard loss and S **Marcus Williams** picking him off on the final play of the contest to seal the victory.

Bridgewater threw for 193 yards and WR **Michael Thomas** had nine receptions for 95 yards tie Odel Beckham Jr. for reaching 350 career catches in the fewest games in NFL history (52 games). Defensively, Bell led the team with ten total tackles.

Week 5: Saints 31, Buccaneers 24; October 6, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – New Orleans put together one of their more complete games as they recorded a victory over their NFC South divisional rivals in the start of their 2019 division slate.

After gaining three first downs on their first possession, New Orleans was forced to punt. However, on Tampa Bay's next offensive possession, the Saints defense forced a three-and-out and a punt. Starting the ensuing drive on their own 36-yard line, QB **Teddy Bridgewater** would lead a nine-play, 53-yard drive that culminated in a **Wil Lutz** 29-yard field goal to give the Saints the early lead. Two possession later, after Buccaneers CB **Sean Murphy-Bunting** picked off Bridgewater after a ball bounced off of WR **Ted Ginn Jr.**, QB **Jameis Winston** and the Tampa Bay offense took advantage of great field position as he found WR **Chris Godwin** for a 26-yard TD to take a 7-3 lead.

On the next Saints possession, they regained the lead, with Bridgewater connecting with WR **Michael Thomas** on a 14-yard TD. Tampa Bay K **Matt Gay** connected on a 42-yard field goal to tie the score in again. But the Saints took the lead back with 37 seconds left in the first half when Bridgewater and TE **Jared Cook** connected for a nine-yard TD.

The Saints then got the ball coming out of the second half and Bridgewater connected on a 42-yard completion to Thomas and two plays later found Ginn for a 33-yard TD. The Buccaneers struck back by going on a 17-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a two-yard TD run by RB **Peyton Barber** to put the Buccaneers back within seven. Near the end of the third quarter, the Saints were pinned back at their nine on third-and-ten and Bridgewater found Thomas for a 20-yard completion to keep a crucial drive alive.

The drive stayed alive in the fourth quarter, eventually going for 13-plays and 91 yards as Bridgewater found Thomas for a nine-yard TD, as the signal-caller tied his career-high for scoring throws. The clubs traded three and outs, but the Saints pass rush became active with three sacks on a single Tampa Bay offensive series to force a punt. The Buccaneers offense struck again with Godwin hauling in a 26-yard TD from Winston to make it a one-score game. But the onside kick attempt went out of bounds to give New Orleans the ball back for a victory formation.

WEEK 6: Saints 13, Jaguars 6; October 13, 2019 @ TIAA Bank Field – The Saints won their fourth consecutive game and improved their record on the season to 5-1, despite missing QB **Drew Brees** for throughout the winning streak defeating Jacksonville in a contest dominated by both defense and special teams, with timely offensive plays mixed in. It marked the first time New Orleans didn't surrender a touchdown in a contest since a 20-0 shutout of the Miami Dolphins in London on October 1, 2017.

The Jaguars won the toss and deferred to receive. The clubs traded punts for their first two possessions. New Orleans jumped out to a 3-0 lead compliments of a 47-yard field goal by K **Wil Lutz**. New Orleans took a bend but don't break approach on a Jacksonville drive midway through the second quarter as Jaguars QB **Gavin Minshew** completed 12- and 22-yard passes to WR **D.J. Chark**, followed by some nifty runs by RB **Leonard Fournette**. But the Saints kept the Jaguars out of the end zone at their four-yard line and forced a 22-yard **Josh Lambo** field goal to close out the only first half scoring.

New Orleans recorded the game's only takeaway on the

first drive of the second half when CB **Marshon Lattimore** picked off a pass intended for Chark. The Saints took the lead back on the next drive when Lutz drilled a 21-yard field goal. Midway through the third quarter, Minshew completed a pass for a 23-yard gain to WR **Dede Westbrook**, that set up a 32-yard Lambo field goal.

Between the third and fourth quarters, New Orleans QB **Teddy Bridgewater** drove the offense 75 yards in 11 plays on a drive that lasted 6:22 and he eventually connected with TE **Jared Cook** on a four-yard touchdown pass to put the Saints ahead for good. New Orleans then defended a Jacksonville drive on downs at the Saints 40 and despite a quick three and out, then forced a Jaguars punt. The Saints then wouldn't give the ball back, holding it for the final 6:09 of the contest, converting three first downs.

Bridgewater threw for 240 yards and WR **Michael Thomas** had eight receptions for 89 yards. DE **Cameron Jordan** recorded two sacks to move into a tie with OLB **Pat Swilling** for third place on the club's all-time list.

WEEK 7: Saints 36, Bears 25; October 20, 2019 @ Soldier Field – S Vonn Bell and LB **A.J. Klein** recorded fumble recoveries, one of which QB **Teddy Bridgewater** converted into a touchdown pass to help New Orleans increase their winning streak to five contests with a 36-25 victory over the Chicago Bears at Soldier Field, the Saints' fifth consecutive over the Bears.

The Saints held Chicago to only 17 rushing yards, the fifth-lowest opponent total in franchise history and kept the Bears run offense from getting a first down for only the fourth time in franchise record books. As part of the dominating defensive performance, DE **Cameron Jordan** recorded two sacks to move into sole possession for third place on the club's all-time list past Pat Swilling.

RB **Latavius Murray** rushed for 119 yards and two touchdowns, New Orleans' first 100-yard rusher of 2019. He added 31 yards on five receptions for 150 yards from scrimmage. Bridgewater improved his touchdown pass-interception ratio on the season to 9-2, throwing scoring throws to TE **Josh Hill** and QB **Taysom Hill**. WR **Michael Thomas** had nine receptions for 131 yards (14.6 avg.). Bridgewater competed 23 of 38 passes for 281 yards and a 100.9 rating.

New Orleans jumped out to a 9-0 lead on a safety from a **J.T. Gray** blocked punt and a Bridgewater-Hill TD connection. The Bears took the lead early in the second quarter on **Eddy Pineiro's** 46-yard field goal but New Orleans took the lead for good on a 39-yard kick by **Wil Lutz**, his NFL-record 35th consecutive road field goal. That was the start of 27 unanswered points by New Orleans.

WEEK 8: Saints 31, Cardinals 9; October 27, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The Saints improved to 7-1, powered by an offensive attack that tied a season-high with 510 total net yards, welcomed back by the return of QB **Drew Brees** and a defense that did not allow a touchdown for the second time this season and the second time in three weeks.

The Cardinals opened the scoring with 5:41 left in the first quarter when K **Zane Gonzalez** drilled a 31-yard field goal. After Brees connected with QB **Taysom Hill** on a 22-yard completion to set up a 26-yard field goal by kicker **Wil Lutz**, the Saints would not trail again in the contest where he returned from right thumb surgery that sidelined him for five games.

Midway through the second quarter, running back **Lata-vius Murray**, who led the saints in rushing with 102 rushing yards, 157 total yards from scrimmage and two touchdowns, scored on an eight-yard rush. On Arizona's next possession, Gonzalez booted a 31-yard field goal to cut New Orleans' lead to 10-6.

Midway through the third quarter, after the Saints stopped the Cardinals on a fourth and one attempt at their 30 on a stop for no gain by defensive tackle **David Onyemata**, Brees led New Orleans on five-play, 30-yard drive, ending with a 15-yard touchdown pass to Murray, the running back's first career scoring grab. Brees finished completing 34-of-43 passes for 373 yards with three TDs and one interception with a 116.4 rating.

With the Cardinals in rally mode, trailing 17-9 at the end of the third quarter after a 50-yard field by Gonzalez, Hill caught a five-yard touchdown from Brees at the start of the fourth quarter. On the next play from scrimmage, a Saints team sack, set the Cardinals back to second and 20 at their 15-yard line and would force a punt. plays later, Brees connected for a touchdown for the final time on the afternoon, when he hit wide receiver **Michael Thomas** for a nine-yard touchdown to seal the win for New Orleans heading into their Week 10 bye.

- A swarming New Orleans defense allowed only 237 net yards and allowed Cardinals quarterback **Kyler Murray** to complete only 19-of-33 passes for 222 yards with zero touchdowns and a 77.8 passer rating
- Brees tossed three touchdowns, giving him 159 career games with at least two touchdown passes, tied with Brett Favre for the third-most such games in NFL history.
- The New Orleans defense held the Cardinals to only 115 first half total net yards, while all four Black and Gold sacks occurred in the second half. LB **Demario Davis** led the standout defensive effort with a team-high eight tackles

(seven solo), while DE **Cameron Jordan** recorded two a sack to reach eight takedowns for the midpoint of the season.

WEEK 10: Falcons 26, Saints 9; November 10, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – New Orleans' return to action following a Week Nine bye would be a forgettable one, as they would suffer their first loss after a bye since the 2015 season at the hands of their divisional rivals. Despite QBs **Drew Brees** and **Taysom Hill** putting up 304 passing yards through the air, S **Marcus Williams** intercepting Falcons QB **Matt Ryan** and WR/RS **Deonte Harris** and K **Wil Lutz** excelling on special teams, 12 penalties and allowing Brees to get sacked six times set New Orleans back.

The two clubs traded field goals to open, as New Orleans scored their first points of 2019 on an opening offensive drive. However Atlanta scored a touchdown on a 17-play, 75-yard drive that stretched into the second quarter, ending with an eight-yard touchdown pass from Ryan to tight end **Austin Hooper**.

New Orleans was on the verge of getting off the field for a field goal attempt, but three penalties in Saints territory resulted in first downs. The clubs traded punts and then field goals, Atlanta went into halftime with a 13-6 edge.

After trading punts to open the second half, Harris returned a punt 19 yards to the Atlanta 38, but a sack of Brees in the red zone forced a third Lutz field goal. Atlanta then chewed 6:12 off the clock on a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a ten-yard touchdown pass from Ryan to running back **Brian Poole**.

After New Orleans was forced to punt, Atlanta kicked a field goal, followed by another loss on downs, but the Saints got New life trailing 23-9 midway through the fourth quarter when Williams picked off Ryan. But the Saints failed to execute and had their six-game winning streak snapped.

