

A rebuild in Miami might cause some short-term growing pains at the big league level, but the Blue Wahoos stand to benefit from their many trades over the past year. 19 of the top 30 Marlins prospects on MLB Pipeline's latest list weren't even in the organization a year ago. We'll be seeing many of those promising players wearing Blue Wahoos uniforms in 2025 and beyond.

Expectations are high, and for good reason. The Blue Wahoos have had a winning season every year since 2016, with Southern League titles in 2017 and 2022. In terms of talent, this current crop might be among the best we've ever had.

NEW YEAR, NEW MANAGER

The 25 years he's spent in coaching have given Nelson Prada rare perspective. He's gone through an era that has evolved with professional baseball's widespread changes in analytics and methodology.

It's a lot different now from then. But he has thrived.

"I look at this, half my life has been enjoying the game on the playing side, and half of my life now has been enjoying the game as a coach," said Prada, who turned 49 in February and takes over as the new Pensacola Blue Wahoos manager for the 2025 season.

"I feel proud that I've been working this long in the game," said Prada, a Maracay, Venezuela native. "With all the changes in the game with sabermetrics, analytics, I've been able to learn and adapt. I believe if players trust me, I can make the players better and they will understand what the organization wants."

Part of the adaptation for Prada will be living this year in a new region of the country. He had never been to Pensacola or anywhere on the Gulf Coast until traveling from the Miami Marlins spring training complex in Jupiter to prepare for the Blue Wahoos' season-opener on April 4.

The past two seasons, he managed the Marlins' Class A affiliate, the Jupiter Hammerheads. He guided the team to the 2023 Florida State League championship, the first in club history. Prior to that, his stops have included the Williamsport Crosscutters in the Philadelphia Phillies organization and Beloit Snappers, back when the current Marlins' High-A team was connected with the Minnesota Twins.

"Every time I've been traveling from Florida, going up north, I never turned left (toward the Panhandle)," said Prada, chuckling at the thought.

What he learned, however, is Pensacola's reputation in baseball for being a destination spot in Minor League Baseball.

"Whenever people in baseball asked me where I was going to be this year, and I said, Pensacola, everybody from umpires to players, to coaches, say, 'Hey, great place.'

Prada, who is bilingual, follows Kevin Randel, who managed the Blue Wahoos in their first four seasons as the Marlins' Double-A affiliate in the Southern League. Randel led the Blue Wahoos to their only outright championship in 2022 and last year became the winningest manager in Blue Wahoos history.

Randel, who has the longest tenure (24 years as a player, coach and manager) of anyone in the Marlins organization, will be a traveling coordinator this season in the Marlins system.

Prada has his own unique background as a manager. He was a catcher in the Minnesota Twins organization, a player considered a rising prospect at 24 years old and headed for elevation to Double-A before the 1999 season.

In a span of seconds, Prada's life changed.

While playing in a winter league in Venezuela, teammates in the locker room began tossing ice at each other. Prada yelled for them to stop. But as he was leaving the room, more horseplay ensued.

"I turned around and when [a teammate] threw the ice, he had a big ring from a championship and that ring fell out from the guy's finger and it landed it right inside my eye."

It caused a rupture in the back of Prada's left eye. He lost 70 percent of his vision in that eye. When he got to spring training, his playing career was over.

"Nobody can fix it," Prada said. "The cut in my eye created a scar. And that scar is the front of my vision. It's like a scar inside my eye that blocks vision.

Prada met with the Twins, who said they would have to release him, but offered a path to coaching. The Twins said he could begin making the transition to coach the next day and remain in spring training learning how to coach.

"I talked to my family back in Venezuela and they said, hey we'll support you in whatever you want to do," Prada said. "So, I thought, let me start my career as a coach. Because, hey, in 20 years I'll be 44 with a lot of experience in coaching and that is what has happened."

In addition to his MiLB coaching career, Prada has become renowned as a manager for off-season international competition. In 2023, he led Spain to the European Championship, the country's first title in 58 years.

In February, he guided Spain to a deciding game in the World Baseball Classic Qualifier, ultimately falling to host team Chinese Taipei in Taiwan. His team beat the Netherlands for the first time in an elimination game. A game later, however, Taipei avenged an earlier loss to Spain with a win in the championship round.

"That was a good experience," Prada said. "The dome in Taipei is incredible. There were 40,000 people in that ballpark. We had an opportunity to see that atmosphere ... the fans dancing and singing the whole game. Competing at that level is an honor."

