

CHUCK NOLL

Head Coach

In the first five years of his head coaching career, Chuck Noll has transformed the Pittsburgh Steelers into one of the strongest teams in the National Football League. He has guided them into the playoffs the past two seasons with a division title and a tie for the title. During this period, the Steelers had a 21-7 regular season record which was the second best in the NFL.

Noll's success with the Steelers did not happen overnight. It was a slow and, at times, painful process in which he seldom deviated from his plan to build a championship team, not just a respectable

one.

During his first three years, each season showed improvement over the previous one. In 1972 the Steelers made their big breakthrough with an 11-3 regular season record and their first appearance ever in the playoffs. It marked a six game improvement over the year before and earned Noll the UPI Coach of the Year award in the AFC. It was a long way from the 1-13 mark of his first season in 1969. Last year's 10-4 record upped his lifetime record to 33-37.

A third straight winning season for the Steelers in 1974 will establish another first for Noll. No Steeler coach has ever had three straight winning campaigns.

When Noll came to Pittsburgh he was determined to build his team through the player draft. Just how well he has been able to

do this can be seen by looking at the Steeler roster.

The great majority of starters have been players who signed their first professional contracts with Pittsburgh. With few exceptions, the outstanding players on the team are those who were drafted by the Steelers and usually in the high rounds. However, Chuck has also been very successful with low-round choices and tree agents. All of his first five number one selections are regulars as well as two players chosen in the tenth round or lower and three free agents.

The exceptional drafts and his ability to communicate with his players have been the keys to Noll's success in Pittsburgh.

In a day and age when people have difficulty relating to each other, Noll has been able to close the communication gap and has developed an understanding and respect with his players which has been mutually beneficial. As a result, the Steelers have been a productive, successful team under him.

Other than winning, the most impressive thing about Noll is the way he wins. He is a very low-keyed, unemotional individual who analyzes everything he does before doing it and rarely acts on impulse. He is very logical in his approach. The winning situation he has created in Pittsburgh is characteristic of his entire football career, and his team is pretty much a reflection of its coach.

In seven years with the Cleveland Browns as a player, Chuck was on five Eastern Conference title teams and two that went on to win NFL championships. He was the Browns' 21st draft choice in 1953. He played offensive guard his first four years and was a

linebacker in his final three seasons.

At the young age of 27, Chuck retired as a player with the intention of going into college coaching but a position at Dayton did not materialize and instead he joined Sid Gillman who was organizing the Los Angeles (now San Diego) Chargers in the fledgling American Football League. He stayed there for six seasons, rising to the rank of head defensive coach, and the Chargers won five division titles and two league crowns.

He returned to the NFL in 1966 with Baltimore as the defensive backfield coach under Don Shula. In three years, the Colts lost just seven regular season games and won the NFL championship in 1968 only to lose in the Super Bowl to the New York Jets.

A native of Cleveland, Chuck won All State honors at Benedictine High and earned a scholarship to Dayton. He had an outstanding career as an offensive tackle and linebacker and was elected the team captain in his senior year.

Outside of football, Chuck's interests are many and varied. He enjoys classical music; is a wine connoisseur; enjoys cooking; putters around his flower garden and for recreation does some scuba diving.

Chuck, who is 42, and his wife Marianne have a 16-year old son, Chris. They live in the Pittsburgh suburb of Upper St. Clair.



BUD CARSON Defensive Coordinator

It is more than coincidental that Bud Carson has been with the Steelers for two seasons and during this period they have developed into one of the best defensive teams in pro football.

In his first year with Pittsburgh, Bud was designated as the defensive backfield coach but for much of the season actually served as the defensive coordinator. The Steelers led the league in interceptions and set a team record for the fewest points allowed. Both accomplishments represented dramatic improvements over the previous season.

In 1973 he was the defensive coordinator in name as well as duties and the Steelers repeated as the NFL's interception leader, setting another team mark of 37, and turning in another great season defensively.