Wide receiver **Michael Thomas** enjoyed another standout day in what has become another record-setting fourth campaign, grabbing a season-high 13 passes for 152 yards. He became the fastest player to 400 receptions in his 56th career game and no player has matched his 401 catches through their first four seasons. Leading the NFL in both receiving and receiving yardage with 86 grabs for 1,027 yards with four touchdowns. He also moved into fourth place in club record books with his 14th career 100-yard receiving game

Williams' pick was his team-leading third of the season and he is currently tied for fifth in the league in interceptions. New Orleans linebacker **Demario Davis** led a Saints defense ranked fifth in the NFL with a game-high 11 tackles and their only sack.

WEEK 11: Saints 34, Buccaneers 17; November 17, 2019 @ Raymond James Stadium – Vonn Bell, Demario Davis, Marcus Williams and P.J. Williams each recorded interceptions, one of which **Marcus Williams** brought back 55 yards for a touchdown and an efficient offense and special teams helped New Orleans rebound from a Week 10 loss to get their first season sweep of Tampa Bay since 2014.

Running back **Alvin Kamara** posted 154 all purpose yards including 13 carries for 75 yards (5.8 avg.), ten receptions for 47 yards and a 27-yard punt return to set up a touchdown. Quarterback **Drew Brees** completed 28-of-35 (80.0%) of his passes for 228 yards with three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 122.4 passer rating, while the New Orleans offensive line kept his jersey clean. Wide receiver **Michael Thomas** posted eight receptions for 114 yards with one touchdown as he became the first player in National Football League history to have 90 catches in each of his first four seasons. Tight end **Jared Cook** had a 30-yard grab and a three-yard touchdown.

In addition to the four picks, the Saints defense surrendered only 36 rushing yards on the day and defensive end **Cameron Jordan** posted 1.5 sacks.

- Linebacker **Demario Davis** tied for a team lead with six tackles, had his first regular season interception as a Saint and a career-high four passes defended.
- P.J. Williams started in place of an injured **Marshon Lattimore** and posted his first interception of the season to go with three solo tackles.
- Linebacker **Kiko Alonso** led the team with six solo tackles and deflected the pass intercepted by Bell at the end of the first half.

WEEK 12: Saints 34, Panthers 31; November 24, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – QB Drew Brees, WR Michael Thomas and K Wil Lutz celebrated a decisive string of late-game successes that put New Orleans on the cusp of a third straight NFC South crown. The Panthers could only lament the first-and-goal they squandered just moments earlier in a third straight loss. Lutz kicked a 33-yard field goal as time expired, and New Orleans beat Carolina 34-31 on Sunday to take a four-game lead in the NFC South with five games left. "It's exciting. It's butterflies. But also, it's confidence," said Brees, who led the Saints from their own 14-yard line with 1:51 left to the Carolina 15 with three seconds remaining. "It's unity. You feel like everybody knows the challenge ahead. Everybody knows what we need to do in order to accomplish whatever it is we need to accomplish to go win the game. Everybody just kind of locks in and goes." Lutz's second game-winning kick this season capped a contest filled with late momentum shifts and critical errors

— none bigger than Carolina K **Joey Slye's** missed field goal from 28 yards with 2 minutes left. Carolina trailed from early in the first quarter until 9:23 remained in the fourth quarter, when **D.J. Moore** reached up with his right hand to corral a fourth-and-goal pass in the back of the end zone to tie it at 31.

Soon after, Panthers S **Eric Reid** stuffed RB **Alvin Kamara** on fourth-and-1 from the New Orleans 45. That set up a dramatic sequence in which Carolina head coach **Ron Rivera** successfully challenged officials' decision not to call pass interference on a third-down incomplete pass, giving Carolina a first down on the 3 with 2:21 left.

Panthers RB **Christian McCaffrey's** run was stuffed, QB **Kyle Allen** threw incomplete on second down and Allen was sacked on third down by Saints DE **Marcus Davenport**, setting the stage for the end of a difficult day for Slye, who'd also missed two extra-point kicks.

"I feel terrible," Slye said. "We needed this win."

Brees finished 30 of 39 for 311 yards and three touchdowns, but also was intercepted by Panthers S **Tre Boston**, a play that helped Carolina come back in the fourth quarter. Thomas had 10 catches for 101 yards and a touchdown for New Orleans (9-2), including receptions of 14 and 24 yards on the game-winning drive as he posted 100 receptions for the third consecutive season and became the first Saint with five straight contests of at least 100 receiving yards.

"We work that situation week in and week out and it always comes up to benefit us," Thomas said of the Saints' hurry-up offense. "I'm just grateful for not cheating the preparation."

Allen passed for 256 yards and three touchdowns for Carolina (5-6).

"It is incredibly frustrating," Allen said. "Some weeks it's been offense, some weeks it's been defense. We've just got to put it together and play a complete game."

McCaffrey had 133 yards and two touchdowns from scrimmage on a balance of runs and receptions. Moore had six catches for 126 yards and two TDs, the first a 51-yarder. Saints TE **Jared Cook** had six catches for 99 yards, including a 20-yard touchdown, and RB **Latavius Murray** scored the game's first touchdown on a 26-yard run.

WEEK 13: Saints 26, Atlanta Falcons 18; November 28, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium – The Saints have clinched the NFC South division title with a 26-16 win over the Atlanta Falcons on Thanksgiving night. This marks the third consecutive season that the Saints have won the NFC South, the best such streak in franchise history. The Saints' victory over the Falcons avenged a humbling setback against Atlanta in Week 10, a 26-9 loss at home that ended a six-game winning streak for New Orleans. The Falcons made the Saints sweat it out late, making a frenzied late-game comeback attempt. The Falcons were successful on consecutive onside kicks. The first successful onside kick came after a touchdown trimmed the Saints' lead to 26-15, and led to a **Younghoe Koo's** field goal that made it a one-possession game. However, the Falcons couldn't capitalize on the second successful onside kick. The drive was thwarted at midfield as **Cameron Jordan** sacked **Matt Ryan** on fourth down to end the comeback threat.

"We had to drop back and pass at the end of the game," Ryan said. "When you do that and there's really no threat of run, it's tough sledding, particularly when you're going against a good defense, a very good defensive line and one of the better pass rushers in the game in Cam Jordan."

Taysom Hill displayed his versatility. He blocked a punt. That led to the Saints' first touchdown, which was scored by Hill. He later ran for a touchdown on a third-and-1 play late in the second quarter.

"When you have guys like Mike Thomas, Alvin Kamara, Jared Cook, the list goes on, it kind of creates opportunities for little old me because it creates so much attention that's put on those guys," Hill said.

WEEK 14: 49ers 48, Saints 46; December 8, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The Saints took the 49ers, who now have the NFC's best record (11-2), to the limit before dropping a 48-46 heartbreaker.

49ers K **Robbie Gould**'s 30-yard field goal as time expired was the difference. After New Orleans jumped out to a 27-14 second quarter lead in scoring touchdowns on their first four possessions, San Francisco took their first lead into halftime at 28-27. After New Orleans regained the lead for a short time in the second half, the 49ers kept the edge for the majority of the third and fourth quarters until QB **Drew Brees** engineered a seven-play, 76-yard drive with an 18-yard touchdown pass to WR **Tre'Quan Smith** with 53 seconds left. But San Francisco rallied as 49ers QB **Jimmy Garoppolo** led a seven-play, 63-yard drive to set up the win keyed by a 39-yard completion to TE **George Kittle** on fourth-and-two to set up the game-winner.

WEEK 15: Saints 34, Colts 7; December 16, 2019 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – **Drew Brees** trotted along the sideline holding his helmet and a Hall of Fame-bound ball in his left hand while using his right hand to wave and blow kisses to an adoring Mercedes-Benz Superdome crowd.

Another milestone, another memory, for an undersized and once underestimated player who has broken just about every significant record a quarterback can break — and doesn't look anywhere near done at age 40.

Brees became the NFL's all-time leader in touchdown passes, throwing for four scores to lead the Saints to a 34-7 victory over the Colts.

"It was special, everything about the night," Brees said. "It just kind of makes your whole life and career flash before your eyes, because I never thought I'd have a chance to be part of something like this."

The scoring strike that broke Peyton Manning's record of 539 career touchdown passes came in the third quarter, when Brees hit TE **Josh Hill** for a 5-yard score. Brees' next pass in the game was the 541st scoring toss of his career, a 28-yarder to reserve QB and utility player **Taysom Hill** that put the Saints up 34-0.

"He's done that to a lot of defenses," Colts coach **Frank Reich** said. "When he gets like that. I don't know that anybody can stop him."

Now in his 19th season, the 6-foot Brees — a 2001 second

-round draft choice — came into the game already holding NFL records for completions with 6,792 and yards passing with 72,577. He built on those numbers while also setting a record for completion percentage in a game. He completed 29 of 30 passes — 96.7% — for 307 yards before being relieved by **Teddy Bridgewater** in the fourth quarter. That broke the mark Philip Rivers had held since completing 28 of 29 (96.6%) against Arizona last season.

"He had a hot hand, obviously," Saints coach **Sean Payton** said. "Guys were making plays, but that's awfully difficult to do."

The victory kept the Saints (11-3), who'd already won the NFC South, in the running with Seattle (11-3), San Francisco (11-3) and Green Bay (11-3) for one of the top two seeds in the NFC playoffs.

"There's a lot at stake right now relative to these games when you look at the top of the NFC," Payton said. "It's about winning and winning and winning and trying to give yourself the best chance in the postseason."

The Colts (6-8) were eliminated from playoff contention after losing their fourth straight and sixth out of seven. They were also left struggled to explain their lack of competitiveness in a game they needed to win.

"I wish I knew all the answers," Colts LB Darius Leonard said. "I hate losing more than I love winning."

Jacoby Brissett finished 18 of 34 for 165 yards against a Saints defense looking for redemption after allowing 48 points in a loss to the 49ers a week earlier.

Meanwhile, Colts defenders had no answer for Saints WR **Michael Thomas**, who caught 12 passes for 128 yards, including a 15-yard touchdown. Thomas' eighth game this season with at least 10 catches gave him 133 for the season, which is also the fourth-highest single-season total in NFL history.

Tre'Quan Smith caught a 21-yard touchdown pass for New Orleans.

Jordan Wilkins scored the Colts' lone TD on a 1-yard run in the fourth quarter.

FLUID RECORD

While Brees holds the career touchdown pass record for now, the New England Patriots' Tom Brady is only three behind at 538.

"It's a fluid record," Payton said. "There's still another quarterback in New England, so that will go back and forth as long as those two are playing."