The experience of managing during international competition has widened Prada's awareness of all different levels of professional baseball. The Blue Wahoos will be his first time managing in Double-A, but Prada has managed major league players during international competition.

"I'm a person that had always worked in the lower levels (of affiliated baseball) in the (United) States," he said. "But I have a lot of experience at the higher level in Venezuela and International ball. I feel like I can handle any level.





"I have worked in the winter leagues, I have done so with a lot of Triple-A and big league guys with those leagues. A chance to manage in the World Baseball Classic, that was high level competition, so you're playing big leaguers and facing big leaguers.

The Blue Wahoos team he will manage in April has several players that Prada managed two years ago when the Hammerheads won the FSL title.

"I think being in Double-A with a group that a couple years ago won a championship is great," he said. "It will be good to be back together. Because we had success together. And it's so hard to have success.

"I only won a championship once in my career and it was with these guys. I have been in the playoffs three times in affiliated baseball and it's tough, because you don't have the same club all year. You may lose five guys in one day [to callups] or you play well with a group of guys in the first half and then you lose people."

Prada knows he's built relationships with players on the Blue Wahoos team that will beneficial this season.

"We're going to have players that we had success together and had a good year," he said.

"That's what you want. I think you want to have players remember you in a good way, so they can say, 'Hey, that's Nelson Prada and I like that guy. That guy was a good mentor, a good coach to me. That is something that makes you feel good."



Ownership

QUINT AND RISHY STUDER moved to Pensacola in 1996 and have been investing in the city's future since. A titan in the field of healthcare, Quint headquartered Studer Group before devoting his career to philanthropy and community building. The Studers have played an integral role in the reinvigoration of downtown Pensacola, building Blue Wahoos Stadium and Studer Children's Hospital and opening numerous businesses including the Bodacious Shops and Bubba's Sweet Spot on historic Palafox Street. Today, Studer is a best-selling author in both business and health care fields, and continues to invest in Pensacola.

ESOR BLUEWAHOOS

BUBBA WATSON grew up in Bagdad, Florida on his way to becoming a professional golfer and two-time Masters champion. Since returning to Pensacola with his family, Bubba has invested heavily in the community, opening Bubba's Sweet Spot downtown, donating generously to the Studer Family Children's Hospital, and becoming a part-owner of the Blue Wahoos with business partner RANDALL WELLS.

DERRICK BROOKS played youth football in his hometown of Pensacola, Florida before becoming a two-time All-American linebacker at Florida State and an 11-time Pro Bowler in a 14-year NFL career. He led the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to a Super Bowl title in 2003, was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2014, and joined the Blue Wahoos as an owner in 2018.

DANA SUSKIND is a professor of Surgery and Pediatrics at the University of Chicago Medical Center and the co-founder and co-director of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning. She is a popular author and is devoted to treating children born with hearing loss.

JOHN LIST is an economist at the University of Chicago. The author of over 200 academic publications, he was a finalist for the Nobel Prize in economics in 2015 and is co-founder of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning with Dana Suskind.

PROUD PARTNER OF THE PENSACOLA BLUE WAHOOS

FORDA STATE

Shortly after being sworn in as Pensacola's mayor in 2022, D.C. Reeves went on a personal mission.

He grew up a Florida State fan. He knew other popular college teams in this region – Florida, Alabama and Auburn to name three – all had their baseball teams play in Blue Wahoos Stadium.

In some cases, these teams played multiple times at the ballpark. The giant void was FSU.

"Every time I would see the (FSU) athletic director at a football game, I would say, 'What do we need to do get FSU to play a game here?' That was almost right when I started (as mayor), a year and a half ago," Reeves said during a conversation last summer.

His lobbying efforts helped lead to an historic moment.

The Seminoles and Auburn staged an exhibition "Fall Ball" doubleheader October 12, 2024 before an overflow crowd at Blue Wahoos Stadium. Tickets sold out in less than 12 hours on August 1 when seats unclaimed by seasonticket members went on public sale.

Days before the game, ticket brokers were selling seats for \$100 and more. A tailgate experience that day before the first pitch created a festive pregame atmosphere. Both teams lined the baseline like a playoff game.

The National Anthem included a military jet flyover from two pilots, one an Auburn grad, the other an FSU grad, stationed at NAS Pensacola.

The concession lines stretched down each concourse. The capacity of Blue Wahoos Stadium (5,038) could have doubled on this day if there was a way to do it.

And Reeves tossed out a ceremonial first pitch amid loud cheers.

