Steelers General Manager Omar Khan and Head Coach Mike Tomlin – 4.22.24

Opening Statements:

Omar Khan: Before we get started, I just want to acknowledge all the hard work that's been put in by a lot of people. Obviously, the coaches and the personnel department but a lot goes into this, and you know, so many departments from the trainers to Burt (Lauten) and his group to the equipment guys to the security people, lots of people and I just want to say thank you to those guys. They really work hard and have done a great job for us. A lot goes into this. You know, not much since we last talked in Orlando a month ago has changed. Still feel good about this draft and excited about the opportunities at pick number 20 and we'll see where it goes.

Mike Tomlin: You know, I second the opening statement that Omar (Khan) provided man, I'm just appreciative of the work that the scouts and the personnel department does for us over the course of a 12-month calendar. We as coaches' kind of get on the moving train after the season ends in an effort to be a component of the evaluation process has been great fluidity in our process. Omar (Khan) and myself have had an opportunity to spend a great deal of time together over the last several months absorbing a lot of information that's going to be useful to us as we make decisions. And I'm also excited about our draft because of just the quality of work that we've been able to get done in free agency, you know it's two means by which we develop our football team for 2024 that goes with existing talent as free agency in the draft. And we've been very active in free agency, and you know, that makes you really comfortable as we lean in on draft weekend so that you know we've addressed a lot of needs, and you don't feel overly thirsty in any particular area. And I just think that that's a good feel as you go into the weekend.

Since the owners meeting has anything in terms of certain positions or anything change when you're looking at the draft? What are the strengths?

Omar Khan: Yeah, I'd say the strengths are still the strengths. You know, obviously we've done a lot of work in the last month and guys are moving up and down and you feel good about certain guys and not as good about other players, but overall, it's pretty close.

What do you find out at top 30 visits that you can't find out at the Combine or Pro Days? And how important are those visits in your pre-draft process?

Omar Khan: Extremely important. You know, the more access you can get to getting to know these players and some players who might have medical issues or other questions. And to have the opportunity to bring them in and sit down with the coaches and understand how they would fit for us and how we would fit for them if we do business with them, but it's extremely important.

Those top 30 visits, can they seal the deal on a certain guy or is it more supplemental just for what you already know?

Mike Tomlin: You know, in some instances it's significant and in some instances, it's a box check. We got several ways to gain exposure to players during this process. You know, those that participate in the Senior Bowl, we get an opportunity and interview those guys down there. Obviously, we get Combine opportunities, Omar (Khan) and myself, we traveled to a lot of pro days. And so, the 30 visits are another means of gathering pertinent information. Sometimes the guy is a non-combine invite, and we want medical information for example. Sometimes a guy wasn't a Senior Bowl participant, and we didn't interview him at the Combine. We also have local visits that are nonencounters. I just think largely for us, it's about exposing ourselves to as many of these guys as we can. And the 30 visit is just a means of catching something if some of the other opportunities have not provided that.

One position where you don't seem to have a long-term starter is center. With the evaluation you've done with the top 30 visits, bringing those guys in. Have your thoughts changed or evolved on that position going into the draft?

Omar Khan: You know, certainly it's an important position and I've mentioned this before, but we have guys on the roster that have flexibility. So, we have options there. But it's you know, if there's some good players at the position and you know, we'll see where it shakes out.

What are kind of some of the strengths of this class of centers in the draft this year?

Omar Khan: There are a number of players at the position that are going to be starters in the NFL this year and years to come. But it's no different than the other positions. I mean, there's good players at all of these positions this year.

When it comes to a potential starting offensive lineman, in your defensive edge, a quarterback. When you've got the first-round pick, how do you weigh that say against like in your guy's case, we might have had some attrition at defensive back or wide receiver, we play multiple people at multiple times. How do you weigh that importance? Mike Tomlin: You do. I don't know that there's a cookie cutter formula if that's what you're asking. It's about the players. It's about their floor. It's about their ceiling. It's about their readiness. And so, there's a lot of variables in the equation. And so, what it requires is a lot of discussion. And that's what's been ongoing for us.

Every year it seems there's so many wide receivers and the class is so deep every draft. Why is that first of all, is that just something that's just going to happen?

Mike Tomlin: I think it's the nature and the development of the game. I think everybody plays with three receivers and five defensive backs at this stage of the game now. I also think it's, you know, the development of seven-on-seven football at the lower levels in high school, where it's becoming more of a year-round endeavor. And so, the people that are involved in seven-on-seven have an opportunity to have a higher level of skill relative to their positions than people that don't. And I think it's played out not only in this draft, but you know, those preceding this draft in recent years. You just really see the impact in the development of high school seven-on-seven as it pertains to the development and readiness of the people that participate in it.

You added a couple of receivers in free agency. How much of a priority? What are you looking to add to that group from this draft?

Omar Khan: It's no different than any of the other positions. I've said this before really the competition, it's important to us and any chance there's an opportunity to upgrade a room, we're going to look into it. But it's a good receiver group, so we're optimistic about the opportunities.

Is there a 72-hour window from Thursday morning till the end of Saturday. Do you guys sleep well? I mean, is there a day where you feel exhausted?

Mike Tomlin: It's really three different processes. You know, you got work you need to do the first day and then you rally and, you know, priorities changed not only for us, but for everyone on day two based on what happened day one and so it's a reset. And so, I don't know that any of us look at it like a 72-hour process. I think it's Thursday and then you regroup and assess not only what we've done but what others have done, and you get ready for the next day and then you repeat the process. It's exciting, particularly when you are prepared.

Isaac Williams was very active for you guys this offseason, of course he coached the Senior Bowl. What kind of input was he able to give you guys on that position? And how valuable is that input in this process?

Omar Khan: It's extremely valuable. I mean, you know, we put them in those positions to gather information for a reason. We utilize it and I think the Senior Bowl, he would tell you the same thing, the Senior Bowl was probably a great experience for him. But the knowledge he gets from getting to know those guys over a seven- or eight-day period it's extremely important. We had great feedback from him. And you know, I'm glad we did it.

You talked about how you're looking to find Steelers. What is that process like? Is it something you know you found a Steeler on tape or is that in the interview process? What are you kind of trying to find during that information gathering process?

Omar Khan: Yeah, no, it's all encompassing. It's the tape. It's getting to know the person. It's doing the homework on him, talking to people that have been around him. And you know, the question before having the opportunity like Isaac (Williams) to get to know some of these guys. I mean, it's all encompassing, but it's a diligent process and you know, it's exciting to be a part of.

Your first draft class was pretty good. Do you put a lot of pressure on yourself to equal that?

Omar Khan: I don't know if I put a lot of pressure on myself. I mean, I think we go into every one of these picks trying to get the best player possible for this organization that's going to help us win a championship. I mean, that's what we're trying to do.

When you're going through all the pro days, the process. What percentage would you say the evaluation focuses on your number one pick through the pro days and what percentage would be after that?

Mike Tomlin: You know, I think personally when I'm at a pro day I'm trying to get to know as many people as possible and that's why we go to some of the pro days that we go to. We go to Georgia, we go to Bama, we go to Michigan, kind of routinely, because you see a lot of prospects. Michigan had I think 18 Combine invites and so, obviously all those guys aren't first rounders. I'm trying to gain information about any and all of those guys, but, you know, that's just the mindset. We step into town. You come in prepared enough on the front end, it allows you to cast a big net and get an exposure to everyone. And so, the key for us in an effort not to get hyper focused on the high-level draft picks, as you mentioned, is to go in with a certain level of preparedness.

How much has Arthur Smith kind of hopped on moving train in the pre-draft evaluation process? And how does kind of his evaluation factor into how your grading guy's?

Mike Tomlin: He's been a big component of it as all the coaches have. We respect opinions. We particularly us meaning the Pittsburgh Steelers, man, we just think opinions are a major component in terms of us coming to Steeler decisions. And so, it's perspective, it's people's opinions and its communications and evaluation meetings in an effort to find common ground and he's been a big component of that. And has done a nice job of really infusing himself into it immediately.

You mentioned that Michigan with so many guys in this draft for them. And their head coach, now in the NFL, was it tougher to get information on the Michigan guys this year?

Mike Tomlin: I mean it's always tough to get information.

Follow-up: Was (Jim) Harbaugh holding some stuff back?

Mike Tomlin: It's always difficult in some locations to get information. In some instances, it's easier. It's just a part of the process for us.

You mentioned pro days. Now you have Justin Fields here. Can you take us back to what that pro day experience was like with him because that got a lot of attention at the time on video and everything?

Mike Tomlin: Sometimes at pro days I'm looking at people that I'm not interested in because I know everyone's watching. And so, to be bluntly honest, there's not a lot of my peers that work on the pro day circuit the way that I work. And so, I understand my movement, what I pay attention to, who I conversate with all becomes media fodder. And so, sometimes I have fun with you guys.

Have there been over the years any sort of fundamental view against trading down in the first round? And if so, what might it take for you guys to be tempted to do that this year?

Omar Khan: Yeah, no, fundamental. I would just say you never trade away; in my opinion you never trade away from a good player. But obviously, if there's ever a scenario that makes sense for both sides, you have to look at it.

Follow-up: One of the reasons I was asking is because there already have been some GM's who have said, somewhere around 20. Like that just seems to be a number that's thrown out and you guys are at 20. So, is there any sort of reason why you think that might be a cut line or something or considered a sweet spot?

Omar Khan: I don't. You probably have to check with them. But, you know, we'll listen.

Mike Tomlin: It's probably a historical sweet spot, to be quite honest with you. That's probably the area where people are having those discussions because there are good football teams that are usually picking playoff caliber football teams. And sometimes trading back provides value for those teams that don't have glaring needs. I think that's probably a spot that's kind of annual in terms of those discussions.

Was it hot when you guys had Kenny (Pickett) there at 20?

Mike Tomlin: It seems like it always is, to be quite honest with you for the reasons that I outlined.

How much of a potential trade can you sit here today or this week thinking this might be placed where we want to move up? You know, this looks like a place in the draft we would like to be. And can you do work ahead of time or is all just sort of in the moment?

Omar Khan: You know, we have plenty of strategy meetings. We've already started between now and Thursday about where the threshold would be, or our comfort level is with certain guys. And you know, there's a million hypotheticals you go through right now and amongst the GM's we all talk amongst each other. So, we kind of have a feel who wants to move up, move down and your kind of prepared. But to say it happens with three minutes left on the clock, probably not the case. I'd say we probably have a good idea before we're even on the clock.

How much groundwork did you have late last year to move up to get Broderick (Jones) or did a lot of that come together on Thursday?

Omar Khan: That one came together on Thursday. I wouldn't say with three-minutes left on the clock, but it was pretty close to us being on the clock.

You were kind of laughing when Mike (Tomlin) was talking about how he operates at pro days. What is it like for you seeing the way that he goes about showing interest in guys you're maybe not interested in or some of just the way that he moves in those situations?

Omar Khan: Yeah, it's awesome. I mean, sometimes I think he's trying to trick me too. But it's great. I have said this before, like, I've never met anybody who's got a greater passion for this and this process than Mike Tomlin it's awesome. Just seeing him work at the Senior Bowl. I can tell you the information that he gets, just being around the players and getting to know those guys and the other people that are there, other coaches, college coaches, it's pretty awesome.

You guys have remade your quarterback room on the fly. You don't have anybody locked up long-term. How would you evaluate this class beyond, I mean, there's a bunch of guys that are probably going to go early. Is that still a position of need?

Omar Khan: Yeah, I mean, I think it's not realistic that we'll be taking a quarterback in round one if that's what you're asking, no

Follow-up: Well, I men beyond that, what do you think of the guys beyond that?

Omar Khan: Yeah, there's some good players there and I wouldn't close the door on anything. If there's an opportunity to improve that room obviously, we'll look at it but like you said, we have three guys who are on one-year deals, and we have to be open to it.

