

CHUCK NOLL Head Coach

Under Chuck Noll the Pittsburgh Steelers have become one of the perennial powers in pro football and in 1978, his tenth season, they will be trying to make the playoffs for the seventh straight year, a feat accomplished previously only by Dallas and one that can be matched this season by Oakland also.

In leading the Steelers to a 9-5 record in 1977, the 46-year old Noll brought his nine year career mark to 74-51-1 which is the 17th highest win total ever by a pro coach and the sixth best of any active coach in the NFL. He needs three more victories to move into 16th place.

Chuck has coached the Steelers longer than any of their previous coaches and has the most wins in Steeler history. His Pittsburgh teams have won two NFL championships and five AFC Central Division titles. In 1972 he was named the AFC Coach of the Year by UPI and was accorded the same honor in 1976 by the Football News.

Since 1972, the first year the Steelers ever made the playoffs, Noll's regular season record is 62-21-1 which is a winning percentage of .744. His postseason mark of 8-4 matches the winning percentage of Don Shula for the best of any active coach. The AFC has been the winner in the two Pro Bowl games he has coached.

Noll's accomplishment in turning the Steelers around as quickly as he did was miraculous. He took over the team in 1969. It had won just 18 games in the previous five seasons and had just four winning years in the previous nineteen.

Drafting shrewdly and not sacrificing short-term improvement for his long-range goal of a championship team, he patiently went about the process of building with draft choices as a nucleus. Working with the team's capable personnel and scouting department, he was near-perfect in the draft in his early years. This has been the single most important factor in the success he achieved. All of the present starters are players drafted or signed directly out of college as free agents. There were no short cuts, though, and his first season the team was 1-13. Losing seasons of 5-9 and 6-8 followed but there was no mistaking the progress the Steelers were making.

In 1972 the Steelers stunned the pro football world by winning eleven games and losing just three. The team had arrived. After a miracle victory over Oakland in the playoffs, the Steelers took undefeated Miami down to the wire before losing in the AFC championship game, 21-17, to the eventual NFL champions.

Two years later Noll realized his goal of an NFL championship in 1974 and his defensive unit turned in one of the most outstanding performances in sports history by holding Oakland and Minnesota to 29 and 17 yards rushing, respectively, as they won the AFC title and Super Bowl IX. The following season the Steelers became the third team to win back-to-back Super Bowls when they defeated Dallas, 21-17, in what many consider the most exciting of the twelve Super Bowls played.

Noll has spent the last 26 years in pro football and at each stop he has been a winner. He was the Cleveland Browns' 21st draft choice in 1953. Paul Brown played him at offensive guard for three years before moving him to linebacker for his final four seasons. During his stint with his hometown team, the Browns won five Eastern Conference titles and two NFL championships.

In 1960 Chuck retired prematurely as a player at 27 to enter coaching. He joined Sid Gillman's staff as a defensive assistant with the Los Angeles (now San Diego) Chargers in the new American Football League. The Chargers won five division titles and two AFL crowns in his six years on the West Coast.

Baltimore was the final preparatory step as an assistant and he spent three years there as Don Shula's defensive backfield coach. During this period, the Colts lost just seven regular season games and won the 1968 NFL championship.

In high school, Chuck was an All State player at Cleveland Benedictine and earned a scholarship to Dayton where he captained the team in his senior year.

Chuck and his wife Marianne have a 20-year old son, Chris, who is a student at the University of Rhode Island. Chuck's outside interests include flying, gardening, scuba diving, wine and gourmet food.

On a day-to-day basis, Chuck is most involved with the quarterbacks and special teams. He is not reluctant to delegate authority to his assistants. He enjoys the teaching phase of coaching the most and is professorial in his analytical, scholarly approach to everything, even outside of football. He is obviously a man who enjoys what he does and, derives as much satisfaction in the doing as in the success.

ROLLIE DOTSCH Offensive Line Coach

Rollie Dotsch takes over as the Steelers' offensive line coach in 1978, and brings the reputation of being a strong fundamentalist. He succeeds Dan Radakovich who is now the defensive coordinator at San Francisco.

Pittsburgh is the fourth stop in the versatile Dotsch's pro coaching career. In his two most recent assignments he was a defensive assistant. He spent last season with Detroit coaching the linebackers and the two before that with New England in the same capacity. professional offensive His coaching experience was with Green Bay where he served as the Packers' offensive line coach under Dan Devine from 1962-65.

Rollie's coaching career began in 1956 at the high school level in Escanaba, Michigan, his birthplace. After two years there, he moved into college coaching as an assistant at Northern Michigan. This three year at Colorado as defensive line coach and four under Devine at Missouri working with the offensive line.

In 1966 Dotsch went back to Northern Michigan as athletic director and head coach. In five years his teams won 33, lost 15 and tied 1. In 1971 he went to Green Bay.