The next-closest active player is Rivers with 395.

Brees wasn't about to underestimate Brady's ability to keep pace.

"He's such a stud. He's got a lot of rings and records," Brees said of Brady. "He's awesome."

HAILING HILL

Brees said the ball with which he threw his record-breaking TD would go to the Pro Football Hall of Fame and also sounded particularly pleased by who caught it.

"I love the fact it was Josh Hill," Brees said, noting that Hill made the team as an undrafted rookie in 2013 and has been reliable both on offense and special teams ever since.

"The epitome of a great teammate, kind of an unsung hero," Brees said. "He's done an unbelievable job. I have so much trust and confidence in him."

GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 16: Saints 34, Titans 28; December 22, 2019 @ Nissan Stadium – The Saints, behind a balanced offense, a record-breaking performance from WR **Michael Thomas** and a rebound by a defense that faced early schedules knocked down the Titans, 38-28. With the win, the Saints reached 12 wins for the second consecutive season for the first time in franchise history and gained ground in the race for a first-round postseason bye.

After falling behind 14-0 in the first quarter and experiencing some early struggles on offense, New Orleans scored touchdowns on four consecutive full possessions in the second and third quarters. QB **Drew Brees** completed 27-of-38 passes for 279 yards, with 11 of his throws and a 20-yard completion from QB **Taysom Hill** going into the hands of Thomas, who set the NFL single-season record for receptions, standing at 145 by the end of the contest. His catches went for 136 yards and one touchdown as his 1,688 yards are the tenth-highest total in league record books. The New Orleans running game was led by **Alvin Kamara**, who carried 11 times for 80 yards (7.3 avg.).

A hard-hitting New Orleans defense finished with five sacks, including a career-high two by LB **A.J. Klein**. When the Titans got the ball back from a failed fake punt attempt late in the fourth quarter at their 38-yard line, rookie S **C.J. Gardner-Johnson** tackled Tennessee WR **Kalif Raymond**, forced the football out and returned it 37 yards to the Titans 25-yard line in what would lead to New Orleans' final touchdown to seal the win.

- LB **Demario Davis** led the team with a game-high 11 tackles and a sack as he reached the century mark in stops for the second consecutive season.
- CB **P.J. Williams** moved to safety after **Marcus Williams** was forced to depart with a groin injury midway through the contest, playing the position for the first time since high school.
- WR/RS **Deonte Harris**, fresh off being the first Saints rookie to be signed as an undrafted free agent to be selected to the Pro Bowl, sparked the New Orleans return game, bringing back four kickoffs for 150 yards (37.5 avg.), including a 47-yard runback and also brought back four punts for 21 yards for 171 all-purpose yards.

WEEK 17: Saints 42, Panthers 10; December 29, 2019 @ Bank of America Stadium – While NFL records fell and were extended as the Saints closed out the regular season in style, the most importing thing was that the team exited the contest healthy and they walked out with a dominating win for their fourth 13-game win season and second consecutive.

New Orleans ran up at least 34 points in four consecutive contests for the first time in franchise history as their 35-3 halftime lead was their biggest edge after the first two quarters of a contest in franchise history, jumping out to a 35-0 lead.

- QB **Drew Brees** led the way by completing 19-of-30 passes for 253 yards with three touchdowns, zero interceptions and a 123.3 passer rating. This was Brees' NFL-record fourth consecutive game of at least three touchdown passes and zero interceptions.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** carried eight times for 39 yards with two touchdowns and also caught two passes for 18 yards as he joined **Deuce McAllister** (2002-04) as only the second Saint with 1,300 total yards from scrimmage in three consecutive seasons.
- TE **Jared Cook** had two receptions for 44-yards with a 21-yard touchdown to finish the season with a career-best nine scoring grabs, tied for first on the team and lead NFL tight ends with a 16.4 yards per catch average.
- WR **Michael Thomas** had four receptions for 37 yards to finish the season with an NFL-record 149 receptions for 1,725 yards, the seventh-highest receiving yardage total in NFL history.
- New Orleans swept the Panthers for the second time in three seasons as they tied the all-time series up at 25-25 in the regular season, taking a 26-25 lead including a 2017 NFC Wild Card Playoff win.
- LB **A.J. Klein** had a second quarter 14-yard interception return for a touchdown, the first touchdown of his NFL career.
- CB **Janoris Jenkins** made his first start as a Saint since joining the club two weeks ago and also made his first pick in a New Orleans uniform as he finished the season with a career-high five picks, tied for fourth in the NFL.

NFC WILD CARD PLAYOFF: Minnesota Vikings 26, New Orleans Saints 20; January 5, 2020 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The Saints dropped a 26-20 overtime thriller at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome and were knocked out of the playoffs in a game fitting of one of the NFL's best postseason rivalries in recent times.

Late in the third quarter, the Vikings enjoyed a comfortable 20-10 lead after RB **Dalvin Cook** rushed one yard in for his second touchdown at the 3:23 mark. But a fourth quarter Saints touchdown drive and field goal near the end regulation, combined with a stifling defense, sent the game into overtime.

But the Vikings won the coin flip in overtime and a nine-play, 75-yard drive by Minnesota QB **Kirk Cousins** that included a 43-yard completion to WR **Adam Thielen** and ended with a four-yard touchdown pass to TE **Kyle Rudolph** advanced the purple to the NFC Divisional round. **CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE**

New Orleans stormed back and tied the score at 20-20 with two sections left in regulation on a drive that started inside the two minute warning following a ten-yard punt return by rookie WR/RS **Deonte Harris**. A 14-yard completion from QB Drew Brees to TE **Jared Cook** put K **Wil Lutz** in range for a 49-yard field goal

On the first drive of the game, Thielen fumbled at the Vikings 37-yard line and the ball was picked up by S **Vonn Bell** to eventually set up a 29-yard field goal by Lutz. A 43-yard field goal by Vikings K **Dan Bailey** tied the score for the first quarter, with New Orleans forcing a punt on the last play of the stanza with a sack by DE **Trey Hendrickson**.

Midway through the second quarter, a 17-yard punt return by Harris set the Saints up at their 30. Three plays later, QB **Taysom Hill** and the rookie connected on a 50-yard completion followed by a four-yard rushing touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara**. A 21-yard Bailey field goal and an interception by Saints QB **Drew Brees** that was converted into a five-yard rushing touchdown by Cook, left the Saints trailing 13-10 at halftime.

- For the eighth contest in their last nine, the Saints held an opponent scoreless in the fourth quarter.
- Playing in his franchise-record 14th playoff game as a Saint and 15th postseason contest overall, Brees finished 26-of-33 for 208 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Brees' 26 completions moves his career postseason total to 434, surpassing Ben Roethlisberger to move into fifth all-time. The 208 passing yards gave him 4,967 in the postseason for his career, surpassing John Elway to move into sixth place all-time.
- Bell had seven stops and his sixth fumble recovery of the 2019 regular season and postseason.
- CB **Janoris Jenkins** made his Saints playoff debut and forced a fumble and had a split sack.
- Hill carried four times for 50 yards, completed the 50-yard pass, caught two passes for 25 yards, including a 20-yard scoring grab and had a special teams tackle.

PAYTON'S PLACE AMONG HEAD COACHES

Sean Payton has had an impressive run as head coach of the New Orleans Saints since being hired in 2006.

Payton has posted a 139-84 overall record (.623), including an 8-7 postseason mark after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival in 2006. Payton holds both the club's top victory total and winning percentage. Payton ranked 26th all-time in NFL record books in victories, fifth among active head coaches. He continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the division, but also among the most accomplished within the NFL. Only the Patriots' Bill Belichick (2000) has been with the his team longer than Payton's 14 seasons in New Orleans. Payton is also one of just seven active NFL head coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are Belichick, the Seahawks' Pete Carroll, the Raiders' Jon Gruden (Tampa Bay in 2002), the Ravens' John Harbaugh, the Eagles' Doug Pederson and the Steelers' Mike Tomlin.

The 2019 Saints edition posted a 13-3 regular season record for the second consecutive season and captured the NFC South division title for the third straight season. A franchise-record six players were selected to the *AP* All-Pro team and a club-best nine members of the team were named to the Pro Bowl. In showing great resiliency in all three phases, the Saints embarked on the first five contests of a six-game winning streak without QB Drew Brees, who was sidelined with a right thumb injury. New Orleans finished tied for third in the NFL in points per game and ranked in the top ten in offense for the 14th straight season. An aggressive and stingy defense ranked third in the NFL with 51 sacks, fourth in run defense and sixth in opponent third down conversion rate.

After the team had captured only two division titles prior to 2006, the club has six under Payton, including three straight NFC South titles from 2017-19, the first time the club won their division in consecutive seasons. The franchise has had 14 winning seasons overall in its 53-season history, eight of them happening under Payton's watch including the 2019 13-3 regular season mark.

Payton is the only head coach in Saints history with double-digit win totals in eight seasons, including the 2019 13-3 mark.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft, free agency and trade to the 2019 Saints offensive line:

LT Terron Armstead - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the National Football League Scouting Combine. He has opened 71 regular season games for New Orleans and six postseason contests and has been selected to the Pro Bowl the past two seasons, as well as being selected as the club's 2019 Man of the Year and the team nominee for the NFL's Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award..

C/G Nick Easton - Originally signed as an undrafted free agent by the Baltimore Ravens out of Harvard, Easton developed into a starting swing guard/center by his second season and opened 17 contests for Minnesota. The North Carolina native signed with New Orleans to provide interior depth and started the five consecutive contests at left guard in place of an injured Andrus Peat, the final four contests where the Saints surrendered only three quarterback takedowns.

T/G Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college offensive linemen in 2014. In his first five seasons, Peat's played in 62 games with 57 starts, opening a contest at every position except center. In 2018, he opened 12 regular season contests at left guard and one at left tackle and both postseason games at left guard as he was named to the Pro Bowl for the first time. He opened ten regular season contests and one postseason at left guard in 2019, named to his second Pro Bowl.

RT Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk out of Wisconsin, viewed by many as one of the best linemen in the entire draft. After opening all 16 games and both postseason contests in 2017 and being selected as a PFWA All-Rookie and subsequently opening all 31 regular season contests he has played in and all three postseason games in 2018 and 2019, being named an Associated Press All-Pro both seasons.

