




FROM WILDCATS TO LEGENDS – DUSTIN BEGGS & KOLE COTTAM REUNITE ON THE FIELD AGAIN







A-Z Directory

Accessible Seating

Accessible seating is reserved for guests with access requirements and their companions. Guests requiring accessible seating may purchase one (1) accessible seat and one (1) companion seat adjacent to the accessible seat. Depending upon availability, seats for additional guests will be located as close as possible to the accessible space. Legends Field is committed to working with guests on a case-by-case basis to adequately accommodate individual needs. All ticket sales are based on availability.

The Lexington Legends are proud to be ADA Compliant.

Alcohol

Guests are prohibited from bringing alcoholic beverages into the stadium. Guests will be required to show valid identification. No guest will be served more than two alcoholic beverages at any given time. Alcohol sales end at the conclusion of the 7th inning during a baseball game and at designated times during concerts and other events.

Autographs

Players can sign autographs before or after the game at their own discretion. Players are not able to sign autographs during the game. We ask that fans arrive early or wait until the game has completed to request an autograph. Come early on Sunday Funday, presented by the YMCA, for the opportunity to meet players on the concourse for pre-game autographs.

Bag Policy

All bags are subject to search upon entry to Legends Field for any Legends game or any other event.

Our birthday packages are offered for \$20/person, and include a Hot Dog Voucher and the option to bring a cake or cupcakes. Additionally, the birthday kid receives a video board announcement. To learn more, please reach out to groupsales@lexingtonlegends.com.

Only personal cameras, with non-detachable lenses with a maximum of 6 inches, are allowed for patrons without media credentials at Legends Field. If you would like information on acquiring a press pass, please contact Jacob Penny at jpenny@lexingtonlegends.com

Cashless Payments

Legends Field is a cashless facility. Visitors to the stadium for Legends games and any other event can expect to exclusively use a credit card, debit card, or mobile payment for all purchases in the stadium.

Children aged 3 years or younger do not need a ticket, but they cannot take up a seat.

All active and inactive military members receive \$3 off with a Military ID.

All University of Kentucky employees receive \$5 off with a valid UK employee ID.

Cottam, now 27, was a breakout star during his three years with the Wildcats. As a freshman in 2016, he caught nearly every inning of Beggs' dominant final season, one that helped lead UK to a regional championship and a spot in the NCAA Super Regionals — a first for the program. Their connection was instant, and their chemistry undeniable. Beggs and Cottam started off the season 7-0 together as the dynamic Wildcat duo.

"Dustin was a guy I looked up to from day one," Cottam said. "He led by example, and he made my job behind the plate easier. There's a trust that builds between a pitcher and catcher, and we had that."

Beggs, who was drafted by the Miami Marlins in 2016, spent several years pitching in affiliated ball, making it all the way to Triple-A, before finding his way to the Legends in 2021. When Cottam finished his stint with Kentucky, he went to the Boston Red Sox in the 4th Round of the 2018 draft and climbed as high as Triple-A before joining the Spire City Ghost Hounds in 2023 — where he crushed 30 home runs and ranked among the Atlantic League's top power hitters.

When Beggs found out that the two would reunite in 2024, "I texted him as soon as I heard the news," Beggs said, smiling. "I just said, 'Let's do this again.' It feels like everything has come full circle."

Legends Manager Paul Fletcher is excited to have them reunite again as battery mates.