Carson began his coaching career at Scottdale (Pa.) High and in two seasons had a 16-2-1 record. He then spent the next 14 years as a college coach, starting at North Carolina, his alma mater, where he spent seven years

spent seven years. In 1965 he went to South Carolina as the defensive coordinator. The following year he accepted the same position at Georgia Tech under Bobby Dodd. When Dodd retired, Bud took over the head coaching job in 1967. In five seasons he had a 27-27 record and appearances in the Sun and Peach Bowls.

After an outstanding career as an all-around high school athlete, Carson went to North Carolina. He was an All Southern Conference defensive back for three seasons.

Bud is a native of Freeport, Pa. He is 43 years old. His wife Linda does television work in Pittsburgh.



DICK HOAK Offensive Backfield Coach

Dick Hoak's responsibilities have been expanded for the 1974 season. In addition to working with the offensive backs, he will be more involved with the entire offense and in formulating the game plan.

He is now in his third season as a pro coach. His progress has been steady and he has played an important part in the success the Steelers have had.

Dick's coaching methods closely parallel his style as a player. He goes about his job in a workmanlike manner and has been able to fully utilize the experiences he gained in his ten active seasons with the Steelers.

Hoak was the Steelers seventh round draft choice in 1961 and from then through 1970, he was one of the most productive players to every play for Pittsburgh. He is the second leading all-time Steeler rusher with 3,965 yards.

In 1968 he had his best season, running for 858 yards which was the fourth highest total in the NFL. In that season against New Orleans, he had the greatest game of his career. He gained 166 yards, including a 77-yard touchdown run which was the longest in the league that year. He was named to the All Eastern Conference team and played in the Pro Bowl.

At Penn State Hoak was a halfback in his first two varsity seasons and was switched to quarterback in his senior year.

After retiring as a player, he was the head coach at Wheeling Central Catholic High School in 1971.

Dick is a native of Jeannette, Pa. and now lives in Greensburg. He and his wife Lyn have two daughters, Kelly (9), and Katie (6), and one son, Richard (2).



GEORGE PERLES Defensive Line Coach

The heart of the Steeler defense is its front four. The man who works with this outstanding group of athletes and has developed it into one of the best in profootball is defensive line coach George Perles.

Now in his third season with the Steelers, the 40-year old Perles is a very personable individual whose natural enthusiasm and zest carries over into his coaching. These trafts have enabled him to establish an unusually close relationship with his players.

George is a native of Detroit. After graduating from high school, he spent two years in the Army before enrolling at Michigan State in 1956. He won a starting position as a tackle in his sophomore year. A knee injury that season ended his playing days. He received his degree and remained in school to earn his master's in Physical Education.

In 1961 he began his coaching career in Chicago at St. Rita High. After one year he returned to his hometown as coach at St. Ambrose. He had three winning seasons and then moved into college coaching.

George went to the University of Dayton for two seasons as an assistant. When he left he was the defensive coordinator.

In 1967 Perles returned

In 1967 Perles returned to his alma mater as an assistant on Duffy Daugher-ty's staff. He remained there for five years. During this period he coached the defensive line for three years and the defensive backs for two seasons.

backs for two seasons.
George and his wife Sally have a daughter, Kathleen (16), and three sons, Terrence (14), John (11), and Patrick (10). They live in suburban Upper St. Clair.



DAN RADAKOVICH Offensive Line Coach

Dan Radakovich brings a familiar face to a new job this season as he rejoins the Steelers after serving as the defensive coordinator at the University of Colorado the past two years.

He returns in a new ca-

He returns in a new capacity as the offensive line coach after spending his entire coaching career as a defensive specialist. Among his past duties was a one-year term as the Steelers' defensive line coach in 1971. In that position he helped develop the front four which is now one of the best in the NFL.

With the exception of that one prior year with the Steelers, Dan has worked in the college coaching ranks. And most of that time was at Penn State where he was an outstanding center and

linebacker.

