2024: Started all 14 games for the Ducks while earning second-team all-America honors from three outlets ... Derrick Harmon Conference Call Transcript

Derrick, when you came here for a visit, did you get any kind of a sense of how interested the Steelers were in you? Yeah, just sitting down with Coach Mike T[omlin] man, he was a great guy, as far as a football coach and a person. Man, very, very relatable, just to talk to on the football side and on the personal side. So, I kind of had the feeling, it felt like home when I went on to visit there, man, and I'm just happy I'm in Pittsburgh.

Derrick, the Steelers had concerns about your shoulder. What's that all about?

I don't know, man, I'm fully up and ready to go. I don't have any concerns. I'm ready to get to work.

Derrick, the Steelers just said that they felt like you had Steeler DNA. Do you feel like it's that type of match for you as well?

Most definitely yes, man. Because I got a guy like Cam Heyward next to me, that's not going for nothing on the field. And I'm going to be just ready to go man. Just ready to get to work.

At the Combine, you talked about how much you want to learn about run defense, that you watch Cam Heyward tape. How excited are you able to pick his brain, like, all the time now?

Man, that was the first...that was my thought process after the call, that I was able to pick Cam's brain, be under his wing. That could be my vet now, and I can really learn from him, because he's been doing this forever, since I was a baby. So [there] wouldn't be no other way I wanted really.

Derrick, how do you put into words, just what does it mean to you to be a Pittsburgh Steeler?

A blessing, a blessing. It's truly a blessing. It's really a blessing

Derrick, what was that moment like when you got that call?

It was a little bittersweet — my mom wasn't with me. She's at the hospital right now on life support, so that was a little bittersweet man, because she worked as hard, just for me to get to this moment, but it was a once in lifetime experience. So, like I said, I'm very excited.

Did you get to talk to her after the pick was in?

No, I did not. Like I said she's on life support. So, after I get off the phone with you guys, I'm headed straight to the hospital to tell her [that her] son got drafted.

How big of a draft party did you have? Or is that kind of subdued because of your mom's situation?

Little bit of both. My village is big man, like, I couldn't get to this point without my village at all. So I have a big village. But the thing going on my mom, it's just her village came out and my village came out. So we had a big party, and I'm very blessed to have that village around me.

Derrick what is your mom's name?

Tiffany Saine.

Derrick, who was sitting beside you when you got the call, who were some of the first people around you to know that you were going to be a Pittsburgh Steeler?

It was my dad on the left side of me, then on the right side of me was my mom's wife, then next to my mom's wife and my grandmother, the other side was my stepmom, my grandmother. Just a bunch of family around them. People were off camera, so it was a lot of people there.

Derrick, you're talking a lot about your mother, what were some of the things that she did for you that you think were most impactful to help get you this moment?

Man, how resilient she was. Just growing up, from my standpoint, of my situation, I grew up with her having probably seven, eight brain surgeries. And after all those brain surgeries, she did not give up. She still took me to practice, still went to work. And I always, always got in the back of my head, from the beginning of my college career, was, why can I keep going if I'm tired, I'm injured, whatever it is, why can I keep going. If she can get up and she can keep going after brain surgery. So, just her resilience, and hard work.



General Manager Omar Khan and Head Coach Mike Tomlin – 4.24.25

Opening Statement:

Omar Khan: Obviously an exciting day for us. I think the other day when we met, we talked about certain guys that we would not trade away from, and this is one of those players for us. The phone was ringing, and we had many serious conversations but at the end of the day once Derrick was still there, we were excited and it was an easy choice for us. Can't wait to get him here. He fits the Pittsburgh Steelers, and you know, like I said, I can't wait to get him in here.

Mike Tomlin: Like Omar said, he has Steelers DNA. For us, it starts inside and up front, and this is a guy that's capable of dominating that space versus the run and the pass. So we're really excited about having him. As Omar mentioned, we were not interested in considering trading away from him and really excited about getting him in here and getting started.

How important was it to get a defensive lineman, and what do you like about this guy in addition to what you said?

Tomlin: Extreme urgency to be quite honest with you. There's no substitute for young talent. You don't have a chance to fill a quality defense unless you're stout up front. This is a guy that has the opportunity to look for the likes of Cam Hayward and put his hands in that pile and be a significant contributor for years to come.

Do you listen in case somebody wants to blow your doors off or something with an offer?

Khan: Obviously we do. We were working the phones, several picks before ours. You listen. You have to. We owe it to ourselves to listen, and you don't know how it's going to shake out five or six picks ahead.

You listen and weigh things, but at the end of the day, he was one of those players we were not going to trade away from.

Were you starting to wonder if he might be there?

Khan: Yeah, obviously, we're watching it, like you guys are, and we don't know what those other teams are going to pick and it just worked out for us.

Defensive lineman, obviously in this first class, did you see something in Harmon that maybe stood out specifically related to the Steelers?

Khan: I just think he's been impressive at every step of the process for us. His tape was impressive. We had great visits with him in Indy. He came to Pittsburgh, and we had a great day with him. Just with each interaction we all got more and more comfortable that he was our type of a guy.

How much was Cam [Heyward] advocating to add Derrick Harmon?

Tomlin: Cam is a team player. He wasn't really advocating for anyone, to be quite honest with you. But he's a quality leader, and I'm sure that he will take that personally.

You talked about the urgency at defensive tackle. How did the way the run defense struggled down the stretch inform that urgency?

Tomlin: The tape is the tape, and so we're behaving appropriately. You don't have a chance to have a top-notch defense unless you're smashing the run and getting after the quarterback, and this is a guy whose résumé says he's capable of contributing in both areas.

You pointed out to us on Tuesday, only two QBs on the roster, and you wanted to have four when you got to Latrobe. Were you tempted to go with a QB?

Khan: We were on the clock, and we got the player that we wanted.

Throughout the Draft process, there was some noise about medical concerns about Derrick. Any red flags there when you guys met with him?

Khan: We wouldn't have picked him unless our medical staff and we were comfortable with it.

Tomlin: We had him in at a pre-Draft 30 visit and had an opportunity to get our documents, him in front of our docs, and we were extremely comfortable with that component.

You talked a lot recently about how you play a lot of sub-package football, with Derrick Harmon leading college football in pressures, how much can he contribute as a three-down type of player?

Tomlin: I think that was one of the critical points I wanted to make. He's a big man. He's stout against the run. His résumé and tape confirms that. But he's also a major, major threat in terms of getting after the quarterback. Probably tops in this draft class in terms of interior rush men, and so we got us a big man that's capable of being significant for us in all circumstances, and that's just what you want when you are talking about first round of the Draft.

He's got a lot of attractive traits, length and size and everything like that, but can you go to the football IQ part of it?

Tomlin: His intangible qualities are very attractive. He's a smart guy. He's a football guy. He's got natural leadership skills. The people at Oregon were really blown away by his ability to fit in and not only fit in but led in a short period of time.

