CHUCK NOLL

Head Coach

When Chuck Noll came to Pittsburgh in 1969 he faced a tremendous challenge. Four seasons later it is still a big job but the serious-minded Steeler coach has made and is making great strides in his efforts to bring Pittsburgh its first pro football championship.

Progress best describes Noll's tenure in Pittsburgh. Each year his record has improved over that of the previous one. That is the tangible part of the progress. But possibly of more significance are the areas which are not obvious. The talented football players he has assembled. The strong organization, including a fine staff, he has helped build. And a positive attitude which is shared by the fans, players and management. The nucleus for a championship team now exists in Pittsburgh and this is what Noll expects beginning with the 1972 season.

Noll believes in building a team with young people. As a result, the Steelers are a very young football team. Less than ten players remain from the pre-Noll era. Only a handful have reached the age of thirty. All positions are stocked with good, young athletes.

The 40-year old Noll is a low-keyed, well-organized man with the intelligence to patiently teach and the ability to communicate with his players. He combines these assets with a compassion to understand the complexities of being a professional athlete today.

The Steeler job has been the toughest undertaking of his football life. It has not been an easy assignment or a smooth one. Beginning with a 1-13 record in 1969, he has followed with 5-9 and 6-8 marks the past two campaigns.

The disappointment of not winning the Central Division title last year was great but it has not dampened Chuck's optimism or the belief that it will not be accomplished this season.

The winning habit was developed early in Noll and has been a part of his football life throughout his career. There have been many stops for Chuck in his climb to a head coaching position in the National Football League and his success at each one stands out. Part of this success can be traced to his ability to adapt to a variety of situations.

He displayed this early in his football career. In high school and college he was always the one who was ready to step in in an emergency. This carried over to his professional career with the Cleveland Browns and is an outstanding characteristic of his coaching makeup.

At Benedictine High in Cleveland, he started as a running back but a need developed for a tackle and Chuck filled the post. While doing this he made All State and earned a scholarship to Dayton.

Another emergency arose there. There was a linebacker shortage. Noll moved in and became the team captain, an All Ohio selection and the 21st draft choice of the Browns.

when Noll joined the Browns in 1953, who at that time were coached by Paul Brown, he was one of the famed "messenger" guards. In his fifth season, a familiar situation cropped up. Injuries had depleted Cleveland's linebacking corps and once again Chuck filled the hole.

In seven seasons with the Browns, Chuck was on five Eastern Conference winners and two NFL title teams.

At the relatively young football age of 27, Noll retired as a player. He intended to go into college coaching but a promised job never materialized. As a result, he landed with Sid Gillman who was then organizing the Los Angeles (now San Diego) Chargers in the newly-formed AFL. Six years under the brilliant Gillman as the head defensive coach launched Noll's path to the Steelers. During this period the Chargers won five division titles and two AFL crowns.

In 1966 Chuck moved on to Baltimore as Don Shula's defensive backfield coach. The winning pattern continued as the Colts lost just seven regular season games in three seasons and won the NFL title in 1968.

It was with this outstanding background that Chuck Noll took over the head coaching position of the Steelers in 1969. Now it appears the Steelers are on the verge of developing into winners with Chuck Noll the guiding hand.



BUD CARSON

Defensive Backfield Coach

After five years as the head coach at Georgia Tech, Bud Carson makes his first venture into pro football this season as the Steelers defensive backfield coach. He succeeds Charley Sumner who will work with the linebackers.

In a college coaching career which has spanned the last 14 years, the 41-year old native of Brackenridge, Pa. earned his reputation as an outstanding defense tactician and is a disciplinarian who has the ability to

get results.

As a player, Bud also made his mark on defense. After an outstanding athletic career at Freeport (Pa.) High School, he went to North Carolina and was All Southern Conference defensive back for three years. A stint in the Marines, which included football, followed.

Carson began his coaching career at Scottdale (Pa.) High School in 1955 and in two seasons recorded a 16-2-1 mark. He returned to North Carolina as an assistant and served under head coaches Jim Tatum and Jim Hickey for the next seven years before moving to South Carolina as the defensive head for a season.

In 1966 he accepted the same post at Georgia Tech and made a tremendous impression with his innovative defenses. He also earned the head coaching job when Bobby Dodd retired after Bud's first sea-

son there.

His first three Tech teams had 4-6 records. In 1970 the Yellow Jackets registered a 9-3 mark, including a Sun Bowl victory over Texas Tech. The 1971 squad finished with a 6-6 mark. His overall record at Georgia Tech was 27-27.