After graduating in 1957 he remained as a graduate assistant under Rip Engle while earning his master's in Business Administration. In 1960 he became a full-time member of the Penn State staff and worked mainly with the linebackers under Engle and Joe Paterno who became the head coach in 1966. During this period the Nittany Lions were among the best defensive teams in the nation.

He left Penn State in 1970 to accept the head defensive coaching job at the University of Cincinnati. The following year he joined the Steelers.

A native of Kennywood, Pa., Radakovich was a great all-around high school athlete at Duquesne

High.

Dan will be 39 during the season. He and his wife Nancy have two daughters, Lisa (15) and Lori (5), and two sons, Dan (15) and Leslie (7). They live in Upper St. Clair.



WOODY WIDENHOFER

Linebacker Coach

Although he is just 31 years old, Bob (Woody) Widenhofer is in his tenth year of coaching and second with the Steelers. His primary duties are with the linebackers but he is also involved in all phases of the defense.

In handling the Steeler linebackers, he has one of the finest groups in the NFL with which to work. He has successfully coordinated the individual talents of these players into an effec-

tive unit.

Widenhofer was an outstanding high school athlete in Detroit, lettering in football, basketball and baseball. He won two letters as a linebacker at Missouri when Dan Devine was the head coach there.

He began his coaching career at Holy Redeemer High School in 1965 in his hometown. After two years there, he went to Nativity High for two more seasons.

In 1969 he became one of Duffy Daugherty's assistants at Michigan State as the defensive coordinator for the freshmen team and a defensive line coach with the varsity. While there he gained his master's degree in Physical Education.

The year of 1971 Woody spent as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Eastern Michigan. His team went undefeated and ranked third nationally among the NCAA college-

division teams.

The following season he returned to the Big Ten with Minnesota. He was the line-backer coach there.

Woody is a native of Butler, Pa. He moved to Detroit with his family when he was ten years old. He and his wife Sherrill, who is an elementary school teacher, have two daughters, Kimberly (5) and Stacy (3). They live in Upper St. Clair.



LIONEL TAYLOR Receiver Coach

As the senior member of Chuck Noll's staff, Lionel Taylor is in his fifth season as the Steeler receiver coach. His responsibilities also include the overall passing game.

Last season was Taylor's most rewarding one since coming to the Steelers. When he joined the team in 1970, all of his wide receivers and tight ends, except one, were in their first year of pro football. In 1973, the first of his pupils earned All Pro honors when Ron Shanklin was selected.

Lionel's ability to relate to football players and teach them the finer points of playing their position is his greatest asset as a coach.

As a player, he was one of the best receivers in pro football history. His success was not immediate and came after a frustrating start. He spent 1959 with the Chicago Bears and played very little. When the AFL began in 1960, he joined Denver and led the new league in receiving four of its first five years.

In 1961 he became the first player in pro history to catch 100 passes in a season. Taylor played seven seasons at Denver and two more in Houston and caught 567 passes, a figure which is still the third highest total of all time.

Although he was born in Kansas City, Missouri, Lionel grew up in Lorado, West Virginla, a small mining town in the southern part of the state. He was an All Frontier Conference flanker at New Mexico Highlands where he also lettered in basketball and track.

Lionel is 38 years old. He and his wife Lorencita have two daughters, Loretta (15) and LaVern (13). The Taylors live in McMurray, Pa.



LOU RIECKE Strength Coach

One of the men who has played a behind-thescenes role in the Steeler success is Lou Riecke. The New Orleans native came Pittsburgh as the Strength Coach in 1970.

His primary objectives are to maximize the physical abilities of the players through individual strength and weight programs. He works closely with each player on a daily basis during training camp and on a reduced schedule during the season.

The direct result of his efforts has been bigger, stronger players with greater stamina. The indirect benefits, which are more difficult to measure, have been a contribution to a

winning program.

It is hard to imagine a better qualified man for his position than Riecke who will be 48 during the 1974 season. In practice and theory, he is perfectly suit-ed for his responsibilities and like all good coaches has the ability to teach what he knows so well.