He had a similar reputation at Michigan State, and so the tangible things are obvious, but we were equally as impressed with his intangible quality, his intelligence, his relationship with the game, his natural leadership qualities.

During your conversations with him, was there something that really stood out to you and impressed you?

Tomlin: Just for a young guy, I thought he had an awesome sense of self. He was comfortable in his shoes. He had a real agenda about what he's trying to get done within the game of football. He's got a desire to be great. All of those things were attractive.

You hit the offensive line hard the first two years you were here, flipping over to defense; that obviously the plan when you took over here to hammer those two areas?

Khan: You guys have heard me talk about the big guys, and it just doesn't apply to the offense side obviously. Same thing. Defensive side is an opportunity, and those big guys, they are not easy to find. When you have an opportunity to get a good one, we're going to get him.

How much versatility is there with Cam and Derrick in playing the three and the five and how do you see them being on the field at the same time in?

Tomlin: You know I am anticipating those guys working well together. I have seen Derrick dominate in terms of the pass rush from the A gap or the B gap. We have all been looking at Cam do that for a long period of time. So I think we are going to have great flexibility there in terms of how we choose to deploy those guys.

Can he play nose if needed?

Tomlin: I don't think nose is his game, but the rush component at three and five, and some of those things, certainly.

Obviously throughout this process, there's still a whole Draft to go, six more rounds to go, but considering Keeanu Benton in his role, do you consider him closer to a nose or a three, or do you want to get as many bodies in front as you can?

Tomlin: I think we have two quality young players who hopefully are going to play a long time together and have a great deal of success. Both guys are versatile, and both guys are stout against the run and both guys are pass rush capable. We'll sort some of those details out once we get them on the grass and begin the process of team development for 2025.

Once you got to 21, was there a deliberation? Did you go over it? Or did you just say, Wow, here we are, here is our quy?

Khan: We knew before. It was easy. We were taking him.

Obviously, nobody is a finished product in the Draft, but what are some areas specifically where Derrick still needs to improve to get to the next level?

Khan: He's a young guy; he's 21 years old. You know, I think the ceiling is really high for him, and you know, we'll see where it goes. I mean, I think we can all improve at everything we do in life. But he's got a good opportunity.

Tomlin: I was going to say, not to specifically avoid answering your question but a 21-year-old guy, he's got a lot of tools in his toolbox, but there's a lot of areas for improvement as he transitions from college to professional football. We'll have a better sense of it as we begin to work and see him in that setting.

What do you remember about when Harmon first got on your radar as a prospect and what stood out to you in the beginning?

Khan: You know, we talked to him in Indy, and you know, we had had our meetings before that, and he's just a guy that stood out. We had done a lot of homework on him. We had a lot of contacts with Michigan State, and obviously Oregon we know some people. He checked a lot of boxes for us.

What happened this year? You obviously got a bigger role, but the yards per carry were way up. What do you think made this season so successful for you?

I just feel like, you know, just always finishing my runs and always want to, you know, just get the first down and do extra for my team to help my team win. You know, I just always, just want to be, you know, go to extra mile and just help my team. You know, up a lot and you know, just come out on top. That's my main thing.

Your experience with the Steelers throughout this entire process, meeting with them at the combine and then also in the pre-draft visit?

It was great from the jump, as soon as I came in. They welcomed me great. First me and Coach Faulkner talked heart to heart. So, me and him know what to do know to come out, you know, on top. And, I'm going to give them my all. And, just Mike Tomlin in general, he told me he likes me as a player. He wanted me to come. And I told him, let's do it. So, it was all in God's hands. So that's all I can say.

Were you a Bengals fan growing up?

No sir. I wasn't anything as a matter of fact. My grandfather was a Cleveland Browns' fan. But that's it. I just like watching football in general.

What type of running back are the Steelers getting?

They're getting a physical running back and one that loves to go score touchdowns. Just a guy that's ready to work and be determined and ready to give the Steelers his all. Man, that's all.

What was that moment like when you saw the 412 area code pop up on your phone?

My heart dropped. My heart sunk, man, I've been waiting all day, and you know, it's just been a dream for me and my family and stuff like that. But it's an unreal feeling. I just can't explain it. I'm more than excited right now; I'm blessed.

Steelers were nearing their pick here in the third, were you starting to anticipate that it was going to be them? Did you think they were leaning quarterback. Were you still playing the guessing game?

I feel like it was like, between them and the Titans kind of. But, you know, to me right now, I feel like God, played in our hands. So, I'm a Steeler now, so I'm ready to work now.

You're coming to a run heavy offense with Arthur Smith. What are you looking forward to most about just carrying that heavy workload with this offense?

I feel like, just in general, just the relationship with the players and, just overall, learning from Coach Faulkner, Jaylen Warren. Me and Jaylen Warren, we are going to be very good together. You know, I can't wait to work. And I'm just ready to work. I'm excited right now.

Along those lines, you come from a scheme that ran a lot of wide zone, lots of multiple tight ends, which sounds a lot like what the Steelers do. What do you think are some of the most important things to be successful in that scheme? And in what ways do you feel like your skill set fits that?

I just feel like learning from the dot, you know, just them coming out, just having, like, a good, schematic, formations and stuff. Just them running out from the dot, from the gun, good mid zone runs, and outside zone runs. And I feel like, you know, in general, it fits, but I was doing that in lowa. So, I'm going to continue what I'm doing. And, get better and to fix up on what I need to fix up. And just be the best I can be for the Steelers.

How did you become such a good mid zone and wide zone runner? How did you train in Iowa? And what are the big traits you kind of hang your hat on those runs.

I really hang my hat on Coach Betts. Because, he came to lowa, and you know, he did his own runs, and he did it from a dot, and he knows what to do. And, just him, as far as him teaching me, and just to always be patient. And, just let the blocks flow. And if they overrun, your offensive line cut back. And, if they under run it, you know, just keep fighting your track. So, I just feel like, you know, I got a good feeling of where to put that ball, you know, where it needs to be put.

You've been compared to LeVeon Bell. Is that someone that you modeled your game after? And do you remember watching him with Steelers?

Yes, I do. And I, you know, I always would see him, I just saw him earlier streaming me and talking we had a conversation, and it was a magical moment. It just speaks into existence- it speaks for itself. So, you know, I'm ready to work. So, let's do it.



Offensive Coordinator Arthur Smith – 4.25.25

Opening Statement:

(We are) Excited about getting Kaleb Johnson in here. Really explosive running back that we spent some time with on a 30 visit here. One of the more instinctive backs that I've watched in a couple of years coming out of the draft. Perfect fit regardless of whatever run scheme you're running. He ran multiple (schemes) at lowa. Really impressive as a volume runner as the game went on, and one of the more impressive stats you've seen in the fourth quarter -- what he averaged in the fourth quarter. I believe it was over 5 yards per carry. Might have been closer to 6. We think he's a great culture fit. Obviously extremely fired up to get Kaleb in here.

What did you learn about him during the visit?