Georgia Tech was 27-27. Bud's wife Jean hails from Natrona Heights, Pa. They have a daughter Dana and a son Clifford.



BOB FRY Offensive Line Coach

One of the original members of Chuck Noll's staff, Bob Fry is beginning his 20th consecutive season in the National Football League. He is the Steelers' offensive line coach.

As a player, Bob won a starting tackle berth with the Los Angeles Rams his first year out of Kentucky in spite of his relatively light weight of 225 pounds. He was exceptionally fast and quick. Except for a two year hitch in the Army, he was regular from 1953-59 with the West Coast team and then became an original player of the Dallas Cowboys when that team was formed in 1963. He completed his active career with them the next year.

At Kentucky Fry played for Bear Bryant on the great Wildcat teams of the early fifties where he was a teammate of Steeler quarterback coach Babe Parilli. He was a starting member of victorious Sugar and Cotton Bowl squads in his sophomore and junior seasons.

In 1965 he moved into the front office of the Atlanta Falcons, first as a scout and then later as a member of the personnel staff before becoming an assistant under Norb Hecker for two years.

Since Fry's arrival the Steeler offensive line, which has been suspect in recent years, is improving as can be seen by the team's better rushing attack and pass protection. The past couple of seasons he has had an opportunity to display his teaching ability as a number of young linemen have been drafted and their contributions have been significant in the team's overall improvement.

Bob, who will be 42 this season, and his wife Vonnie have six children, three daughters and three sons.



DICK HOAK Offensive Backfield Coach

Dick Hoak returns to the pro football scene after a year in the high school coaching ranks. He replaces Max Coley as the Steelers' offensive

backfield coach.

From 1961 through 1970, Dick was one of the most productive players to ever perform for the Steelers. His intelligence and determination were his most outstanding characteristics as he derived maximum results in spite of the handicap of not having better than average speed or size.

In three of his ten seasons, Hoak was the team's leading ground gainer and his 3965 yards rushing place him only behind John Henry Johnson as the all-time Steeler leader and rank him 32nd among the all-time NFL leaders. He carried the football more times in his career than any other

Steeler.

In 1968 he had his best year, gaining 858 yards which was the fourth highest total in the NFL. Against New Orleans in that same season, Dick had the top day of his career, gaining 166 yards, including a 77yard touchdown run which was the longest in the league that year and is still the fourth longest in Pittsburgh history. For his outstanding effort, he earned a first team berth on the Sporting News All Eastern Conference team and a trip to the Pro Bowl.

Hoak came to the Steelers from Penn State as a 7th round draft choice. He was a halfback in his first two varsity seasons and was transferred to quarterback in his senior year. He was voted the team's Most Valuable Player as the Nittany Lions duplicated their Liberty Bowl victory of the

year before.

Throughout his career, Dick was a very versatile, clutch player. He was very effective on the pass-run option and was an excellent receiver.

Dick and his wife Lyn have two daughters.



BABE PARILLI Quarterback Coach

Babe Parilli joined the Steeler coaching staff in 1971 with the primary purpose of helping the team's young, talented quarterbacks. That he accomplished his mission can be seen in Terry Bradshaw's improvement alone.

This is still Parilli's main function and if he is as successful in 1972 as he was last year the Steelers, led by Bradshaw, will be a team to contend with this season.

Babe combines the knowledge of 16 years as a pro quarterback in three leagues and the patience of a father in his first full-time coaching position. He has been able to establish a rapport with his pupils which goes much deeper than the usual playercoach relationship.

As a pro player, Babe had his greatest success in the American Football League as he spent 10 years with Oakland, Boston and the New York Jets. In 1963 he led the Patriots to the Eastern Division title and the following year was named the league's MVP. He also played on the Jets' Super Bowl championship team of 1970.

Babe began his pro career as a first round draft choice in 1952 with the Green Bay Packers, the first of two stints with them. He played a year at Cleveland where Chuck Noll was a teammate. In 1959 he was with Ottawa of the Canadian League.

Parilli currently ranks 12th among the all-time passing leaders in pro football. He completed 1,552 of 3,330 passes for 22,681 yards and 178 touchdowns.

Under Bear Bryant at Kentucky, Parilli became the school's first unanimous All America, achieving the honors in 1950 and 1951 and following this up as the MVP in the College All Star game.



GEORGE PERLES Defensive Line Coach

George Perles is taking his first crack at professional football in 1972 after a successful coaching career at the high school and college levels. He succeeds Dan Radakovich as the Steelers' defensive line coach.