"I just think there were a lot of winners," said Auburn coach Butch Thompson, whose team won both games. "When I say that, the City of Pensacola is a winner in this deal.



"This is amazing for college baseball here. This is a military town, so having a flyover and having those guys who flew over the stadium then come and stand on this field, that's a win.

"Both teams are winners because we both know more about our ballclubs. And the fans, there wasn't a cloud in the sky here and I think each person who came here was a winner because they got to see pretty good college baseball."

College teams are permitted to play two dates in the fall against opponents of their choice. The games do not count for the following year's record. The Seminoles are in talks to return in 2025 for a date and opponent to be announced later this season.

TAKES THE FIELD

"To open up and provide this hospitality to both teams and for the fans to come out here and spend the time and the money to watch these teams play ... it was a full day and it was really something we conjured up and never did I envision it would turn into an event like this," said FSU coach Link Jarrett, who took the Seminoles on a dramatic run to the College World Series in 2024.

At the midpoint of their 2025 season, the Seminoles are considered among the contenders to return to Omaha.



"It was really neat," Jarrett said. "And (Blue Wahoos) staff, the grounds crew, the front office staff, the music and everything else that goes into putting on an event like this was first class and I absolutely loved it."

As fate turned out, a Pensacola player shined for Auburn.

Only five months past his high school graduation, former Pensacola Catholic High star Chris Rembert drove in four runs and scored three runs, as Auburn had a pair of 7-inning wins, 4-1 and 9-5. "It's an awesome feeling. [There's] nothing else I could think of that would top this day," said Rembert.

It was the first game at Blue Wahoos Stadium between two major colleges since 2020, right before the first onslaught of the coronavirus hit to shut down sports that spring and summer.

The event also marked an important milestone.

It was 20 years ago in October, following the destructive wrath of Hurricane Ivan, when community leaders in Pensacola gathered to formulate a rebirth of Pensacola to include a bayfront stadium.

The thinking was that a stadium would bring thousands of people downtown to enjoy waterfront events, shop and dine. That vision was brought into full focus last fall.

The massive crowd who saw the event watched two teams with as many as 10 players viewed as pro prospects. This attracted 30 scouts from 17 different MLB teams. All five MLB teams from California, including the Los Angeles Dodgers, who had three scouts, attended the event.

"I can't create a practice like this. Link can't either," Thompson said. "This created an atmosphere of what it's going to be like playing on the weekend in the SEC and ACC. So I just tip my hat to everyone."

"To have these two programs, we expected to have a big turnout," said Reeves. "This is a community-first idea and we got an amazing team and organization to help execute it." ◊

Nelson Prada Manager

Nelson Prada joins the Blue Wahoos for his first season in 2025. A former player in the Minnesota Twins system from 1995 to 1998, his managerial experience includes the GCL Twins (2005-07), Beloit Snappers (2008-12), Williamsport Crosscutters (2013), Clearwater Threshers (2014), the GCL Phillies (2018), DSL Marlins (2022) and Jupiter Hammerheads (2023-24). A native of Venezuela, he spends the winter managing the Spain National Team in international competition and serving as the bench coach for the Cardenales de Lara, the reigning champions of the Venezuelan winter league.

Jason Krizan Hitting Coach

Jason Krizan returns to the Blue Wahoos for his second season in 2025 after spending 2023 as the hitting coach for High-A Winston-Salem in the Chicago White Sox organization. Selected by the Detroit Tigers in the 8th round of the 2011 Draft out of Dallas Baptist University, he was a First-Team All-American in his senior season. After an 11-year minor league career in the Tigers, Mets and Giants organizations, he made his MLB debut for San Francisco in 2022.

Jerad Eickhoff Pitching Coach

Jerad Eickhoff returns to the Blue Wahoos for his second season in 2025 after a seven-year MLB career that included time with the Philadelphia Phillies (2015-19), New York Mets (2021) and Pittsburgh Pirates (2022). Selected in the 15th round of the 2011 Draft by the Texas Rangers, he also spent time in the Padres and Guardians organizations, finishing his playing career with Triple-A Columbus in 2023.

Jay Weaver Defensive Coach

Jay Weaver joins the Blue Wahoos in 2025 for his first season in MiLB player development. After a collegiate playing career at Southern New Hampshire University, he co-founded The Catching Camp, which provides instruction and programming for catchers at the amateur and professional level. He also served as an associate scout for the Los Angeles Angels from 2011 to 2016.