This process, which I appreciate, which I like, we travel on the road. We're very present at Pro Days and Senior Bowls. Then we use the visits. So Kaleb was here on a visit. As a coach, you get into the process. The scouts, these guys have been looking at him for years. We're kind of later on. You're trying to get to know the person. Obviously the tape, you can evaluate the skills on the tape, but really it's getting to know the person. I always want to know and the way I look at it especially in this role, all right, what's the vision? What's the plan if we take this player? How does he learn? That's what a lot of it is (is) getting to know the person and Kaleb and just a really impressive person. Obviously a great football player and really how he sees. Everybody learns differently. So when you take these guys and we meet with them and as I go through schemes and you are really just hearing them talk and seeing where they're at, whether it's protection with the back and what their history is. Obviously at lowa they were pretty run-heavy, and he ran multiple schemes, but really think he fits no matter what run scheme you want to operate.

The desire to get a running back, is it you want to create that kind of tandem that you had last year with Jaylen?

It will be different. Every year I've been around, I've never been one that compares this is the setup we had at this stop. Generally you've got 500-plus carries in a regular season. You're talking about 1,100 snaps. You would like to be on the plus side of 500. That means you're in more four-minute. Let's leave it at 500 carries to divvy up. That's kind of where you're at. Then obviously losing Naj (Harris), Naj for four years here, he was very durable, and that's a lot of missing carries. Then obviously we got some carries, especially early on of Justin (Fields). So it's just a really good fit. Guys will roll, and there's a lot of good group of guys we have in that running back room. We're obviously excited. No matter if you are running the football or the pass game, we need to get more explosive, and this is an explosive runner, and that's where he will certainly help.

The fit that you mentioned at the end of your first answer, was that sort of the differentiating factor in deciding to go running back here even with the lack of numbers at QB and did you have QBs on the roll --

I respect the way you worked that in. I'm going to keep this about Kaleb. Trust me, I get it. Here's the thing, I know Coach and Omar, Mr. Rooney, have spoken about the quarterback. We're talking about Kaleb and just the way we're looking at backs and why we're so excited about Kaleb, and that's kind of where my focus has been. That is my job. Kaleb Johnson is a Pittsburgh Steeler, and we're really excited about him and what he can bring to the offense and the team.

How can they work together Jaylen and Kaleb? How can they work off each other?

That depends on the game and where Kaleb is at. One thing Jaylen (Warren) does, which is extremely valuable, is how much you trust him in protection and those critical possession downs. It doesn't mean a young guy can't do it, but sometimes they can take something off his plate early on. Everything is new to him. The rookie years are long for these guys. Obviously if something happens to Jaylen or somebody else, I mean, his role can expand. So, as you say, you got 17 games. Obviously we're hoping to play more than that, and there are a lot of carries you can divvy up, but they'll fit. Jaylen, we're really excited about where Jaylen is at coming into this spring as well and where Kaleb really, like I said, will add hopefully an explosive element to the offense.

When you look at lowa's offense, one of the most run-heavy teams in college football, one of the teams that used tight ends some of the most and then also a lot of wide zone, outside zone. When you have something that sounds a lot like your offense, how does that help in your projection of how a player might fit with your team?

Yeah, I'll pivot. Last year we didn't run as much true outside zone. That was due to some of the familiarity with some of the players we had. You try to adapt to the strengths of the players. You don't want to be rigid. We ran a lot less wide zone, outside zone, whatever you want to call it, than I had the previous couple of years. I think Kaleb can do it at. He ran plenty of gap schemes at lowa. You can change it up. Again, you don't want to get stale, but he is a really good, whether you are talking wide zone or tight zone, runner.

Does picking Kaleb here reinforce the idea that you want to have a run-first offense? Still plenty of stuff to take shape, but does that suggest that's the direction this offense is going?

I get it. When you have had the privilege of coaching somebody like Derrick (Henry) and again, you're trying to play to their strengths and some of the things we did in '22 where we were damn near a service academy the way we ran the ball. You use what you got and try to play to their strengths. That's not necessarily...We obviously added DK (Metcalf). We want to be an explosive offense. I think balance is the right word. It doesn't mean that every game you're going to be exactly, hey, we're going to be 35 carries, 30 passes.

Again, whatever way we have to operate to win the game, and really that's the thing we want to be. We want to be more explosive. The years I've had it where you have guys that can rip off explosive runs, that may open more things in the play pass or the keeper game or even the action screens. If you don't have that, then you've got to operate a different way. This offense, we've got some returning players, but obviously Kaleb is a new offensive piece we've added along with DK. So we have to get DK the ball as well. As this thing keeps building, it's ongoing as we add to the roster, but we're just excited about this player and how he fits really overall. I look at him as an explosive weapon.

When you have a player with good instincts, does that normally mean a quicker transition?

Usually. Yeah, that's part of the process that you want to do your homework. Where are we starting at when this guy gets here in a couple of weeks in rookie camp? That certainly helps. That's a great trait to have, football intelligence, instinctive, awareness. That's what you are trying to build. You would love to have 11 guys with high football intelligence.

You mentioned a couple of times about explosiveness. Why was that so important this offseason to improve that area of your offense?

I think regardless of your scheme, where you're not just plodding where you are two, three, four yards and multiple third and twos and third and fours. You would like to get those chunk plays. History will tell you that, whether you want to look at advanced analytics. Regardless of how you look at the game, that opens up and usually produces more touchdowns. That's what we're looking for. At times, probably the middle point of the season, we were hitting some explosives, a little bit how people were playing us, and the way we're attacking, but we have to have more ways to get those chunk plays.

How do you feel good about being drafted by the Steelers? Did you get to see that one coming at all?

I love it. I mean, it's a dream come true. You know, to be able to play in the National Football League and such a storied franchise like the Pittsburgh Steelers and a coach like Mike Tomlin. I mean, it's just a dream come true.

I know they met with you at the combine, talked to you at Pro Day. But did you imagine coming to the Steelers, knowing they already have a pretty loaded outside linebacker group?

Yeah, you know, I just think that I really love Mike Tomlin, I love all the rest of the staff, and I thought it'd be a great fit. I love the way they run their organization. And I'm just so excited to add value anywhere I can to this team and organization.

How do you feel about your skill set, your body type, fits into how they use guys like Watt and Highsmith?

Yeah. I mean, I love the defensive scheme that we have. And, you know, those guys are great players. I'm excited to come in and learn from them. And, you know, see how they go to work and, and, you know, like I said, just add value in any, any way or shape or form I can, to the organization and to the city and to the team.

Do you have any relationship with Cam Heyward?

Yeah, I've actually talked to Cam Heyward a few times. You know, he's obviously one of the best human beings there is, and one of the best football players that have ever played the game. And him being an Ohio State guy too, I'm excited to hopefully get to learn a lot of stuff from him as well. So, I'm excited. And, you know, I'm excited to go put up big Cam and all the rest of the great defensive players that we have on our roster. I'm just excited.

T.J. sometimes, I think, wishes he was still a high school quarterback. How about you?