A native of Detroit, the 38-year old Perles came to the Steelers from Michigan State where he spent five years as an assistant under Duffy Daugherty. He was the defensive line coach for three years and the defensive backfield coach for two

George also played his college football for the Spartans. After a two-year stint in the Army following high school, he won a starting position as a one-platoon tackle in 1958 but a knee injury late that season ended his playing days. He continued on in school and graduated. He stayed another year to earn his master's degree in Physical Education.

In 1961 he landed his first coaching job at St. Rita High School in Chicago. A year later he accepted the head coaching post at St. Ambrose High School in Detroit and held the post for three winning seasons.

Perles' next stop was the University of Dayton, Chuck Noll's alma mater, as an assistant. He stayed there for two seasons before returning to Michigan State.

While at Michigan State George tutored a number of outstanding players including Bubba Smith.

George and his wife Sally are the parents of four children, sons Terrence, John and Patrick and daughter Kathleen.



CHARLEY SUMNER LINEBACKER COACH

Charley Sumner's pro football career takes on a new dimension in 1972 when he becomes the Steeler linebacker coach. Prior to this season, he had spent his entire NFL tenure either as a defensive back or coaching defensive backs.

Charley came into the NFL from William and Mary where he was a great allaround athlete who had developed into one of the school's all-time top offensive backs as a quarterback

and halfback.

The Chicago Bears had chosen him in the 22nd round of the 1954 draft as a future. When he arrived in training camp the following year, George Halas made him a defensive back. He won a starting berth and was named the Bears' top rookie that season. He also returned punts and kickoffs.

After two years in the Army, he returned to Chicago for three more seasons. He went to the Minnesota Vikings in the expansion draft of 1961 and completed his playing career there the following year.

His first assignment as a coach came in 1963 when he joined the Oakland Raiders who, at that time, were coached by Al Davis. In his six years there, he developed the Raider secondary into one of the best in pro football.

When Chuck Noll accepted the Steeler head coaching job in 1969, Sumner was one of the first assistants hired and he is now in his fourth season with Pittsburgh. Actually, part of his previous assignment involved working with the linebackers on their pass coverage assignments.

Charley, who is 41, is a native of Radford, Virginia. He and his wife Barbara have two sons, Terry, 11,

and Colin, 4.



LIONEL TAYLOR RECEIVER COACH

Now in his third season with the Steelers, Lionel Taylor can be proud of his accomplishments during the short period he has been the team's receiver coach.

As a first year coach in 1970, Taylor was working with a group of wide receivers comprised completely of rookies. One year later, in 1970, two of his pupils, Ron Shanklin and Dave Smith, ranked among the AFC leaders. He was instrumental in their development and subsequent success.

Lionel's ability to instruct football players in the art of being in position to catch a football and actually catching it is not surprising. During his nine year career he was one of the best receivers in the sport, capitalizing on his extraordinary ability to run excellent patterns. He caught 567 passes and when he retired in 1968 was the league's all-time leader. He still ranks third in receptions in the history of professional football.

Lionel started his pro playing career with the Chicago Bears as a free agent. When the AFL was formed in 1960 he joined Denver and the following year became the first pro to catch 100 passes in a single season. In five of his seven years with the Broncos he led the league in receptions. He completed his active days by playing two years in Houston.

Lionel was born in Kansas City, Missouri but grew up in southern West Virginia in the mining town of Accoville. He was an All Frontier Conference flanker at New Mexico Highlands.

Lionel and his wife Lorencita, who is a school teacher, have two daughters, Loretta and LaVern.



LOU RIECKE STRENGTH COACH

Lou Riecke is the first man to hold his unique position in the Steeler organization and is now in his third year with the team.

As the strength coach, he has developed an overall plan which is designed to increase the strength and stamina of the individual players through the use of weights. Each player is on a general program which is specified to his requirements and capabilities. It is a daily routine during training camp and then during the regular season is reduced.

Lou has been a competitive weightlifter for most of his adult life and is a staunch advocate of the value of a formal strength program. His education and experience make him an ideal man for the position.

As an athlete, he participated in football and track in high school and lettered in track and weightlifting in college. He won the NCAA weightlifting championship in 1947. Three times he was the national YMCA champion. He represented the United States at two world championships and in the 1964 Olympics at Tokyo. He still holds two national weightlifting records.

In addition to his athletic experience in his highly specialized field, Lou's education is related to his position. He obtained his B.S. degree at Louisiana State University where he majored in Zoology and Chemistry. He then attended the LSU medical school for two years.

Lou, who is 45, is a native of New Orleans and still lives there. He and his wife, Enid, have four daughters.