Rollie was a great high school athlete in Lansing, Michigan. He won 16 letters in football, baseball, basketball and track. He played college football at Michigan State where he played on Biggie Munn's 1952 national championship team. He majored in History and has a masters from Michigan in Secondary Administration.

Rollie, 45, and his wife Carol have two daughters, Helen (17) and Molly (2), and one son, Michael (22). They live in Mt. Lebanon.



DICK HOAK Offensive Backfield Coach

Dick Hoak is the only member of Chuck Noll's staff to have played pro football. The experience he gained in 10 years as a player with the Steelers prepared him well for coaching and he has become a fine assistant.

In his capacity as offensive backfield coach, Dick is involved in the entire offense and works on the weekly game plan. He has been instrumental in the success achieved by Franco Harris and was one of the very first to recognize Harris' great potential. He has an excellent rapport with all of his players which enables him to be an effective teacher.

As a player, Hoak never enjoyed the team success he has had since becoming a coach. He is now in his seventh year in the latter position and the team has made the playoffs each of his first six seasons.

Dick was a seventh round draft choice in 1961 and became one of the most versatile and productive players in Steeler history. With 3,965 yards, he is the team's third leading rusher of all-time and its ninth best receiver. His best season was 1968 when he ranked fourth in the NFL with 858 yards which included a career-high game of 166. He made the Sporting News All Eastern Conference team and played in the Pro Bowl. That same year he won the Dapper Dan Award as Pittsburgh's outstanding sports figure

At Penn State, Dick was both a halfback and a quarterback. Before rejoining the Steelers in 1972, he was the head coach at Wheeling (W. Va.) Central Catholic High School for a year.

Dick is a native of Jeannette, Pa. and will be 37 in December. He and his wife Lynn have two daughters, Kelly (13) and Katie (10), and one son, Richard (6). They live in Greensburg.



TOM MOORE Receiver Coach

In his first year as the Steeler receiver coach in 1977, Tom Moore made a significant contribution to the team's offensive improvement. He helped to formulate and implement a new approach in the Pittsburgh attack which resulted in the team throwing more with greater success.

Chief benefactors of this change in offensive philosophy were the three starting receivers. Lynn Swann, John Stallworth and Bennie Cunningham all had their most productive seasons.

Although the Steeler position is Tom's initial one in the NFL, he had previous pro experience with the New York Stars of the World Football League in 1974 when he was an offensive assistant.

His prior coaching experience was in the college ranks. His first job was in 1961 as the freshman coach at lowa, his alma mater. After two years there he went into the Army for two more. He returned in 1965 and became an offensive assistant at Dayton where he spent four seasons.

Then followed two stints in the South. In 1969 he was the offensive coordinator at Wake Forest and the following year he went to Georgia Tech.

Between his one year tour in the WFL, he served twice at the University of Minnesota. The first time was in 1972-73 and then returned for two more years in 1975-76 before coming to Pittsburgh.

Tom was a high school All America quarterback in Rochester, Minn. He lettered three years at Iowa and played on the 1958 team that won the Big Ten title. He majored in History and later earned his masters in Guidance and Counseling.

Moore will be 40 in November and is a native of Owatonna, Minn. He and his wife Emily have a daughter, Terry (13), and a son, Thomas (8). They live in Upper St. Clair.



GEORGE PERLES Defensive Coordinator

After six very successful years as the Steelers' defensive line coach, George Perles has been promoted to defensive coordinator and replaces Bud Carson who resigned to join the Los Angeles Rams' staff.

The 44-year old Perles came into pro football with the Steelers in 1972 and since then the team has made the playoffs six straight years. Much of the credit for this almost unprecedented accomplishment has gone to the defensive line and Perles has been the man who developed this unit into one of the best front fours in NFL history.

In his new capacity he will be responsible for the overall defense but will continue to work with the line on a daily basis. This will enable the entire defense to benefit from his exceptional and creative teaching ability and enthusiasm.

Perles came to the Steelers after serving five years as a defensive assistant to Duffy Daugherty at Michigan State. Prior to that he had been the defensive coordinator at Dayton in 1965 and 1966.

His coaching career began at Chicago St. Rita High School in 1961 and after two years he went to Detroit St. Ambrose for three seasons. His work there earned him an opportunity in college coaching.

George served two years in the Army after high school and then played college football at Michigan State where he was a two-way tackle. He majored in Physical Education and stayed an extra year to earn his masters degree in that field.

George and his wife, Sally, are natives of Detroit. They have one daughter, Kathleen (20), and three sons, Terrence (18), John (15) and Patrick (14). They live in Upper St. Clair.



LOU RIECKE Strength Coach

When Chuck Noll took over the Steeler coaching post in 1969, he recognized the need for a strength and weight program and someone to direct it. At the time, only a few NFL teams had such a person. It took Chuck more than a year to find the right man and in 1970 Lou Riecke was hired.