No, I think it's God's plan for me for playing defense on the defensive side of the ball has been good. So, I'm just excited about that. And, man, I just can't wait. I can't wait. I'm super excited, I'm pumped up.

We were just talking to Teryl Austin. He was talking up your ability to set the edge against the run. Why do you think you're good at that, and you're playing position where a lot of people get more attention for their pass rush. Why is that something that you focus on?

You know, I think for me, I just try to play the game as physical and as tough as I possibly can. And, setting the setting an edge and playing the run is all about manhood on manhood. And for me that's kind of who I am as a guy, as a man. And, I love the storied defenses we've had and throughout Pittsburgh, and the toughness they play with, and I can't wait to bring a part of that.

If someone were to go back and watch a game or a play from your college career, what should they look at that sums up who you are as a player?

You know that's a good question. But I don't think I could really point to any play. I think that the tape speaks for itself. And obviously I got a lot of work to do, a lot of growth left to the chase after. And that's what I'm more focused on right now.

Whether there's a part of your game that you're most proud of, that you've improved in your college career, what part of your game would you say that is?

Yeah, the one I really came into this season trying to prove that I can do at a high level is pass rush. And I felt like I was able to showcase that I'm able to get out to the quarterback at a high level and throughout the playoffs. And continue to build that the pass rush arsenal and continue to get better in every area in that in that point of the game.

How much does being a part of the Ohio State, Michigan rivalry prepare you for Steelers, Ravens now in the AFC North?

I love it. I mean, those are the types of games you grow up dreaming to be a part of. And like you said, I already played the biggest rivalry in college. And I'm super fired up the experience, this rivalry now in the NFL, so I'm super excited about it, and, you know, looking forward to that definitely.

You followed the Steelers pretty closely.

Yeah. Growing up, my best friends like a brother me, and their families the biggest Steelers fans you can probably find in Columbus, Ohio. So, yeah, I grew up watching the Steelers, watching all those teams and the defenses and the winning history. Coach Tomlin never having a losing season-just always great teams. Fired up about that.

I read that your grandfather played for the Pirates farm system. What's his name? And how much do you know about those stories?

Yeah, his name is Craig Shade. We don't talk too much about that. He's a huge baseball guy, he played in the farm system for a couple years and then he got called into the draft, for the war.

<u>Steelers Defensive Coordinator Teryl Austin – 4.26.25</u>

Opening Statements:

Teryl Austin: Alright, hello everybody. Just a couple things. As you know, we drafted Jack Sawyer from Ohio State. Going to put him as an outside linebacker to compete for us. Really good, this guy right here is really good, tough, unbelievable, intangibles football character, and he also has a knack for making plays when they're needed. You see him make a lot of big plays at crunch time, which tells me, you know, he's going to be the type of guy that shows up when you need them, when plays are needed. Really, just unbelievable across the board, no holes in terms of who he is and what he's about, and I think he'll fit in nicely in our room.

Was outside linebacker something you were thinking was a big need or was this a matter of just liking the player?

Teryl Austin: I think at this point, we really just like the player. And I think as you get further down in the draft, as you know, sometimes up top, you know, it's easier to pick those guys, but when you have a guy that has all the qualities that he has and intangibles and the winning attitude, those things are hard to pass up. And so, we thought he was the best football player for us at this time.

Looking at his size and playing the position to get in college, is that maybe more suited to play against the AFC North?

Teryl Austin: Yeah, absolutely. You're talking about a 260-pound man who has his mean on half the time and probably more than half the time, and that's really a good thing, because you got to be able to set edges and do things. And we know in the AFC North, if you're not good, stop and run, that's going to be a problem. And so, he helps us in that area. I think he also helps us in special teams, because you're talking about a big guy that's not afraid of contact and will be able to do some things.

At Ohio State, did he move around a lot?

Teryl Austin: Yeah, he flips sides. He did some different things. He and JT [Tuimoloau], they would move sides and do some different things, but you'll see him move around. He's pretty flexible with that. And I think the one thing that we do with all young guys, young guys always play both sides, and they learn how to move around and do different things for us.

You guys already have a lot of depth and talent in that position group. How do you imagine him fitting in?

Teryl Austin: We're going to let him come in and work, and we'll just let the thing sort itself out. I think what happens is, when you have good football players, they push each other, and then the guys that are usually best suited to play will, you know, they'll rise above the other things, and it'll make it easy for you. It'll make an easy decision for us, so we just let it sort out, and his play on the field will determine what he does.

What are some of the things he does to put himself in a position to make those big plays?

Teryl Austin: I think when you look at him, he's a smart guy. He understands the game. He gets himself on edges when he needs to get on edges to rush. He knows when the bull rush. And it's just, I think one of those things, that's how guys have a knack for it. They really study it. They understand the game, they understand the situations, and he takes advantage of all that instead of just playing. There's a difference between just running around playing and understanding the situation you're in and being able to apply that as the game goes.

What do you think about Derrick [Harmon] in the first-round pick?

Teryl Austin: Derrick, really like him, like his explosiveness, like the fact as an inside rusher, he'll give you some up the field push, some different things in there, working alongside, probably on the same side as TJ [Watt], which maybe should open some things up that way. You know, I feel good about his skill set, his length, the different things there, and plays with a good moto for a big man.

You mentioned how critical it is to stop the run, especially in the AFC North. How much does the way the season ended last year and kind of the issues in run defense kind of shape some of these defensive selections in the draft so far?

Teryl Austin: Well yeah, we didn't finish the way we wanted. But I think we're always looking to be better in run defense, and we know, if we're not, then things aren't going to end the way we want them to, so that's how we addressed it. By getting guys that we know, that we feel, that can help us there.

Have you allowed your mind to already kind of, the wheels start turning on, how you're going to use, you know, Derrick [Harmon] and Keeanu [Benton] and Cam [Heyward], how you're going to rotate that group?

Teryl Austin: I'm sure the wheels are turning; they're always turning. Sometimes that's good, sometimes that's not so good. But I feel pretty good about, you know, we had an idea of what we wanted to do if we drafted these guys, if we had these guys in the room, and how we would use them. But a lot of that is to be seen because he has to get here first. We have to really see what he can do and then I make a better, more informed decision at that point.

How much evaluation did you have, or how much interaction with Jack [Sawyer] did you have months leading up to this?

Teryl Austin: Well, obviously, you had a lot of you know, we had him for an interview, a formal interview at the combine, was at his pro-day. I missed the dinner. We had dinner with him the night before, but all the things that you talk about and the people that I know that are at Ohio State, and being around him, they all say that he is exactly what you want in a football player. So there was, there was no question about the football character. And then, you watch the tape like we do, you know, scouts had a really good high opinion of him. We had a high opinion of him and how he fit into our system. So all that worked together, and it made him the right choice for us at the time.

In your process of him, of Derrick [Harmon], did you as a staff really freed up to focus on the front seven? What was the way from the front office attacked the secondary by adding those two pieces for it in the offseason?