At the beginning you mentioned going into the draft you're not thirsty because all the work done in free agency. How has kind of the team building process evolved? You guys have built through the draft for so long, but now coming into it with almost a head start from free agency.

Mike Tomlin: You know, I don't know that I've looked at it from an evolution perspective. We just do what it is we need to do to position ourselves to be in pursuit of the confetti game this year. And so, we had some business that needed to get done. We were active in free agency accordingly. I don't know that I've evaluated in the ways that you've asked.

This year how are you balancing best player available versus a positional need or want? I know everybody always says best player available but is there some balance that has to be worked out there obviously, not quarterback?

Omar Khan: Yeah, I mean, I think it's the same as it's always been. I mean, take the best player at a needed position.

You were asked before about Arthur Smith, when you change the coordinator and you change the quarterback, how much do you also have to consider their strengths and weaknesses in roster construction and other players who might complement what they want to do?

Omar Khan: I think when you have a change, you always have to have the discussion. Some hard discussions have to happen, and you know, we've had those.

Are you guy's board done or close to being done? And I know you told me before that you guys don't do mock drafts anymore, but do you have an idea of what the teams ahead of you might take or might do?

Omar Khan: Yeah, we've gone through a ton of hypotheticals. I'd say the board is you know, it's, I'm trying not to overthink this too much. But I'd say that it's close to being where we feel comfortable, but you know, we're going through a million scenarios right now. It's just a part of the strategy process. And you know, these next few days are going to feel like a year, but yeah, I'm ready to get there.

Do you do top 20? Is that what you do?

Mike Tomlin: Yeah, we mock it for us if that's what you're asking. It's a waste of time to try to figure out how others might address their needs and things of that nature. We mock it for us.

Follow-up: So, when you do that, do you look at the rank? In this instance, the 20 best players or the 20 players you think you might have a shot at.

Mike Tomlin: Best.

How does this process and the relationships you're building with these guys now help not just for this weekend, but down the line when you're considering free agents, trades, that type of thing?

Mike Tomlin: You know, I just think as was mentioned, we build our team primarily through the draft. We supplemented free agency and even when we're supplementing in free agency, oftentimes, it goes back to knowledge and relationships established and draft prep. And so, you know, you could use that in terms of identifying some of the free agents that we were able to do business with in this cycle. Usually, that interest was born in draft prep, and our knowledge of them, the base of our knowledge of them is based on interest that we had when it came out in the draft.

You guys talked about the depth at receiver because of the way the college game has changed. Has that also led to more depth at corner because there's more people in that position?

Mike Tomlin: No question. When I answered the receiver question, that's why I said those that participate in seven-on-seven because the same could be said for corner.

You had a lot of turnover in the wide receiver room this offseason. How do you feel about that room as we sit now? And the second part of that, do you anticipate George (Pickens) taking more of a leadership role this year because he's the vet in the room?

Mike Tomlin: First part of that, I'm comfortable with the trajectory of that room, as we've mentioned, you know, the guys come in ready-made. There's a lot of talent available to us and a lot of those guys participate. If you look at the kid from the Rams, was really significant this year and I think maybe it was a fifth-round pick. That's what's going on at that position. So, it makes us all comfortable, not just us, but us as a collective, the National Football League. And certainly, we're really comfortable with the trajectory of George Pickens in terms of what he's going to be able to provide us as a player, not only in terms of playmaking, but what his experience within the room and within this organization provides us.

Cory Trice and Darius Rush. What's the expectation for them?

Mike Tomlin: You know, they're going into their second year. And so, obviously, we expect guys in their second year in the program regardless of position to make a significant step. I think that's a reasonable expectation. And so, we're excited to see what they're able to provide.

Is Cory (Trice) healthy?

Mike Tomlin: Moving in the right direction, certainly.

When you look at a college guard or even a college tackle who might be able to play center in the NFL, what are the traits that you want to see in this process and you know, reasons why it might work out or why it might not?

Mike Tomlin: You know, usually there's some intellect things in terms of front identification, and so forth, communication-oriented things, and they have to show an aptitude for that. And preferably, they have something in their background. Whether they were a backup guy that did it in practice, so you didn't see him do it in the game, or maybe a guy that maybe did it as a young guy and evolved to other positions as they've gotten older. Usually, there's a history of some kind there, and an aptitude there that allows you to make those assumptions.

Follow-up: Are there physical criteria too? Whether it's certain size, length, movement abilities.

Mike Tomlin: Yeah, but those are just guidelines. You know, there are exceptions to every rule. You know, there's short tackles, there's tall centers. You know, I think we're all pretty familiar with that discussion.

Those intellectual things, is that something you find out during these top 30 visits?

Mike Tomlin: You find that out at any point in the process. I learned about their football intellect when I'm standing on the field watching practice at Mobile, when I interview guys in Indy. I think you guys are probably making a little bit more out of these 30 visits with the line of questions that we're getting. It's just another component of building a profile.

When you call a player that night and tell him he's a Pittsburgh Steeler. What's that emotion like for you? Just what do you appreciate about that exchange?

Mike Tomlin: You know, obviously it's less emotional for me. More than anything, I'm just trying to get a sense of how they absorb the moment because it's just a window into who they are. You know, or what motivates them, or the spirit in which they're going to walk into that door for the first time. And so really, for me, I'm just trying to assess their mindset as they receive the information.

We talk about at the senior bowl, combine, the 30 visits, the high-end guys, the high-profile guys, but the third day guys, the sixth, seventh round guys. Your interaction, I mean, does that go to the depths of your status on the team or is that more dependent on the scouts?

Mike Tomlin: We try to touch everyone, we do. There's not a lot of first rounders in Mobile, for example. We try to touch everyone.

The new kickoff rule, does that change what you're looking for at the bottom of the draft in terms of body types and things like that?

Mike Tomlin: I think we're all speculating regarding what the impact of the new rule. We could give you an answer, but it's speculation. Obviously, we're making certain moves relative to that, and its impact on the game. That's why we went out and signed (Cordarrelle) Patterson immediately, for example, but I think we're all in a process of figuring out the impact of that play on the game and decision makings in terms of roster building and who gets a hat, late round selections, etc. I think that we'll all have a better understanding of it 12 months from now.

The previous question about cornerbacks. As you are operating, approaching the draft, is there some of those veteran cornerbacks that were on your team last year that are still available in free agency could come back? Are you assuming they're gone elsewhere?

Omar Khan: You know, they're not a part of the team right now. So, until they're a part of the team, you know, we have to look at every avenue to try to improve the position and add competition and address the needs.

What has Andy Weidl brought to this draft preparation now that you guys are going into number two together? Do you have any specific anecdotes about Andy (Weidl)?

Omar Khan: I have a lot of anecdotes about Andy (Weidl) I'm not really going to share them. We go way back. But Andy's (Weidl) been great. You know, I've said this before, I'm very fortunate to have a great staff around me. You know, with Andy (Weidl) and Sheldon White and Mark Sadowski, Cole Marcoux, Dan Colbert and the rest of the guys. It's just been, they're great for me. But you know, Andy (Weidl) leads his process, and he does an awesome job of it and I'm excited about what Thursday is going to bring.

Ahead of the draft have you guys made decisions on fifth-year options for (Justin) Fields and or Najee (Harris)? Omar Khan: Yeah, we have till May. I've said this before we have until May 2nd to make that decision. So, we'll focus on the draft this week, and I'm sure we'll have some serious conversations about that next month.

What do you like better, the process of the hunt or the pick, the kill?

Mike Tomlin: I like the process. I'm a process guy. It's just good. It's good for the short-term, it's good for the long-term. You cannot be in this business without personnel being a hobby and knowledge about personnel and that's what it's about for me. There's a pool of people coming into the National Football League and it's our job to know them. Whether or not we get an opportunity to do business with them in the short-term is irrelevant. There are guys that are coming into this business, and we got to know what they're about. Those that we don't get an opportunity to do business with, we'll probably compete against. And so, that's the mindset that I go into the process about and that's why I'm a process guy. That's why my urgency is there.

Obviously, you guys added Patrick Queen in the middle. Is there any update on (Cole) Holcomb? How do you feel about depth at that position and what do you think about it in the draft?

Omar Khan: Yeah, I can tell you Cole's (Holcomb) working extremely hard to get back. I don't really have much to add on the timeline. We've discussed it was a major injury, but he's working hard and I'm optimistic about all the effort he's going to put into getting back on the field. In terms of the depth, you know, it's no different than the other ones. I hate to sound repetitive but if there's an opportunity to add competition and improve a room. We're going to do it good.

Troy Fautanu Conference Call Transcript

I read you grew up a Steelers fan and a big fan of Troy Polamalu. How excited are you to be wearing black and gold?

Man, it couldn't have gone any better, to be honest, like I grew up a Troy Polamalu fan, I wore 43 pretty much my whole life until I had to switch to O-line, and I couldn't wear it. And just growing up, being a fan of the Steelers, and you know, when Ben (Roethlisberger) was there. I know a lot about the team and a lot about the history. So, I'm just super excited to finally you know, kind of get this over with and it couldn't have been any better that it was with the team that I grew up loving.

Describe the emotion of that call.

Man, I was a little crybaby. I'm not going to lie. You know, it was very nerve-wracking just up to that point, you know, just because you never know where you're going to land and I'm just so happy that things happened the way they did. And I was able to get drafted by a team like the Pittsburgh Steelers. So, I'm super excited.

Mike Tomlin said that you looked kind of mad maybe as the draft was going on when other tackles were coming off the board. What was going through your mind, as you know, other teams are putting in their picks, picking tackles and it's not you?

Yeah, I mean, you know I wouldn't say I take it personally, but I'm rooting for those guys because I met a lot of those guys along this process and they're all really great guys. But you know, the competitor in me I guess does take it personally. You know what I mean. I'm just ready to kind of pour everything into this organization and get ready to work.

Have you had any interactions with Troy Polamalu at any point in your life?

Yeah, I have. So, through the recruiting process, when the University of Southern California was trying to recruit me. They lined up my visit the same weekend that Troy Polamalu was going to be there. I was there talking to Clay Helton, the head coach at the time and then somebody knocked on the door, and he goes to open the door and I opened it and it's Troy Polamalu sitting right in front of me, my idol growing up, my G.O.A.T, you know what I mean. It was a surreal moment. I didn't know what to say. And it's just so crazy kind of seeing. It's just like so hard to visualize, like because he's very soft-spoken. Everything that he did on the field and everything he contributed to football and then like him kind of talking to me in that way. It was very surprising but something I'll never forget.

How did that not work? Why did you end up going to Washington?

Honestly, because I knew Troy Polamalu wasn't going to be there every day. Yeah, you know you got to weed through a lot of that stuff on the recruiting process. So yeah, but that was an awesome experience for sure.

Were you running back before wearing that 43?

Yeah, I was. I was a fullback, D-lineman wearing 43. And the only reason why I switched numbers is because they moved me to O-line.

Follow-up: When did they move you to 0-line?

My sophomore year of high school.

There were a lot of people who thought you were probably going to go before the Steelers got on the board at 20. Any idea what it was that kept you there? Was it any of the concerns about your knee that people expressed kind of late in the draft process?

Yeah, honestly, I couldn't tell you. I mean, for me, everything happens for a reason you know what I mean and the thing that did happen, you know, me falling to 20 was something that, like for me, I just went into it open-minded just trying to get through it because it was a very stressful process. But for me, like I couldn't tell you what happened, but I'm just glad that you know, the Pittsburgh Steelers kind of saw through all that and were able to take a chance on me. So, I'm just really excited for this opportunity.

You feel good about it now, the health?