He is now in his ninth season as the team's Strength Coach and during this period the Steelers became one of the stronger, more physical teams in pro football and this, in part, has led to their great success.

Riecke is one of the world's foremost authorities on the value of weight training for athletes, both from a practical and theoretical standpoint. He has devised a 12-month program for the Steelers which has not only increased the players' strength but also their speed and stamina.

Lou spends the entire training camp period with the team. When the regular season starts he works one day a week on the weights with the players and on game day charts plays from the booth upstairs. The strength program is introduced to new players in the off-season. By the time training camp starts they are well into it and deriving some of its benefits.

Riecke was a world-class weightlifter who won an NCAA championship in 1947 and later three national YMCA titles. In 1964 he was on the United States Olympic team that participated in Tokyo.

In addition to his competitive experience, the 52-year old Riecke's formal education complements his role with the Steelers. He majored in Zoology and Chemistry at Louisiana State and attended medical school there for two years.

Lou is a native of New Orleans and still lives there. He and is wife Enid have four daughters, Cindy (26), Ginger (24), Vicki (22) and Lee (19).



PAUL URAM Flexibility Coach

After free-lancing in his highly-specialized field with several pro football and major league baseball teams. Paul Uram became a permanent member of the Steeler staff in 1973 and since then he has had his duties expanded into working with the special teams and kickers.

As the Flexibility Coach, he works with the players on a daily basis in training camp and during the regular season. He has refined the manner in which athletes in all sports prepare for competition by replacing the traditional calisthenics with stretching exercises. The result is that the individuals' muscles and limbs are better prepared for competition which increases their efficiency and at the same time reduces the risk of iniury.

Uram's theories and program have been adopted by most professional and college football teams and are being used in several other sports. Paul's book "Refining Human Movement" has served as a guide for both individuals and teams.

Much of his knowledge in his field was acquired during a long career in gymnastics. He won national Sokol junior and senior titles and is a member of the Helms and Western Pennsylvania Halls of Fame. He coached the Butler (Pa.) High School gymnastics team and in 13 years was unbeaten in 107 matches. He was also an assistant football coach there.

At Slippery Rock College, Paul was an outstanding athlete. He lettered in football as a quarterback and in track as a sprint man. He received his masters in Physical Education from Pitt.

A native of Butler, Paul still lives there. He is 52 and he and his wife Helen have one son, Ron (21).



WOODY WIDENHOFER Linebacker and Secondary Coach

It appears just a matter of time until Bob (Woody) Widenhofer lands a head coaching job. At 35 he is the youngest member of the Steeler staff and is now in his 14th year as an assistant. In 1978 his responsibilities have been expanded to the defensive backs.

Woody has enjoyed success at every level while gaining experience in his climb up the coaching ladder. His college playing career at Missouri was cut short by an injury after he had lettered two years and, as a result, his thoughts turned to coaching early.

After graduating he accepted the head job at Holy Redeemer High School in Detroit in 1965. He spent two years there and two more at Nativity High.

Next came two years at Michigan State where he earned his masters in Physical Education. In 1971 he moved to Eastern Michigan as defensive coordinator and secondary coach. His team was undefeated and ranked third nationally in the college division. This led to a position on the Minnesota staff as linebacker coach. After one year there he joined the Steelers in 1973.

The rapid development of Jack Lambert is probably his greatest individual accomplishment but he has been instrumental in Jack Ham's continued success and the consistently fine play of his entire group. He has made a major contribution to the team defensively and has earned Chuck Noll's confidence which has resulted in additional duties.

Woody spent the first ten years of his life in Butler, Pa. He went to high school in Detroit where he excelled in football, baseball and basketball.

He and his wife, Sherri, have two daughters, Kimberly (10) and Stacy (6). They live in Upper St. Clair.



DICK WALKER Defensive Assistant

Dick Walker is one of two new members of the Steeler coaching staff. He is a defensive assistant and in that role has responsibilities in all three major areas of the defense.

The 45-year old Walker had previous pro coaching experience with the New England Patriots in 1977 where he was Chuck Fairbank's defensive backfield coach and helped to develop the Patriots' defensive unit into one of the best in the NFL.

Prior to that Dick had spent all of his coaching career in the high school and college ranks. His longest assignment was an eight year stint at Ohio State as Woody Hayes' secondary coach. During this period, the Buckeyes were a perennial national power and won or tied for seven Big 10 championships. He helped to develop six All America defensive backs in this stretch. His first position in college coaching was at Toledo in 1967 and 1968.