Teryl Austin: I think so. I think that, you know, the bottom line is, we know we needed to get some young talent up front, and Derrick was the right guy for us. We were happy he was there. You know how it is, you evaluate guys, and you have a pecking order and a list of guys that are there that you would love to have, you think they'd be good Steelers, and he was one of those guys. So we were fortunate enough that he was still there when we picked the 21 to get him, and now it's just a matter of him developing, coming into our system, and getting to work and living up to the talent that he does have.

Where do you feel like you fit most naturally on the line? Is there a spot you prefer?

Man, at the end of the day, I'm really just going to play wherever they need me. They have a good group. Wherever I fit in, learn and stuff like that.

Yahya, what was your experience like when you came in for a visit? Just your entire process of meeting with the Steelers and Mike Tomlin and Teryl Austin and Karl Dunbar?

First, can we talk about how pretty it is when you drive in to Pittsburgh-going through the tunnel, and it opens up into the beautiful city. That was definitely what I saw first. And then just everybody in that facility, and everybody around there, I had such a great mindset. It really just takes me back to my college days at lowa. It's just hard, nosed tough, and they're doing the right thing.

Did you have an inkling that the Steelers were going to be the team to select you?

I mean, you're playing the waiting game. I loved it there. They're great people. I felt the love come back to me. So, the black and gold sticks around.

How did you and Logan Lee do with tackling Kaleb Johnson in practice?

It's going to be great. Seeing Kaleb there, he's got a good head on his shoulders. Logan Lee, that was my guy at lowa, so it's going to be like we never left each other.

I read that you gained a lot of weight throughout your college career. Can you talk about that process and why that was part important for your evolution as a player?

I was string bean when I got to lowa. The weightlifting program at lowa, they really do it right. Maybe the pounds weren't the best early on, but they really molded me into the guy I am now.

Yahya, you mentioned toughness a minute ago. Can you talk a little bit about the lowa culture and why you think that perpetuates?

If you ever been in the building with any of those guys from the offensive side of the ball, but especially the defensive side of the ball, it's just the consistency that's always there that never leaves. That whole culture has been built around KF [Kirk Ferentz] and he really upholds that to everybody's standards.

Yahya, what was the biggest thing you did to become a better run defender? I think back to the UCLA game, where you had at least five different big stops in that game. What was the biggest thing you improved to become a better run defender?

What it really comes down to is the fundamentals. Coach Kelvin Bell at lowa, it was doing the same thing every single day. He'd always say the Bruce Lee quote, "I don't fear the man that trains 10,000 kicks one time. I fear the man that trains one kick 10,000 times." So, it's the repetition and consistency.

Yahya, how much pride do you take in being a good run defender? And how much is that something the Steelers stressed in their visits with you that they were looking for?

You have to know your role. If you don't know your role, then you're really lost, and you can't do everything at once. So Coach [Karl] Dunbar really, he was like, "Hey, if you know what you're doing you can get better at the other stuff, and improve. But right now, focus on what you need to focus on."

Opening Statement:

Hey, how y'all doing? It's great to be sitting here, because if I'm sitting here, that means I got somebody in the draft. So, it's always good this time of year, and it's always good when you get big guys. So really excited about Yahya [Black], watched a lot of his tape. Good, physical young man. Likes the things he brings to the table in the fifth round. So, you got to love that.

Karl, obviously a lot of attention being taken to defensive line. And even with Jack Sawyer, there's an ability to run something different.

I think, we need to be more dominant up front. And I think the way you get dominant up front is to get youth. And I think he's going to be a great addition to the group.

Is he going to be your nose Karl?

I think he's going to be able to play all of it. I think he's going to play a four technique. He can play nose, but I think we have a pretty good nose tackle on staff right now.

You've had an experienced defensive line for years? What does it mean to get younger?

It's always good to get younger. You know, guys late in the season, you know you can't bounce back because of the beating your taking, and now we've gotten two guys this weekend that's going to really help that case.

Where is a scenario where Keeanu [Benton] can move up to three if Yahya can play?

When we go in our sub package, and he plays great over the guards, and then we're in our O-P front, our three-four structure, he plays nose tackle. And I think Yahya and Derrick [Harmon] have the length to play four technique. And I really like Keeanu, where he is right now, and bring these guys up in that B- gap and get them the opportunity to do that.

Karl, sounds like a lot of teams are going to a more rotational idea along the defensive line. Do you feel like you guys now have the depth to build a little bit more of that?

Well, I think we've always had that depth, as just some guys get nicked up and things like that. And I think if you want to be good up front, you guys got to have a good rotation. When Cam Heyward is playing 55-60 plays a game in the fourth quarter, you don't have what you want. If we can get those plays 30-35, snaps a game, and you got a good rotation going, everybody will be fresh, and then your best players could play their best at the end of the game.

Are options to put some of the returning guys on notice, because it's going to be difficult to take five to seven of them.

It's about competition, and that's why we're sitting in this room. It's competition. So, if you want to eat, go take your food. So that's what it's all about.

Karl, Mike [Tomlin] mentioned after the draft of Derrick about wanting to have a guy be able to work with Cam. What's the benefit you see with these two guys being able to work with Cam?

It's like being in the church- youth and wisdom, you know, he has youth, and Cam has wisdom. So some things you try to give to a person, but I think a lot of players respect other players who've been through it, and that's going to be the benefit of having someone like Cam and even T.J. [Watt], with Jack Sawyer, you know, and Alex [Highsmith], those guys that had game time reps, and you can't buy that. You have got to go out there and earn that. So, I think having Cam in the room with these young guys is always great.

How about Derrick Harmon? How do you imagine him fitting into what you do?

Same thing. He's going to be a four-technique, long, lean guy who can push the pocket. And if we can get guys to push the pocket with Alex and T.J., it's a great recipe for us.

When did you have an idea that the Pittsburgh Steelers were interested and might be selecting you in this draft? I talked to the Steelers at the combine. I had a formal interview with them, and had dinner with them before our Pro Day, actually. And it just made a lot of sense from the moment I met Coach Tomlin, I was like, 'Man this is a guy I could play for'. I'm just so blessed. I'm overwhelmed.

What have the last three days been like for you, and how excited were you to get that phone call, to see that (412)? It's been long, but I'm not going to lie, it's not about when, it's where. And that was what I kept saying to myself. And I had to trust in God and believe that he had a plan for me, and that the right team was going to pick me, and I think 100% the right team picked me. And I'm a Pennsylvania kid, it just makes a lot of sense. And, the Steelers, I feel like, is an organization that I've had a lot of respect for a lot of years, and coming into this process, I was honestly hoping that the Steelers would take me, just because I felt like it was a great situation. I loved everybody in the organization, and I'm so blessed.

What was that Pro Day dinner with Coach Tomlin like?

It was awesome. It was about probably 14 of us, a bunch of guys from Ohio State, and it was really informal. We just got to sit down and spend time with them as people, as human beings. And couldn't have been more fired up to be with an organization like the Pittsburgh Steelers and Omar, Coach Tomlin, Coach Smith, everybody that I've met, just salt of the earth, amazing people. And I'm just overwhelmed. I'm so blessed.