C Erik McCoy - New Orleans traded up in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft to select this standout from Texas A&M, who was a three-year starter, anchoring the middle of the Aggies offensive line. In 2018, he was a team captain who paved the way for the SEC's leading rusher and was the first Saint in franchise history to start at center in Week One, as he has able replaced the retired Max Ungler, opening all 16 regular season contests and being named PFWA All-Rookie.

RG Larry Warford - Originally selected by Detroit in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft (65th overall) out of Kentucky, this seventh-year blocker brought size, strength and foot quickness to the Saints' line in 2017, as he started all 14 regular season games he played in and both postseason contests at right guard. New Orleans' rush offense responded to his addition, as the ground game finished fifth in the NFL as he was named to the Pro Bowl for the first time in his career. In 2018, Warford opened the first 15 regular season games and both postseason contests for the NFL's sixth ranked rushing offense and third-ranked scoring club, as he was named to the Pro Bowl the second straight time. Warford opened 15 contests this season.

C/G Will Clapp - A technically proficient player, who through the combination of size, strength and intelligence, was a three-year starter on the LSU offensive line, starting all 36 games that he appeared in (13 at center, 12 at left guard, 11 at right guard), earning first-team All-SEC honors at guard and center. Blocking for 1,000-yard rushers in each of his three college seasons, the former Brother Martin standout settled in at center in 2017, where he was a first-team All-SEC selection and a Rimington Trophy finalist. Clapp made his first career start at left guard in the 2018 regular season finale. After his first full offseason in the club's offseason strength and conditioning program, Clapp provides depth on the interior of the Saints line and has also served as a jumbo tight end, seeing significant action as the club's sixth offensive lineman in each contest as well as at left and right guard in 2019.

T/G Patrick Omameh - Originally signed by San Francisco as an undrafted free agent in 2013, this former Michigan standout has played in 79 games with 57 starts in the regular season and three playoff starts at both tackle and guard for five different teams, possessing the flexibility to play either inside or outside. Omameh played at left tackle in three quarters of the Oct. 24 win over Carolina following an ankle injury to Armstead and then opened the Thanksgiving night victory at Atlanta, where the Black and Gold did not give up a takedown.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEFENSIVE DRAFTS

Over the last five NFL Drafts from 2015-19, New Orleans has shown a commitment to improving the defense, spending 17-of-28 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in the 2015 NFL Draft, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine defensive players in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the players selected by New Orleans from 2015-19 on the 53-man roster:

LB Stephone Anthony, Clemson (D1-15) - Selected in the first round (31st overall) of the 2015 NFL Draft out of Clemson, Anthony was a consensus All-Rookie selection when he led the Black and Gold with 144 tackles. Following a two season stint in Miami, Anthony returned to contribute on both defense and on special teams.

S Vonn Bell, Ohio State (D2b-16) - Selected in the second round (61st overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, Bell was a consensus All-American. As a senior, the Rossville, Ga. native was a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist after recording 65 tackles, two interceptions, one brought back for a touchdown, a fumble recovery and 11 passes defended. Bell has translated that collegiate success to the NFL with ease in his first four seasons, appearing in 61 games with 45 starts and filling up the stat sheet with 349 tackles (241 solo), eight sacks, 16 passes defended, seven forced fumbles and seven fumble recoveries, one brought back for a touchdown. In Weeks 3 and 4, Bell became the first Saint to post three takeaways in two weeks since 2017, recovering three fumbles, including returning one 33 yards for a touchdown at Seattle, Sept. 22 and recovering two in the second quarter of a 12-10 win over Dallas, Sept. 29, to go with a club-best ten tackles, a pass defended and forcing one of the two fumbles that he recovered. He's posted a secondary-best 86 stops, a pick, 1.5 sacks, six passes defended, two forced fumbles and five recoveries, first in the NFL. Bell's five recoveries are the most by a Saint since Sammy Knight's five in 2001. Bell recorded his first career pick in the Nov. 17 win at Tampa Bay.

DB C.J. Gardner-Johnson, Florida (D4-19) - Possessing a combination of instincts and speed, this Florida native was a solid value in the fourth round for New Orleans after playing in all 13 games with 12 starts for the Gators in 2018, when he posted 71 tackles, three sacks and four interceptions with two brought back for touchdowns. Gardner-Johnson has appeared in all 16 contests with seven starts, recording 46 tackles (35 solo), one interception, eight passes defended, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and three special teams stops as he was named PFWA All-Rookie.

DE Marcus Davenport, Texas-San Antonio (D1-18) -

Davenport joined the Saints with the 14th overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft after showing potential and production as a pass rusher at Texas-San Antonio. In four seasons, Davenport posted 22 sacks, including 8.5 in 2017 when he captured Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year. Davenport's strength on the line is a valuable asset for the Saints front, playing an important role in the club's packages in 2018, recording 4.5 sacks. Despite missing the final four games of the season, Davenport finished ranked second on the club with six takedowns, posting two sacks and a career-high three forced fumbles on Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, also leading the club with four forced fumbles and 12 games.

DE Trey Hendrickson, Florida Atlantic (D3c-17) - This third round draft choice in the 2017 NFL Draft (103rd overall) out of Florida Atlantic brought his raw talent, size, strength and speed to a youthful Saints defensive line. Hendrickson is ranked third on the team with a career-high 4.5 sacks. In the NFC Wild Card loss to Minnesota, Hendrickson added six stops and another quarterback takedown.

CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17) - The 11th overall selection in the 2017 NFL draft out of Ohio State and the first corner taken possesses all the traits of a lockdown defender. With his agile, fluid style, Lattimore has the ability to shut down the best wide receivers. He played a critical role in the pass defense unit as a rookie, as he moved into the lineup immediately. For the 2017 season, he finished with 53 stops, five picks, to lead NFL rookies and the Saints, tying a team rookie record, a club-best 18 passes defended, a forced fumble and a recovery. Lattimore was the first Saints corner selected to the Pro Bowl since 1995 and was selected as AP Defensive Rookie of the Year. His five takeaways (two interceptions and three fumble recoveries) in 2018 led the team, adding two more picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win. In the Sept. 22 win at Seattle, Lattimore led New Orleans with a career-high 12 tackles (career-high ten solo). In the Sept. 29 win over Dallas, he covered Dallas WR Amari Cooper who managed only five receptions for 48 yards and in the Oct. 6 win vs. Tampa Bay, WR Mike Evans didn't manage a catch, adding a pick Oct. 13 at Jacksonville. For his efforts, Lattimore was recognized by being selected to his second Pro Bowl after posting a club-best 14 passes defended.

DT David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16) - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first

player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being new to football, the 2016 fourth round draft pick became a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front in 2017, playing in all 16 games with six starts, making 40 tackles and two sacks. Onyemata had a career-high 4.5 sacks in 2018, including a single-game career best three takedowns in last year's matchup at Dallas, adding another fourth quarter takedown against the Cowboys, Sept. 29. Onyemata has provided a punch for the Saints defense, having started all 15 games that he has played in and recording 32 stops and three sacks to tie for fourth on the team, while being a key run-stopping cog to the NFL's fourth-ranked rush defense.

S Marcus Williams, Utah (D2-17) - A three-year starter at the University of Utah, Williams was twice named All-Pac 12 and earned second-team All-American as a junior when he tied for second in the conference with five interceptions. The defender boasts a dangerous mix of speed, fluidity, and instinct that allows him to read offenses and make breaks on the football. His athleticism showed in his rookie season in as he made 70 tackles, four interceptions and six passes defended, adding ten more stops (seven solo) and another pick in the postseason. In 2019, he's played in all 15 games with 14 starts, posting 52 tackles (35 solo), the team-high four picks, tied for eighth in the NFL, 13 passes defended, a forced fumble and two coverage stops.

CB P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15) - Williams' career was initially limited by missing all but two games his first two seasons with injuries, but he's rebounded to miss only one game with injury since. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners, he has made 41 stops, a sack, an interception, three passes defended and one special teams stop, serving as the team's nickel corner for the second straight season. In the Dec. 22 win at Tennessee, Williams further showed his versatility by making the switch to safety after Marcus Williams was forced to depart with a groin injury and then starting in Williams' place in the regular season finale at Carolina.

S Saquan Hampton, Rutgers (D6-19) - Selected in the sixth round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Rutgers, the New Jersey native stayed home for college and played in 39 games with 27 starts in the Scarlet Knights secondary, as he posted career totals of 177 stops with five interceptions, 19 passes defended and a fumble recovery. He opened all 12 games at free safety for the Scarlet Knights in 2018 and earned team Most Valuable Player honors with 65 stops, three picks, 13 passes defended and one fumble recovery. Hampton contributed on defensive and special teams in five contests, posting one stop for loss and is expected to compete for additional playing time at safety in 2020.

STOPPING THE RUN

In rush defense, the Saints gave up only 80.2 net yards per game in 2018, second in the National Football League after giving up 129.4 per game in 2017. The 2019 Saints finished the regular season ranked fourth in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game (91.3). 2018-19 marks only the second time they've done so in back-to-back seasons in franchise history, joining the 1986—1987 teams

FOURTH DOWN DEFENSE

In the September 22 33-27 win at Seattle, the Saints allowed the Seahawks to convert on fourth down attempts only once in five tries, stopping them four times. This marked the first time the Saints stopped an opponent on fourth down four times since a 23-10 win at Jacksonville, October 2, 2011. In the October 13 victory at Jacksonville, a fourth quarter fourth down stop at the New Orleans 40-yard line on fourth-and-two put New Orleans in the drivers seat.

SACK ATTACK

After tying the franchise record with nine sacks on Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, led by a career-high four from defensive end Cameron Jordan, who tied the franchise career-best, the Saints finished the regular season ranked third in the National Football League in quarterback takedowns. JUST KICKING IT

Between deep touchdown passes and athletic interceptions, players often use their hands to produce the game's flashiest plays. However, players who use their feet often make the difference between winning and losing, drilling clutch field goals or flipping the field with a well-executed punt.

K **Wil Lutz** went undrafted in 2016, joining the Baltimore Ravens for training camp. Prior to the start of the regular season, Lutz joined the Black and Gold and immediately took on placekicking and kickoff duties. Lutz has kicked in 64 games, converting 119-of-136 field goal attempts (87.5 percent) and 196-of-202 PATs. He's also recorded 245 touchbacks on 375 career kickoffs. His 87.5 percent field goal percentage is best among kickers with at least 50 made field goals in team history. Until the 2018 regular season finale, he'd kicked a field goal in a club-record 36 consecutive games, second-longest streak in National Football League history.