Oh, yeah, for sure. No, yeah, that knee thing hasn't bothered me in years, it's going back to I mean, you play football and play offensive line. If you come out playing football for years and years and you don't get injured, it's you're like a pony. I understand the physicality that I do play with, and you know, sometimes things are going to happen like that, but it doesn't stop me from you know, showing up to work every single day and playing the way that I do play. So, I'm just super excited to get in that O-line room and just soak up all the knowledge.

How would you describe your passion for the game?

I mean, I would say, everything up until this point in my life, I've done everything to have this day happen. It's all I think about. Football is all I think about. Football is all I know. Especially, playing offensive line, man, you really got to love the sport in order to do what we do down there in the trenches and it's something that I take pride in, it's something that I truly enjoy, and I just really can't wait to come showcase what I can do and contribute to an organization like such.

Has any of the current Steelers reached out to you yet?

Unfortunately, I lost my phone when I was talking to the hundreds of people that were in the building with me, but I checked my phone and I saw Isaac Seumalo reached out to me and I met him when I was there in Pittsburgh a couple of weeks ago. And you know, getting a text from a guy like that, a vet guy that's been around the league for so long and I have to look through my phone a little bit more, I've been kind of busy trying to you know, say hello and bye to all the people that came. But yeah, I'll probably check my phone a little bit after this and then see and kind of hit those guys back up. You know, I'm just grateful man. I don't want to beat a dead horse, but I'm just so happy that you know, this is the organization that really did take a chance on me. I'm excited to get in the room with a lot of those guys, a lot of those vet guys, and learn from them and soak up that knowledge.

Mike Tomlin said, they definitely view you as a tackle. Had other teams talked to you in this process about maybe moving inside? And are you glad to be staying at tackle?

You know, for me, my process has always been, I just want to be able to contribute and whatever role that is, you know, given to me by the coaches. If Coach Tomlin tells me that I'm playing tackle, then I'm going to play tackle to the fullest of my capabilities. But for me, I just want to be able to contribute.

Did he tell you if you're going to line up right or left?

No, he did not. I'm just ready for whatever they throw at me whenever I get down there. And yeah, I'm just excited for the opportunity for sure.

I'm curious about your Polynesian heritage, just how has that shaped you as a person and also as a football player? I mean, it's everything. For me, It's the loyalty you have. And for me, I kind of translate that onto the field with my teammates. And being able to trust the brothers next to you especially on the O-line is something you need and it's something that if you want to win games, you got to have trust, you got to have love, and you got to be able to hold your brothers accountable and know that they're not going to be able to turn on you. And that's something that I learned from my parents, something that I learned from my family growing up and everything in that Polynesian culture is what has made me and is what is going to continue to, I'm going to continue to live that way because it's never led me astray.

Are you Samoan?

Yeah, I'm Samoan and Tongan.



Troy Fautanu Introductory Press Conference Transcript

Opening Statements:

ART ROONEY II: Good afternoon, everyone. Thanks for joining us today. We are excited to welcome Troy Fautanu and his family to Pittsburgh. Glad they were able to make it in on the redeye last night.

We had some inside information on Troy this year because his teammate was Mark Bruener's son, so great to have Mark share some thoughts. The little coincidence there is the last person we picked in the first round from Washington was Mark, and so now we're bringing Troy here from Washington.

As you know, Troy had a great career at Washington. They went all the way to the championship game this past season, and he really established himself as one of the top linemen in the country, and we were excited to make him a Steeler. It's my honor to introduce Troy Fautanu.

TONY FAUTANU: First and foremost, I just want to thank God, man. Without him, this opportunity wouldn't be here. I'm truly grateful, so I just want to thank Mr. Rooney, Omar (Khan), and Coach Tomlin for taking a chance on me, man, and believing in me.

I'm just super grateful to play for an organization like the Pittsburgh Steelers. I'm sure everyone knows I grew up wanting to play for these guys and grew up a fan, and this is truly a dream come true to be here.

Can you take us through the last 24 hours? What has it been like since being drafted and being here today and spending the day with Mike and all these guys?

The last 24 hours has been a blur, man, to be honest. It's been hectic. It's crazy to think back just 16 hours ago or however long it was I got my name called in the NFL Draft. It's something that I've been working on for my entire life. Everything that I've done up until this point is to try to get to this point. I'm just truly grateful, man.

It's been hectic, once again, but I think I'll be able to kind of soak it in once I get back to the hotel and my family and just kind of talk about it, so yeah.

Why the love for the Steelers?

It all started with Troy Polamalu. I was a big Troy Polamalu fan. Kind of watching him, and you get to see what the Steelers are all about, how they play football, what the brand of football is.

I kind of took that and put it into my own game. What I think of when I think of the Steelers, I think of gritty. I think of working in the trenches, stuff you don't see. I take it personally because it's part of my job.

It's an awesome organization. I'm just so happy to be a part of it.

You mentioned Troy Polamalu was the origin of you becoming a Steelers fan, but Mike Tomlin said last night that maybe your dad had something to do with you becoming a Steelers fan. What are some of your earliest memories? Is that how you were influenced?

Yeah. I'm going to clear some things up. My dad wasn't a Steelers fan. I'm not going to say the team he is a fan of. It was me that just kind of grew the love. I mean, I had an uncle and aunt that were Steelers fans, and we lived with them for a year when we moved to Vegas, and then I'm, like, oh, these guys are cool. They're playing the sport that I was.

I've always gone against the grain because I'm a West Coast kid. We're from the West Coast, and my dad is, like, oh, why do you like the Pittsburgh Steelers? They're on the other side of the country. It just happened. Everything played out the way it was supposed to, so...

Why do you think this organization and this team captivated you at such a young age? You talked about how it became personal for you to a certain point.

Once again, just the grit that the team plays with. I grew up a really big fan of Ben Roethlisberger. That's what I always saw him do. He is out there commanding the team and commanding that offense. I always thought he was one of the toughest guys I've ever seen play. He would get hit and get right back up. That inspired me to play the way that I do.

Yeah, hats off, man. Coach Tomlin has done a really great job. I'm just so happy to be under him and learn from him.

Some prospects might delete those old tweets when they come into the draft if they were talking about a team or the league. Are you glad that you left those up and everybody can kind of see how long you've been invested in this franchise even before you got here?

So, I left -- I thought I only left the one. I initially left that one just in case they signed me.

I had my whole agency and marketing team send me some tweets that were a little questionable. That one I decided to leave up because why not? See where we are right now.

How many tweets did you have to delete?

I don't remember. There was a couple, but nothing crazy.

What's your earliest memory of the Steelers? Do you remember Super Bowls at all watching them?

Yeah, my earliest memory was in 2007, I believe. It was the Steelers, and we were playing the Patriots. I don't remember why I remember that game, but I think it was the first football game, NFL game, I ever watched, and I don't remember what the score was. I was 7 years old, so I really can't recall anything that happened, but for some reason that's so vivid to me.

When you were drafted, you hugged a couple of women first. Probably grandparents or mother. Can you tell us who they were and kind of what they mean in terms of your journey to get to this point?

Yeah, the people that I had sitting next to me were the people that I thought were most important in my life, starting with my grandmothers because fortunate enough I still have those two strong women in my life. That's my mom's mom and my dad's mom.

The first woman that I hugged was my mom's mom. The second woman I hugged was my dad's mom. And then I went over to my parents because my parents, without their sacrifice, I wouldn't be here.

And then on it went, I hugged my sister and my girlfriend. Those people -- being able to share that moment with them because they've done so much to get me to this point and hats off to them for believing in me from a young age. I'm just happy to be able to be in a position to help them and repay that.

Have you talked to any of your new teammates, and have you looked at the roster and thought about I'm going to be playing with some of these guys?

Oh, yeah, man. For me, the little kid in me, I'm still a fan of football. You know what I mean? Sometimes I still get starstruck seeing a lot of these guys around here. I met Isaac Seumalo on my top 30 visit, and I've watched him growing up, watching a guy like that, he is talking to me and saying he watched me play before, and I'm, like, what are you talking about? That's not normal.

For me, Dan Moore hit me up. Russell Wilson called me on my flight here. Yeah, a lot of the guys hit me up. It's crazy to me still. I'm just really excited to kind of learn from those guys because a lot of those guys have been around the league for a really long time, but I'm just trying to soak up as much knowledge as I can.

You talk about wanting to learn things from your new teammates. What are you most excited, though, for Steelers fans to get to learn about you?

I think just the mentality that I play with. I think that's one thing that, of course, I was taught, but I feel like I've always had. Just the want to go hit somebody in their mouth, man, and that's just something that it's either you have, or you don't, and I feel like that's something that I have always played with even growing up.

I played -- I was running the rock. I had the ball in my hand, so I was trying to run everybody over. I was always the biggest kid playing kids my age, so I feel like that's where I got it from.

Then when I finally got to play up, it was a little bit easier. Yeah, I just think that that mentality that I do play with and just the passion that I have for this game.

The amount of opportunities this game has offered me is something I appreciate so much, and that's why I'm willing and I want to be able to put my all into it. So, yeah.

Obviously, you talked about that mentality of hitting people on the field, but I've heard you've got some other talents as well, from volleyball to cutting hair, maybe even some piano and singing. How have you become such a well-rounded guy beyond just playing football?

To be honest I just get bored when I'm sitting at home, so I just go on YouTube, and I'm, like, what can I learn today? So, I picked up hair-cutting in high school. I've played volleyball. I feel like I picked it up pretty quickly.

I got it from my parents. My older sister plays volleyball. The whole singing thing, my sister can really sing. I have never told anyone this, but yeah, she can sing better than me, but I kind of got it from her. I just do random things.

You do play piano?

I do. I play guitar. I play a couple of instruments. It's just random things. Whenever I'm at home and feel like I'm not doing anything productive, I decide to put my energy towards something.

The best assessment I've ever heard of you was last night. I said, what do you think of the Steelers draft pick? He said, it's sort of like a ZIP code with arm and legs. Having that mobility and having grace with it, is that one of your attributes that you think you can bring to the team?

I really do. I really do. I feel like -- I'm a product of the people around me. The people around me were very good at what they did with my 0-line coach, who is now at Seattle. My offensive coordinators that I had. Just my teammates, learning from them. The quy opposite side of me is in the draft now, Roger Rosengarten. I learned a lot from him.

Playing next to my best friends, left guard, right guard, Julius Buelow and Nate Kalepo. I learned from watching them play. We all have different play styles. For me, I like to watch a whole bunch of people and pick things from these different players and try them out. Try them out at practice. That's when you do get the ability to do it. Then I go into the game a lot more confident.

I feel like for me a lot of it I learned. A lot of it didn't come naturally I feel like. Being able to move maybe did, but the technique and all that stuff, I'm a student of the game. I'm a sponge, man. I'm just ready to learn, and I know I'm going to learn a lot from these guys that are in this room, so I'm super excited.

Have you been to a Steelers game before?

I have not. I have not. It's crazy, but my first one I'm going to be wearing a jersey on my back, so I'm super excited for that.

Have you thought about what number you're going to wear?

I'm wearing whatever number these guys give me. I wore the same number for my whole life, but it's really not up to me. I'm just excited for the opportunity.

You mentioned last night that you were a running back and, on the O-line. For somebody who likes to hit somebody, was that a move that you welcomed, or was it like this is what I have to do to be on the field?

I always thought I was going to have the ball in my hands. I always thought I was going to be able to do that. When they told me O-line was the best position to get opportunities like this, then I decided to buy in. Once I realized how fun playing in the trenches are and how, like, crazy it gets down there, there's a whole lot of things that happen down in the trenches that not a lot of people see.

The position that I play -- we play as offensive linemen, you don't really get praise until you mess something up. That type of pressure is the stuff that I live for, man. I enjoy that pressure, so I'm just super excited to be here and, once again, learn from these guys that are in this room and soak up that knowledge for sure.