Ruben Šomeillan Defensive Coach

Ruben Someillan joins the Blue Wahoos in 2025 after previously serving as an assistant coach at Jacksonville University, where he was a five-year starting outfielder from 2017 to 2021. The Miami native also coached at Nova Southeastern and the Jupiter Wave in summer collegiate baseball.

Brandon Remalia Strength Coach

Brandon Remalia returns to the Blue Wahoos for his second season in 2025 after serving in a similar role for High-A Beloit in 2023 and Class-A Jupiter in 2021 and 2022. Prior to joining the Marlins organization, he worked at St. John's College High School in Washington, DC as a sports performance coach. He is a graduate of Frostburg State University with a bachelor's degree in sports and exercise.

Adam Sparks Athletic Trainer

Adam Sparks joins the Blue Wahoos for his first season. A graduate of The University of West Alabama, he was an athletic trainer in the Baltimore Orioles organization from 2018-2021 before serving as an assistant athletic trainer at Jacksonville State University from 2021-2024.



Entering its 14th season, Blue Wahoos Stadium is widely considered one of the premier facilities in Minor League Baseball. Recently named the Best Ballpark in Double-A by Ballpark Digest, the stadium has established itself as one of the best places to enjoy a Minor League Baseball game in the country. A three-time recipient of the Southern League Ballpark of the Year, Blue Wahoos Stadium welcomed over two million fans in its first eight seasons, finishing first or second in the league in attendance five times.

With a capacity of 5,038 fans, Blue Wahoos Stadium is the smallest in the Southern League, allowing fans to get closer to the action than any other park in the league. Nestled alongside the water in Pensacola's Community Maritime Park, the field provides unbeatable views of the Pensacola Bay. The playing surface at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially named Admiral Fetterman Field in 2015 in honor of the late Admiral Jack Fetterman, who was instrumental in the creation of Community Maritime Park for the Pensacola community.

Blue Wahoos Stadium and the surrounding Maritime Community Park were built to be used by the local community throughout the year, not just for Wahoos baseball games. More than 200 events are held at the ballpark throughout the year, making it truly a stadium for the entire community to enjoy.

Honoring Admiral Fetterman

On September 23, 2015, the field at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially renamed Admiral Jack Fetterman Field. 

EXTREME MAKEOVER,

The first sign of stadium change greeted you at the top of the main entrance stairwell.

This is our new Fan Assistance location. To your left is a new "Grab-and-Go" area for beverages, and Bodacious Café salads and snacks. The former location of the Fan Assistance booth is now a food kiosk with various items for quick purchase.

Welcome to the 2025 season-opening month at Blue Wahoos Stadium. There have been some major home improvement projects at the ballpark with a couple more ongoing.

Most of the enhancements are in areas not visible from the outside, or the seating bowl, but necessities to ensure the team's future as direct affiliates with Major League Baseball.

The biggest completed project has been the remodeling and expansion of the visiting team clubhouse, along with some remodeling of the Blue Wahoos clubhouse. Sometime this season, two indoor batting cages will be installed in an area along the first base side of the stadium.

As part of the Blue Wahoos' 10-year agreement in the Professional Development League (PDL) contract for Minor League Baseball teams, the improvements will help meet requirements set by Major League Baseball for facility needs.

This season begins the fifth year of the Blue Wahoos' affiliation as the Miami Marlins' Double-A team in the Southern League.

"It's significant, because of the fact if you don't meet PDL requirements, you lose your baseball team," said Blue Wahoos team president Jonathan Griffith. "So it's very important that we make sure we follow all of the PDL rules to meet and exceed those (requirements).

"To the point of exceeding, we're going to have one of the largest, if not the largest, visitors' clubhouse areas in Double-A baseball. I believe we'll be the only one with its own weight room, which is taking it to another level. That way we will hit all of the marks."

The Blue Wahoos have partnered with Pensacola-based Hanto & Clarke General Contractors to handle engineering and construction.

The combined enhancements represent the largest renovation of the ballpark since it opened in 2012. Here's a review:

 The visitors' clubhouse has new carpeting, wood lockers that replace the original blue metal lockers, new televisions, enlarged coaches' offices, a separate weight and workout area, enlarged dining area and more space for support staff.

The area visible on the sidewalk area on the third base side – once known as the Imagination Station – was converted into an expansion of the visitors' clubhouse.

"We basically removed a couple walls (where the Imagination Station was located), so we're almost doubling the size of the visitors locker room and clubhouse," said Tyler "TJ" Johnson, the Blue Wahoos' assistant general manager. "It's now a much larger area for visiting teams.