Was the college football playoff your best ball of your career? And if so, what clicked?

Without a doubt, I think at that time, as much as I hate to say, that last game this season kind of gave us the boost that we needed. And, when we went into the playoffs, we had a lot to play for and a lot to prove. And we went out there and played with that chip on our shoulder. I played free. I just went out there and did my thing. And I feel like they really let me be myself out there and distribute the ball. And it was the most fun four games I've ever been a part of, and some of the most blessed times of my life.

How do you go about trying to carry that mindset over into the NFL?

You know, I think it's about the process, and it's about how you attack every single day. No matter what happens on the field, it's a day to day process. It's not about the results. It's not about what happens on the field. It's about what you're putting in off the field. And you know, I think I learned a lot throughout my college career. I've been through a lot of different situations. I've pretty much seen every situation that a college quarterback could see. I've transferred, I've been a backup, I've been benched, I've been a starter, like I've seen everything, and I'm seasoned. I'm ready, I think this year at Ohio State got me so ready for this step to the NFL. And I just, I'm just so thankful that the Steelers believed in me, man, and all I need is a chance.

Considering Jack Sawyer and Skylar Thompson are here, it's kind of a small world, isn't it?

Absolutely this football world is crazy. I can't wait to get back with my guy [Skylar]. Me and him were so close, and he was such a great mentor for me at my first year as a Kansas State. And then obviously, Jack and I are about as close as two guys could be. And I always said throughout this process, one of these Ohio State guys- I'm going to end up with one of them. And, man, I'm so glad that Captain Jack and I are going to Pittsburgh together.

During the draft, Art Rooney, the team president, said that, if the Steelers drafted, a quarterback would be a developmental guy. For you coming in that position, what do you think is going to be key to making the most of your opportunity and climbing the depth chart?

I think the biggest thing is, just like I said earlier is attacking the process and trying to get better every single day. And you know, it's not a matter of what happens on the field or if I play right away, it's about getting better, and it's about learning. And whoever is in the room with me, whoever is there competing with us, I just cannot wait to delve into this situation, and to really give my all to this team. Because that's how I do things. I don't do things half- in. I go all in. And I have every expectation that this next step with the Pittsburgh Steelers is going to be amazing for me. It's going to be the best thing for me. With Coach Smith, Coach Tomlin, with Coach Arth, all guys that I have tremendous. respect for and feel that I could learn so much from. I'm so excited and can't wait to get to work.



Arthur Smith Press Conference Transcript - 4.26.25

Opening Statement:

Obviously, we're really excited to add Will [Howard] to our quarterback room. Really impressive resume, as I've gotten to know Will during this process. Obviously, he's played a lot of big games, and when I got a chance to meet with him and spend some time with him at his Pro Day, [we] just came away even more impressed with the person that Will Howard is. We're just excited that we can to add to our quarterback room and the opportunity to work with him.

Arthur, did you evaluate the entirety of the season? Did something change with him the last four games?

I think it's important. Any player, when you're looking at them, you want to see that. Because it's the same thing in our League. Guys start hot, and you may go into a lull. You always want to see how people respond to adversity, certainly on the stage. And in college football, he played on the biggest stage. You lose a game like that against Michigan, and for those guys it says a lot about them. Ryan Day and those players in that program are a really impressive group. Going to dinner with that whole group. Jack [Sawyer] was there that night. Had a lot of great players. But, the way you see those guys respond and certainly Will, in that kind of leadership role. He played his best football at the end of the year. You see him the big moments of critical possession downs, even in the National Championship game. Momentum plays to kind of end the game, extremely excited to work with Will.

Arthur, when you draft a quarterback in the middle of day three, maybe at the beginning, it's going to start as a developmental piece. What are the keys in terms of helping to unlock his full potential?

There's been a lot of discussion about the development of quarterbacks. I think the one thing that I've enjoyed, certainly last couple years, is that I think the third quarterback rule helps a lot of guys. There's more jobs available. That was kind of the old model. You go back and look at some of the things that Green Bay did, and some of the quarterbacks they got a chance to try to have a runway to work with somebody. I think that's critical, having that third QB, however you want to use it. Now, that lets you elevate. Regardless, you need the time with these guys. There's always a transition for what they've been asked to do, and certainly how you manage reps, pre-season snaps, like they got to play. Having guys, given the opportunity to hang around certainly helps. And then a guy emerges. You've seen that happen before. Best guys got to play, but extremely excited to have the chance to work with him.

Arthur, we know that you wanted to add to the room here in the draft at some point for the quarterbacks. These rounds three through five. They're a bunch of pre-accomplished guys that came off the board. What makes you comfortable, and Will, that you got a guy that can still fulfill what you were looking for here in this round?

I just looked back at his resume, the way he's wired. There's so much attention on the draft. Obviously, it's such a premium position. These guys get picked apart, more than anybody in pro sports. But, really looking at Will and his maturity level, what he accomplished this year. Going from Kansas State and then stepping into that role at Ohio State and winning the National Championship. Those are things you see him do on the actual tape. He takes some of the guesswork about his mental toughness, and then obviously, the transition is going to have the NFL for any of these guys. We have got to make sure we have the right setup for him and give him every opportunity to succeed with all the quarterbacks in that room.

What did you learn about him, maybe that you didn't see watching those college playoff games?

I mean, it's one thing to look at the tape. Nothing replaces that real reconnaissance; however you want to say it. The human interaction. Years pass, Zooms they help. But when you get to spend time with somebody and get to learn what they're about. And really, how they interact with their teammates, what other people think about them at the facility. That came away to all of us, which is extremely impressive.

You guys just added your third quarterback to the roster. Omar mentioned adding a fourth absolutely at some point. How do you go about constructing your offensive plan for the for an upcoming season when you're this far into the off-season and you're still building that quarterback?

It's your job. That's just going back to my history, you've had to adapt. And it forces you to get a lot better. And you understand that to go about this it's not one size fits all. As you assess where guys are, regardless if you had a veteran already established as a returning starter, when you're always trying to work the back end of the roster. History will tell you during the season, eventually you end up playing a lot of guys. That's what's so critical this time of year, when those guys come in really during training camp, to make sure you're trying to develop everybody. That's what I really like about 16 people on the practice squad, and the third quarterback rule. It really just helps. I think it's good for the game of football, and getting these guys. That's what people want to see, they want to see good quarterback play, and so you try to use all those rules and roster mechanism to your advantage.

How much do you put on a guy who's a champion and who's won at a high level? Is it different for a quarterback than a different position?