Talking about your evolution and changing positions, starting from a running back and then eventually becoming a tackle, how did you maintain your athleticism and mobility while you added weight to your frame?

I just always felt like athleticism was always something that I could be good at, I guess. I don't know. Just being able to move out in space. My coaches did a really great job of putting me in situations where I could kind of show that, showcase that.

Especially these past two years with Ryan Grubb as our OC. He put me out on screens. I was pulling on counter. Just things like that. Just being able to -- them being able to put me in those positions, I wouldn't be here without them. Hats off to them for sure.

Have you ever played right side, practice any scenarios?

I pretty much played every position in college. I played the left side mainly in games, but our coach did a really good job of cross-training us and making sure that we were ready for any opportunity that presented itself. I'm comfortable anywhere, man. I'm ready to contribute.



General Manager Omar Khan and Head Coach Mike Tomlin – 4.25.23

Opening Statements:

OMAR KHAN: Appreciate you guys all being here. As you know, we drafted Troy Fautanu. Excited to have him as a member of this organization. He's a Steeler. We spent a great deal of time with him. We met with Troy at the Combine, Pat Meyer attended his pro day. We had him in here for a 30 visit. Like I said, we're excited to have him here and can't wait for the rookie camp to see him here.

MIKE TOMLIN: Really excited about Troy, as Omar said. And the tape was just really, really impressive, not only in terms of his talents, but really, I think his talents were really highlighted by the way that Washington utilized his talents schematically. You saw everything that you wanted to see. You saw him out in space in the perimeter game, be it crack toss or wide receiver screens. He was great in the run game. He was great as a drop-back passer, pass protector. We had great visits through the process. Went to Tuscaloosa, obviously, to handle some Alabama business, but we had an opportunity to really talk to some people in Tuscaloosa that had some firsthand knowledge of his capabilities, the coaching staff, and he just checked every box. We're really excited to have him and we'll pause and open it up for questions.

Is he sticking left tackle, or will you try him on the right side?

MIKE TOMLIN: Right now, he's a tackle. Maybe we'll have a little bit more detail for you in the morning.

Is he center capable?

MIKE TOMLIN: No, we're not concerned about that. We legitimately see him as a tackle.

How much did it help that six tackles were taken ahead of him?

OMAR KHAN: Yeah, I'm sure that in the grand scheme of things that definitely helped. Not just for us, I'm sure there are other teams that that helped, but we're excited to have him.

To that point, you had every corner on the board, plenty of wide receivers on the board, every center on the board. Is there anything about your evaluation of the tackle position that came into play in this as well or was it just about a player?

OMAR KHAN: I would say that he was a player that we had rated really high up on the board. He was one of the guys that we were hoping would be there and that we were targeting. When he was, we were on the clock -- when they, when we were at 19 and waiting to see what the Rams picked, and it was just -- we just felt really good about it. He's the player we wanted.

On needing a tackle over any other position...

MIKE TOMLIN: I think position aside, he was the highest rated guy on our board. So that just speaks to our level of excitement about having an opportunity to get him.

As this went on did you field any calls about maybe moving up or back?

OMAR KHAN: Yeah, the phone was ringing, obviously, to move up, move back. It's just part of it. At the end of the day, we had the opportunity to move back if we wanted to, but when we were at 19 and waiting for the Rams to make their selection and they picked who they picked, and we were just, we weren't going to --

MIKE TOMLIN: We weren't moving off Troy, no.

You mentioned his tape being impressive. But when you met with him what was that like?

MIKE TOMLIN: His commitment to the game, his passion for the game really was very evident in communicating with him. That was relayed to us by those that had an opportunity to not only coach him, but we talked to a lot of guys that played with him. His passion is real. It is a calling card. Coupled with his tremendous athletic talent.

Can you speak about his affection for Troy (Polamalu)?

MIKE TOMLIN: A lot of that. I think his dad is the original Steeler fan in the household. But just, he's really excited to be here. We'll let him speak for himself, but he is just a very impressive young man. Upside, young guy in the draft pool, a lot of talent, passion for the game. We're just really excited.

When you took over a couple of years ago, Andy (Weidl) was even talking about building up the trenches, your offensive line. Two years in you pretty much did that. Why is it so important to you guys as an organization to have those guys up front?

OMAR KHAN: Yeah, I think it's, for obvious reasons, I've said it from the beginning, the offensive line, defensive line, those are big priorities, the big men, that's where it starts. We want to be a physical football team and it's got to start up there.

Obviously, most tackles check in 6'-4" or taller, what is it about Troy that gives you the confidence he can do it, and are there other guys that he reminds you of who have done it at his size?

MIKE TOMLIN: You know, what are we talking about? If he was a quarter of an inch taller you might not be asking that. He's got great arm length, and his tape is very, very impressive. It's probably one of the reasons why he was available to us, so we really probably appreciate his stature, to be quite honest with you.

Is it tough to sit there and wait when you like this guy so much, thinking, maybe I need to move up one or two? **OMAR KHAN:** Every one of those 10 minutes were the longest 10 minutes of my life, I promise you that.

MIKE TOMLIN: He is not kidding you either. He wore me out (laughing).

Is that daunting when there's that many tackles that goes in front of him?

OMAR KHAN: Absolutely. But just because it's him, like Coach mentioned, he was really high on our board, and just hoping he would still be there at 20 and, yeah, glad -- I don't even know what time it is right now, but, yeah. It's 10:53. Yeah, can't say enough about how excited we are to have him. This guy loves football. I can't wait for you guys to get the opportunity to talk to him.

MIKE TOMLIN: Just turn the tape on.

OMAR KHAN: This guy loves it.

There was some stories about a medical concern about his knee that bumped him down.

OMAR KHAN: We wouldn't select him if we weren't comfortable with it. I can't speak for some of the stuff that's put out there and what's true and what's not and what other people are saying, but we're comfortable.

He seemed pretty emotional on the screen.

MIKE TOMLIN: He was. We were laughing at him a little bit earlier because he looked angry, because some tackles were coming off. But you want that. You want a guy that takes it personally. I think that he does. He just shows all the signs of the type of guy that we want to do business with. It's important to him.

Were there any other qualities that stood out to you regarding him?

MIKE TOMLIN: I just think his relationship with the game is a pure one. He's a competitor. He loves football. He loves the things that come with football, based on talking to those around him, the preparation things, the training, practice, he's just, he's a black and gold type of a guy.

OMAR KHAN: He's a great teammate. He's a great teammate also.

Do you remember anything about how he first fell on your radar? Maybe how you first got interested in him?

OMAR KHAN: Our scouts early on, they felt really good about him. Mark Bruener, he's a Washington alum, he's one of our scouts, and I joked with him, I think the only school he scouts is the University of Washington, because he talks about those guys so often. But he was the guy we were intrigued by early on.

MIKE TOMLIN: For me, watching him late in the season, just trying to — they were making a lot of noise out west as a collective as a football team, so I can remember laying in the hotel room watching them late one evening, and it was just really impressive, schematically, the things that they were doing that highlighted his skills. Their perimeter game was very left-handed, and just watching it from a spectator's perspective it just lets, you know, that that left tackle was a special player in their eyes, just by play selection. Not very often do you watch tape, and see plays being called to highlight a guy that's not an eligible, but that's what it looked like watching UW tape.

How exciting is it as an offensive lineman to be coming into a team that picked two of its first two picks as a first-rounder last year and seems to be putting so much focus and emphasis on building from the trenches out?

Yeah, I mean, I just know how much offensive line means to the Pittsburgh Steelers and you know, their long tradition there of having great o-lineman and great offensive lines. So, I mean, it's special too. And like you said, you know, they already went to the offensive line in the first round. So, it's special. I'm excited.

Building off of that, how challenging is it going to be for you, Troy [Fautanu], you know, even Brodrick [Jones], potentially being a full-time full-year starter? How challenging is that to get good, this young as a core?

I think we'll just have to (inaudible connection cut out) trust in the guy next to us. You know, for me making all the calls at center, making sure we're all on the same page. I think that's just built through reps and I'm ready to get started on working on it.

You broke up there for a second at the start of your answer. So, what do you say before you make all the calls, I'm sorry.

(inaudible) with the calls and you know, that's something that we'll get through practice and something that I work towards, you know, making sure we're all on the same page.

What keyed your success at West Virginia?

I would say just my work ethic. Just how I attacked every angle of you know, film study, practice habits. You know, in the training room, in the weight room, just, I'd say just my work ethic.

How much does your wrestling background help at your position?

It helps a lot, every snap is some form of either hand-to-hand combat or just using leverage, which is why wrestling is so you know from using hands to understand leverage to understanding how to move people that's really what offensive lineman do.

Growing up so close to Pittsburgh. What did it mean to get the call that they're drafting you and did you grow up being a Steelers fan?

It was unbelievable. I live an hour and a half away. And that's the closest NFL team and I just couldn't be more excited. I'm so excited. I don't have words for it really.

I'm curious how much communication did you have with the Steelers? Were you able to meet with Arthur Smith or Mike Tomlin and what were some of those conversations like?

Yeah, I met with him. I met with Coach Tomlin first at the Senior Bowl. It was really just getting to know each other, getting to know me. He's asked a lot of questions. And (inaudible cut out) the visit I went on up there, got to meet him but, I'm excited to get to work with them and get us started.

What do you want Steelers fans to know that they're getting in you?

Yep, they're getting a hard worker that's going to give everything that he has to the organization to win football games.

Your dad played center correct?

Yeah.

Follow- up: When did you first start snapping the ball and what was it like to have him coach you on the way up?

Yeah, so he coached me all the way through Little League and middle school. That really helped out through high school. But I started considering center once I got to college, I was always a right guard. In high school and growing up.

Did you start at center in the opener of your true freshman year?

I did start it, I did start the first game. And then I moved to left guard for the rest of the year.

So, what was that like mentally and can it transfer into maybe your first year in the NFL?

Yeah, definitely. Well, first off going from high school to college is a lot of studying and obviously the playbooks are a lot more complicated from high school to college. So it is something that I have to study and I just was persistent until I got it.

Follow-up: So, you think you can do that again- now that you're starting another level? (Lost connection)

(Rephrased and asked again once Zach regained connection): So, you worked very hard to get the mental aspect out to start your first college game. How does that transfer to your first NFL game? Can you do that again?

Yeah, yeah. Be persistent. Until I get all the plays down all the calls. And just really start studying as soon as I can. I'm coming up there tomorrow. So as soon as I can get started on it, I will.

Did you get a sense that this was coming? I mean, up here this has been sort of a match that looked really obvious on paper for a while.

I definitely knew that this was a possibility. At the same time, you know, I had no clue what was going to happen. But in the back of my mind, I always knew that this was a possibility. And you know, I couldn't be more excited that it came.

In your conversations with Arthur Smith or maybe just what you know, from his offense from watching the league. What do you know about it and about how much he likes to run the football and how exciting is that for an offensive lineman?

Yeah, I didn't get to talk to him too much, but kind of what he did say is, you know, he kind of does what works. He said when he had Derrick Henry it was a little different than when he was in Atlanta. So, his system is based on the players that he has.



Arthur Smith Press Conference Transcript

Opening Statement:

We're extremely excited to bring Zach [Frazier] into the program. It's rare you find a guy with that kind of pedigree and his resume and the amount of snaps he has in college. Certainly, his background in wrestling. He's been a high achiever his whole life, and we couldn't be more fired up to get Zach in the building.

When you took this job, how important was it to you as a former offensive line coach to build up this line?

I was just excited about the opportunity to get here to Pittsburgh. You know, any great team I've been around, it's always going to start up front. There's obviously so many important pieces, but when you want to play a certain brand of football, Steelers brand of football, it certainly helps to have the right guys.

Arthur, for you to get a tackle like you got with Troy Fautanu and be able to come back right away and get a center, how significant is that?