With his first field goal on October 20 at Chicago, Lutz set the National Football League record for consecutive field goals on the road (35).

Thomas Morstead was the first punter drafted by the Saints since 1984. The club's fifth round draft choice (164th overall) in 2009 from SMU, Morstead's been a weapon in the field position game with his strong leg, outstanding placement abilities and booming kickoffs. In 11 seasons, he has a gross average of 46.9 on 630 punts with a 41.6 net and 228 punts inside the 20-yard line, while also booming 259 kickoffs in the end zone for touchbacks. Morstead is ranked eighth on the club's all-time games played list with 174 regular season appearances and his consistency carried over to 2018, where he averaged a 46.4 gross punting average, a career-high and league-best 43.2 net punting average, with 15 dropped inside-the-20-yard line. In 2019, he finished the regular season fifth in the National Football League in net punting average (43.1).

SWISS ARMY KNIFE

New Orleans QB **Taysom Hill**, in his third year with the club, has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints on both offense and special teams. A participant on every special teams unit except field goal and PAT, as well as a signal-caller, runner and receiver on offense, in the 2018 regular season, Hill averaged 24.9 yards per return on 14 kickoff returns, had six coverage stops to rank second on the team, completed a ten-yard pass on a fake punt in Week Four and blocked a punt on December 9 at Tampa Bay. Overall in 2018, Hill carried 37 times for 196 yards (5.3 avg.), ranked third on the team with two touchdowns and completed three of seven passes for 64 yards. The blocked punt against the Buccaneers earned him Week 14 NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In the 2018 postseason, he caught a touchdown, made a special teams tackle and executed a successful fake punt.

In 2019, Hill appeared in every contest, carrying 27 times for 156 yards (5.8 avg.) with one touchdown, catching 19 passes for 234 yards with six touchdowns, deflecting a punt, returning one kickoff for 12 yards and posting two coverage stops. Hill is ranked third on the club in total touchdowns and third in receiving touchdowns. After a multi-threat performance on Thanksgiving night at Atlanta, when he deflected a punt and caught and rushed for a touchdown. Hill became the first NFL quarterback to both rush for and catch a touchdown in the same contest since Chicago's Jim McMahon in 1983, who also played at Brigham Young.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

COVERAGE/BLOCK UNITS

New Orleans' coverage units have been led the past three seasons by linebacker **Craig Robertson**, Hill and defensive back **Justin Hardee Sr.**

Hardee led the team with nine stops and a blocked punt recovered for a touchdown as a rookie in 2017. In 2018, Hardee led the team in the regular season with a career-high ten stops, with Hill ranked second with six stops. He posted five tackles in 2019.

Robertson, who is a two-time special teams team captain, has developed a reputation for his intelligence and knowledge and making timely plays in the kicking game. He made a big play in the November 4, 2018 win over Los Angeles when he stopped rams holder Johnny Hecker short of the first down marker on a fake field goal attempt. He did the same December 23, 2018 vs. Pittsburgh in a crucial fourth quarter situation to snuff out a fake punt attempt. Robertson had five special teams stops in 2019.

In another addition to the club's special teams units, second-year defensive back **J.T. Gray** led the team with 16 special teams stops, blocked a punt and recovered a fumble on a muffed punt as he was selected as an *Associated Press* All-Pro.

RETURN UNITS

Rookie wide receiver/return specialist **Deonte Harris** has made an impact on New Orleans' return game. Harris was signed following the NFL Draft out of NCAA Division II Assumption College in Worcester, Massachusetts, where he finished his college career as one of the most prolific returners in NCAA history. In the final game of his college career, he set the NCAA-All Division record for career combined return touchdowns (14).

In 2019, Harris has brought back 36 punts for 338 yards (9.4 avg.), ranked first in the NFC and fourth in the National Football in punt return average, ranked second among rookies, following a 53-yard runback for a touchdown in the first quarter of the Sept. 22 33-27 win at Seattle.

Harris has also returned 24 kickoffs for 644 yards (26.8 avg.), ranked second in the NFC and third in the NFL and has recorded one special teams stop.

On offense Harris has carried twice for 18 yards (9.0 avg.) and caught six passes for 24 yards.

Harris is the first player signed by New Orleans as an undrafted rookie following the draft to be selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie, as well as being *AP* first-team All-Pro.

DREW BREES

- Since first signing with New Orleans as an unrestricted free agent from the San Diego Chargers in 2006 and starting all 213 regular season games he has appeared in, a club record in both categories, Brees leads the National Football League with 65,068 passing yards, 467 touchdown passes, 8,352 attempts, 5,742 completions, a 68.8% completion percentage, 113 games with at least 300 yards passing, 16 with at least 400, 500 completions of 25 yards or more and stands at third in the league with a 101.3 passer rating.

- Since signing with the Saints as an unrestricted free agent in 2006 from the San Diego Chargers, Brees threw for 4,000 or more yards in his first 12 seasons with the club before sitting out the 2018 regular season finale at 3,992 and became the only National Football League signal-caller to throw for 5,000 yards five different times and ranked at or near the top in every passing category.

- Brees enjoyed another standout campaign in 2018, completing 364-of-489 passes (74.4%) for 3,992 yards with 32 touchdowns, only five interceptions and a 115.7 passer rating. Brees finished first in the National Football League with his league-record completion percentage, career-high passer rating, second in fourth quarter passer rating (118.9), third in third down passer rating (108.8) while setting the league's all-time records in both completions and passing yardage and moving into second place in Week 10 in scoring throws. He was selected as the Pro Bowl starter and as an *AP* All-Pro

- In 11 regular season games sandwiched between a right thumb injury in 2019, Brees completed 281-of-378 passes (74.3%) for 2,979 yards with 27 touchdowns, four interceptions and a career-high 116.3 passer rating. Brees finished the regular season ranked first in the National Football League in completion percentage, second in passer rating and fourth in fourth quarter passer rating (110.2).

- Brees has been selected to play in a team-record 12 Pro Bowls as a member of the Saints, with 13 overall berths in the National Football League's all-star game, three times as a starter, including his most recent selection in 2019. His seven consecutive selections (2008-14) as a Saint is tied for first in club history with Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle William Roaf and Brees has been a Pro Bowl selection for the last four campaigns.

- In the postseason, Brees has started all 15 games he has appeared in, completing 434-of-648 passes (67.0%) for 4,967 yards with 34 touchdowns, 12 interceptions and a 99.6 passer rating. He ranks fifth all-time in completions and passer rating, third in completion percentage and sixth in passing yards and touchdown passes.

- Brees has posted a 133-83 regular season mark in games he has started since signing with the Saints in 2006. In Week 15 of the 2016 season, Brees earned his 100th regular season victory in a Saints uniform. Including his eight playoff victories, his 141 total wins as a member of the Saints make him the winningest quarterback in team history and the National Football League's second-winningest signal-caller since 2006.

- In his 19-year National Football League playing career during which he has appeared in 275 regular season games with 274 starts, ranked fifth in league record books for signal-callers and ranked 23rd overall, Brees has completed 6,867-of-10,161 passes (67.6%) for 77,416 yards, 547 touchdown passes and a 98.4 passer rating. He's stands as the NFL's all-time most accurate passer, became the league's recordholder in completions on Sept. 23, 2018, the passing yardage leader on Oct. 8, 2018, is ranked first in touchdown passes and third in passer rating.

TEDDY BRIDGEWATER

- With Drew Brees sidelined following thumb surgery, sixth-year veteran Bridgewater's taken over the reigns of the offense. Bridgewater began his NFL career with the Vikings as the 32nd pick in the 2014 NFL Draft. He moved into the starters role in Week Four of his rookie season and went on to be selected the Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Year, leading the Vikings to the NFC North title the following season with a Pro Bowl selection. Overall, he has played in 43 games with 34 starts, completing 698-of-1,070 passes for 7,652 yards with 38 TDs, 25 interceptions and an 88.3 rating. Bridgewater has also carried 133 times for 434 yards with four touchdowns. In 34 career starts, Bridgewater has posted a 22-12 career record in the regular season.

- With starter Brees sidelined following thumb surgery for five games, the Miami native has played in seven games with five starts, completing 132-of-195 attempts (67.7%) for 1,370 yards with nine touchdowns, two interceptions and a 98.9 passer rating, while carrying 20 times for 39 yards and winning all five starts.

- Bridgewater received his first start of 2019 on Sept. 22 at Seattle and completed 19-of-27 passes for 177 yards with touchdown passes to Alvin Kamara and Michael Thomas, zero interceptions and a 112.7 passer rating. He also car-

ried three times for 12 yards in the 33-27 victory. It was Bridgewater's first win since the 2015 regular season finale.

- Bridgewater quarterbacked New Orleans to its second consecutive win on Sept. 29 vs. Dallas, completing 23-of-30 passes for 193 yards and engineering a 15-play, 67-yard drive that spanned 9:06 and ran into the fourth quarter, resulting in a go ahead field goal in rebounding from a 10-9 deficit, completing three-of-four passes for 22 yards. It was his first fourth quarter game-winning drive since a 21-18 win vs. The St. Louis Rams on Nov. 8, 2015.

- Bridgewater earned his 20th victory as a starter and third straight in a 31-24 win over Tampa Bay, Oct. 6, finishing 26-of-34 for 314 yards, four touchdowns, one interception and a 131.2 passer rating, the second-highest of his career. It was the second four-touchdown game of Bridgewater's career as he passed for over 300 yards for the sixth time. Bridgewater's 42-yard completion to WR Michael Thomas on the first play of the third quarter is his longest completion as a Saint. Joined Billy Kilmer (1969) and Brees as only the third Saints signal caller with 300 yards passing and four touchdown passes in the same contest.

- Bridgewater earned his fourth straight win in a 13-6 win at Jacksonville. He completed 24-of-36 (66.7%) of his passes for 240 yards, one TD, 0 interceptions and a 94.7 rating. He engineered a game-winning drive that spanned the third and fourth quarters and ended with a four-yard TD to TE Jared Cook to put New Orleans up 13-6.

- Bridgewater earned his 22nd career win as a starter and won five straight starts for the second time in his career, completing 23-of-38 passes for 281 yards, two TDs, 0 interceptions and a 100.9 rating in a 36-25 win at Chicago.