Lou has been a competitive weightlifter for the better part of his life. In addition to lifting weights, his athletic endeavors included football and track in high school and track at LSU.

In 1947 he won the NCAA weightlifting championship and three different times he took the national YMCA ti-He represented the United States at two world championships and in 1964 at the Olympics in Tokyo.

At LSU, Lou majored in Zoology and Chemistry. Later he attended the university's medical school for

two years.

Riecke lives in New Orleans where he is in the lumber business. He and his wife Enid have four daughters, Cindy (22), Ginger (20), Vicki (18) and Lee (15).



PAUL URAM Flexibility Coach

The pioneer of the Steeler staff is Paul Uram who has revolutionized football. He is in his second year as the Flexibility Coach.

The 48-year old Butler, Pa. native has radically changed the method by which athletes prepare for competition. He has replaced the traditional calisthenics with an extensive flexibility program which emphasizes the stretching of muscles rather than the quick bouncing movements

of calisthenics.

Through years of study and application, Uram has become the nation's foremost authority in this field and a widely-sought man by many athletic teams. He has worked with ten NFL teams and has aided several in other professional sports as well as a number of colleges.

His close association to the sport of gymnastics as a participant and a coach has provided him with much of his knowledge and background. It has enabled him to write a book "Refining

Human Movement.'

In his younger days, Paul was a fine athlete and today is still in excellent physical condition. He attended Slippery Rock and was a standout in football and track. He earned his degree in Physical Education and acquired a master's at Pitt.

In gymnastics, he won the National Sokol Junior and Senior championships in the early fifties. He is a member of the Sports Halls of Fame of Western Pennsylvania and Butler.

Since 1955 he has been on the faculty at Butler High. He coached the gymnastics team for 13 years and had a 107-0 record. He has also coached football, basketball and track.

Paul and his wife Helen have one son, Ron (18).



RALPH BERLIN Trainer

Ralph Berlin is the Steelers' Head Trainer and is in his seventh season with the team. He had previous pro training experience with the St. Louis Cardinals of the NFL.

Ralph was born in Pasadena, California but grew up in Philadelphia. After completing high school, he enlisted in the Marine Corps and was discharged after three years

after three years.
In 1958 at lowa State,
Berlin's playing career was
shortened by a knee injury.
This paved the way for his
entry into the training field.
He worked as a student assistant until he graduated.

After finishing college as a Physical Education major, Ralph went into training on a full-time basis. He spent eight years in the college ranks at DePauw (Ind.) and Kentucky. In the summers he worked with the Cardinals.

During this period, he earned his Master's Degree in health and safety. When he joined the Steelers in 1969, he was well-prepared for his role.

Ralph not only has outstanding qualifications for his position but also contributes to the Steeler organization in many other areas. He has a good sense of humor which provides a degree of levity in the locker room.

He is also involved in team's dietary schedule. During training camp, he helps plan the daily menus and when the team is on the road he supervises the preparation and serving of the pre-game meal.

Ralph and his wife Dee have a daughter Beth (13) and a son Steven (11). They live in Bethel Park.



TONY PARISI Equipment Manager

A transplanted Canadian who found his way from hockey to football, Tony Parisi is in his tenth year with the Steelers. He is the team's Equipment Manager and is responsible for the purchasing, care and reconditioning of the equipment. He was the trainer of the Pittsburgh Hornets' hockey team for four years before coming to the Steelers. He played pro hockey and was a goaltender. Tony and his wife Joan have two daughters, Paula (9) and Beth (5).



JACK HART Field Manager

In point of service with the Steelers and their hardest worker, Jack Hart has been with the team longer than any other employee. He joined the organization in 1946 and has served in a variety of capacities. He is the Field Manager and cares for the facilities at the St. Vincent training camp and at Three Rivers Stadium. He is also responsible for the availibility and functionality of all field equipment. Jack is a native of Pittsburgh.