I mean, obviously the great players come from all over, from you see Hall of Famers from small schools, but certainly it helps. He stepped into that role and took advantage of that opportunity on, arguably, you know, the biggest stage in college football. He's been in pressure moments. I've never been in person to Ohio State/Michigan [game], but I've watched enough of them. I mean, that's as close as you get to a big-time NFL atmosphere, and then, certainly, now the playoff model seasons longer. So you get going back to that question about the totality of the season, a lot of games to play. And really, it's not just the physical stuff. Sometimes it's the middle part that wears guys down. He certainly proved that he has that part of this game.

Carson, are you happy, or is this going to be strange?

Oh, no, I'm happy. I mean, I got my name called, I got that phone call. Oh, man, it's something special, for sure. I can't wait.

Carson, you have an extensive special teams experience. How much is that something you embrace? And how do you think that can help you at the next level?

Oh, absolutely. I mean, special teams is something that I started playing at UW young and early in my career, and something I embraced and really fell in love with. And it's been something I've been able to do my whole career at UW and excel at, and I know that's something I'm going to be able to bring to Pittsburgh, for sure.

So take us behind the scenes with your dad. How did this all go down? Did you know what's going to happen? Did he tell you it might happen? How did it come?

We had no idea. He's here with me right now. I was able to see where they had me, kind of on the draft boards. But the biggest thing is just patience is key, and kind of just seeing where this draft leads. We were literally just talking about it, and he's like "I could see the Steelers picking with the next pick, but we'll see." And then about two seconds later, I get a phone call from Pittsburgh. So, it was a crazy moment.

So he's not in the war room right now for the first time?

Yeah, that's correct. He was there for the first round and flew out to be with us.

Carson, does this seem real? I mean, thinking of your family history and that now you're going to put on the same uniform your father did?

Not really, no, it does not. The crazy thing too is I'm actually sitting in the same exact spot my dad got drafted with the Steelers 30 years ago, over at our cabin, same exact spot. So it's just a full circle moment. It's crazy.

Are you excited about joining your former UW teammate, Troy [Fautanu]?

Absolutely, I can't wait to go to work with him. He's a great guy. I've been able to learn a lot from him and just kind of practicing against him two years ago at UW helped me out as a player. I'm excited for it all.

So when you sat in that seat, was it for the sole purpose of getting picked by the Steelers?

I mean, at this point, coming into this draft, I was happy to get picked by anyone. Obviously, yes, I had my favorites, and the Steelers were definitely up there for that. So just being in this couch and where my dad was drafted 30 years ago, I mean, it's just this crazy, full circle moment. I'm happy we're able to do it.

Carson was the last time you were in the Steelers facility or just around things in Pittsburgh?

A few years ago. Few years ago, I was back, actually, in high school, I know for a fact. And I was actually in the in the War Room for the second and third round while I was in high school, sat there, was able to talk to Ryan Shazier a little bit and kind of understand how everything works, and was able to meet some of the coaches and Coach T[omlin] and all that stuff. So this is just absolutely insane. It's hard to wrap my head around.

Carson, it's pretty well known that the Steelers like drafting players with NFL backgrounds, bloodlines, that kind of thing. How do you feel like growing up with the NFL is such a big part of your life, has helped you through this process?

I feel like I'm just prepared for anything at this point. It's something I grew up watching, watching my dad play, and something more, having him as my mentor, him as a coach and going through this whole process. It's like that whole pressure feeling is something I don't really feel because it's just a second part nature for me.

Just to clarify, you said sitting in the same seat. You said you're your family's cabin. Where is that?

It's over in Westport, Washington, the coast of Washington. And yeah, I was sitting in this spot on the couch that my dad was drafted exactly 30 years ago to the Steelers.

Who else is with you at the cabin?

My mom, my dad, all my siblings, my girlfriend and my grandparents.

So, they brought in a special team coach here, I assume that you would project Carson Bruener to be significant contributor on special teams.

And so, I do know a lot about them and what they play, and you know, it's our job to study that and to get them started, right. You know, that's the big key on special teams. Where can they be successful immediately? And so I try to hit that off with that film study. So, when I get here, they're on go, as opposed to relearning stuff.

Danny, do you feel like you're ever the primary driver of those decisions? Like, "Hey, we like this guy to be a special teamer", or is it more like, "Hey, we like this linebacker?" Do you think you can use them as both?

Danny Smith: Hey, man, that's a tough question. They got a-s-s apostrophe 't', after my title. They give me the player-I coach

Scott, you were at Pitt playing when Mark [Bruener] was playing here. Do you remember watching him? There has been a city overlap.

Scott McCurley: Yeah of course, no question, yeah. Legend here in Pittsburgh, watched him play growing up. And I think that pedigree really carries over when you see Carson play. I mean how smart he is, instinctive, and you can see that coming out in him on the football field.

Was Carson on your radar at all before you came here to join the coaching staff?

Scott McCurley: Really, they brought the names to us right there, and that's who we looked at. But of course, he was a guy you saw play on those Washington teams and did a great job there, so looking forward to coaching him.

What are the emotions right now?

Man, it's hard to explain. I'm just happy that I'm a PA baby, and I feel that PA baby stays in PA. That's an exciting moment for me to go play for the Steelers. But my emotions were through the roof throughout this whole draft, just keeping God first, staying positive. It all paid off, and I'm so excited.

Do you feel more comfortable in the slot or outside? Do you feel like you can do both?

I feel like I could do both. I'm a versatile player. I could play the nickel position. I also could play the cornerback position as well. But not only that, I feel I'm a football player that could return punt. I could come in be a corner special teams player. You could throw me back deep as a kick returner as well. I just want to come in and do whatever I could do to contribute to the team in a positive way.

Did you have any idea the Steelers were going to pick you?

I had no idea. I didn't really have too much communication with the Steelers throughout the whole process. So, it caught me by surprise. But I know Mike Tomlin goes to the Big 33 games High School All Star Game. I was selected to play in that didn't get to play because of the COVID year. I knew Mike Tommy was watching.

What do you think caught the Steelers attention about you?

Just my versatility, being able to play in different positions at a high level, I think that's really what caught their attention.

How were you primarily used in the secondary this past season?

I played a lot. I played both corner and I played a lot of nickel as well. I might have played a little bit more nickel this year. I feel like I can play both. I don't have a preference of where I should play, where y'all think I should play at. Wherever y'all want me at, that's where I'll play.

You say Steelers like you're from this side of the state, but you're from Dowington? I'm from Harrisburg.

Have you ever been here for anything, trips to Pittsburgh over the years, being from Harrisburg or anything like that, or any connections?

My brother used to play at Robert Morris, but I never really just like hung out in Pittsburgh.

What was your special teams experience last year or throughout college?

So, in my early years, I played a big role on our special teams as a gunner on punt, and I played a lot of r1 and r2 on kickoff. This past year, I only did punt returns.

Donte, growing up in Harrisburg, were you a Steelers fan and Eagles fan? A Ravens fan? Where did you go? I actually was a Chicago Bears fan, but I'm a Steelers fan now. Now, where are those towels at?

Khan (Opening Statement): Thanks for still being here. Can't say enough about how the draft went for us. Really feel like we're a better football team today than we were before the draft started on Thursday. We filled several needs, and I think the term was used a couple days ago about "Steelers DNA," and I think when you guys get to know these guys, you'll realize these guys have Steelers DNA.