RUNNING BACKS

ALVIN KAMARA

- A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in total yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg.) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg.) with five TDs and a kickoff return for a touchdown for a club rookie record 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL. Kamara finished first in the NFL in yards per carry.

• Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an *Associated Press* second team All-Pro (flex), the clubs' first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and *AP* NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

ALVIN TIME

As a rookie in 2017 Kamara totaled 81 receptions, second-highest among running backs and the highest rookie reception total. His 826 receiving yards set a club record for running backs as well.

LATAVIUS MURRAY

• Originally a sixth round pick of the Raiders in the 2013 NFL Draft out of Central Florida, the versatile back brings a bruising style to the Black and Gold to complement Kamara. Signed as an unrestricted free agent from the Minnesota Vikings, Murray has appeared in 93 career games with 56 starts for the Raiders, Vikings and Saints, carrying 1,045 times for 4,335 yards (4.1 avg.) with 39 touchdowns and catching 162 passes for 1,118 yards, including his first career receiving touchdown scored vs. Arizona, Oct. 27.

• In his first season in New Orleans, Murray played in all 16 games for the third consecutive season with seven starts, carrying 146 times for 637 yards (4.4 avg.) with five touchdowns to tie for the team lead and has also caught 34 passes for 235 yards with his first career receiving touchdown, to rank third on the club in overall scores. In Weeks Seven-Eight, Murray was the first Saint to have back-to-back games of 150 total yards from scrimmage since RB Deuce McAllister from November 23-30, 2003.

MURRAY'S BIG DAYS

New Orleans Saints running back Latavius Murray has reached 100 rushing yards ten times over his career, including in two performances in 2019. His teams have posted a 9-1 record in those games.

• **November 20, 2014 at Kansas City** - Murray carried four times for 112 yards (28.0 avg.) with one 90-yard touchdown, becoming the first player in National Football League history to gain at least 110 rushing yards on five or fewer carries in the first 100-yard performance of his career.

TED GINN JR.

- Ginn joined the Saints in 2017 as an unrestricted free agent and is in his 13th NFL season. He has been a member of five teams since being selected with the ninth overall pick in the 2007 NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins out of Ohio State, and has appeared in 187 games with 83 starts over that period. In his long career marked by big play ability, he has accumulated 5,692 receiving yards off 408 catches (14.0 avg.), recording 33 touchdowns. In his first season in New Orleans, Ginn played in 15 games with ten starts and recorded 53 grabs for 787 yards with four touchdown receptions, carried ten times for 39 yards and brought back 19 punts for 103 yards and five kickoffs for 56 yards. Ginn finished ranked second on the Saints in receiving yardage among the team's wideouts. He also enjoyed his most productive postseason as a professional, opening both playoff contests and making 12 grabs for 187 yards with an 80-yard TD and adding one carry for 11 yards.

- After spending the bulk of the 2018 campaign on Injured Reserve with a knee injury, Ginn returned with a vengeance in the postseason with six grabs for 102 yards. In the 2019 opening win over Houston, posting seven receptions for 101 yards, including a 41-yard grab and has 29 grabs for 411 yards (14.2 avg.) and one touchdown with three carries for 18 yards in all 13 contests with nine starts. He surpassed 6,000 career total yards from scrimmage with his 45-yard grab in the October 20 win at Chicago to set up a score.

TRE'QUAN SMITH

- A talented second-year wideout, who was selected by New Orleans in the third round of the 2018 draft out of Central Florida, the 6-1, 210-pounder emerged as one of the Knights' top weapons from 2015-17 and was a key figure in the emergence of their program. During that period, he caught 168 passes for 2,748 yards (16.4 avg.) with 22 touchdowns. In his final campaign for the 13-0 Knights in 2017, Smith appeared in and started all 13 games and hauled in 54 receptions for 1,082 yards (19.9 avg.) and 13 touchdowns, his first 1,000-yard receiving season. Working his way into the club's wideout rotation, Smith posted 28 receptions for 427 yards and five touchdowns as a rookie.

- Smith battled injuries that forced him to miss five games and parts of two others, but got healthy for the stretch run, posting nine grabs for 119 yards and three touchdowns in the month of December as he entered his second postseason.

- This veteran tight end has enjoyed his most explosive season as a professional in his 11th overall and first with the Black and Gold after signing as an unrestricted free agent from the Oakland Raiders. • This Idaho State product made the club as an undrafted free agent in 2013 and his consistency has been an asset to the position group for who he's played in 103 career games with 54 starts, making 108 receptions for 1,025 yards and 14 touchdowns, also chipping in 27 special teams tackles. MARCUS DAVENPORT

• Trading up to the 14th spot in the 2018 NFL Draft, the Saints addressed the line and the pass rush with this gifted pass rusher, only the second draft choice ever from Texas-San Antonio. During four college seasons, Davenport notched totals of 186 tackles (97 solo), 22 sacks, 38 tackles for loss, six forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one returned for a touchdown and eight passes defended, finishing his career as the school's all-time leader for stops for loss, takedowns and quarterback hurries (21). In 13 games as a rookie, Davenport posted 22 tackles (12 solo), four sacks, two passes defended and one forced fumble. He served as a solid bookend opposite Jordan in 2019, starting all 12 games before being placed on Injured Reserve and posting 29 stops, six sacks and four forced fumbles. Davenport enjoyed a breakout performance on Thanksgiving night at Atlanta where he recorded two sacks to tie a career-high and added three forced fumbles.

TREY HENDRICKSON

• Selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft, Hendrickson came to the Saints from Florida Atlantic, where he departed the school with a team-record 29.5 career sacks. Hendrickson has appeared in 28 career games in three seasons, recording 35 tackles (22 solo), six sacks, two passes defended and two forced fumbles. Following an offseason, where he made significant strides in the weight room and with his technique, Hendrickson's hard work paid off with two sacks in the Sept. 9 season-opening win over Houston followed up by a takedown/forced fumble in Week Two at the Los Angeles Rams and one on Thanksgiving night at Atlanta. In his breakthrough campaign, he had 19 tackles and 4.5 sacks to rank third on the club, adding another takedown in the NFC Wild Card Playoff vs. Minnesota.

CARL GRANDERSON

• Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming, Granderson has seen action in four contests on special teams and defense, recording his first sack vs. Tampa Bay, Oct. 6. Granderson posted 17.5 career sacks in college and possesses the perfect body type for a pass rusher. Granderson appeared in eight regular season contests, posting ten tackles and one sack as he moved into the defensive line rotation in December.

DEFENSIVE TACKLE

MALCOM BROWN

• This former first round draft pick out of the University of Texas was a vital part of a Patriots defensive line that helped pick up two Super Bowl championships in the last three seasons. The University of Texas product has been a run-stopping force in the New England defensive line for the past four seasons and now with New Orleans after signing as an unrestricted free agent in the offseason, playing in 76 career games with 67 starts and recording career totals of 220 tackles (121 solo), ten sacks, one forced fumble and four fumble recoveries. Brown supplemented the middle of a Saints defense that finished the 2019 regular season fourth in opponent rushing yards per game, posting 1.5 sacks and one fumble recovery in all 16 contests as well as 34 stops.

• Brown is a veteran of the postseason from his Patriots tenure as he made his playoff debut with the Black and Gold with a split sack in the NFC Wild Card Playoff vs. Minnesota. He has made 12 appearances with 11 starts, posting 35 tackles and 1.5 sacks as part of two Super Bowl Championship squads.

DAVID ONYEMATA

• A fourth round selection out of Manitoba in 2016, Onyemata teams with Brown to form a solid duo in the interior of the Saints defensive line. In 63 games with 25 starts in four seasons, he has posted 140 career tackles, 9.5 sacks, two passes defended and one forced fumble. In 16 games with four starts in 2018, Onyemata posted 36 tackles, in helping with a run defense ranked second in the National Football League. On Nov. 29, 2018 vs. Dallas, he enjoyed a breakout performance with career-highs in tackles (seven), Quarterback takedowns (three) and forced fumbles (one). In 2019, he opened all 15 regular season games he played in, posting 32 stops, one pass defended and three sacks for the NFL's fourth-ranked run defense.

SHELDON RANKINS

• The third defensive lineman selected in the 2016 NFL Draft out of Louisville, Sheldon Rankins started all 16 games in 2017 posting 26 tackles (16 solo), two sacks for loss of 13 yards, one interception, one pass defended and one forced fumble. He helped a defensive unit that went from 31st in the NFL, allowing 28.4 points per game in 2016 to allowing 20.4 points per game in 2017, good for tenth in the league. In 2018, Rankins had a career-high 40 tackles (26 solo), a forced fumble and a career-best eight sacks to rank second on the club and fifth in the National Football League among defensive tackles.

• In 2019, after ardent rehabilitation from a ruptured Achilles tendon, Rankins returned to the lineup in Week Four and contributed two sacks to the defensive line rotation, being voted by his teammates as the team's Ed Block Courage Award winner.

LINEBACKERS**DEMARIO DAVIS**

• This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the Saints after a breakout 2017, where he started 16 games for the New York Jets. Davis posted a team-high and career-high 165 tackles (112 solo) and a career-best five sacks. For his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 128 games with 114 starts for the Jets (2012-15, 2017), Cleveland (2016) and Saints, recording 881 tackles (588 solo), 22.5 sacks, two interceptions, 32 passes defended, three forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries and 24 special team stops.

• In 2018, Davis opened all 16 contests and led the team with 110 stops (74 solo), five sacks to lead the linebackers, four passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Davis' abilities to diagnose and tackle played a key role in New Orleans ranking second in the National Football League in opponent rushing yards per game and opponent rushing yards per play. Participating in the post-season for the first time, Davis led the defense with 22 stops (15 solo), an interception in the NFC Championship and a pass defense. In 2019, he posted 111 stops, ranked first on the club, four sacks, one interception and 11 passes defended as he was named *AP* first-team All-Pro

A.J. KLEIN

• Signed as an unrestricted free agent from Carolina in 2017, where he spent his first four seasons, Klein's played a significant role in the linebacker rotation. Overall in 103 career games with 66 starts, he has 346 tackles (245 solo), 10.5 sacks, three interceptions, one brought back for a touchdown, ten passes defended, four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.

• Klein started all 15 regular season games that he appeared in in 2019, ranking among team leaders with 67 stops (45 solo), 2.5 sacks, one interception returned 14 yards for a touchdown, one fumble recovery and one special teams stop.