Sometimes in the draft, a lot of great players and, selfishly, certainly things break your way, and they feel like that, last night, and today or tonight. But I'm just really excited to get a chance to work with both of them. And, you know, even Broderick [Jones], still early in his career as well. There's a lot of guys, Isaac [Seumalo], all these linemen. I'm really fired up to get a chance to work with them.

What is going through your head right now during the draft – the job with a lot of youth in a new system and team?

Yeah, but you know, I'm excited about it. I've been fortunate enough to coach a lot of great young players and previously stopped. These guys have a lot of experience. Both Zach and Troy. They played a lot of snaps as they're not that green. There's always a learning curve getting into the National Football League, but there's a lot of guys that have been here and it'll sort itself out. I certainly appreciate the investment and they're all really top end players who know right. It's our job to help them reach their potential and really the chemistry with the entire line and how they fit.

The makeup, the demeanor, the attitude of these two guys that you guys have drafted in the line in the first two rounds. What is it about their attitude that you like or that makes them the right fit for the Steelers?

Well, I think we get the consistency. They played a lot of snaps at a high level. They're not up and down players. Two really physical players that play with high effort, high football IQ. They check a lot of boxes for us.

How would you describe the identity and the philosophy of the offensive open style here?

Well, there's a certain style of play in a tent we want that fits this team with the history here with the Steelers, the brand of football and that shared vision. Every team I've been on, you want to win the line of scrimmage, but you're going to adapt to the strength of your team. That's a lot of times that's coach speak. But, I would like to argue, I've done that at every stop I've been to. You've tried to play to the strengths of your team. If you want to have a physical team, play with an edge you need those guys up front.

Do you think you have that type of mentality?

Certainly, well on our way, it certainly feels that way. I'm really excited and excited about a lot of the players that were already here on the roster that I've gotten to know the last couple of weeks. and it's really exciting how it plays out in competition.

Is there value in drafting young offensive lineman and down the road they play and grow together?

Yeah, absolutely. I think that chemistry and fit and those guys, some of those guys grow together. You want to make everyone love to play every snap and to stay healthy but to continue to develop. The back end of the roster always and the consistency that definitely helps.

Zack suffered a pretty serious leg injury, any lingering concerns with his leg injury? What was that medical vetting process like for you guys?

Well, it's certainly something I'll defer to Mike [Tomlin] and Omar [Khan]. We feel very confident in the player, selecting him here and certainly his resume and his background. I couldn't be more excited.

Did you take anything away from him crawling himself off the field after his injury?

That's who he is. That's who his resume is, when you're trying to do some dramatic shot for the camera. He's one of the tougher guys I've seen on film around me a lot of Ben Jones and that's a real, real toughness to him.

These guys have experienced playing a second sport of choice, playing volleyball and Zach wrestling. When you see that in an offensive lineman does that make you stop, and you look a little bit more? Does it say anything about their athleticism and the way they move?

I think it's awesome. To see, not to get on a soapbox here, but I think a lot of times you see a lot of specialization going on in youth sports. I think it helps when you have a different diverse background. Different skill player but it just you know a guy like A.J. Brown. He was a phenomenal baseball player. You could track the ball as a center fielder. I think it helps. I think it helps to be well rounded. I'm just shocked to see Troy. I didn't know that. I thought they may have had a weight limit in volleyball. It's pretty impressive. It certainly helps.

Does Troy remind you of any player over the years?

Troy is just unique. His power and his initial clicks off the ball. Those are all very impressive.

How do you feel Zach's intelligence will help with the responsibilities that come with being a center?

He's got a lot of experience with pulling the ball and making calls. There's obviously going to be adjustment to the National Football League, but that experience really helps. When he was in here, he was telling me he does a lot of woodworking. He builds things. Just that resume is impressive. He's a very, very mature person for that age coming in here and that helps. That's why we want him to play center.

When Troy was here earlier today, he was talking about how he liked to go on YouTube and learn things like how to cut hair and play piano. It sounds like he's similar to Zach. They like to have hobbies outside of football. What does that add to have a guy that has so many other interests in addition to being a great football player?

That's kind of what you want. I think it's good. You always want to be curious. You want to be constantly learning, you're never going to know it all. I try to challenge myself that way. It's funny that it's become normalized on YouTube. I have an 11-year-old that learns how to code and video games, I guess cheapens on YouTube. It just shows their overall makeup. That's another reason we're excited to have both of them.

How does having good pullers help you run the scheme and setting that tone up front?

When those guys are really comfortable playing in space, there's certain things you want to add. You don't want to get stale. You're not just going to reprint a playbook from a year before or four years ago. There is a certain intent we want to play, but you want to evolve to play the strengths. That can certainly be up front. We're not going to get stale. There's going to be schemes you add every year and wrinkles. We're going to have our core philosophy, but you have to stay on top of that. The game changes and putting in personnel. You're excited about the versatility, for sure.

As excited as you are, I'm sure, to get Troy in the first round, the first-round tackle, was it tough to leave those senators, including Zach, leaving good ones on the board where you kind of sweat it out in the second round like seeing picks go by and hoping that he was still going to be there at 51.

Last couple of years, I mean, there's things that are in your control and out of your control, it's just exciting when it breaks your way. You know, like I said, there's a lot of great players in this draft. And obviously, Mike and Omar and Mr. Rooney, you know, they're the ones that have to make those decisions and I think I have more appreciation now, I've been in that role before. I feel fortunate, like I said, selfishly as the OC, that we're able to get both Troy and Zach.

As you looked at the tape. What jumped out on each one of those two players?

The consistency and you know the intent that they play with, they both play with an edge. I think they're very smart players. But with that consistency, you don't see a lot of flaws in their game. And that's a credit to both them and the way they worked and they've trained.

They both have 30+, 40+ college starts, especially at that offensive line. Is that value, is that something that over the years know that players like that with college experience players can step in over here?

Yeah- like I've said that I'm really impressed with their body of work. You know, it's the old adage of looking at the whole body of work or you're looking at just the SATs tests, you know that sometimes you get caught on the recency or the guys run in the 40s or the shuttles but you go back to the tape and both those guys- it's impressive; their body of work.

Opening Statement:

I'm unbelievably excited to be a Pittsburgh Steeler. I want to thank the Rooney family. I want to thank Omar Khan. I want to thank Coach [Mike] Tomlin. I want to thank everyone that helped me get here, my family, my wife. I want to thank everyone at West Virginia that has helped me to this point. I'm ready to get to work.

There are lots of successful centers that came from the Steelers. Does that mean anything to you? How exciting is it to get an opportunity to be the next one?

Yeah, there's a rich tradition of great centers here and there's definitely a high standard for that position. And that's just going to make me work that much harder to uphold that standard and keep that standard.

What was that moment like last night when you got the phone call? Do you have any cell surface issues before that?

Yeah, I did. So, I got the call, and I could hear them, but they couldn't hear me. So, I was going all over the house trying to figure out where I could get the best service. But it all worked out.

What was that moment like when you hear them and they're, you know, saying, "Hey, we're picking you." What's going through your mind at that moment?

Well, I kind of got thrown a curveball because they couldn't hear that I was there. I'm like, "Yeah, I'm here," but they couldn't hear me. I'm scrambling all over the place, but it was an unbelievable feeling to have that weight lifted off your shoulders and just have that relief of knowing that I finally got picked. And then also, that I got picked, here, just right up the road.

The last play of your college career was when you crawled off the field. When we asked offensive coordinator, Arthur Smith, about it he said, "That's just who you are." Where does that come from? You know, who are the people or how did you develop that kind of an attitude, that kind of a mindset?

I would say just my family. I was just kind of raised to do everything you can and do everything in your power to help the team win. I didn't even think twice about it. When it happened, it was just something that I did. Yeah, I just tried to try to do my part,

Given the severity of your knee injury, when it happened, how would you describe the offseason when it comes to rehab then to have to stack on a draft process with that?

It was definitely not planned and not my plan but the Lord's plans. Everything worked out for a reason. Thankfully my injury really wasn't that bad in the grand scheme of things. I was able to come back pretty fast. Heal up and be able to do everything at Pro Day and some stuff at the Combine. I'm ready to play football now.

Are you feeling 100% now?

Yeah.

Has it sunk in?

Not all the way. I keep pinching myself. It doesn't quite feel real.

What was the ride up here like this morning?

It was unbelievable to just hop in my truck and drive up here and not have to get on a plane. I think when it hit me was when I drove through the tunnel and saw the city. It's like, "Oh, this is real. This is pretty cool."

What was the reaction of your family like?

Yeah, they were ecstatic. We're just an hour and a half down the road so they couldn't have been any happier. It was definitely a special moment for my family.

Was that your parents house you were at last night?

It was my uncle's house.

On the collection of memorabilia in his uncle's house and having Steelers items.

It's a couple of Steelers jerseys, but he's a Cowboys fan. I had some local media there and they wanted to interview me, and I was like, "I can't do it in front of all this cowboy stuff. We got to get out of here."

Did you have a feeling that the Steelers might take you- that you might end up here? What were some of the things that they wanted to ask you to learn about you on your visit here?

Yeah, I knew it was a possibility. Of course, you don't get to pick, and you don't know what's going to happen. So, there's a lot of uncertainty but, as the picks kept getting closer to Pittsburgh, I kept getting more and more excited because I knew that that was a possible spot for me. And, when I saw the 412-area code I knew right away. Actually, in our meeting when I came up here in the pre-draft process, Coach Tomlin was joking around, 'don't answer the phone unless it's 412'. So, once I saw it, I knew right away.

You played here a couple years ago, right at the Backyard Brawl?

Yeah.

Follow-up: Now you're a Steeler, is it going to be weird at all being right next door to Pitt, given that rivalry?

Yeah, the people in West Virginia hate Pitt, but love the Steelers. It's the weirdest thing. But it's definitely going to be special.

Have you been to Steelers games at all?

Yeah, the last Steeler game I was at was 'Big Ben's' last game against Cleveland.

You're obviously an accomplished wrestler. Only lost twice. I'm curious. How did you ever lose? What do you remember about the losses and how did you then respond to those?

Yeah, both the losses were my freshman year, earlier in the season. I was just able to overcome that, and I didn't lose again.

So how long of a drive is it door to door?

When I left my apartment in Morgantown, it was an hour and 15 [minutes]- pretty guick.

With wrestling and with Troy being picked the day before you, he did high school volleyball. I mean to have both you and him and so many players now play multiple sports. How much does that help you to not specialize before you begin this NFL career?

Yeah, I think it's good for younger kids to just play as many sports as they can. Because, like for me, there's a lot of things in wrestling that carry over to football. And I think it's just good to make well rounded athletes especially at that age. There's no reason to specialize too early. Obviously when you go to college you to.

What about your game do you think it's going to carry over well into the NFL?

I would say just the way I played, playing physical, setting the tone up front.

Were there any centers that you tried to model your game after, that you liked watching to kind of pick up and see what they do?

Well, last offseason, we studied the Eagles offensive line. Watching Jason Kelce, obviously he's really special. I like watching Creed Humphrey, I like watching his game. I like watching football. So, I like watching everyone.

They (Steelers) picked you and Troy back-to-back. Have you gotten to interact with him or what do you know about Troy (Fautanu)?

Yeah, I met him a little bit at the Combine. I'm so excited to get to work with him. You know when they were playing in the playoffs, in the national championship, I watched him a lot. He's a very good player and I'm excited to get to work with him.

Yeah, I do some woodworking projects.

End tables, desks, I built a shoe rack. Whatever my wife wants that I don't want to buy.

Did you really get all straight A's all through school, like all the stories?

Through high school. I got two Bs in college, I think two or three.

How much did that first B bother you?

It bothered me, I was in engineering at the time.

Three young guys all come in together and build chemistry with him. How exciting is that?