But again, I'm excited, can't say enough, and I just want to send a quick shout-out to everybody that was involved from our scouts, our coaches and the support staff here because there's a lot that goes into this and things went really well for us this weekend and that's a credit to them and everything they do for us.

Big emphasis on fixing the defensive front and getting some big-bodied guys?

Tomlin: Yeah, I would certainly agree with that, but it goes beyond the defensive front. We wanted to retool physicality in all areas, including in that discussion is the use of the second-round pick to acquire DK Metcalf, although he's a receiver, I think he fits the bill in terms of physicality and size. That definitely was an agenda of ours this weekend.

Mike, when did you start to like Will Howard and what did he show you down the stretch of the Playoffs?

Tomlin: I think like a lot of people, how he responded to that adversity at the end of their regular season and the leadership and play making that he displayed throughout the Playoffs was really attractive. It's really what NFL football is about. There's going to be some adversity. How you respond to it defines you and your football team particularly from the quarterback position.

How about the way Jack Sawyer responded to that, as well, being kind of part B to that team, I guess, and the leader of that team?

Tomlin: (I) Love Jack Sawyer. It's easy to love not only in terms of his resume but his relationship with the game, his approach to football business, how he's viewed and received by his teammates. As Omar mentioned, a lot of these guys represent Steeler DNA, and I think that's really indicative of Jack Sawyer.

Was drafting Carson Bruener atypical at all?

Tomlin: You know, great story, obviously, for him and his family, but as I told him when we had him on the phone, we were on the phone with him because of the merits of his resume and the things that he did at UW. Over 100 tackles this year as a starting inside linebacker, displaying great instincts, and in 22 and 23 he had double-digit special teams tackles for his football team. It is a worthy resume. It's just an awesome side note that his father is a Steeler and got drafted by this organization, I think, 30 years ago.

When you have a player like Sawyer where outside linebacker was not a desperate need for you but you felt like he was a really good player for the slot, how do you balance those things and where do you decide it's okay to pull the trigger on a guy who you think is talented even if it's not a huge need?

Khan: Yeah, I think you said it based on how we had him graded, we spent a lot of time with him, he just fits here, and it made sense. But we had a really good grade on him, and it was hard to pass up at that point.

You dedicated significant free agent assets towards the secondary, went back to the secondary late with Kent from Central Michigan. How do you feel about the depth at outside corner?

Tomlin: He has a Swiss Army Knife skill set. He's capable of playing inside and out. He also added to his resume this year by proving to be a very capable punt returner, and I think that's things that are attractive to you later in the draft, a guy that adds versatility in his game. So we're excited about putting him in the mix.

You went really heavy on Big Ten products. What is it about the brand of football that they play the style that fits with this organization?

Tomlin: I don't know if that was an agenda. I just think there's a lot of teams in the Big Ten now, just like there's a lot of teams in the SEC. How many teams are there in the Big Ten?

A lot more than 10.

Tomlin: So that's probably the safe assumption there.

How does Kaleb Johnson fit with what you want to do in your offense?

Tomlin: Just like I was talking about a physicality and big man agenda, this is a high-volume capable runner who was the center of his offense, a lot of NFL Sunday-like runs, if you will, meaning he did it from the home position or the pistol position into a lot of loaded boxes. There wasn't a lot of guesswork or Saturday-like holes on his tape, and that made the evaluation a fun one and the projection an easy one.

Sticking with just running back, you have a couple of 5'8", 5'9" guys in Jaylen Warren and Kenny Gainwell. Was his size, 6'1", 225 pounds, something that you wanted to round out that room?

Tomlin: (I'm) Less concerned about the measurables and more concerned about the play style and the resume, and certainly he's a guy that's capable of high-volume carries.

When you talk about "Steeler DNA," what are you talking about?

Khan: I remember when I got this job, I talked about what it means to be a Steeler, and I could be up here for three days talking about it. I think when you're in this for as long as we are, you just sort of know, and that's why the process of getting out there and getting to know the guys is so important to us. We spend a lot of time on the road. We spend a lot of time meeting with guys at the combine. It goes more than -- it's more than just about who they are as a player. It's who they are as a person, too. We get to know them on the road and bring them here and the combine is just -- you just sort of know when you're in this. You get a feel for those guys. There are times we leave these dinners or these meetings, we're like, not sure. But there's sometimes where you're like, that guy, he's one of us. You just sort of know. I'm not really answering your question there, but...

With Will Howard, what kind of value do you feel like you got being able to select him in the sixth?

Khan: You know what, he's a national champion and that says a lot about him. Just feel really good about knowing where we got him, just that we got the player here.

Did you expect the quarterback board to shake out the way it did going into this draft?

Khan: You never really know. I think we talked about the other day, we're guessing like everyone else. You just don't know, and it just sort of fell that way.

As you were sitting there waiting on Day 2, I'm sure Kaleb Johnson had to be high on your list. At any moment did you feel pressure to make a move to go get him?

Khan: You know, I think -- let's just go back. It feels like it was a week ago. But we feel there's some calls just like we do every round, but it just felt like it was coming to us the right way. There hadn't been that run on the running backs, and it was a deep position, and we were excited that we were able to get him.

How do you see Yahya Black fitting into the defense?

Tomlin: Like I've been saying throughout the process, he's a big chassis, okay. There's F150s. He's like an F350. He's a big man and really stout against the run. You can always use a skill set like that certainly.

Omar, as draft preparation really ramped up in March and you got ready for free agency, what made you decide to go as heavy and invest in DK, invest in Slay, invest in Eckels at those positions, knowing by that point you were looking at the draft?

Khan: Yeah, that's a good question. When you start the process, you hope that it's going to work out perfectly for you the way you want it. It just doesn't happen. There's a lot of variables that cause you to have to adjust and you have to be flexible and you have to be light on your feet and that's sort of how that process goes. You'd love to get X, Y and Z and sometimes you do, sometimes you don't. The way it worked out this year, it really worked good for us. DK (Metcalf) when we had the opportunity to trade for DK, we were all in on that, and we felt it was important, just excited to have him here. Just sort of happens that way.

Did it sort of dovetail the way the pool was, as well?

Tomlin: When free agency hit, we had had enough time to analyze the draft pool and we recognized that maybe those were probably good locations to invest in terms of veteran NFL guys and so that's why we did it.

Mike, Kaleb's top speed isn't great, but he was very explosive in college. What traits about him to be so explosive despite not having great top speed?

Tomlin: We didn't question his speed whatsoever watching the video. Oftentimes that's the case. You can watch video and be really excited about someone's speed or you can go to the combine and get excited by their combine 40 time. His speed was not in question on video. He broke a lot of long runs in the Big Ten, as we talked about earlier, and so he's just a very talented young guy, but also at the same time, he's a third-year junior, and it's just exciting to be a part of his continued growth process.