Walker had a distinguished high school coaching record. He began as an assistant at Cathedral Latin High School in Cleveland in 1957. In 1960 he became the head coach at Watterson High in Columbus. In seven years there, he compiled a 51-11-3 record and the 1966 team won the state championship. These accomplishments earned him the distinction of being the outstanding high school football coach in Ohio and an invitation to join the staff at Ohio State.

Like Chuck Noll, Dick is a native of Cleveland. He is a graduate of John Carroll where he majored in History. He lettered three years as a center and linebacker and was selected to the All Big Four team his final two seasons.

Dick and his wife, Eleanor, have two sons, Brad (21) and Tom (15) and a daughter, Kim (18). They live in Upper St. Clair.





The Oakland defense gave the Steelers a taste of their own medicine as the Raiders ended the Steelers' 10-game regular season winning streak. Five Steeler turnovers and a superior kicking game was the major difference in the 11th meeting of these bitter rivals. The Steelers failed to score on their first possession-a 52-yard drive-when Roy Gerela missed a 29-yard field goal and just tallied once in six trips into Oakland territory in the second half. The Pittsburgh offense contributed directly to the final 21 Baltimore points on the last three of their six turnovers. Seventeen penalties, nine of which resulted in damaging first downs to tie an NFL record, for 122 yards also were important factors in the final outcome. The Steeler victory eliminated Cleveland and Houston from the Central Division race and left next week's game in Cincinnati as the one which will determine the division champion. It assured the Steelers of an unprecedented sixth straight winning season. They broke a 13-13 tie with 17 points in the fourth quarter, 10 of them coming as a result of Jack Ham forcing a fumble and Mel Blount intercepting a pass. Three of Seattle's four turnovers were converted into Pittsburgh points as the stubborn Seahawks fought back from a 13-3 deficit to tie the game before their mistakes got them back into trouble. Franco Harris raised his season total to 1,052 by rushing for 103 yards. It was his fifth 1,000-yard season in six years, making him just the fourth player to ever do this, and his 28th 100-yard game which is the third most in NFL history. The Steelers stormed back to take a 10-7 halftime lead which could have been greater except for ten first-half penalties. The Bengals turned things around in the second half. After being outgained 240 to 103 in the first half, they held a 310 to 122 edge in the final 30 minutes. The game turned around in a two and a half minute stretch of the third quarter. With the Steelers driving for a score which could have put the game out of reach, Franco Harris, who gained 101 yards in the first half and had minus six in the second. fumbled on the Cincinnati 24-yard line. Ken Anderson hit a 57yard bomb on the first play after the turnover which set up the tieing field goal and when Jim Smith fumbled the ensuing kickoff Anderson tossed a 43-yard scoring pass on the next play. The two scores came 18 seconds apart. Another Harris fumble on the Bengal 18 ended the last good Steeler scoring chance.

With Houston defeating Cincinnati in an early game, the Steelers had the division title and a playoff berth locked up before their final game was more than a few minutes old. The Chargers marched 62 yards the first time they had the ball and after that the Steeler defense settled down to limit San Diego to 113 yards. The game marked the return of L. C. Greenwood and his presence sparked the defense, particularly on the pass rush as the team had a season high six quarterback sacks. Robin Cole and Dwight White were responsible for half of the sacks. Alvin Maxson, getting his first chance as a Steeler in place of Rocky Bleier, was the team's leading rusher with 51 yards and receiving with five catches for 70 more yards. San Diego's 68 yards rushing was the lowest the Steelers permitted this season. The Steelers' three interceptions gave them 31 for the season and the NFL lead for the third time since 1972.

Denver 34, Pittsburgh 21 Dec. 24 at Denver, 75,011

Making the same mistakes that typified their play during the regular season, the Steelers were eliminated in the opening round of the playoffs for the first time since 1973. Pittsburgh lost the football on four turnovers plus a blocked punt which accounted for 24 of Denver's points. The blocked punt and a Franco Harris fumble set up short scoring drives of 17 and ten yards which kept the Broncos in the game in the first half when the Steelers held a 183-44 edge in offensive yardage. Both Steeler touchdowns came on long, time-consuming drives in the second quarter as Harris ran for 82 yards in the first half with 60 of them coming during the two scoring efforts. In the second half the Steelers deserted their productive running game and rushed the ball just nine times with Harris getting it five times after carrying on 23 occasions in the initial thirty minutes. They were outgained by Denver, 214-121. After stopping the Broncos four times from inside the two yard line in the third quarter, the Steelers could not get out of the hole and this led to Denver's third score, a first down pass for 30 yards. The Steelers had one more comeback left as they came from behind for the third time to even the score on a 60-yard, four play march with all but one of the yards coming through the air. After that the bubble burst as Pittsburgh got just one first down on its final three possessions and turned the ball over twice on interceptions to set up Denver's last ten points. The lone positive note for the Steelers was Harris becoming the first pro player to gain 1,000 yards in postseason play as he pushed his total to 1,050.