Yeah, I'm excited. I think the pieces are there to have a good core group of guys for a long period of time. I think with the offensive line, it's important to build chemistry with the guys next to you. That's kind of how it was with me at West Virginia. We had the same group of guys for basically three years. By my senior year, we were pretty tight and kind of knew each other was thinking. I'm definitely excited for that one.

Who came up to Pittsburgh with you?

Yeah, my wife's here. My parents are here, my brother's here, and then my uncles' families are coming up to the draft party too.

Did you guys all fit into the same truck?

Oh, just the five of us were in my truck. And then there's more coming up.

You got to interact with Mike Tomlin a bit at the Senior Bowl. What was that interaction like for you?

Oh, it was cool. I met him a few times before that. The one thing that really stood out was him telling me to go find Quinyon Mitchell, just get reps of him, and just go to work on him. That was one of the big things for me at the Senior Bowl. Just having a guy like Mike Tomlin, I know that he's watching me, and he wants me to go against the best and ball out. That's exactly what I went out there and did.

How did that interaction kind of establish that relationship for you? And how strong is that now obviously since you're now a Steeler?

I mean, obviously, it was a pretty good impression because I had informal interviews. I was walking past, and I was headed to the Steelers, and he was kind of walking out and we ran into each other, and it was kind of weird. Just me and Quinyon were right there and he just kind of pulled us both to the side and was just like, "You two, tomorrow, every rep needs to be you two, all eyes on you." So, you know that's basically like what happened.

We've seen that you're a willing blocker in some of your tape, how would you describe the edge with what you play?

Some of it is hunger and just looking to make the most out of every opportunity. For someone that has been doubted on and somebody that just wants to prove everybody wrong.

It's been a lot of changes here in the wide receiver room aside from George Pickens. It's a pretty blank canvas. Did they talk to you already about the potential of making an impact quickly as a rookie?

Yeah, definitely. The reason they took me is that they expect me to come in and play it and help this team win games. That's exactly when I'm going to come in and do.

Doubted in what way, Roman?

I feel like in every way, just watching this draft, I just feel like I'm downed on. I felt like I was a top 10 receiver. Just watching a lot of receivers go in front of me, I just feel like a lot of people are down on me.

What's your initial thoughts of getting to play with a guy like Russell Wilson?

I'm just blessed to be able to play with a guy like that. I grew up watching him win Super Bowls, play with a very good team and him being a leader and a great guy he is. I just can't wait to get to work with him.

Roman, there's a little bit of an age difference. But did you know the Herbig brothers in high school at all? It's kind of crazy that you're both all three from Hawaii?

Yeah, yeah, well, Nick Herbig we're in the same grade, same age we play ball together. Nick, I know him very well. When I went to high school with him, we kind of grew up together a little bit. So, that's my guy.

Follow-up: Could you ever imagine playing now in the NFL with him? I mean, how crazy is that to end up happening?

Oh man, I never thought I would be on the same team as him in the NFL. But as I got closer to the draft day, there were more and more rumblings about it. I could kind of see it happening before it started.

National Championship last year, what did you learn the most or what was the most important lesson you learned about winning at Michigan?

I think the most important thing I learned about winning is that I think winning is more important than anything you could ever do on the field. I feel like your main focus should just be winning instead of just trying to put up some crazy stat line. It just helped me focus on just winning and doing whatever I need to do to win a game. That was the biggest thing I learned at Michigan.

What led to your more consistent season this year? You obviously put up better stats this year.

I think to just turn it up a notch. Get in the lab, watch some more film. Get on the field more and just working harder and just really just investing everything I have into it, to really commit myself and just taking it to another level than I was on before.

Any NFL receivers you've patterned your game after in any way?

I watch a lot of Tyler Lockett and Hunter Renfro. Just mainly those two guys this year. I just felt like I was trying to emulate my game after them and just trying to figure out more ways to get the ball in my hands.

Roman, obviously, you ran the ball a ton at Michigan as a receiver. Is there a certain mindset you have to take to be a part of that and to buy into something like that?

I feel like if your mindset is to win a game, you're going to go out there and do whatever your coach asked you to do to help the team win. At Michigan, for me it was blocking, so if I want to win the game, I'm going to go out there and I'm going to block my ass off.

Opening Statement:

Yeah, we're really excited to add Roman Wilson, another really high football character player, a lot of production last year at Michigan, part of that really impressive class in the draft this year. And it was really fun being at that Michigan Pro Day, got a chance to go to dinner with all those guys with Mike (Tomlin) and be a part of that process. He really impressed on the football field but off the field as well. So, I'm fired up to get a chance to work with Roman.

Pretty obvious from the outset of the Senior Bowl, Mike Tomlin looked pretty interested in Roman. When you first got to watch his tape and got to know him, what stood out to you about him?

Competitiveness. I think you can see his instincts on tape. I thought he stepped up in the big moments. And, he had a great energy about him too when I met him in person, with a lot of people at dinner. Again, you could see meeting a lot of those guys at Michigan, why they won the National Championship, credit to those players and that staff. We're just really excited to add that kind of value and experience as a rookie and add to that receiver room.

Arthur, where do you expect them to fit in with this offense?

Yeah, well, he's got versatility. And as the game evolved and if you do motion and you play condensed on early downs, you know whether you're at the x or z, it's interchangeable. Now you're getting into some of the drop back situations in the passing down. I mean, he's got inside-out flex. Certainly, you like his instincts that you can play inside. You know, in those kinds of obvious pass situations, but he'll have a lot of versatility. He's got a lot of instincts. Again, high football character guy.

You're talking about a high character guy - at that position, the perception is that there are not a lot of high character guys. Is that you're feeling and is that why he stands out to you?

It's one of the many attributes that makes him an impressive pick for us, but you know, I think that's very subjective. My experience and again, I just go back by my own experience where I've been fortunate to work with guys, I think that have high football character. And I get that's a very subjective thing, but I just look at their resumes and just my interactions and their body of work. So, whether you agree or disagree with that, I get it. It's pretty subjective, but I can say I've been lucky.

Mentioning that high football character, he was just saying that he'll block his ass off. I mean, what does it mean to have a guy that is that gritty and how important was it when you're looking at tape to see him and doing that dirty work?

Yeah, well you know, sometimes you don't knock a guy you know, the way the game is played in college. I guess they're changing some of the timing rules a lot, a lot of offensive skill, a lot more snaps to do and professional football. You know, so you don't knock, especially if they're playing really fast. Sometimes you know, but I think what Michigan you saw, call it a pro style and they did a lot of things that would translate to the pro game. What I saw was a great teammate. You know, everybody wants the ball and that's great. You want guys that want the ball. I have a problem with guys that don't want to work. So, the guys are good teammates and do that, you can get more possessions and extend drives. I think the tape shows a lot about your personality. People can say what they want, but you look at their actions and certainly Roman's pops off to the tape backs up when you meet them in person. We're just really excited to get him in our program.

He drew an analogy or said that he tied himself a little bit after Tyler Lockett and Russ (Wilson) being your quarterback - can you see a little of that imagery? Can you picture that a some?

So, I never got a chance to work with Tyler Lockett, been a big fan of his, he's a productive player. That'd be hard for me to compare him. You know, obviously if Roman sees himself that way, I think Roman's a unique football player in his own right. And I'm just excited. I won't make a judgement until I really get to work with them.

You do have a very blank slate right now in the receiver room. That versatility, as you mentioned before, comes into play because you don't know who else is going to be dyed in there that you can bounce around and do different things. Is that part of why you chose him where you chose him?

Well, I think as an organization, we felt the value that he added to this team. I think the reality in the NFL, you know week in and week out you're talking about maybe 1,100 snaps in the regular season and hopefully more playing into February. So, you need depth. Certainly, you may have game plans and if you have an injury somewhere and you don't have guys that can go - you're going to have to adapt your plan. So, if you have guys that are versatile, they know more than one spot, that has a lot of added value on game day, especially as a young player.

What are some of the things Roman needs to improve on at this level? Is it hard to evaluate it at all when a guy's coming from such a dominant offense? And they weren't stopped very often last year last season.

Yeah, I mean, every player you know, if you're going into your 13th season, you're always looking to improve, and there's always things you got to work on. And same with coaches, you want to continue to improve and evolve. So, we're excited and again, we got a long journey ahead of us as we get ready to play a season, get ready for week one. And that's ultimately what you're starting to build when they get into the building and rookie minicamp there's a progression to get these guys ready to go. And we're just excited that he's a part of this rookie class.

It looks to more it looks like he did most of his damage between the numbers just how does that fit into what you want to do here?

Yeah, I mean, like I said, when in a game for a lot of teams now there's so much condensed, you know, don't go inside the numbers and you know, people motion all over the place now so they're not very static. So, you've got to you got to be versatile and then a lot of it if you're going to get into action and you see some of these run alerts or bubbles and the play action and the movement game. If you've got an instinct and it's different then you get to the drop back and obviously if he's got instinct and he can match up and win in the slot, that's a huge added value in those critical third fourth down two minutes situations. So, we're just excited. Hopefully continue to work like all these guys and expand his game, have a little inside-out flex.

This is a fairly young offense. Do you think that there will be anything challenging about that? Or is that exciting to you that you have a bunch of young guys that you can kind of mold to what you want?

I'm excited, never been afraid to play young guys or veterans. Like I said, competition I'm hopeful we'll have and create. Guys that give me bravado. We've done it before to work on those guys and you know, we'll be counting on a lot of these guys. Young players, not a lot of experience. But that ball is going to kick off week one. And you know, it's our job to get ready to roll.

With your older brother having played for one of the other pro teams here, have you been to Pittsburgh much? Have you been around the city as a fan before coming here now as a player?

Yeah, I actually came to a few games because my brother played for the Pirates. It's one of my favorite cities of all time. My brother actually used to live in the Strip District so super familiar with the city and just super familiar with how much Pittsburgh loves their professional sports teams and super excited to get there.

How do you see yourself fitting in with this defense? Do you see yourself dropping into coverage?

I think that just my versatility kind of speaks for itself. I think I'm able to play in the box as well as drop into coverage. Growing up, just watching the Pittsburgh Steelers defense. That's kind of the way that I modeled the way I play. Just hard and fast and physical and playing as tough as you can play. Just super excited to get with everyone there and continue to elevate my game.

What kind of feedback did you get from the Steelers and other teams as you're going through this process?

Yeah, I think a lot of it was just how I've stayed healthy these last two years and being able to maintain that productiveness that I've had. I think that I'm one of the most productive players in this year's draft. That's the feedback that I got. If I'm able to stay healthy, which I plan on doing, that's kind of just the way I live my life now, just very religious about my maintenance programs and my nutrition, that I can be one of the best linebackers in the NFL.

Did your parents name you after anyone in particular?

No, it's actually a pretty funny story. I think my mom got my name off, baby.names.com.

What did you learn going through some of those injuries?

I think when you turn on my tape, you can kind of see that I play with my hair on fire. I think that's truly because of what I've been through. Just really understanding that you can't take this game for granted, because no one in the world knows when that last snap is going to be. Everything that I've gone through, I've really learned to trust my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, as well as to continue to play the game like it's going to be taken away from you. I just play as hard as I possibly can and prepare as hard as I possibly can.

Are there any linebackers or other players that you've kind of watched or tried to model your game after?

Growing up, I was a massive Luke Kuechly fan. Just how smart he played, the fearlessness that he played with, and the high motor that he had. Lately, I've actually studied Patrick Queen, who's going to be a teammate of mine here soon. It's been awesome just to study those guys, and other guys like Logan Wilson, just his versatility and zone coverage. I'm just trying to take individual things from different players and try to elevate my game.

That's one of my idols, an NC State legend, someone who lives life the right way as well as on and off the field. His name's in the Ring of Honor at NC State and he's one of the best coaches to ever coach in the game and one of the best linebackers to ever play. I'm super excited to wear this jersey and continue his legacy.