"Our plan is to blow (visiting teams) away. We have new couches, cabinets, new finishes, the wood lockers, the new carpeting. It looks really good." - The home clubhouse received new wood lockers for the players. The assistant coaches' offices move into a much larger space across from the manager's office, complete with new carpeting. A new clubhouse concierge office was created in the former dressing area of the assistant coaches.

— The two indoor batting cages will connect inside a prefabricated building to be attached to the stadium. Included in the building will be an audio/visual room for teams to utilize in analyzing swings.

"It will be nice to have two indoor cages and it gives us more overall indoor space," Griffith said. "This area will be over 5,000 square feet of indoor space. That will be beneficial to do other things apart from the season as well, but the big one is being able to meet the PDL requirements."

 Further plans include an expanded women's locker room, big enough to accommodate 10, which can include trainers, fitness specialists, female coaches or visiting female staff members.





"It will give us 40 percent more space, and as more women come into the sport, we'll have an area large enough to meet requirements," Griffith said.

- There will soon be a remodeled lobby entrance inside the Blue Wahoos front office. This will include a ticket reception area, separate from the box office that is accessible from the sidewalk.

"We'll almost double the size of that area," Johnson said. "Our plan is for a small merchandise storefront as well, separate from our team store on the concourse. This will enable us to sell some shirts, hats, and other items. We'll add some Blue Wahoos memorabilia to increase the wow factor."

- There also will be new blue padding installed on rails from the dugouts on each side, all the way down each baseline, as well as a new batter's eye windscreen in centerfield.

Team owners Quint and Rishy Studer have been involved in the entire stadium enhancement procession. Their input has led to further improvement plans.

"They've been a huge influence," Johnson said. "This is is a big initiative that we are undertaking, and facilities are something that mean the most to Quint. He wants to have the best, the top of the line, to make everything look great.

"He and Rishy have been wanting to make sure everything looks just right. They have been great." \diamondsuit








BALLPARK RULES

We want every game at Blue Wahoos Stadium to be an enjoyable and memorable experience for every fan. To make that possible, the following rules are enforced.

 Foul/abusive language and/or rowdy behavior will not be tolerated and will be cause for ejection and/or arrest. Violators may also have their season tickets revoked. Notify the nearest guest services or safety/security representative immediately if actions of this type occur near you.

 The use of derogatory language, which is defined as offensive language concerning another person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin is cause for immediate ejection from the stadium without a refund and could result in future ticket loss.

• By Major League Baseball rule, bags are not permitted in the stadium. Diaper bags, medical bags, and small purses are allowed.

Entering the playing field without authorization or throwing objects onto the field is a violation
of ballpark rules and may be hazardous. Offenders will be ejected and subject to arrest and
prosecution.

• All tobacco and electronic cigarettes are prohibited in Blue Wahoos Stadium which includes the seating sections, concourses, and stairwells.

• Keep aisles clear at all times; emergency situations require that stairways be kept clear. Guests sitting or standing in the ballpark aisles jeopardize the safety of others.

 For your safety and the safety of those around you, please sit in your assigned seat to avoid inconveniencing other guests.

 Drunk and disorderly behavior as well as violation of any alcohol policy will result in ejections from the ballpark without a refund and could result in the loss of season tickets. Underage consumption and the excessive consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.

• Umbrellas are allowed in the stadium. Please be courteous of those around you when using an umbrella.

• The Blue Wahoos ask that no one solicit contributions or distribute literature on stadium property without written approval of the team.

 Flags and banners without poles are permitted. Flags must be event related and may not cover any ballpark signage. All flags or banners deemed inappropriate by stadium management are subject to removal.

• Gates will open 60 minutes (1 hour) prior to the start of the game for admission into the stadium. We strongly encourage guests to enter the stadium as early as possible to avoid delays.

• All guests entering the stadium are subject to search. Refusal may be grounds to prohibit admission.

• The following items are prohibited from entering the stadium: bottles, cans, coolers, containers, fireworks, flares, bets or animals of any kind (with the exception of service animals), weapons, water guns, toy/replica weapons, squirt bottles, soap bottles, balloons, brooms, skateboards, roller blades or skates.

• Handheld radios and televisions are allowed as long as guests listen with an earpiece or headphones. Guests should be considerate of their neighbors when using these devices.

• Outside food and beverages are not permitted inside the stadium. Concession stands are conveniently located on both sides of the concourse for your food and beverage needs.

 All fans must comply with requests from stadium staff regarding stadium policies and emergency response procedures. Be safe. Have fun!