COMING ON STRONG

In the final two weeks of the 2019 regular season, both Saints victories, A.J. Klein showed a propensity for big plays. In the Dec. 22 38-28 win over Tennessee, he posted a career-high two sacks. The following week in the regular season finale at Carolina, Klein created momentum by picking off Panthers quarterback Will Grier and returning it 14 yards to the end zone for his first career National Football League touchdown. In the NFC Wild Card Playoff vs. Minnesota, he had a postseason career-high eight stops and had a potential fourth quarter forced fumble reversed on replay review.

CRAIG ROBERTSON

• In just his first year with the Saints, Robertson quickly became one of the most important members of the young defense. After four seasons with Cleveland, Robertson joined the Saints looking to contribute on defense and special teams, yet his production outpaced even the highest expectations. Starting 15 games, Robertson led the Saints with 131 tackles (100 solo), while adding a sack, four passes defended, and an interception, and two fumble recoveries. In 2017 in 16 games with starts in the last 12, he had 77 stops (50 solo), second on the team, two sacks to lead the linebackers, two interceptions to also lead his position, six passes defended, the forced fumble/fumble recovery and a coverage fumble recovery. In 2018, he played in every contest and posting 14 defensive and special teams stops and one sack, as the Black and Gold surrendered a league-low 60 punt return yards. Robertson, a special teams captain the past two seasons, has 554 career defensive stops and 46 special teams tackles, provides depth at all three linebacker positions and outstanding leadership to the defense and special teams units.

SECONDARY**MARSHON LATTIMORE**

• Selected by the Saints in the first round (11th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles (44 solo), a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended, as he became the youngest Saint (21 years old) ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was selected as the *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

• In 2018, Lattimore opened all 16 regular season contests and posted a career-high 59 tackles (49 solo), two interceptions, 12 passes defended, a club-best four forced fumbles, which was tied for fourth in the NFL and three fumble recoveries, returned for 91 yards, leading the team in takeaways and tied for the NFL lead in defensive fumble recoveries, the highest total among defensive backs. Lattimore also added two picks in the NFC Divisional Playoff win over Philadelphia.

OUT OF THE MARSH

Below are several of Marshon Lattimore's 2019 defensive highlights which resulted in him being voted to the Pro Bowl.

In a 33-27 win at Seattle, Dec. 22, Lattimore posted a career-high 12 tackles (career-high ten solo) and one pass defended.

In the Sept. 29 win vs. Dallas, Lattimore was assigned to standout wideout Amari Cooper and held him to five catches for 48 yards, while he also drew two offensive pass interference penalties.

In the Oct. 6 win vs. Tampa Bay, Lattimore was assigned to perennial Pro Bowl wideout Mike Evans, who did not record one reception, while Lattimore posted two passes defended.

In the Oct. 13 win at Jacksonville, Lattimore recorded his first pick of the season and three passes defended as Jaguars wide receiver D.J. Chark was held to three receptions for 43 yards.

• In the 2019 regular season, Lattimore started all 14 games he played in and posted 57 stops, one interception and ranked first on the team with 14 passes defended, during a standout campaign where he was a Pro Bowl selection for the second time in his three-year career and a PFWA All-NFC selection.

ELI APPLE

• The tenth overall pick of the New York Giants in the 2016 NFL Draft out of Ohio State and a former teammate in the Buckeyes defensive backfield with Lattimore and Vonn Bell, since being acquired by New Orleans, Bell has made a positive impact in the Saints secondary. In the 12 regular season and postseason games Apple started, the Black and Gold surrendered 20 or fewer points eight times with six consecutive contests of giving up 17 or fewer points and he picked up two interceptions, including one in the end zone at the end of the first half of the December 17 win at Carolina and a fumble recovery. Further progression has come from Apple in 2019 after his first full offseason with the Black and Gold with his first big play coming with a forced fumble in the September 22 win at Seattle. Starting all 15 games that he played in before suffering an ankle injury in a Week 16 win at Tennessee that sidelined him for the regular season finale and playoff contest, he posted 59 tackles (54 solo), four passes defended and the forced fumble.

JANORIS JENKINS

- An eight-year NFL veteran who was originally a second round draft pick of the St. Louis Rams in 2012, Jenkins has shown a nose for the ball during his stints with the Rams (2012-15), New York Giants (2016-19) and since joining the Saints prior to Week 16. He has played in 115 games with 112 starts, posting 466 tackles two sacks, 23 interceptions, 106 passes defended, six forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one blocked field goal and one return of a blocked field goal for a touchdown. The 23 picks since his NFL debut in 2012 are tied for fifth in the NFL. Jenkins made his first start in the regular season finale at Carolina and made his first pick as a Saint and fifth of the season overall, as he was tied for fourth in the NFL in the category. Overall, he played in 15 contests with 14 starts in the regular season with both the Giants and the Saints and posted 61 stops (50 solo), the career-high five picks and 16 passes defended.

- In his Saints postseason debut in the NFC Wild Card Playoff vs. Minnesota, Jenkins opened the contest and posted eight tackles (three solo), split a sack with Malcom Brown and recorded a first quarter forced fumble.

MARCUS WILLIAMS

- After being selected in the second round of the 2017 NFL Draft (42nd overall) out of the University of Utah, this ball-hawking safety had an excellent rookie campaign starting all 15 games he appeared in posting 70 tackles (56 solo), four interceptions and six passes defended. Williams led rookie safeties in interceptions and was second in tackles and passes defended, including two picks in the regular season finale. He also posted his first career postseason interception, which was the only pick made by a rookie in the playoffs. In 2018, Williams posted 55 stops, one sack, two picks, three passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in starting all 16 contests at free safety.

- Williams opened 2019 in impressive fashion, recording a key third quarter pick in the Monday night win over Houston and posting a pick at the end of the Sept. 29 win vs. Dallas. He currently has 53 tackles (38 solo), the four interceptions to tie his career-high, with one returned for a touchdown, tied for third in the NFL, a career-best 13 passes defended, the forced fumble and the two coverage stops.

VONN BELL

- Bell left onlookers impressed with his 2016 rookie campaign. Playing in every game with 14 starts, he totaled 98

tackles (59 solo), second on the team, four passes defended, a sack, two forced fumbles, and a fumble recovery. Selected in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft (61st overall), Bell was a consensus first-team All-American as a junior at Ohio State. In 61 career games with 45 starts, he's posted 349 tackles, eight sacks, one interception 16 passes defended, seven forced fumbles and seven fumble recoveries.

- Bell finished the regular season ranked second on the team with 86 tackles (63 solo), his first pick, and has a club-best five fumble recoveries, which is ranked first in the National Football League and the most by a Saint since safety Sammy Knight's five in 2001. His six total takeaways are the most by a Saint since the 2009 season. He then added another fumble recovery in the NFC Wild Card Playoff vs. Minnesota.

New Orleans Saints Head Coach Sean Payton
End of the Season Press Conference
Tuesday, January 7, 2020

What's the prevailing thing that stood out to you reviewing the way that the season ended?

"I think specifically in the game, obviously it started out well, getting the turnover early and we settled for a field goal on that drive. I think we knew it was going to be a hard fought game, back and forth. I thought early on both defenses played well. I thought we struggled offensively, particularly in the first half. Our third down numbers were just one of four. In the second half we started moving it a little bit better. I think the turnover differential ended up being one in their favor. I thought in the first half we struggled protecting Drew (Brees) more than we would've liked and then it came down to, there's a handful of things. It's always frustrating as a coach when you watch it, you know, you miss a field goal at the end of half. Our kicker's been fantastic all season, come back in the second half and we get a little bit of momentum there and we have the turnover after Taysom's (Hill) long run. I think on the overtime drive, Kirk (Cousins) makes a fantastic throw to (Adam) Thielen on that play. Obviously the play prior, Marshon (Lattimore) had gone out. But when you watch the catch and throw, those guys really did a nice job and I said it after the game. It was a hard fought game. It was obviously difficult to end your season like that and yet those guys made a few more plays than we did. We kind of move into the next phase for us, (which) is the evaluation of our own personnel before we do anything else and so we will be doing that the next week and a half and then you begin to look at upgrading or improving the roster as best you can. And that is either via the players in this league (current) or that are going to be coming up through the draft."

In a perfect world would you want all three quarterbacks back or do you feel like you have to choose between them all?

"We have not gotten that far yet. I like the perfect world scenario and yet we do not live in one. We have not even gotten that far down the road yet. Mickey (Loomis) and I will spend a lot of time meeting. We'll meet on all these topics. We have a handful, as we do every year of unrestricted free agents and then a few restricted free agents. All of those players will be guys that we spend a lot of time on and hopefully make the right decisions on."

What was the parting message to the team?

"The challenge in the postseason with our league's (that) there are two plans in place. You are meeting Monday, you're getting ready to play Green Bay or you're meeting Monday and you're in your exit meetings with the players and physicals. And so it was more organizational, relative to the offseason, relative to the players that were dealing with injuries. Obviously, everyone's disappointed, you'd like to continue playing and there's that finality of it. But it's typically one of those meetings where you're really kind of covering all the things that they need to know, relative to what's coming up from an offseason standpoint, physicals, all the things that need to take place in the next week."

Do you wait for Drew Brees to make a decision or do you reach out to him regarding playing next year?

"Well, listen, to date we've not had to do any of that and it'd be too early to say. I just finished talking to him five minutes ago and it was about something else. It was about LSU tickets. It's (that) we just played two days ago. We're clearly not even at that stage relative to our own roster. I think it's always best that there's time that takes place between the last game and even when you begin to do what we do next. I think it's important that there's some time in between that because you want to really give the true evaluation of your roster. I'm talking about all the other positions, but yeah, I'm sure Mickey (Loomis) and myself (will discuss Drew Brees). But there's not that formal call (scheduled or expected). There will be a gap of time here and I can't speak for Drew as to his wants. I think he wants to play more, that we saw him play at a high level and we'll discuss every player on the roster, himself included. But I don't anticipate this grandiose meeting or phone call anytime soon. We will go through the numbers. We will go through the team and then try to do what's best for, for, for the team as well."

How do you balance the success of this season and where you need to focus on improving this offseason?