You're wearing his jersey at NC State?

No, I was just saying that, put on the Pittsburgh Steelers jersey, a team that he coached, just excited to kind of continue that legacy.

Opening Statement:

He was a guy we had high on our board. Liked him as a football player. He's very productive, fast, and really has good football instincts. All the things you kind of want in a football player. To see him where he was and have an opportunity to get him, we thought that was a good thing and we like where we are at with that.

How do you balance his injury history with the production over the last couple of years?

I look at the tape that I see. I let the doctors handle all the medical stuff. My job is to grade the tape as a football player, and what I think and how he helps our defense. He brings some speed to our defense, he brings some physicality to our defense, and ability to cover guys. That's what I look at.

What most stood out about him on the tape?

The speed. He can really go. He is a quick-trigger guy, which I think you like that as a linebacker. He sees and diagnoses things fairly quickly. And allows us his speed to really show up in games.

On his speed evident on tape

Yes, there's always when you look at it there will be guys you watch, and go, "I didn't know he was that fast when they run the 40 at the Combine. When you watch this tape you go, "Boy this guy is fast!" That's always a good thing. That a guy plays to his speed.

How do you see him fitting in with a guy next to Patrick Queen?

Right now we just want to get him in here and kind of get him up to speed on what we do, where he fits and how he fits will be determined by him. Once he gets in here and learns what he does, and then we'll see how he does and how fast he is able to earn a spot.

Is his speed what led him to those interceptions?

I think it's a little bit of all of that. I think when you watch guys and get around the ball quite a bit they're using good key react guys, they see things and they trust what they see they go fast and you see that in his play.

What does he bring to the position group from a mentality standpoint as it's important to you guys with linebackers. And, it seems like you get good reviews from that- that he's from NC State.

Yeah, he's one of the guys that loves football. I think that's one of the characteristics we look forward to from those guys because it's a tough game and the way he likes football, he is a good leader on his team. All those things are attractive, and I think he can bring that to us.

Do you think those attributes will start out well in special teams, like that's a place where you can make an impact right away?

Absolutely any young guy that comes in, that's the first place where you want them to make their bones, so to speak, is being available and active in special teams until you earn a spot as a starter.

I know Patrick [Queen], one of things you liked about him is his blitz ability. Does he allow that comfortability in the middle of the field so you can free up Patrick and plays where they are together?

I think talking about how he pairs with Patrick, which is I think his ability to run and play in space is really attractive. And we know what PQ can do. And so, we'll see what [Peyton] can do, if he can bring the things that he's shown on college tape to us, I think it'll be a bonus for us because we'll have a guy that can also show he can blitz, but he shows that he can cover. He can do a lot of different things and I think that's always valuable when you have a guy that can do both.

Body styles 6'4, but kind of skinny, runs real fast. Does that make it harder to see how he might fit in your defense? Yeah. What I looked at was how he played on tape. Then put it together with well you know, maybe he's a little bit taller, and nit-pick that way. I looked at what he had on tape, what our scouts thought about him, how we evaluated him against the crowd. And we went from there and what we thought was we found ourselves a Steelers football player.

Absolutely. I'm very excited to be a Pittsburgh Steeler. This is definitely a dream come true.

From what I understand you were kind of an overlooked guy in high school. I think at one point you were a zerostar recruit. How did that shape you and how were you able to overcome some of that?

Coming to South Dakota State, there's a ton of amazing people here. And they've developed a ton of really, really good players and this place is special. And so, shoutouts go to South Dakota State. It's been an amazing ride and I've loved every bit of my time here.

When you made your pre-draft visit, what stood out about your visit and your meeting with the coaches and staff? I just loved all the coaches. Between Coach Meyer and Coach Tomlin. Omar (Khan), the GM, is awesome. I'm just super excited to be in that building with a ton of amazing coaches and great people.

What was the key to making 57 consecutive starts? Is that some kind of record for an offensive lineman?

I don't know if it's a record or what, but it's just consistent effort on a daily basis. That's what I pride myself on and I'm excited to be a Steeler.

How would you describe your playing style?

Opening Statement:

Yeah, so obviously, Mason [McCormick] loved it and got him here. Third round, kids come from a smaller school, one double A division there, South Dakota. But the kids are tough, he plays football the right way, he loves football. He wanted to be a Steeler, I know that, just talking to him and working the kid out. So we're obviously excited to have him. So I have him penciled in at the guard position and he'll come in and compete from day one.

You ever had a one, two, and a four (draft round picks) before your coaching career?

I have not. That's the first time doing it and the draft is still young so we'll see what happens here later on.

Pat, why so many offensive linemen?

I mean, numerous reasons. Obviously, we wanted to continue to become youthful at that position. We got Broderick [Jones] here last year, pick three this year. You know the draft is always different, you never know. I mean, we could have come out with zero this year, we came out with three. Just the way the draft order goes down and the picks and who's available at that position. But obviously we're excited about it- having three new guys in the room. All three of them would be great additions for us.

Pat, is there a common trait that all three of these guys have, these offensive linemen have, in their attitude or the way they play that really jumped out to you guys in the process?

I would say that's probably the main thing, is like you said like, their attitude and their play style. I don't want to say they're not pretty players or all that, it's just all three of them have this quality that you really liked, that here especially at the Steelers. You talk about guys that are tough, that love ball that are just fanatics about it. All three of them, all three of those guys have those traits that we were really looking for here over the last couple of years.

Pat is there a difference between evaluating Division 1 and Division 1 Double A guys?

Not really, you got to look at who they're playing. You'd like those kids that come from the smaller schools to play some form of bowl games like Mason did and get to play against better competition. There's still good competition there but just day in and day out because you know, the leap from college to this level, to the NFL, is obviously going to be a huge jump for all of them. Because, every day they're playing against, obviously, they're playing against the best. So in terms of evaluation, not really, I mean, you still look for the traits, in terms of physical traits and play style, do they have that and what redeeming qualities do they have that we really love. And then their makeup, their background, their play style, the way they're brought up in the athletic realm and football. That's what we'll look for.

Did you watch his lowa tape?

Yeah.

Follow-up: How did you like that?

Good. Because obviously, when you have a guy like that, and they play a major power five school you study that one too. Because competition is just what it is, they typically have a better athlete or a better player playing against themselves. We've studied that (lowa game film), studied him in the bowl game and in many games. Again, regardless of competition, it's the style of play, play in and play out. How did the guys finish? Just play style, how do they finish, how do they act throughout the game? Are they banged up in this game? Do they still play through injury? That type of stuff, we study all of it.

How did the athleticism at the Combine impact your thoughts on [Mason]?

He did great there. You talk about guys in the 'green', like your numbers wise in terms of what his 10 Time is and shuttle times and all that. He was in that upper echelon of timing. The film is the film and that's what we base it off of. But you got guys that are close, that are ranked similar. Then you go back to the numbers and 'this guy's this, this guy's this'. So it gives you more athletic, quickness number wise.

Pat as an offensive line coach, how exciting is it to see the team really commit to building from the trenches? To see that just being a continued commitment.

It's great. Obviously, I'm biased, coaching O- line and being an ex-lineman. Games are won in the trenches. That's true, I know it's a cliche act, but that's got to start up front. And they're going to add to a room that we've been working on for a few years here now, that's going to just add to that group and into that room. It's going to be great. It's going to be awesome.

What kind of benefit can this be with a big group of guys that are all about the same age, coming up and building on the same things together in terms of team building?

It's good. We got a good group in here, like the room itself. We have a mixture of vets and older vets and fifth- and sixth-year guys, Isaac [Seumalo] is a ninth-year guy, Broderick is going to be a second-year guy, and three new ones coming in. You want to build that and stay as young as you can. Young, healthy, hungry- all that. So, it's going to be a fun process.

You have guys that can really work in space with Mason, Zach [Frazier], Troy [Fautanu] and other guys who have. How's that helped with your run game diversity? You can do pulling, wide zones, all that stuff.

Yeah, it gives us flexibility in the playbook for that type of stuff in terms of athleticism and youth. And so it'll open up the playbook and obviously we'll have a system here and we'll run the system that we have here. But, having quality guys here, whether everyone becomes starters or backups, that'll play its way out during OTAs spring camp and training camp in July and August.

Is there a common trait these three guys had or something you were looking for that they checked off the boxes for?

Like I said earlier, I think the biggest thing is their play style and the love of the game. They all, but some guys stand out. And all three of these young men, their mental makeup, their approach to the game, the love of the game. And, their playstyle in terms of being tenacious and wanting to finish. Because all three are going to be different in terms of athleticism, but that mental makeup and football background that they love the game and want to come in and compete right away.

Some players getting drafted aren't as young, multi-starters. Some will be 23 at least by the time the season starts. Does that help in terms of being able to hit the ground running?

I mean, they're gonna be a little bit more mature than maybe somebody else that's coming in at 20 or 21. All the guys that are getting drafted are here. It's individually going to be based off, how do they pick it up? How quickly do they pick it up? The position that they're going to play, the competition. All that's going to play itself out.

Is there something that you like to see in these offensive linemen that have hobbies outside of football? What does it kind of tell you about how their mind works or their approach to things?

Yeah, no, that's fair. Like you said, woodworking, he likes to build things with his hands. So that's with his mental capacity. It's always neat to just find out what drives these young men. Just so you know coming in, this is what his hobbies are. Whether it's, Mason is going to be more of an outdoorsman, more of like the fisherman and hunter. So it's kind of neat, kind of unique. They're all again, they're all individuals and all different. So it's kind of a unique perspective to see where they are and how they come from, and what their other interests are outside of football.

You look at these three offensive linemen you added, where do you think that they will continue to develop and to reach their full potential?

Individually based it's going to be different for everyone coming in. You just got to get in here. They're going to work hard and they're going to work at it. We're going to work with them, but we got to figure out each one individually and what they need to work on. This is in terms of them attaining their goals of coming in and helping us here in the near future.

Do you remember when Mason first popped up on your radar? What caught your attention about him?

This whole process with him, and like most of the guys from the Combine on you try to pick all these guys that you have an idea of who they are, unlike the scouts that have been following these guys for a year or more. As a coach, you're watching these guys going into the Combine to just get an idea of who they are. It's just the process, just a long process figuring out who they are. You're at the combine, here's what they did at the Combine, and at Pro Day. And then you're evaluating their tape, from the last year or years in the past. If you want to go back and haven't looked at it like versus I were somebody else versus another team. It's just a long process. Everybody's put a lot of work into it. To this point it's worked out well for us.

Does the word butt kicker describe these three offensive lineman you drafted?

I would say yes. These guys are tenacious. They play the game "the right way". And they're the love of the game. All three of them truly have that love for the game and the passion for the game. They want to get going right away and that's obviously exciting for me as their position coach to work with them.

You've had a number of guys that haven't worked well together. How do you accelerate that communication and try to build that bond as quickly as possible?

It's a lot of work. There's going to be a lot of work on here over the next several months. First of all, get them here and find out what they can do, where their comfort zones are, where they're not, where they're uncomfortable, and make that comfortable for them. It'll just be hands on and it's going to be a fun process. Coming into the NFL they're going to have their ups and downs being young, but just the mindset and the mental makeup that they have. Just keep working with them every day and keep getting them better each day.

In what ways have you seen the offensive line changed the most since you got here? What would you say the defining characteristics are?

I just think with the draft picks that we've had, we got two last year, with Broderick, and Spencer [Anderson]. Then, we get three now and then the free agents that we brought into, we've essentially changed the look of the room. In the last two years, we've changed the look of the room. It's new guys, new starts. They want to work. This group wants to get better and they really love the game. They're a tight-knit group together. They do a lot of things together. It's the way that I like to put a room together, with a thought process of coming to work every day, enjoying it because they enjoy it, and they want to get better. So, just a mixture of all that.

