

CHUCK NOLL

HEAD COACH

In Chuck Noll's second year as the Steeler head coach, the future appears bright for him and his football team. Despite a 1-13 record in his first season, it was obvious that significant progress was made in 1969.

Noll accepted the Steeler job with great credentials and everything and anything that happened in 1969 did not do anything to tarnish his hard-earned reputation. It is generally agreed among knowledgeable pro football people that he is the man who can lead the Steelers into the ranks of pro football's top teams and last season was the first step in building a solid foundation.

In that tough initial season, Noll exhibited the qualities that are prerequisites for a coach if a rebuilding program is to be successful. Start with hard work and add intelligence, imagination and plenty of patience. These are the things that characterized Chuck Noll in his first year as a head coach and play a large role in the thinking of those who predict a bright coaching career for the 38-year old native of Cleveland.

His preparation for a head coaching job came under three of the most successful and knowledgeable men in the game. As a player with the Browns for seven seasons, Chuck was exposed to the Paul Brown innovative system, as first a "messenger" guard and later a linebacker.

When Noll prematurely retired as a player at the age of 27 after the 1959 season, it was with the intention of accepting an assistant's post at his alma mater, the University of Dayton. Here is where fate stepped in and shanged the course of his career.

he Dayton job did not materialize and, as a result, he shired as a defensive assistant by Sid Gillman, who at that time was organizing the San Diego Chargers for the AFL's first season.

Baltimore was the second step on the Noll coaching ladder. He joined Don Shula's staff as the defensive backfield coach. He was instrumental in the Colts' success during the three years he was there which included a trip to the Super Bowl after the 1968 season.

All of these men recommended Noll highly when the Steelers were searching for a coach in the early days of 1969. They were concentrating their efforts on a young, energetic man who knew both the American and National Football Leagues. Noll filled the bill perfectly.

His first chore was the 1969 draft and his background was invaluable as the Steelers had the most fruitful draft in their history. A dozen or more rookies were on the 40-man roster the entire season.

The strong nucleus of young talent developed plus the overall improvement in the team's mental attitude were the major positive factors in Noll's first season. His ability to maintain great spirit throughout the season amazed neutral observers. Although the progress made was not reflected in the team's record, enough promise was shown to insure a fine future.

Success which came to Noll as a jack-of-all trades player in high school, at Dayton and with the Browns and later as an assistant coach does not seem far off in his biggest undertaking in football.

Chuck and his wife, Marianne, are classical music buffs and their home in the Bethel Park area of Pittsburgh is elaborately equipped with stereo equipment. They have son, Chris.



MAX COLEY
Offensive Backfield Coach

Max Coley undertakes a new assignment on the Steeler staff this season. After spending his rookie pro campaign coaching as the Receivers Coach, he succeeds John Bridgers as the Offensive Backfield Coach.

Actually, he is assuming the same duties he held for ten years at the University of Oregon. His fine performance there paved the way for his entrance into the professional ranks. Under Coley's direction, the Ducks were always one of the most imaginative and productive college teams in the country. Usually they were among the total offensive leaders.

Max began his coaching career at the high school level in Tulare, California. He returned to his alma mater San Jose State for a three year stint as an assistant before moving to Oregon to serve on former Pitt coach Len Casanova's strategy board.

Max was born in Wewoka, Oklahoma and went to high school in Tulsa. He had an outstanding career as a running back at Northeastern Oklahoma A & M and San Jose State.



BOB FRY Offensive Line Coach

Over the 18 seasons Bob Fry has been in the National Football League, he has served four teams in a number of positions. This is his second campaign as the Steelers' Offensive Line Coach.

As a player, Bob played seven seasons as a regular offensive tackle with the Los Angeles Rams. When Dallas entered the NFL in 1960, he became one of the original members and completed his active career there in 1964.

Brief terms as a scout and front-office man with the Atlanta Falcons preceded his entrance into the coaching field. While serving as assistant to the Director of Player Personnel with the Falcons, Coach Norb Hecker appointed him to an assistant coaching post where he remained until joining the Steelers.

A native of Cincinnati, Bob had a brilliant collegiate career at Kentucky under Bear Bryant. Evidently, he learned his lessons well under the old master.

Bob and his wife Vonnie have five children, two boys and three girls. They are expecting a sixth addition early in the season.



LOU RIECKE Strength Coach

A position of recent vintage in pro football is that of a Strength Coach. Lou Riecke becomes the first man to fill the job with the Steelers and takes the post with tremendous credentials.

Riecke's primary function will be to develop a program which will enable the entire squad to increase its overall strength. Such a program will result in an increased immunity to injuvas well as the other obtous benefits of a physically stronger squad.

His education and athletic background in related fields provide an excellent foundation for his first venture into pro football. He attended the Louisiana State medical school for two years after obtaining his B.S. degree at the same school where he majored in Zoology and Chemistry.

As an athlete, he competed in football and track in high school and lettered in track and weightlifting at LSU. He won the NCAA championship in weightlifting in 1947. Three times he was the national YMCA champion and represented the United States at two world championships and in the Olympics in 1964 at Tokyo. He still holds two national weightlifting records.

A native of New Orleans, Lou is 43, married and the father of four daughters.