"Yeah, there are some clear things though, relative to a really good roster. There are some areas that maybe we see differently or see clearly relative to where we can improve that I think are going to be important. And yet I think one of the benefits of the roster this year was really the depth relative to some injuries that we had guys were able to play. We played a handful of defensive backs. We played a couple, three fullbacks, the same way at receiver and tight end. In the same way, particularly on the offensive line (we played multiple players). We met yesterday just briefly on our unrestricted free agents and our restricted free agents, but there's some must right now that are at least in my mind, (must) positions that we have to solidify to be better. And I think we'll try to do that any way, shape or form."

Anything, any specific or positions that you want to improve?

"Nothing specific right now."

What are your thoughts on keeping the timeout and accepting the 10-second runoff near the end of the fourth quarter?

"Well number one we valued the last timeout. The unique thing that came up is we had that option of a ten-second runoff. Burn the 10 seconds, keep the timeout or give them the timeout and now being without a timeout. Drew (Brees) and I, if you watch during that quick break are sitting there and both he and I both valued the timeout. Because it just gives you so much more freedom relative to play-calling and so we knew, the field goal number one was paramount. And then the challenge always when you get down to what we had left in the clock is you're going to just see it much different type of defense in the end zone. And I would have liked to not have to make that decision and when we were clocking the football, we need to obviously be set. I thought how we handled that, I don't know how far (we were), we had a 1:55 when the drive started. There was nothing earth shattering about what we chose to do there. There's some plays that you would've

liked to have had maybe differently, but getting into that situation without a timeout is just a little bit trickier.”

Does having that timeout just in case something goes wrong still allow you to have a chance at a field goal?

“Yes, your goal initially when the drill starts is let's make sure we put ourselves in a position to kick a field goal. And if we get close enough then with time remaining, let's figure out a way to win it. But specifically when we clocked the ball, there is a penalty. I think it was 21 seconds or we were right there as to you want 11 or 21, one's going to have a timeout, the other's not. I think we both felt 11 with the timeout was a better option for us at that time, rather than 21 because you're still at anything that stays in play you're in a mayday alert, you're running onto the field and you can potentially with a timeout and 11 seconds have a little bit more luxury.”

Is the deep wide receiver class in this draft an intriguing thing to you?

“I have not seen the class at all yet. Probably in the next two or three weeks I'll be made aware of (prospects). I've heard that it's a pretty good receiver class. But yes, all those options we'll look closely at, I think we are picking at 24 (in the first round). We will start with the free agency (possibilities). Where do we feel like some of these areas we feel are must where can we fill them. If it's deep in another area then that helps to know that. But that's just one position group. There's a handful of areas though where we're going to be looking closely to see if we can find the right player.”

What did you think about Janoris Jenkins in his brief stint with the team at the end of this season?

“I thought he did well. Look, he's a real good foot athlete. He's smart, he came in and competed, obviously he was in great shape, but I was encouraged and impressed.”

The Carolina Panthers hired Matt Rhule today. Do you have a chance to meet him when he worked down here with Baylor in Sugar Bowl prep? What did you think?

“I did, he was really impressive. Jeff Ireland went to Baylor and Jeff knew Matt and Jeff had just came to me and said, hey, they're going to be practicing here. Do you want to maybe visit with him and the team? It was during their week of preparations. The first time I met him and then today I heard just like you did that Carolina hired him and look, that's a great job for him and he seemed, I was real impressed with their three years, if I'm going to speak to some group that I don't really know that well. Kevin (Petty) kind of pulled up some numbers for me and their turnaround in three years relative to what they went through and in his first year, the second year, it was real impressive. They won a lot of games and I was impressed when I met him.”

Do you think with the right moves that you could be back at this spot next year?

“We'll see. We'd like to think so. We're excited about the guys we currently have and our job now's to find the other players we feel like can help us put ourselves in a position to compete again. Look, it's fresh off the season and you don't know how the regular season's going to go. I thought, obviously, early on we handled some of the adversity pretty well and we found a way to win 13 games, which is hard to do. This league's

funny, sometimes 13 (wins) can get you obviously a real high seed. And in our case, we were playing at home, but I think the challenge will be finding a way to improve and put ourselves in that position. Absolutely.”

Is it more challenging addressing those positions you feel are needs when you know that you've got a lot of talented guys about the hit free agency?

“No, managing the cap relative to your current roster is one thing. But I think we'll spend a lot of time on those decisions and those are never easy. You have a fixed budget. There's no luxury tax or you can't overspend if you choose to. Those will be the things we deal with here in the next coming weeks.”

You've had a pretty cohesive assistant coaching unit, do you think that might change starting with a loss yesterday?

“Well, we lost Mike (Nolan) yesterday. Congrats to him. We're excited that he has that opportunity. I've said this before, look, when people are calling and interested, that's a good thing. I think it's good for those guys to have those opportunities. It's a little bit more nerve wracking when no one's calling, but I think we've got a handful of coaches on this staff that I think someday will be in a position or have that opportunity hopefully. But Mike was the first one that we had a request sent in for.”

Do you think there's a chance that because of the numbers you will lose some talented young free agents? Isn't this part of the deal?

“Well, hopefully, look, there's always that chance. There's always that chance. Our job is to try to try to protect as best we can the guys that we feel like moving forward are going to help us the most. And that doesn't mean that a player or two that we'd like to have gets a chance to play somewhere else. That's part of the business. Yeah, there's that chance. It absolutely exists.”

In your experience in pro sports, to what extent is it possible that in terms of team building, you feel like you've done almost everything right and you didn't win a Super Bowl?

Well look, that's hard to do. But the understanding that we're doing the right things relative to each step of the way, starting with the players in the offseason, how we train and how we practice and all of those things are easy to approach because I think the players themselves and everyone in the building understands, Hey, we're doing the right things and that doesn't promise you the final game. And yet to get there, you've got to win and continue to win. Listen, that's the trick then. But, yes, all that being said, shoot these guys as disappointed as they were yesterday leaving. They understand the challenges of winning in the postseason, it's a single elimination tournament.”

You addressed the lack of production from (Alvin) Kamara, but was he fighting an injury kind of near the back of the near the back end of the year?

“No. Listen, I felt like he was healthy and there was a handful of things in that game Sunday relative to our running game that you look at and you're like, ah, we might've done something a little bit (differently). There's a handful of things you see from teams defensively and Mike (Zimmer) has done a great job there. They're going to play certain front and coverage, and yet I think he was healthy and we saw him in the last couple

games play well and we just didn't have those numbers. When you go one-of-four on third down, just do the number count and then look at the possession. It all just plays itself out. Yes, I want to absolutely run the football, but you have to convert more third downs to have those opportunities."

This might be a silly follow-up, but as teams have more tape on him and have they defended him differently than they have in previous years?

"No. Silly follow-up."

What are your thoughts right after this season though on sort of maximizing the production of both Kamara and (Latavius) Murray? Is that something you wanted to do more consistently throughout the year?

"Well, look, I think when you're moving the football, those aren't challenges. I think they're challenges when you have some penalties early on and downs and your third down numbers are down, then it becomes challenging when you have less plays. But, it was no different than the year before with Alvin and Mark (Ingram)."

Did Taysom (Hill) pick up a bigger role towards the end of the season this year and maybe surpass your expectations?

"I think that we began looking at, it wasn't that we looked at him differently, but man, the more and more you kept watching, the more and more we felt like he's one of our better players and needs to be on the field. So to answer your question, yeah, I would say that that even evolved more to the point where, obviously, there's a read option element to when he's playing quarterback, but the deep pass he throws to Deonte (Harris) was something that we felt might have a chance. He has real good arm strength. He was exceptional Sunday. He was outstanding. He's an exciting football player and he does a lot of things well. I'm glad he's on our team."

Was his development as a receiver kind of a necessity after Tre'Quan (Smith) and Keith (Kirkwood) went down?

"It started a year ago actually because you saw him block and the challenge always is are you going to get nickel defense or base defense? It's trying to gameplan because those are extremely different defensive looks or potential defensive looks. And we received a little bit more base with him in this last game than in some weeks. But now, it's kind of evolved. He's someone that was good at a lot of different things and we played him in that F role, if you will, quite a bit this year. Then the snaps he played at quarterback, it's like anything else, do we have enough snaps and enough touches where he can get his hands on the ball? That one series, he has the long pass and the very next play he is blocking at the point of attack with Tre'Quan and those guys and we score. His performance demands those opportunities."

Is he one of the trickier, maybe free agent players to deal with it because you don't know how people value him or what they may value him as?

"It is a little bit of an enigma. He is (a) restricted (free agent), but yes, it is a little bit of an enigma. My understanding is you can't find a spot for him on your fantasy roster, so it's probably difficult for the reality of it (laughter)."

Was this year easier, the way it ended? Was it easier to digest than last year?

"Entirely different. Like I said after the game, you hate to lose a game like that. You tip your hat to Minnesota and Mike (Zimmer's) a close friend and obviously you want to play well and win and advance. There's certain things you look back on even during the year relative to your best positioning, but in that game, you play over opportunities. It is difficult losing in the postseason, but last year was different."

Doesn't Jeni's ice cream digest the same?

"Yeah, it's definitely from last year."

Do you remember hearing about how (Bill) Belichick said after they lost to you guys in 2009 that he just knew somehow that that team wasn't a Super Bowl team relative for what his expectations were? This team would be different, right? Where you may have thought all along until the very end it was a Super Bowl team?

I don't know that, look, I thought (20)11 was one of those teams and the concern this year was at this stage of the season was where we were health wise at some positions. But you know that in each week leading up to it, like, look, this Minnesota game was one that concerned me relative to, I just know how they played defensively and you knew it was not going to be a high scoring game. Time of possession, the turnovers were going to matter and they did. But I don't know that that at the start of the tournament you thought, hey, this, you have to earn that. It would be really some of the injuries of, hey, are we healthy enough here? We got nicked up at linebacker, we had some injuries in the offensive line. We were getting healthy and guys were coming back. But yes, the approach was one game at a time and obviously putting our best foot forward against them."

How much did you miss (Sheldon) Rankins and (Marcus) Davenport at the end of the year?

"It's hard to put a number on that. I thought our front played well defensively. I thought our D-line played well, played well in that game Sunday. Look, you hate to have some starters out, but I thought those guys and some of the guys we were playing snaps with that had not played a lot stood out. Look, you're sitting at 20-20 at the end of regulation and you had two turnovers. Offensively, one of them on a short field for your defense. The other one on the other end of the field, but like anyone else, you miss starters that are out and yet it's hard to put an exact tag on it."