He came up here on the top 30 Visit, good young man and I think he fits the Steelers mold.

Why do you think he fits the Steelers mold?

What's the key when you drafted a defensive lineman, at this point, a little bit later in the draft? And developing him into a contributor early in his career?

I think the thing is, are they fundamentally sound, can they take coaching. And that's the thing when taking him at this position makes it good for the Steelers.

Do you have any idea the Steelers were so interested in you?

I think I figured I had a chance of coming to Pittsburgh. Everything was up in the air, but I felt like I left a good impression with the staff. When I met with them at the Combine, and really just trying to do my best to show them that I'm worth the pick.

Where do you see yourself outside? Maybe moving inside? Where do you see your fit in the NFL?

I could fit anywhere, really. I feel with my size and my speed and whack and moving my body. I feel like not a lot of six-three corners can move like I can. So to be able to just keep developing. I feel like I can be played at safety, nickel, corner. I feel like I can just maximize my potential anywhere, really.

When you met with them with the Steelers, did they talk to you about playing safety or corner? Or was there any discussion about that?

No. It was really up in the air, but they just really liked how versatile I was. I like the idea that they can play me at a corner or safety or nickel, really. So just being able to have that versatility. I think that's what they love most about me.

How much experience do you have playing special teams?

I've been playing special teams since my freshman year at Ohio State. I was at Ohio State for two years and then Texas for two years. I've been playing special teams throughout my whole career. Every one: kickoff return, punt, punt-return, so I got a lot of experience.

Has anyone around you used the term "Avatar-Corner" around you?

I've never heard that one. That's a first.

Ryan as the draft is going on, you know, and we're getting into the sixth round here, what were your emotions and then when the phone call came, you know, what was that moment like?

Oh, man, it was amazing man. I felt like all my work finally was able to pay off and I just got to really be thankful to God because being able to be in this position. I had a lot of trials and tribulations and I'm just here to finally be a part of a home so I can go ahead and get to work and put the odds to rest. I feel like there are a lot of odds stacked against me and I got a lot to prove. So I feel like having that edge and having a lot to prove makes you the most dangerous man in the room. So I'm ready to work.

So in order to prove that, where do you feel like your game needs to continue to evolve and where would you like to see yourself continue to develop?

Really just consistency, just hone in, leveling into the next part of my game is getting more comfortable. I know when I unlock that it is going to be a crazy journey for me and it's going to be dangerous.

Who all of the Steelers did you get a chance to meet with like at your Pro Day? And at the combine?

I met everybody at the combine and it was like 10 people in the room. I can't really remember everybody but basically, Coach Tomlin, DC [Teryl Austin], everybody was in there, and the GM [Omar Khan].

Did they know much about you going into this?

Yes, they did. They knew about my past, and they watched the film on me and they're just really trying to find out the type of person I was like and my game.

What led to your transfer from Ohio State? Why did you decide to go to Texas?

For more opportunities and to go back home. I saw Coach Stark when he got the job at Texas and Coach Joseph, he was at Notre Dame. He was the head of recruitment for me at Notre Dame. So seeing him go to Texas and being able to come back home, I felt more comfortable doing that.



General Manager Omar Khan and Head Coach Mike Tomlin – 4.27.23

Opening Statement:

OMAR KHAN: Very pleased how the weekend turned out for us. We addressed some needs but really got some high-character guys and some players that we think are going to help us not only this year but in the future and are going to be great parts of this community. With that, I'm free to take any questions.

Omar, you said on Thursday the 10 minutes waiting for the Rams to pick before you selected Troy [Fautanu] was nerve-racking. Was there any of that going on yesterday while you were waiting to pick Zach [Frazier]?

OMAR KHAN: I would say that is accurate, yeah. Those seven minutes were going pretty slow, but excited to have them. He's a Steeler -- he's another one I can't wait for you guys to really get to know. I'm not sure if you guys spoke with or met with him yet, but he's going to be a great addition to the team.

Did you try to trade up or anything like that?

OMAR KHAN: We had conversations about moving up and the phone was ringing about moving down. Really every round we were in, we had a pick, we were having conversations about moving up, moving down. It was pretty active.

I know you've been asked a lot since you've taken the job about your mentality about being aggressive. What sort of different challenges are there to being patient and waiting in situations like that?

OMAR KHAN: Yeah, I mean, you have no choice but to be patient on draft weekend. But it all comes down to what players are there when you're picking, and you try to make the right decisions, whether to move up, move down, or take a pick. As I've said before, for me, I know we made some moves last year, but when there's a good player there, it's hard to trade away from and we had the opportunity to trade away, to trade back this year, and with where we were, we just felt really good about the players we took and where we took them.

Mike, you drafted three offensive linemen. What does that say, and also the other coaches came in and all talked about the amount of snaps that these guys can play, was that a focus, guys that had a lot of experience?

MIKE TOMLIN: We're looking for guys with talent. Oftentimes that talent is coupled with experience. It's good to have a group that is mature as players and as people, and I think that's reflective of the collective that you're talking about. All that means is we should expect those guys to have a high floor and maybe have a good presentation of what they're capable of early on, and for that, we're excited certainly.

How do you think those three impact your room, the offensive line?

MIKE TOMLIN: That remains to be seen. Obviously, we'll give them an opportunity to do that, but needless to say we're really excited about having them. As Omar mentioned, we had some testy moments there leading up to our picks but that's a good thing from my perspective. It means we had guys on our board that we're excited about the potential of taking, and I think in all three of those instances we were really excited.

Mike, it looks like the last couple years you're pretty good on when to move up, when to not. Do you feel like you've got a beat on that, how a draft unfolds, and can you read it as it unfolds?

MIKE TOMLIN: I think we're just making decisions moment to moment based on what's available, whether or not it's attractive to us and how much the phone is ringing. We roll our sleeves up, we do a lot of work before we get into these scenarios, and we were just talking, when you're prepared, it makes for a good weekend.

We've been working long and hard, obviously, our scouting department over the course of a 12-month calendar, and then he and I had an opportunity to get shoulder-to-shoulder and do a bunch of traveling, all for the purpose of preparedness so that you could feel the way we felt this weekend and just allow things to happen and make the moves necessary in an effort to round out our group. It's been a really good process. We're doing what we have to do. But largely it's been a good process because of the work that people are willing to do leading up to the weekend.

You added in Roman Wilson. How do you feel like he complements George Pickens and some of the other pieces in that room?

MIKE TOMLIN: Just on his merits alone, forget how he complements anyone, he's a good player, he's competitive. He creates separation at break points. He's battle tested on the interior portions of the field. He comes from a winning program. You can't say enough about the winning component in terms of how it shapes the relationships with the game and what they're willing to do and their mettle. He checks a lot of those boxes.

Is there a common thread finding these guys in terms of their mentality and maturity that will enable them to contribute right away?

MIKE TOMLIN: I don't know that it's in every instance there's something along those lines, but obviously we value the tape, and oftentimes tape is produced by good relationships with the game and work ethic and being solid individuals. We value all of those things. We research. I think that's kind of reflective of this group.

Roman talked about how hands on you were with him at the Senior Bowl. How did that interest begin with him, and how did it grow over time leading into this?

MIKE TOMLIN: I'm just trying to get familiar down there with everyone at the Senior Bowl. It is a great atmosphere for getting to know the guys, for getting up close with them, to watching them compete, to maybe giving them some instruction and seeing how they take instruction and apply it to play. He's one of those instances, he and I had an opportunity to spend some time together. I think we interviewed him a couple times in Mobile. We had an opportunity to get some intimate moments in practice sessions on the field, challenging him to compete against some people.

It's just a get-to-know, an opportunity for me to get to know him, an opportunity for him to get to know me. But again, that's what I'm talking about when I talk about our process. We don't run away from the work, we run to the work, and I think it tees us up for a good weekend like we had this weekend.

You were at the Senior Bowl, right?

MIKE TOMLIN: I was self-appointed on staff.

You just go down there and wherever you want to go, you go, and whoever you want to talk to you talk to? MIKE TOMLIN: Pretty much.

When you watch Zach Frazier's tape in his last game where he crawls, hops off the field after fracturing his fibula, what does that tell you about the kind of player he is and the kind of person he is?

MIKE TOMLIN: You know, it probably speaks more to the person. His quality of play speaks to the player that he is. But he needs no enforcement from me. You guys are pretty familiar with him. He's a regional guy. He's a tough competitor. He was an instant contributor in Morgantown. He's got an awesome background from a read perspective, high school wrestling champ, and got a lot of respect for that combat sport. Just really comfortable with him as a player and as a person.

Were you guys surprised Payton Wilson was still there with your second and third round?

MIKE TOMLIN: Yeah, I think you could characterize it as surprised. He is an award-winning linebacker, Butkus Award winner. Had an opportunity to get really familiar with him down in Mobile, as well. But the linebackers themselves weren't coming off the board at that juncture, so sometimes they'd make runs on positions at different times, and there hadn't been a lot of linebackers to that point. I think he was No. 5 or so.

How much more athletic are you at that inside linebacker position and what effect will that have on your defense? MIKE TOMLIN: We haven't had a chance to look at the collective yet. I like to reserve some of those opinions until we get our groups on the field and start the process of working, but just on paper certainly we've helped ourselves, whether it's [Payton] Wilson or whether it's some of the things that we did in free agency with [Patrick] Queen. We're really excited about the collection of talent we've been able to assemble.

Have you had multiple guys with those running numbers before?

MIKE TOMLIN: I'm sure we have, yeah.

Omar, was it obvious early that the offensive line was going to be this much of a focus or was that a reflection of the strength of this class, and how much of Andy's [Weidl] input did you take because of his experience in that area?

OMAR KHAN: I would say it's a little bit of everything you just said. It was a strong offensive line group. We've talked plenty of times about how we feel about the importance of the offensive line, and we got through day one -- obviously Andy used to play the position and has a lot of knowledge, not only about that position but all the positions, and it just kind of worked that way for us. Even in the fourth round when we had a chance to get Mason McCormick, he's a guy that we had rated really high up there and we had a couple players at the position who are in the last year of their contracts and felt it was important to address it if he was there, and we did.

This might be a follow-up to Mike's question previously about Roman, but his addition to your wide receiver room, does that give you enough there with some of the guys you added in the off-season, or with what you did with Alex's [Highsmith] contract, restructured that, does that give you an ability to play with that later in the summer? OMAR KHAN: Yeah, we'll see. I've said it before, if there's ever an opportunity to improve the team, we're going to look at it, and if it makes sense, we're going to go after it. But we structured Alex's deal, and like you said, it puts us in a position to be flexible with some things if there's an opportunity to do something.

Mike, a couple times you always would say you temper your expectations. A couple times you said you had a good weekend. What makes you feel at this point in time that you did have a good weekend?

MIKE TOMLIN: Just our general level of excitement when we're on the clock and the options that were available to us and the amount of research and information that we had on those options creates a really good sense of comfort in the process. That's what I mean when I describe a good weekend. Obviously, this weekend will be defined over the next four to five years with the quality of play of this collective. But in terms of how we feel today, it's about preparedness. It's about options and feeling good about what we did through the process to provide good clean decision-making.

What interests you in a guy like Ryan Watts?

MIKE TOMLIN: Just his body of work. He's a long guy. He runs well. He's got position flexibility. He plays with an edge. So those are some of the real tangible reasons why.

Speaking of doing the extra work, did you by any chance have somebody at the St. Louis High School in Hawai'i four years ago? And do you remember Logan Lee almost running you over in a high school event?

MIKE TOMLIN: I do not remember Logan Lee. Okay, that's interesting.

OMAR KHAN: I don't remember.

MIKE TOMLIN: I don't remember that. But no, we weren't in Hawai'i. But we were in Ann Arbor, and there were reasons to be in Ann Arbor.