WALT HACKETT Defensive Line Coach

A native of Tuscola, Illinois who grew up in Southern California, Defensive Line Coach Walt Hackett has coached at all levels of organized football. His present tenure with the Steelers is his second tour in pro football.

Chuck Noll and Hackett first met while both were on the staff of the San Diego Chargers. Under Sid Gillman, Walt had the same assignment he now holds with the Steelers. During his five year stay in San Diego, the Chargers won three division titles and the AFL championship in 1963.

Three years in the Navy during World War II and a college education at Whittier College preceded his coaching career. He spent seven years in the high school coaching ranks and then two more at Cerritos (Cal.) Junior College. Next he joined John Bridgers at Baylor as the former Steeler assistant's top aide.

Walt became the first head coach at the San Diego branch of the University of California in 1968. He left there to join the Steelers and now is in his second campaign with the team.

Walt is married and he and his wife Carol have three daughters.



CHARLEY SUMNER Defensive Backfield Coach

There is no question that the Steeler defensive backfield was greatly improved in 1969. The secondary ranked third in the NFL in total interceptions and, in general, showed great promise. Much of the credit for this turnabout has to go to Defensive Backfield Coach Charley Sumner.

Now in his eighth pro season as an assistant coach, Charley spent six seasons with the Oakland Raiders before joining the Steeler staff. During the period he was with the West Coast team, the Raiders' defensive record was one of the best in pro football.

A late round draft choice by the Chicago Bears in 1954, Sumner was named the Bears' top rookie before going into the Army for two years. He returned and became one of the best defensive backs in the game for three years with the Bears. He moved to Minnesota when the Vikings obtained an NFL franchise and completed his playing career there after the 1962 season.

Charley is a native of Radford, Virginia and attended William & Mary where he was an outstanding offensive back. It was not until he entered the proranks that he became a defensive specialist.

Charley and his wife Barbara have two sons, Terry, who is nine, and Colin, who is two.



LIONEL TAYLOR Receiver Coach

One of the new members of Chuck Noll's staff is Receiver Coach Lionel Taylor. This is the former American Football League great's first venture into the coaching ranks.

After a season with the Chicago Bears in 1959, Lionel became a pioneer with the Denver Broncos when the AFL was formed. His 92 receptions that season were good enough to lead the league and he captured the same honor in four of the next five seasons. In the 1961 campaign, he caught 100 passes and became the first player in pro history to reach the century mark.

In seven seasons with Denver and two with Houston, Lionel had 567 receptions which still ranks him as the AFL's all-time career leader. He also holds the record for most passes caught in a single game (13) and most times leading the league in pass receiving (5). He played in the AFL All Star game three times.

A native of Kansas City, Missouri, Taylor went to high school in Accoville, West Virginia which is near Logan. He continued his education at New Mexico Highlands where he was an All Frontier Conference selection.

Lionel and his wife Lorencita have two daughters, Loretta (11) and LaVern (9).



RALPH BERLIN Trainer

Out of necessity a foot-ball trainer must be a man of manly and varied talents. The job requires a thorough knowledge of the prevention and treatment of injuries plus the temperament to work with a squad of athletes usually performing under conditions of great emotional involvement.

Ralph Berlin holds this important position with the Steelers. He is in his third of many and varied talents.

Ralph had previous pro experience with the St. Louis Cardinals who utilized his talents during the summers of 1963 and 1964 while he was the head trainer at DePauw University. Later he held the same post at the University of Kentucky for four years.

A knee injury prematurely ended Berlin's playing career at lowa State. As an aftermath of that ailment, Ralph underwent knee surgery during the past off-season.

He stayed on at Iowa State and began work in his present profession as an assisant trainer. While at DePauw he earned a Masters Degree in health and safety with a major in athletic training at Indiana University.

A native of California who grew up in Philadelphia, Ralph spent three years in the Marine Corps.

Ralph and his wife Dee have two youngsters and make their home in Pittsburgh.



TONY PARISI Equipment Manager

A native of Canada and a former hockey player and trainer, Tony Parisi is in his sixth season with the Steelers. Four years as the Pittsburgh Hornets' head trainer preceded his move to the Steelers where he is responsible for the purchasing, care and reconditioning of the equipment used by the players.



JACK HART Field Manager

The Steelers' jack-of-all trades is Jack Hart. Associated with the organization since 1946, Jack gets involved in many areas throughout the year. But his primary duty during the training camp period and once the regular season starts is the actual playing field. It is his responsibility that the field is as playable as possible and that all necessary related equipment is available and functional.


THREE RIVERS STADIUM

Three Rivers Stadium was opened on July 16, 1970. It occupies approximately ten acres on the North Side of the Allegheny River, directly across from the apex of the downtown Golden Triangle. The playing surface is Tartan Turf.

Seating capacity for football is 50,075 and in the future can be expanded to approximately 54,000. Fifty per cent of the seats are under cover. The highest seat is 122 feet above the playing field and the farthest seat is 259 feet from the field.

The electronic, computer-operated scoreboard is 274 feet long and 30 feet high. An auxiliary board is on the facade of the second tier on the east side of the stadium.

The press entrance is located on the first level between gates A and D. Elevator service to the press area is available at this point. The football press box is on the fourth and fifth levels on the west side of the stadium. The auxiliary (baseball) press box is in the north end zone on the fourth level.
